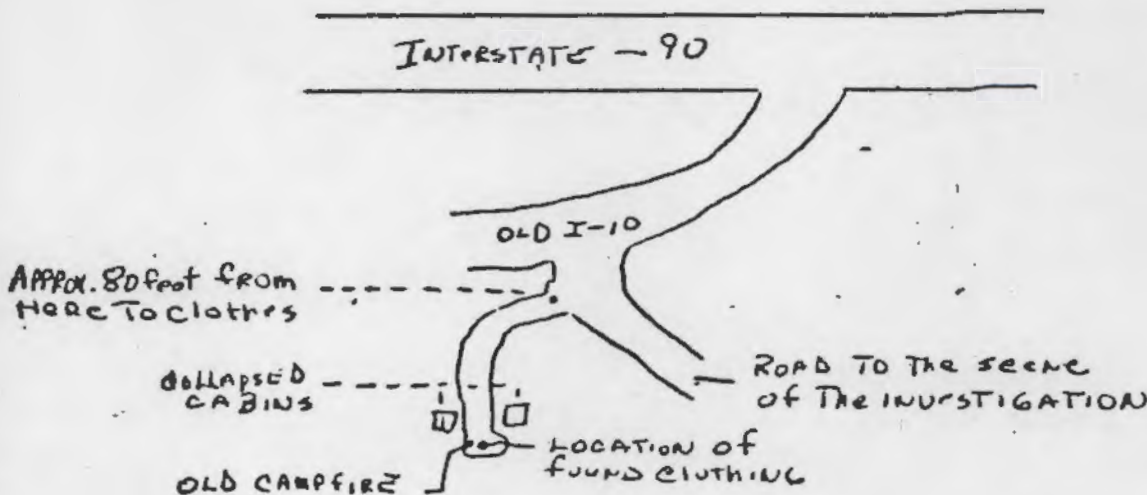

UPON ARRIVING AT THE SCENE OF THE DEATH INVESTIGATION AT 1750 HRS, RIO WAS MET BY SGT. JOHN KELLY (26). SGT KELLY INFORMED RIO THAT HE HAD FOUND A PILE OF WOMENS UNDER CLOTHES LAYING ON A DIRT ROAD, NEAR THE SCENE. RIO PROCEEDED TO THE LOCATION (SEE MAP) AND PLACED THE CLOTHING INTO EVIDENCE. THE CLOTHING FOUND WAS AS FOLLOWS: FIVE (5) PAIRS OF PANTIES, ONE (1) HALF SLIP, ONE (1) NYLON UNDERSHIRT, ONE (1) NIGHTGOWN, AND FIVE (5) BRAS. THE CLOTHING WAS PLACED INTO EVIDENCE, IN THE PRECINCT THREE EVIDENCE LOCKER, AWAITING TRANSPORTATION TO HEADQUARTERS.

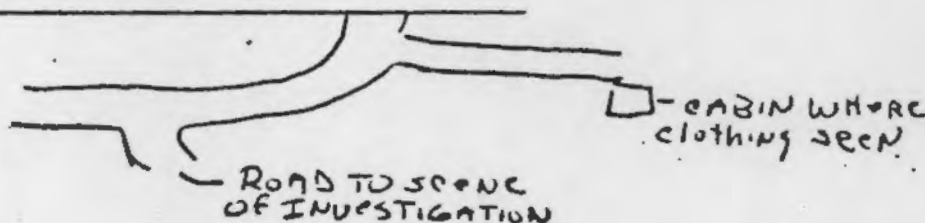

AT 1650 HRS, THIS DATE, RIO WAS DETAILED TO CONTACT SWEETEN, DAVID W. AT SH 68538 CONCERNING CLOTHES HE HAD FOUND NEAR THE SCENE OF THE ABOVE DEATH INVESTIGATION. RIO CONTACTED SWEETEN VIA PHONE AND THEN MET HIM AT ISSAQUAH P.D. FROM THERE RIO AND SWEETEN WENT TO THE LOCATION OF THE CLOTHING HE HAD FOUND (SEE MAP). RIO AND SWEETEN WERE MET THERE BY 26, SGT JOHN KELLY. THE LOCATION WAS AN OLD HOUSE (VACANT) JUST NORTH OF I-90. He said the police treated him like he was nothing and he did not like the way they rebuffed him. He said he does not want anything out of his leads, like money.



BETTY characterized [REDACTED] as a perfectionist - she was very neat and clean, always had clean and pressed clothes. She would press her clothes she had worn if they were clean, then immediately hang them up. Her work at the Youth Center was very professional - she never seemed afraid to break up fights in the girls' detention unit. [REDACTED] appeared to be concerned about her own life style. BETTY felt that [REDACTED] led a rather sheltered life and since she was separated from [REDACTED] it was a new experience for her. BETTY felt that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] even had an understanding-- [REDACTED] wouldn't have minded if [REDACTED] had relationships with other women. BETTY got the impression that [REDACTED] did not go out with other males until she had moved to the apt. on Dayton Ave. Her attitude was more of the dare-devil type. She mentioned hitchhiking and was not afraid to start talking with anyone. [REDACTED] liked active things and probably would have liked to go sailing if someone asked, even a stranger.

[REDACTED] appeared to be confused about her own marriage; she was not happy about being married; she had doubts about her husband. [REDACTED] used to get upset because [REDACTED] used to have long periods of silence even when he was around friends and [REDACTED] would have to talk to keep things going.

[REDACTED] did not mention much of her sex life with [REDACTED]. BETTY got the impression that [REDACTED] was more dissatisfied with the marriage arrangement rather than being dissatisfied with her sex life. There was one occasion when Lesbianism was brought up in conversations but not enough to develop an impression of.

During the time [redacted] lived with BETTY which was about 20 days, [redacted] went out with RAY JACOBSON, and another guy named RAY, and CHAS. DeLAURENTI. These were the only ones that BETTY is familiar with. She may have gone out with more.

[redacted] had some problems with her vaginal area - BETTY thought that [redacted] had a D & C either in Spokane or at Group Health. She had complications with her periods. LINDA DRAHN mentioned to BETTY that [redacted] had cancer or some problems with her ovaries. BETTY felt that [redacted] was probably closer to her sister who lives in Spokane and also to LINDA DRAHN.

On July 14th, [redacted] called BETTY to ask if she could use BETTY's back-pack. BETTY told her that she could. [redacted] said that she was going to Lake Sammamish.

BETTY described her back-pack as nylon, dark blue in color with black straps--two shoulder and one waist, a small pocket on the front with heavy duty silver snap. White draw string to close the major portion of the pack. The waist strap had a metal pin clasp. She purchased the pack at Greg's Bicycle Center on Greenlake in the Fall of 1972.

BETTY described [redacted]'s bicycle as unusually heavier than her own 10 speed. BETTY could easily carry her own 10-speed up with one hand but she could not carry [redacted]'s with one hand. The bike was bright yellow with a lot of chrome.

On the morning of the 14th, BETTY went to work at the Youth Center. [redacted] called in the morning and asked to use her back-pack. It was usual for [redacted] to ask before she used anything of anyone else's. BETTY did not go home that night. The next morning [redacted] did not show up for a tennis game with DEE PETERSON at 7:00 a.m. Then [redacted] missed a luncheon date with CHAS. DeLAURENTI. It was not like [redacted] to miss appointments at all, then BETTY called the Issaquah police.

During the time after [redacted] disappeared, [redacted] stayed at BETTY's house. BETTY does not know who notified [redacted] that [redacted] was missing. She does not know any of his friends. While BETTY was on vacation from July 29th to August 22nd her boyfriend MICHAEL MEIGHAN stayed at her house. MICHAEL is now in Kansas City working a research job with the University of Kansas Medical Center. [redacted] was also in and out of the house. BETTY moved out of the house in September or October.

[redacted] came to the house when the bones were found, [redacted] had not yet been identified. He talked of searchers finding boughs of hair.

## SUMMARY OF EVENTS JULY 14 to SEPTEMBER 7

JANICE GRAHAM arrived at Lake Sammamish State Park at 11:30 hours. GRAHAM is 5'6½" tall, weighs 120 pounds, 22 years old, long blonde hair parted in the middle below shoulder length. She was wearing a halter type dress, very short, backless, green in color. Also she had on photogray glasses and wedding rings.

GRAHAM looked around a short while for a picnic table. There were none available so she went to the bandstand area to watch races sponsored by the Rainier Brewery. A strange male approached her and said, "Hello". She said, "Hello" back. She kind of moved away at this time. He asked her if she could help him for a minute. She said, "Yeah, what do you want?" He said he wanted to load his sailboat on his car. She told him, "Sure."

GRAHAM describes him as a white male, 5'8" to 5'10", 150-160 pounds, 25 years old, sandy blonde hair, short on sides, longer in back. He was wearing a white t-shirt with red trim (neckline was crew type) with short sleeves and blue jeans (possibly long length). She did not notice his shoes.

She and the stranger walked up to the parking lot between the bandstand and the restrooms. He asked her what she was doing. She told him she was waiting for her husband and parents. He said, "This is out of sight; there are so many people." He stopped three times during the walk to the parking lot to hold his arm against his body as if it was hurting. His left arm was in a beige sling with no cast. He said he hurt his arm playing racket ball. He asked her if she had ever played it; that it was a lot of fun. He asked if she lived around here. She said, "Bellevue", and that she worked at Boeing.

They approached a newish looking Volkswagon bug, metallic brown in color. GRAHAM did not see a sailboat so she asked where it was. He said, "It's at his folks house; it's just up the hill." He had motioned to the passenger side door as if to open the door for GRAHAM. GRAHAM told him that she could not go because she had to meet her folks. She asked him what time it was and he replied it was 12:20. She told him she was already late because she was to meet them at 12:15. He said, "Oh, that's OK. I should have told you if wasn't in the parking lot. He said, "Thanks for bothering to come up to the car." He walked GRAHAM about halfway back up toward the park. He said, "Thanks for coming with me. I should have told you it was not in the parking lot." He walked towards the bandstand.

Approximately 1200 to 1215 hours, JANICE OTT arrived at the park beach.

GRAHAM characterized him as very polite at all times, very sincere, easy to talk to. He kept up a continual conversation. He was friendly, nice smile and did not get upset when she told him she wouldn't go with him.

At about 12:30 hours, SYLVIA VALINT was laying on the beach at the park with her two friends. JERRY SNYDER was about 15 feet from VALINT with his wife. THERESA SHARP was with her family about 10 feet from VALINT. They were all on the beach about 200 yards directly in front of the east restroom.

The above three witnesses all observed JANICE OTT arrive on the beach and position herself between them. VALINT was the closest to OFF; about two feet away. JANICE OTT is described as five feet tall, 100 pounds, long blonde hair straight to the middle of her back. She was

wearing very short levi cutoffs, an offwhite, possibly yellow midriff shirt. She had with her a yellow girl's 10-speed bicycle. She took off her clothes and had on a black bikini. She laid down a plain white towel and laid down. She had with her a dark blue knapsack. She took out some cocoabutter, the type that comes in a small orange jar.

Subsequent investigation revealed the bicycle to be a Tiger brand, 10-speed, girls model, yellow, racing type handlebars wrapped with black vinyl, dual control handbrakes, narrow seat covered with quilted black vinyl, possible serial number P=290 stamped on bottom of crankcase or right side of vertical bar extending from crankcase to seat, tires are 27" x 1½" gumwall mounted on chrome rims and no fenders.

Subsequent investigation revealed the knapsack to be blue in color, canvas, two shoulder straps, waist strap, front pouch as well as the main pouch, and the flaps are tied shut; no metal fasteners.

OTT had been laying on the beach for about a half hour when a white male came up to her and said, "Excuse me, could you help me put my sailboat onto my car?" He said, "I can't do it by myself because I broke my arm."

The conversation between OTT and the suspect was probably more closely heard by VALINT due to her close proximity. SNYDER and SHARP readily admitted they only heard portions of the conversation.

OTT told the suspect to sit down and said, "Let's talk about it." He said, "It's up at my parent's house in Issaquah." OTT said, "Oh, really. I live up in Issaquah. Well, OK."

SHARP heard OTT say she did not know how to sail and the suspect said, "It will be easy for me to teach you." She asked if there was room in the car for her bike and he said, "It will fit in the trunk."

OTT put her cutoffs and shirt on. VALINT heard OTT say, "Under one condition; that I get a ride in the sailboat." He said, "My car is in the parking lot." OTT said, "Well, I get to meet your parents then." As they were walking towards the parking lot, VALINT heard him ask who she knew in Issaquah.

As OTT and the suspect were talking on the beach, VALINT heard OTT introduce herself as JAN and the suspect said his name was TED. VALINT and SHARP thought he had a slight english accent although SNYDER did not notice an accent. All three witnesses observed that the suspect had on a beige sling. VALINT thought he also had on a cast. SHARP noticed that he took his arm out of the sling when he was talking to OTT and there was no cast.

A consensus of opinion from VALINT, SHARP, and SNYDER described the suspect as 5'8" to 5'10", medium build, blondish brown hair, wavy down to the back of his neck, tanned skin. The suspect was wearing white tennis shorts, white t-shirt, white socks, and white tennis shoes.

OTT and the suspect talked on the beach for about 10 minutes.

At about 12:30 hours, JANICE GRAHAM observed the same man who approached her walking towards the parking lot with a girl who had a yellow bicycle. GRAHAM thought the bike was a 10-speed because of the curved handlebars. GRAHAM did not know where he was going to put the bike. GRAHAM met her folks at 12:45.

At about 1:00 PM, DENISE NASLUND, KEN LITTLE, BOB SARGENT, and NANCY BATTEMA arrived together at the park. They set up about 200 feet in front of the restroom near the end of the parking area. DENISE NASLUND is 18 years old, 5'4", 110 pounds, long dark brown hair parted in the middle. DENISE was wearing faded blue cutoff levis and a dark blue halter top. She also had two rings on each hand. One ring is a large.

blue stone on platinum. The second ring was a very large black onyx. She had a small metal band on her little finger. The fourth ring is unknown. She wore a gold watch with chain clasp, ladies style. Throughout the afternoon, the NASLUND group laid on the grass and watched games that were being played.

At approximately 3:00 PM, PATRICIA TURNER and her friends arrived at the park. TURNER is 18 years old, 5'2", 108 pounds, long brown hair parted in the middle. She was wearing a black flowered halter top tied in the back and long blue levis. She was also wearing rings and pierced earrings.

At about 4:00 PM, SINDI SIEBENBAUM was at the park. SIEBENBAUM is 5'6" tall, 120 pounds, 16 years old, long golden brown hair. She was walking back from the restroom about 100 yards from the restroom, when a man who was walking towards her said, "Excuse me, young lady, could you help me launch my sailboat?" She asked him what he had done to his arm. He said he sprained it and could not find anyone to help him. She told him that she was sorry, but she could not help him because she had people waiting. He said the boat was up the beach and that it would only take a few minutes. It appeared to SIEBENBAUM that the guy meant the sailboat was up towards the restroom since he pointed with his hurt elbow. She again told him that she could not help. The suspect kept on asking and tugged on SIEBENBAUMS'S arm. SIEBENBAUM finally just told him she was sorry and left.

SIEBENBAUM described the man as a white male, 5'10" to 6' tall, skinny, suntan, in his late twenties, sandy brown colored hair, parted in the middle, bangs over his forehead, 2" below his ears, clean shaven. He was wearing sort of bleached white boxer swimming suit with elastic band waist and his left arm was in a sling. He had sort of a pointed

nose and thin lips. SIEBENBAUM got the impression he was nervous because he spoke rapidly and gestured with his hand. She described his eyes a bug-eyed, set back, and small pupils. His shirt was long sleeved, left arm rolled up, in sling, faded light green, unbuttoned.

At about 4:15 PM, TURNER was not feeling good so she walked along the sidewalk to the concession stand. She was approached by a man that had a sling on his left arm. The sling was bleached white and clean.

TURNER described the man as about 5'8" tall, 160 pounds, well built, hair was dishwater blonde, neck length, and cut in a shag, about 25 years old. His hair was parted in the middle and messy. TURNER thought he was a good looking man. The man was wearing white shorts, white t-shirt, and white tennis shoes.

As TURNER walked to the concession stand, the man followed her. He talked to her on the sidewalk. He said, "I need to ask a really big favor of you." He asked her to help him launch his sailboat. He said, "I normally wouldn't ask this favor, but my brother is busy and unable to help." He sort of pointed in the direction of the parking lot with his elbow. TURNER told him she was sorry and in a hurry to go. He said, "That's OK." She did not notice an accent. He stood for a few seconds and then walked away.

At about 4:00 PM, BOB SARGENT had returned to the NASLUND group with hot dogs. All had hotdogs and potato chips. KEN and BOB fell asleep. DENISE had taken about 4 valium when she got to the park. DENISE mentioned to NANCY BATTEMA that she was feeling high. The NASLUND group had come to the park in DENISE'S car and DENISE had left her purse and personal items in the trunk of her car. NANCY asked DENISE what time it was. DENISE either answered 20 after 4 or 4:30. After a few minutes, DENISE got up without saying anything and walked straight

towards the restroom. NANCY BATTEMA was the last person DENISE knew to see DENISE NASLUND alive.

Sometime between 3:30 and 4:30, BETTY BARRY, a Seattle Police employee, claimed to have seen DENISE NASLUND in the restroom. NASLUND was talking in the restroom to another girl who was wearing a knit maroon bikini top. The two girls walked out of the restroom together.

At about 5:00 PM, JACQUELINE PLISCHKE arrived at the park on her bicycle. PLISCHKE is 20 years old, 5'4", 108 pounds, long blonde hair. PLISCHKE was wearing a very brief pink bikini top and short blue jean cutoffs.

PLISCHKE was at the park for about 20 minutes. She had gone to the point in the park where people waterski from. She observed a man who was watching her. She described the man in his early twenties, 5'8" tall, medium build, dark blonde hair, hair length was to the middle of his ear, beige sling on his left arm, the sling was not neat. She could not remember what he was wearing.

PLISCHKE came back along the path and the man approached her near the corner of the beach. The man said to her, "Hello, I was wondering if you could help me put my sailboat on my car." She said, "I'm not very strong." He said, "It's better that I asked someone who was alone." She told him she was waiting for someone. He then seemed to not have any interest in her. He said, "Oh, I see." He then turned away and walked towards the bath house.

PLISCHKE felt that the man talked smoothly, talked clearly, used no slang words, everything was very distinct.

Throughout the day of July 14, the weather was clear, hot, and sunny. The temperature was in the 90's through the afternoon. It was estimated that there were 40,000 people at the park. The main event at the park

ORIGINAL

was the Rainier Brewery picnic. The Brewery sponsored numerous races and contests for the public-

On September 7, two hunters were hunting in the Issaquah area when one of them found a human skull and what appeared to be a spinal column with portions of ribs attached. Subsequent investigation revealed that human remains belonging to three (3) people were scattered over an area of approximately 130,000 square feet. The remains, consisting of hair, decayed flesh, and bones, was scattered by animals. The area is covered with very dense foilage and undergrowth. It is located 4.4 miles east from Lake Sammamish which takes 12 minutes to drive. The remains were 300 feet north of I-90, a location that was accessible by a logging road.

A skull was identified as belonging to DENISE NASLUND and a mandible was identified as belonging to JANICE OTT. The third person hasn't been identified as there was only four (4) lumbar vertebra found belonging to that person.

In comparison to the ground around it was bare earth with no leaf covering approx 30" in a rounded corner square. Travelling the same direction about 15' beyond the earth just mentioned, was what looked to be the upper torso skeleton, rib cage, back bone, clavicle tips, pelvis, upper thigh bones, with cartilage still on the bones, no flesh or entrails were noted. About eight feet beyond the rib cage, following the same line of travel, was a skull, definitely human, devoid of flesh, lower jaw, or any external meat. But did contain a set of upper teeth. Sgt. Report on skeletal material found 1 1/2 miles east of Issaquah, Washington  
on 9-7-74 and 9-8-74.

Bag #1 - Spine, rib cage, pelvis, left femur (fragmentary)

The material in bag #1 represents a female. This diagnosis is on the basis of the fragmentary pelvis. The key here is the very wide sciatic notch which is a characteristic hallmark of the female pelvis. The age of this material is based upon the femur. The greater trochanter is absent and the bulbous nature of the femur suggests that this epiphysis had not completely fused. Also, the distal end of the femur is missing and again it is believed to be the result of immaturity. The greater trochanter usually fuses with the shaft of the femur between 17-18 years of age. Also, this is the approximate time for the distal end of the femur to fuse (Krogman, 1955).

Bag #2 - Fragmentary right pelvis and femur

It is believed that this material goes with that in bag #1. The pelvis, on the basis of the sciatic notch is female and in this instance we have a portion of the pubic bone and the subpubic angle is female. As in the femur in bag #1, this specimen lacks a greater trochanter and distal end of the femur. This points to a similar age. I hasten to add that there is always a range of maturational variability attached to age estimates, and when we say a bone is a certain age (17-18) this is at best an approximation; for it is well known that there is a great amount of individual variability in the timing of fusion of bony parts.

Bag #3 - Human Skull

Sex: Female. All evidence suggests that this is a female skull. The brow ridges are small. The nuchal lines are very small. The suprameatal crest is practically nonexistent. The total morphology of the skull suggests female.

Age: ca. 18-22 years. This estimate is based essentially upon dental eruption and the wear of the teeth since the skull displays a general premature closure of all cranial and circum-meatal sutures.

Race: Caucasian. The skull and mandible suggest Caucasian since it exhibits numerous features usually associated with this group.

Morphological description: Face: Extremely high and narrow face; zygomatic arches are very small and narrow, and the zygoma inclines distally at a sharp angle, thus accentuating the narrowness of the upper face. The nasal bones are extremely high and narrow and the root of the nose is high also. The nasal aperture is very narrow. From the side, the face presents a straight or orthognathous profile. This nasal morphology suggests that the individual possessed a long, narrow nose.

Cranium: The cranium is exceedingly long and narrow. The long head is the result of premature closure of the sagittal suture. This condition is called scaphocephaly and results in very long heads compared to their breadths. The cranial index ( $\text{breadth} \times \frac{100}{\text{length}} = 63.95$ ).

This is an extremely long, narrow-headed individual. The index for "average" long-headed individuals is between 71 and 76, thus the long, narrow head in this case is obvious.

The forehead is bulbous and the frontal bosses are quite pronounced. There is a small degree of asymmetry in that the left side of the forehead projects somewhat more forward than the right side.

The occipital bone as well as the general contour of the rear end of the skull is bun-shaped. Both of these conditions, the fullness of the forehead and the bun configuration are probably the result of unusual brain growth in a front-back direction during the period of brain growth in this individual.

Teeth (maxilla): All teeth are permanent and the individual possessed the normal complement of 16 maxillary teeth. The third molar had not erupted, although from its position in the crypt it is judged that this tooth was probably a few months from erupting. An isolated right maxillary third molar from bag #4 fits into the vacant crypt of skull (#7). The central incisors are normal sized and still display the remnants of the three mamelons along the incisal border. In older individuals these have usually been worn away. The long axes of the central incisors are inclined to the left, especially the left central. Also, the left central is positioned approximately 3 mm lingual (behind) the right central. An additional detail, the right central incisor presents a slight incline plane on the mesial half of the tooth. This indentation was not postmortem and therefore might be useful for identification. The lateral incisors are average size. The left lateral is positioned lingual (behind) the left central and its long axis is slightly rotated mesiodistally. The right lateral incisor is more or less in normal position, but it is rotated several degrees distolingually. This rotation positions the incisal border of this tooth obliquely to the same border of the right central. The canines are of normal size and present no distinguishing features. The premolars are both bicuspid and appear of normal dimensions. The first upper molars present 4 cusps. These teeth are of normal size. The right upper first molar has a slight development of the Carabelli cusp. It appears as a small enlarged crest on the lingual surface of the protocone (mesiolingual cusp). The left first upper molar lacks this cusp. If dental casts were ever made of this individual, this trait should be apparent on the cast. The second molars have four cusps although as is often the case in modern Homo sapiens the hypocone (distolingual cusp) is quite small and is really nothing more than a slight indentation along the distal surface of the tooth. The third molars are 3-cusped; they lack the hypocone (distolingual cusp). The absence of this cusp is frequently observed in humans.



Bag #4 - Left tibia, represented only by the mid-shaft, and 3rd maxillary molar

I do not believe on the basis of size and morphology that this tibia is from the same individual represented in bag #8. There is a third maxillary molar in this bag belonging to the skull in bag #3.

Bag #5 - Bone fragment, unidentified

Bag #6 - Mandible

Sex: Female. This sex diagnosis is on the basis of the small size and proportions of the mandible. The markings where the attachment of the masseter muscle inserts are barely visible. The coronoid process is narrow and pointed and the semilunar sulcus is relatively shallow. The ascending ramus, as well as the corpus is not pronounced. All of these features suggest female. One feature does not suggest female, and this is the square profile presented by the mandible in the region of the chin when viewed from below. I do believe, however, that the overriding features suggest female.

Age: The individual had not erupted the third molars. They do not appear to be present, however, this should be checked by x-ray examination.

Teeth: The central incisors are represented only by the left one. The right is absent and it appears to have been lost postmortem. The lateral incisors appear normal in size. The left one is positioned slightly distolingually to the left central. The canines are represented only by the left one and, here again, I believe it was lost postmortem. The premolars show nothing unusual and are of normal size and position. It might be noted that both first premolars display 2 or 3 small cuspules along the mesial marginal ridge.

The first molars have four cusps and present the +4 pattern. In addition, the left one has an amalgam filling in the buccal developmental groove, while the right has a large amalgam filling on the occlusal, mesial and buccal surfaces. The second molars are also 4-cusped. The left one has an amalgam filling identical to the first and the right one has an amalgam filling that occupies the occlusal and buccal developmental groove. The filling does not pass to the mesial surface as on M<sub>1</sub>.

Bag #7 - Mandible (this mandible fits with the skull in bag #3)

Teeth: All 16 permanent teeth are present. As in the maxillary dentition M<sub>3</sub> has not erupted or perhaps the protoconid (mesiobuccal cusp) had just pierced the gingival tissue. The central incisors appear to be of normal size and morphology. The incisal border of the left central is horizontal, whereas that of the right central inclines distally. The lateral incisors are of average dimensions. The right lateral incisor is more caniniform than its antimeres and is also positioned (rotated) lingually to the canine. The canines appear to be of normal size. The first premolar is bicuspid and both right and left are similar in size and position. The second premolar is also bicuspid, albeit, the left presents a better developed distal marginal rim than its antimeres. Also, this marginal rim displays two or three very small grooves. The first molars present 5 cusps. The left one has the typical Y-5 pattern. This configuration is as follows: The hypoconid (distobuccal cusp) contacts the metaconid (mesiolingual cusp) in the central basin. The occlusal surface of the right first molar is obliterated due to a large amalgam filling. The second molars present 4 cusps and here again we see an amalgam filling on the occlusal surface of the right one. Although not erupted M<sub>3</sub> possesses 5 cusps. Finally, it should be noted that in addition to the two fillings mentioned, there is a buccal amalgam filling in the developmental groove of both lower first molars. The mandible is gracile and presents few rugosities. Both the ascending ramus and the corpus are small and narrow.

Bag #8 - Right tibia - proximal and distal ends missing

Bag #9 - Vertebral column consisting of 11 thoracic vertebra and 5 lumbar and very fragmentary pelvis, all articulated. Bones are small and delicate suggesting female. There is a laceration along the ventral surface of the centra of lumbar 3 and 4. The explanation for this is not immediately apparent to me.

Bag #10 - Cervical vertebra (axis to 7th plus 1st thoracic with attached 1st rib (left) - probably this material goes with vertebrae in bag #9).

Bag #11 - Fibula, fragment - distal and proximal ends missing

Bag #12 - Right humerus. Small but more robust than humeri in bags #13 and #20. This humerus represents another individual.

Bag #13 - Left humerus, same general structure as specimen in bag #20. Specimens in bags #20 and #13 probably represent one individual.

Bag #14 - Right femur. Distal and proximal ends missing. The lesser trochanter is missing. The bone is heavy and shows well developed linea aspera.

Bag #15 - Right scapular fragment (small)

Bag #16 - Bone fragment, possibly from mid-shaft of right ulna.

Bag #17 - Left femur. Distal and proximal ends missing. Lesser trochanter is missing. This bone also presents well developed linea aspera and it is of the same general size and proportion as specimen in bag #14. I believe these femora represent a single individual.

Bag #18 - Atlas vertebra - probably goes with vertebral column from bag #1. Left femur with distal and proximal ends missing. The lesser trochanter is present. Small femur.

Bag #19 - Bone fragment, possibly from mid-shaft of radius or ulna.

Bag #20 - Right humerus fragment. Proximal and distal ends missing. Deltoid tuberosities slightly developed. Small in construction.

Bag #21 - Four lumbar vertebrae (L1 - L4). The 3 upper vertebrae are articulated, one is loose. These are badly preserved. The vertebral epiphyses are still represented as slight lines thus suggesting recent closure, and therefore a young adult.

Bag #22 - Bone fragment, possibly from mid-shaft of radius or ulna.

Bag #23 - Fragment of rib, left side

Bag #24 - Fragment of what appears to be the odontoid process from the axis

✓ Bag #25 - Six ribs - very fragmentary. All left ribs. One of these, I am not sure which number, shows a marked indentation just medial to the angular facet. The rib is broken at that point and may represent an old injury. All of these ribs are gracile.

Bag #26 - Fibula fragment. Distal and proximal ends missing

Bag #27 - Right femur. Proximal and distal ends missing. Lesser trochanter present. Linea aspera well defined. This bone is somewhat larger and more robust than the isolated femur in bag #18. If these two femora go together (bags #27 and #18) we then have the two femora from the third individual. If not, a fourth individual is represented by the femur in bag #27. Additional clarification is necessary before positive identification is possible.

Bag #28 - Fragment of what appears to be the upper portion of the left greater sciatic notch, thus this fragment represents a piece of ilium. Female ?.

Bag #29 - Fragment. Portion of right ilium representing the upper border of the sciatic notch and part of the auricular facet. The contour of the notch strongly suggests female. This fragment and the fragment from bag #28 represent the right and left halves of two ilia, however, in my opinion, they are not from the same individual.

#30 - Two (2) boxes

Box #1: Right maxillary canine, human. Both from size and coloration, the tooth appears to go with the mandible in bag #7.

Box #2: Left maxillary lateral incisor, human. Both from size and coloration the tooth appears to go with the mandible in bag #7.

Bag #31 - Nonhuman. Animal pelvis.

Bag #32 - Nonhuman. May be a bird bone.

Bag #33 - Nonhuman vertebrae and ribs from some small mammal.

Bag #34 - Religious book. Fragmentary.

Bag #35 - Three human ribs. All left.

Bag #36 - Left tibia, proximal and distal ends missing. The anterior crest is extremely sharp and the bone is more robust than the tibiae in bags #4 and #8, thus representing another individual.

Bag #37 - Left human scapula, badly preserved. Small; delicate.

Bag #38 - Human Rib - left.

Bag #39 - Unidentified material.



- Bag #40 - Nonhuman vertebrae and two ribs, probably a young cow?
- Bag #41 - Human left pelvic fragment. The contour of the sciatic notch suggests female. There is evidence that the iliac crest has recently fused, thus indicating an individual in their late teens or early twenties. The pelvic fragment in bag #29 might belong with the more complete pelvis in bag #41. This is certainly no more than an educated guess based upon size. If this is true it means there are three individuals as stated earlier. If this new fragment does not go with the other material, and if fragments in bags #28 and #29 are different individuals, we have the pelvic fragments of four individuals.
- Bag #42 - Shaft of human left humerus. Extremely small; delicate. proximal and distal ends missing. I believe that this humerus goes with the right humerus in bag #12.
- Bag #43 - Nonhuman. Probably the distal epiphysis (?) - femur of a cow?
- Bag #44 - This bag contains extremely small bone fragments which I do not believe to be human. I do not know what animal they are from.
- Bag #45 - Unidentified bone fragments.
- Bag #46 - There was no bag #46 included.
- Bag #47 - I do not know what the specimen in this bag is, probably an animal of some sort?
- Bag #48 - Seven fragmentary thoracic vertebrae, plus what appears to be fragmentary ribs. This material is human. The vertebrae are badly preserved. Also, where it is possible to determine, it appears that the epiphysis of the centra had not completely fused and were lost after death suggesting a young adult. These thoracic vertebrae might go with the four isolated lumbar vertebrae described in bag #21.

Summary

There are definitely three (3) individuals represented by this material. The skull and one mandible are probably female and may go with the articulated spinal cord and pelvic and femoral fragments in bags 1 and 2. The isolated mandible is probably that of a young female and may well belong with various bone fragments represented in this collection. There are two (2) more or less complete vertebral columns plus four (4) lumbar vertebrae from a third individual. In addition, there are femora from three (3) individuals, thus, there is positive evidence of three (3) individuals. It is our opinion that there are two (2) fragmentary female skeletons represented and they both were probably in their late teens or early twenties at the time of death. Since the third individual is represented by such fragmentary material it is difficult to assess the sex or age, however, the femur is rather small. I would not hazard a sexual diagnosis at this time.

We have finished examining the remains collected by R.D. Keppel. The bones are definitely non-human and appear to belong to a minimum of three immature elk (genus Cervus). The remains definitely are not those of a goat.

The epiphyses on the long bones are not fused in any of the individuals inspected. The cranial bones give evidence of still patent sutures.

The permanent dentition has not fully appeared--the dentition is mixed (deciduous and permanent teeth), again indicative of an immature group of animals.

There is no evidence of butchering, carving, etc. Some post-mortem gnaw marks are present, however.

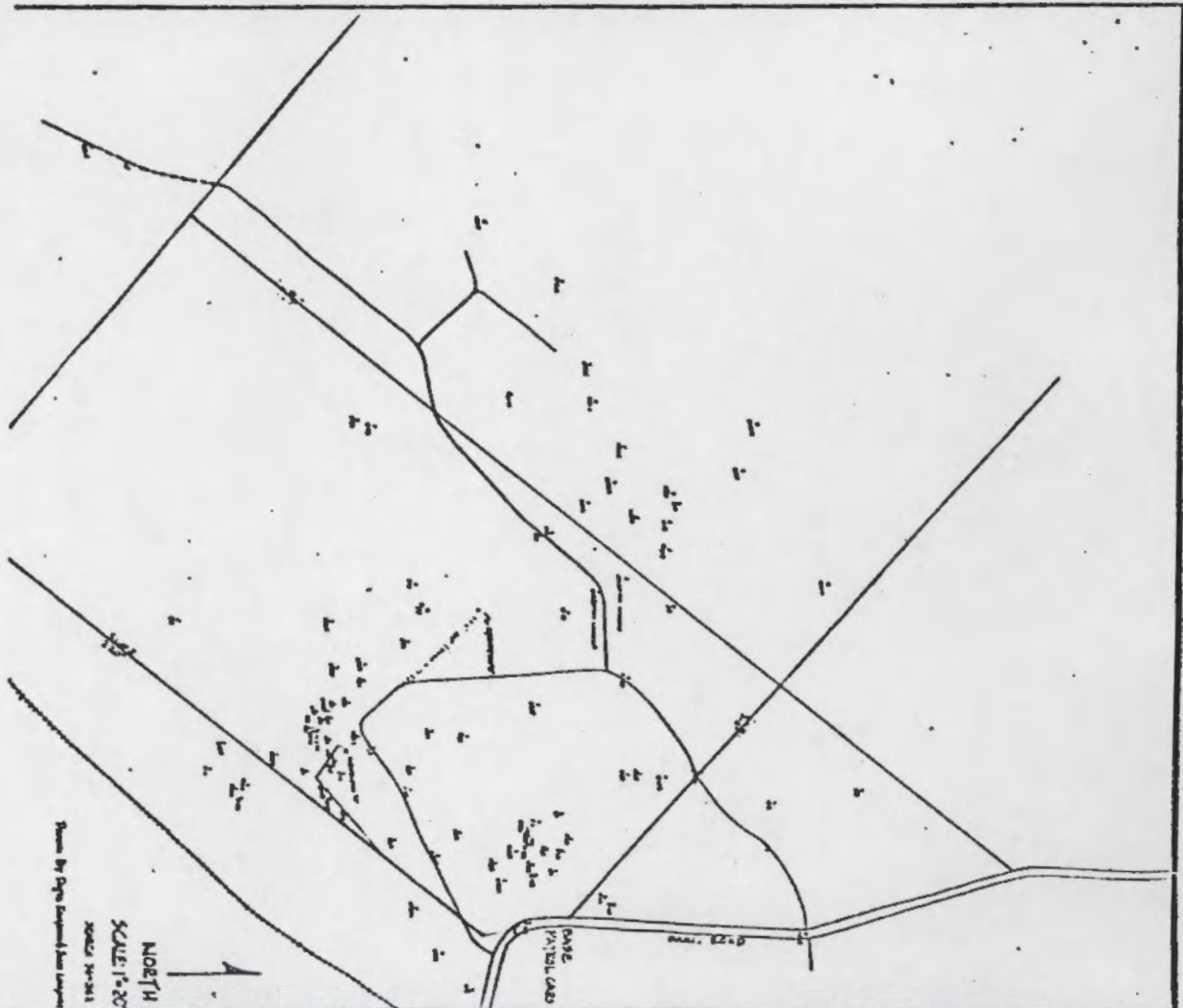

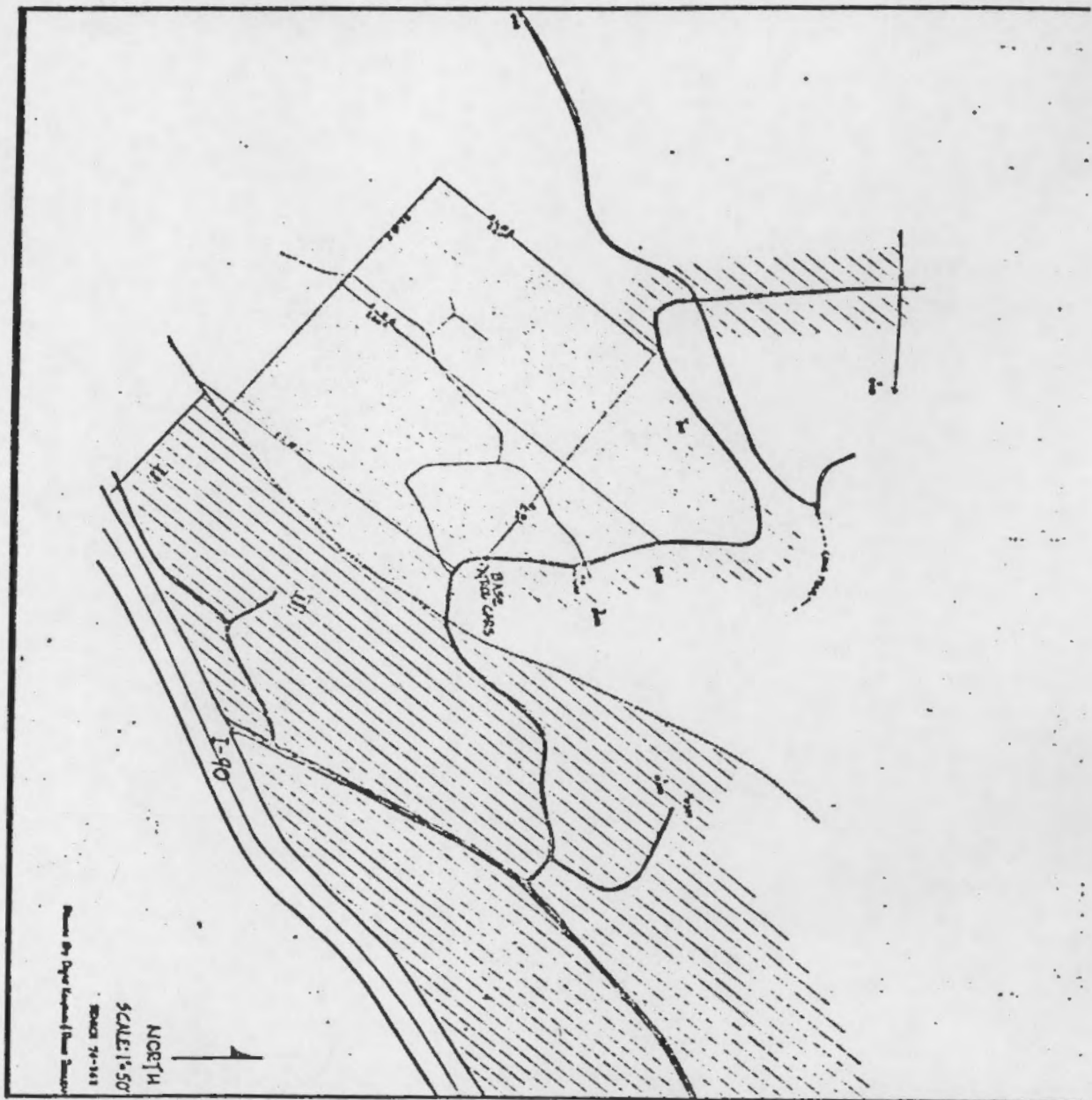

Mrs. Janice Blackburn Ott was first seen July 14, 1970 at which time she was undergoing periodic vomiting spells which were believed to be on a functional basis. X-ray examination of the upper gastrointestinal tract was normal.

She was seen in September 1970 with a problem of dysmenorrhea and stated that she had missed her last menstrual period. No investigation was undertaken at that time and she was advised to use aspirin for the dysmenorrhea.

She was seen in July of 1971 with chronic respiratory distress, sore throat and cough. She stated that she was now menstruating two times a month and was still experiencing some ovarian dysfunction. Therefore, she was put on Norlestrin-1 anovulatory medication at that time.

She was seen again in May of 1972 stating that she was still on the Norlestrin-1 and had no further menstrual disorder. At that time she had monilial vaginitis and had been treated elsewhere successfully and no further treatment was undertaken.

He was on a survey crew in the area where the bones were found, just after the girls were missing and reported hearing gun shots. He said they were surveying along the area of the railroad grade and noticed a distinctive odor. I arranged to meet him in the field the next day.

23 10-24-74 1010 hrs.: Met with ROGER OLSON and the rest of his survey crew consisting of FRANK CARSON, 6601 210th SW, #105, Lynnwood, 776-7262, he is the crew chief; FRANK HUGHES, 10442 NE 142nd, Bothell, 822-8369; and CALVIN C. DECKER, 10056 Interlake Ave. N. 522-0696. This is the same crew that had surveyed the railroad grade on June 25, 26, and 27, and also on July 10 and 18, 1974. OLSON went on to say that they parked at the area where the base camp for the Explorer Search & Rescue was set up and during his lunch hour he noticed a strong odor. He went to examine to see what the odor was emanating from and he found a carcass that he thought was that of a deer. He observed this from about 20 feet away, and he didn't go any nearer to explore it. Using the dates from his time log, with the corresponding dates that the girls were missing, the carcass was too badly decomposed to be that of either JANICE OTT or DENISE NASLUND. It could very well have been the third set of bones which were found at the location. He was taken to the spot where the bodies decayed for some time and he said it definitely was not that area and the decomposition rate would have been such that the bodies would have been whole at this point. Due to the fact that he thought the carcass was that of an animal, he didn't bother to call in at the time or draw it to the attention of his other crew members.

24 10-25-74 1930 hrs.: Called MRS. RUTH PETERSON and discussed the house just below the crime scene with her. She will check all of her back rent records past KIM EGGERS for previous tenants. They never lived at the house and always rented it out. The house had been purchased from the Highway Department in the Lake Hills area and moved to the location approximately ten years ago.

25 10-26-74 1000 hrs.: ELEANOR ROSE and DENISE NASLUND's family conducted a Memorial Service in the Holy Family Catholic Church at 9600 16th Ave. SW. I attended this Memorial Service without incident. There were no possible TED suspects at this service.

26 1500 hrs.: At the end of the Memorial Service, a graveside service was held at Forest Lawn Cemetery. The only one who was out of place was RICHARD K. SYPHER, 12-3-44, who lives at 5018 N. McBride Street in Tacoma. He provided credentials of a journalist from the Tacoma News Tribune and said he was covering the service for his newspaper. His driver's license photo was requested.

She saw two rings, one blue stoned ring, yellow gold.

The city of Yacolt is about 25 miles from I-5; it is in the Northeast Clark County. About two miles from Yacolt one must turn South on the Dole Valley road and travel about one mile, then turn off on a dirt road. At the end of the dirt road is a dirt turn-around commonly used by lovers. A path starts at the end of the turn-around.

128. The body location was about 100 feet along the path, one body was down between two old cedar logs approximately 5' in diameter; the other body was about 40 feet farther up the path, dropped next to a similar cedar log. Portions of bones from the first body were dragged over the cedar log apparently by animals. Bones were found in an area of about 10,000 square feet. The path that the bodies were found along appeared to be more used by animals than by humans. The only physical evidence located was a blue Tampax holder near the second body find. The bodies were thought to be dumped nude since no clothing nor jewelry was found. Investigation indicated that animals had removed and gnawed bones from bones of both bodies. The second body had been identified as CAROL L. VALENZUELA who was reported missing to the Camus Police Dept. on August 4, 1974. VALENZUELA was last seen in Vancouver hitchhiking to the Welfare office. CAROL was married to ROBERT VALENZUELA. Clark County has eliminated ROBERT from involvement in CAROL's death or disappearance. He was cleared after a polygraph examination. CAROL was found about 25 miles from the area last seen. The first set of bones appears to have been subject to more decomposition than VALENZUELA. The bones were that of a female, 18 to 25 years old, about 5'5" to 5'7"; there is still a mandible missing from this body. The skull has been recovered. Dental charts of BRENDA BALL have been examined with negative results. Identification has not been made. No apparent cause of death has been determined. Bones are being sent to the FBI lab for examination.

129. Clark County has a subject in jail by the name of [REDACTED] he is charged with Rape and Attempt Murder. [REDACTED] dumped a nude female in a county park after he had raped, strangled, shot with a dart gun and stabbed her. He left the female for dead but she lived. [REDACTED] is not talking. Clark County feels [REDACTED] may be responsible for other deaths but they do not have any evidence to link [REDACTED] to the deaths. [REDACTED]'s photographs has been shown to witnesses in King County cases with negative results. [REDACTED] appears to match the description of TED but Clark County has verified that [REDACTED] has had a mustache for the last year.

The people in the car did not get out. The semi driver went towards the dummy with a flashlight, it was about 10:30 at night. The four of them ran across the trestle. One kid by the name of BUCKY ELLIS had good clothes on and high heel type of shoes and was slow in catching up with them. Others involved were JIM JOHNSON and BROCK BAKER. The writing on the dummy was just terminology the kids thought of to put on it. [REDACTED] estimated that he had thrown dummies off the trestle in the past three years about 3 or 4 times. The top portion of the dummy was a white hooded sweatshirt, the head was a paper bag inside the hood; there was no wig. [REDACTED] related that the other 3 kids involved would be cooperative and would answer any questions with respect to the dummy.

144 11-20-74 0800 hrs.: Contacted OFFICER KEITH MOON of Issaquah PD. MOON originally investigated a dummy being thrown off the road; he picked up the dummy and threw it in the bushes and then a couple days later went back to the area and tore the dummy in half, taking the top portion, the sweatshirt to Issaquah Police station to show other officers. He threw the pants in the bushes, the pants were not torn when he saw them. The date on his report is only approximate.

145 11-25-74 0930 hrs. Had meeting with CAPTAIN MACFIE and JOHN BERBERICH, psychologist. DR. BERBERICH gave his impressions of the women confronted and the sused TED. First, the women were ages rather young looking, 5'3" to 5'6"; their builds were typically slender; long uniform hair, mostly blonde; all had cut-offs worn on July 14th, except one; all were wearing brief bikini tops. Most of the girls he interviewed were easily approached except for PATRICIA TURNER. Most girls gave the appearance of being sexually naive. DR. His composite of TED included penetrating eye contact, takes rebuff well, clean, neat in his appearance, is respectable; he doesn't get into rough things, he is a lone, educated, does not have a sexual pick-up line of his own; he feels comfortable with women; at one time said "out-of-sight." He was aware that JANICE GRAHAM was married. He noticed that TED no longer winced when going back to the car with JANICE GRAHAM after he knew his particular meeting would end fairly soon; he doesn't feel that TED is socially adept. JANICE GRAHAM had no signs of anxiety. TED had no sighing or stretching to relieve anxiety. He feels that TED does not partake in manual labor; not the rugged type. In TED's confrontation with TURNER she got the impression that he was sociable, not bashful, no bumbling; clean, physically attractive; stood close
