Result of examination:

No soil suitable for comparison with K1 through K4 was found in specimens Q2 through Q10.

No hairs dissimilar to the hairs present in the K5 hair sample were found in Q18 or Q19. The Q18 and Q19 hairs in all probability originated from the victim.

No hairs microscopically like those in the K5 hair sample or in the Q20 combings were found in the Q6 through Q8 vacuum sweepings.

No hairs were found in the Q9 through Q15 fingernail scrapings.

The pubic hairs present in the Q20 combings exhibit the same microscopic characteristics and in all probability are of common origin.

It is pointed out that the sex of a hair cannot be determined in the Laboratory.

Several textile fibers were removed from Q9, Q13 and Q14. These include blue cotton fibers, a pink cotton fiber, a red synthetic fiber and a grey synthetic fiber. These fibers have been placed on glass microscope slides for possible future comparison purposes.

Numerous textile fibers of various types and colors were present in the Q6 through Q8 sweepings. These fibers have been placed in pillboxes for possible future comparison purposes.

No blood was identified on Q1.

Grouping tests conducted on the human blood identified on Q10 were inconclusive. Human blood, too limited in amount for conclusive grouping purposes, was identified on Q9 and Q11. Blood, too limited for origin determination or conclusive grouping purposes, was identified on Q16 and Q17. No blood was identified on Q12 through Q15.

No seminal stains were identified on Q20.

The results of the fingerprint examinations and the disposition of the "Also Submitted" evidence will be given in a separate report.

Victim Campbell, and Dr. Gadowski were together downstairs in the inn, prior to her disappearance. Victim Campbell, went up to their room, # 210, to retrieve a magazine. Victim was seen exiting from the elevator on the second floor, and walking toward room # 210. Victim was not seen again.

On Feb. 17, 1975, a nude female body was discovered on rural Owl Creek Road, approx. two and one half (2½) miles from the Wildwood Inn. The body had been dumped over an embankment from the roadway and was covered with snow. The body had apparently been dragged from its original resting place by animals. The body was subsequently transported to Denver, Colo. for autopsy., and identified as that of the victim, Caryn E. Campbell.

On Feb. 26, 1975, a 1975 Ford Maverick rented by an associate of Ms. Campbell and Dr. Gadowski, while in West Village, was secured and examined by Det. Sgt. R. D. Kralicek. An item secured as evidence at that time, is being forwarded to the F.B.I. laboratory for examination.

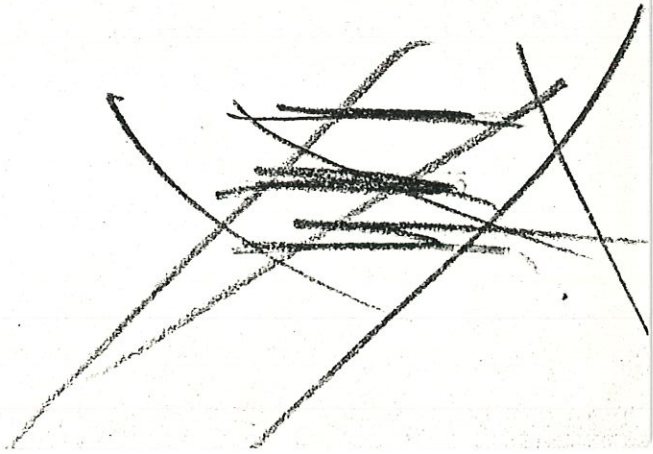

Body was taken to Denver for autopsy and was identified by Pathologist as being that of victim, Caryn E. Campbell.

One red-brown head hair of Caucasian origin was found among the hairs previously recovered from specimen Q22 which is microscopically like many of the hairs of specimen K4. Accordingly, this hair either originated from the person represented by K4 or from some other individual of the Caucasian race whose head hairs exhibit the same microscopic characteristics.

Numerous hairs of Caucasian origin were found either in or on specimens Q28 through Q33. No hairs were found in specimen Q34. None of the aforementioned hairs were found to be microscopically like the hairs of specimen K4.

Previously your lab has conducted several tests in regards to this same case; refer to your file numbers PC-L4197 KT, dated 12-11-74, and PC-L3330 KT NX, dated 11-7-74. Since that time, we have developed the above suspect in this case. He is also now a suspect in several of the murders in the Seattle, Washington area, the Colorado area, Utah, and parts of California. All of these cases are similar in the fact that all the girls matched the same description, they were all found nude, they were all beaten about the head and strangled.

We now have the suspect's 1968 Volkswagen Bug, and we are attempting to link the subject and any of the victims to this car. We have been able to place this subject in California, Washington, Utah, and Colorado at the times the girls showed up missing. Before we obtained the automobile, it had been sold by the subject to a young high school student who had it approximately two weeks before our seizure. We are not sending you all of the hair samples of all the victims as there are too many at this time. If you do locate any human hair or human blood from your examinations, we will at that time send you anything that comes close to your findings.



On the same evening in Bountiful, Utah, Debbie Kent turned up missing from a high school play in Bountiful. No trace of her has ever been found. In the parking lot of the high school was found Q-3, a handcuff key.



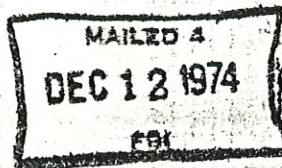

No semen was found on specimens Q1 through Q4.

There were no hairs found among the debris from the submitted fingernail clippings; however, a few textile fiber fragments were found on these specimens. Most of these fibers consist of blue cotton fragments and, additionally, one light green cotton fiber, one red cotton fiber and one green woolen fiber were also found. Due to their size, these fiber fragments are of limited value for microscopic comparison purposes.

A number of brown pubic hairs of Caucasian origin were found in specimen Q10. None of these hairs appeared to be markedly dissimilar, with respect to microscopic characteristics, to the remaining hairs. It would, therefore, appear that most if not all of these hairs originated from the victim's body; however, in the event a suspect is developed, a known pubic hair sample should be submitted for further comparisons with the Q10 combings.

No extraneous debris was found on specimen Q11.

Result of examination:

The hairs mounted on the resubmitted glass microscope slides are pubic hairs from the person of MELISSA SMITH. You are referred to the FBI Laboratory report dated December 12, 1974 (PC-L3330 KT) in which this hair sample is originally listed.

Several light brown head hairs of Caucasian origin were found among the debris taken from specimens Q39 and Q48. In the absence of pubic hairs in this debris, no microscopic comparisons could be conducted with the K2 hairs.

The aforementioned light brown head hairs were microscopically compared with known head hair samples from homicide victims SHELLEY ROBINSON, JULIE CUNNINGHAM and CAROL DA RONCH. None of the head hair samples from these individuals were microscopically like the head hairs found on specimens Q39 and Q48.

A review of prior laboratory reports relating to the suspect, THEODORE R. BUNDY, and submissions of physical evidence in homicide investigations of other jurisdictions fails to suggest the possibility of additional comparisons between the submitted specimens and items submitted by such jurisdictions.

No blood was found on specimens Q39 through Q49.



One brown pubic hair of Caucasian origin was found in specimen Q35. A single hair is not a sufficient sample for use in conducting a significant microscopic comparison with the questioned hairs previously recovered from the automobile.

Numerous light brown to brown head hairs of Caucasian origin were found in specimens Q35, Q37 and Q38. Some of these hairs exhibit areas of bleaching and, in some instances, artificial coloration. None of the previously recovered hairs from the suspect's automobile were found to be microscopically like the aforementioned head hairs.


On August 16, 1975, the above subject was pulled over on the west side of Salt Lake City as a suspicious vehicle by Sgt. Bob Hayward of the Utah Highway Patrol. In the back seat of the subject's Volkswagen was the brown gym bag containing the above items.

Through investigation it has been confirmed that the above subject did own and operate this vehicle at the times the homicides he is suspected of committing did go down.

Also, the above subject Theodore Bundy was found guilty of Aggravated Kidnap of Carol DaRonch on 3-1-76 and is at present waiting to be sentenced. Under Utah law, he could receive a sentence of from 5 years to life imprisonment. This is for your information.
