attention.

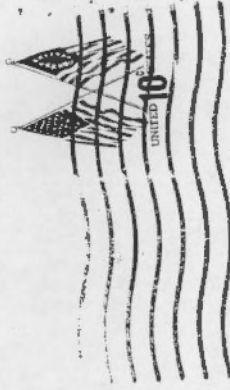
Also, through one of my neighbors

Girl reports rape, torture at beach near Vancouver, B. C.

VANCOUVER, B. C. — Police are investigating a report from an 18-year-old girl that she was raped and tortured Thursday at Britannia Beach, on Howe Sound north of here.

The description given to police here did not match that of "Ted," a suspect in the disappearance of several Washington State women.

The girl described her assailant as a white male in his late 20s or early 30s; 5 feet 7 inches to 5 feet 8 inches tall, fat and flabby with sideburns and short dark brown hair swept left to cover a balding area, police said. He was riding a Kawasaki motorcycle with a red gas tank and told the woman he was from Toronto, police said.

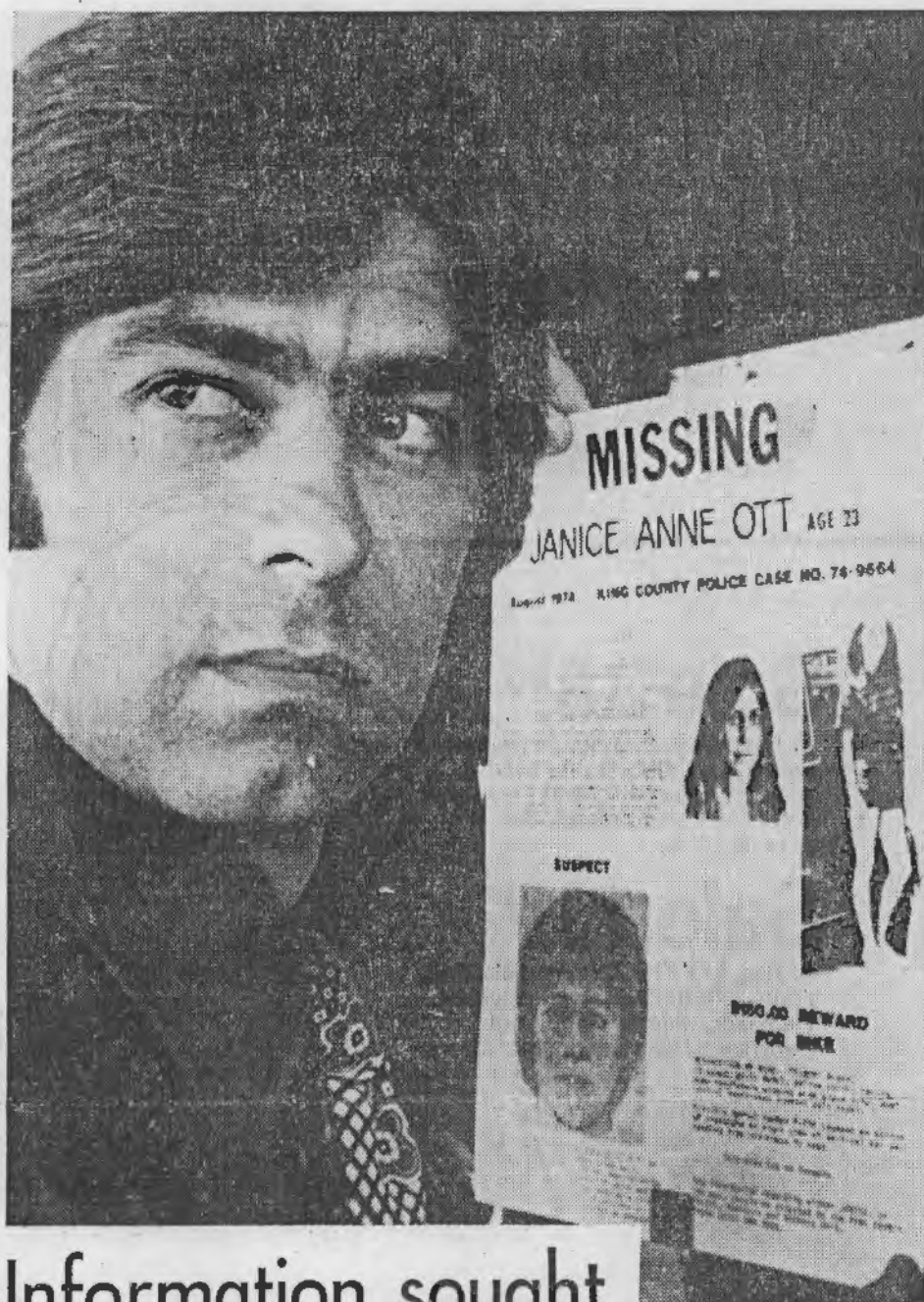
Officials said the girl, who arrived in Vancouver four days ago from Toronto, told police the man whipped her and burned her with a cigaret.

She was found staggering on a highway by motorists, taken to a hospital and later released.

Six bodies have been found in the past year in British Columbia. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police recently charged a 26-year-old man with two of those murders. The victims were Roberta Gates, 15, whose body was found 40 miles east of here July 9, and Barbara Joan Statt, 17, found dead in North Vancouver July 29. The man also is charged with a murder-rape in Ontario. Police said the man does not fit the description of "Ted" as he is 6 feet 4 inches and 225 pounds.

Meanwhile, in Washington State, where at least seven women are missing, directors of the General Telephone Co. of the Northwest announced they have offered a \$1,000 reward for information leading to the whereabouts of Susan Rancourt.

Miss Rancourt, a Central Washington State College student, disappeared from the Ellensburg campus April 17. Her father, Dale Rancourt, is an employee of General Telephone.



Information sought

James Ott, 27, posted the first of hundreds of notices asking for information about his wife, Janice Anne, 23, who has been missing five weeks today. He posted the notice in front of the King County Juvenile Court, which has offered office space and the part-time help of a probation officer, Carol Hasman, to the Janice Ott Committee. The citizens' committee hopes to find persons who might have seen the woman at Lake Sammamish State Park, from which Mrs. Ott and Denise Marie Naslund, 18, disappeared July 14. At least five other young women have disappeared in the state since January.—Staff photo by Vic Condiotty.

AUTOBIOGRAPHY

If someone were to appraise the things I had accomplished in my life they might say that I had accomplished a lot and should have a good life ahead of me, and if I were to agree with them, I would state that it is due to the fact that I take pride in myself by doing my best in whatever I do. I feel that if anyone is to be successful at anything, they must put everything they have into it and be sincere in doing so. If there is anything worth having, it is best savored with the knowledge that it was gained through hard, honest work.

Most of the activities in which I partake are of a physically active nature. I suppose it is because I cannot see much accomplishment in anything that is of a passive nature. That is not to say that I do not enjoy being lazy occasionally--who does not? I do like to be off by myself sometimes just to enjoy simple, natural things in life, that usually entails a walk late at night when the air is fresh and the noise is at a contenting level. If I am at peace with myself, then it is easier for me to accept most things for what they are, and not what I would like them to be just for my convenience.


Most of my working experiences have been of a labor type, such as newspaper boy, yardwork, gas station

attendant, cold storage warehouse employee, and construction worker. I cannot really say that any one of these has had a singular effect on my life style. Rather, I should probably say that they have had a cumulative effect on my knowledge of people, knowledge of tools, and a knowledge of money management. If any were to take precedence over another, my knowledge of people would be the most enhanced. A working relationship with people can be one of the most valuable tools a person can possess.

My decision to choose prosthetics-orthotics as a profession was based on the fact that I would be working with people in an active manner, and in the process, help them to function in as "near to normal" a capacity as possible. This in turn would enable that person to enjoy the things that he would like to enjoy, but otherwise could not due to his particular handicap.

Although, I have not had any exposure to the professional field itself, I have been exposed to a handicapped person with whom I have a personal relationship. Through our relationship, I have built an understanding and compassion for that person's needs and it is very gratifying to see that he has adjusted so well under the circumstances.

Due to my active nature, I suppose, I do not like to see people put in a situation where they are forced



to maintain a relatively non-existent, non-active life style. After my involvement with the handicapped, it would give me great satisfaction to see someone enjoying an activity which they would otherwise not be able to enjoy.

Too often, people with handicaps are overlooked, and in some cases, do not even exist! It is the barrier of simple acceptance that would seem to be of great importance to the handicapped person, and if I can help to bring down this barrier the pleasure would be mine.

A curriculum in Prosthetics-Orthotics is offered by the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine in the School of Medicine. It provides professional training in the basic sciences and the clinical use of accepted fitting and fabrication techniques.

The Prosthetic-Orthotic program leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science awarded by the School of Medicine upon completion. Students are admitted to this curriculum autumn quarter at the junior level and, among other qualifications, must ordinarily have completed the specified requirements or their equivalent with a minimum cumulative grade-point average of 2.50. Exceptional cases will be considered when applications are supported by adequate evidence of qualification.

Applications for admission into the curriculum must be received by February 15th of the year in which the applicant plans to enroll.

The last two years of the curriculum must be taken at the University of Washington School of Medicine. Entrance to the program is dependent on the decision of the Prosthetic-Orthotic Advisory and Evaluation Committee.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE PROGRAM

Prerequisites and other curriculum requirements:

- A. Minimum cumulative grade point average required for consideration for admission - 2.50.
- B. Proficiency requirements: A total of 15 quarter credits from English composition, foreign language and/or mathematics is required for those who do not meet the proficiency requirements upon entrance to the University. (For detailed information regarding proficiency requirements and exemptions, consult the University of Washington College of Arts and Sciences Bachelor's Degree Plan book. The book may be obtained by writing to the Arts and Sciences Advisory Office, B10 Padelford Hall, GN-10, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington 98195.)
- C. Distribution requirements: A minimum of 60 quarter credits selected from the distribution list is divided so that a minimum of 20 credits each is in Humanities, Social Sciences and Natural Sciences. Courses taken to satisfy the proficiency requirements are not to be included in the 60 credits. (For further details related to distribution requirements, see the Arts and Sciences Bachelor's Degree Plan Book.)
- D. Prerequisites:
 1. Biology 101-102-General (10 credits) or Microbiology 301,302-General (3 & 2 credits). NOTE: Chemistry 102 is prerequisite for Microbiology.
 2. Chemistry 101, 102-General and Organic (10 credits recommended only).
 3. Physics 114, 115, 117, 118-General (10 credits)
 4. Biological Structure 301: Human Anatomy (4 credits)
 5. Zoology 118 or 208: Human Physiology (5 credits)
 6. Education, Curriculum and Instruction 306: Industrial Education (5 credits)
 7. Mechanical Engineering 302: Welding (1 credit) or equivalent
 8. English Composition, 5-6 hours (2-3's or 1-5)
 9. Psychology 100 or 101
- E. Electives: (Recommend list) to equal a total of at least 90 quarter credits on entry to the third year of the curriculum.

- F. The following application procedure must be initiated before February 15th, preceding the Autumn Quarter for which the student applies for admission:
1. Arrange for a personal interview.
 2. Submit application to Bernard C. Simons, Director, Division of Prosthetics & Orthotics, BB911, University Hospital RJ-30, Seattle, Washington 98195.
 3. Arrange for official transcript(s) to be sent directly from the registrar(s) of the college(s) to the address given above. Include complete record with grades and credits to date. (When college transcripts do not include a complete list of high school courses and credits, such a list must be submitted with the application.)
 4. Enclose with the application a listing of the courses (with credits) in which the applicant is currently enrolled. Also list all planned course work prior to entry to the third year. An official transcript of these courses should be forwarded when available. Enclosure of an unmounted photograph with the application is desirable but not required.
- G. It is necessary to also apply for admission to the University of Washington as well as applying for admission to the Prosthetics-Orthotics Curriculum. Write to Undergraduate Admission, 320 Schmitz, PC-30, University of Washington, Seattle, WA 98195, for an application of admission to the University. July 1 is the deadline for transfer students to be admitted for the following Autumn Quarter, and it is wise to apply as early as possible.

The University of Washington's campus - 660 acres of trees, landscape and buildings - is located on the shores of Lake Washington and has long been considered one of the most attractive in the nation. Many different species of trees, shrubs and flowers add beauty to the campus. 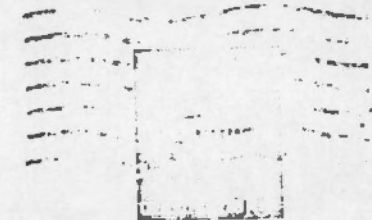

3-26-75 1010 hrs.: Called by DET. REED, SPD - he received a phone call from DETECTIVE LANE, Riverside, California. He related that MR. BRADY had lived on Orchard Ave. since 1958 - no one used the telephone on 6-24-74.

1125 hrs.: Interviewed BETTY J. STOVER at the King County Youth Center. STOVER first met JAN OTT at the Youth Center a short time after April 1973 when BETTY started tow work at the Youth Center. She did not ever go out with JAN while she was living with JAN at their apartment on Dayton Ave. One day JAN asked to live with BETTY because JIM had to go to California and JAN was not going untill September. JAN moved in toward the middle of June.

BETTY visited JAN's apartment on Dayton on one occasion for dinner with LINDA DRAHN and possibly took her home once before.

BETTY characterized JAN OTT as a perfectionist - she was very neat and clean, always had clean and pressed clothes. She would press her clothes she had worn if they were clean, then immediately hang them up. Her work at the Youth Center was very professional - she never seemed afraid to break up fights in the girls' detention unit. JAN appeared to be concerned about her own life style. BETTY felt that JAN led a rather sheltered life and since she was separated from JIM it was a new experience for her. BETTY felt that JIM and JAN even had an understanding--JAN wouldn't have minded if JIM had relationships with other women. BETTY got the impression that JAN did not go out with other males until she had moved to the apt. on Dayton Ave. Her attitude was more of the dare-devil type. She mentioned hitchhiking and was not afraid to start talking with anyone. JAN liked active things and probably would have liked to go sailing if someone asked, even a stranger.

JAN appeared to be confused about her own marriage; she was not happy about being married; she had doubts about her husband. JAN used to get upset because JIM used to have long periods of silence even when he was around friends and JAN would have to talk to keep things going.

JAN did not mention much of her sex life with JIM. BETTY got the impression that JAN was more dissatisfied with the marriage arrangement rather than being dissatisfied with her sex life. BETTY felt that JAN was childish in hersex attitudes and almost curious about sex. There was one occasion when Lesbianism was brought up in conversations but not enough to develop an impression of.

On 7-13-74 at about 10:00 p.m. BETTY came home with her boyfriend. JAN was home and was drowsy from sleeping. BETTY said that JAN mentioned she had talked with JIM - it might even have been two phone calls. JAN appeared to be troubled by the conversation, and it was possible that the conversation was a heart-to-heart type. JAN could not talk because of the presence of BETTY's boyfriend.

During the time JAN lived with BETTY which was about 20 days, JAN went out with RAY JACOBSON, and another guy named RAY, and CHAS. DeLAURENTI. These were the only ones that BETTY is familiar with. She may have gone out with more.

JAN had some problems with her vaginal area - BETTY thought that JAN had a D & C either in Spokane or at Group Health. She had complications with her periods. LINDA DRAHN mentioned to BETTY that JAN had cancer or some problems with her ovaries. BETTY felt that JAN was probably closer to her sister who lives in Spokane and also to LINDA DRAHN.

On July 14th, JAN called BETTY to ask if she could use BETTY's back-pack. BETTY told her that she could. JAN said that she was going to Lake Sammamish.

BETTY described her back-pack as nylon, dark blue in color with black straps--two shoulder and one waist, a small pocket on the front with heavy duty silver snap. White draw string to close the major portion of the pack. The waist strap had a metal pin clasp. She purchased the pack at Greg's Bicycle Center on Greenlake in the Fall of 1972.

BETTY described JAN's bicycle as unusually heavier than her own 10 speed. BETTY could easily carry her own 10-speed up with one hand but she could not carry JAN's with one hand. The bike was bright yellow with a lot of chrome.

On the morning of the 14th, BETTY went to work at the Youth Center. JAN called in the morning and asked to use her back-pack. It was usual for JAN to ask before she used anything of anyone else's. BETTY did not go home that night. The next morning JAN did not show up for a tennis game with DEE PETERSON at 7:00 a.m. Then JAN missed a luncheon date with CHAS. DeLAURENTI. It was not like JAN to miss appointments at all, then BETTY called the Issaquah police.

During the time after JAN disappeared, JIM OTT stayed at BETTY's house. BETTY does not know who notified JIM OTT that JAN was missing. She does not know any of his friends. While BETTY was on vacation from July 29th to August 22nd her boyfriend MICHAEL MEIGHAN stayed at her house. MICHAEL is now in Kansas City working a research job with the University of Kansas Medical Center. JIM OTT was also in and out of the house. BETTY moved out of the house in September or October.

JIM OTT came to the house when the bones were found, JAN had not yet been identified. He talked of searchers finding boughs of hair.

After JAN's disappearance BETTY had the locks on the doors changed. She gave a new key to JIM OTT; she didn't think he had an old key. JAN did not give him one. JIM gave back the new key at the end of August.

BETTY had given a new key and an old key to CHIEF PROSISE. BETTY remembers JAN's keyring as having a hard leather device on a key ring. She identified an older key and a keyring as displayed to her by DETECTIVE KEPPEL as possibly resembling the old key to her house. It would have been possible for JIM to have obtained a key because BETTY just left the old keys lying around in her house.

3-27-75 0910 hrs.: Called SERGEANT GISLE, Riverside P.D. Homicide - had him check out address 5 [redacted] Canyon Crest, also the P.N 686-[redacted] - supposedly the address and phone number where [redacted] lived on July 14th.

1410 hrs.: Called Greg's Bicycle Shop regarding the pack purchased by BETTY STOVER. The manager stated they sold many different packs and it could possibly have been a Jan Sport Pack. He does not have any of the past sales slips.

1530 hrs.: Received telephone call from ERNIE LUERA, Riverside P.D. Homicide. He stated that the address on Canyon Crest was an apartment house. [redacted] lived in # [redacted]. He lived there from June 1974 to August 26, 1974. He left a forwarding address of [redacted] Front St. S., Issaquah. His reference was [redacted].
