

This will be a summary of a suspect developed in the killing of the girls in the Salt Lake area, and possibly into surrounding states, being compiled by Detective Jerry Thompson of the Salt Lake County Sheriff's Office, Homicide Division.

The suspect is a THEODORE ROBERT BUNDY, DOB 11-24-46, white male, 5'11", 170 pounds, brown hair, blue eyes. Salt Lake County Sheriff's Office arrest number is 78058.

The subject first basically really came to light in my eyes on 8-16-75 when he was arrested by a Highway Patrol trooper in the early morning hours driving around a subdivision, and in his vehicle he had a satchel full of numerous items--handcuffs, pantihose, a ski mask, strips of rope, a crowbar, an ice pick, etc. His explanation for these items was very poor.

On 8-21-75 this detective picked the subject up from the Salt Lake County Jail and took him to his apartment at 565 First Avenue #2, where he signed a consent search of his apartment. A thorough search was made of the apartment by this detective. Basically, we came up with only three items--a Colorado map, a brochure from Colorado on the ski resorts in the state, and a recreational type brochure from a Bountiful recreation center, also one book called the Joys of Sex. Before finding these particular items, the subject was asked by this officer if he had ever been to the state of Colorado, if he had ever been over there skiing. His comment was, "No, that is one state I have never been in." He was asked if he had ever been in the town of Bountiful, just north of Salt Lake, and he stated, "Not to my knowledge; if so, I've just passed through." In finding these items, he was asked by officer how come he had them. He had another explanation for everything, that a friend, he couldn't remember who, left them in his apartment, he didn't know why they were in there. The subject was then asked for his permission

to look through his car and also to take photographs. Photos were taken of his Volkswagen vehicle, which at this time was bearing Utah license LJE 379, on a 68 Volkswagen, registered to the subject. The color was either an off-white or a light brown or light beige. Observed in the vehicle at this time is that it did not have a front bumper nor a front license plate, and that in the back window the back seat on the top had a large tear across the top; also, there was a different paint coloration on the right door and towards the fender. The subject never at anytime asked why or what we wanted any pictures for or anything else. He was asked to come into the office the next day and talk to myself and Capt. Hayward, to which he stated he would be more than willing to, again never asking what for. The very next morning we received a call from his attorney, John O'Connell, who stated that his client would not come in, he had advised him not to come in and talk to us, and he wanted to know what we wanted to talk to Bundy about, we surely didn't think that he had killed all these girls. He was informed negative, we just wanted to talk to him.

From this point on, a more thorough investigation went into the individual by myself; Mike Fisher from the District Attorney's Office in Aspen, Colorado; Sgt. Bill Baldrige from the Pitkin County Sheriff's Office in Colorado; Milo Vig from the Mesa County Sheriff's Office in Grand Junction, Colorado; and Lt. Ron Ballantine from the Bountiful City Police Department and the rest of his staff; and Robert Keppel from the King County Sheriff's Office in Seattle, Washington, and his staff. It was then learned from Mike Fisher from Colorado, where he obtained some charge receipt invoices from Chevron Oil, after having been given Bundy's credit card number by this detective, and came up with the first 6 months of 1975's charge cards. The rest had been subpoenaed by this detective and are awaiting arrival, for the years of 1973, all of 1974, and the current 1975. It was observed at

this time, however, of particular notice that on 1-12-75 the subject bought gasoline in Glenwood Springs, Colorado, two times on this date. This is the date in question when CARYN CAMPBELL turned up missing and was killed out of Aspen, Colorado. Glenwood Springs is just a short distance from Aspen. Again of particular notice, on 3-15-75 the subject was observed buying gas in Golden, Colorado; also on the same date in Silver Thorne, Colorado; and the same date in Dillon, Colorado. This is the date when JULIE CUNNINGHAM turned up missing from Vale, Colorado, and has never been seen or heard from since. These towns are all within a very short distance of the ski resort. Again, in April of 1975, on the 4th, it was observed that the subject bought gas in Golden, Colorado; in the 5th in Silver Throne, Colorado; on the 6th in Grand Junction, Colorado. This is the date when DENISE OLIVERSON from Grand Junction, Colorado, turned up missing and has never been heard from or seen since. Her bicycle was recovered along a street. Bundy's whereabouts other than that are not known, other than that he was living in the Salt Lake area during October and November, the time that are girls were missing, and that he was living in Seattle, Washington, in the early part of 1974, when the 7 or 9 girls were missing up there.

In an attempt to learn more about this individual, a subpoena was served on Mountain Bell by this detective, and I obtained telephone receipts of his long distance phone calls. Ones of particular notice were to a Dr. R.N. HIRST in Ogden, Utah, phone 394-9230; and ELIZABETH KLOEPFER, who lives at 520B 18th N.E. in Seattle, Washington, phone 206-525-4494. Several others were noted and are on record, but these two are of significant value. In checking out the call to Dr. Hirst in Ogden, it was learned that this subject is the father of Bundy's girlfriend, Elizabeth Kleopfer, and that he was familiar with the subject. An interview was made with the doctor by this

detective and Lt. Ron Ballantine. From this interview it was determined that it would be of great value to interview his daughter in Seattle, Washington.

On 9-17-75 this detective, Detective Ira Beal from Bountiful Police Department, and Detective Dennis Couch from the Salt Lake County Sheriff's Office went to Seattle and talked to Elizabeth Kloepper. It was of particular interest to this officer that his girlfriend had numerous doubts about him, going back to when the girls turned up missing in the Seattle area and had at that time contacted the King County Sheriff's Office with her suspicions. Her suspicions first started approximately June or July of 1974 when Seattle put out a composite which resembled Ted very much, according to her, and also that the subject's name was Ted. From then on she claims that she found numerous items in her apartment which were unexplained, like plaster of Paris, elastic bandages, which the subject so called used up in the Seattle area, which Bundy could not explain to her. She also found a meat cleaver, an ax, and a large knife in her apartment, which he could not explain to her. Her lug wrench from her Volkswagen was taken out of the trunk and it was taped about halfway up and put in the front seat of her vehicle. He told her that that was in case she ever needed it. He was observed on other numerous occasions of going out during the middle of the night most of the time, and one particular time he hid an object in his pocket, which she later found out to be surgical gloves. She claimed that he napped a lot during the day and was out during the night; that he followed her and her girlfriends and seemed to like to jump out or come out from behind the bushes and grab them just to scare them. Things from here had just built up, and in Liz's opinion, she is still very fearful of the individual and believes that he is the one involved. His sexual habits, according to her,

have changed tremendously. She has known him for six years, and just this last year his sex habits have changed considerably, which is on another report. Another girlfriend in the Seattle area was confronted about him, MARY LYNN CHINO, DOB 2-16-45, who lives at 914 West Emerson in Seattle, home phone 282-8289. She more or less substantiates the same feelings as Liz does about the subject. Between the two of them it was found that his family background goes as follows: his father is a cook at Ft. Lewis in Washington; his mother is a secretary at Puget Sound University; they do not have a lot of money; there are five or six brothers and sisters in the family; they are originally from Vermont or Pennsylvania; they apparently came to Seattle in 1969. The subject was told by a cousin that he was an illegitimate child and that his parents have never really told him that; they claim that has had quite a bearing on his life. They claim that the subject is a petty thief and he has stolen televisions and numerous items up there; that he is an individual that has a champagne diet and a beer income, he does not have money. In fact, at the present time he needs money badly for his tuition. He asked his girlfriend for \$700.00 to help pay attorneys' fees. This subject does have a college degree from the University of Washington, a B.S. degree in Psychology. He is presently attending the University of Utah in Law School. He has been quite prominent in the Republican Committee in the Seattle area and the Governor Evans' campaign in 1972. He appears to be definitely a loner, according to everyone we have contacted. We have been unable to come up with any close friends at this time, other than Elizabeth, his girlfriend. They claim he has a tremendous personality when he first meets people, but shortly after you can see through him and the fact that he likes to use you. They all described him as very educated, a very handsome individual,

and a tremendous personality.

An around-the-clock surveillance has been put on the subject by our office and Bountiful Police Department in an attempt to locate or come up with friends or associates. We have been unable to come up with this, even during our surveillance. We did come up with the information that he joined the Mormon Church a month or so ago and went to one of their overnight outings at Sweetwater in Bear Lake, Utah. He appeared to stay for the most part alone up there. He does not appear to have any close friends that we have been able to come up with up there either. We have come up with one possible girlfriend, a MARGUERITE CHRISTINE MAUGHAN, DOB 3-20-47, who lives in the same apartment complex at 565 First Avenue apartment 1 in the basement. She was observed with this individual on two or three occasions. It should also be noted that she does have an arrest record with our office for Possession of Narcotics and a Shoplifting charge.

That basically is all that we know about the subject at this time.

On 11-B-74 a CAROL DaRONCH was abducted from the area of the Fashion Place Mall this evening in a Volkswagen she describes as an older model, light in color, with a large tear in the back seat across the top. Also, there was a discoloration or some type of marking on the right door and fender. The subject attempted to handcuff her and got both handcuffs on one wrist. He also produced a small calibre weapon, unknown on the calibre, and at one time produced what she describes as an 8 sided lug wrench, or something to that effect. Since that time, this detective showed this victim numerous pictures, approximately 40, with the suspect Bundy. She pulled out Bundy's picture, giving all the rest back, stating she had not seen the individual in there. When questioned about the one in her hand, she stated, "I don't know why I pulled it out, I guess its because he looks like him." She was then shown the photos that I took of the subject's car. She stated that in her opinion it was the same color, the same type of tear in the back window, and the only thing she could tell me was that looked like the vehicle that she was in. Since that time, Bountiful Police Department officers showed her a group of drivers license pictures, along with the subject, and she pulled out the suspect's picture, stating, "I believe that's the man, but I cannot be positive." She was then taken up in an attempt to eyeball the vehicle in person. At this time the subject had put in a new back seat or else had the back seat repaired, there is no tear in the back of it. He has put on the front bumper and the license plate. The hubcaps are changed from what originally photographed by this detective, and it appears that the vehicle has been painted a darker brown color than originally painted. Also, the Bountiful Police Department took both photos of the subject and showed them to their witnesses at the

Bountiful High School, who saw the so-called suspicious person on the night of the [REDACTED] disappearance. They pulled a drivers license and mug shot photo from a group of others out and stated, "If you would put a mustache on the man I would say that that was him."

It should also be noted that the subject's attorney, John O'Connell, called Bob Keppel, King County Sheriff's Office in Seattle, Washington, and made the comment to him that the police in Salt Lake were harrassing or bothering his client and that he wanted to know basically if they thought he was involved in the killing of the girls in that area, that his client definitely was not and that his client would be more than willing to come in there and talk to them about this if this is what they were looking at him for. They informed him that he could come in and talk with them anytime and they would be more than happy to talk to him about anything. What the Salt Lake authorities were doing here, they did not know and they suggested that he talk to the Salt Lake police. They stated it appeared that he was more or less fishing wanting some information about what we knew about his client.

Also it should be noted that a Detective Bob Denning from Clear Creek County Sheriff's Office in Golden, Colorado, contacted this officer and stated that they had found a nude female down in a mine shaft late in August and it was determined that she turned up missing around July 1 or July 2 of this year. He was inquiring if we had any information that this subject was in that town at this time. I do not have July records from the Chevron Oil Company to see if he was over there in July. They are in the process of obtaining them now. He was in the Golden, Colorado, area however on two occasions, one in March and one in April. A copy of his report is being sent over in regards to his case.

Since the surveillance on the subject, another subpoena was obtained for the records of Mr. Bundy from the University of Utah. It was served on the Assistant Dean Bruce Zimmerman, and a copy of his entire student folder has been obtained and is in our file at this time. Also, Standard Oil Company of California has sent the year of 1974 gas receipts and all of 1973 receipts to me. The year of 1973 puts the individual solely in the Seattle, Washington, area. 1974 from January through August also puts him up there. The month of September, he does a lot of travelling through the Washington area, headed from Idaho, down into the Salt Lake area. It should also be noted that he did purchase gas on 9-26-74 in Murray, Utah, and on 9-24 in Murray Utah. In October, on 10-14-74, he purchased gas in Murray, and on 10-28-74 he purchased gas in Bountiful, Utah. The rest of the tickets are all Salt Lake. From November of 1974 till June of 1975, the gas purchases are related earlier in this summary. July's gas purchases have not yet come from Standard Oil.

On October 1, 1975, a Court Order requesting Mr. Bundy into a line-up for October 2, 1975, was obtained and served on him this date, 10-1-75 at about 3:30 p.m. in his apartment. He seemed extremely nervous and upset when this was served on him, and yet he seemed like he was relieved when he found out it was just an order for a line-up. The individual at this time had long hair over the ears, about collar length. The next morning he showed up for the line-up, on 10-2-75 at 9:00 in the morning, and his hair had been cut, it was cut quite short, was not over the ears, and it had a part on it, it was combed to one side. The individual was picked out of this line-up by our Murray victim, CAROL DaRONCH, as being the person who kidnapped her. He was also picked out by two witnesses from the Bountiful area, who stated he was the individual who confronted them at Viewmont High

School on November 8, 1974, the night that [REDACTED] turned up missing, and she has never been seen since. The subject was arrested a short time later this date, 10-2-75, by this detective for Aggravated Kidnap and Attempted Criminal Homicide with \$100,000.00 bail. When the individual was confronted that he was under arrest by this officer, again, after being told what he was arrested for, it seemed like a great relief to him. His only comment was something like - "Is that all?" And from that point on he has been observed as being extremely relaxed compared to his condition previously.

The very next day a search warrant was obtained and was served on his apartment at 364 Douglas Street. The only items taken on this search warrant were: 19 cassette tapes, a can with some marijuana seeds in it, and one blue sports coat; no other items of interest were in this apartment. The apartment does not have near the clothing and items in it that his other apartment had when searched before on a consent search. Another search warrant was obtained for the search and seizure of his 1968 Volkswagen, which he has sold. This was picked up and seized from the person that bought it and it is now being held in my custody until a further search can be made of it.

Since the arrest of Mr. Bundy, several people have called, stating they know the individual. Three in particular were: a BART FARNSWORTH, a GLORIA ANN HOWARD, and an ALAN MATHIES, all law students who were in the same class with Mr. Bundy. They stated that during the fall of 1974 they didn't even know him because he missed so much school, and after the first of the year, possibly in March or a little bit earlier, he came to school and they observed scratches on the side of his face, which appeared to them to have been made by a human. His explanation was that he was riding a horse and got scratched by branches. They stated they did not believe this but did not further question him as he did not seem to think it was a joke.

Also, numerous law professors were interviewed. Their comments of the individual were basically the same, that during the fall of 1974, his first year in law school, the individual was hardly in school at all; he made special arrangements to take tests at the end of the year, and different things. They thought this was highly unusual of the individual. They thought that he was a loner. But other than that, they could not add any light to the matter.

Also, Mike Fisher from Aspen, Colorado, stated that they have had Bundy identified from pictures as buying gas in one of the stations in Golden, Colorado, on two occasions, and that the station attendant there remembers him; a also a coincidence is that one of the girls that was found murdered in a mine shaft in Clear Creek County, Colorado, knows this station attendant well and has been in that station on several times. It is unknown if Bundy was ever there at the time that she was there.

Also, a Detective Harry Hanson from the Tacoma Police Department has stated that they have had Bundy identified from a picture that was put in a newspaper that he was the individual, without a doubt, that raped a girl in Tacoma in November of 1973. Charges are pending on this case at this time.

An attempt to get a court order to obtain the blood from the suspect is being made at this time, and as of October 8, 1975, this is where the investigation stands at this time.

On December 12, 1974, the Intermountain Crime Conference was held at the Stateline Motel, Nevada. Sponsored by Police Dept. Tooele, Utah. Discussed at the conference was the traveling felons from Oregon, Idaho, Washington, Nevada, California and Utah. Part of the conference was devoted to the missing girls, and murders which have occurred in the Seattle, Wash. Rawlins, Wyo. and Salt Lake City, Utah. area and all seem to have likeness in the M.O.

Seattle P.D. States from Jan 31, to July 14, they have had a total of seven girls abducted in there area, and the only possible leads they have is that suspect possibly drives a brown Volkswagon, and has a cast on his arm. The remains of two girls have been located with no leads to the where abouts of the other five girls.

Rawlins, Wyo. States from July 4 to Aug 23, they have had a total of four girls abducted in there area, and they have no leads or suspects, but all victims were last seen in the area of the Carbon County Fairgrounds, Rawlins, Wyo.

Salt Lake County S.O. Are investigating two murders. One missing girl, and one attempted abduction all on teenage females.

Salt Lake Cases As Follows:

VICTIM #1- [REDACTED] age 17, daughter of Police Chief, Midvale, Utah. Last seen on the night of Oct 18, 1974, was found in Parley's Canyon murdered Oct 28, 1974. The victim was found nude, had been molested, and beaten severely about the face. Death was caused by strangulation.

VICTIM #2- On Nov 8, 1974, 18 yr. old female shopping at large shopping mall in Murray, Utah. Suspect approached victim, identified himself as police officer, and showed badge, suspect told victim he wanted to talk with her about a vehicle accident. Suspect had victim get into his private vehicle, and told her they were going to the police station. Enroute suspect attempted to put handcuffs on victim, one cuff was placed on victims wrist, suspect displayed gun, and tried to hit victim in head with tire iron, victim was able to escape. Suspect described as W/M 25-30 yrs. old. 6-0 to 6-2. Good Looking, and dressed in sport clothes, driving dirty light colored Volkswagon. Handcuffs in evidence. No further leads developed on this case.

VICTIM #3- [REDACTED] age 17, last seen on the night of Nov 8, 1974, at high school play. No leads to whereabouts of the victim, but suspicious male subject was observed at high school. Description of suspect fit extremely close to suspect on Victim #2, also on the crime scene search, handcuff key was found which fit the handcuffs that were placed on Victim #2.

VICTIM #4- 17 yr. old female last seen Oct 30, 1974, found murdered in canyon, South of Salt Lake on Nov 17, 1974. M.O. was identical to Victim #1.

Most all of the girls are around 17-19 yrs. old, have long hair, and apparently resembles each other in appearance. Unknown if cases are connected, but M.O. does resemble each other.





Aspen Meeting
November 13 & 14, 1975

On November 13, 1975 a meeting was held in Aspen, Colorado for representatives of various police agencies from Washington, California, Utah and Colorado to discuss cases of great similarity regarding homicides of young females occurring in these states.

The meeting was opened at approximately 9:00 A.M. with a welcoming speech delivered by Carrol D. Whitmire, Sheriff of Pitkin County. A brief welcome was also extended by Lt. Bill Baldrige of the Pitkin County Sheriff's Department, outlining the purpose of the meeting.

Detective Robert D. Keppel of the Department of Public Safety, King County Police Department, Seattle Washington was introduced. The following is Det. Keppel's talk, which centered around the background information collected regarding Theodore Robert Bundy, currently in custody in Salt Lake City and the possible connection of Bundy to the cases discussed at this meeting.

Det. Keppel stated that the purpose of his talk was to take the attendees of this meeting from day one of Bundy's life up to August 24, 1975, when he was arrested in Salt Lake City on charges of Aggravated Kidnapping and Attempted Homocide.

Briefly, Bundy was born in Burlington, Vermont on 11-24-46 to Eleanor Louise Cowell, who was unwed at the time of his birth. Her son was named Theodore Robert Cowell. On 10-6-50 Theodore Cowell's name was changed in a Philadelphia Court to Theodore Robert Nelson. On 3-19-75 Eleanor Nelson married John Culpepper Bundy in Tacoma, Washington. Keppel stated that Bundy's early life was sketchy. He attended Hunt Jr. High in Tacoma where he evidenced loner behavior and sexual naive'te'. His peer group found him masturbating in a closet at school and threw water on him. This was at approximately age 13. Keppel stated that if sex was mentioned Bundy would become violent. He stated that Bundy was left handed and left eyed. He displayed infantile behavior up through fifth grade. He liked to do superior work when he did work. He did not like to be singled out for disciplinary action. In 1965 he graduated from Wilson High School in Tacoma. Bundy worked for Tacoma City Light from graduation in June until September. He then started at the University of Puget Sound in September of 1965. On 3-29-65 he claimed he had been in an accident and had scratches on his face and was embarrassed to come to work. In the 1965-66 school year he was living with his parents and attending the University of Puget Sound. In September of 1966 he enrolled in the University of Washington and met his first girlfriend, one Diane Edwards. He went with her through the summer, still working at Tacoma City Light. He continued at the Univ. of Washington from January 1967 until June and lived at McMahon Hall. From June through August he attended Stanford University, although this has not been verified. He broke up with

Diane Edwards in 1967. Keppel stated that Bundy exploited this girl by using her car and depending on her money to pay for dates, etc. In September of 1967 Bundy went to work at the Seattle Yacht Club as a parking attendant. Bundy would often drive people home from the club who were unable to drive and speculated that this might have been an occasion for Bundy's first homosexual experience. On 1-20-67 Bundy sent his college transcript to the U. of Colorado although he had not yet graduated from the U. of Washington. He also sent transcripts to the U. of Michigan and Stanford Univ. He registered for winter quarter at Washington U. but withdrew on 1-18-68. He sporadically worked at the Yacht Club, again as a parking attendant, working for exclusive dinner parties. He apparently enjoyed the exclusivity of this club and the select atmosphere. He worked at Safeway store from 4-12 to 7-26-68, although it is unknown why due to the disparity of the atmosphere he was accustomed to working. He evidenced sporadic attendance at this job and never came for his final pay check. Keppel mentioned that he did work at the Olympic Hotel in March of 68 but was let go because of theft from lockers. There were no charges or accusations made at this time. He was just terminated. Some time during this period he became acquainted with an older woman, a Mrs. Ferris, who, when interviewed, admitted that she felt he was not an angel, even admitting hating him. Apparently he had absconded with money belonging to her. He was noted for befriending older people, offering to help them, getting groceries, etc. and then exploiting them. At this time it was noted that he was fond of practicing foreign accents. Also at this time had access to a gray VW. On 10-30-68 he sent a transcript to Temple U. Apparently, he was doing a lot of talking about his education but not going to school much. He was also talking a good deal about politics, law and order, etc. and his interest in getting a six year law degree. He entered the fall quarter of Temple U. and was living at Lafayette Hill, PA in Delaware County. At this time, it was noted, that Delaware County had a number of missing females. It was noted that nude bodies were found but this county has 47 different police jurisdictions, complicating solution of these crimes. Apparently, at this time he lived with relatives in Pennsylvania. Mrs. Farris stated she put him on a plane for Aspen and took skis. She also stated she had given him \$100 for this trip. His second stop was Arkansas to visit Cowell family relatives. It seems that Bundy showed up in San Francisco that Spring with Diane Edwards and stayed at a motel in Mendocino, Calif. with her. In September, 1969 he met Liz Kloepper and began working at Legal Messengers, Inc. as a running boy with legal messages. Some time in this period he fractured his right ankle but no medical records have been obtained to verify this. He apparently had slipped on ice and broken his ankle. His military classification was 2-S (to attend school). He was never 4-F. The lottery was in use at this time but he was able to avoid draft as his name was not called. In September 1969 he was living with Mrs.

Rogers and at Christmas, 1969 went to Ogden, Utah with friends of Mary Chino and stayed in Ogden with Liz's parents. In the Fall of 1969 he was to have attended a traffic school for a bad driving record although this has not been verified. In June of 1970 he re-entered the U. of Wash. for summer school and was still working for Legal Messengers, Inc. He quit in May and went to work for Pedline, a Medical instrument supply company delivering to Doctors' offices. Here he had access to medical instruments. He worked there until 12-31-71. He was out of the state in 1970 from August 29 until September, 1970 on a trip with Liz to Ogden, Utah. He drove through Yakima, Baker, Oregon and Utah, looking over campuses in these areas. In 1971 there is little information. He attended U. of Wash. Jan. through Dec. including summer quarter, still working at Pedline in the U. district and residing with Mrs. Rogers. At this time he also got involved in politics. He graduated with a B.S. Degree in Psychology from the U. of Wash. on 6-10-72. June to September he was employed as a counsellor at H.V.H. Mental Health Center. Here he met Sandy Gwinn. Bundy worked at H.V.H. counselling people on the psycho wards. Sandy Gwinn stated he had no feelings for these people at all. He had a very cut and dried approach. At this time he took Gwinn on various trips and was familiar with areas East of Seattle where bodies were found. Regarding their sexual relationship she inferred that it was a quick slam bang approach by him. He would have sex with her and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] From Sept. until Nov., 1972 he worked for Citizens for Dan Evans for Governor campaign. He apparently did extensive work for them on speaking engagements East of Washington (another area we are interested in). In June of 72 he was recommended for the Seattle Crime Commission and was hired. It was noted that Bundy was in competition with one Tom Sampson regarding reports for the commission. Bundy was doing research on sexual assaults on women and had access to copies of police reports of this nature. However, he apparently didn't get the report he was to have for the commission completed, which meant a loss of money to him. Some time around this period he tried to get a job with the Law & Justice Planning Commission. In the Spring of 72 Liz had an abortion although there are no medical records to verify this as yet. Apparently his affection for her was limited during this period. At this time he registered in a research class at the U. of Wash, which was also attended by Lynda Healy (victim) and they were involved in several of the same projects. In the summer of 72 he took frequent bike trips around Greenlake with Sandy Gwinn as well as sailing on Lake Washington and he also went to Lake Sammamish State Park with Sandy Gwinn. He also visited Sandy's parents at their Alpenthal condominium at which time Karen Covach (Linda Healy's roommate) met Bundy. The Alpenthal is located at a ski area East of Seattle. At this time the expenses of these dates were on Sandy Gwinn as Bundy didn't have any money. In July 1972 Edna Cowell (relative of Bundy's from Arkansas) came up from Arkansas to visit Linda Healy's roommates, who were friends of hers. It was not established that Bundy knew Healy but after her disappearance he would go over to her apartment frequently to visit her

roommates. Healy disappeared three blocks from another missing subject. Subject was never found. Bundy lived three blocks from the latter subject. In June, Sandy Gwinn's car was stolen and she suspected Bundy had stolen it as he was prone to borrowing it without permission. However, she couldn't prove it. Later on it was found that Liz's car was also stolen. In May of 1972 Bundy sent transcripts to five universities as he had been rejected from Utah Law School on May 12, 1972. The universities he sent transcripts to were the U. of Cal. at Berkeley, Hastings College, the U. of Oregon, U. of Utah, U. of Southern Calif. Around this time Liz finds out about Sandy Gwinn and threatens suicide, whereupon Sandy wanted out of the relationship. To gain favor with Liz, Bundy belittles himself, says he is inferior, etc. so Liz takes him back. Keppel, at this time, mentions that the Crime Commission said Bundy was meticulous with his work but unreliable and very tardy. Apparently he was spying on Rosselini, another political figure, embarrassing Rosselini with his constituents as Bundy wore wigs and a removable mustache for these activities and was also spying on Rosselini's sex activities. In December 1972 Bundy is rejected by the U. of Wash. Law School and was upset about this as this is a very prestigious law school. In January he is still on a contractual basis with Criminal Justice Planning. He contracted to them under the name of TRB Associates (his initials) to work for King County. He was paid in \$400 lump sums and was doing a study on criminal recidivism rates. This gave him access to criminal reports. On 3-16-73 he did a recidivism progress report and on 3-19-73 he was to turn in a recidivism summary report which he didn't do, costing him a fee of \$1800. In these reports he became very familiar with problems of police jurisdictions in relation to sexual assaults. In March of 73 Liz notices a 4" bladed knife in her glovebox. Bundy claims that Vortman (an attorney in Seattle) gave it to him. Also at this time Bundy is arrested for outstanding traffic warrants. This was the period when Liz's car was also stolen. Liz, like Sandy, suspects that Bundy stole her car. On the 30th. of March he had a VW key made. In June he applied at U. of Puget Sound Law School. Also in June from 13-15 he stayed at the Mark Hopkins motel in San Francisco. In August he receives a letter of acceptance from the U. of Utah Law School. In August he also had an accident with Liz's car in the U. District, colliding with a police car. This was a minor accident but Bundy sent a letter to the U. of Utah saying that he could not attend the Univ. due to injuries sustained in an accident. At this time, Diane Edwards reappears on the scene and takes Bundy to Alpenthal and stays with him. At this time he grew a beard for a short while, shaved it and grew it again until possibly December of 1973. In October of 1973 Liz had become suspicious of him because she had found womens' clothing in his room, i.e., a large sized bra. Apparently he talked his way out of this by claiming it belonged to his landlady. In the Fall of 1973 he enrolls at the U. of Puget Sound and is in a car pool commuting from Seattle to Tacoma (a distance of 65-70 miles). He would go to class on Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights. He would ride to class but would often disappear during the class. During this time he started jumping out

at girlfriends from behind trees, etc. and scaring them. He would occasionally visit his parents in Tacoma City. He was keeping late hours and would sleep late in the day. He barely passed his mid quarter exams at Puget Sound. They had no attendance records but stated his attendance very poor. At Christmas vacation he injured his head while skiing at Crystal Mountain. He had ski magazines in his car on various occasions. He liked skiing and the ski atmosphere very much. However, he was only seen skiing on one occasion. He was very familiar with ski areas in Washington. At this time a ski hat mask was seen in his car by Chris Sharpe. He had been faithful to Liz but then Diane came back to town. Diane states their sex together being normal. Liz stated that about this time Bundy bought the book "Ties of Sex" and wanted to start experimenting. One experiment was to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He did this on several occasions until Liz cut him off. Liz said he was also [REDACTED] (?) She then turned down the [REDACTED] and noticed an extreme change in sex activity thereafter. On 1-4-74 [REDACTED] (victim)(not fatal) was found. She lived six blocks from Bundy and three blocks from Bundy's cousin's house. This subject had gone to sleep at 2:00 A.M. on 1-3-74. At 1630 hrs. next afternoon she was discovered in bed, beaten about the head with a vaginal probe (speculum?) shoved in her. She lived in the U. District where all the houses are alike with similar entries and exits. She lived in a basement apartment. Doctors estimated her injuries not more than 3 to 4 hours old. There was never a period of time that this house was empty on these dates. Bundy had broken up with Diane three days prior to the date of this assault. He was very upset about breaking up with her. The victim remembers nothing. She went to sleep and woke up the next afternoon in the hospital. This house similar to that of Linda Ann Healy. On 1-31-74 Healy disappeared. Healy lived 15 blocks from Bundy. Healy and Bundy both frequented a bar named "Dantes" although he cannot be placed there that night, he went there a lot. Bundy lived four blocks from where Healy worked. Healy majored in Psychology at U. of Wash. with Bundy. She entered the U. of Wash. in 1969 and would have finished her junior year in 1974. Bundy was also in the same psychology research class as Healy. Blood was found on Healy's pillow and on her nightgown in closet. However, her bed had been neatly made. Bundy was a very very neat person and meticulous about his room being neat. Bundy could have had contact with Healy on at least 4-5 occasions. On 3-3-75 Healy's lower jaw bone was found 34 miles from her home at (Taylor Mountain). The previous year Bundy and his cousin's son were known to go riding to look at old barns. They wouldn't go in the barns but just look at them. Bundy, during this time, would slow down at the area where the bodies were later found. On 3-12-74 Manson (victim) disappeared Donna Manson was last seen at 10:00 P.M. when she left her dorm at Evergreen State College in Olympia to go to a jazz concert. Her friend Tom Sampson lived in Olympia and also went to

Evergreen State College. Bundy played raquet ball with Sampson at Evergreen State College. Manson is still missing. On 4-17-74 Susan Rancourt attended a meeting of dorm supervisors of Central Washington State College, Ellensburg and afterwards disappeared. Her skull was found 3-3-75 at (Taylor Mountain) with jaw broken in three places and her skull had been cracked. Two women have come forward that had seen Bundy trolling U. of Wash. library Spring of 1974. He would, according to them, carry packs of books with his arm in a sling, would drop books and solicit help in picking them up. That early Winter he had skied Crystal Mountain and gotten injured there. Another woman said he used same skam approx. 10:00 P.M. at night with packages and books with arm in sling and dropping books or packages to get assistance. Women cannot positively identify however. One woman was 5'11 and described that she could look him directly in the eye. Another who was 5'7" mentioned that she thought the subject was driving a yellow VW Bug. This girl went to help him with books and noticed no seat in car on passenger side. Bundy was good friend of Terry Storwick who lived in Ellensburg and was friend of Rancourt. Storwick had early morning jogging class with Rancourt. Mrs. Storwick, mother of Terry, recalls Bundy visiting in Spring of 1973. Terry Storwick recalls Bundy visiting Spring of 1974. During this time he frequently rafted on the Yakima River with friends from the Republican Party, at which time, he would often disappear for half hour at a time and frequently the seat was out of his VW (front seat, passenger). Roberta Parks disappeared 5-6-74 from Oregon State U., Corvallis, Oregon. She had been despondent over her father's health. She left her room at 10:00 P.M. to go to the Student Union Building. She never arrived. She was found 3-3-75 at (Taylor Mountain). Her jaw bone was found, no upper teeth; they had been broken off. She had sustained blow to front of head and damage to both sides of skull. Bundy not placed at Oregon State U. He had applied to Salem U. Law School, Eugene, Oregon. Parks was a neat person, would take cosmetics, if she planned to go out. Her cosmetics were found in her room. Her purse with ID and \$15.00 cash was missing. Brenda Ball disappeared 6-1-74. She had been to the "Flame" tavern, which had a bad reputation as a pickup joint. She left at 2:00 A.M. She was found 3-1-75 at (Taylor Mountain). Bundy had made deposits at bank at White Sands area close to this tavern. On 6-11-74 Georgeann Hawkins vanished from her sorority house at the U. of Wash. District in Seattle at approx. 10:00 P.M. Bundy lived 11 blocks from this location. Liz lived 5 blocks from this location. She has never been found. On 7-14-74 Janice Ott and Denise Naslund disappeared from Sammamish State Park, Issaquah, Wash. On 9-4-74 their nude bodies were found 4 miles from the park. Bundy was seen at the state park on 7-7-75 by friends. He was positively identified by two of these people. Bundy was seen meandering down beach on that date. Told friends he was not feeling too well. He had been working for the Dept. of Emergency Services. Bundy was off work two days prior to that weekend, Thursday, Friday (Saturday and Sunday), Monday and Tuesday also off work. Bundy purchased gas that day.

He was reported to be seen at the park wearing white shorts and white t-shirt. He had gone to Liz's house and had an argument with her. Liz was going to Greenlake beach. She saw him at 10:00 A.M. and then didn't see him again until 6:00 P.M. Bundy had his own VW with Liz's ski rack. When she did see him he told her he was not feeling well but proceeded to take her ski rack off his car and changed it back to her car. One witness stated that a man named Ted with a sling on his arm (that he had gotten from a racket ball injury) was going sailing but was seen soliciting help with his sail boat. He was also seen at Emergency Services Dept. with a sling on arm but the next day he didn't have it on. He had dinner with Liz that night but didn't stay with her. He changed his clothes to long pants and t shirt. Mrs. Farris saw him with cast near Greenlake and Albertsons at this time. Naslund had been on beach at 4:30 P.M. On 9-7-74 her and Ott's bodies were found on North side of highway, four miles away from park. On October 12, 1974, after deer season, just outside of Seattle, 25 miles East of Interstate 25, a hunter saw what he thought was a wig hanging from some brush. He then discovered a human skull. He then noticed some bones near the trail and a large amount of light brown hair. 35-40 feet from that point he found a partially intact human skeleton. One of these two was later identified as Carol Valenzuela who was 18 years old and married. She was on welfare and had come home to Vancouver for welfare stamps. She was last seen on August 2, 1974. The second body was unidentified but the remains have been sent to the FBI Lab. The jaw bone and dental chart were submitted to the National Dental Association and Missing Persons Bureau and the FBI Lab. It has been established that both girls died a sudden death similar to suffocation. No jewelry was found nor any clothing. A tampon holder believed to belong to Valenzuela was found near victims, along with her rib bones and pelvis bone of unknown victim. The unknown victim was the first victim in June or July (six weeks before the disappearance of the second victim Valenzuela who disappeared on 8-2-74). These two victims were found in an area known as Doe Valley, 1/4 mi. up a dirt road in Clark County. It was then mentioned that a man had been seen at the U. of Seattle, using a photography scam. He would stop young women, offer them 30-40 dollars to pose for him park. This man was later identified as [redacted] who grabbed a victim, drove her to a shopping center, purchased tape, prophylactics and then took her to the park in Camas, Washington. [redacted] was a park employee. He took her down a road 1/4 mi. down in the valley and shot her in the breasts with a pellet gun. He then worked her over with a dildo, put a noose around her neck and led her down a path. He then stabbed her five times with a four inch knife. He took her clothes and covered her with tree limbs. She was later found and the wounds were fortunately superficial. She survived and later positively identified one [redacted] as the man and he is currently in the Western State Mental Hospital.

More information was then introduced about Bundy regarding his acceptance to the U. of Utah in 1973. More was said about his "bad auto accident" in the Fall of 1974 and that he was seen only two days during the Fall quarter at school. It was stated that he had to take final exams in January and was worried that he would fail these. He was able to pass these exams with C's and D's. The faculty stated that Bundy was a very unusual person. Most of the professors contacted stated that he was a tremendous salesman. They said that he "used" girlfriends and the roommates of these girlfriends could always "see through him" both in Seattle and Salt Lake.

On August 16, 1975 he was pulled over by the Utah Highway Patrol. When they first saw him he attempted to duck down but then took off and ran two or three stop signs. The passenger seat of his VW was unbolted and turned around facing the rear of the car. Items found in the car in a satchel were torn strips of bed sheet (white), a piece of multi-colored rope, an ice pick, a crow bar, a pair of pantyhose with spaces for eyes and mouth cut out, a ski hat mask, two unmatching ski gloves, a pair of foreign made hand cuffs, and some glad bag garbage bags (green). At this time he was arrested and charged with Possession Of Burglary Tools. He was asked for a consent to search his apartment. He gave this without questioning why. His apartment was upstairs in an older home. The apartment was immaculate. He had many pairs of patent leather shoes. There was a large meat cutting block and a round wheel above it with a real "buther's" collection of cutting tools. When asked about this he stated that this was a very good conversation piece. Bundy was very cooperative but never asked why his apartment was being searched. He had skis and when asked said that he skied occasionally. He was asked if he had ever been to Colorado, which he denied. A map of Colorado was found in his apartment. Also found in his apartment was a ski brochure. When asked, Bundy stated that he was not planning to go to Colorado but that a friend had left the map and brochure in his apartment. Marked on the ski brochure was the Snowmass ski resort, (Wildwood Inn) (Where Campbell victim disappeared) and the Shadow Mountain Lodge in Aspen. Also found was a Chevron gas receipt from a Chevron credit card and the book, "Joys of Sex". There was a considerable amount of clothing with 7-8 t-neck, long sleeved shirts and a large number of walking shorts. When Bundy was arrested the second time he had a different apartment with little clothing found. After the first arrest he was placed on a 24 hour surveillance and during this period he joined the Mormon Church and with a church group went on an outing near Bear Lake. During this time investigators also asked to photograph his car and took pictures of his back seat which had a large tear at the top of the back seat which matched the earlier description of a witness. Bundy never asked investigators why his car was being photographed. Bundy bailed out of jail on the possession of burglary tools charge. The Murray girl positively identified the car. In the meanwhile the car had been changed. The hub caps were different, the car was shinier, possibly having been sprayed with some type of shiny material. The passenger door was a different color and the car had a new front bumper. When Bundy was asked about this he said that he was getting ready to sell the car, which he did two or three

weeks later. The car was sold to a teenage boy but was later seized by authorities and samples from the car sent to the lab for analysis. Bundy was then served a Court Order to appear for a lineup. When the officer went to serve this paper, Bundy at first blanched white. When he saw that it was for a lineup he said something like, oh is that all. The next day he showed up for the lineup but had cut his hair short. He was identified, nonetheless by a teacher from the Bountiful area and another girl from Bountiful (with regard to the [redacted] girl's disappearance). During the time the investigators were checking on him on campus, talking to professors, etc., he continually followed them around telling them that they were doing a good job, etc. Investigators said he has blue, piercing eyes that you would never forget. Bundy was brought to the Captain's office at Salt Lake in regards to "vicious rumors of other crimes". Bundy's attorney protested even though Bundy tried to answer questions his attorney blocked him from doing so. At no time did Bundy actually protest or deny anything. His attorney said he would not let his client talk to anyone from any other jurisdiction.

On November 8, 1974 at the Fashion Palace Mall, one Carol De Raunch was approached by a man professing to be a police officer with the Murray, Utah Police Department. He stated his car had been broken into while he was at the cleaners. He walked to the mall to a light colored VW. He identified himself to her with a full badge and he got her to go with him, drove a block and pulled up by an elementary school, pulled a small caliber revolver on her. A struggle ensued during which time he was able to get one hand cuff on her. She was able to see what might have been a crow bar in the car. During the struggle another car approached, the lights shining on Bundy's vehicle and she was able to get away and was picked up by that car after Bundy had fled. She recalled a soft object in front of the passenger seat but was unable to identify what it was. She did have blood on her jacket which was O type. Her type is A-Positive. Later that same evening, November 8, 1974 one [redacted] left Bountiful High School at approx. 10:00 P.M. to pick her brother up. She never picked him up and she was never seen again.

On October 18, 1974 the daughter of the Chief of Police of Midvale, Utah, [redacted] was given two dollars from her father for pizza. She was going to spend the night with a girlfriend. She left "J.B.'s" a restaurant across the street from where the DeRaunch girl had been picked up. This girl was found on 10-27-74 in oak brush in Summit County, nude with a nylon stocking tied around her neck. She had been beaten around the head and strangled. Drag marks were found on her body, similar to the Campbell victim. These were drag marks or burn marks similar to being thrown from a car and sliding along the pavement. Bundy apparently was seen the night of this occurrence soliciting girls to help with his auto. At the time he was first seen it was noted that he was calm and neat in appearance. He was seen

that same evening in a very disheveled state. This victim ([REDACTED]) showed evidence of anal intercourse. Liz had stated that Bundy had asked to have anal intercourse with her but she did not like it. Liz's father, who is a doctor, on talking with investigators said, although he was not a psychiatrist, and couldn't give a professional opinion, that he felt Bundy was a schizophrenic. Dr. Hurst had gone hunting with Bundy. In September of 1975 Bundy sold his car to a high school boy. He worked April to June of 1975 at Dallas Hall Dorm but due to the supervisor's opinion that he came to work drunk and came to work late and left early he was asked to quit. In June he worked as a night watchman. However, upon investigators checking on him, he was let go. Bundy had the 1968 VW and an older model pickup truck. This pickup apparently was in pretty run down condition. In February Bundy bought Utah license plates. He said he lost this set and applied for a second set. However, the first set were used after application and receipt of the second set. He also had Washington Plates while in Colorado. Though Bundy can be placed here in Colorado on 9-5-75 he discontinued his Chevron card with a letter saying that he wanted to get his balance paid up.

Note: There was then a general discussion as where and when Bundy had used his credit card, distances from victims, etc.

Writer's Note: The following is as much as I could get from this discussion. It was hard to follow as several times more than one person would be speaking. However, I will attempt to get a copy of the order of these credit card purchases and include it with this report. I will, however, indicate what information I did get.

In 1973 the areas where Bundy can be placed were Washington, Seattle, these were in Jan., Feb. Mar. April in Seattle, May Seattle and Tacoma, June Olympia, July 1974 Seattle, Olympia, Merc. Isle, August Olympia, Tacoma, Sept. Oregon, Seattle, Yacam, Boise, SLC, Washington, Murray Utah, & Salem., Oct. SLC, Bountiful, Nov. Salt Lake, Hebler, Dec., Ogden, Jan. SLC and on the 10 and 12 in Glenwood Springs, Colo., on the 13 in Green River on the 23 in Seattle on 31 in SLC, in Feb. SLC in Mar. Wyoming and Dillon on the 15th. at Silverthorne, Colo. on the 15, in Golden, Colo. in April, SLG in May, SLC in June, Washington and Idaho in SLC on the 13 in July SLC, Aug, SLC in April Grand Junction, Colo.

Bundy owes the U. of Utah \$1,990 for an emergency loan. Not known what this loan was for. Dr. Hurst says Bundy knows many foreign dialogues. Keppel then went over the items found in Bundy's apartment and also mentioned that Bundy made a call on 6/16/75 to the Denver Post. They were unable to find out who he spoke to however. On the 31 of October, 1974 [REDACTED] left Salem, to go to American Fork, Utah. It was speculated that she was making drug buy at a cafe called "Browns". Bundy had been seen there frequently in January using name of Jack, Ted or Terry. She was found 11-22-74 in American Fork Canyon with a nylon stocking around her neck. She had been strangled and had massive blows to her head. She also had a necklace on that did not belong to her. Her hair had been shampooed after the attack and all the blood

had been drained from her body. On 10-2-74 one [REDACTED] a possible runaway, disappeared from her residence in Salt Lake and was never seen again. On July 4, 1975 one Nancy Baird was last seen when she left her place of employment, a Fina fas station, East of Layton (30 mi. from SLC). She disappeared about 5:30 leaving her purse with a cashed pay check she had received that day for \$130.00 Her car was still at the station, locked. She was not a straight-laced girl but had a four year old son and was thought to be a very good mother. She was living with her parents. Later there was a rumor that she had been seen in Denver but this was never confirmed. She has never been found.

Slides were then shown of the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] victims. Both of these victims showed food particles in the stomachs during autopsies. The [REDACTED] victim also had 1.0 alcohol in her system.

There was a brief talk by Det. Sgt. Butch Carlstedt from Sonoma County Sheriff's Dept. in Santa Rosa, California. He spoke about 8 female homicides from February, 1972 through December, 1973. He said that they could not connect Bundy with any of their homicides. Captain Jim Caulfield also from Sonoma County then spoke and he brought out the fact that the Univ. of Nevada had offered to computerize all the data on the homicides that had occurred in these states and see if they could be of some assistance in the solution of these crimes. Captain Caulfield stated that if any agencies were interested they should contact him and submit any information they had. He mentioned that names could be deleted if so desired.

Mention was then made about another suspect, [REDACTED] who is currently in death row in New Mexico. His FBI # is 958056D.

Lt. Ron Smith of the Grand Junction, Colorado Police Dept. then spoke. On 7-2-74 a Salt Lake Hitchhiker, one [REDACTED] was found in Grand Junction dumped off the side of a road. This 23 year old girl had been manually strangled and was found nude except for a necklace and ring. She had left Salt Lake on 7-1-74. He also mentioned another homicide involving the work of possibly an occult-oriented murderer. He said this victim was found with seven slash wounds across her chest and an unusual cross carved in her breast, which he drew an example of. He mentioned that if anyone had any information with occult type homicide to contact him. He then went on to his second victim, which might be related to the other homicides being discussed at this meeting. On April 6, 1975 one Denise Oliverson of Grand Junction got on her bicycle and was never seen again. The bicycle was found ten blocks away, three blocks from the river. Oliverson is 5'4½ tall, brown hair, blue eyes. Her shoes were found close to the bicycle.

Mike Fisher of the District Attorney's Office in Aspen, Colorado then spoke of the case that he and Lt. Baldrige of the Pitkin County Sheriff's Department had been investigating. On 1-11-75 Caryn E. Campbell, a nurse from Michigan was in Snowmass, Colorado to attend a medical convention with her fiance and his two children. They were staying at the Wildwood Inn at Snowmass. On the evening of 1-11-75 they had had dinner at approx.

6:00 P.M. at the "Stew Pot", a restaurant near the Wildwood. After dinner the couple had stopped at the drug store in the mall at Snowmass to look for magazines and then stopped in the Lobby of the Wildwood. Caryn had told another doctor in the group that she would go to her room and get a magazine for him. She headed for room 210, taking the elevator. She was seen exiting on the second floor by six people who were in the elevator waiting to go down. She was never seen again. Twenty-seven days later on 2-17-75 she was found 2.8 miles from the Wildwood Inn in a field off of Owl Creek Road, nude. Two gold earrings were found, one still on one ear and one on the snow nearby. At the time she was dumped it was 15 to 20 below zero. No clothes were found nor her key to room 210. All her belongings were left in the room. There were no witnesses found after two weeks of solid interviewing of everyone in the Wildwood and all other surrounding lodgings. She had suffered severe blows to the back of her head although when found her body had been partially eaten by coyotes (left side of body and head). Fingernail scrapings disclosed blue, red, & gray synthetic fiber scrapings. Time of death was set a approx. two hours after abduction. She had contents of dinner still in her stomach. Cause of death was listed as four blows to back of head which would have put her in sever coma state but exact cause of death was probably due to exposure. Bundy purchased gas on 1/12/75 in Glenwood Springs, Colorado twice on 1/12/75. Glenwood Springs is a distance of 42 miles from Aspen, Colorado. One gas attendant from one of the stations(Chevron) could not be interviewed as he had committed suicide in Denver in March of 1975. The attendant from the other station was unable to make positive ID of Bundy although Bundy had used Washington plates and then Utah plates.

Fisher also stated that in March of 1975 a ski instructor in Aspen was approached by a crippled guy to help him with his brief case. She is coming to Aspen to look at the picture of Bundy.

It was noted that Bundy and Harris were both in Aspen at the time of Campbell's abduction. Campbell had to go willingly as there were plenty of people around at that time of night who would have noticed unusual actions. The parking lot of the Wildwood is 75 yards away from the Inn. It could be reached from the second story of the Wildwood by a staircase as the Inn is built on the hillside giving access to the main level of the street from the second story by several steps. This building is such that you can us. the elevator or go down steps and the rooms each lead to an outside balcony arrangement. Campbell disappeared between 7:40 P.M. and 8:30 P.M. She was officially reported missing at 10:30 P.M.

Investigator David Bustos of Vail Police Department then told of a missing girl from Vail, Colorado. Julie Cunningham, age 26, worked at a sports shop in Vail and did part time ski instructing. She had worked there two years. On March 15, 1975 she left another apartment in her apartment complex at approx. 6:30 P.M. to return to her apartment, which she did. She talked to her mother on the phone long distance at 8:30 P.M. She was then supposed to meet her roommate at a bar two blocks from her apartment for a drink between 9:00 and 9:30 P.M. Th

leaving her place she would probably walk to the meeting place by taking East Meadow Drive for 700 feet across a covered bridge to the Mall at Vail. Ore Creek Drive was another street she could have taken from her apartment but it was in the opposite direction of her destination. Inv. Bustos went through her apartment thoroughly. Her apartment was extremely clean with few clothes as there was little closet space, just clothing for skiing and casual clothing. It was his opinion on talking with her roommate, who knew victim's clothing well that she was wearing a brown suede coat, ski hat, jeans and boots when she left. The subject was a very popular girl. She was well liked, outgoing but not a loose girl. Insp. concluded, after talking to guys she had dated, that she wasn't easy but wasn't a prude either. Her diaphragm, which her roommate stated she wouldn't go across the street without, was found in her bedroom drawer, along with car keys, wallet, toilet articles, favorite coat, special face soap for a skin problem, etc. Victim had just returned from a ski trip with a guy to Sun Valley. She had taken two weeks off, instead of the one week that she had asked for, which was unusual for her inasmuch as she was considered very dependable. It was speculated that the reason for this was that she had found a guy that she wanted to settle down with. The trip had not been too good as when they arrived in Sun Valley the man she had gone with met some of his former girlfriends. Cunningham was a little depressed about this and had mentioned it to her mother in their conversation of March 15, 1975. She had left Sun Valley on the Wednesday prior to March 15 to return to Vail. Male acquaintances in Vail were polygraphed with no positive results. Gas was purchased by Bundy in Dillon and Silverthorne, Colorado on March 15, 1975. Dillon and Silverthorne are close to Vail. Of note is the fact that these two towns are only 1.3 miles apart. The man who runs the Silverthorne station definitely recognizes Bundy. Also the Chief of Police of Silverthorne recognized Bundy. The Chief had to go to Breckenridge, Colo. to Court and had stopped by the Holiday Inn in Frisco, also near Vail. He was waiting in the lobby to be seated in the coffee shop. He remembers Bundy coming in, spotting him, turning and leaving. He was wearing a blue ski jacket (wet look) and a yellow turtle neck shirt. In Silverthorne the station remains open until midnight. Bundy only purchased 1.9 gallons or .89 worth of gas. The Dillon attendant remembered the car but not Bundy. He gassed there in the afternoon.

Det. Thomas Shomaker of Boulder County Sheriff's Department then spoke about his case. On 4-23-75 [redacted] (victim) was found clothed but with her jeans pulled down and unzipped, blouse torn in front, jean jacket with blood on sleeve. She had been struck at base of skull, probably not going fully unconscious, then struck a second time by a 35-45 pound rock which was dropped on her head. She had scratches on front of body where blouse was ripped open. It was speculated that this might have been the work of hippie-type individual due to the condition of a pillow case which was around her neck. Her hands were bound with green nylon cord in front of her body with this dirty pillow case rag around her neck. It is speculated that

the rag had been used as a blindfold, which had slipped. A portion of the pillow case blindfold had been torn away. At first her father was a suspect as he had been having sexual relations with his daughter as well as the daughter's girlfriend. It was noted that the father one [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) [REDACTED] had spend 18 months of a two year sentence in the state penitentiary for bad checks. This case has not been solved to date.

A talk was then give by Bob Demming, Undersheriff of Clear Creek County in Georgetown, Colorado. On 6-30-75 Kelly Robertson left her home for work at her father's printing shop in Golden, Colorado. She was last seen at 34th. & Sheridan Streets in Denver hitchhiking to her job. She was seen at this location getting into an old 1952-1957 Chevrolet pickup truck, red in color, with a bearded subject. She did place a phone call that evening so was still alive at that time. On 8-23-75 two young people working for Amax testing for gas content found her body in a mine shaft three miles East of the Summit of Berthod Pass. The victim's body was covered with mold. Also found were two pieces of torn furnace tape, one on the body and one nearby. She had been struck on the front side of head and top rear of head and also had been struck on the right front chest. She had been picked up at or near the junction of I-70 and Colfax and never seen again until 8-23-75. It was noted that she had been attending a Transactional Analysis group.

Ed Thompson, Undersheriff of San Miguel County in Telluride then gave a talk regarding their missing female. On September 24, 1975 Kathryn Mary Kelly left with her boyfriend, [REDACTED] who is a Merchant Marine from Maine enroute to Tellurid, Colorado. They arrived in Telluride on September 26, 1975 and spent the night together in a house she had rented in Telluride. On the following morning [REDACTED] left her to return to the Merchant Marines. That day 9-27-75 she spent the day shopping and setting up her new household. She had purchased plants, new sheets, etc. That evening she was seen at a couple of the local bars by friends. She was last believed seen at 11:00 A.M. Sunday walking over Bear Creek Bridge. She was seen by an acquaintance who was driving in a car at the time so could not be absolutely positive that it was her. She was wearing blue jeans, a red white & black flannel shirt and hiking boots. It was believed that she was going out for a hike. She has never been seen again. An extensive search was made by search and rescue to no avail. She is 5'7", 130 lbs., long brown hair, green eyes, DOB 6-14-55. It was stated that a guy was seen in the bar on Saturday night, who one girl complained had constantly stared at her. He had asked her what the after hour action was and when she told him there was none and she was waiting for her boyfriend he split. The boyfriend of Kelly, one [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] 6'2", 170, brown collar length hair, shorter now, driving 1969 Chevrolet Chevelle, gray with black vinyl top, SS # [REDACTED] This subject will be polygraphed as soon as possible. [REDACTED]

Sheriff Whitmire then related, in the absence of Sheriff Hogue, that in 1974 a married woman was abducted while hitchhiking toward New Castle, Colorado. She had been dragged through the sand and thrown in the river. She was found two days later. Her husband cleared on the polygraph. This crime has never been solved.

Mike Fisher, Investigator for the D.A.'s office in Aspen then described another suspect for everyone's reference: [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] 6', 175 lbs., light brown hair, light blue eyes, with receding hairline, who has a record of being a flasher. He has been in the Seattle, Portland, California, Aspen and Vail, Colorado areas. He was driving a light brown station wagon with Washington plates. His FBI number is 67430 L10.

It was then suggested that everyone attending the meeting make an effort to circulate and exchange all current credit card information with regard to gas purchases made by Bundy.

Captain Nick Mackie then made a plea for cooperation of everyone attending to keep silent with regard to inquiries from press regarding the meeting and the subject matter discussed for obvious reasons. It was stressed that pre-trial publicity would blow any chances of getting a conviction on Bundy. Bundy's hearing is set for 11-21-75.

David Yocom, Salt Lake County Attorney, made comments also on the importance of silence with regard to the press. He stated that Bundy is represented by John O'Connell. He mentioned that O'Connell has speculated that if Bundy gets out on bail he will stick to his current line of innocence, commit suicide or possibly get wiped out. He also mentioned the possibility of O'Connell agreeing to a private psychiatric examination of his client, results of which would not be available to anyone but Bundy's counsel. He had also mentioned the possibility, that if he felt Bundy was guilty, he might cop to one of these cases if other jurisdictions would agree, getting him put away in a mental institution as in the Boston Strangler case. Yocom stated he believed Bundy will get bound over on the Aggravated Kidnapping charge but will probably have the Attempted Homicide charge thrown out. If Bundy testifies the chances of conviction are good and if he doesn't his chances of conviction are poor. He stated that the press coverage in Salt Lake had not been bad to date. Yocom thinks that Bundy will be tried before Christmas. O'Connell had set a high fee so that slowed things down for a while. To date, Bundy has not bonded out. At first it looked like friends in Washington would get the money up. This has slowed down after publicity about the credit cards, etc. Yocom stated that O'Connell and his associate, Bruce Luback (sp?) like publicity and like to talk about their cases. O'Connell likes to have his name in print. Yocom thinks he is a very fine, ethical attorney and thinks he will ^{not} Bundy to cop if he is in on this.

Someone then mentioned that another witness has come forth and identified Bundy as having approached her after he was released on the Possession of Burglary Tools charge and said "Hi, Thou Sayesth the Lord" and then smacked her. Another witness, a 72 year old rape and beating victim has come forward and identified Bundy as her assailant. It was then mentioned that possibly many more would come forward with statements of this nature.

Mike Fisher then thanked everone for their cooperation in making the meeting such a successful exchange of cases and ideas. A list of agencies attending was distributed and everyone was encouraged to contact different agencies if necessary.

The meeting was concluded at approximaately 11:30 A.M. on 11-14-75.

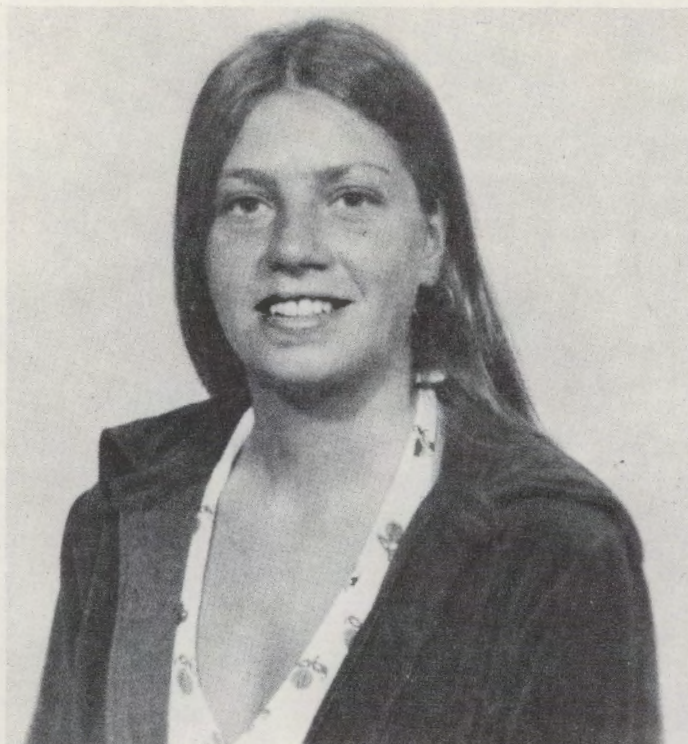



Thought you may be interested in this. On the early morning hours of 8-16-75 BUNDY was spotted by our Patrol Division prowling a residential neighborhood in his brown Volkswagen. When officers attempted to approach him, he fled in his vehicle. When officers placed him under arrest, they found in his vehicle a canvas gym bag containing the items shown in the photograph. Bundy had no reasonable explanation for being in the residential area, nor any explanation for the items in the bag. The patrol officers were not familiar with Bundy's background, and he had been released from jail before this was brought to my attention. However, we are attempting to obtain a warrant on Bundy for Possession of Burglar Tools. If we are successful in this, I will interview Bundy when he is arrested again.

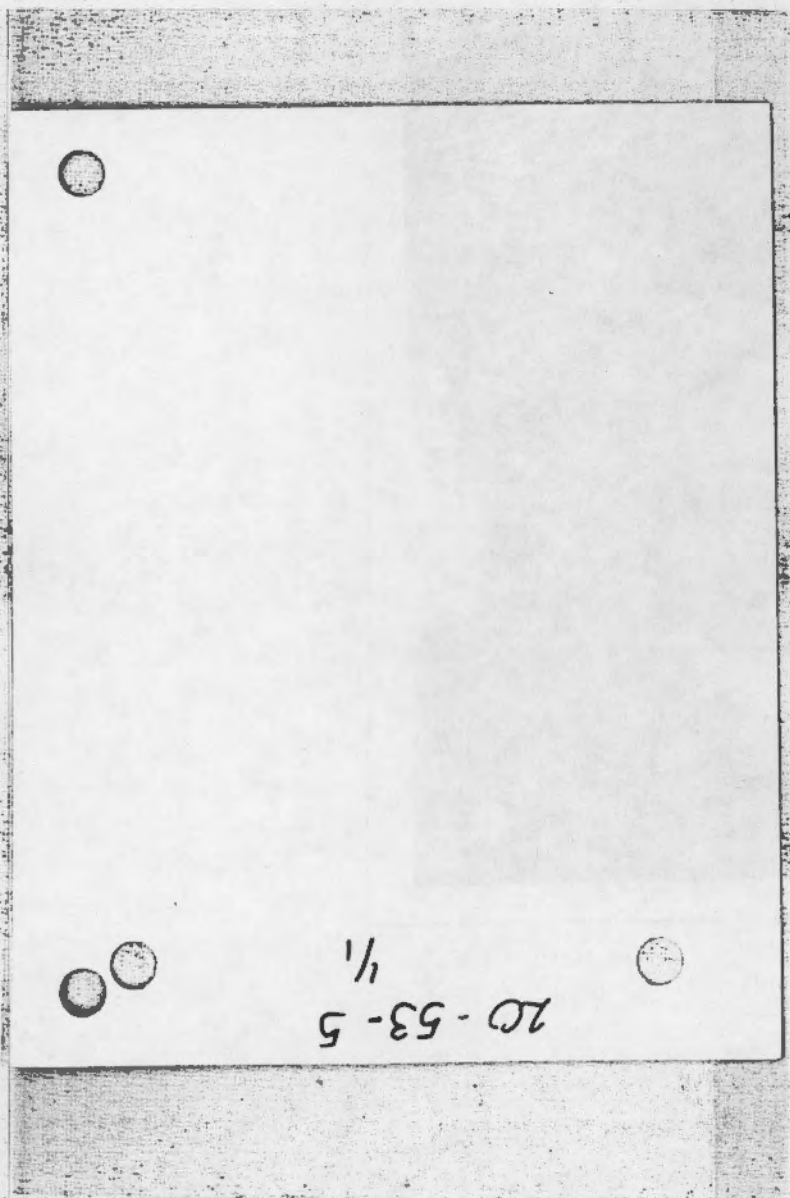

I have contacted my neighbor, Judy Poe, who has a reputation for being quite knowledgeable of these signs. Judy advises the closest symbol she knows to that indication is the sign for Saturn. The proper sign is, h, however the symplified form is 3. Judy advises this sign may have many meanings but death is ruled by this sign. Saturn is connected with the gall bladder, spleen, skin, teeth and bones. This later affect is strength by its influence on the anterior lobe of the pituitary when regulated by the sex glands and bone and muscle structure.

For further information I refer you to THE MODERN TEXTBOOK OF ASTROLOGY by M.E. Hone, D.F. Astrol.S., specifically page 30; HEAVEN KNOWS WHAT, by Grant Lewi; THE COMPLEAT ASTRALOGER (proper spelling) a McGraw Hill publication by Parker, pages 31 and 98; and SYMBOLS, SIGNS AND SIGNETS by Ernst Lehner, page 60. 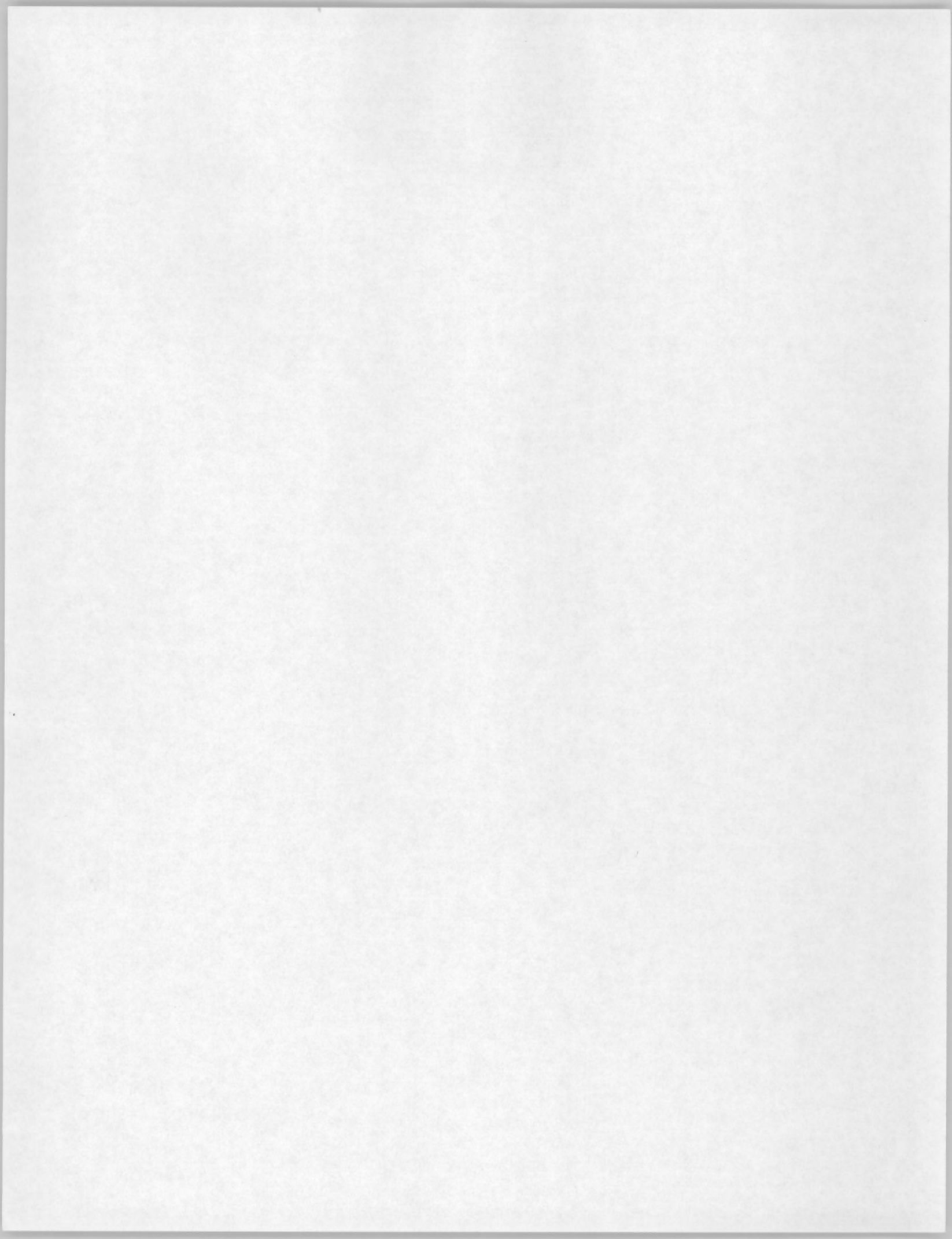

DETAILS: The Complainants (ROSS) (FISHER) were in the Willie Mae Mine which is approximately one mile East of Berthoud Falls, Colorado on August 21, 1975 conducting heat flow tests. At that time the Complainants noticed a odor of decaying material in the mine. The Complainants left the mine but returned on August 23, 1975 at approximately 1000 hours.

At this time the Complainants found the mold covered remains of an unidentified subject. They went immediately to the Berthoud Falls Standard Station and notified the Clear Creek County Sheriff's Office of their discovery.

Sheriff E. Gene KIEFER, Undersheriff Robert DENNING, Captain Kenneth STEWART, Sergeant Steven FOELLMER, Sergeant M. Gene DAY, and Investigator Thomas SCHEIDER responded to the Berthoud Falls Inn. At that time Sergeant M. Gene DAY and the Complainants returned to the Willie Mae Mine and secured the scene. Deputy Coroner Loys CALDWELL also met at this location.

At approximately 1100 hours the teams arrived at the crime scene which had already been secured by Sergeant DAY. The teams began performing their respective tasks on the exterior of the mine. It was noted that electric lighting would be desirable upon entering the mine.

A call was placed to the Georgetown Fire Department requesting the use of their generator and lighting equipment. Firemen Dick SHOCKLEY and Bobby PRETZ arrived with the rescue van and set up the lighting equipment.

At approximately 1145 hours the mine was entered in the following manner:

Approximately 25 feet into the tunnel, a footprint was noted in the mud, leading into the mine, which did not match the footprints of the Complainants. The footprint was photographed; however it lacked sufficient tread detail to be of value.

Between the first branch tunnel and the second tunnel (where the body was located), Deputy Coroner CALDWELL found a 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " X 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " negative laying in the mud alongside the ore tracks. However, the negative was blank. The location of the negative was photographed.

As the investigative team approached the second branch tunnel the stench became stronger. At the entrance to the second tunnel, the body could be seen, covered with a white substance later identified as a mold.

The tunnel was photographed progressively as the team approached the body. Upon closer observation of the body and surrounding area, a small piece of heating duct tape was found in the mud near the body, by Deputy Coroner CALDWELL. The tape was secured by Sheriff KIEFER.

The location of the body was diagramed by Sheriff KIEFER and Sergeant FOELLMER. Reference diagram. The body and surrounding area was completely photographed by Captain STEWART and Investigator SCHEIDER. The body was placed in a body bag by Sheriff KIEFER, Deputy Coroner CALDWELL, and Sergeant FOELLMER and removed from the scene. The ground under the body was photographed by Captain STEWART and Investigator SCHEIDER.

On above date, at approximately 1030 hours, writer was contacted at his residence to respond to a dead body in a mine shaft. Upon arrival at 1100 hours writer met with other officers at the Berthoud Falls Inn and from there proceeded to the location of the mine which was approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile East of the Inn. The scene had all ready been secured by Sgt. Day who was talking with witnessed upon arrival of writer & other officers. Writer and other officers then did a search of the area outside the mine for any possible evidence. Pictures of the area were taken by writer & Captain Stewart. After a thorough search of the outside perimeter, officers went into the mine shaft looking for any evidence and taking pictures as they proceeded. The body was found approximately 500ft. into the the shaft. The body was not found in the main shaft, but in the end of a shaft that went East from the main shaft and approximately 70ft. in. The body was that of a nude woman and was covered with a white substance that appeared to be mold. After taking pictures and searching the area for evidence, the body was removed from the area. Measurements of the area and evidence collected by the Sheriff & Sgt Foellmer. Writer & Captain Stewart conducted the search for evidence and took photographs. Undersheriff Denning took statements from the persons who discovered the body, and Loys Caldwell was in charge of the body and its removal. After the removal of the body, it was taken to Jefferson County Coroners Office, where an autopsy was conducted by Dr. Hunt. Writer, Sgt. Foellmer, & Loys Caldwell were present during the autopsy, and writer took photographs. See Dr. Hunt's report for details of the findings of the autopsy. See Sgt. Foellmer's report for list of evidence found.

At approximately 1120 hours on the 23rd of August 1975 writer at the request of Captain Kenneth L. ~~Stewart~~ responded to the Berthoud Falls in on U.S. Hwy 40 approximately 7 miles west of Empire, Colorado in regards to a death investigation.

Writer arrived on scene at approximately 1129 hours and awaited further instructions. At approximately 1207 hours writer and several members of the Clear Creek County Sheriff's Office went to the scene of the suspected homicide.

Writer under directions of Captain ~~Sin~~ began making a crime scene chart of the area. As well as searching for evidence in the immediate area. After the above had been completed writer and several members of the Sheriff's Office entered a mine in an attempt to locate the victim. Stewart.

The victim was in fact located in the mine in a shaft bearing to the left about 500 feet inside the main portal. The victim was photographed by Captain Stewart and Investigator ~~Schneider~~ before being removed by the Deputy Coroner. Schneider

Writer and Investigator ~~Schneider~~ responded to the Jefferson County Coroners Office with ~~Deputy Coroner Lays Caldwell~~. An autopsy was performed by ~~Deputy Coroner Dr. John Hunt~~ of the Jefferson County Coroners Office. Deputy Coroner Dr. John Hunt

During the autopsy Dr. ~~Hunt~~ advised that the victim had a ~~slight bruise in the middle of the chest~~. Dr. Hunt further advised that the victim had been struck about the head with an unknown object. ~~Bruises were found on the right side of the head, top, forehead and back of the head.~~ There were no fractures of the skull though. Dr. Hunt further advised that he could find no signs of knifing or bullet wounds in the victim. The victim did not appear to have been strangled and the neck was not broken. At the completion of the autopsy Dr. ~~Hunt~~ could not at that time determine what the exact cause of death was. He related he would have to wait until further lab examinations had been completed before attempting to determine what the exact cause of death was. right side

Several items were found on the victims body and were removed and marked as possible evidence. Those items were kept in writers possession. As there was no possible way to determine identity of the victim through facial features the victims teeth were removed as a possibility of identifying the victim through dental charts. As much of the skin had been deteriorated Dr. ~~Hunt~~ removed several of the victims fingers in hopes that fingerprints might possibly be obtained.

The victim was described as a Caucasian female, age 18 to 30, height 5 foot 8 inches, approximate weight 130 pounds, brown hair and brown eyes. No visible scars or marks could be found. Dr. ~~Hunt~~ estimated that the victim had been in the mine between six and eight weeks.

Dr. ~~Hunt~~ contacted writer at approximately 2215 hours this date and advised writer to contact Lab Technician Piper at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office in regards to attempting to process the fingerprints of the victim. Dr. ~~Hunt~~ advised that Piper had advised he had a new techniques in developing such prints and that he would be able to assist this department on Monday August 25, 1975 if officers would contact him.



At approximately 11:01 a.m. Undersheriff Denning received a telephone report from The Clear Creek County Sheriff's Department advising the discovery of a body at a Mine just east of Berthoud Falls on August 23rd, a Saturday. He was requested to report to Sheriff Kiefer at Berthoud Falls. At 11:25 a.m. Denning went in Service and at 11:44 a.m. he arrived at Berthoud Falls. Details were being assigned by Captain Stewart and Denning was assigned to interrogating the complainants who found the body. The complainants, Mr. Gordon C. Ross and Mrs. Deborah Fisher were taken to The Clear Creek County Sheriff's Department and interviewed on two tape recorders which were later reduced to writing and signed by the complainants. (See Interviews with Mr. Ross and Mrs. Fisher)

The gist of the interview was that the complainants had been attempting to set a heat measuring device for AMAX Corporation. They stated they ~~had been to the mine sometime in the middle of July and that it was full of water at that time~~ so they could not enter. Later, August 21st they went to the mine and found that the water had subsided so they went to the end of the tunnel for their inspection. During this course of events, they noticed a strange stench and peered into the second adit where they observed a white object. Not knowing where the odor was coming from or what it was they decided to leave for their safety. After discussing the matter with her supervisor, Mrs. Fisher decided to re-enter the mine and further investigate the situation. On August 23rd approximately 10:30 a.m. she and Mr. Gordon went back into the mine and discovered the body in the second adit.

August 25, 1975 - Denning met with Sheriff Kiefer, & Captain Stewart for a briefing. After the briefing Denning and Stewart interviewed the following persons:

August 26, 1975 - Stewart and Denning met with Sgt. Bailey at The Englewood Police Department in reference to a similiar crime believed committed by a resident of Englewood. The facts involved in that incident were that a Mr. [REDACTED] 34 [REDACTED] South Corona, Englewood, Colorado, was reported missing to Englewood P.D. June 24. He had failed to report for work on the 23rd, but was contacted by a co-worker who states he thought he had woke him from a nap. He was seen loading his van on the 22nd and on the 23rd he withdrew funds from his bank account at the First National Bank of Englewood. His apartment was checked on the 24th by Englewood P.D. and only toilet articles and a certain amount of clothing were found to be missing. He wasn't heard from until June 27th. On June 27th his parents received a phone call from him at his aunt's house in San Bernadino, California at approximately 6:00 p.m. He told them that he was on a leave of absence from Burroughs Company and that they were going to visit a friend of his aunt the next day. His aunt Mrs. [REDACTED] was last seen during the day of the 28th and [REDACTED]'s van was last seen at her residence about 2:00 a.m. On the morning of the 29th neighbors heard a woman scream at about 3:20 a.m. Mrs. [REDACTED] failed to show for work on the morning of the 30th. Later her body was found in Utah near the Colorado border. She had been shot and two 380 slugs were recovered from her body. On July 1st a neighbor saw [REDACTED] at his Englewood apartment where he was loading a suitcase and other clothing. On July 7th Englewood P.D. again checked [REDACTED]'s apartment and discovered that a suitcase, that had been there on the 24th of June, was gone along with other items. However, his television and some furniture remained. Englewood P.D. then checked his mail box and found that mail prior to July 2nd had been picked up. They returned to the apartment and found adhesive bandages with hair, rouge, and mascarra on them in the waste basket. [REDACTED]'s step father advised Englewood that he never dated to his knowledge. Pornographic literature was discovered in his mail.

Mrs. Robertson was last heard from on the evening of the 1st of July when she made a phone call. She was known to be an avid hitch-hiker. It is possible that she was picked up by [REDACTED] as he was on his way out of town killed and abandoned at the Willie Mae Mine. A pawn ticket from Boise, Idaho indicates [REDACTED] pawned a rifle there on August 4th. Later in the Evening Denning again contacted Sgt. Bailey by telephone and was advised that a Detective Gary Hilder from San Bernadino Calif had arrived at Englewood to investigate the [REDACTED] murder. Detective Hilder advised that Mrs. [REDACTED]'s body had been wrapped with duct tape also.

Prior to going to Englewood, Denning and Stewart had met with Mr. & Mrs. Robt. Williams, #108, Big Horn Apartments in Idaho Springs. Mr. & Mrs. Williams advised that some peculiar instances had occurred which they wanted to relate. They stated that at approximately the time Shelley Robertson had came up missing they found

a pair of shorts and a bright colored blouse next to the apartment's swimming pool, also panties and a brassier. They kept the items for several days, but then threw them away. During this period a door mat was taken and after Mr. William had replaced it he found that the original had been returned, but he observed that it appeared to be covered with blood. He rinsed the mat off and put it in another location. Stewart requested the loan of the mat as evidence and William obliged. It was taken into custody by Denning. It was noted that some of the substance still remained on the mat. When Mr. and Mrs. William were shown a picture of Shelley, they both were sure they had seen her around the apartments. Mrs. William later stated she believed she had seen her cleaning and washing for a tenant who lived there a Mr. [REDACTED] who they had evicted July 18th. It is possible that [REDACTED] and Shelley were swimming nude during the evening of July 1st or the morning of July 2nd; that something happened to provoke [REDACTED] and he killed Shelley and took her to the Willie Mae Mine. It is interesting to note that [REDACTED] worked for Henderson and passed the mine daily enroute to work. Further follow up investigation should reveal more in this instance.

August 27th, 1975 -- Sheriff Kiefer, Undersheriff Denning, Captain Stewart and Sergeant Day met with two gentlemen from the District attorney's office in Aspen, Colorado. They were Mr. [REDACTED] of the Pitkin County District Attorneys Office and Mr. [REDACTED] of the Pitkin County Sheriff's Office. They were interested in the similarities between our case and a case which occurred in Aspen sometime back. They provided back-up material on many other instances of similar circumstances occurring in California, Oregon, Washington and Utah.

Stewart, Fisher Baldrige and Denning then went to Englewood Police Department where they met with Det. Gary Hilder of the San Bernadino, California Police Department. Data was compared between the two cases, Alice Stephenson and Shelly Robertson. Ellis

It was found that duct tape was used in both instances. However, the duct tape in the [REDACTED] homicide was fibered and the Robertson case the tape was not fibered and displayed a shinier appearance.

Data indicated that [REDACTED] was in the area of Englewood, Colorado on July 1, 1975. A sample of Shelly Robertson's hair was given to Det. Hilder who advised they would compare it with the hair on the tape found in [REDACTED]'s apartment July 7, 1975. They will notify this Department with results of comparisons.

Although the date in this incident seem to relate, surrounding circumstances are different. Mrs. [REDACTED] was shot and two (2) 380 slugs were recovered from her body just off of I-70 West just short of the Colorado/Utah line. While Shelly Robertson showed no indication of a shooting. [REDACTED] was encased in two (2) large garbage bags which were then sealed with duct tape. Shelly Robertson was found completely nude with small pieces of duct tape on her body and the immediate vicinity.

August 28, 1975 - Denning and Fisher returned to the crime scene and searched the surrounding area again. A pair of shorts and a bath towel in very good condition was located on the North side of the US 40. approximately 1/8 of a mile West of the crime scene. Certain paraphenalia was ~~located~~ ~~just South East of the entrance of the mine.~~ This included ~~some~~ ~~plastic buttons larger than~~ ~~those used on a shirt~~ and the end of a Carlton cigarette carton. The carton had a florescent orange price tag such as those used in Target Stores.

In another camp fire just South of the road entering the area, cloth debris was found. The metal buttons will be compared by CBI with the shorts taken from Shelly Robertson's residence. The other clothes and the towel will be presented to the family for possible identification.

Denning and Fisher then returned to the Clear Creek Sheriff's Office where they met with Stewart and Baldrige for a brief conference. The rest of the afternoon was spent in case preparation and the development of crime scene film.

August 29, 1975 - A conference was held in Sheriff Kiefer's office and assignments were issued.

Sgt. Gene Day was instructed to take the clothing found yesterday to the family for possible identification. He was then to deliver all evidence to CBI for various examinations (see examination sheet). He is also advised to interview Mr. Ron Christenson, the victim's steady boyfriend.

Sgt. Steve Foellmer prepared identification lists, complete with photographs and Xerox copy pictures of the victim and possible suspects. These information sheets are to be taken to various businesses, agencies, etc. on the F70 route for possible clues.

Denning received several phone calls during the morning regarding this case. Mr. Ron Christenson telephoned and he advised of a mutual friend of Shelly Robertson and himself, who owns an older model red pickup. He stated the name was [REDACTED] (believe spelled [REDACTED]), a school bus driver from Jefferson County where Shelly was also employed. His description is as follows: A full beard, 60", 175 to 180, sandy colored blond hair, 24 to 25 years old and being a conservative dresser.

Mr. Pete Gardner from KLAQ in Denver telephoned and asked if we were familiar with "Jack The Ripper" from Miami, Florida. He went on to describe a list of killings strikingly similar to those previously described by Fisher and Baldrige. All of these killings are quite similar to the Shelly Robertson case. He also described an incident which happened about a week ago on a Sunday morning in Lakewood, Colorado. Mr. Gardner also stated he would look into the Grand Junction case of a few days ago and give us another call if it was similar to the Robertson incident.

Mike Fisher called and stated he would mail a copy of the [REDACTED] case. The [REDACTED] father and son, raped a girl in the Winter Park area April 21, 1975.

In the afternoon [REDACTED] who is being held while awaiting sentence on a rape charge committed in this County three (3) months ago (see interview [REDACTED]), WAS INTERVIEWED.

This supplemental report was completed approximately 4:00 P.M. which brings us up to date.

Details:

August 30, 1975 - Sergeant Gene [redacted] and Undersheriff Robert [redacted] returned to the crime scene at the Willie-Mae Mine and again went over the crime scene. At the junction of the second adit to the west, they observed an Olympia beer can and a celophane pack labeled Leo's Gourmet Cut Ham. The sticker price on the ham was 91¢ and the weight was labeled as four ounces. In the lower right hand corner are the numbers 27 which is believed to be a code setting forth the date of packaging of the ham. At the very end of the shaft, the last adit to the east, ~~Denning, Stewart, Coor's~~ ~~door can.~~ The ~~small of the~~ ~~door can~~ ~~is still apparent.~~ The officers again searched the immediate vicinity of the body raking the area and sifting the puddles. No ear-ring or other evidence was found. The meat wrapper was taken into custody by Denning as evidence.

Conclusion - The meat wrapper and Olympia beer can were at the location found when initial investigation entry was made according to Sgt. [redacted]. The Coor's Can was not at the end of the mine at the initial investigation. The Leo's package appears to be of recent vintage. It is ~~possible that an unknown person entered the mine at the time of the crime and discarded the items found at the entry to the second adit.~~ It is apparent that someone has entered the mine since the investigation.

Action Needed - Contact Leo's Distributor and attempt to date the meat package. Contact the initial complainant and determine whether or not they have been back in the mine. Return to the mine and retrieve the beer cans for investigation and examination by Captain Stewart.

September 2, 1975 - Captain Stewart and Undersheriff Denning contacted several agencies in the Denver area for comparison with similar criminal activity. Detective [redacted] related circumstances surrounding the slaying of ~~Shelley Kay Robertson~~ ~~August 26, 1975.~~ The girl was thrown from a bridge into Cherry Creek; there was a small amount of blood on the bridge. Cause of death was drowning. Denver P.D. has uncovered evidence that the girl had been involved with a Mr. [redacted] ~~mm.~~ [redacted] has an extensive record of sex offenses. A copy of his arrest record and a copy of a picture was obtained for use by this department. [redacted] number is [redacted]. The suspect is believed to live in Morrison, Colorado.

Denning and Stewart then, to Lakewood Department of Public Safety and met with detectives from their department. They related information on a suspect in a stabbing at the ~~Consensus Motel~~, Colfax and Jay, Lakewood. He is [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] 5'7", 130, brown and brown. The suspect is listed as the person who discovered the body; he has an extensive record of sexual violations. The case seems quite dis-similar from the Robertson Slaying.

The investigating officers then contacted Agents ~~Gillespie~~ and ~~Sedlacheck~~ at the ~~Colorado Bureau of Investigation~~. Agent Sedlacheck furnished information concerning a rape which he is investigating in Douglas County. The case has many similarities to the Robertson Homicide. The victim was picked up walking along the road and forced into the car by two U.S. white males. She was taken to an abandoned cabin and raped by both men. During the transport of the victim, she attempted to stab one of the attackers (believed to be [REDACTED] - see below). The attackers broke into an abandoned cabin where the victim was blindfolded and raped; One of the men was raping her while the other inserted his fingers into the victim's vagina and pulled. Victim stated she believed that he was trying to pull her female organs out. One of the men removed an ear-ring from the victim during the attack. This suspect is believed to be [REDACTED] USWM, 185#, 6', Brown and Blue - DOB [REDACTED]. Victim states [REDACTED] attempted to strangle her, but was discouraged by the other attacker known only to her as, [REDACTED]. The vehicle involved is a '63 Ford pick-up believed to be owned by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is also a suspect in a 1970 rape/murder of a Jefferson & Arapahoe County investigation. He failed the polygraph in that instance; again the victim was strangled. Writer believes that [REDACTED] is a definite possibility as the assailant of Shelley Robertson. [REDACTED] is married to a Portorican girl who states, "I don't care what he does as long as he brings me something."

Denning then read a statement of another girl which involved only an unusual circumstance in Aspen a short time ago. The suspects name was [REDACTED] (Spelling?). The statement included victims account of two male suspects acting in a strange manner including statements of, "Drink up, tomorrow you may be dead". This incident seems unrelated to the Robertson Slaying.

Denning and Stewart then returned to Idaho Springs where they met with Deputy ~~Camp~~ ~~Schulz~~. Schulz was under orders to retrieve the Coors can from the mine for examination by Captain Stewart. The meeting between the officers took place at Schulz's residence on Chicago Creek. Schulz stated that he had failed to see the Olympia can. Stewart and Denning again returned to the Willie-Mae mine and found the can where it had been left the day before.

Conclusion - While some of the cases seem different, all suspects are possibilities in the Robertson Homicide. Writer feels that ~~Kraft~~ is a definite possibility; also that his picture seems very familiar.

Action Needed - All suspects will have to be checked out and eliminated.

September 3, 1975 - Denning contacted Mr. Dale Ferguson of Under-Lion Distributing Corporation in reference to the Leo's Ham wrapper found earlier. Mr. Ferguson advised that the numbers, 27 were incomplete, but probably meant the 27th of some month. He stated that he would check the price lists and give the date of changes from 89¢ to 91¢ per pound on September 4. The company is at 4970 Niagra, Denver, Colorado; phone 287-2848. Mr. Ferguson also advised that they have not distributed to Safeway for some time, but they do distribute their product to City Markets on the Western Slope,

the West End Market in Idaho Springs and two groceries in Georgetown.

Early in the afternoon Mr. ~~Shelley Robertson~~ telephoned this office to advise that while he was working at Shelley Robertson's residence, he visited with Mrs. ~~Ross~~. Mrs. ~~Ross~~ stated to him that a ~~Detective Anderson~~ had telephoned her Friday and asked to talk to, [redacted] (Subject's given name). She became suspicious and would not discuss the matter with him. He did not identify his department. Writer knows of no [redacted] involved in this case and questioned other involved C.G.S.O. officers to determine if they knew of any Anderson's working on the case or possibly related cases. All officers contacted, Stewart, Foellmer and Day advised they did not. Also Mr. Robertson advised he had found a roll of furnace tape at Shelley's residence. Denning contacted Sergeants ~~Foellmer~~ and ~~Day~~ to have them pick up the tape and contact Mrs. ~~Ross~~ for further investigation. The officers advised they would contact Mrs. ~~Ross~~ and Mr. Robertson the next day, September 4, 1975.

Later in the Afternoon Detective ~~Fisher~~ from the Pitkin County District Attorney's Office, stopped to relay information concerning the Salt Lake City Suspect, ~~Frederick Bundy~~. Fisher had a copy of Bundy's Chevron Credit Card Charge tickets for the last several months. According to Fisher, Bundy claims never to have been in Colorado, but is placed within the state numerous times in that period. On ~~March 11, 1975~~ ~~Thursday, March 11, 1975~~ Bundy was last seen at Vail, the cards indicate he ~~gassed~~ ~~at Steamboat~~. On ~~April 6~~ the day ~~Ronnie Olsson~~ was last seen at ~~Grand Junction~~, he gassed at ~~Glenwood Springs~~. On January 12, the day ~~Karen Campbell~~ was killed in ~~Aspen~~, he gassed at ~~Glenwood Springs~~. The records after July are incomplete. Detective ~~Watten~~ allowed writer to copy his photostats and stated we could contact a ~~Mr. Bill Izert~~ at ~~Chavron Safety Division~~ in Denver for records after that date. Bundy's account number is [redacted] Izert's Phone number is 292-1400. The total records indicate travel from Salt Lake on 1/70 to Golden, Colo.; then Wyoming, Oregon & Wash. Conclusion: It is extremely possible that Bundy is involved in the western slope cases as indicated by his location at the times of the crimes. Further investigation will ascertain whether or not he was in the area of the Robertson slaying.

Action Needed: Contact Mr. Bill Izert and obtain records of Bundy's Account after July 1st.

September 8, 1975 Writer contacted ~~Shelly Robertson~~ and ~~John E. Robertson~~ at the ~~First State Bank in Idaho Springs~~ Colorado. Mr. Campbell related that a Shelly Robertson had a savings account and a checking account at the bank. Writer requested copies of open records. Mr. Summers produced cards indicating account # opened in the names of John E. or Shellie Robertson on October 23, 1974. A checking account with an initial deposit of \$150.29 and the address indicated on that card as 2700 South Holly, Denver, Colorado and P.O. Box 1564, Idaho Springs, Colorado. The account was over-drawn \$80.00 which was later brought current and the account was closed July 10, 1975. The savings account was opened in the same names, account # . This account was opened on April 10, 1975 with an initial deposit of \$257.00.

Mrs. Robertson's employment was listed as the Red Angus Restraunt (city unknown). The tax identification on both accounts was # . Further information from Mrs. Helen Buck; that John E. Robertson was a colored man living at Mrs. Ingles house, near the cemetary, on Chicago Creek.

It is noted that these accounts were opened in the name of Shellie A. Robertson and the subject victim of this case was Shelley Kay Robertson. The signature on the accounts compared with victims student I.D. card are strikingly similar. Bank tellers Janet Fields and Helen Buck were shown the victims photograph and they stated that it was not the same person who was doing business with them.

CONCLUSION:

At this point it appears that the two Robertson girls are different parties.

ACTION NEEDED:

Attempt to locate Shellie A. Robertson for final verification. In the event that we are not able to locate Mrs. Robertson, have the signatures compared by a hand writing expert.

September 8, 1975 Denning contacted Mrs. at the ~~Idaho Springs Post Office~~ for finding address of Shellie A. Robertson. Denning interviewed Mr. Harvey at his home and was advised of the following information:

Shortly after Shelly Robertson disappeared Mr. Harvey started an investigation of his own. He states that he talked to a bartender at Tony's Bar who told him that a girl came in Monday evening, June 30, 1975, wearing a brown striped dress (SAs related to be the one Mrs. Rossi observed). Shortly after a man came into the bar and they immediately left. They did not order a drink.

Mr. Harvey related the last time he saw the victim he did walk with her to 34th and Sheridan. At this time she was wearing cut off jeans, a white blouse with a bare midriff (possibly a pull over with colored trim) and earth shoe sandals. She did not have socks on. It is possible she was wearing a scarf. Mr. Harvey stated that after he crossed the street, leaving Shelly, he heard her call words to the effect of "I got a ride right away". He turned and observed an older model red pickup crossing the traffic lanes and pulling up ahead of Shelly. Harvey described this pickup as being faded red and possibly bearing a yellow license plate. He states that the pickup either didn't have a tail gate or that there was not a brand name on the tail gate. He described the driver as having bushy hair, no glasses and with a full beard. On July 2nd and 3rd, 1975 Mr. Harvey returned to this location between 8:30 A.M. and 9:30 A.M. and believes he saw the same pickup on one of the above dates.

Mr. Harvey had made arrangements with the victim to meet her the next morning, Tuesday. He was supposed to phone her early and get her up. Mr. Harvey did phone but received no answer. He went to the victim's home that morning, knocked and received no answer. Upon looking through the windows he observed a night light which was on and possibly a note on the table near the light. The house didn't look as if there had been a struggle. That afternoon Harvey called the printer shop and was advised that Shelly hadn't arrived for work.

Related to personal information, Harvey advised he had met Shelly at a dance course at Metro College; that they became very good friends (to the extent of putting their arms around each other and holding hands, etc.) but they were never lovers, although the matter was discussed. He states that Shelly used only marijuana and then very rarely. However, she had told Harvey that she had, "done peyote and/or Mescaline - hashish once or twice".

Other items that she had told him:

That she was married to someone in Canada. That this was a convenience marriage and that this man, "Could have been a pro baseball player, but he was out of shape".

She had told Harvey of a girl who was interested in Astrology but had never mentioned devil cults or the occult to him.

She had mentioned "Fred" as being her adopted father in analysis groups.

Writer drove to 1742 West 36th and picked up Mr. ~~Harvey~~ Denning and Harvey went to 34th and Sheridan in an attempt to identify the older red pick up which Mr. Harvey identified as picking Shelly up when she was last seen. While staking out the intersection, comparisons of pick-ups were made. The one closest to Mr. Harvey's memory were ~~the ones~~. However, the suspect vehicle was not contacted.

Denning and Harvey went to the victims residence in an attempt to determine if the clothes, Mr. Harvey had observed Shelly wearing when last seen, were in the house. ~~Mr. Robertson~~ was working on the house; he stated that on Monday afternoon, the day Shelly was last seen, he received a call from a friend of Shellys requesting that Shelly return her call, he put the note in a flower pot on the table under the light where Shelly would find it when she returned. This note was still there when Mr. Harvey stopped Tuesday morning. Shelly had not called the girl.

Neither the brown striped dress which Mrs. ~~Denning~~ states she saw Shelly wearing June 29th, nor the blouse that Mr. ~~Harvey~~ recalls were at the residence.

Shelly did not return home after being picked up at 34th and Sheridan.
CONCLUSION: ~~Shelly did not return home after being picked up at 34th and Sheridan.~~

Denning contacted ~~Mr. Robertson~~ by phone from the victims residence. Mrs. Robertson stated she had taken some of the clothing home. Denning drove ~~to her home~~ to her home in an attempt to locate the blouse Shelly was last seen wearing. The blouse was not at Mrs. Robertson's home either.

While at Mrs. Robertson's Denning asked about Shelly's marriage. Her reply was "how did you find out about that?" She went on to explain that Shelly had married a Canadian in a "convenience" marriage. It seems that the husband wanted to work in Alaska and Shelly wanted to go into Canada. As spouses are allowed to enter both countries, the marriage was of practical value. Her reason for not mentioning it before was implied that her husband might be her legal heir. Shelly's husband is ~~Edward Sullivan~~, 9741 110th Street, Edmonton, Alta, Canada. He is flying in within the next week. Denning read a letter at Mrs. Robertson's dated August 28th from Sullivan to Shelly. It appears from the nature of the letter that they were only good friends.

While Denning was with ~~Harvey~~ during the day the following information was gained:

Shelly's hair was cut much shorter than indicated in the photograph we have in possession.

When Mr. Harvey walked the victim to 34th and Sheridan she was definitely going to work and her plans were to catch a bus at Colfax and Sheridan.

CONCLUSION: It seems increasingly important to locate the red pick-up Shelly last entered. Arrangements were made to meet Harvey again September 11th in this attempt. (See Harvey's interview for description)

~~Molly Fox~~ (see interview with Mrs. Fox), Shelly Robertson spent Saturday and all day Sunday with Molly Fox. Mrs. Fox advised of a party, a member of the therapy group who she felt was Catatonic "Someone who does not respond to reality, physically or mentally, if subjects arm is lifted over their head, they will hold it there until someone moves it, subject does not respond in any way".

He stated she was not wearing a bra, was wearing an orange sweater and pink stretch pants. Sullivan was employed at [REDACTED] as a dish washer. He further stated that the girl he believes was Shelley talked with a drawl. He says at the time they were driving a green 1962 or 63 Chevy pick-up which belonged to Donna's brother. They were attempting to raise funds in one fashion or another and are believed to have sold a tote-gote in Montrose.

He states he again saw Shelley with [REDACTED], he believes, on February 2, 1975 at the Spaghetti Ranch in Idaho Springs. He was questioned as to other possible associates who might also have seen the girl with [REDACTED]. He stated that the reporting officers should contact Mrs. Woods and Nancy Prout. October 21, 1975: Denning met with Miss Dana Cole and Mr. Swank in the Office of the Dean (room 808) at Metro College across from the Mint in Denver, to determine whether or not [redacted] was in class June 30, July 1st and 2nd, the approximate dates of Shelley's disappearance. The information was not immediately available, however, that Department will attempt to gain that information and relay the data to us.

Approximately 2:00 P.M. Denning contacted Miss Terry Rainey at Fulcher Company, 2715 South Locust, Denver in reference to information on suspects [redacted] and [redacted]. 
