ITEM:

OVER THE PAST SEVERAL DAYS, I HAVE HAD CONTACT WITH A LOCAL SUBJECT NAMED DONALD L. OSBORNE OD P.O. BOX 326 FALL CITY, 222-5796. MR. OSBORNE IS 19 YRS OLD AND HAS HAD NUMEROUS CONTACTS WITH MYSELF AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THIS DEPARTMENT OVER THE PAST THREE YEARS. OUT OF THESE CONTACTS I HAVE OBTAINED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION.

ON THE AFTERNOON OF THE RAINIER SUN BUST AT THE LAKE SAMMAMISH STATE PARK, DONALD OSBORNE AND A NUMBER OF OTHER LOCAL SUBJECTS GOT TOGETHER TO DRINK AND PLAY FRISBEE. THEY WERE PLAYING QUITE NEAR THE WATER FAUCET (THE ONE SHOWN IN THE NEWS CLIPS ON T.V.) AND APPROX 75 YARDS FROM THE CONSESSION STAND. THIS IS APPROX 45 YARDS FROM THE WATER. AS DONALD OSBORNE AND A RICK JONES, ALSO OF FALL CITY, WERE THROWING THE FRISBEE BACK AND FORTH IT GLANCED OFF THE LOWER LEG OF MR. OSBORNE AND FLEW OFF AT A TANGENT. IT APPARENTLY STRUCK AN INDIVIDULE IN HIS LOWER ANOTOMY AND DROPPED TO THE GROUND AT HIS FEET. HE BENT OVER AND PICKED IT UP WITH HIS RIGHT HAND. HE WAS APPROACHED BY MR. JONES AND ASKED TO RETURN IT. THE SUBJECT GAVE MR. JONES "A RATION OF CRAP". SEEING THIS, MR. OSBORNE APPROACHED THE SUBJECT AND USED SOME PROFANITY IN ASKING WHAT WAS GOING ON. THIS ATTRACTED THE ATTENTION OF THE SUBJECT TO THE FACT THAT THERE WERE MORE THAN JUST TWO PEOPLE WITH THE FRISBEE. SEEING THIS THE SUBJECT BECAME QUITE POLITE AND RETURNED THE FRISBEE AND APOLOGIZED. HE THEN TURNED AND LEFT WITH TWO OTHER PEOPLE. WHAT MAKES THIS CONTACT UNUSUAL ARE THE FOLLOWING DESCRIPTIONS.

- #1. SUBJECT WHO PICKED UP THE FRISBEE...5'8" 160lbs BLOND WAVY HAIR ALMOST SHOULDER LENGTH (NOT CURLY) CAST ON LEFT ARM JUST PAST THE ELBOW NO SCARS OR FACIAL HAIR MAYBE SIDEBURNS VERY SOLIDLY BUILT NO JEWELRY OBSERVED WEARING WHITE T-SHIRT AND BLUE JEANS WHICH MAY HAVE BEEN CUT OFF THE VOICE WAS NOT ROUGH OR LOW BUT NOT PARTICULARLY MEMORABLE SUBJECT WAS APPROX 20 YRS OLD
- #2. WMA 5'10" 175 MEDIUM STOCKY LONG CURLY LT BROWN HAIR JUST BELOW SHOULDERS NOT FRIZZED OR RATTED AND NOT AN AFRO BLUE LEVI BELL BOTTOMS HARNESS BOOTS BROWN CHECKED LONG SLEEVE SHIRT WITH THE SLEEVES ROLLED PARTIALLY UP. THIS SUBJECT APPROX EARLY 20s. THIS SUBJECT TURNED AND LOOKED AWAY WHEN HE SAW MR. OSBORNE APPROACH AND THEREFORE MR. OSBORNE DID NOT SEE MUCH OF HIS FACE.
- #3. WFA EARLY 20s NO WEIGHT OR HEIGHT BUT DESCRIBED AS VERY WELL BUILT WITH LARGE BREASTS AND VERY LONG DARK BROWN HAIR ALMOST TO THE SMALL OF HER BACK. WEARING A HALTER TOP AND BLUE PANTS. SHE HAD A BLUE AND A PINK PLASTIC BRACELET ON HER LEFT WRIST. SHE ALSO HAD A VERY THIN GOLD BAND ON THAT WRIST.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE ABOVE INCIDENT, ALL THREE WALKED AWAY TOGETHER. ALSO AT THE BEACH BUT WITH LITTLE MEMORY OF THE EVENT WAS A THOMAS MITCHELL SMALLEY/PROVO (USES BOTH LAST NAMES) P.O. BOX 117 222-5909. THE RICK JONES MENTIONED ABOVE IS CURRENTLY IN THE U.S. ARMY, HOWEVER

I WILL LEAVE THE INVESTIGATOR TO EVALUATE THIS INFO, BUT DON HAS LIED TO ME ON MANY OCCASIONS. I DO FEEL THAT THIS INFO IS WORTH REPORTING AND FOLLOWING UP IN ANY CASE.

THE APPLICATION OF ANIMAL AND HUMAN BEHAVIOR MODELS
TO THE SOLUTION OF A SERIES OF RELATED CRIMINAL EVENTS .

There is no substitute for good police work in the solving of a crime. But often good police work entails the ability and willingness to seek and to accept assistance from sources outside the criminal justice system. It is this philosophy that sparked the creation of the consultant program in the Oxnard, California, Police Department. The participants in this program are highly qualified and credentialed volunteers from several diverse professions, whose function is to provide expertise not normally available to a law enforcement agency. The consultants are sometimes called upon to assist in various concerns of the Department.

One of these consultations involved the investigation into a series of rape and prowl events occurring over a six-month period of time in a particular section of the city of Oxnard. The M.O.s were similar enough to cause the consultants and the detectives to believe that the offenses were perpetrated by a single (unidentified) suspect.

The rapist had held his victims at knife point and warned them to remain quiet in order to avoid being hurt. Some of the victims were assaulted in their homes, and some in areas near their homes. Most of the occurrences were on one street, within a four-block area; some other occurrences took place on cross streets within two blocks of the well-lighted primary street.

The suspect revealed a familiarity with the victims' habits, as determined by some of the comments made to them during the commission of the crimes. The victims were approached either in their beds while asleep, or from behind while going from their cars to their homes. In most of the cases the suspect threw a towel, shirt or other cloth over the victim's head, or, in at least one case, wore a woman's stocking over his own head as a mask to inhibit identification.

Information extracted from the vague descriptions of the suspect given by the victims was used in the preparation of two different composite drawings by police artists. However, since none of the victims had been able to adequately observe their assailant, the composites bore little resemblance to each other (although as it later developed, one of the composites was a very good likeness of the ultimate suspect).

Considerable investigation, patrol, and surveillance effort failed to yield a likely suspect, although a person who worked nights at a location near the area of the crimes was thought to resemble one of the composites.

Since fiscal realities severely limit the time available for surveillance and/or increased patrol activity in a target area it was suggested that if a probability statement about the next occurrence could be made with any degree of certainty then the Department would be able to economize on the deployment of forces -- concentrating on a target time as well as a target area. It was this probability statement that we boldly offered to make on the basis of available data. This idea was found to be appealing to the Detective Bureau, which decided to give it a try.

The task, then, was the prediction of the time and place of the next occurrence. Prediction depends on data; the more information available, the better the chance for success (at least this is the belief of the "pure" scientist, who in his laboratory or field observations has the luxury of waiting for what he considers to be a sufficient number of occurrences before making his prediction). But applied science, especially forensic applications, plainly cannot afford such luxury. If a rapist strikes once, that is once too often for the victim and for others in the same area. Therefore, the task of apprehension of the perpetrator has an immediacy about it that is foreign to most "pure" scientists. If the scientist is to be of assistance, he must be so at the earliest possible moment. There is no time to be cautious and conservative. He must leave all this in the laboratory and be prepared to make bold pronouncements about the real world at a moment's notice -- almost invariably without what he would consider "sufficient" data.

There was, however, little time in which to accomplish the almost overwhelming task and, as is usually the case in applied science, much of what could have been done was not, for the sake of both economy and time. However, hoping for a little serendipity to go along with the scant data on hand, we set about collecting what evidence was available from the already extensive investigative efforts of the detectives assigned to the case.

Imbued with the philosophy of multi-disciplinary involvement in criminal investigation (McCollum 1974), we perceived certain similarities between the distribution of events in this series of rapes, prowlings, and assaults with the behavior of some predatory animals.

The assumption was made that if certain types of criminals function analogously to predatory animals, then the techniques used in the study of animal behavior should be applicable in the prediction of the most probable occurrence of criminal activity. There is a large body of knowledge available in that branch of science known as ethology, which is the study of animal behavior under natural conditions. Ethological research is largely based on descriptive field observations of animals with minimal interference by the worker. These observations are analyzed and a predictive model of the subject animal's behavior is formulated. The model is then tested by comparing the predicted behavior with that which actually occurs. It was also assumed that the information contained in crime reports can be used as a source of data for ethological analysis of criminals. From these data, a probabilistic model of a suspect's behavior can be produced; the test of this model is the apprehension of a suspect engaging in the projected criminal activity at the time and place predicted.

Many mammals conduct all of their activities within a defined area known as a home range. Within this area, the animal captures its prey at certain intervals (Ewer 1973), and when threatened follows familiar escape routes. While in its home range, an animal is difficult to capture (Bourliere 1960). It was our assumption that the rapist was operating within a restricted range in which the best hiding places and escape routes were known to him, and was striking with a regular frequency.

In the present case the available data was minimal at best. However, if the assumption was true that the several prowler reports from the same area were caused by the activities of the rapist, then

the addition of these occurrences to the data already on hand would yield a larger sample.

With this in mind, all available pertinent data were collected and collated by the authors. (Table 1) Tables were made of the distribution of the incidents with respect to time and age of victim. (Tables 2 and 4) An on-site visit was made to each of the locations where incidents had been reported in order to determine if there were any local features that might have a bearing on the behavior of the suspect. Following this, the frequency and latency of events were calculated. Frequency is defined as the mean number of occurrences per week; latency is the mean interval between events. The modal time of day, day of the week and the age of the victim were also calculated.

The sequence of events was analysed by constructing a table of events (Table 5) and calculating the proportion of times that one event followed another.

The assaults and rapes all occurred between 2330 and 0400 hours on various days of the week (Table 2), with no occurrences on Thursdays (Table 3). The prowler calls, which occurred in the same area and were believed to be committed by the same suspect also occurred in this same time frame, with the same Thursday hiatus. The occurrence of 11 events over a 19 week period yields a frequency of 0.58. The mean interval was 13 days with a standard deviation of 4.97. Events occurred on Friday and Saturday with equal frequency. The mean time of day was 0145 hours, with modes of 2330 and 0230 hours.

The analysis of the data revealed that the suspect was selecting his victims. In the cases examined, the attacker knew who was in the

house and when the victim was available. There was a preference for younger women. (Table 4)

An analysis of the sequence of events (Table 5) revealed that the most probable sequence of events was a prowl followed by an attempted rape followed by either a rape ($p = .60$) or another attempt ($p = .40$). After a rape there was an equal chance that the next event would be a prowl, assault, or rape (Figure 1). Given the mean latency, the next time of occurrence would be Tuesday, November 19, but Tuesday was not a preferred day of the week (Table 3). The nearest preferred day of the week was Saturday (Table 3) which fell on November 16.

Based on these calculations, a prediction was made that the suspect would be active on Saturday night between 2300 and 0330 hours. This prediction was based on the probabilities of the suspect appearing on any particular night and at any particular time. The detectives conducted a surveillance operation at a location near the area of activity on the night predicted by the model.

While traveling to his post on the predicted night, a detective encountered a prowler who immediately fled from the area. A search was conducted and a suspect was apprehended who matched the description of the rapist.

The model of the rapist as a type of predator is supported by the results of this case, though additional studies are needed before any broad generalizations can be made. These studies will require well-written police reports for their sources of data: the analysis for this study was possible only because the reports used contained the necessary information. The importance of precise, detailed, and complete crime reports cannot be over-emphasized.

The apprehension of the suspect occurred through the efforts of several persons, each of whom contributed work based on his or her specialty. The detectives spent a considerable length of time in searching records to gather the data. The theoretical framework of the analysis was based on principles drawn from ethology and anthropology. The surveillance and final capture required the application of skilled police work. Success came only through an interaction of all these elements.

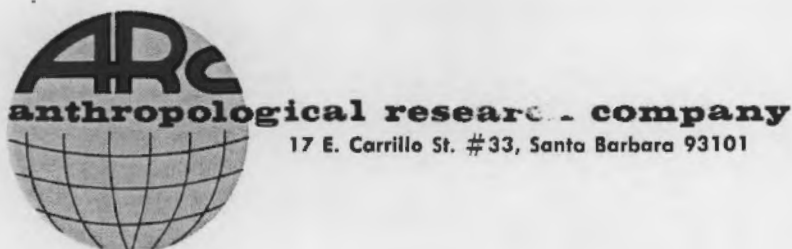

Enclosed is an article we have submitted to the Journal of Police Science and Administration, describing a technique developed by our staff. This technique, using knowledge from the science of ethology (animal behavior) and ethnology (human cultural behavior), was recently used successfully by the Oxnard, California, Police Department to apprehend a rape suspect. (The suspect has since pled guilty to one of the five counts and is currently serving time in the hospital for the criminally insane at Atascadero, California.)

We have discussed the application of this technique with our staff and with Chief Owens of Oxnard P.D., and feel that this might be applicable to the series of homicides you are currently investigating in Issaquah. As I currently understand the case (from the little we have heard about it down here), much of the work could probably be done in our offices, but a visit to the scene would be necessary for Dr. Lunt and myself to gain a thorough understanding of the environment and characteristics involved. There are, of course, no guarantees, but we feel confident that our method could be successful in helping you solve this case.
