SUBJECT Suspicious circumstances

On 6-23-74, just after midnight, (Sun Morning), P/R (Mr James Thompson) of 5020 20th NE, 525-3243, observed a W/F-20's with long blond hair being forced into a vehicle in the 5000 block 20th NE. P/R states that there were 2 males. One inside the vehicle he could not describe or tell race. #2 was a W/M-20's with short bleached (almost white) hair. As #2 went around the vehicle to drive, P/R could see the W/F and male in the vehicle fighting. Vehicle was a late model Station Wagon, model unk, large, white or yellow with a large chrome luggage rack. P/R called 911 at the time. Checking the log sheets for that date revealed that radio cancelled the call before the car arrived. P/R did not cancel call and came to N. Station 2 weeks later to determine the results of his call. No Lic # obtained, P/R states that it was green on white but does not think it was Washington. P/R states that another neighbor may have seen it also.

Approx. 3 to 4 weeks ago an incident was related to me by a friend, involving a conversation and poss. pick-up by a strange N-M.

Sheila Burke, age 22, blond hair, and generally fits the discrip. of the missing girls frm. the U. Dist. was sitting on one of the planters near the monorail waiting for her mother to get off work. ---- 1800 hrs. ----

Sheila's attention was focused on the traffic that was W/B on Pine, when a N.M. driving a white van with the lettering YOUR BLOOD CENTER ~~XXXXX~~ tried to get her attention. Ignoring him she turned the other way, as she had never seen the man before. Then approx. 3min. later the same N-M came up to her frm. behind and asked her why she ignored him. After she told him that she didn't see him, and didn't talk to strangers, the subject said " Well I can understand that. My ~~my~~ name is [REDACTED], what's yours?" He continued to ask her all types of quest. as where she worked, what was she doing downtown, was she waiting for someone? After Sheila told him that she wasn't going to answer any of his quest., the subject stated " I bet you live in the north-end." The man finally left after she shunned all of his advances. Sheila futher said the subject stood abnormally close during the intire conversation, as if he was going to touch her or grab her.

Making inquires ~~at the blood bank~~ found out that the blood bank at Terry & Madison has a N-M 25yrs. named [REDACTED] who works for them.

HE TOLD HER THAT THERE WAS NOT AND HUNG UP. AFTER RETURNING TO THE OFFICE I CALLED MRS. HADRICK AND DETERMINED THAT SHE HAD CALLED THE [REDACTED] RESIDENCE AND MADE THE INQUIRY ABOUT THE GIRL. IF THERE WAS IN FACT AN ABDUCTED GIRL AT THAT RESIDENCE, MRS. HADRICKS CALL MAY HAVE FORWARDED THEM AND THE GIRL COULD HAVE BEEN REMOVED PRIOR TO OUR ARRIVAL.

On 8/8/74 at 1715 hrs. I was in the process of releasing some belongings from the Property Room to a convicted burglar by the name of [REDACTED] B/T #73-653. Simmons has been "fairly" truthful in the past, and passed on the following info:

On 3 or 4 occasions in the last few months, he has observed groups of 3-5 N/M's & N/F's coming & going from an apartment house in the 1800 block of East Roy, across from the Russian Community Center at 704-19th E., on each of these occasions, they have placed a different W/F in her 20's in the trunk of various vehicles and driven off. He was unable to tell if the W/F's went of their own free will or not. Wouldn't furnish any other particulars, other than to make a remark about the missing W/F's the department has been looking for.
