Possible appearance of 'Ted' retold

Editor's Note: The following story is an account of an incident that occurred at Western last spring. The girl's name has been changed to safeguard her identity.

It was about 10 p.m. on a warm spring evening. Lisa had just come from the sauna at Beta Gamma and was headed back to her dorm at Kappa—50 yards away.

Lisa, who was wearing a duster and clogs, saw a young man with a cast on his right arm walking toward her. As he saw her he dropped a pile of books he had been carrying and asked her to help carry them to his car which was parked nearby.

As she walked behind him between the dorms she became suspicious and asked where his car was parked. He didn't answer but got down on one knee and reached into his pocket.

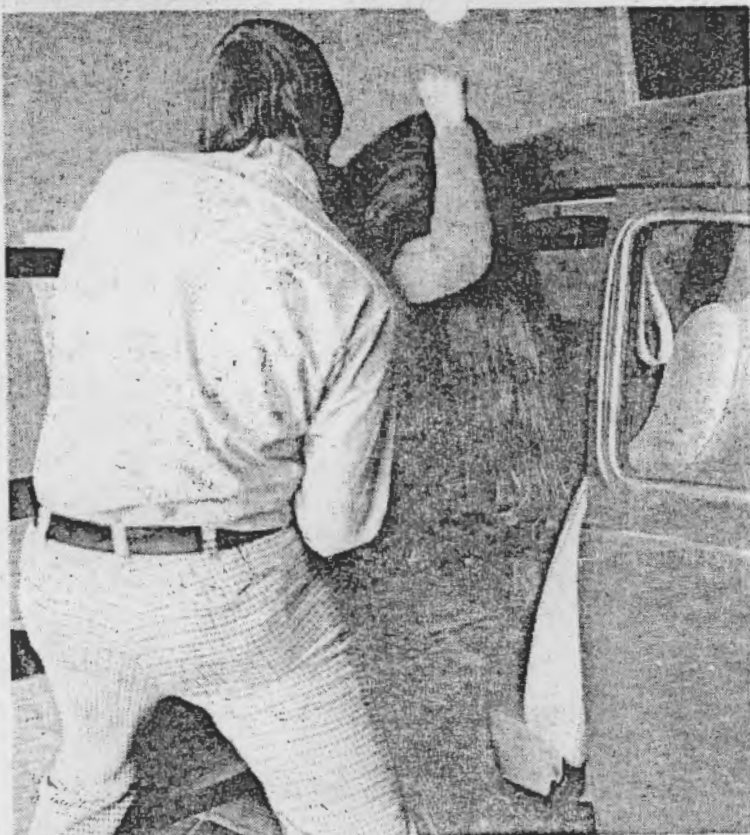
"I didn't know what he was doing," the 19-year-old said. "That's when I really became frightened."

He led her to an unlit parking lot on the hill adjacent to the dorms and stopped at a light-colored Volkswagen.

Opening the door, he asked her if she would help look for his keys which he said he had dropped earlier.

"I was so scared by then that I dropped the books on the hood and began to run down the trail leading to the street. I heard footsteps coming behind me but just as I got to the top of the driveway a car came and I ran down the road."

Lisa didn't mention the incident to anyone. "I was

afraid my mother or boy friend would find out and kill me.

But during the summer when the media first reported the disappearances of Denise Naslund and Janice Ott from Lake Sammamish State Park she became frightened.

The man at the park was described by other women who had been approached on that late summer afternoon as a smooth-talking young man who wore a cast on his left arm and

drove a metallic-brown Volkswagen.

Lisa remembers the man she encountered was considerably taller than the man described to police.

Whether it was a coincidence or the same man she doesn't know, but she admits she now is paranoid of strangers.

"It was a stupid mistake on my part and I'm just thankful that I didn't end up like the other two women—dead."

Supplementary Reports on Case #74-00336 - Susan Elaine Rancourt

On Saturday, 4/20/74, two groups of residence hall personnel were contacted regarding Sue Rancourt. The general situation was discussed with these groups, one at the Tanum Creek Campground and the larger group in the Counseling Center. Very little in the way of additional information was discovered, but each group was alerted to the seriousness of the situation and the fact that we have no evidence of any kind regarding the nature of her disappearance or the reason for it. Mr. Pickles made contact with Dennis Hamilton regarding a reported assault on a female which had occurred at an unknown time and place a number of days previously.


At the second meeting I discussed the situation with Diane Pitt, Sue's room mate. Diane reports that Sue was on "the Pill" but that she was not promiscuous. She did mention that Sue had spent the night with a boy named [REDACTED] and a boy named [REDACTED]. I asked her to put these boys in touch with me.

On 4/22/74 both boys, who are room mates in A-24 Barto, came to see me. I interviewed them separately.

[REDACTED] is [REDACTED] and describes Sue as a very alive and aware person, perhaps the most so he has known. He only knew her 2½ to three weeks, and remembers her for her love of life and stability. He would like to have know her longer. He particularly noted that he could see nothing depressive about her. He said that she would never go anywhere without Diane, that she had no particular friends except Diane and some male named Mike and perhaps one or two others. He was also in the jogging class with Sue.

He spent the night with her on one or two occasions in her room, and reports that she seemed to feel little if any guilt over the sexual contact. He said that she had no particular preference with

regard to sexual stimulation.

 Sue told him that she had broken up with [REDACTED] because of his drug use.

"She liked me probably because I'm so conservative". He said she was choosy and not loose. He further said that he thought she really liked [REDACTED] better than him, possibly because he, [REDACTED] is engaged to be married and had told Sue the relationship could not continue more than a few more weeks.

He said Sue really liked school, liked physical things like swimming, jogging, and other physically active pursuits.


He said Sue had no fears and was setting out to convince her father that she could handle her own life.

He reports that Sue used dental floss a lot, that she liked clean white teeth.

The other boy was [REDACTED], who met Sue at the end of Fall Quarter at a party. He said she did not drink much at parties, but when she did she drank mixed drinks. He never saw her drunk.

He describes her as really easy going, and that she liked him more than he liked her. She would come over on her own initiative to see him, and then feel guilty because she had been too forward.

He says that he more or less broke up with her in the middle of February. He thinks she is probably still in love with [REDACTED]

 [REDACTED] He described her as definitely affectionate and physically so. He spent one or two nights in her room and feels that she was not free with her body but that she had probably been to bed only with him. She seemed quite natural and spontaneous and asked for no particular kind of sexual interaction.

He said she was really close friends with some guys in B-10 Barto.

He said this is just not normal for her to disappear, that she

would tell someone, because she always faces things head-on.

At 8:42 p.m. Monday, 4/22/74, Thurley Moen at the switchboard asking for Sue Rancourt. Mrs. Moen asked him where Sue Rancourt had lived, and the young man replied that he/heard that she was missing and wanted to talk to her room mate. However he was notable to remember the room mates name, only that he had met Sue last fall and wanted to inquire of the room mate about Sue. Mrs. Moen did not inquire the name of the caller but she did give him the telephone number of the room.

On 4/22/74 Mr. John Wilkie College Duplexes, ASC #9721620, came to my office voluntarily to offer some information about Ms. Rancourt. John is quite definite that he saw Sue on Thursday, April 18th, at about 10:55 a.m. on the Walnut Mall just North of the tennis courts and about even with Wilson Hall. He says she was headed south walking quite rapidly, looking very agitated and distressed. He spoke to her because he had a botany class with her in Fall Quarter and was also one of her lab partners. He said, "Hi, Sue," but she did not respond. It was very unlike her not to respond because she had always spoken to him before. He cannot remember whether she might have glanced at him but he is certain that she looked very distressed and did not speak to him. He was impressed by the very rapid way she was walking toward the south.

Mr. Wilkie dates this on Thursday because on that day he had an exam in statistics at 10:00, as well as exam in accounting at 8:00. His professor in the statistics class is Professor Gunn. The time of this exam should be checked out with Professor Gunn. At that time Sue had on a coat of light color, possibly light brown, not buttoned, and the rest of her clothing was generally the same color, although his attention was directed to her face because of the anxious expression on it. She was not wearing any makeup, and there was nothing in her hands. John is positive that it was Sue that he met, but it is possible to shake him on whether it happened on Wednesday or Thursday, although he did pass within two feet of her and because he was in a class with her he feels he knows her very well.

He mentioned also that he dates this encounter on Thursday because Wednesday was a review day in the class with the test following on Thursday.

He says Sue had as a close friend a dark haired girl in the same botany class, this girl having sat by Sue in Botany 111. He also says that there was a Sunday study group of people in this botany class, both males and females. He felt she seemed to like one fellow, a boy with rather blondish hair.

His last previous encounter with Sue was approximately one month previous in the Barge-Mitchell courtyard.

He further says that at the encounter on Thursday he remembers there was no wind blowing, and he further remembers that after paying his final payment on an expected maternity bill for his wife he played golf.

During the hour and 10 minutes of our conversation John sweat two rather large circles under his arms, through both a shirt and a light jacket. John describes himself as a rather high-achieving

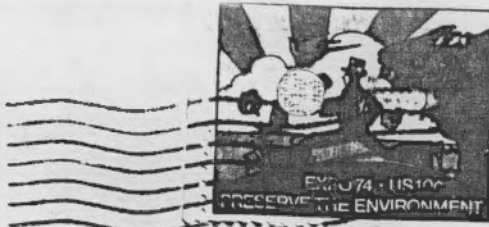

than I did!!

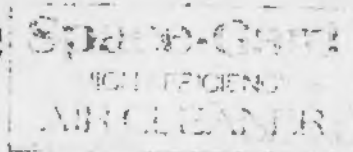

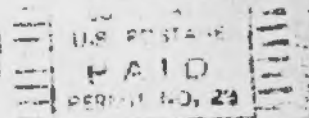

If the description of your suspect as furnished by the RANCOURTs is correct, it is doubtful [REDACTED] is even close.

Photographs of subject [REDACTED] and his vehicle are enclosed for your consideration. It might be noted that [REDACTED] indicated the vehicle was white when he purchased it. He had the vehicle painted "Astec (metallic) Gold" which is a 1974 Chrysler color.

The parents of RANCOURT were understandably upset when they observed this vehicle. They were assured that [REDACTED] does not fit the description and that as far as can be ascertained the vehicle was in Delaware.


Subject [REDACTED] was born and raised, (according to military records) in San Jose California.

INFORMATION: On Tuesday 11-5-74 approximately 1 p.m. Mrs. Rancourt contacted Investigator Rice by phone and identified herself as the mother of the possible homicide victim from Ellensburg, Washington. She at that time stated that her daughter was possibly abducted on 4-17-74 and was probably a rape/homicide victim in that city. She further stated there were a total of 7 suspected homicide/rape cases in the same general area and that police agencies within the state of Washington are currently investigating. She stated the suspect vehicle had been developed by investigating agencies which is described as a bronze or gold colored VW. She states this is a "unique" color in that it is thought that the color is not that which is a stock Volkswagen color. She stated the reason for her call was she had observed such a vehicle in the Mountain View area just moments before making the phone call. So she and her husband thought perhaps this department should be aware.			
It should be noted that no correspondence could be located regarding this incident from the "lower 48" and the only information known by this department was what has been reported in the local news media.			
Investigator Rice and Officer Dennis responded to the Mt. View area and discovered a metallic gold Volkswagen parked on Bragaw Street near Paterkin. The license number is AY [REDACTED]. Contact was made with the Department of Motor Vehicles and it was ascertained that the vehicle is registered to [REDACTED] PFC - 3 Box 2 [REDACTED] Elmendorf. The vehicle had been registered on 10-30-74 and the owner did not have his title to it. It has formally been registered in the State of Delaware.

SUMMATION:

As I was coming back to work to the campus and crossing the street at 7th and Walnut I noticed a young man leaning against the post at the corner (No Parking-Here to Corner) of Muzzall Hall. The young man was staring very intently at a large group of girls (Cheerleaders). These girls were in the middle of the block between Sampson and Walnut on 7th - their baggage was all lined up and they were waiting for transportation to take them from the campus. (This was at 1:00 pm on July 19, 1974)

The young man definitely fits the description of the composite sketch in the Crier July 25, 1974. He had medium brown curly hair that seemed to be cut the same length all over and ^{2m} ~~xxx~~ middle-of-the-neck length (fine-^{2m} ~~busxxx~~ bushy) - he particularly attracted my attention because he was staring so hard and when I got to him and ^{1m} looked directly in his face ^{2m} he just continued this stare. He had dark brown eyes (I looked directly into them and couldn't see the pupils) - He was dressed in medium brown shirt and medium brown trousers (not tan) - slight built - and narrow, pointed nose - slender face (Approximately 150 - 160 lbs ^{2m} - 5 ft 7 in. tall). His complexion was smooth.

He did not have a cast on either arm.

I had such a peculiar ^{2m} feeling about the man - after I walked ^{2m} ~~axxxx~~ little further I decided to turn around and ask him something (probably, If he was looking for ^{2m} someone) - but when I started towards him again - he walked very briskly away from me-taking short, fast steps.

Writer contacted Kathy D'Oliveo by telephone to ascertain if she had given a statement to the Pierce County S.O. The statement is being forwarded to this department.

Ms. D'Oliveo stated that she had been walking to her car from the library when a man dropped boxes and packages that had been contained in a light nylon backpack, the type some students use to carry their books in. He had his right arm in a sling with metal braces on fingers of both hands (the type of brace used on broken fingers). He stated he had been in a skiing accident, but did not state where. He did not use his right arm.

She helped him carry the items to his VW bug. (She stated it was shiny, possibly brown in color) no ski racks that she can remember. The car was parked on 10th Street--just north of the railroad trestle, 1/4 block east of Chestnut Street. Subject dropped his key, she backed up so she could spot the key's reflection in the light, picked up the key and handed it to him. (See statement for details). Stated subject was soft spoken.

Ms. D'Oliveo described the man as not clean cut looking or hippy, but kind of weird looking. He had long hair, below the ears, shaggy, dark brown. She stated that she had never seen him before or after this incident on campus. She stated that her image of the man is blurred and cannot remember if he had a mustache or not; whether he wore wire-rimmed glasses or not.

On Wednesday, April 17, 1974, about 8:00 I dropped off my roommates in close to downtown Ellensburg and drove up to the library. I parked in the sub-parking lot next to Hertz Music Hall.

DET.: Where is the parking lot in respect to the library?

KATHLEEN: Kind of kitty-corner to the library, I guess about a block span.

DET.: Which direction does the library face?

KATHLEEN: It faces west.

DET.: Okay, what did you do when you left your car in the parking lot?

KATHLEEN: I locked the car and walked right over to the library, went in the main entrance to the library; I think I went upstairs, in the upper part of the library (that is called the curriculum laboratory). I'm not sure that's where I was that evening, but I'm almost sure. I stayed there until 10:00.

DET.: What were you wearing that particular day?

KATHLEEN: Most likely I was wearing blue jeans, and I'm not sure what I had on with it that time of the year, I think I was wearing a blazer jacket.

DET.: What was the weather condition outside?

KATHLEEN: It was a clear night, I don't remember it being extremely cold or extremely warm.

DET.: How tall are you?

KATHLEEN: 5'9½".

KATHLEEN: I think I had, most likely I had a couple of notebooks, possibly one or maybe two textbooks with me, no more than that.

DET.: What kind of purse?

KATHLEEN: A shoulder strap purse made out of navy blue fabric.

DET.: What route did you take to get out of the curriculum lab?

KATHLEEN: Most likely I went straight out of the lab, down the main stairs of the library, and out the door, the main entrance. Now I'm not sure on that, I could have done something else in the library before I left, but I don't think so. I think I went straight from that area on out.

DET.: When you leave the library, do you have some sort of book procedure that you have to check through on the way out?

KATHLEEN: They don't actually check your books, but its electronically done now, and you do walk through a certain path to get out.

DET.: What would happen if the electronic system went off?

KATHLEEN: That would mean you were carrying a book that wasn't properly checked out, or had some other property of the library. I went through it with no problems and left.

DET.: You left through the front door, then?

KATHLEEN: Correct.

DET.: Where did you go from there?

KATHLEEN: I walked out, I took a right, which was leading across the front part of the library (cement porch-like, whatever) and was cutting across a lawn that went between the library and Black Hall. I was aiming toward the parking lot where the car was parked. I hadn't quite gotten off the lawn, or sidewalk (wherever I was, I hadn't reached the main mall stretch) when I heard something behind me. It sounded like something

following me, it didn't startle me or anything, it wasn't a loud noise and I turned around and there was a man dropping books, he was squatting, trying to pick up the books and packages was what he was doing, and so I noticed that he had a sling on one arm, and a hand brace on the other. I didn't really notice it at the time, I just noticed that he was unable to pick up that many things and I assumed that he was going into the library. I went over and said, "Do you need some help?" He said, "Ya, could you," or something to that affect. So I picked up what was to me felt like a bicycle back pack, it was light nylon material, kind of.

DET.: Do you recall the color?

KATHLEEN: No . . . orange stands out in my mind, but there are so many orange ones around, that might be why. I'm not sure on that at all.

DET. The backpack had what felt like books in it?

KATHLEEN: Yes. It felt like books.

DET.: Was he carrying anything else?

KATHLEEN: Yes. Some packages, three boxes that were small, not large.

I think they were wrapped in parcel post, or brown paper bag-type thing and I think some of them had string ties on them, you know, like . . . I'm almost sure on that, but at any rate, I picked up the bag that I thought had books in it, the napsack type bag, and he picked up the packages.

DET.: Could you describe him to us, as far as how tall was he?

KATHLEEN: He was no taller than I am, possibly, he could have been a few inches taller, maybe 6' but absolutely no taller than 6'. He . . .

I don't remember thinking that he was alot shorter than I, nor alot taller.

I would say he was probably around my height. He had brown, light brown, kind of shaggy hair, no real style, no real cut, cut kind of long and shaggy. He was thin and his face is a blur to me, I don't remember his features at all. I don't really recall if he had a moustache or not. I picture him in my mind both ways, one with and one without one. The same thing about glasses - in one thought in my mind I picture him with wire rims, and another I don't. I don't really know. He was dressed kind of sloppily, not real grubby, but nothing outstanding.

DET.: Describe the condition of his arms.

KATHLEEN: His left arm was in a sling, no cast, no plaster of paris cast I know that, but it was in a sling. His right arm had like a hand brace, or finger brace.

DET.: Was it metal?

KATHLEEN: Yes. As far . . . ya, I think it was metal. He had bandages wrapped around it. It was supporting his fingers. I'm not sure if his arm that was in a sling was wrapped, but I think that it was, I think his hand was wrapped. He told me he had hurt it skiing. He'd run into a tree or something and bent his fingers back, and dislocated his shoulder. (or did something to his shoulder.)

DET.: Where did you think he was going to take the books to?

KATHLEEN: I thought he was going in the library. He was headed that way, so I thought that's where he was going. But that same sidewalk actually leads up over a little bridge that runs right alongside the library; its just a short bridge that goes over a pond (manmade pond) and

that's actually the direction that he was going in, but its right next to the library and the same sidewalk will angle off to go into the library so that's where I thought he was going. We started walking and when we came to the bridge, it was obvious that he wasn't turning off to go to the library, and I said wait a minute, you know, where are we going? He said, "Oh, my car is just parked right over here." I said okay, or didn't make any motion, but at the time I knew what I was carrying which I thought was books, or felt like books, was very heavy, and the way I was carrying them, I knew I could protect myself with it if the need arose.

DET.: Did he, at any time between his car and the library, stop and wince, or anything, or say that his arms hurt?

KATHLEEN: He never actually stopped at all. He may have mentioned that he was in pain, maybe once, but he didn't make a real big deal out of it; it was just so obvious that he was helpless that he'd have to be in pain, that's the way it appeared to me, anyway. He told me he'd been in an accident (ski) and this is what had happened, and the way he was bandaged up it all made sense, the sling on his arms and shoulder, etc.

DET.: How far do you figure you walked from the library to where his car was?

KATHLEEN: Well, I couldn't give it to you in feet, possibly a block and a half, but it wasn't arranged in blocks . . . by any means. We walked across the bridge then to the edge of . . . I don't recall the name of the street, but it runs up the campus, kind of an alley street. It's not

a real well traveled street. Then under the railroad trestle and then his car was parked in the first right under the trestle there, it was a dark road. There were no street lights on that road. But his car wasn't parked so far down that it was completely black.

DET.: Is this a no parking area?

KATHLEEN: I believe it is. I'm pretty sure it is.

DET.: What kind of car was there?

KATHLEEN: It was a Volkswagon. I think it was brown, it was a newer VW; there were no dents in it. It was shiny and fairly nice.

DET.: What happened when you got to the car?

KATHLEEN: I set the pack down, well first of all, he went to unlock the door on the passenger side, which is the inside . . . I mean, the car was parked right next to a log and there was room between it for a person, and he went to unlock the car on the passenger's side, and I set down the package (the pack) that I had been carrying and leaned it against the log and I think I said goodbye . . . anyways, my thought was well, I had done my deed and I was going to leave, and then he was supposedly unlocking the car and he dropped the key; then he felt for the key with his right hand and he couldn't find it apparently and he said, "Do you think you could find it for me because I can't feel with this thing on my hand. (meaning the brace on his right hand.) I was cautious at this time, I mean, even while we were walking I thought well, I'm not going to let him get behind me, I'm gonna keep an eye on him, I've got these heavy books and I can use them. But I didn't want to bend over in front of him so I said,

let's step back and see if we can see the reflection in the light, so we stepped back behind the car, kind of behind the car to the side, and I squatted down and luckily I did see the reflection of the key in the light so I picked up the key and dropped them in his hand and I said goodbye and good luck, or something with your arm, or something to that affect, and that was the end of the conversation.

DET.: Did he say anything to you at that time?

KATHLEEN: He may have said, "Thank you," or something like that. He didn't offer me a ride home, or ask me to come with him, or anything like that . . . that's about it.

DET.: At the time you put down the books, you said goodbye at that time, and then he dropped the keys?

KATHLEEN: I think that that's how it went . . . I'm not real sure, but I remember then that my thought was to leave then, so I think I did say goodbye.

DET.: During your first confrontation with him, when he dropped his books, did you feel that it was a sincere gesture on his part, that he was dropping his books and needed help?

KATHLEEN. Yes. I did. Ya . . . and I thought he was just going into the library, it was just a short distance and he really did need help and I thought I could help him, you know.

DET.: At what point in time did you fear there may be something else on his mind?

that he wasn't going into the library, when I asked him where are we going and he said, "My car's just parked over there." At that time I knew I had the books in my hand, I knew they were heavy and I knew I could handle him, you know. So that's about it.

DET.: Did you notice anything unusual about his car, for instance, some sort of ski rack or bicycle rack, or anything like that?

KATHLEEN: No, I didn't. It looked, just very normal, like any VW on the street.

DET.: Were the tires wider than normal?

KATHLEEN: Not that I noticed. All I really noticed was that it was a nice VW, it was in good shape. It was shiny.

DET.: Did he appear to you to be the skier, or athletic-type of person?

KATHLEEN: No, not at all. No, he just . . . he didn't fit the stereo-type in my mind of an athlete, or even a skier.

DET.: Did he use any of the street-type language at all?

the campus runs the stretch between 8th & 14th, and then . . . but I was clear down on lower campus, so . . .

DET.: You had to pass under a railroad bridge to get to where his car was parked, right?

KATHLEEN: Right.

DET.: In walking to the car, was there anything speeded up by his walk, did he seem to get faster as he got closer?

and up, and I was kind of mad at myself for even being suspicious.

DET.: Did he give you the impression that he went to school there?

KATHLEEN: Yes, that's what I thought. Namely just because he was on campus and because I thought he had books and just assumed that he went to school there.

hanging out. I mean, intentionally hanging out, wearing it on the outer side of his pants. I don't remember what type of pants he had on, just all-around kind of grubby, like jeans or something like that.

One Sunday night (possibly 4/21/74) at 9:00 pm Jane Curtis was walking out of Bouillon Library when a man in his late 20's (see statement for description) with what appeared to be a cast on his left arm, dropped a lot of books in front of her and said, "oh, my arm." She asked if she could help him carry the books as she was going in the same direction (North on Campus). The cast went to his elbow, it wasn't a hard cast; it had gauze on top; "something he could do himself" is what Ms. Curtis stated. Subject kept whinning and complaining about his arm; he was stooped toward his left side. He kept the palm of his left hand toward himself; he had a metal finger brace on one of his fingers, either the left ring or left little finger--it was bandaged like his arm. He stated that he had broken his arm by skiing into a tree. Ms. Curtis suggested Crystal Mt to the man--he agreed, yes, that is where it happened. He was wearing dark colored clothes, nothing that stood out "old crap," messy. Subject was dressed in grubby clothes; hippy style; grubby long cloth coat (weird as Ms. Curtis described it). He had a stocking cap pulled down over his hair. His hair was dark brown, possibly shoulder length or shorter. Ms. Curtis described subject as "homely" with "kinda big eyes--weird", gave her the "creeps." He did not look like the skiing type. She could not remember if he wore wire-rimmed glasses or not, but feels that she might be able to identify him. She had never seen subject on campus before ^{or} after the incident.

Ms. Curtis and subject walked north on Chestnut after walking under the railroad trestle they turned right on to 10th. The car was parked a short distance east of the trestle on the right hand side of the road. He asked her to place the books (all hardcover, textbook type) in his late model yellow VW bug. When she placed books in the car she noticed that there was no passenger's seat, but that the interior of the upholstery was black and the driver's seat had a high back. Around midnight on Tuesday, July 30th, an Evergreen student was doing her laundry at the ASH Commons building when she noticed a man standing behind the door staring at her. He began speaking in a strangely deliberate way, over-enunciating every word. He walked forward until he was distracted by another woman entering the room. The man turned and held the door for the other woman so she could get her bicycle out and they both left.

The Evergreen woman was continuing to fold her clothes when she looked up again, and saw the man's face reflected through the glass on the door. He seemed to be impatiently waiting for her. She quickly walked out the door and ran. On Friday, the student saw a copy of the August first issue of the Journal, with a photograph of "Ted," the suspect in the cases of two women missing from Lake Sammamish. She recognized him as the same man who had confronted her, and came forward. He was described as being 5'8", 160 pounds, broad-shouldered with a muscular build, having dirty blond hair longish in the front, collar length in the back and parted to the side over one eye. The man seemed to have a medium tan, and possibly the beginnings of a beard. His voice was extremely unnatural and could be thought of as having an accent. The suspect was wearing tan cords, and a short-sleeved open neck shirt. He did not have a cast.

appearances of at least three of the seven women missing in this state since the beginning of this year. He has been seen at least twice on the Central Washington State College campus, at Lake Sammamish last month, and now here at Evergreen. This is the only solid clue police have in these strange disappearances and anyone with information pertinent to these cases is asked to call their local authorities.

Here, on the Evergreen campus, the Security Office is looking for the woman who came into the ASH laundry room on a bicycle last Tuesday night. Her identity is not known, but the Security Office is hoping she can be located. This woman is not a suspect. The Security Office only wishes to talk to her for a confirming description of the suspect. The woman is asked to come to the Security Office or call, at 866-6140. Her statement will be totally confidential. If there is any apprehension about going to the Security Office, the woman is asked to contact either Knute Berger or Stan Shore at the Journal office, 866-6213.

In other developments, another young woman, Brenda Carol Ball, 22, has been reported missing from her home since June 1, when she was last seen. The report was filed on June 17 with King County police. Ball, who is described as five feet three, 112 pounds, with long brown hair, fits the same general description of at least four other missing women in the area. While the circumstances and exact time of her disappearance is not known, she did, as in the other cases, leave without taking any belongings.

Police have no direct evidence to link Ball's case with the disappearances of three other women, yet they are not ruling out the possibility that this may be in a pattern involving the mysterious "Ted," the young man thought to be responsible for the disappearances of Denise Naslund and Janice Ott who vanished from Lake Sammamish Park.

He began to touch her body, saying that she was for him. When he touched her breasts she stated that she left the area and when went back to her seat. She further advised that he came and sat beside her for a few minutes, but when he realized that she was upset he got up and left. Miss [redacted] stated that when she first talked to Subject 19, she gave him her first name and phone number, but during the past two months has not received a call.

Miss [redacted] and Miss [redacted] discussed the incident before this Officer arrived and both feel that the two men involved are one and the same.
