R/O received a message from SHERIFF BLAISDELL, Skamania County - they are currently investigating a homicide of a 14 year old nude female in their county. Polygraph examinations were made with the victim's mother, father, and mother's boyfriend, with negative results. There were no further developments in their case.
- 7 1130 hrs.: R/O had personal contact with CARL LARSON in this office. (Refer to Master Suspect file.) A polygraph appointment was arranged for CARL LARSON.
- 8 8-8-75 1230 hrs.: CHARLES LEGGETT contacted this office and obtained a polygraph examination which he passed, regarding KAREN SPARKS.

- 10 8-12-75 1100 hrs.: ROBERT LOPEZ came into this office. (See Master Suspect file regarding that interview.)
- 11 1700 hrs.: SGT. FRASER, Snohomish County, contacted this office and provided us with a list of suspects in the disappearance and homicide of JANNA HANSON.
- 12 8-13-75 1300 hrs.: R/O had personal contact in this office with U.S. Marshal SABOL. (See Master Suspect file regarding TED FOSTER.)
- 13 8-14-75 0815 hrs.: R/O received a phone call from DET. DUNCAN Snohomish County, who gave an additional name of DOUGLAS BRAME as a possible suspect in the JANNA HANSON case.
- 14 1530 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with DET. DUNCAN and gave him record check information to this date.
- 15 8-18-75 1330 hrs.: R/O received information from DET. JUSTIS, King County Police, regarding found property under King County case #75-117076. This property was found at SE 92nd & 384th SE in Snoqualmie. R/O viewed the clothes in the property room. The clothing consisted of women's slips and very old style bras. The clothes were mildewed and in very poor condition. R/O discussed the property with DET. DUNN who advised that DET. JUSTIS could destroy the clothing as it was not pertinent to this case.
- 16 1400 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with SGT. FRASER, Snohomish County Sheriff's Office. During the past weekend they found what appears to be JANNA HANSON's remains--two lower arm bones, rib bones, hand bones, and a possible lower jaw bone. Also found were a pair of panties, a homemade scarf, a pair of socks, a watch, and two earring loops also believed to have belonged to the victim. SGT. FRASER was given information regarding names that he requested be checked out by this unit. (See the Master Suspect file regarding Snohomish County information for details of the suspects in their case.) A letter was sent to SGT. FRASER with information regarding the suspects. SGT. FRASER also advised that MARK SCRIPTUNAS had not shown up for an interview at their office. (See our Master Suspect file regarding SCRIPTUNAS.) A photo of TED FOSTER was returned to U.S. Marshal SABO
- 17 8-19-75 1000 hrs.: R/O contacted the neighborhood of BRENDA BALL's last residence in Seahurst. No businesses were observed on the road which is SW 172nd or the Sylvester Road. The road is well traveled as it passes Three Tree Point and a boat launch. Across the street, North of the residence, is a heavily wooded hillside. There are several houses close together near 2323 SW 172nd on the South side of the street. The two easiest ways to reach the house are on

- 18 8-19-75 1045 hrs.: R/O attempted personal contact with BRENDA BALL's mother at her residence. MRS. ARNOUD was not home. A message was left for her to contact this office. OFFICER O'SHAUGHNESSY received a phone call from DET. FORBES of the Salt Lake City Sheriff's Office regarding THEODORE R. BUNDY. MR. BUNDY was in jail over the weekend on a traffic violation. He had an overnight bag with him which contained a large ice-pick, pieces of rope, a pry bar, insulated electric wire, pantyhose with two eye holes and a nose hole cut in them, a full-face ski mask, and a pair of handcuffs made in Spain. DET. FORBES will be sending a mug shot to this office.
- 19 8-21-75 1300 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with MRS. ARNOUD, 655-0634 - she stated that BRENDA did have an old address book and that she would look for it. She does have some papers of BRENDA's and will look for the book and re-contact R/O so that an appointment may be made to see her.
- 20 8-22-75 0930 hrs.; DET. DUNN had phone contact with DET. BEN FORBES - they're currently charging THEODORE BUNDY with Possession of Burglary Tools. Salt Lake City Police searched BUNDY's residence and found a brochure from a resort near Vail, Colorado. They are checking his Chevron credit card for possible information leading to the disappearance of several girls in the Utah and Colorado area. MR. BUNDY has an attorney at this time and has refused to take a polygraph examination. A driver license check revealed that on 1-9-75 BUNDY applied for a Utah driver's license. He went to Utah in September 1974 according to records made by DET. HERGESHEIMER.
- 21 8-25-75 R/O had personal contact with MRS. ERNEST ROGERS at her residence, 4143 12th NE, phone 632-5323. She stated that BUNDY is a very nice boy, that he lived in a room at their house for approximately 3 years while attending the University of Washington. She could not remember his employment record other than that he worked for the Republican Party. She stated that he left in September of 1974 to attend Law School in Utah because it is cheaper than in Washington State. She stated that he had a girlfriend who worked at the University of Washington; no particular men friends nor strange activities that she observed. She stated that his parents were from Tacoma and that he had a gray or brown Volkswagen, she thought it was gray. MRS. ROGERS though TED was a very nice person and apparently she was reluctant to give further information or was quite friendly with the suspect.

23 8-26-75 0930 hrs.: R/O received a phone call from LIZ KLEPPFOR who advised that she is a girlfriend of TED BUNDY. She stated that the landlady, MRS. ROGERS, had told her that she had been questioned regarding TED. (d) made an appointment to come to this office and speak with R/O.

24 1015 hrs.: R/O had personal contact with (d) in this office. She had quite a bit of information regarding TED BUNDY. She stated that they met in September of 1969 at the Sand Piper Tavern in the U District which is now the Rainbow Tavern. (d) current address is (d) 18th NE. Her home phone is (d) business phone (d) (d) stated that she and TED broke up one time in 1972 when he was dating a girl he worked with at the Mental Health Center at Harborview. They were broke up for a couple of weeks. He graduated in the University of Washington in 1972 and applied to several law schools. He also worked at Seattle Crime Commission for the Washington State Republican Party in Olympia to which he commuted. He bought the Volkswagen after they began going together. He also worked for a medical supply firm called Pedline. She observed some plaster of paris in his room that she believes he took from the medical supply firm. She states that this was in approximately 1970. She describes TED as being very athletic and remembered that during the first week of July in 1974 he went to a water skiing party at Lake Sammamish at which he did not have a very good time. She did not go with him to that party. He also had a job in 1974 with the Department of Emergency Services in Olympia. She recalls that on July 14, 1974, in the morning TED appeared at her residence as she was getting ready to go to church. TED was wearing a white T-shirt and yellow shorts. They had some sort of fight that morning and TED went home. (d) went to church and later took her daughter to the lake. She returned home around 6:00 p.m. in the evening. When TED returned he was wearing gray turtle neck and long pants. She states that at this time TED complained about not feeling well; that prior to their going out for dinner and despite his not feeling well, he removed a ski rack which he had placed on the back of his car back on her car as it was her ski rack. During the first week of July TED had removed the ski rack from (d) car so they could carry his bicycle to Eastern Washington on a trip that they took. (d) bicycle was folded up and put in the back seat. (d) advised that TED's parents have an A-frame cabin near Lake Crescent which is near Gig Harbor. The last time TED was in King County was in June of 1975 when he came for a 4 - 5 day visit. Currently he is working as a security guard at the University of Utah campus.

He attended U.P.S. Law School at night in 1973 and 1974. ^{1(d)} also found several items in TED's room at different times. Several years ago she found a brown bag full of women's clothing. At another time under the seat of his Volkswagen she found a hatchet. On a third occasion she found a knife that TED advised was given to him by a friend. This knife was in the glove compartment of ^{1(d)} car. ^{1(d)} also observed a meat tenderizer and a meat cleaver as TED was packing to go to law school in Utah last Fall. According to ^{1(d)} TED has been to Utah three times--in December of 69. In regard to their relationship she advised that she and TED were not together every night and it would not be unusual for him to be away from her for several days at a time. Since September of 1974 ^{1(d)} has seen TED during Christmas of 74; during the first week of June when TED was here; and during the first week of August when she visited him in Utah. She received a phone call from TED from a pay phone the night or near the night that the girl from Bountiful, Utah, was missing, or found. She recalls this from reading Ogden, Utah, where ^{1(d)} is from. The knife that TED had he stated he had received from MARLIN VORTMAN who lives in the Magnolia area. TED has a brother RICHARD who is 13 and lives in the home; a brother GLEN, 20 years, who lives in San Diego and is in the U.S. Navy; a sister SANDY, 18, who lives in Tacoma; a sister LINDA, 22, who lives in Tacoma. His mother's name is LOUISE BUNDY, she works at the University of Puget Sound as a secretary, and his father is JOHN who is a cook at Madigan General Hospital in Tacoma. Some time ago TED learned from his cousin JOHN who is 26 and lives in Tacoma, that MR. BUNDY was not his real father, that he was an illegitimate child. TED had some resentment towards his mother due to the fact that he did not learn this fact and there has been no communication between them regarding the circumstances of his birth. ^{1(d)} indicated that TED had credit cards at Standard Oil and Nordstrom Best; that his checking account was with Rainier Bank in the University District. She advised that he had a friend named TERRY in Ellensburg whom they visited in the summertime. She said that on one occasion he borrowed her car to go to Richland which she believes was in the summer of 1970. ^{1(d)} also found a stolen television set in TED's room, confronted him with the fact, and he admitted to her that he had stolen it and would not do this again. According to ^{1(d)} TED has not been in the Armed Services and did apply to ten different law schools. During the past month TED's brother RICHARD visited him in Salt Lake. TED crated a bicycle and packed it back with RICHARD on the airplane. When ^{1(d)} questioned TED about this he asked her what bike she was referring to, ^{1(d)} has not seen the bicycle. This interview ended at 1130 hrs. R/O then discussed TED BUNDY with DETECTIVE DUNN.

25 8-26-75 1300 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with DET. BEN FORBES, Salt Lake P.D., 801-328-7441. He indicated that in the search of

TED BUNDY's room they found correspondence with Governor Dan Evans at the State of Washington. He stated also that Bountiful, Utah, plans to have a line-up with BUNDY in it soon; they are awaiting results of his credit slips from Standard Oil of California. The handcuff key found at the crime scene at which one of their girls disappeared, does open the handcuffs that TED had, however, many keys open that particular set. He also advised that TED's apartment was very immaculate. DET. FORBES also gave information regarding WILLIAM FAY TRAYNOR. (See Master Suspect file for information regarding TRAYNOR.)

- 26 8-26-75 1400 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with DET. MILO VIGG Mason County Sheriff's Office, Grand Junction, Colorado, 303-242-3322. He asked to be notified regarding any new developments regarding TED BUNDY. He was advised that according to ^{1(d)} BUNDY was in Washington of July 1975. R/O contacted U.P.S. Law School Security who referred me to MR. JOSEPH SINCLITICO who is the Dean of the U.P.S. Law School. He was not in and a message was left for him.
- 27 8-27-75 1000 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with Dean SINCLITICO, U.P.S. Law School, Tacoma, phone 756-3324. He stated that the Buckley Amendment prohibits revealing any attendance records of students. BUNDY's name was not mentioned at this time.
- 28 8-28-75 1000 hrs.: R/O attempted phone contact with MRS. ARNOUD with negative results.
- 29 1045 hrs.: Same as above.
- 30 1450 hrs.: R/O drove by BUNDY's residence in Tacoma. It is a two or three story wood frame home approximately 30 years old, blue with white trim. It is about two blocks east of the U.P.S. main campus. It has a detached garage in the back and a small fenced yard. The back of the house is on an alley; it is a strictly residential area, there are no woods or businesses nearby. R/O contacted U.P.S. Law School and learned that night school freshmen attended classes from 5:00 to 10:45 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, and that their spring schedule usually ends around the first of April and summer schedule begins in May.
- 31 8-29-75 0930 hrs.: R/O received a phone call from ^{1(d)} and arranged to see her at 1530 hrs.
- 32 0945 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with SGT. CANNON from Salt Lake County Sheriff's Office. He advised that BUNDY had been working as a security guard at the University of Utah campus and was fired because of his recent arrest. They were waiting to see if CAPT. MACKIE would like to send addresses to the line-up.

33 8-29-75 1030 hrs.: R/O attempted phone contact with JOE KESTENBAUM. R/O contacted his mother-in-law who advised that he would be home in Toledo on Tuesday. His phone is 419-474-2862

34 1100 hrs.: R/O picked up negatives from GAYLORD HARTVIGSON. (See Master file regarding HARTVIGSON.) These photos are supposedly of people at Pine Lake Park on July 14, 1974.

35 1500 to 1700 hrs.: R/O had personal contact with 1(d) in this office. 1(d) brought with her TED BUNDY's checks for April 1974 which she obtained from his residence without his knowledge. On April 19, 1974 he wrote checks to the Campus Creamery and Ness Flowers, both businesses in the U District. On April 17th, he wrote a \$6.24 check to Ernst Hardware and a \$7.20 check to Q.F.C. Food Stores, both of these are believed to be stores at University Village. The check for Ernst cleared the bank on May 22, 1974 and on April 19th the Q.F.C. check cleared. On April 17th he also wrote a check to Freeway Volkswagen for \$1.03; this check cleared on 4-18-74. He wrote checks to Cain's Rental, phone 525-3450 on April 13th for \$2.63, contract #17395 and on April 29th for \$4.21, contract #17989. He also wrote a check on April 16th to Standard Oil Station #129 in the University District for \$6.42. In the summer of 1965 TED worked for a saw mill in Tacoma and attended his freshman year of college at the University of Puget Sound. 1(d) did not know what he did in the summer of 66. He attended school at the University of Washington in the Fall of 66 where he lived at McMahon Hall. In 1967 during summer session he went to Stanford and was enrolled in the Chinese Language program. In January 1968 he went to Temple University in Philadelphia and lived with his aunt in Philadelphia. In 1968 in the summer he returned to the University of Washington and according to 1(d) memory attended the University of Washington in the Fall. She does not know what he did in the summer of 1969 and she met him in the Fall of 69. He moved to ROGERS' residence prior to working for Legal Messengers in September of 1969. In 1969 and 1970 Winter Quarter he attended the University of Washington and also attended their Spring Quarter. During Christmas that year he and 1(d) flew to Utah to visit her family. In 1970 he attended summer school at the University of Washington and he may have been working at Pedline Hospital Supply at that time. During that summer he went to Utah with 1(d). He attended the University of Washington in the Fall of 1970 and in the Winter of 1971 he worked at Pedline and attended the University of Washington. Possibly that summer they went to Utah however, it might have been the summer of 72. In the Fall of 1971 TED attended the University of Washington and worked at Pedline and in the Spring of 1972 he graduated from the University of Washington.

In 1972 in the summer he worked at Harborview Hospital in the Mental Health Unit. He dated a girl named SANDY GWINN at that time. Upon completing that he worked for Governor Evans' campaign in Seattle. In the Fall of 72 he began working for the Seattle Crime Commission and in March of 73 began working for the Republican Party in Olympia, to which he commuted. In Sept. of 73 he began Law School at the University of Puget Sound as a night student, he attended Winter and Spring Quarters. His possible schedule was Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for the first semester, leaving Seattle at 5:00 p.m. and returning at 11:00 p.m. Possibly Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday for the second semester, leaving at 5:00 and returning at 11:00 p.m. He didn't go down to the law school just to study, there was a study group here in Seattle and they would go to various houses to study. He would also go to the University Law Library. In the summer of 1974 TED worked for the Dept. of Emergency Services in Olympia, beginning approximately June 11th. He worked on the budget and worked Monday through Friday. Sometimes he would stay at his parent's house, his house, or FREIDA's house - he was usually in Seattle on the weekends. This job lasted until Sept. of 1974. 1(d) does not remember what TED did between the end of law school and the Dept. of Emergency Services job but she believes that he did not have a job at that time. He started applying to law schools in his senior year of 1972 and applied to ten. He received one acceptance from the University of Utah but did not want to attend there. He also applied to Berkeley, San Francisco, University of Washington, and possibly University of Oregon, and Willamette University. He re-applied a second time to some of the above. In March of 1974 he called Utah and they said they would accept his application as a new student (this means he would return to Utah as a freshman, not having advised them that he had been a law student the previous year.) TED said that he did not like the commuting atmosphere of the University of Puget Sound Law School. TED did not belong to any outside organizations other than the Republican Party and CHECC. He did not belong to any particular athletic teams although he did visit the intramural building quite often. He was very much interested in hand ball, and would play with whomever might be at the athletic center. He has an aunt in Philadelphia - her name is AUDY, and an uncle in Arkansas. He visited in Utah at Christmas of 1969 where he apparently he drove with her friends and she met him down there. Part of this indicated that he flew to Utah, I believe this information is correct that he drove with some friends of 1(d). During the summer of 70, 1(d) and TED drove together to Utah - they would go to Eastern Washington, through Yakima, South through Baker, Oregon, they would not connect through Vancouver or Portland in driving to Utah. Between March and Sept. of 73 he flew to San Francisco on business for the Republican Party. When not at Law School he would usually study/visit with 1(d) go to the IMA Bldg. with JOHN NEELER who also lived at FREIDA ROGERS' house in the U District. He did not

have a locker at the Intramural Athletic Bldg. He has no brothers or sisters who attend college and no friends at any out of state colleges. His cousin, JOHN, attended the University of Mississippi and also a school in Arkansas. 1(d) observed a hatchet under the seat of TED's Volkswagen sometime during the summer of 1974. The hatchet had a pinkish leather cover. TED had obtained his Volkswagen while working for the Seattle Crime Commission. Before obtaining his car he drove 1(d) car or rode his bicycle. 1(d) remembers the date she saw the hatchet as she had been to Green Lake with TED that day and had seen it under the driver's seat. At this time 1(d) had been thinking that TED BUNDY might be a good suspect in this case, and the hatchet bothered her however, he gave a good explanation for it. She does not remember the explanation at this time. 1(d) remembers this date as this was right after she had returned from Utah in August of 1974. TED remarked that he was going to get a rifle possibly, this was the day after she returned from Utah. 1(d) also observed a cleaver in Sept. of 1974 while observing TED pack to go to Utah, one side had a blade and the other side had bumps as though it were a meat tenderizer item. 1(d) also observed a knife in TED's possession. 1(d) describes the knife owned by TED as being brass in a wood carved case; it had a 4" blade and was brown in color. This knife was seen in the glove box of 1(d) car in March of 1973. He stated it was given to him by SHEILA and MARLIN VORTMAN - they live in Magnolia area by Discovery Park. This knife was in 1(d) glove compartment of her Volkswagen which is gray, license OPM 001 until August of 73, when 1(d) car was stolen. At the time it was recovered TED appeared and having some outstanding traffic warrants he was taken to Seattle P.D. TED also attended a traffic school in 1969. TED met SHEILA and MARLIN through work in Governor Evans' campaign. In TED's trunk he kept a tool box and two pairs of mechanic's overalls. In the Fall of 1973 1(d) observed a sack of clothing in TED's room one night while he was at law school. The only piece of clothing she actually observed was a white bra which was a very large size. 1(d) assumed these to be FREIDA's clothes and did not look at them any further. FREIDA cleaned TED's room every Friday and TED's door was generally unlocked. During 1972 1(d) observed a television and stereo in TED's room - TED admitted to her later that he had stolen these things but that he would not do something like that again. 1(d) also observed an electric typewriter in TED's room which she stated he had bought from the Republican Headquarters. TED is described by 1(d) as materialistic - he enjoyed listening to music and still has the stereo and TV. In May or June of 1974, 1(d) observed crutches in TED's room - TED stated they belonged to ERNST JOHNS, his landlord who had a problem with his feet. TED was going to return them for ERNST or ERNST gave them to him, 1(d) could not remember. 1(d) also observed an Ace bandage that TED had obtained when TED broke his foot while going to Temple Univ. She also observed plaster of paris in his room on an occasion.

SUBJECT COMPLAINT OF MISCONDUCT (MORALS) - FILE #74-138

An investigation of a complaint made by Patricia Brazier which was referred to I.I.S. by the Morals Unit after preliminary investigation by them has been carried by this office to the point of closure due to a lack of evidence to identify an accused.

The facts of this case are noted in the investigator's summary and I concur with the conclusion drawn from these facts.

There has been considerable time and energy expended to date that has failed to even identify the accused as an officer of this, or any other department. The complainant thinks the suspect was an officer because he told her he was, because he used language common to those in the profession, and because he showed her a badge. Other than these observations there is no evidence to support this opinion. She has been shown S.P.D. badges and stated that the one shown by the suspect was not like any of them. Of more import, is the fact that the person she positively identified by photograph has been checked out and found to have been on duty in the South Precinct during the time in question. His whereabouts have been firmly established and no possibility that he was involved exists.

One other officer also was considered as a "possible" only because he owned a red Volkswagon similar to that described as the suspect vehicle. This officer's photograph was included among those shown the victim and a witness. He was not picked by either. In fact, both the victim and witness pointed out the same man; the officer who was proven to be elsewhere. As an added precaution it was arranged for the victim to have close personal observation of the officer who owns the red Volkswagon. She stated positively that he was not the suspect.

Since the two aforementioned officers were the only ones towards which any shred of circumstantial evidence pointed, and since both have been excluded as possible suspects, I suggest that the I.I.S. investigation be concluded for lack of evidence necessary for further pursuit of this matter. *(Unfounded)*

NOTE: The Morals Unit case file referred to this office has been kept intact and separate from our case file should it need be returned. It is my recommendation that the investigative file of the Morals Unit be returned to them for further consideration of suspect identification.





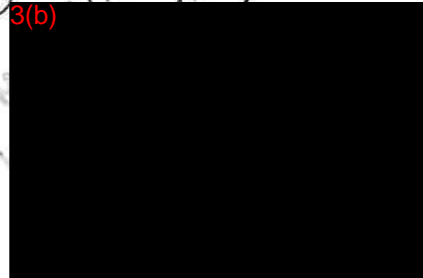

On Saturday, March 2, 1974 I went to bed about 1am. My shades were drawn but on one of the curtains you can look in on the side and see my bed and see that no one was in that bed. About 3/4ths of the time I have someone staying with me. I was sound asleep, probably about 4am when I was awakened (I believe by him opening the window and shutting it). I had forgot to put the wooden slot in the window to lock it and although it would be difficult to see that it was not there in the dark, he must have seen it as he took off the outer screen to reach the window. I opened my eyes and he was standing in the doorway and I saw only the profile of him. There was a light shining from the living room where he had left his flashlight on the table and left it lighted as later I asked him where the light was coming from and he told me it was none of my business. He came right over and sat on my bed and told me to relax that he was not going to hurt me. I asked him how he got in and he said it was none of my business. He sat there for maybe 10 minutes and mostly I asked questions and his answers were confined to just relax and that he would not hurt me. He was wearing a/white T undershirt short sleeved levis and no shirt or jacket although it was cold outside. He had a dark navy watch cap pulled down over his head to below his chin. It was not a ski mask as there were no holes for nose and I think he must have made slits in it for his eyes although I could not see them. So I never saw his face or his hair and I have no idea of the color of his hair, if he had mustache or beard or anything like that. I know it was not a ski mask as it did not go down on his neck. His voice sounded like a Northwesterner and he was well educated and could be a student at U. of W. I do not recall any jewelry or watch and although I saw his bare arms, did not see any hair on his arms. He told me he would not use his knife if I did not scream and he showed me a hunting knife and it looked like a carved bone handle, dark with streaks in it. He had been drinking but was not drunk. 24 1015 hrs.: R/O had personal contact with 1(d) in this office. She had quite a bit of information regarding TED BUNDY. She stated that they met in September of 1969 at the Sand Piper Tavern in the U District which is now the Rainbow Tavern. 1(d) current address is 1(d) 18th NE. Her home phone is 1(d) business phone 1(d) 1(d) stated that she and TED broke up one time in 1972 when he was dating a girl he worked with at the Mental Health Center at Harborview. They were broke up for a couple of weeks. He graduated in the University of Washington in 1972 and applied to several law schools. He also worked at Seattle Crime Commission for the Washington State Republican Party in Olympia to which he commuted. He bought the Volkswagen after they began going together. He also worked for a medical supply firm called Pedline. She observed some plaster of paris in his room that she believes he took from the medical supply firm. She states that this was in approximately 1970. She describes TED as being very athletic and remembered that during the first week of July in 1974 he went to a water skiing party at Lake Sammamish at which he did not have a very good time. She did not go with him to that party. He also had a job in 1974 with the Department of Emergency Services in Olympia. She recalls that on July 14, 1974, in the morning TED appeared at her residence as she was getting ready to go to church. TED was wearing a white T-shirt and yellow shorts. They had some sort of fight that morning and TED went home. 1(d) went to church and later took her daughter to the lake. She returned home around 6:00 p.m. in the evening. When TED returned he was wearing gray turtle neck and long pants. She states that at this time TED complained about not feeling well; that prior to their going out for dinner and despite his not feeling well, he removed a ski rack which he had placed on the back of his car back on her car as it was her ski rack. During the first week of July TED had removed the ski rack from 1(d) car so they could carry his bicycle to Eastern Washington on a trip that they took. 1(d) bicycle was folded up and put in the back seat. 1(d) advised that TED's parents have an A-frame cabin near Lake Crescent which is near Gig Harbor. The last time TED was in King County was in June of 1975 when he came for a 4 - 5 day visit. Currently he is working as a security guard at the University of Utah campus.

He attended U.P.S. Law School at night in 1973 and 1974. (d) also found several items in TED's room at different times. Several years ago she found a brown bag full of women's clothing. At another time under the seat of his Volkswagen she found a hatchet. On a third occasion she found a knife that TED advised was given to him by a friend. This knife was in the glove compartment of (d) car. (d) also observed a meat tenderizer and a meat cleaver as TED was packing to go to law school in Utah last Fall. According to (d) TED has been to Utah three times--in December of 69.

In regard to their relationship she advised that she and TED were not together every night and it would not be unusual for him to be away from her for several days at a time. Since September of 1974 LIZ has seen TED during Christmas of 74; during the first week of June when TED was here; and during the first week of August when she visited him in Utah. She received a phone call from TED from a pay phone the night or near the night that the girl from Bountiful, Utah, was missing, or found. She recalls this from reading Ogden, Utah, where (d) is from. The knife that TED had he stated he had received from MARLIN VORTMAN who lives in the Magnolia area. TED has a brother RICHARD who is 13 and lives in the home; a brother GLEN, 20 years, who lives in San Diego and is in the U.S. Navy; a sister SANDY, 18, who lives in Tacoma; a sister LINDA, 22, who lives in Tacoma. His mother's name is LOUISE BUNDY, she works at the University of Puget Sound as a secretary, and his father is JOHN who is a cook at Madigan General Hospital in Tacoma. Some time ago TED learned from his cousin JOHN who is 26 and lives in Tacoma, that MR. BUNDY was not his real father, that he was an illegitimate child. TED had some resentment towards his mother due to the fact that he did not learn this fact and there has been no communication between them regarding the circumstances of his birth. (d) indicated that TED had credit cards at Standard Oil and Nordstrom Best; that his checking account was with Rainier Bank in the University District. She advised that he had a friend named TERRY in Ellensburg whom they visited in the summertime. She said that on one occasion he borrowed her car to go to Richland which she believes was in the summer of 1970. (d) also found a stolen television set in TED's room, confronted him with the fact, and he admitted to her that he had stolen it and would not do this again. According to (d) TED has not been in the Armed Services and did apply to ten different law schools. During the past month TED's brother RICHARD visited him in Salt Lake. TED crated a bicycle and packed it back with RICHARD on the airplane. When LIZ questioned TED about this he asked her what bike she was referring to, LIZ has not seen the bicycle. This interview ended at 1130 hrs. R/O then discussed TED BUNDY with DETECTIVE DUNN.

- 27 8-27-75 1000 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with Dean SINCLITICO, U.P.S. Law School, Tacoma, phone 756-3324. He stated that the Buckley Amendment prohibits revealing any attendance records of students. BUNDY's name was not mentioned at this time.

35 1500 to 1700 hrs.: R/O had personal contact with 1(d) in this office. LIZ brought with her TED BUNDY's checks for April 1974 which she obtained from his residence without his knowledge. On April 19, 1974 he wrote checks to the Campus Creamery and Ness Flowers, both businesses in the U District. On April 17th, he wrote a \$6.24 check to Ernst Hardware and a \$7.20 check to Q.F.C. Food Stores, both of these are believed to be stores at University Village. The check for Ernst cleared the bank on May 22, 1974 and on April 19th the Q.F.C. check cleared. On April 17th he also wrote a check to Freeway Volkswagen for \$1.03; this check cleared on 4-18-74. He wrote checks to Cain's Rental, phone 525-3450 on April 13th for \$2.63, contract #17395 and on April 29th for \$4.21, contract #17989. He also wrote a check on April 16th to Standard Oil Station #129 in the Univeristy District for \$6.42. In the summer of 1965 TED worked for a saw mill in Tacoma and attended his freshman year of college at the University of Puget Sound. 1(d) did not know what he did in the summer of 66. He attended school at the University of Washington in the Fall of 66 where he lived at McMahon Hall. In 1967 during summer session he went to Stanford and was enrolled in the Chinese Language program. In January 1968 he went to Temple University in Philadelphia and lived with his aunt in Philadelphia. In 1968 in the summer he returned to the University of Washington and according to 1(d) memory attended the University of Washington in the Fall. She does not know what he did in the summer of 1969 and she met him in the Fall of 69. He moved to ROGERS' residence prior to working for Legal Messengers in September of 1969. In 1969 and 1970 Winter Quarter he attended the University of Washington and also attended their Spring Quarter. During Christmas that year he and 1(d) flew to Utah to visit her family. In 1970 he attended summer school at the University of Washington and he may have been working at Pedline Hospital Supply at that time. During that summer he went to Utah with 1(d). He attended the University of Washington in the Fall of 1970 and in the Winter of 1971 he worked at Pedline and attended the University of Washington. Possibly that summer they went to Utah however, it might have been the summer of 72. In the Fall of 1971 TED attended the University of Washington and worked at Pedline and in the Spring of 1972 he graduated from the University of Washington.

In 1972 in the summer he worked at Harborview Hospital in the Mental Health Unit. He dated a girl named SANDY GWINN at that time. Upon completing that he worked for Governor Evans' campaign in Seattle. In the Fall of 72 he began working for the Seattle Crime Commission and in March of 73 began working for the Republican Party in Olympia, to which he commuted. In Sept. of 73 he began Law School at the University of Puget Sound as a night student, he attended Winter and Spring Quarters. His possible schedule was Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for the first semester, leaving Seattle at 5:00 p.m. and returning at 11:00 p.m. Possibly Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday for the second semester, leaving at 5:00 and returning at 11:00 p.m. He didn't go down to the law school just to study, there was a study group here in Seattle and they would go to various houses to study. He would also go to the University Law Library. In the summer of 1974 TED worked for the Dept. of Emergency Services in Olympia, beginning approximately June 11th. He worked on the budget and worked Monday through Friday. Sometimes he would stay at his parent's house, his house, or FREIDA's house - he was usually in Seattle on the weekends. This job lasted until Sept. of 1974. LIZ does not remember what TED did between the end of law school and the Dept. of Emergency Services job but she believes that he did not have a job at that time. He started applying to law schools in his senior year of 1972 and applied to ten. He received one acceptance from the University of Utah but did not want to attend there. He also applied to Berkeley, San Francisco, University of Washington, and possibly University of Oregon, and Willamette University. He re-applied a second time to some of the above. In March of 1974 he called Utah and they said they would accept his application as a new student (this means he would return to Utah as a freshman, not having advised them that he had been a law student the previous year.) TED said that he did not like the commuting atmosphere of the University of Puget Sound Law School. TED did not belong to any outside organizations other than the Republican Party and CHECC. He did not belong to any particular athletic teams although he did visit the intramural building quite often. He was very much interested in hand ball, and would play with whomever might be at the athletic center. He has an aunt in Philadelphia - her name is AUDY, and an uncle in Arkansas. He visited in Utah at Christmas of 1969 where he apparently he drove with her friends and she met him down there. Part of this indicated that he flew to Utah, I believe this information is correct that he drove with some friends of (d) During the summer of 70, (d) and TED drove together to Utah - they would go to Eastern Washington, through Yakima, South through Baker, Oregon, they would not connect through Vancouver or Portland in driving to Utah. Between March and Sept. of 73 he flew to San Francisco on business for the Republican Party. When not at Law School he would usually study/visit with (d) go to the IMA Bldg. with JOHN NEELER who also lived at FREIDA ROGERS' house in the U District. He did not

have a locker at the Intramural Athletic Bldg. He has no brothers or sisters who attend college and no friends at any out of state colleges. His cousin, JOHN, attended the University of Mississippi and also a school in Arkansas. LIZ observed a hatchet under the seat of TED's Volkswagen sometime during the summer of 1974. The hatchet had a pinkish leather cover. TED had obtained his Volkswagen while working for the Seattle Crime Commission. Before obtaining his car he drove LIZ's car or rode his bicycle. [REDACTED] remembers the date she saw the hatchet as she had been to Green Lake with TED that day and had seen it under the driver's seat. At this time [REDACTED] had been thinking that TED BUNDY might be a good suspect in this case, and the hatchet bothered her however, he gave a good explanation for it. She does not remember the explanation at this time. (d) remembers this date as this was right after she had returned from Utah in August of 1974. TED remarked that he was going to get a rifle possibly, this was the day after she returned from Utah. [REDACTED] also observed a cleaver in Sept. of 1974 while observing TED pack to go to Utah, one side had a blade and the other side had bumps as though it were a meat tenderizer item. (d) also observed a knife in TED's possession. (d) describes the knife owned by TED as being brass in a wood carved case; it had a 4" blade and was brown in color. This knife was seen in the glove box of (d) car in March of 1973. He stated it was given to him by SHEILA and MARLIN VORTMAN - they live in Magnolia area by Discovery Park. This knife was in (d) glove compartment of her Volkswagen which is gray, license #OPM 001 until August of 73, when (d) car was stolen. At the time it was recovered TED appeared and having some outstanding traffic warrants he was taken to Seattle P.D. TED also attended a traffic school in 1969. TED met SHEILA and MARLIN through work in Governor Evans' campaign. In TED's trunk he kept a tool box and two pairs of mechanic's overalls. In the Fall of 1973 (d) observed a sack of clothing in TED's room one night while he was at law school. The only piece of clothing she actually observed was a white bra which was a very large size. (d) assumed these to be FREIDA's clothes and did not look at them any further. FREIDA cleaned TED's room every Friday and TED's door was generally unlocked. During 1972 (d) observed a television and stereo in TED's room - TED admitted to her later that he had stolen these things but that he would not do something like that again. (d) also observed an electric typewriter in TED's room which she stated he had bought from the Republican Headquarters. TED is described by (d) as materialistic - he enjoyed listening to music and still has the stereo and TV. In May or June of 1974, LIZ observed crutches in TED's room - TED stated they belonged to ERNST ROGERS, his landlord who had a problem with his feet. TED was going to return them for ERNST or ERNST gave them to him, (d) could not remember. (d) also observed an Ace bandage that TED had obtained when TED broke his foot while going to Temple Univ. She also observed plaster of paris in his room on an occasion.

TED had a friend named TOM SAMPSON who attended Evergreen State but did not live on campus. This was during 1973-74. He lived on a lake close to the campus and TED would visit him on week nights. (d) never met TOM but TOM was employed with TED at the Seattle Crime Commission. TED had a friend named TERRY STORWICK from Ellensburg who attended Central in 72. On one occasion TED drove to Richland and drove (d) car and stopped and stayed with TERRY. TERRY attended Wilson High School and lived in Tacoma. He has since graduated but was living in student housing with his wife in Ellensburg while attending Central. (d) knew of no contacts that TED had at Oregon State Univ. although she believes they went through Corvallis on one occasion when they were returning from Utah and looked around the campus. TED has never done any caretaking for any party. On New Year's of 1974 TED attended a New Year's party at Crystal Mountain at the cabin of a law school friend. He stayed overnight at that time. TED's family has a cabin at Crescent Lake and during 74 the cabin was constructed; prior to that there was a lean-to and tent structure that remained up all year round. (d) visited Crescent Lake approximately three times in the summer of 74. TED's parents go to the cabin often. (d) stated that TED went to Crescent Lake one time overnight to get away from things. To get to the cabin you go through Gig Harbor, the cabin is west of Gig Harbor about 10 - 15 minutes on the lake by some other houses. It takes approximately one and a half hours from Seattle. TED owns a 35 mm. camera but does not develop his own film She saw film cannister with black tape around it on one occasion in his room but did not open it. TED does not have linens in his car and the linens in his room belong to FREIDA ROGERS. He currently owes FREIDA \$500. Once in a while TED would take (d) car overnight and took it on one occasion to Richland. He got in a wreck with it after it was recovered after being stolen in the University District. (d) stated that she had never observed any pornography in TED's room; that birthdays with his family were not particularly special occasions; she could not pinpoint any dates for that reason. She does not know how often TED would skip class but she knew he was in a car pool and one of the girls in the car pool was named MARY PARKS who lives near Ravenna Park in Seattle. There were also two guys in the car pool and that they would study together often. TED took naps during the day and stayed up late at night. He would often sleep in. He went to a laundramat on University Way N.E. on the south side of 45th. He once rented a sail boat but he doesn't own one or have friends that do. Often when out driving, TED would look for roads away from the main roads. He didn't study much on the weekends, did study at the law library at the University of Washington once or twice. And once or twice studied at the University of Puget Sound Law Library. He did go camping on one occasion by Mt. Rainier - he doesn't hunt, fish, hike or back-pack according to (d) One time in 1974 that (d) knows of, TED went skiing at Snoqualmie Pass. He used to ski a lot more and never went away for a skiing weekend. She believes he went to

Crystal skiing also in 74. (d) never noticed any bug bites or scratches on TED's legs - he wore shorts often, had a couple pairs of white shorts. He played tennis a lot at the IMA courts with whomever might be there. She believes he was in Provo, Utah in the Autumn of 74. He also was in Vail prior to their meeting. She believes this was while he was attending Temple University. He had several pairs of shoes - she believed Adidas type tennis shoes with stripes; he also had a pair of Penney loafers. He hurt his ankle on one occasion on (d) front porch - has weak ankles - he saw a doctor regarding that but she does not remember. He never went to a dentist. He repaired his car at Freeway Volkswagen or University Foreign Car. His car was in the shop at University Foreign Car for a couple of days in the Winter of 1974. (d) car is bluish-green with black interior, the seats come out for cleaning purposes, just the front seats however. TED's car is light brown with light brown interior; the seats also come out. He keeps his car very clean according to (d). About two or three years ago TED gave (d) a turquoise ring but other than that there has been no jewelry as gifts. TED went to taverns a couple times a month with JOHN NEELER and sometimes with (d). He did not go to taverns alone very often. He went to O'Banions and Dante's. He drinks beer and scotch and would go with JOHN to the Pipe Line Tavern to pick up girls. TED owns a red back-pack which is nylon, it has two pockets in the front. According to (d) he has had this pack since 1969, it is what is known as a day pack. (d) does not recognize the description of any suitcases or packs taken from any of the victims in this case, or from KAREN SPARKS. His friend, JOHN NEELER worked as a diver possibly at the Aquarium downtown. (d) recalls that on Nov. 8, 1974, TED had called her at approximately 11:00 p.m. in the evening; there was a lot of noise in the background and he stated he had just been to a movie. She remembered that this coincided with the disappearance of a girl in Utah and she recalled this after reading about the girl in the newspaper at the public library. On Oct. 18, 1974, during the evening, TED called (d) three times - he was very excited because he was going deer hunting with (d) father the following day - she remembers his calling her early in the evening at her home; she believes he was at his residence when he called her but she is not sure.

- 36 8-30-75 1000 hrs to 1130 hrs.: R/O had personal contact with MRS. ARNOUD at her residence and obtained a map of the Kent area from BRENDA BALL's possession and a key number B-10 and several telephone numbers.

- 40 1500 hrs.: R/O received phone call from SANDY GWINN, 415-921-1697 - she is employed as manager of the Stanford Court Hotel in San Francisco. SANDY stated that she met TED BUNDY in the Summer of 1972 when she worked with him at Harborview Mental Health. She worked with him for several months and went out with him for about four or five months. She stated that his girlfriend kept threatening suicide and this presented a problem and they broke up. She stated that she saw 1(d) or that 1(d) had come to TED's house when she was in TED's room and this presented quite a problem. She stated they went to Pier 70 and a couple of other restaurants and also a black nightclub. She felt that TED was very concerned about mental health problems. She remembers going on a picnic with him at a river south of Seattle near Olympia - it was a secluded area - they had intended to go to Ocean Shores, however, it was foggy and they had a picnic instead at this other location. They went in SANDY's car as TED did not have a car at the time. She describes TED as being a friendly type. She remembers bike riding at Greenlake with him several times - she remembers one occasion which they drove to Lake Sammamish to look for someone who TED knew but TED wasn't ablt to find the house; she believes it was someone in his family, like a grandmother. She stated that he had some strange attitudes and remembered that he did not have any men friends. She remembered that he did not have a father who was living and was very concerned about a younger sister who had a couple of children she could not support. He told SANDY he felt inferior to her and did not want to come to SANDY's home for that reason. He always wore dark colored clothes, navy and brown. They went sailing on Lake Washington several times after renting a sailboat at Portage Bay. TED loved to sail very much. In the summer after graduation TED worked at Harborview for about six months. SANDY stopped working at Harborview in Sept. of 72 and stopped seeing TED primarily due to 1(d) suicide threats. TED told her he had broken up with 1(d) prior to his seeing SANDY. TED was always broke. On one occasion SANDY went with TED to see Mango Santa Maria near Jackson Street. He enjoyed her dependence on him and enjoyed seeing her hassled by blacks. On one occasions she dropped him off at the corner near 1(d) house because he saw 1(d) go by while he was in SANDY's car. He tried out techniques on patients during counseling but seemed to be without compassion. He was very physically oriented and enjoyed touching SANDY. He had a warm smile but they did not get involved physically. She felt that the

strangest thing about him was that he had no men friends. She describes him as sexually aggressive; that he had several plants in his room and had a great desire to buy a sailboat. She had been to his room approximately six times. She never saw a weapon in his room. She noticed that he belittled himself often and wanted to get a graduate degree in psychology but did not feel he could do so. She believes they went to Alpenthal one time and hiked around, SANDY's parents have a condominium at Alpenthal. They would usually go places for one day at a time, never overnight. SANDY's roommates did not like TED. SANDY was living off Fremont & Evanston N. at the time. She describes TED as being in good physical condition, that he would run often and rode his bike to a lot of places. He also went to the Intramural building a lot. TED did not own a car at the time. TED spoke as an intellectual. SANDY describes his voice as having British overtones. He tried to express himself in very intellectual terms. The last time she saw TED was in Sept. 1972. SANDY left the Seattle area in Feb. 1973 and has been in San Francisco since that time. She also recalled that TED liked to do things that were dangerous because he thought they were fun. During the time they picnicked at the river they went swimming and TED was very much enjoying ducking her. Sometimes SANDY would notice TED staring at her and would notice that he was very friendly to many women. He did not talk about any men in his life unless it was in derogatory manner. He thought his mother was weak and was very concerned for his younger sister. SAM BARRO was TED's supervisor at Harborview Hospital and also a professor at the University of Washington. Approximate time TED and SANDY went out together was between June and September 1972 however, she did not consider him to be a serious boyfriend.

41 9-3-75 0830 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with DET. FORBES who stated that they might not have a line-up regarding BUNDY as they had a witness only to a suspicious circumstance. DEBBIE quit the Dept. of Emergency Services in Dec. 1974. She stated that she felt TED hung around with some strange people. She said he was good looking and attractive and always dressed well. He went to one office party where her girlfriend KAREN JOHNSON, 943-5798, was approached by him for a ride to his car. KAREN took him to his car during which time TED said: "Thank you for letting me spend the night." KAREN told him there was no way he was spending the night with her. TED worked on the budget at the Dept. of Emergency Services and DEBBIE remembers in April of this year some people from Emergency Services went to visit TED in Utah. She remembers that TED was not there every day, sometimes he had to stay and work late and thinks he spent the night in the office a couple of times. She felt that he had to work late because he goofed off when he should have been working, or possibly, the janitor threw some of his files away. He wore jeans on one occasion however, he usually dressed very nice for work.

BUNDY missed several nights of class and she remembers distinctly as the other three missed no nights. Their schedule was to leave at approximately 5:00 p.m. and class was over at approximately 10:45 p.m. They would get home around midnight on Mondays and around 11:00 p.m. on Wednesdays and Fridays, as class ended at 9:35 p.m. on Wed. and Fri. Sometimes TED would go out during school for a hamburger. She described him as being even-tempered. CHRIS SHARPE lives at 1826 NE 91st, Seattle, LA 4-9634, and BILL HARRIS lives at 1812 NE 68th, LA 3-2655.
- 52 9-5-75 0815 hrs.: R/O had phone contact with MILO VIGG, Mason County Sheriff's Office in Colorado regarding TED BUNDY. He advised that on April 6th, TED charged gas or oil in Grand Junction, Colorado. They had a missing girl on April 5, 1975. On Jan. 12, 1975 he was in Glenwood Springs, near Aspen, also at the time a girl disappeared, and on March 15 he bought gas or oil in Silverthorn or Dillon which is one hour from Vail, Colorado. This is also consistent with the disappearance of a missing girl. MILO advised that Salt Lake to Grand Junction is approximately a 6 hour drive. He requested work records from the end of June to the first of July regarding TED BUNDY.
- 53 0900 hrs.: R/O contacted NANCY SCHNAZO, Dept. of Emergency Services and requested information on BUNDY. She will re-contact this office. A few minutes later NANCY SCHNAZO contacted this office with attendance records of TED BUNDY. She advised that BUNDY was employed by the Dept. of Emergency Services on May 23, 1974 to work on the budget. His regular hours were Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. He often worked evenings and a couple of weekends towards the end of his employment. However, he took off early on other times but there is no record of this. Sometimes he would come in late if he worked late the night before. TED BUNDY had a sick day on June 24, 1974, July 1, 1974 he was off without pay. He was sick on July 11 and 12, 1974, and July 15 and 16, 1974. He was paid sick leave for only 3 of these 4 days. She recalls his having a cold on one occasion but cannot place this as being in July. TED BUNDY terminated his employment on August 28, 1974, and had no sick days in August. NANCY believes TED worked a couple of weekends in August, possibly the weekends of the 10th and 17th. The Dept. of Emergency Services flew TED BUNDY back to Tacoma for one day for a

budget hearing as some of the work he had completed was not done as it should have been. The ticket was obtained through Capital World Wide Travel and the number was 0038013205399. Capital Travel is in Lacey, P/N 491-2640. The State Travel Request Number was 25793. The travel request billing date was Sept. 11, 1974 and the travel voucher signed by BUNDY was 9-17-74. There was no premium paid and he flew on Air West. NANCY describes TED as being very nice with a dry sense of humor, however, not very dependable. She did not know whether he was going to come, often, where he was or what he was doing. He was friendly and chatty and usually had a lot of comments to make, however they were not off color. Other persons would wonder whether TED were going to show up or call from the office, and then he would turn up. Most people figured since he was single he kept long hours. NANCY would not be surprised if TED were involved with drugs however she had no personal knowledge of that.

54 9-5-75 0930 hrs.: R/O talked with MILO VIGG and gave him the information he requested. He advised that the District Attorney in their county wanted to know the name of BUNDY's girlfriend. R/O talked with MR. 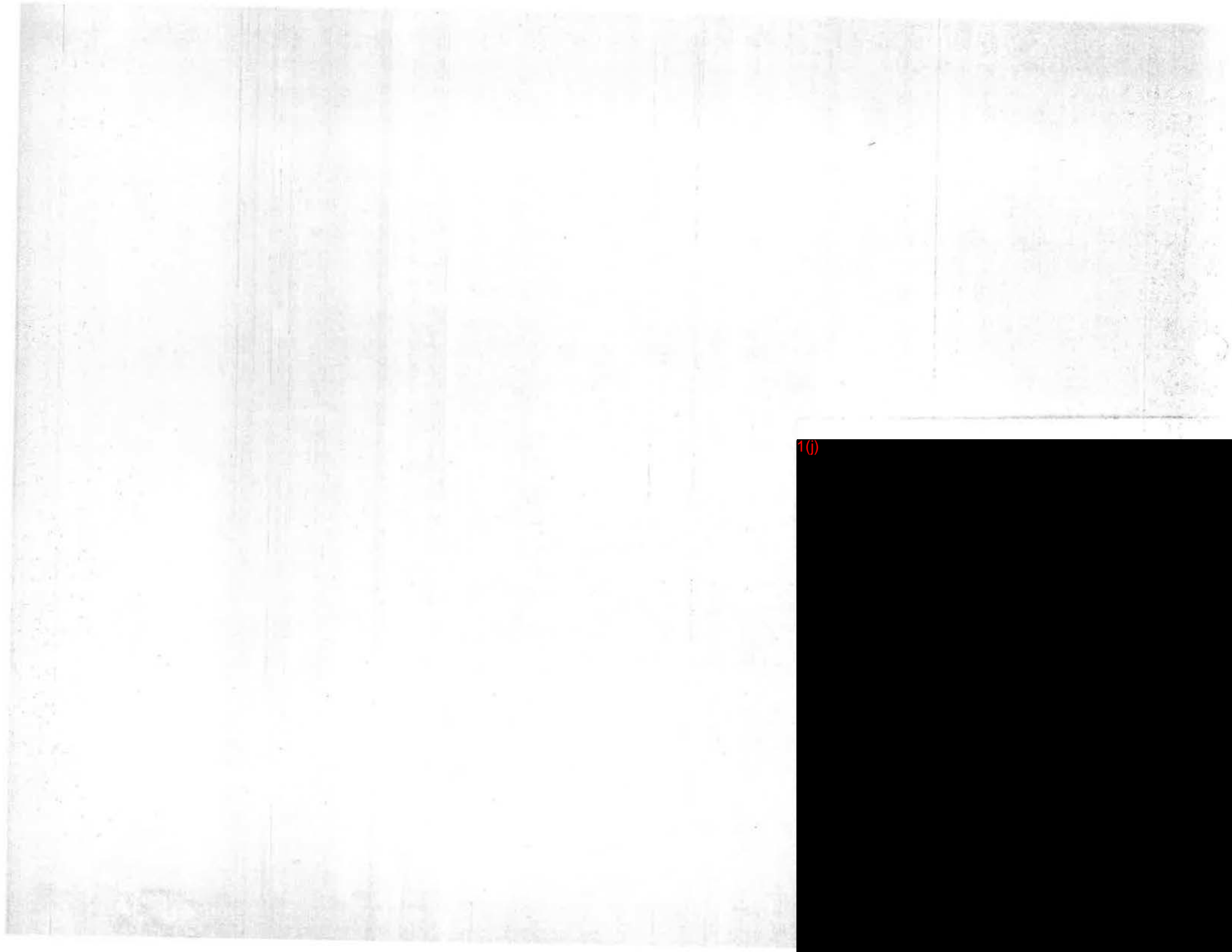





Thought you may be interested in this. On the early morning hours of 8-16-75 BUNDY was spotted by our Patrol Division prowling a residential neighborhood in his brown Volkswagen. When officers attempted to approach him, he fled in his vehicle. When officers placed him under arrest, they found in his vehicle a canvas gym bag containing the items shown in the photograph. Bundy had no reasonable explanation for being in the residential area, nor any explanation for the items in the bag. The patrol officers were not familiar with Bundy's background, and he had been released from jail before this was brought to my attention. However, we are attempting to obtain a warrant on Bundy for Possession of Burglar Tools. If we are successful in this, I will interview Bundy when he is arrested again.

At that time discovered the disappearance of the girl in Salt Lake, this being Melissa Smith, and upon her return to Seattle she contacted ^{1(d)} and told her about the girl missing in Salt Lake being very similar to the ones that had turned up missing in the Seattle area.</p> <p>Mary then left and went to Europe and did not return to Seattle until December. Mary was then asked if she had observed any unusual things or any unusual actions in Ted's actions. Mary was then asked if Ted had ever made any comments to her regarding missing girls in the Seattle area and she stated he had not.

Mary was asked if Ted had ever made any advances toward her sexually and she stated he had not.

Mary then was asked if she knew when 1(d) talked with the Police. She stated she did and 1(d) had talked with her just prior to going to the police and in fact she had kind of encouraged 1(d) to go.

Mary was then asked if she had any ideas as to what type of hair-do's Ted liked or any particular style or type of girl that he liked. She stated he loved long hair and liked to play with 1(d) hair all the time, always running his fingers and hands through it.

Mary was then asked if she knew of any of Ted's friends. She stated Ted did not have very many friends in Seattle. The people she knew that had met Ted saw through him as a phony. Mary was then asked if it would be hard for Ted to start a conversation with a stranger such as picking up a girl. She stated it would be very easy for him to do this as he dressed very well, was a good conversationalist and was very good looking and it would be very easy to strike up a conversation with a strange girl and possibly talk her into going with him.

Mary was then asked if Ted had ever said anything to her or around her in regards to evidence or laws of evidence regarding his work or schooling as an attorney. She stated he had not.

Mary then stated Ted calls all the time from Salt Lake and whenever she is at 1(d) apartment and he calls and 1(d) is not at home he gets quite upset. She also stated that if Ted calls and no one is home at 1(d) apartment he will immediately call her apartment and be very upset because 1(d) is not at home. She stated he is very jealous of 1(d).

Mary was then asked if she knew how Ted was getting his money for his schooling. She stated Ted did not come from a rich family, he did not have very much money. She stated she is sure he steals things to get money, that he lies. She stated she knows he has lied to her and he has also lied to 1(d). Mary then went on to state that one time when they were taking a river trip, that he likes to get down the river into the rapids area and go further than he should deliberately to try and scare the girls that are with him as he just loves to see girls scared.
