THE PLOT (sort of)

Marco and Guiseppe, two Venetian gondoliers with strong republican leanings and a penchant for finding pretty girls (even when blindfolded), are somewhat dismayed to discover that one of them is a likely heir to the throne of Barataria.

This intelligence is relayed to our heroes by the Grand Inquisitor, a somewhat lugubrious gent who confesses in a roundabout way that he does not know which of them is high-born and which is merely a "vulgar-boatman". They democratically agree to share the crown until things are cleared up.

Matters are further complicated by the arrival in Venice of the Duke and Duchess of Plaza-Toro, a moth-eaten pair of aristocratic racketeers. This seedy duo claim that their daughter Casilda had been married by proxy when a baby to the infant son and heir of the King of Barataria. Casilda has now reached twenty one and unbeknownst to her parents has been "carrying on" with the family servant, Luiz. The Plaza-Toro's, with the scent of loot strong in their elegant nostrils, place their case before the Grand Inquisitor. He informs them of the slight mix-up involving switched babies and other skullduggery.

Casilda's arrival is a further embarrassment for Marco and Guiseppe and their brides. A classic Gilbertian matrimonial entanglement unfolds, involving two grooms and three brides. The situation appears desperate, but . . . at the finale of the Second Act Inez, the King's foster mother, is brought on and in an interesting recitative solves the whole problem. Everyone is paired off in a neat and morally proper fashion, virtue triumphs once again and happiness reigns supreme. Which of course, as everyone knows is the way that theatrical performances are supposed to end!

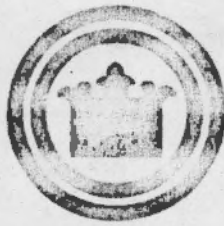



7-21-74 0230 hrs. I was detailed to Boeing Field with one of the County photographers, JIM NEIL. At this time we contacted MEL MCKIVOR, our pilot with Civil Aeronautics. I was to photograph the area of Lake Sammamish State Park and JIM NEIL was going to photograph using infrared film with a 35 MM. We took off and photographed the complete area of Lake Sammamish State Park. Returned at 0515 hrs. I then returned to the office and answered phones from possible witnesses until 1900 hrs.

7-20-74 I arrived at the office at 8:00 and answered phones from possible witnesses who state they may have cited the suspect or suspect car. Finally secured at 1400 hrs.

7-23-74 0800 hrs. - 1300 hrs. Answered phones and did follow-up on information supplied by possible witnesses. Reference this case.

After talking to MR. MORELAND it is apparent that he is suffering from a very nervous disorder; he has not worked since 1962 and has been living with his parents at least since that time; he is not married and does not drive a car; he does seem very concerned about MRS. OTT and all of the girls missing from the Seattle area as is his mother, both seem to be following these investigations closely. A statement was taken from MR. MORELAND regarding his conversation with MRS. OTT, I then secured at 1550 hrs.

When he took off I ran his plate: CLH- [redacted] 1963 Pontiac (Blk), comes back to [redacted] out of Sequim. I then found the car he wanted at 8520 So. 115. The car is a rental out of Virginia and rented to a [redacted] of [redacted] NW 22st, Acala, Florida phone# 1-404-774- [redacted]. The person who talked to me also said that his sister could describe the inside of the car and the house. He was very adamant about the fact that penetration had occurred and that she was indeed raped.

I then went down to Nels Cafe on So 114 and Rainier to have breakfast. While there, a young crummy looking male came into the cafe. I was drawn to his face as he is (too me) a dead ringer for the latest composite in reference to the missing girls from Lake Sammamish State Park. I told him to come over to my table, he did, and I asked him to identify himself to me. He identified himself as [redacted] 05- [redacted]-51 out of West Virginia; S.S.# [redacted]. I called Data and ran his name, data was down at the time and I told him to hang around. He said that he was staying at the SARGENTS home; 8 [redacted] So 119. About five (5) minutes after he walked out to the restaurant, the phone rang and data said that the NCIC had a hit; he was a fugitive out of West Virginia. I ran out and drove up the hill and picked him up. We then went back to Nels Cafe where I finished my breakfast and had a talk with him. He finally admitted he was an escapee and that he was serving 1 to 10 on burglary.

I took him to the county jail, booked him investigation fugitive, had him mugged and printed and called Lt. Kraske.

Point of interest: [redacted] told me that he has been listening on the radio about the missing girls and that he knows he looks like the suspect.

We got to the park at about 3:50 - 4:00 p.m. We walked over to where the band was playing and talked to some of our friends. The four of us then walked out onto the peninsula where the kite-skiers were. As we started walking back toward the band, I noticed 2 white males wading across the creek. There were some boats out on the very end of the peninsula including sailboats. The two guys that crossed the creek followed us and started talking to us, not quite a football field's length from the bandstand. One of the guys was about 5'9" tall, about 135 pounds because he was thin. He had light brown hair below his ears like a styled shag that hadn't been kept up. He had a tanned complexion with blemishes. He was wearing white pants with some type of brown print and I think they were a cheap double knit. His pants were wet up to his knee and he was barefoot. He didn't have a shirt on but was carrying his left arm in a sling. The sling could have been made of his shirt because it was pretty decrepit looking, kind of dirty white. I am positive he had a cast on his left arm as well as the sling. The cast went up above his elbow and I distinctly remember it had writing on it. His general appearance was messy and unkempt. His pants hung very low on his hips and the shorts underneath were baggy. I couldn't tell if they were boxer or jockey type but they definitely were not tennis

His hair was blonde, straight and came down to about his shoulders. It appeared tacky and was not styled. He wasn't wearing a shirt and I believe he had on long jeans. His general appearance was sloppy and unkempt. He had a round medallion around his neck that hung down to mid-chest. I don't recall a particular design but remember that it flashed in the sun. Both guys looked burned out but I didn't smell any booze or dope on them. Both of them looked tired. I turned both of them off right away and really didn't pay much attention to them. I saw the artist's conception in the Sunday paper and I think the guy with the sling looked like that drawing except his hair was more messed up. DET. 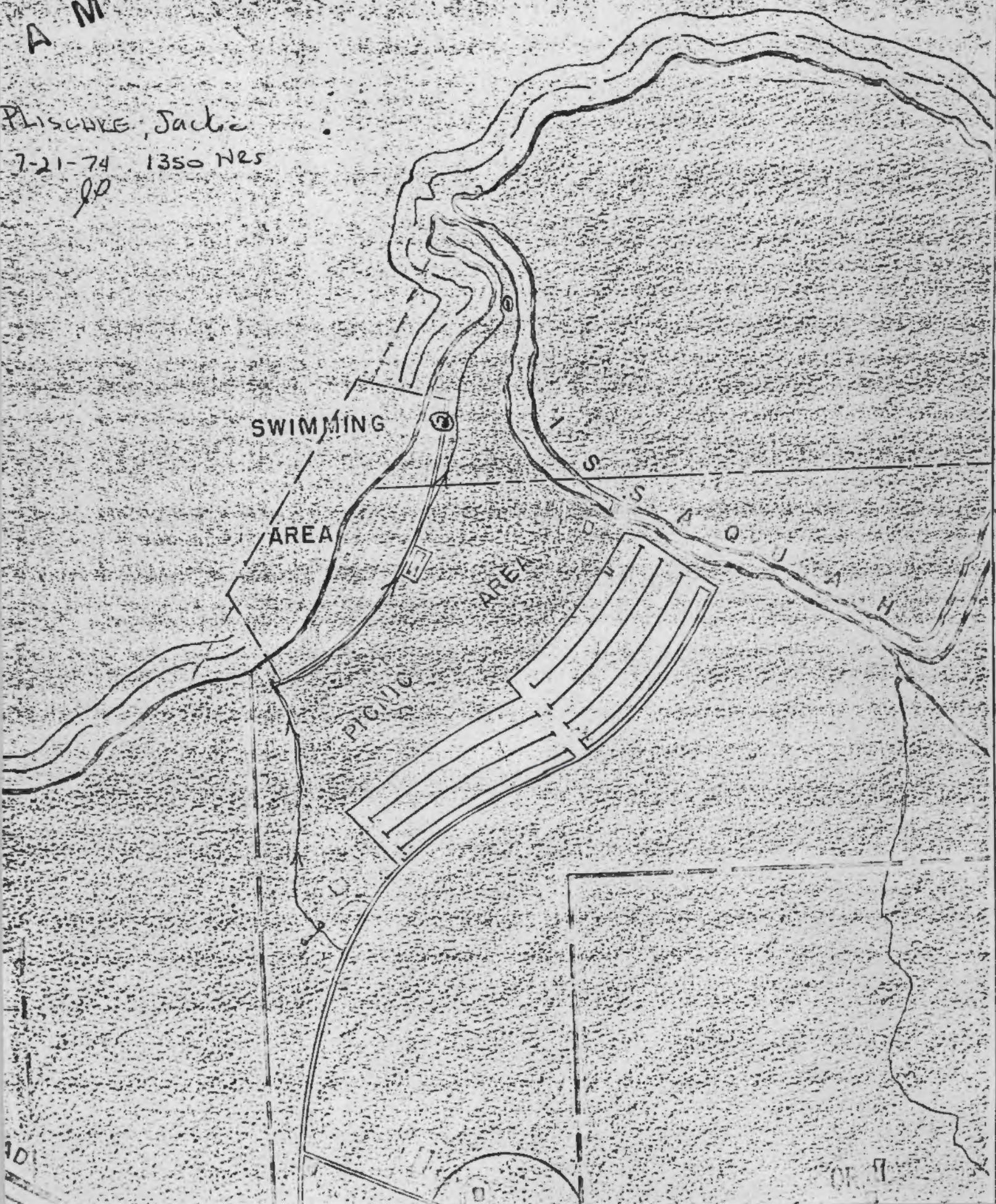

95 1515 hrs.: Reviewed the case with D.P.A. PHIL KILLIEN who said that since the case has received so much publicity and composites have been used to describe the suspect, when a good suspect or suspects are developed, they should be advised of Miranda Rights at the start of any interview. If a confession or admission then comes out, a probable cause arrest could be made on investigation of homicide. If enough circumstantial evidence is available, it will not be necessary to find the body of any victims to establish the crime of homicide.

96 On 7/28/74, the P.I. posted a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the recovery of the missing girls in the Northwest, which includes JANICE OTT, LYNDIA HEALY, [REDACTED], GEORGANN HAWKINS, SUSAN RANCOURT, DONNA MANSON, and ROBERTA PARKS from Oregon State University. Our unit received an anonymous call from a woman who stated that JANICE OTT's bicycle is possibly at the north end of Beaver Lake. She also mentioned two other lakes, Pine Lake and Yellow Lake. She refused to give any more information.

Please have patrol officers working in these areas be aware of this information. The bicycle is described as follows:

"TIGER" Brand, 10-speed, girls model, yellow paint; racing-type handlebars, wrapped with black vinyl dual control handbrakes (center pull type); narrow seat covered with quilted black vinyl. Possible serial number P-290 stamped on bottom of crankcase or right side of vertical bar extending from crankcase to seat. Length of this bar is 19". Tires are 27" x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " gumwall, mounted on chrome rims. Fork is chrome plated 12" from axel extending up the fork. Accessories include kick-stand and possibly a red reflector on rear. This bike has no fenders.

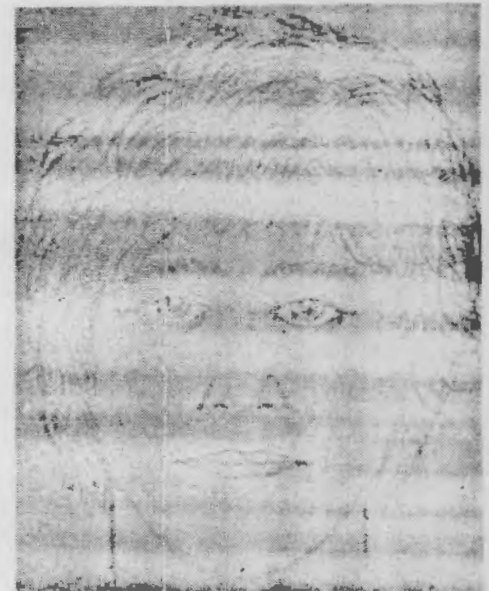
JANICE was last seen wearing cut-off jeans, a white shirt tied in front and a dark colored knapsack. She was wearing a dark colored bikini under the above clothing.

MISSING GIRLS - DENISE NASLUND AND JANICE OTT

A Medium from Washington D.C. was contacted about the cases and had an impression about the individual responsible for the girls' disappearance, as well as his house and vehicle which are noted below:

HOUSE: The Medium saw a very quaint gingerbread-type house constructed in the 1920's on a hill, 1,000' from the road. The color of the house was painted yellow with brown trim. It had a small front porch. It had a globe-type light hanging on a chain 6-7' long on the front porch. It had a swing couch in bad condition also on the front porch. The house was located on a secondary road in the country not too far outside Seattle. At this point, the Medium saw the number "47". He didn't know what it implied. There is a mailbox at the roadside that is homemade and looks like a birdhouse. The number "137" is on the mailbox.

MAIL-BOX:

There is a silo in the rear and to the right of the house as you face the front of the house. The color of the dome on the silo is red; the rest of the silo is light colored. There may be other buildings in the rear of the house that cannot be seen. The most unusual feature of the house is that it has four (4) chimneys.

JANICE OTT's bicycle is at the house, and is a yellow "TIGER" girl's frame ten-speed with gumwall tires and the serial #P-290.

VEHICLE: The type of car that is seen at the house is an American-made car, probably a Ford station wagon, and light colored. The glass on the left tail light is broken.

SUSPECT: The Medium described the man that was with JANICE as being in his late 20's or early 30's. He has blond short hair, a good build, and he saw blue jeans.
