Gentlemen:

This officer interviewed a [REDACTED], age 16, at Green Hill School for Boys, Chehalis, Washington. [REDACTED] was committed to the institution in December, 1974, for Burglary in Chelan County, and as a result of his arrest, [REDACTED], dob 12-[REDACTED]-42, of Wenatchee was charged with Receiving Stolen Property and was sentenced to 15 years.

During the summer of 1974, [REDACTED] was with [REDACTED] in Seattle, visiting [REDACTED] brother, [REDACTED]. This visit was in June-July of '74. At this time, [REDACTED] told his brother of an individual that had ripped him off for one pound of grass and that he ([REDACTED]) had taken care of him.

[REDACTED] went on to say that [REDACTED] had drowned the subject in Lake Washington and that it would be some time before the body was found, according to [REDACTED]. No name was ever mentioned regarding the alleged victim.

Hope you find this information useful, as the boy seemed sincere about the story.

Either way, this department would appreciate knowing what is found out through investigation.

He is approximately 5'9", 155#, blonde, longer hair than average and has some resemblance to the composite that you have in the newspapers etc. This guy has been involved with drugs, off and on and evidently has worked for a veterinary by the name of Bean, Howard, 3714 Rainier Ave. South. Evidently [REDACTED] has burglarized Bean on numerous occasions and Bean would not prosecute, which would lead me to believe that there might be some sort of clandestine relationship between the two.

Recently, Case #75-18617, Bean names [REDACTED] as being the suspect again, and this time said that besides taking different forms of drugs, nebutal, etc., he also took a 9 Amp 1½ H.P. power plane, which infuriated Bean, so now he wants to prosecute. Amongst the things taken in the burglary were also surgical instruments, forceps, scalpels, etc. Bean indicated [REDACTED] had an interest in dissection cutting, surgery and that sort of thing.

I talked to [REDACTED]'s parole officer, Raetzloff, Nancy, phone is 464-6909, she said that [REDACTED] evidently speaks with an English accent as does your Ted, and that he used to work for Washington State Highway Dept. as a grounds keeper. [REDACTED] was arrested on 3/19/75 on traffic warrants so there's probably a fairly recent photograph of him in file. I know you are deluged with material like this but I thought this little here might help.



On September 24, 1974 one Mrs. Doris Dwyer of our city indicated that she could identify a subject wanted by your city for questioning in a disappearance of eight teenage girls.

She went on to say, the composite picture as displayed in People's Magazine, September 9th issue, page 10, looked like a boy she had dated in Quebec Province.

Mrs. Dwyer gave a description as follows:

[REDACTED], "Ted", age about 28, Loreteville, Quebec Province, Canada. 5'7", blonde hair, medium build, 140 lbs. Spoke with a slight accent, combination - Canadian, English and French, spoke fluent english & french.

Mrs. Dwyer indicated although she had not seen him in 8 or 9 years she would feel remiss if she did not bring this to the attention of the police department. 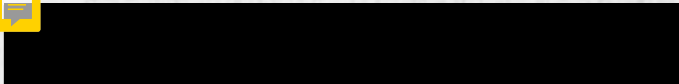

[REDACTED] has been in Western State Hospital Sexual Offender program since Aug. 13, 1974. During this period he had keys so could leave and return at will. Prior to July 29, 1974 arrest for Abduction and foreseeable rape our county had been in our area only a few weeks having moved here from the King County Area. Prior history between 11-13-72 and to late May 1974 he has been principally in the King County area.

He has failed in the program at Western State due to failure to respond to treatment.

In Jan. 1975 he was returned to Clallam County for Parole Revocation hearings and for sentencing on initial charges of Rape, Supplying Narcotics to a minor, Abduction, and Assault with a deadly weapon.

On 4-1-75 [REDACTED] was despondent over a letter from his girlfriend and requested to be moved to a smaller cell where there weren't so many people. In the smaller cell occupied by one other he obtained a chip of glass from a prior broken window and with a matchbook cover for a handle cut a gash inside the crook of the left elbow which bled profusely in a suicide attempt. He was discovered and treated at the local hospital then returned to confinement.

He is scheduled for Superior Court Hearing at 1:30 pm date. Hearing for sentence has been continued for 2 weeks pending some rep. from a Drug Program named Jeffreys or some such can consult with him about the possibilities of entering him into the program...

When they were approaching the corner of the boundary lines he seen a man jump up naked after a girl had screamed "don't go, please don't go. Help me". He couldn't see the girl because she seemed to be moving away from him, but he caught a glimpse of her when the male subject, naked, grabbed her by the hair and started dragging her back down the road toward the car. He heard the female say "you're going crazy again". He couldn't make anything else out.

Before they entered the slash area they had noted a red car with a man laying on the trunk lid. He spoke a few words with this man before departing into the woods. The car was as he describe

a red muscle car. It had a chrome roll bar inside. It had wide tires with chrome rims on both sides. The man on the car was what he figures about 20, dark with heavy features. INVESTIGATION: At 1700 I received a call from Dispatcher Egnew that a [REDACTED] had called the Sheriff's Office and wanted to pick up some clothing and a watch that he had left in the Lost Mountain Road area. He said he would come down to the office. Egnew stated that [REDACTED] had called from the city PD.

I arrived at the office and met [REDACTED] who stated he wanted to pick up some shoes, panties, the watch that he left up the Lost Mountain Road. I asked him what the clothing was doing there and he stated that he and his girlfriend had a little tiff and took off without the gear. I asked him about identification. He identified the panties as being a pink and the halter as being some kind of a flowered halter and the watch was a timex watch fastened on a black leather band, hand laced around the outside edges with the lace broken on the part of it and silver dots thru it. He said he had hand made the band.

I explained to him this was evidence for a possible crime. Although we had no crime reported at this time I didn't know whether there was a girl dead or wanting to make a complaint and I would have to hold the evidence until I investigated it further. He said that he was in the area with a friend of his, [REDACTED], and this girl that he had picked up hitchhiking. They went up there and he says he couldn't penetrate her because he'd been dropping beans and he couldn't get an erection except for that much--indicating about 3 or 4" on his finger. He said he'd be willing to take a lie detector test that he hadn't raped any girl or killed any girl and left her up in the woods. I told him I still had to maintain the evidence and he stated he was working for the county in an undercover status and wouldn't do anything like that then departed.

I left the office and was enroute to my residence when I heard over the radio that the city had a complaint of a rape, the complaint just being made. Sgt. Sweat requested contact with

me. At this time he stated that he had taken a complaint from a [REDACTED] 17 year old female who lived at Apt. [REDACTED] Apartments. She stated she had been raped in the road that goes up from Long John Corner, describing a red car and two suspects.

They proceeded up the Lost Mountain area where he parked the car and [REDACTED] told her to get out. She said no, but they made her get out. [REDACTED] took off her shoes while [REDACTED] held her arms pinned to her sides. Then he proceeded to take off her jeans leaving her in her panties and her halter. [REDACTED] then told [REDACTED] to watch for him while he took her down the trail where he ripped off her underpants and started for her halter when she backed up. some time. This penetration happened just before two older men approached in the woods. She started to hollar for help--please help me, please help me, don't go away. The two men went back down the road. Manny told her she didn't have to worry him, that he knew them anyway. He drug her back down, put her in the car and they took off. While in the car they made her put her jeans on and [redacted] gave her his white shirt. They drove down into Jefferson County. They went almost to the Hood Canal Bridge and went up and power line road. At this point [redacted] taped her feet together and put her hands behind her and taped them and tried to convince her she should have relations with him.

At this point she seemed to be coming down off of a 'high' and started feeling sorry for her and telling her how mean he was to her so he took the tape off and brought her back to her apartment in Port Angeles about 1715 or 1730.

[redacted] the male with [redacted], kept wanting to snuff her out because he knew they had done something bad to her and didn't want her to talk.

A check will have to be made at the power line road by the Hood Canal Bridge to get the tape that was cut off the victim's arms and legs. White shirt picked up from the victim which was given to her by the suspect. The victim will have a medical test run by a doctor in the a.m.

The victim also identified the car in which the transportation was afforded.

RE-INTERVIEW SUSPECT [REDACTED] (rmn)

On tuesday, 7-30-74 at approx. 4:20 p.m. suspect was contacted by Detective McDonald and r/o in the squad room at the Sheriff's Office where he was waiting for arraignment. Before discussing anything with him, r/o advised him of his rights per Miranda as follows:

"You have the right to remain silent. You have the right to contact and have present an attorney at any time. If you cannot afford an attorney, one will be provided for you by a competent court at no charge to you. Any incriminating statements that you make can be used against you at a subsequent court action. Do you understand those things?"

Defendant responded that he understodd what officer had told him. R/o then asked him about any knowledge he might have regarding the victim having had her wrists and ankles taped together and if she had been taped similarly for any reason. Suspect denied any knowledge of victim having been so taped.

At approx. that time it was understood that suspect was to be taken upstairs immediately for arraignment and r/o, Sheriff Bishop and Deputy Egnew accompanied suspect to the courtroom in the county courthouse.

Upon seating defendant r/o subsequently left and security was maintained by Deputy Egnew. After suspect's arraignment Det. McDonald and r/o again contacted suspect [REDACTED] in the squad room at the Sheriff's Office and at this time, after being asked again about the taping by r/o, suspect admitted that victim had been taped at the wrists and ankles by him. He further indicated that he had thrown the tape out of the car when back on Hwy 101 from the power line road. Suspect was then questioned regarding the suspected dangerous drugs found on his person at the time of his arrest. He indicated that the "dope" on his person at the time of his arrest had been part of what was originally 100 hits of speed which he had purchased from a

female named [redacted] who lives at [redacted] E Street and works at what as he described as Peoples Bank (bank next to the fountain downtown). Returning to questioning regarding the physical contact between he and victim at the time of the alleged rape effort, suspect replied that the victim "froze up" at one point and he was "out of line" at that time. He indicated that the time he was speaking about was approx. the time the two men had come out of the woods.

Suspect was questioned regarding what points he was willing to take a polygraph examination in reference to and he indicated that he would be willing to take a polygraph test in reference to whether or not he had used a knife to threaten victim with. Suspect indicated he would not take a polygraph test on the question of who had furnished dope to whom (whether or not suspect had furnished dope to victim or vice versa). Suspect also declined to take a polygraph examination on whether or not he had thrown the tape used to bind victim from his vehicle, stating that point made no sense to him. R/o asked suspect what suspect could tell r/o which would make suspect appear to look in a better light. Suspect indicated that victim had mentioned her dad was a cop and that she was working with retarded children and he recalled having been told that a cop named Cliff Peterson had been given information about pending narcotics raids to people involved in narcotic trafficking and that he had been given the information about this Cliff Peterson by a Jim Simpson and Lamarr Rudolph and by people who live in a yellow house near or next to Lamarr Rudolph, and that initially he had been interested in getting narcotic information from victim for the purpose of subsequently turning this information over to Officers.

He further indicated that he had told suspect [redacted] to "cool it" when [redacted] had grabbed victim's jeans in an effort to pull them down. He stated also that suspect [redacted] was quite high at the time and implied that he did not think [redacted] was really in control of himself. INTERVIEW SUSPECT : Vashon, Apt. , d.o.b. 11- -49, WMA, 24 years,
Occupation-Upholsterer.

Suspect was interviewed at the PAPD commencing at approx. 9 p.m. date by r/o in the Squad Room of the PAPD. Prior to interview suspect was advised of his rights per Miranda and he stated an understanding of same. R/o then - asked him for the story from his side and he indicated as follows: Victim was thumbing a ride in the vicinity of Sunrise Hill before or around the hour of noon this date. Upon getting into the car she indicated her name to be . Suspect described her as a WFA, approx. 18 to 19 years, having long dark hair and wearing a halter of unknown color and blue jeans.

Suspect indicated he was driving a 1966 Thunderbird, red in color, and that was sitting in the front passenger seat. Victim sat in the rear passenger seat behind after she entered the vehicle. She indicated that she wanted to go to Quilcene. Shortly after entering she "fired up a joint" (lit a marijuana cigarette) and the joint was passed around between the 3 occupants of the vehicle. Suspect then lit another joint and all 3 again smoked the second joint. Victim then reached into her purse and gave each of the 2 suspects "5 whites" (5 tablets of speed). They then bought beer and gas at a store on the left hand side of 101 while traveling east and continuing in an easterly direction, turned on a road which is encountered just before crossing the bridge which suspect describes as a green bridge crossing the Dungeness River. They then turned right on this roadway and drove several miles up the hill and turned right on a small dirt road. Suspect indicated that "nobody was feeling any pain" at that point. He, suspect, had dropped 5 whites. Suspect stopped the vehicle and all 3 got out and victim was talking very friendly. They discussed dope for a while and suspect had his arm around victim and was "feeling her up". Victim was willing and walked up a trail and sat on a log with suspect and they had carried the beer with them.

Suspect [REDACTED] was back and forth between suspect [REDACTED] and victim's place and the vehicle on a number of occasions and suspect stated he was interested in "privacy". He stated he next heard two men who he describes as "woodsmen" and both he and victim were nude or close to it at that point. Victim stated something about her dad being a cop and got "spooky". Victim then said for suspect to stop fondling her or making amorous advances and pushed suspect away. Suspect stated that he was not a robot and could not be turned on and off like one and at about this point victim began yelling.

Suspect [REDACTED] started to leave and then thinking better of it went back and had some clothing in his hand and grabbed the victim by the arm. Victim then grabbed suspect [REDACTED] by the hair and suspect [REDACTED] in turn grabbed victim by the hair at the back of her head in an effort to pull her away from him. He also indicated that he slapped her arms a couple of times and finally jerked her loose while victim was still yelling and the two men were approx. 35 to 40 yards away. He stated that at that point victim was "temporarily nuts". He continued wrestling with victim and wrestled her back toward the vehicle and during the course of doing so, victim yelled for him to go back and pick up her things or that she wanted to go back and pick up her things. He stated that victim was at that point wearing his white shirt because of all the bugs in the area.

While approaching the car or shortly after having put victim inside the car suspect indicated that he yelled for [REDACTED] to "get the gun" in order to scare the men who were nearby and further that he did not at any time have a gun. ought to just kill the bitch", but didn't really mean it. He stated that victim was going from rational behavior to "blowing it" during this time period and he thought [redacted] was just trying to scare her.

He stated they next drove approx. 10 to 15 miles east of Sequim on Hwy 101. R/o asked him to return to the time period when he and victim had been allegedly engaged in amorous activities and he stated that he had only been "skeening on her" at the time of the alleged rape and "couldn't get a hard-on". He stated the desire to copulate with victim was mostly in his head. He stated that at the time the men appeared victim was wearing only suspect [redacted]'s white shirt (because of the bugs) and he further stated in response to officer's question that [redacted] did not help unclothe the victim; that he, [redacted], was the only one to have done so and had done so by ~~untying~~ untying victim's halter and victim then held her arms up to allow it to be taken off by suspect. Suspect [redacted] further indicated that he had slid her jeans down and sometime during that period victim had asked him if "didn't I know you can't ball on speed". He stated that victim did not at any time fight him but "played little ladies games".

After the two men were seen and during this scuffle suspect states that he accidentally tore victim's underpants, but did not mean to do so. When asked where he had traveled on Highway 101 east of Sequim, he stated that he does not know the area, but remembers having passed a sign stating that Olympia was some distance ahead. They went to a location which victim described as a horse trail by a power line which went across Hwy 101 and victim stated she used to live near there.

When the vehicle was stopped again victim stated she wanted to go home. They stopped the vehicle and suspect said he wanted to talk with victim and indicated that he was mad at the way victim had "put him down" and that victim was at this time talking like she was there

unwillingly which suspect states she was not. Before leaving the area east of Sequim suspect remembers giving her \$10 to replace the pants which he had torn and he stated that victim did not want to accept this money, but that she ultimately did. Stated that they then left and went to a store/gas station combination where they got gasoline and obtained some pop and cigarettes. Victim and suspect stayed in the car during this purchase. 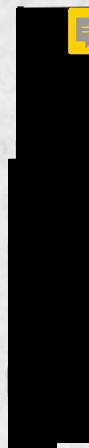



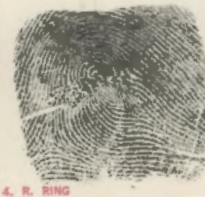

I was working at Birneys Wednesday night and this character came in after 2 am and he sat down in the booth with his girl friend and there was Edson and Barbara Brown who had come in with this girl friend of his earlier. I walked over to the table and asked him if I could help him and he said I want a glass of buttermilk. Second, I want a cup of coffee. Third I want a glass of milk with a waffle. He was extremely ornery. I started to leave and he grabbed my arm and squeezed it and shook me. Then he said you will be my girl. I said "No, I won't". He said, "I said you will be. Can you have children? I want you to have my children." He was so ornery and demanding I couldn't get it out of my mind. I got his buttermilk and set it down on the table and then I got him his coffee and his milk and waffle, and they talked for a while and his ~~fi~~ ~~girl~~ girlfriend all this time looked like she was about ready to cry and looked scared. When he paid his bill he again asked if I had children. I said I had three and didn't want any more. He asked if I had boys. I said yes. He said, "I am going to make them football players. I said they already were and he said, "I am going to make them the best in the world". Then he said, "You are going to be mine."

I told Rose Jack about it. We went to Rolfs Friday night and he didn't see me but we saw him and we thought he was real strange.

Friday night after bar crowd he and his girl friend came up to Birney's and sat in the bar. Joey McCauley came in and had a couple in the bar that had been drinking on a credit card and wanted to eat. So I filled out the credit card and it happened to be the same couple and he looked at me again and said this is the woman who is going to have my children (but he was going to marry this other woman) and I looked at him and said I didn't think my husband would appreciate that. He said, "I don't care one bit about your husband" and he was very nasty now. I couldn't get away from him. He picked me up and shook me by the arms and told me I was going to be his. I finally got away.

The girl that was with him came into Birneys this morning about 5:45 am and told me that these two girls had come to get her. He had called a girl that works at Peoples National Bank in Aberdeen. This girl's name is Max. He told her to put some money in the bank now.

The girlfriend claimed that she had been kidnapped. She only knew him a week. She had seen him one time before he kidnapped her at gunpoint. She showed me a cut on her side where he cut her with a knife. She also showed me where he stuck a fork up her nose and any time he wanted to make love - in the car or the woods - he threw her down and said "I want you". These girls came to get her because he was going to meet this Max half-way between here and Aberdeen and he called her this morning just as she was walking out of the motel. They were staying in #258 at Aggies.

I helped them get gas this morning and they left town. They were going back to Kent.

I have been told he has been investigating me and asking my name and where I lived and telling people he was going to have me.

His name is [REDACTED]. His girlfriend says he buys everything on credit cards and he goes from town to town with credit cards and buys a new set of clothes in each town. Each time he leaves a motel he leaves his clothes behind. His credit cards each have a different address.

Relayed information from Det. McDonald (Clallam County SO)

Information picked up at the time of arrest 3-18-75 and continuing to date- [REDACTED] asked on the way to the station 3-18-75 if he had been in this area before - subject stated he woke up with blood on his clothing and didn't know how it got there (indication of time period sometime last year with no date given). Subject questioned about a murder in Sappho area after he had talked to his attorney - at this time he stated he was just kidding about the blood incident. On March 31, 1975 subject called Det. McDonald at his residence at 6:30AM and wanted to know if McDonald was checking on the murder at Sappho and again brought up the subject of dried blood and not knowing where it came from. Subject states he is regressing in mental age and looks (says promised his girl he'll loose 30 years in looks in a week - unknown date of bet). Subject states he is writing a book on age and love. Subject states he will solve the Sappho murder for Clallam SO (subject did in fact go to Forks, Wa. and posted a reward poster-\$5,00 bail on the bulliten board at the Antlers Cafe, and told people there he knew who did it then left).

At the time of arrest 3-18-75 subjects room contained various womens clothing (no woman was staying with him). Reliable informant states [REDACTED] had 2 handguns in his room however none were found. Went to school Enumclaw area and know it well. Spent 5 years in Folsom prison. CII California sending 3 page rap sheet showing continuous assaults with dangerous weapon. Subject did buy and sell .22 rifle in this area during the last month (March 1975). Known to have registered in his name IHN [REDACTED] (66 Olds - this registration is not in the computer).

[REDACTED] took vehicle to Alaska - picked up by Pt. Townsend 3-23-75 on charge of Auto Theft and released 3-28-75 (case dismissed by Prosecutor - breach of trust).

[REDACTED] owes Master Charge over \$7,000 (if card located contact Mr. Gillespie of Seattle First National Bank)

Subject was courting widow in Pt. Townsend worth quarter of million dollars (this incident occurring in last few months)-subject attempted to talk widow in marriage but she declined. While in Pt. Townsend jail subject wrote numerous notes stating various things about himself (along with poetry)-some as follows:

Boise State Penn - 2 yr

Camarill (? state) - 2 months

Vacaville (? state) - 3 months

Folsom Penn - 3 yr.

Subject also stated he had applied to several mental hospital however none would admit him. Reliability of subject is questionable - Pt. Townsend to make copies of the notes in their possession to forward to our department.

Subject indicated girlfriend MAXINE ANTIG (phone #533-1467) of Hoquiam and unknown relationship with subject NINA SINCLAIR (phone #TU6-2705) of Seattle-Enumclaw area.

Contacted ELLEN BURSON in her place of employment yesterday during the noon hour and she advised that on September 3, 1974 while at Eastmoreland Golf Course in the City towards the hour of darkness, she was finishing playing golf when male subject, also playing golf, caught up with her and they finished playing the last three holes together. During the conversation she found out his name was [REDACTED] said he was 24 years of age. She learned he was born on July [REDACTED] however the actual year is unknown but presumed to be 1950. From this meeting she has had subsequent contact with the subject and learned that he resides at 6 [REDACTED] SE Steen Court in Milwaukie, Oregon located in Clackamas County and is employed as a painter for the

She further advised that subject is originally from Longview Washington and that he attended Colleges in Washington State mainly Bellvue Community College and Western Washington State College. MISS BURSON further stated that although she has never seen his vehicle subject claims to drive an orange Volkswagen, year unknown.

The purpose for ELLEN BURSON CALLing this office was due to the fact that she had occasion to view the September 9, 1974 issue of People Magazine which contained a composite of a suspect involved possibly in the missing coed cases primarily located in the King -County area. She stated subject resembled the composite photograph very strongly, said that his hair had a blonde-reddish cast and currently subject had a mustache.

During the contact with GILLAHAN, ELLEN BURSON stated she had no reason to believe by any of his actions that he could be the subject involved in these cases, however stated there was a resemblance to the subject and the composite as published in the Peoples Magazine.

Check for any record or wants on [REDACTED] and from the computer found a [REDACTED] with dob of 7- [REDACTED]-52 which coincides with the month and day given by the subject to ELLEN BURSON however his age would be 22 at this time rather than the 24 which he stated to her. This might be understandable as ELLEN BURSON is 29 years and he probably wanted to make himself a little older to fit more in her age category. The only item in the computer is that on 8-16-74 subject was a complainant in a larceny from office in which someone stold his wallet, Case #74-64828. The information in this report will be forwarded to King County Sheriff's Office.

NARRATIVE: SIR: At 3:40 p.m. this date I received a telephone call from SHIRLEY JEAN DIXON, employee of the TV Clinic, 6360 SE Foster, phone 777 3811, regarding a subject who acted in a suspicious manner at their store and whom she felt might possibly be connected with the recent cases involving missing women in the Seattle, Washington area.

MRS. DIXON reports that on September 10, 1974 in the evening at the TV Clinic Store a white male subject whom she describes as late 20's, 5'8"-5"-10", husky build, 160-180 lbs, with light dishwater blonde hair slightly shaggy and blue eyes which she described as looking funny but cannot say in what manner, and having a day or two growth of whiskers on his face, came to the front entrance of the TV Clinic Store after she had locked the front door and loitered around the front door for some period of time then walked to a window which looked in to where she was using the telephone. Subject remained at the location for some time and subsequently left. MRS. DIXON stated that at the time this occurred, her two young daughters were with her in the store.

MRS. DIXON states that approximately 3:30 pm this date, this same young white male subject walked into the store inquired about a small 9" TV set which had been in the window. MRS. DIXON states this TV set was still in the window and the subject made conversation about looking for a smaller TV and mentioning a Sony TV Set and the possibility of buying one at the Fred Meyer Store, located at SE 82nd and Foster.
