260 11-6-74 1000 hrs.: DEAN QUALSUND contacted at the Courthouse, brought in a dummy that he had found underneath the trestle at Issaquah. Also he had pieces of a blue balloon near the dummy and white yarn. He also found an ID tag from Seaboard Lumber Co. The dummy was merely a pair of corduroy pants stuffed with newspapers. He also brought in white tape and a pink routing slip. In addition he found a book containing information about masturbation that he located on old Hwy. 10 where the Pipeline crosses. QUALSUND also reported confronting [REDACTED] who was in a red pickup at the bone find. [REDACTED] has registered to him: A0Y [REDACTED] 65 Ford address 16 [REDACTED] 2nd Ave. S.W. DOB 9- [REDACTED] 46. He is 5'7" 145 lbs. brn. hair. Ordered DMV photograph on [REDACTED]. R/O initiated lab request on dummy to ascertain if there were any identifying marks on the newspaper and also any semen stains or hair fibers on the dummy.

She will talk with her son and call R/O.

272 11-13-74 1010 hrs.: Called by MRS. ██████████ she had talked with her son ██████████ and he stated that ██████████ and a couple of his friends had made the dummy. ██████████ had come to his house and told ██████████ what he was doing. ██████████ gave him some papers. DMV check on ██████████ reveals ██████████ DOB 9-57, DMV # ██████████ 5'4" 110-lbs. Ordered DMV photograph on ██████████.

273 1400 hrs.: Contacted at ██████████'s residence. He related that in October at night on a weekend ██████████ asked for some newspaper. ██████████ had told him what he was doing. He thought that ██████████ had thrown dummies off the trestle in the past just for kicks. ██████████ told him that they threw it off the trestle onto one of the roads below.

275 11-14-74 1000 hrs.: Contacted MRS. ██████████ - she wants her husband to be present when her son is interviewed; he will be home on Saturday.

285 11-19-74 1730 hrs.: Contacted ██████████ and his mother - the pants actually belonged to ██████████ - the dummy was not torn at the time it was thrown. It was stuffed with newspapers and water balloons, the balloons were blue and red.

236 About 12 kids were at his house on about 19th of October constructing the dummy. Four of the kids took the dummy to the trestle, dropped it down on I-90, ██████████ was one of them. A car and a semi stopped and they ran. No one was there before the truck and the car came along. The people in the car did not get out. One kid by the name of ██████████ had good clothes on and high-heel type of shoes and was slow in catching up with

them. Others involved were ██████████ and ██████████. The writing on the dummy was just terminology the kids thought of to put on it. ██████████ estimated that he had thrown dummies off the trestle in the past three years about 3 or 4 times. The top portion of the dummy was a white hooded sweatshirt, the head was a paper bag inside the hood; there was no wig. ██████████ related that the other 3 kids involved would be cooperative and would answer any questions with respect to the dummy.

11-20-74 0800 hrs.: Contacted OFFICER KEITH MOON of Issaquah PD. MOON originally investigated a dummy being thrown off the road; he picked up the dummy and threw it in the bushes and then a couple days later went back to the area and tore the dummy in half taking the top portion, the sweatshirt to Issaquah Police station to show other officers. He threw the pants in the bushes, the pants were not torn when he saw them. The date on his report is only approximate.

WHILE WORKING THE SITE ON HWY. 18 I WAS CONFRONTED BY A MR. STEVE LUCK 12012 UPPER PRESTON RD. SE, PRESTON WN. PHONE # 222-7382 HE STATED HIS GIRLFRIEND WAS APPROACHED AT SO. CENTER BY A STRANGE MAN WHILE WALKING TO HER CAR IN THE PARKING LOT. THE MAN MADE SOME OBSCENE REMARKS TOWARD HER, BUT WAS NOT AGGRESSIVE. THE GIRL GOT INTO HER CAR AND STARTED TO DRIVE OUT OF THE PARKING LOT. AT THIS TIME SHE NOTICED THIS SAME MAN WAS NOW FOLLOWING HER IN HIS VEHICLE A 1966-67 BLUE BARRACUDA. THE GIRLFRIEND LOST THE SUB. IN TRAFFIC.

ABOUT A WEEK LATER (APPROX THE SAME TIME THE GIRLS CAME UP MISSING AT LAKE SAM PARK) MR. LUCK AND HIS GIRLFRIEND WERE AT LAKE SHAMMISH PARK. THEY SAW THE SAME MAN THAT HAD APPROACHED THE GIRLFRIEND AT SO. CENTER THAT PREVIOUS WEEK. MR. LUCK STATED IT WAS A HOT DAY BUT THIS MAN WAS DRESSED IN A SPORT COAT & SLACKS. MR. LUCK SAID THE MAN WAS WATCHING GIRLS AS THEY WALKED BACK AND FORTH TO THE RESTROOMS. MR. LUCK STATED THE MAN DIDN'T APPROACH OR SAY ANYTHING TO THE GIRLS, BUT JUST STARED AT THEM STRANGELY.

This address was given to me as of April 8, 1975 and I hope that it is current in case anyone desires to contact Mr. [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was born in Oldham, England on September 12, 1950 and Mr. [REDACTED] reportedly moved to Toronto, Canada and lived there until he was 9 or 10 years old. Mr. [REDACTED]'s parents are British and it would be likely that Mr. [REDACTED] could have a British accent as described by those people who have reportedly met Ted. The information in the Pre-sentence Report on Mr. [REDACTED] indicates that he is possibly deeply involved in drugs especially as he has not been able to explain how he supports himself without employment. I should note that Mr. [REDACTED] stated to probation officers that he had used no drugs except marijuana and hashish, but he was arrested for Shoplifting and Possession of Dangerous Drugs on October 1, 1972. At that time he had LSD and barbiturates in his possession, fresh needle marks on his arm, and appeared to be intoxicated although there was no odor of alcohol. While in that state Mr. [REDACTED] did awing at arresting officers and attempted to offer resistance when arrested.

[REDACTED]'s sister had indicated to the probation officer that [REDACTED] resents authority and resists authority in many forms. She stated that she felt that he had some inferiority feelings as a result of his rather small stature, and had hostility towards following rules and regulations. She stated that he had always attempted to demonstrate to his peer group that he was capable of being courageous and a "big man". She felt that he was somewhat immature in this area. Mr. [REDACTED] is 5'8" inches tall weighs approximately 130 pounds has blond hair and blue eyes and fits fairly closely the description of "Ted".

Mr. [REDACTED] was employed as a Groundskeeper for the State Highway Department from October of 1971 to February of 1972 through ESP Program. His social security number is [REDACTED]. I have no indication of when he was employed as a Groundskeeper, but this might possibly be something which should be checked out. [REDACTED] also has a history of alcohol abuse in that he has a record of Minor Consuming, Driving While Intoxicated and Drunk In Public. This combined with his drug history could indicate a person who is at times not in control of himself. Mr. [REDACTED] is apparently well thought of by many people, and evidently presents a good appearance and can be very likeable. People with whom he has worked in the past have indicated that Mr. [REDACTED] presents a good appearance

and seems to be very well liked. Although Mr. [REDACTED] does not report having an automobile, he has had several arrests for Speeding, Driving While License Suspended, etc. and therefore probably knows how to drive an automobile and will have access to a car.

On January 11, 1974 it is noted in Mr. [REDACTED]'s file that he had gotten a haircut and was looking respectable. His past mug shots have showed him with long hair, but in January of 74 he evidently had short hair. In May of 1974 he used someone else's name to obtain treatment at Riverton Hospital, although there is no indication of the type of treatment. Ms. Mann of Riverton Hospital, 244-0180, contacted the probation office because Mr. [REDACTED] had not paid his bill. That bill has since been paid.

[REDACTED] is a suspect in the theft of surgical tools and injectable pentobarbital from a veterinary hospital. There have been previous thefts from this hospital and the veterinarian believes that Mr. [REDACTED] is responsible, since he had previously worked there and the veterinarian had been forced to fire him because he had been drunk. If Mr. [REDACTED] is indeed responsible for the theft of the surgical tools and injectable pentobarbital, there is some question as to what use he might put such items. Although I have never met Mr. [REDACTED] in person, I feel that his file material as well as his appearance and being a suspect in theft of surgical tool and injectable pentobarbital, would indicate that Mr. [REDACTED] could be a suspect in the "Ted Case".

INTERVIEW: #6 I, CRAMMATTE

ALLEN B. CRAMMATTE, son of WILLIAM W. CRAMMATTE, stated the following: He has known [REDACTED] for the past six to seven years and met him in San Francisco right after [REDACTED] was discharged from the service. [REDACTED] was just traveling around so he had moved in with him. In the summer of 1970 they went to Vancouver where they lived with a couple of girls. After a short period of time with the girls [REDACTED] had left Vancouver and went back to the mid west to his home for approximately a year and then came back to the Seattle area about three years ago.

[REDACTED] and CANDY moved in the CRAMMATTE residence on Christmas Eve, 1974 after their boat had sunk off Vashon Island.

[REDACTED] had met CANDY in 1972 while he was staying on Vashon Island.

[REDACTED] worked various jobs along with working with him building cement boats. He found it very hard to believe that [REDACTED] killed CANDY since they had both drank and worked together and he had never observed [REDACTED] aggressive. When cement boats are being poured there is a lot of stress and this was never noticed to bother [REDACTED]

When CANDY left [REDACTED] seemed mildly depressed, however this would be normal since they were so close. He had seen both [REDACTED] and CANDY have arguments, however when this would happen they would both withdraw and they would settle their differences. CANDY would sometimes pout after one of these disagreements. He said that last time he saw [REDACTED] was on Monday night the 7th of April at approximately 7:00 p.m. when he had got home from work he then went out and [REDACTED] was not there when he returned. He assumed [REDACTED] had gone to bed for the night, and on Tuesday night when he returned home from work [REDACTED] was not at the residence. He knew [REDACTED] had obtained \$500 from DAVE LANDIS a week before and this must have been the money he used to go to Alaska. LANDIS had found the boat he had purchased from [REDACTED] for \$500 to be under lien to the property owner shortly after giving the money to [REDACTED] and wanted his money back. He did not know how [REDACTED] and LANDIS had worked this out.

INTERVIEW: LATTIMER

DONALD ROBERT LATTIMER stated the following: He has known [REDACTED] close to four years and can not believe that he would kill CANDY. They had worked together many times plastering boats and CANDY would mix the cement while he and [REDACTED] did the plastering. He felt they were good friends.

He had observed arguments between [REDACTED] and CANDY and there was no violence. They would talk out their problems. (continued)

The last time he saw [REDACTED] and CANDY together was the day before CANDY went to Alaska. CANDY had told him she was going to Alaska the following day.

After CANDY had left he and [REDACTED] had spent the whole day together, the 29th of March. They had discussed their relationships between he and his wife and [REDACTED] and CANDY. [REDACTED] had told him that he was going to make a little money and buy CANDY an engagement ring and that they were going to be married. Then as soon as CANDY had obtained flight privileges with Alaska Airlines they were planning on going to Europe for awhile. He had asked [REDACTED] why they were going to be married since their present relationship was working out so well and [REDACTED] had replied it was the right thing to do. [REDACTED] appeared to miss CANDY very much. [REDACTED] had said that CANDY was going to work two weeks and then come back down to the Seattle area or he was going to go up to Nome. She had called the night before and said she was enjoying herself. [REDACTED] felt CANDY should be out on her own for a while and that he felt she was becoming more secure.

He said since he has known CANDY he felt she was a very insecure person.

When plastering the boat [REDACTED] always ran the hose which at times would be very tiring and trying. [REDACTED] never lost his temper and worked well under stress.

On Saturday, the 5th of April they had plastered a boat then drank together and [REDACTED] never once mentioned going to Alaska the following week.

[REDACTED] had never used chemicals (hallucinogenic drugs) since he had known him and only smoked marijuana a couple of times a week. He had drank many times with [REDACTED] and knew that he was not a heavy drinker.

[REDACTED] had come into \$500 the week before he left. He had bought an amateur boat builders boat for \$5.00 and sold it to [REDACTED] for \$500.00. After getting the money for the boat [REDACTED] found that the boat was tied up by a lien to the property owner and that [REDACTED] was going to have to give the \$500.00 back. He said as far as he knew LANDIS had not received the \$500.00 Back.

INVESTIGATION

TUFTS stated the following: She is a probation officer with the Adult Correction Division of the Department of Social and Health Services for the State of Washington. She first met and observed [REDACTED] on 3/31/75. [REDACTED] told her his girl friend had gone to Alaska and he missed her very much. She noted he was overly polite and tried to impress her with the fact that he would be very cooperative. She felt that since this was her first meeting with [REDACTED] and the fact that it only lasted 15 minutes her only reference to his back ground would be from his probation file which was very limited. [REDACTED] had been sentenced for possession for sale on eight bricks of marijuana on December 27, 197. and was sentenced to five years deferred.

TUFTS stated she had received a call from ALLEN CRAMMATTE on this past Thursday morning the 10th of April 1975, and that he had heard about the homicide in Nome and wanted to know if there was anything she could do to be able to help [REDACTED].

INTERVIEW: #4 I, CRAMMATTE

WILLIAM W. CRAMMATTE, father of ALLEN B. CRAMMATTE, stated the following: CANDY moved in his home in December of 1974 after the boat she and [REDACTED] were living on, off Washon Island had sunk. CANDY and [REDACTED] had a bedroom upstairs both were nice reasonable people and he never heard them quarrel.

Since CANDY left, [REDACTED] started asking him about the mail. He had asked [REDACTED] what kind of letters he was expecting and [REDACTED] would reply, "Love letters from CANDY." He explained to [REDACTED] no matter how much in love they were he should not expect CANDY to write him every day. He never heard [REDACTED] and CANDY discuss the fact CANDY was the only one working steady and basically supported [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] had told him he smoked grass, however it was a strict rule in his house that it was not allowed.

He said he could find it very hard to understand why [REDACTED] would kill CANDY.

Summary of Facts:

[REDACTED] : Will testify to: That she is nineteen years old, lives at [REDACTED] N. 75th Street, and attends school at Seattle Community College. That on the evening of May 6, 1973, she and three friends, MARILYN DREHER, RAPHAEL JUSTICE, and JUANITA JAMES, went to the Pier 70 Tavern to listen to jazz music. That she met the defendant at the tavern, and he invited her to a party with some of his friends, which she and her friend, MARILYN, agreed to go to. That on May 6, 1973, at approximately 11:00 P.M., Miss [REDACTED], MARILYN DREHER, GORDON BROWN, BARBARA SANFORD, and OLIVIA BYRD drove to Miss BYRD's home. That on the way, Miss SANFORD stopped at two locations, a gas station and "7-11" store. That they all stayed at Miss BYRD's home for a short time, and unable to get a ride home from Miss SANFORD, Miss [REDACTED], Miss DREHER, Mr. BROWN, and Mr. [REDACTED] began walking toward Mr. [REDACTED] apartment, as Mr. [REDACTED] promised Miss [REDACTED] a ride home. That they got a ride from a friend of Mr. BROWN's, who let Miss DREHER off near her home, and then drove them to Mr. [REDACTED] apartment. That Mr. BROWN said "goodnight", and that she and Mr. [REDACTED] got into his Volkswagen van, but it would not start. That he suggested they go to his apartment to use the phone, which she agreed to. That once in his apartment, he grabbed her by the neck and told her "Fuck me, or I'll kill you", and "I'll crush your Adam's apple if you make any noise". That she undressed as he ordered her to do, and he performed an act of cunnilingus upon her, and then sexual intercourse. That he ejaculated inside of her, and after a period of time, she convinced him that she should call her mother as she would be worried about her. That he allowed her to get dressed, held her by the arm, and walked with her to the area of 9th Ave. & Madison Street, where she got into a Yellow cab. That he asked her to give him her name and phone number to let her go, and that she wrote her name and a fictitious telephone number on a matchbook cover. That she went to a girlfriend's apartment, that of DEBBIE HUGGINS, told her what happened and then telephoned the Crisis Clinic for help. That the Crisis Clinic referred "VIRGINIA CROW", a volunteer worker from "Rape Relief" to her, and that Ms. CROW took her to King County Medical Center where she was examined by Doctor HOBSON, and interviewed by Officers McNulty and Winney concerning the rape offense.
