Subject: Newspaper clues found by us recently at the Taylor Mountain site that (if the Bellevue American with the photo of [REDACTED] or the previous newspapers found by us at the Issaquah site had any relevance to your case) will help further your investigation.

On Monday July 21, 1975 we searched the brush at the Taylor Mountain site and discovered in various locations:

(1) A weathered May 7, 1975 Wednesday Homemaker's Edition of the Bellevue American. Two dried sunflower heads with numerous small ants crawling throughout the paper were on top of the Crossroads Courier section that was folded open to page 4. This page has been repeatedly stabbed through with a slim double-bladelike knife with a 1½ inch-wide blade. A photo of a girl on this page makes us wonder (granted that "Ted's" identity has previously been revealed in this newspaper-deposit manner) whether this is the woman at the Lake Sammamish State Park restroom in the bikini last seen with Denise Naslund and who could possibly have enticed Denise off. At any rate we feel something on this page has prominence in the case in some way. Missing from the Crossroads section of this paper are pages 1, 2, 7, and 8. Page 5 of the Crossroads section was slashed through even many more times; this is a Lamonts full-page advertisement (Further along in this letter you will note that another Lamonts ad in another newspaper has also been slashed into with a knife). Because of the weathered condition of the Crossroads section found, we have enclosed here a similar section of that paper with the woman in question's photo that we purchased Tuesday July 22, 1975 at the Bellevue American office.

Below the Crossroads section of the May 7, 1975 Bellevue American was the main Homemaker's edition of this same paper. It had been widely knifed into near the center of the paper and on through several pages. On page 18 there is a dime-sized ink-bottle ink splotch at the corner of the Homefinder's ad that has a sketch of a Sherlock Holmes holding his pipe in one hand and a magnifying glass in the other. The clue planter seemingly thinks he's a joker, too. This ink spot has soaked through several other pages, so it has not been made by the printer's ink.

(2) Our second find on the Taylor Mountain site was in the brush further south than the other. It was pages 1 through 4 of section D of the Wednesday May 28, 1975 Seattle Times alongside of a used sanitary napkin and a couple of squares of pink toilet paper. We researched other sections of this paper and found a story on page G1 to which possibly if there is a clue it refers. The story is about one woman's being raped and on another's being assaulted with a knife and slashed on the face and hand as she fled her attacker. Even if this Seattle Times story on rape and knife assault refers to a black it could still fit in this case in as we have perceived a 6' slender, neat-appearing, athletic black with relatively fine features and

shorter-than-usual Afro-American-style hair leaving the " [REDACTED] " house at 5319-9th Ave. N.E. But more solidly we feel the sanitary napkin is a clue to a woman's involvement as an accomplice in this case.

(3) Our third find was even still further south than the second and in the brush, where there were several pages of section F part 2 of the Sunday May 18, 1975 Seattle Times along with a cardboard Marlboro cigarette pack with two unused cigarettes inside. The newspaper was stabbed through twice at the bottom of page F12—which is a Lamont full-page ad (this is the second Lamont ad we've found knifed through). Also the Cole's Marina ad on page F2 has at right angles been slightly pricked through twice by a knife—resulting in an X-like puncture. The ad:

This is the third cluelike item we have discovered concerning boats (the first being ads in a newspaper found with the [REDACTED] photo; the second being a deteriorated boat brochure we had notified you of in our letter dated June 16, 1975).


We have searched wooded areas continually for the remains not left at Taylor Mountain. But since we have heard that only jawbones were found there and we have discovered repeated clues pertaining to boats, we have come to feel that the other remains (including clothing and the Ott girl's bicycle) are somewhere under water. Fishermen string fish through the gills or jawbone and morbid as it sounds—if the girls had thus been treated with their bodies weighted to the bottom below a boat moored somewhere, then only strung jawbones would remain after a period of time. After the Ball girl's disappearance such a mode of disposal seemingly wasn't available to the murderer(s?). We don't know if the Cole's Marina ad knifed through gives clue to the spot where the presumed boat was moored. But if a suspect worked there during the first half of 1974, it is well a possibility the remains would still be at the bottom since there is no tide-water there. Or is it that the boat is of the type mentioned in the ad? Or is it still being just inferred that there is a boat involved?...

(4) We searched the Taylor Mountain site further through the week and made a fourth find on Thursday July 24, 1975 further south yet and just west of the explosion-area gate. It was a copy of the Columbian Comics (funny-papers) from the Saturday February 20, 1971 New Westminster, The Columbian. It had been torn and mutilated badly (possibly by a knife), but its weathered condition seemed not as bad as the papers mentioned above. The front section has a story on a character, Johnny Hazard—who in the story finds a young woman dead. It is a Canadian publication and we think it relevant (the suspect at Lake Sammamish State Park reportedly had a slight British accent and according to newspaper accounts six young women in British Columbia were murdered by a killer as of yet unknown).

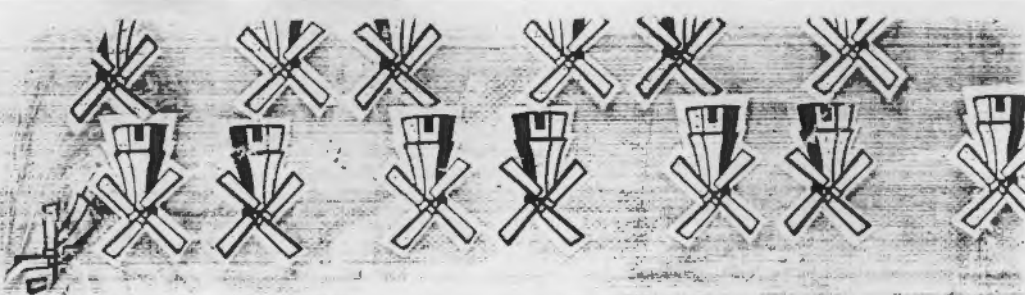

Plant Tips by Connie Reneau of Green Earth Plants

FERN
BOSTON FERN NEPHRO-
LEPIS EXALATA BOSTON-
ENSIS

Ferns are not the easiest plants for you to grow indoors. Keep this in mind before you buy one. I went through a few Bostons before I could grow one successfully. Now, however, I have no problem growing them. Sometimes it seems to take a while to get used to the requirements of different plants, so if you were unsuccessful growing a Boston, you might want to try it again.

Most of the books you buy on Ferns will tell you they like indirect light to shade. Keep in mind that most books on plants were written in California and Florida; where the growing season is longer, the light more intense, and the humidity is different. Here in Washington, we only have about a five month growing season. Then our light fades and our heaters are turned on. In Washington, I have found

good light and cooler temperatures are essential in growing ferns. Keeping this in mind, it is best never to place a fern in the same area (or within reasonable distance) where there is a heat register. Because their fronds are so sensitive to the touch, they prefer to be hanging or in a stand of their own. They need good air circulation around them. Remember, if you have them hanging, that the air is much warmer (heat travels up) closer to your ceiling, and take care to mist as often as you like every day. (Or do the deep dish method; refer to humidity) Misting does not take the place of watering. Check your ferns every three to four days to see if the surface soil is getting dry. You may want to submerge the pot in your sink or tub once a week to give it a good soaking. If it dries out during the week, water it from the top until you see water coming through the drainage holes. That brings up another important point with ferns... it is very important

that your fern has proper drainage. Be sure you put your fern into a pot with a drainage hole at the bottom. I prefer plastic pots with ferns because they tend to hold in the moisture, but you can put them in nearly any kind of container as long as it has a hole in the bottom.

Light is important in growing nice looking ferns!! West exposure is generally a good light source for them. South exposure would be good also, but remember to pull your shade during the warmer part of the day. Even an East exposure will do if there are no trees or buildings close by to block the light.

Once a week or so, take your fern down and prune off any brown leaves or browning tips... Sometimes the light cannot get through to all of the fronds and they die back as there is new growth. The tips turn brown from lack of humidity (misting will help, but since the temperature is warmer in your home, you will probably have some brown tips.)

So, a quick review on how to grow these ferns successfully is:

1. Cooler temperatures... not freezing.
2. A pot with good drainage
3. Keep your ferns moist... check new growth in the center of fern, if the tips are turning black, cut back on water. You can overwater your fern if it isn't in enough light for the amount of watering it gets, or if it is standing in water for any length of time.
4. Good light... Be sure if your plant is hanging that the center of the plant is getting good light.
5. Mist daily as often as you like. Or do the "Deep dish method"
6. Be practical... don't do strange things to your ferns (like putting ice cubes in her soil) Think before letting anyone talk you into doing something with your fern because it works for them. It

may not work for your fern. Go by the directions on your fertilizer. Don't use more because your best friend did and her fern looks great.

7. Prune up your fern occasionally.

Sometimes ferns turn a grayish-green color if they haven't been watered enough. Try watering more and in a couple of weeks or a month, your fern should be good and green.

These rules can be applied to lots of ferns... Whitmanii, Roosevelti and Fluffy Ruffles, etc.

"A plant uses water based on how much light it receives; the more light it gets, the more water it needs. HOWEVER, there are some exceptions, such as cacti, and succulents, etc.

Speaking of FLUFFY RUFFLES, remember to do the "deep dish method" for humidity. They tend to get very brown if this element is lacking. Misting generally doesn't give them enough. Otherwise, treat them the same as your Boston... they're of the same family.

BIRDSNEST FERN ASPLENIUM NIDUS

This fern is so much fun!! You can almost watch the fronds grow from the center of the fern, uncurling in the prettiest color green. North exposure is fine for this guy, and if you keep the soil moist (don't let him stand in water for any length of time) and do the "deep dish method", he'll grow like crazy for you.

MAIDENHAIR FERN ADIANTUM

This fern likes cooler temperatures and will do well in a North or East exposure. (150 foot-candles or more). There are many different varieties, all of them dainty with wedge-shaped leaflets about 1/4 to 1/2 inches across on wire-like stems. Keep the humidity high (deep-dish method) and water when the surface soil feels dry to the touch. Maidenheads go dormant at times... so if one whole frond turns brown and dies back, go ahead and cut that frond off (leaving an inch or so of stem) and another will grow to replace it.

HARE'S FOOT FERN POLYPODIUM

Grows from rhizomes that creep along the top of the soil. Because the rhizomes are on top of the soil and do not penetrate deeply, the plants do not need deep pots. Keep the soil moist and get this fern in good light... East or West

exposure is best. When you report, don't bury the rhizomes, instead you can pin them to the soil with pieces of bent wire until they form new roots. New ferns will grow up from the rhizomes. If you like different kinds of ferns... this one is a must.

"The other side of the Mountain"

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE MOUNTAIN, a film about the life of Jill Kinmont will open an exclusive engagement at the Crossroads Cinema on May 23.

In 1955, Miss Kinmont was slalom champion in both women's and junior divisions. She slid into the starting gate for the Snow Cup at Alta, Utah, knowing she had to win to make the 1956 Winter Olympics Team.

As she zigzagged down the course, she picked up speed, careening into the hazardous corkscrew turn at 60 m.p.h. She was thrown into the air. Only years of intense physical discipline kept her on a middle path between two trees, but then she went out of control crashing into a bystander. A strange vibration shot through her body and when she stopped, she was paralyzed from the neck down. She thought she was dying. As a result of that accident, she has since lived her life as a quadriplegic.

Miss Kinmont has known many tragedies in her life.

Shortly after her accident, her fiancé, (Olympic skier, Dick Buck) played by Beau Bridges in the film was killed in a plane crash. Before her accident, another romance, Olympic skier Buddy Werner (played by Bill Vant) was killed in an avalanche in Europe.

Despite these setbacks, in 1967 she became a TIMES "Woman of the Year" for her work in teaching remedial reading to children at the Hawthorn School in Beverly Hills. LIFE magazine profiled her work with the Indian children in Bishop.

Miss Kinmont was a East-side resident for awhile, and taught for the Mercer Island School District. Her friends are sponsoring a benefit of THE OTHER SIDE OF THE MOUNTAIN on Wednesday evening, May 28. Tickets are \$4.00 with proceeds going to Jill's summer school for Indian children. Street Fair Coming

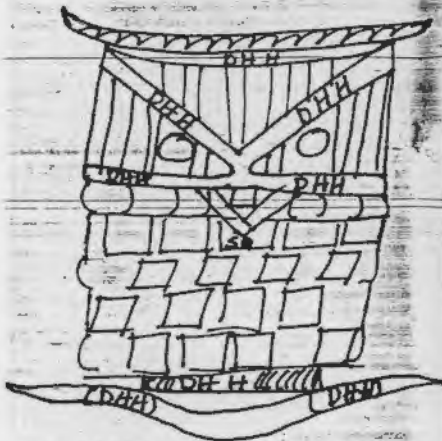

SUBJECT: A tying together of the case of the missing girls found dead and the case of the girls being knifed to death.

At 6:00 P.M. on Monday April 28, 1975, after searching the ridge above the Issaquah "site" for the Ott bicycle and related articles to her disappearance, I found at the entrance of the dirt road off the "old highway" and 500' in from I-90 a copy of the February 17, 1975 Post Intelligencer folded into a quarter of its size and placed in view beneath a cable that was anchored to a log, the paper evidently slashed on the front by a knife.

Nothing was denoted by ink or was readily apparent as had been the photo of [redacted] or the marked "ads" in the previous papers found on the site. The sports pages were missing and similar copies of the sports pages of this stated issue inform of Senior Soccer results, [redacted] activity.

Of the classified section, several gaps had been without care torn or knifed out and were missing. We have outlined for you on photostates here enclosed what was missing in the discovered newspaper.

As the paper was found on the Issaquah "site" and only two days previous to its publication Diana Maria Peterson was murdered and considering that the torn-out sections in the paper advertised homes in her general district, we thought it important to bring this all to your attention. At the time the paper was dated the cause of the Peterson girl's death was being withheld by the King County Police.

As to the suspect whose photo is in the March 7, 1974 Bellview American that was found by us on the Issaquah murder site, one [redacted], a soccer player, we have discovered listed in the University of Washington Student Directory (1974-1975) as [redacted] a non-matriculated student who is listed as living at 5 [redacted] 9th Ave. NE., his phone as 525-[redacted]. SUBJECT: Probable address of the Ted-Zodiac individual or individuals.

Wednesday, July 30, 1975 we were following clues on the Taylor Mountain site that we informed you of in our last letter dated July 28, 1975. Referring to that letter, behind the location of clue #(1) we further found an empty Marlboro cigarette pack. We have already informed you in clue #(3) of this previous letter that there was found a Marlboro pack with two cigarettes in it along with a newspaper with a Lamonts ad knifed through and a Cole's Marina ad marked X-like with a knife. The Cole's Marina ad led us to that business at 1220 Westlake N., where we found a sign on the window: ZODIAC/SEATTLE, a find which Mrs. Hoxsey notified Detective O'Shaughnessy about by phone at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday July 30, 1975.

Searching the Taylor Mountain site further, we followed on a line with clue #(1), clue #(2) and clue #(3) to an area up in the brush and east of the off-shoot road and to just west of that point marked by the Explorer Search & Rescue Seattle Unit Line #50 Team as Search Base 000. There we found a nearly completely dumped-open garbage bag with two empty Marlboro cigarette packs conspicuously present in an open spot in the center of the garbage along with an empty match book with the Zodiac designation—CANCER.

There was the usual rubbish (empty cans and paper plates), but mostly there lay colorful Christmas wrapping paper in all of its gaiety. One Bon Marche sale paper with torn, possibly knifed holes advertising a November 14, 15, and 16 sale contained an address:

Gift tags (some of which were attached to the wrapping paper) were scribed:

To Raymond from Aunt Wilma—To Laurie from Gayle—To Ray from Steve—To Ray from Wilma—From family to Ray—To Ray from Skeets—To Kelly from Bart and Benny—To Mom from Laurie—To Kelly from Lil and Fred—To Raymond from family—To Gayle love Benny, Barb—To Dad from (Illegible; something like Garcus)—To Mom from girl's and Ray Jr.—To Gayle love Benny & Barb.—To Mommy love Benny, Barb, Girls, Ray Jr. A torn-in-half letter from a Kelly was also present in the garbage.

Part of one bone was in the garbage that we still aren't positive isn't human from checking Cunningham's Textbook of Anatomy and Last's book entitled Anatomy and House's Review of Gross Anatomy. This partial bone is being delivered to you detectives with this letter. If it is a human bone, you have an 100% chance of finding the Ted-Zodiac killer(s?) at 11 [REDACTED] SE 272nd. But even if it isn't human, we still feel the chances of finding such individuals there are potentially great. We believe that our following the clues being planted will eventually lead us all to the killer(s?). We hope this is that time.

Checking the above address in question, we found that the only house with such a numbered order is at 11 [REDACTED] 272nd Pl. SE., where there were parked a white Plymouth licenced AZP [REDACTED]; a brown GTO licenced OAD [REDACTED]; and a green sedan licenced OZO [REDACTED], this latter

car with a Western Music bumper-sticker on the rear.

A separate finding we made on the Issaquah site on Friday May 23, 1975 at 2:00 p.m., we feel concerns a missing girl, Marilyn Straight—who was last seen at Glacier High School at 8:00 p.m. Monday May 5, 1975. We had found 200 feet in from the eastern access from I-90 a May 19, 1975 Post-Intelligencer knifed through on page B11, along with a separated May 19, 1975 Lamonts Westwood store ad section from that P.I. (The suspect has to have either recently worked at or is working at a Lamonts store—probably the Westwood Village store—this being the third reference he has made to Lamonts; the others done so by knifing Lamonts advertisements). Also found with the May 23, 1975 Post-Intelligencer was a sportspage of the May 5, 1975 Post-Intelligencer. We referenced the papers but could find no relevance until we saw a circular last Friday calling attention to a Marilyn Straight. Also found with the Post-Intelligencer of these two dates were various rain-wetted litter items (one a Beemans gum wrapper).

On Friday May 30, 1975 at 5:00 p.m. at the Issaquah site we found a Beemans gum wrapper where one a week before hadn't been at the entrance to the dirt road 500 feet in from the west access to I-90, at a place we had previously found a knifed newspaper. We don't believe this gum wrapper has ever been wet and if you care to you might find (besides for the prints where Mr. Hoxsey handled it) other prints on this gum wrapper. The gum wrapper in a plastic bag accompanies this letter.

But please investigate the residents at 11 [redacted] SE 272nd. This very well could be the long-awaited end of all of our searching. But as far as charging someone with littering, we want to stay aloof from and not get involved into something so petty. Unless you need it as some sort of a lever, please don't make such a charge. If and when you press charges concerning what has happened to the girls, then we are behind you as fully as possible.

On Wednesday July 9, 1975 at 5:30 PM we found an August 1 1974 Post-Intelligencer sportspage within twenty feet of where the paper with the [REDACTED] photo had been found. The paper was not there when we checked the Issaquah site on June 30, 1975. A corner of this August 1, 1974 paper has seemingly been sliced out. A photostat is enclosed here of another section from that paper—from page A 3. It refers to the New York case involving Karen Levy.

The Monday June 30, 1975 P.I. (page A9) has a story on cultlike killings of cattle in various states, the article mainly relating to those cattle recently mutilated in Idaho. On Sunday June 29, 1975 an old blue pickup truck with an Idaho licence number N 28 [REDACTED] began showing up in front of the house at 5 [REDACTED]-9th Ave. N.E. (a house which has a "[REDACTED]" address). The truck has been there steadily ever since—although since the middle of June the other automobiles connected with the house have been gone for long periods at a time. And on July 11, 1975 a brown compact car with an Idaho licence N 29 [REDACTED] began being parked at that house, sometimes in the driveway. As far as we have seen, this car also has been there nightly ever since.

Subject: An offer of our knowledge of those we consider suspicious in regard to the disappearance of women in the Greater Seattle area.

We have two trained German shepherds for tracking and weekday afternoons up until the discovery of the remains outside Issaquah near Interstate 90, we had searched alongside utility swaths south of Lake Sammamish. One individual met along a gas pipeline swath east of the Cedar Hills Alcoholism Treatment Center had some of the features of the composite of the suspect known as "Ted." This man gave his name as [REDACTED]. He said he was unemployed and looking for work driving heavy trucks, something he explained he was trained to do. He said his wife worked part-time in a doctor's office. He gave his age as twenty-five and claimed to have no permanent address as he was unsettled, living somewhere down the road near where it joins the highway between Hobart and Issaquah.

He was scavenging alderwood to sell to homeowners. He had a 3/4 ton surplus army truck, license number U56 [REDACTED] and he said he owned a Volkswagen. He knows the woods around Issaquah very well and was unusually well-versed on hand-guns. He said he had a rifle in his truck. Repeatedly he interjected into the conversation for some unknown reason that he did not use drugs. He said he hadn't attended college but by his polish, charm, and vocabulary he could pass as a top graduate. He revealed he had been arrested and incarcerated for two weeks—then moderated it and said it was only for half an hour. He seemed very nervous about something back in the woods behind where his truck was parked and when the dogs headed intently back there he seemed nearly scared, saying that they were probably going after deer. He was obviously much relieved when they finally returned.

NR Considering what we have stated above and examining on a map the location of where [REDACTED] said he lived and the areas where the human remains of the various girls have been found and the proximity to where one David Adam disappeared in 1968, we feel there is ample reason for you to consider [REDACTED] in your investigation.

On weekends since the "Ted" suspect was disclosed and until autumn we spent much time watching for such a person at a spot at the head of the bird-sanctuary walk under the Evergreen Bridge near the Museum Of History and Industry. We had theorized that if such a one as "Ted" existed and was actively prowling for young ladies, he would finally pass our way. And a strong likeness of the suspect did on the day before the Seafare Races. In fact, he hung around us for over three hours, not too obnoxiously so but due to his likeness of all three composites—disconcertingly so. We tried to be friendly and he was most engaging, he supposedly much in admiration of our dogs.

As he was leaving, we gave our names and inquired his. [REDACTED] was the one he gave. Memorable facts discerned during the conversation: He resided at the Scandinavian House, learning Swedish that way. His home was near Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He was taking sailing lessons at the University of Washington. He was in the School of Fisheries there. He had attended the U.W. since the autumn of 1973. At the time we saw him he said he was taking plant samples for a botany class. He had a large athletic bag stuffed smoothly as though it were full of clothing. Our dogs repeatedly sniffed the bag, he saying that it was because of a sandwich inside.

Mrs. Hoxsey seated herself off in a shady spot and the individual viewed her walking off very unhappily. Mr. Hoxsey told him she sunburned easily and the individual followed over to where Mr. Hoxsey settled between Mrs. Hoxsey and the individual. He towered over us seemingly threateningly. Then he asked if we were interested in athletics. Mr. Hoxsey is an ex-professional boxer, having earned his way through college that way, and upon the relating of this, the individual became friendlier again and squatted down on the ground. Then we learned he was a trackman and had worked for the concessions at the Olympic Games in Munich. Because of the time coincidence of the Olympics and the Syracuse, N.Y. case, along with his tenor at the U.W. and his sailing lessons and his identical resemblance to the composites, we thought it worth your while to check out this individual—[REDACTED]

NR In the spring of 1968, we had participated in an extensive search for a lost boy south of Issaquah, David Adam. Information elicited regarding one [REDACTED] during that search we related to Detective Steinhauer in a letter dated May 9, 1968. We still have a copy of the letter. At that time [REDACTED] was about nineteen years of age. He was then purportedly out of the U.S. Navy because of psychological problems, and the last we heard of him the county police were interested in his submitting to a polygraph test. As far as we know, the disappearance of David Adam remains unsolved. Since remains of missing young ladies are being found in the same geographic area, we think it would be worth your considering investigating [REDACTED] further.

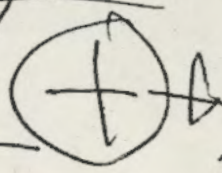

A man calling himself Bill Lacy responded. He claimed he was in Syracuse on business and was heading back to the Monmouth area. His description was very similar to that of Ted.

King County police said yesterday that it would be a "farout shot" if there is a link between the New York and Washington cases. But they emphasized that no leads in the case will go uninvestigated.

Lt. Richard Kraske of the county homicide and robbery unit said that his investigators have already interviewed 1,205 people in connection with the missing Washington women.

A man calling himself Bill Lacy responded. He claimed he was in Syracuse on business and was heading back to the Monmouth area. His description was very similar to that of Ted.

King County police said yesterday that it would be a "farout shot" if there is a link between the New York and Washington cases. But they emphasized that no leads in the case will go uninvestigated.

Lt. Richard Kraske of the county homicide and robbery unit said that his investigators have already interviewed 1,205 people in connection with the missing Washington women.

The Reward

I have previously sent you the "mug" shot of [REDACTED] as a long shot suspect in the case involving the girls.

[REDACTED] first came to my attention when I was approached by a local Bail Bondsman regarding his having fled our jurisdiction on an indecent exposure charge which charge is a felony charge here in Pierce County.

Upon being bailed out he failed to appear at his arraignment date and the bond has been declared forfeited and a Bench Warrant has been issued for his arrest, with no bail set.

I have taken it upon myself to investigate this man in an attempt to find him for the Bonding Company. As a result of my investigation and because of certain coincidences, I am report it to you as a lead and as a possible suspect in the slayings of the girls.

Mr. [REDACTED] was convicted last summer in Snohomish County of Kidnapping in the Second Degree. He was initially charged with kidnapping and 2° involving a young boy and a young girl. He is alleged to have taken a young girl and young boy into the woods and taking their clothes off for sexual purposes. He was placed on a sexual offender program and ordered to report to Western State Hospital. He came to our County where he committed the offense of indecent exposure again involving a young child and upon being bailed out, dropped from sight.

He has a background of sexual offenses in Oregon. He has been in mental institutions in Oregon for sex offenses. This man is described by various authorities as being dangerous. He has an arrest in Salt Lake City for carrying a concealed weapon.

He was convicted in Multnomah County in November of 1972 for grand larceny involving the theft of an automobile. He is described psychiatrically as a border line "schizophrenic". There is a report of this individual talking to young children around schools in Seattle. One of his methods is to apply to a school for employment and use this as a pretext to talk to children.

He has hair which is described as blond, and can be blond or bleached depending on his whim.

He is presently missing from the Western State Hospital and from the Sexual Offender Program. One of our informers relates that he has contact with a social worker or case worker in the University of Washington area. He, therefore, has some association with the University or colleges.

As I informed you previously he is from South Bend, Oregon. As I informed you previously, I have information that he is presently in California working as an attendant in a hospital. I am reporting this to you because of the following coincidences.

One: His name is [REDACTED]; the nickname for [REDACTED] is "Ted".

Two: This individual has associations with colleges.

Three: He is from ~~South~~ ^{NORTH} Bend, Oregon and the bodies were found at North Bend, Washington.

Four: He is knowledgeable about hospitals being an attendant in one presently, and therefore knows how to apply a cast.

Five: I believe his physical description is consistent with the suspect.

Six: This man is a dangerous deviant.
