In January of 2019 the Grand Junction Police Department began getting requests from news media about the Denise Oliverson case. A lot of the questions being asked were about the link between known serial killer Ted Bundy and the disappearance of the Denise Oliverson. I observed upon looking this case up in the records management system, this case was a missing person case and was open. Members of the news media believed this to be a homicide case which was closed and Ted Bundy was the suspect. According to the FBI Multi agency Investigative Team Report from 1992 page 34, there was a statement which stated Ted Bundy had abducted Denise Oliverson while she was riding her bike and her body possibly ended up in the river.

Upon speaking with Commander Baker about this FBI Multi agency report, he advised me he thought it appropriate we contact the FBI and find out where the above information came from. As I began looking into this case I found there were two detectives from Colorado who had interviewed Ted Bundy. One of the retired detectives was Matt Lindvall and the other was Mike Fisher. In the past Lindvall had worked for Vail P.D. and Mike Fisher had worked for the District Attorney's Office in Glenwood Springs Colorado. Both detectives had been investigating women who had been abducted and killed by serial killer Ted Bundy. While they were investigating these cases they were requested to interview Ted Bundy at Bundy's request. Bundy was wanting to provide them with information on the whereabouts of the bodies of these two women. While they were interviewing Bundy the Grand Junction Police Department had requested they interview Bundy about Denise Oliverson as it was proved Bundy was in Grand Junction on the same date Denise Oliverson had gone missing.

In early January of 2019 I was able to make contact with Matt Lindvall by telephone. Upon contacting Lindvall he advised me he had been part of a group of investigators who had been allowed to interview Ted Bundy prior to his execution. Lindvall advised he was there to talk to Bundy about a female victim, Julie Cunningham, who had been abducted and murdered by Bundy. He advised Cunningham had been abducted from Vail Colorado, killed and her body had been dumped in the Garfield County area. Lindvall stated when he and Fisher interviewed Bundy they had mostly talked to Bundy about where they could locate the body of Cunningham. Lindvall stated during this time Bundy really did not talk about Denise Oliverson. Lindvall stated just prior to Bundy being executed he made a statement about killing Denise Oliverson and saying her body had been dumped in the river west of Grand Junction. Lindvall stated to me this statement was recorded by jail staff and he had a copy of this statement and it should have been booked in at the Vail Police Department. Ret. Detective Lindvall advised me based on this statement he had no doubts in his mind Denise Oliverson was killed by Ted Bundy and her body dumped in the river.

I attempted to locate and contact Mike Fisher. At this time I was unable to contact Fisher.

I had Alex Bertrami from the Grand Junction Police Department Lab pull all of the evidence from this case. Upon reviewing the evidence I did not locate any recordings which were part of the case. When I spoke to Matt Lindvall he stated he had believed there was a recording of Ted Bundy talking about Denise Oliverson and the GJPD had been given a copy of that recording.

I contacted the Vail Police Department and was able to get a copy of the recording of Ted Bundy when he makes a statement about Denise Oliverson. I booked this recording into the evidence locker at the Grand Junction Police Department. I listened to this recording and could hear a person presumed to be Ted Bundy making a final statement about where the body of a girl he had abducted and killed from Utah was located. During this recording Bundy states he needs to make a statement to the detectives from Colorado. He stated they were wanting to talk about a girl and he names Denise Oliverson. He goes on to say her body was placed in the Colorado River 5 miles west of Grand Junction. The recording goes on from there. Ted Bundy was executed directly after this statement was given. I think it important to note Ted Bundy never admits to killing or abducting Denise Oliverson. He only states her body ended up in the river west of Grand Junction.

After several news stories had aired on several media networks about Ted Bundy, I received a phone call from Ret. Det. Mike Fisher. Fisher stated he had received a phone call from a friend who told him the Denise Oliverson case was still open at the Grand Junction Police Department. I advised him the case was a missing persons case and it was still open. Fisher advised after he had supplied the Chief of Police with a copy of the Ted Bundy recording he believed the case had been closed. I had received an email from a local media outlet with an attachment which showed an older news paper article. This article claimed Chief Bob Evers of the Grand Junction Police Department had closed this case after Bundy was executed. I asked Fisher if I could get his phone number. Fisher refused this request and stated every time he gives out his phone number the media calls him. He stated he did not want to be bothered. He did state the Oliverson case should be closed. Fisher stated he wanted to tell me about his interview with Ted Bundy and why he thinks the case should be closed. Fisher said while he and Mat Lindvall were in Florida they had the opportunity to interview Ted Bundy a couple of times. Fisher stated there were so many detectives there to ask Bundy about missing person cases and Bundy was giving a lot of detailed information. Fisher said when they did get a chance to interview Bundy about the missing Colorado women, Campbell, Cunningham and Oliverson their time was very limited. The only two missing women were Cunningham and Oliverson. Ms. Campbell had been located murdered in the area surrounding Aspen and Snowmass. Fisher stated due to their limited time, they spent most of their time talking about Ms. Cunningham. Fisher and Lindvall both stated this was due to Cunningham's body being hidden in the mountains in Garfield County surrounding Glenwood Springs. Lindvall previously stated Bundy wanted

them to find Cunningham's body. Bundy believed if they found Cunningham's body he would be able to get an extension on his time prior to his execution. Fisher went on to state when he tried to talk to Bundy about Oliverson, their time was up and they did not get the chance to talk about her.

Fisher stated there was a last interview they were given with Bundy to try to get more information. Fisher stated again they were given only a limited amount of time for the interview. Fisher stated another detective who interviewed Bundy before them went over his time. He and Lindvall were only given a very short time to talk to Bundy on this second occasion. Fisher stated Bundy was not wanting to talk and the interview was cut short. Fisher stated he told Bundy they wanted to talk about Denise Oliverson. Bundy would only say that before he was executed he promised he would make sure to clear up the matter of Denise Oliverson but he was not going to talk about her on that date. Fisher stated this was the last time he and Lindvall spoke to Ted Bundy. Fisher stated he and Lindvall returned to Colorado. Fisher stated on the date Ted Bundy was executed he received a phone call from the warden of the prison in Florida. Fisher stated he had been informed of the recording of Ted Bundy making last minute confessions prior to being executed. Fisher stated he heard the recording and in his mind this was Ted Bundy's way of clearing up the Denise Oliverson case. Fisher said there is no doubt in his mind Ted Bundy killed Denise Oliverson and put her in the river near Grand Junction. Fisher then offered to get me a copy of the recording. He also stated he had the gas receipt from when Ted Bundy purchased fuel in the Grand Junction area the same day Denise Oliverson went missing. Fisher told me based on the last interview with Bundy when he promised to clear up the Denise Oliverson case, the recording from Bundy minutes prior to his execution and the gas receipt showing Bundy in the Grand Junction area, he has no doubt Bundy is responsible for the death of Denise Oliverson.

Based on these interviews of Matt Lindvall and Mike Fisher it is my recommendation this case be changed from a missing person to a homicide. I would recommend this case be closed as Death of Offender.

On November 13, 2013, at approximately 1300 hours, Detective Cowgill and I contacted Nina Nicholson at 811 White Avenue, #16, in Grand Junction, CO. Nina Nicholson is the mother of Denise Oliverson the missing person in this case.

Oliverson's maiden name is Nicholson.

Nina Nicholson, age 90, indicated she is the biological mother to Denise Oliverson. Nina indicated her husband Robert has been deceased for quite some time. Nina indicated Denise has a biological sister by the name of Renee West, age 50, who lives in Palisade at the Palisade Living Center.

Nina Nicholson agreed to provide buccal swabs in this case in the event DNA is needed to confirm the identity of her daughter, Denise Oliverson.

Nina Nicholson also signed a release for dental records reported to be at Dr. Bull's office located at 2119 N. 7th Street.

I obtained four buccal swabs from Nina Nicholson, identified as item JS-1. The buccal swabs were included with the family packet DNA kit provided by NAMUS. The buccal swabs were sent out US mail via NAMUS packaging on 11/14/13.

I also contacted dentist Dr. Bull and provided him with the name of the Odontologist for NAMUS. Dr. John Bull agreed to contact the Odontologist and provide the dental records he had for Denise Oliverson.

This letter is to inform you that STR and mtDNA profiles have been developed for the sample which was submitted by your agency to the University of North Texas Center for Human Identification (UNTCHI). The DNA profiles for the sample have been entered into the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) and uploaded into the Texas Department of Public Safety's State DNA Index System (SDIS). On 03/16/15, at about 1000 hours, Detective HEIL and I responded to _____, in Mesa County, to speak with a resident there, _____. This was in response to an email _____ sent to Chief CAMPER in regard to the cold case missing person DENISE OLIVERSON.

I knocked on the camper and _____ answered; she later confirmed her identity via a CO driver's license. I asked _____ to tell me about the email she sent Chief CAMPER. _____ launched into a lengthy, detailed story about her ex-boyfriend, _____. In summation, _____ began dating in about January of 2004 and she spent time with him at his house, located somewhere near Sherwood Park, in the City of Grand Junction. _____ if he had an extra bike he could loan her and he said he did not. Sometime later, in about August of 2004, _____ down into his basement where she saw a women's bicycle. _____ said a female had left the bike there and he kept it. _____, "Can you believe I did this?" _____ did not know what to think of this, but did not like that _____ kept the bike a secret, because she wanted a bike. _____ seemed to treasure the bike and did not let _____ have it.

_____ broke up in about October of 2004. _____ formed the opinion that _____ was odd and treated her poorly. Over the years, she sought out other ex-girlfriends of _____. She spoke to one female (unknown) who claimed to have located a safe in closet which contained pornography and underwear. Some of the pornography appeared to be of young males and females, but no specifics were given. _____ recalled also seeing a safe in _____ closet, but she was unable to get inside of it. As time passed, _____ thought a lot about _____ and came to the opinion that he was capable of being a serial killer. She based this on "a woman's intuition."

Recently, about a year prior to my conversation with _____, her mother passed away. As _____ was going through some old things, she came across documentation that the notorious serial killer TED BUNDY had stayed on her family's property in Grand Junction. _____ then recalled meeting a male by the name of TED BUNDY when she was younger. _____ also found a photo of the man she knew as TED BUNDY. _____ began researching TED BUNDY and learned that he was believed to be a serial killer. She could not reconcile the TED BUNDY she knew as being a serial killer and believed he was not a serial killer. _____ believed _____ was a serial killer.

While researching online some of the crimes TED BUNDY was alleged to have committed, _____ came across this case, the missing person case of DENISE OLIVERSON. _____ became convinced that the bike she saw in _____ basement was DENISE's bike. _____ thinks _____, not TED BUNDY, killed DENISE.

_____ showed me the picture of TED BUNDY that she found in her family's belongings. It was a blurry photo of a man tending to a horse. The photo appeared to be genuine and matched the era that _____ purported it to be from (1980s). The photo was blurry and the pictured male was not readily identifiable as TED BUNDY. He was similar enough that it may well have been a photo of TED BUNDY. _____ said people in her family disagree about whether or not the man in the photo is TED. _____ reiterated that the TED BUNDY she knew could never have killed anyone. _____ reiterated that _____ could kill someone and she believed he had.




_____ could not provide any more specifics about her time with _____ which made her suspect him as a killer. She did reference that _____ had a cabin in the woods near Telluride, CO, and he took her there on several occasions. _____ said the cabin "freaked (her) out" because it had a saw blade and an ax hanging above the door. _____ acted like these tools were "cool decorations" but they were not cool and _____ thought they were "creepy."

_____ appeared to be convinced about what she was saying. She spoke clearly, but a lot of what she said was not logical. _____ admitted that she had no facts to support her thoughts, just "feelings." I concluded our interview.

I researched _____ and found a record of an _____ in a local police database. His last known address was _____ Grand Junction, CO. He did not have a concerning criminal history in our local database.

This concludes my involvement with this case to this point.

While reviewing this cold case, I observed a request from the Colorado Bureau of Investigations Missing Persons Center, a Maria Lunn who works for the State of Colorado. Her contact information was with a telephone number of (303) 239-4251. Based on this information, they were requesting dental information on a missing person cold case that the Grand Junction Police Department has had open since 1975 involving Denise Oliverson (DOB 8/10/50).

I went through the report and noted that Detective Stogsdill had contacted Dr. Bull, an odontologist within Mesa County, back in 2013 reference the dental records. Dr. Bull stated that he provided an odontologist for NAMUS, which is a federal database for missing persons, this information back in 2013. Dr. Bull also stated that he had provided a copy of all of the dental records and x-rays for Denise Oliverson sometime back to a Detective John Baker, who is no longer employed with the Grand Junction Police Department. Dr. Bull dropped off a packet containing the dental records, films, and other documentation for the Denise Oliverson case on 8/5 to Administrative Assistant Kim Turner, who then forwarded them to me. I booked all of these items into Evidence at the Grand Junction Police Department. I further requested copies of the dental x-rays to be scanned and placed into the file, converted by our lab.

On 8/12/15, I contacted Maria Lunn with the State of Colorado reference the entry of these dental records into NCIC/CCIC. She provided me a name of a Dr. John Filippi, who is a dentist with NAMUS, as far as a contact for obtaining this information regarding the entry of Denise Oliverson into NAMUS as well as NCIC/CCIC.

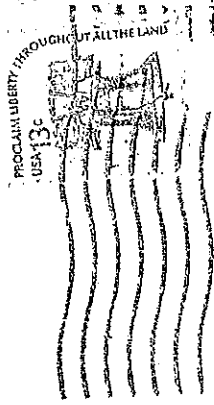

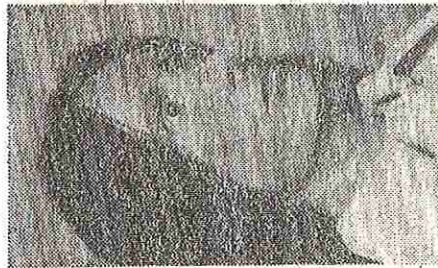

Bus tickets, rental cars help in Continental strike

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Strike-bound Continental Airlines, the nation's seventh largest air carrier hit by a walkout of commercial pilots Saturday, reported no "serious problems" Sunday as thousands of passengers and a million tons of freight were rerouted from its grounded planes to other airlines.

In Denver, the biggest problem has been accommodating passengers booked on Denver to Colorado Springs flights, said James Burnett, Denver station manager in charge of passengers.

Burnett said that the airline has been purchasing bus tickets and leasing rental cars for these passengers.

"Otherwise there have been few problems," he added. "We have been able to find spaces for our passengers on other airlines. Luckily the strike happened during the off-season."

Continental, which serves 31 cities in the Southwest, West and Midwest, announced that the strike had forced cancellation of all flights from midnight Sunday at least through midnight Monday, saying that to give into the pilots' demands would bankrupt the airline.

A total of 1,086 members of the Air Line Pilots Association struck Continental Saturday when negotiations held under federal mediation in Washington D.C., fell through on attempts to

work out a new contract to replace one that expired last November.

No new talks were scheduled.

Pilots, who currently earn \$38,200 a year with 12 years experience and a DC10 captain's status, are demanding a pay increase to \$79,200 annually.

"The pilot negotiating committee has made demands that would surely bankrupt the airline and has refused to bargain in anything approaching a reasonable manner," said Robert S. Six, chairman of the board for Continental.

"I can only hope that they will change their attitude before the strike goes on so long that irreparable damage is done to Continental and to its 9,000 other employees and their families," he said.

Negotiators for the pilots claim Continental's salaries are about 20 per cent less than the industry average. They also want to reduce the number of landings and takeoffs a pilot can make each day, which negotiators said could be accomplished with a 12 per cent increase in the number of pilots. The airline, however, said they would have to hire an additional 21 per cent to meet the demand.

The strike is the first to hit Continental in its 42-year history. The airline serves 31 cities and carries an average of 21,000 passengers and a million pounds of freight daily.

During the investigation of this missing person I have come the conclusion that the possibility of foul play in the disappearance of Denise Lynn Oliverson is very real. Sgt. Frazier has authorized an APB to surrounding states. I have checked with most of the people who knew her well and no one has seen or heard from her since her disappearance.

before

A bicycle was found under the 5th Street viaduct one day after the report of her disappearance was made to the Police Department. MSR # on this found property is 4 183. An Engineer passed Officer Fraser in a train while the officer was recovering the bicycle and stated that the bicycle had been there approximately one day and that he had seen some clothing and some shoes sitting on the seat of the bicycle. He returned to that spot at a later time and the mentioned items were gone. Officer Fraser advised me that he had found a brown - tannish colored cloth belt - looked like a girl's belt - laying 20 to 30 feet away from the bicycle. Officer Fraser does not recall what happened to that belt. It seems as though the girl was an avid drug user, possibly harder marijuana. She was also seeing a psychiatrist for an unknown period of time, possibly two years. She is perhaps unbalanced and is very gullible.

From a statement from Mr. Joe Oliverson he has known her to use drugs in the past and she might have just taken off. However, her record in the past one year it would not seem to be like her. The possibility of her just taking off, I feel, is slim. Unless, of course, she were pressed very hard. She may have been pressed very hard by Steve Romero who had apparently just moved in as a protection measure against a Fat Aragon. I don't believe Romero's motives were entirely for that of protection against someone's entering a maliciously, but rather simply a way to get into the house Oliverson from all appearances has had a good relationship with Romero until recently when she stated to Parish that she did not want him there any longer. However, he still resides at 1619 Laveta. Also Oliverson's dog, Toma, is still at that residence with Mr. Romero.

In an interview with Romero he appeared quite broken up and concerned about Oliverson. However, he refused to allow me to look through the house for something which might give me a lead in this case. Perhaps Oliverson's parents can gain his cooperation and be of some help. They state that she might have had some personal papers, letters or the like that could be helpful. The papers on her bicycle, purchased four or five years ago from an unknown individual, should among those papers.

In an interview with Mr. Romero, who goes by the name of Steve, he stated that Oliverson has been missing for some 5 days at the time of the interview which took place at approximately 1700 hours on 28 May 1975. He stated that they gone to the park and had seen persons whom he didn't know (Gallegos). Steve stated after going through the park, they had gone to several different places in the downtown area just looking around and had returned home. He stated that she had been upset because the person in the park would not talk to her, and she had also stated to him that she could not talk to him about it. She was also upset about that person in the park getting married and her not knowing about it and just "finding out" about the marriage. She had been attached to Mr. Gallegos at one time. Her relationship with Mr. Gallegos had an intimate one. When they got home, she said she was going for a bicycle ride. She said she would stop at her mother's house before returning home. Mr. Romero stated that he has not seen her since. He also stated that when she left that night she was wearing a new pair of Levi's, a long sleeved shirt with green indian patterns on it and red wood sandals.

Mr. Romero stated that he had gotten out of the Army last June 1974 and had come out as a refrigeration specialist. He told me that Oliverson had been writing to a person named John Henry Marchese who is serving time in Canon City, Colorado. State Penitentiary for armed robbery which occurred in our city. That information is being checked out. Marchese having received any letters from Denise Oliverson in April or May of this year. Mr. Turnbow will contact me concerning this information. Mr. Romero also advised me that she had several friends, one by the name of Joanie. He didn't know her last name - a Sandy - last name unknown - Violet - last name unknown. (In talking with John Dunlap, manager of the Whatever Bar, who also knows Violet, he believes that Violet's boyfriend works at M & I Counter Top. It goes by the first name of Cliff. Mrs. Dunlap is a friend of Oliverson's. Romero said Oliverson knew a girl by the name of Marie Parish. I have interviewed Parish.

Parish states that Romero is a very moody person and flies off the handle easily. When talking to him over the phone one time, she had advised him that she would tell her parents if she found out anything about Denise and he had become very mad and informed Parish that she would tell him about it before she told the parents.

At this time Steve Romero is working at County Court under supervisor John Esquibel. He is working through the WIN Program and has talked to District Attorney Jerry Cooper several times. I have not been able to talk to Cooper as yet, however, an interview with Cooper is forthcoming.

Additional information: Concerning the disappearance of the Oliverson girl, Mr. Nicholson stated that on the morning after her disappearance an unidentified person called the house early in the morning and asked if Denise were there. Mr. Nicholson replied "no" and asked the caller to identify him or herself. That person hung up without answering. The next morning - that being a Tuesday - the same person called again and asked if Denise Oliverson were there. Mr. Nicholson again replied, "No, she is not." Mr. Nicholson again asked who was calling, and this time the caller said, "This is Steve." (That being Romero.) That same morning Romero had stated to Nicholson over the phone that she had been hurt by the car. This could be speculation on Nicholson's part because he is very upset about his daughter. This officer believes that Romero may have had something to do with the girl's disappearance.

On the 07th of April 1975 the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad called the Grand Junction Police Department - caller is unknown at this time - and advised the Department that there was an abandoned yellow Coast to Coast 10 speed bicycle under the 5th Street viaduct up close to the railroad tracks. At that time Officer Lew Fraser, ID #438, was dispatched at 0848 hours on the morning of the 07th to that area. He found the bicycle and a brown cloth belt - a more tannish-color - rolled up and probably 20 feet away from the bicycle. Officer Fraser does not recall what he did with the belt. The bike was taken to the Old City Shops to be stored marked as "unknown owner". To this date I have not been able to find that bicycle in the Old City Shops storage area. An MSR #4 183 was completed.

NOTE: The bicycle had a chain lock on it. The chain had plastic covering, color unknown.

Contact and interview of railroad engineer who had found the Oliverson bicycle under the 5th Street bridge viaduct near the railroad tracts.

Interview #1: Wilbur M. Class, 2931 North Avenue, Space #28, 242-0121. At approximately 0730 hours to 0800 hours on the morning of the 7th of April 1975, Mr. Class noted a yellow bicycle, he thought it was a 10 speed, leaning against a pillar of the 5th Street viaduct. He said it had snowed that night and the bicycle was sitting there with some shoes - looked like sandals - on the seat. I showed Mr. Class the shoes that we had found where the bicycle had been located and he identified them as those he had seen on the seat of the bicycle. The same shoes had previously been positively identified by Steve Romero as those of the missing person. Mr. Class stated that on the previous day - the 6th of April 1975 - the bicycle had not been there; meaning to this officer that perhaps Mr. Class overlooked the bicycle that day which he felt he surely did not do, or that someone may have put the bicycle there in the dark hours of the evening or the early morning hours April 6/7.

Interview #2: Lloyd Partridge, 2876 Pinyon, 242-5920. Mr. Partridge stated that it had snowed that night and he had seen the bicycle parked with a pair of wooden shoes on it. That bicycle had not been there the day before. He stated that he had seen the bicycle about 0800 or 0830 on the morning of the 07th of April 1975, and it had not been there the day of the 6th of April 1975.

Interview #3: William Boyd Schultz, 1409 Mesa Avenue, 242-3392. Mr. Schultz stated that he had seen the bicycle at approximately 0730 or 0800 with the shoes on the seat. The bicycle had not been there the day before - 06 April 1975.

From the officer's point of view - report made on 08 April 1975 by missing person's father, Mr. Nicholson, and not Steve Romero, the victim's boy friend. Why this is I do not know at this time. Mr. Romero - I presume - is to be run a polygraph examination through it. Smith and Sgt. Frazier of the Grand Junction Police Department. Another speculation; on the 5th she was supposed to have been missing, and on the 6th was supposedly the last time any one had seen her. I believe there is some confusion of the dates 5th and 6th; that being the 5th the day she disappeared and the 6th as well. Our report shows the 5th being the day she disappeared.



Police look for missing woman



DENISE OLIVERSON

A 24-year-old Grand Junction woman missing since April 6 has become the focus of a intensive investigation by city police.

Police report no leads in the disappearance of Denise Lynn Oliverson, 1619 La Veta, who was last seen riding a bicycle from her residence at 3 p.m. April 6.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert D. Nicholson, of 801 Ouray, reported her missing April 7 after a friend of the woman said she had been on her way to Lincoln Park. On that day police found Mrs. Oliverson's bicycle and shoes under the Fifth Street bridge near railroad tracks, but have been unable to come up with any leads since.

Capt. Robert Burnett said today the

Colorado Bureau of Investigation was asked to provide assistance this month in distributing information concerning her disappearance to police agencies through the western state area.

He said a number of interviews with friends and relatives of Mrs. Oliverson have failed to turn up any clues.

According to her father, she had planned to stop at her parents home before or after a trip to Lincoln Park. He could give no reason for her disappearance.

Nicholson said he contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation for assistance after she was reported missing, however, was told they will not become involved unless there is indication of death resulting from foul play, kidnap-

ping, or extortion.

According to the CBI bulletin she is described as 5'4" tall, with long brown hair and blue eyes. She was last seen wearing blue jeans and an Indian print blouse.

Mrs. Oliverson was graduated from Grand Junction High School in 1968 and employed at Dixon Inc. as an assembler in 1974.

She was divorced following a short marriage in 1972.

Persons with information concerning her disappearance are asked to contact the police.

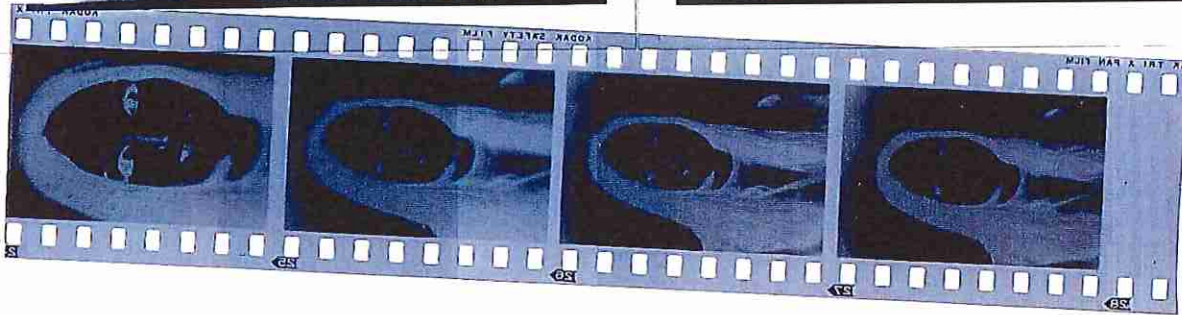

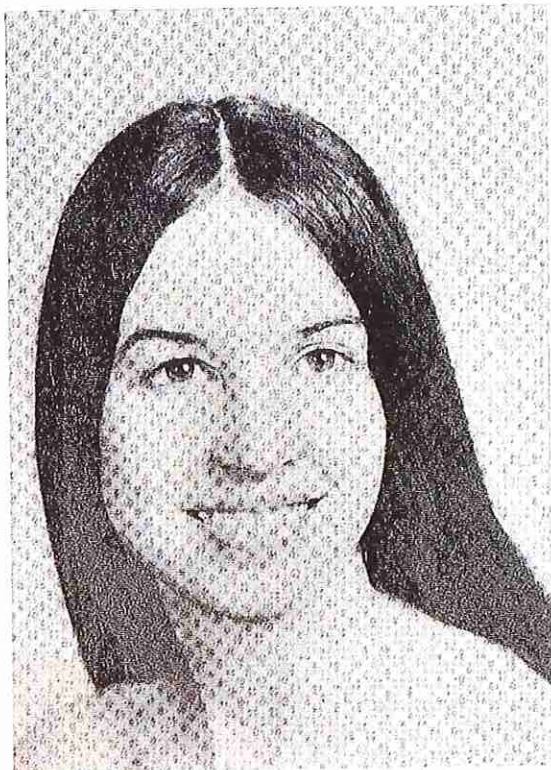

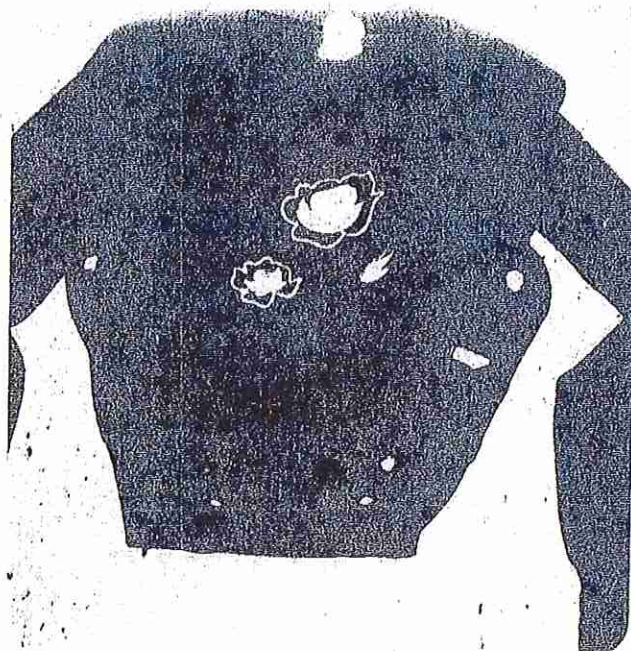
UNIDENTIFIED BODY

The body was found about 84 feet from an oiled road in a mountain canyon, next to a stream in a wooded area.

The victim had a nylon stocking tied around her neck and also a necklace chain. She was wearing a ring with a yellow stone and had a rubber band around her wrist. The cause of death was listed as multiple head injuries with a skull fracture and strangulation. She had also been sexually molested.

The victim had apparently been murdered somewhere else and dumped at the scene. Because of the time involved from the time she was last seen and the time of death, there is a good possibility she might have been held somewhere for several days. The victim was known to hitchhike and to play around with narcotics in a small amount. She was also a habitual runaway.

Her nude body was found October 27, 1974, in a mountainous area in Summit County, just east of Salt Lake City. She was found in the heavy scrub oak up a hill approximately 50 yards from a newly cut in road.

One of her dark blue nylon stockings was tied around her neck. A necklace she had been wearing was still on her neck. No other clothing has been found. Her fingernails had been painted and were in very good condition. She had been beaten around the head and had numerous bruises, contusions, etc. on her back, buttocks, and legs. The victim had apparently been murdered somewhere else and dumped here. The cause of death was listed as multiple head injuries with a skull fracture and strangulation and had apparently been raped.

She was believed to have been dead about 48 to 72 hours prior to being found, this leading investigators to believe she might have been held somewhere for several days. She has been known to hitchhike and play around with narcotics in a small amount.

In an interview with Mrs. Jordan she indicated that she had first met Ronald Erik Harris who was using the name of Erik Mountainhorse through a girl friend of her's, LeAnn Lafferty. LeAnn Lafferty and Victoria Jordan obtained their master's degrees together, and it was only through this acquaintance that Victoria Jordan ever came into contact with Erik Mountainhorse.

On September 29, 1974 LeAnn Lafferty and Erik Mountainhorse came to the Jordan residence at 117 Mantey Heights Drive and spent the night at that address, leaving the next morning. During the course of the evening Erik Mountainhorse in the company of LeAnn Lafferty and also Victoria Jordan went to the Nancy Taylor residence, 105 Mantey Heights Drive, where Nancy Taylor bought a large amount of jewelry from Erik Mountainhorse to sell in the Aspen Store. At the time Erik Mountainhorse was in the Jordan residence in September of 1974 he had a mustache but not a beard. He came only with LeAnn Lafferty. He had not brought his daughter. He was driving a Volvo owned by LeAnn Lafferty. Mrs. Jordan also indicated that she thought Erik Mountainhorse also had a truck; and the Erik Mountainhorse had said that he was pulling horses and would be back over in a couple of weeks for the hunting season. While at the Jordan residence Erik Mountainhorse met two other individuals: Mary Mansfield, husband Gary Mansfield, who live on East Orchard Mesa, and Sally Obergfeld, whose husband is a realtor in Palisade Erik Mountainhorse gave the impression that he had a master's degree and that he had worked in a clinic, a mental health clinic in the Phoenix area and that he was a phycologist. At the time of his visit at the Jordan residence his hair had grey streaks and it was a medium length-slightly below the ears.

According to Vickie Jordan Erik Mountainhorse called Nancy Taylor on other occasions and tried to sell her more jewelry; however, Nancy Taylor told Jordan that she did not want anymore to do with Erik Mountainhorse.

The jewelry Erik Mountainhorse sold he sold as Indian -made. The only other information the Jordan could give about Erik Mountainhorse was that he was kind-hearted, that he had a lot of warmth, but she didn't trust him.

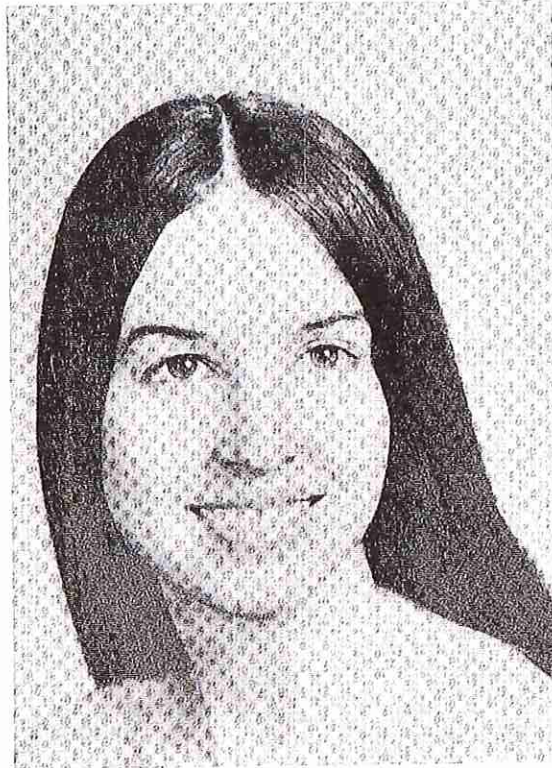

 Mr. Lopaz stated to me in an interview on this date that he had read the article in the Daily Sentinel on the 24th of J 1975 and that it was he who had found the bicycle and shoes under the 5th Street viaduct and had placed that bicycle and pair of shoes against the pillar. Mr. Lopaz did not remember the day that he found these two items there; however, he say the time was approximately 6 o'clock in the evening. He stated that while switching an engine he had seen the bicyc and the shoes laying across the railroad tracks under the 5th Street viaduct. Mr. Lopaz picked the bicycle up and place it against the pillar and the shoes he placed on the bicycle seat. When asked to describe the bicycle and shoes, Mr. Lo answered that to the best of recollection the bicycle was yellow and the shoes were sandals, brown in color. Mr. Lopaz told me that he found the bicycle with the front wheel pointing north, laying across one rail of the far south railroad track. Both sandals were found between the two rails of the same track, one on the east side of the bicycle and one on the west side of the bicycle. Mr. Lopaz said that at that time he did not see anything else present. He did not take notice of anything indicating a struggle having taken place in the area. Records of the railroad department were checke and they showed that Mr. Lopaz had reported finding the bicycle and shoes on April 6, 1975. One other person was with Mr. Lopaz at the time of his finding the bicycle, that person is being sought so he may be interviewed. Mr. Lopaz told me that at the time of finding the bicycle and shoes he had not seen anyone in the immediate area; he saw noone walking, he saw noone standing or sitting in any of the places that would have been associated with the bicycle; and he said that in his opinion the bicycle had not been on the tracks very long as it probably would have been removed by someone else.

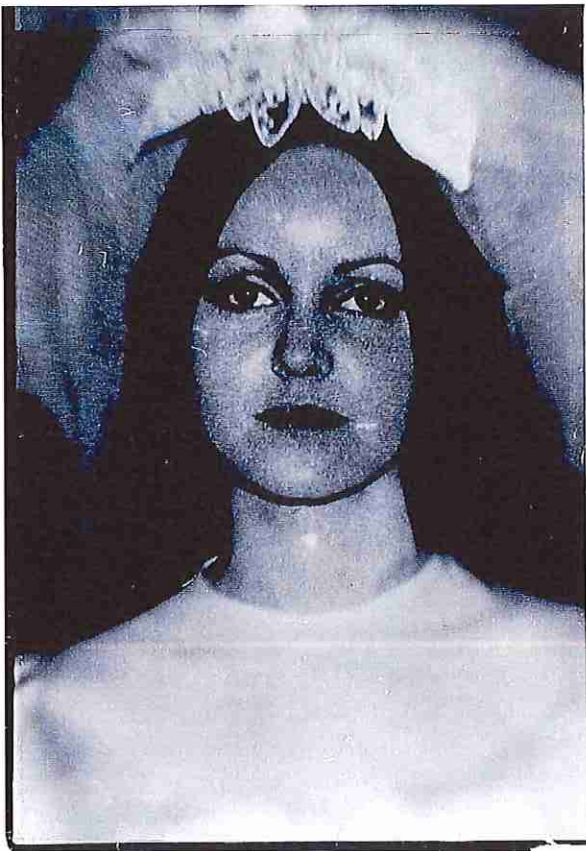

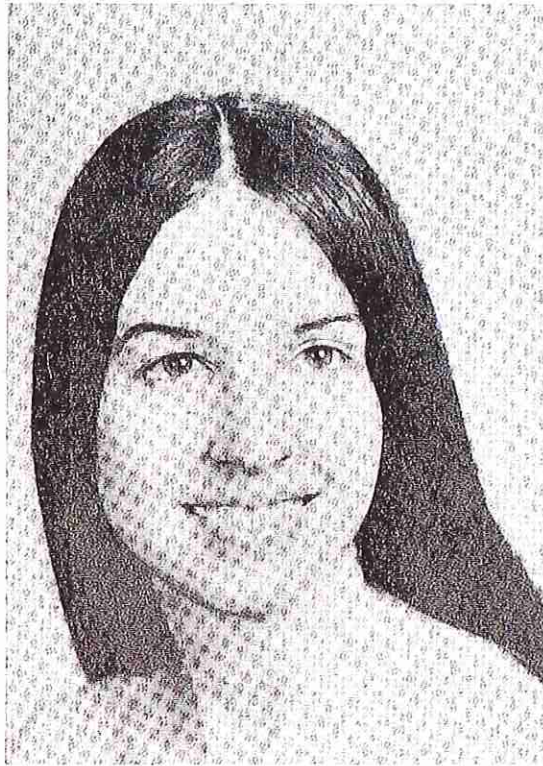

Another area you might try for location of body of Denise Oliverson is "Further north and a little further east than the 4 recent bodies were to the southeast. Could be where Roan Creek comes into the Colorado River in Debeque Canyon." This sounds more logical to me. Friend who provided this information was correct on the fact that all 4 missing people (Botham & Miracles) would be found dead, and in the same place, not scattered around, and their direction was southeast of Grand Junction, although friend was way off on distance from Grand Junction. Friend was wrong on the element the 4 dead people would be found in, but acknowledged making a mistake in the initial analysis, and later corrected it to water. But friend feels "watery death, watery grave" is correct for Denise. (It isn't going to hurt to check this out; God knows you might find someone else's body).

Some food for thought in regard to suspect(s) in Botham-Miracle deaths: Friend believes there are two suspects, with one suspect more deliberate and would be inclined to set the "stage" beforehand. This deliberate-thinking suspect is described by friend as: strong constitution, loves food, thick neck, very stubborn, fond of possessions, likes music, may have some musical talent. Pleasant singing voice, can't hold onto money. Derives his income from "communications". Job is unique--complex--something the average person is not geared to do; involves a specialty. Could be in electric or electromagnetic field. Could be said to work "behind the scenes." Versatile where type of job is concerned. Puts much thought and time and money into his hobbies....can also make money with them. Moves around in his job and hobbies...longer distances, not just a few blocks. This suspect might be found through his work, eventually. Looks as though he was getting ready to leave G.J. area. His departure route would be southeast, past the area where the bodies were recovered.

Friend believes a second suspect is involved, described as nervous, impulsive, daring-type as opposed to the methodical one. Friend states that, as grim as it may be, deaths were result of drowning.

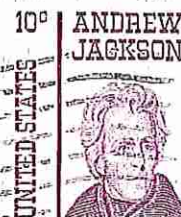
Partnerships create problems for the methodical suspect (the one who methodically anchored everyone to the bottom of the river) and the mate of this suspect shows a violent death. Friend emphasizes that this suspect, or both of them, will be caught. Car(s) involved in the 4-person murder: one may be red & white; one is "different" than ordinary. The bottom of one may be painted and the top may be like a sportscar, collapsible or something like this.

I am enclosing a copy of what friend had to say about the Botham-Miracle case before the bodies were found. I summarized friend's errors and non-errors. Will forward small slip of info to Sher. Rogue, as I believe the Roan Creek-area, falls into his jurisdiction.

Keep plugging, you'll bust this one. Friend says the case will be solved. Hope you can tie the rope suspect used on victims around his own neck, along with the type of knots used, and possibly fibers from the rope...home, vehicle, etc.---kick Jenett in the butt and tell him to get to work.

The following information may be incorrect, of no value. However, the impression I have is that the case is not solved (newspapers) and you have nothing. Nothing from nothing is nothing, so take a look at this and do what you want. A copy sent to Sher. Hogue, Glenwood.

Denise kidnapped....is dead...car involved, possibly red, darker shade of red---sex victim. Browning involved, or watery grave. Location of body: along direction of Rifle and Silt; shows possibly a location veering north of Silt in direction of Elk Creek (on Colo. map). Description of location where body might possibly be: Low, damp valley between hills...land where there are bogs, hot springs, swamps, stagnant water, muddy ground. Body may "travel" after death, such as being washed into a place other than where life left it. BODY WILL BE FOUND.

SUSPECT: Either looks or is older person. Melancholy, not liked by acquaintances & has few friends. His description: homely features, swarthy complexion, dark, thin hair, "spare" build, eccentric, superficial type of person. Likes to move around. Wins & loses money---"feast or famine"---Suspect would have chest & stomach ailments...especially chronic stomach ailments.

Location of suspect: May now be around or slightly south of Grand Junction. Question: Are you sure this case has not been solved? This suspect could now be in custody for this crime or some other. Suspect has been in trouble with law before.

Suspect's work, interests, etc.-----His work is not steady; moves around a lot. Could have to do with "domestic" duties, or around water (dishwasher?) Interests would be entertainment, especially sports, gambling, racing, maybe car racing.

Suspect with perverted sexual habits in regard to young people. Work seems to be of a "hobby"...he "leans on others" for his income. Music ability. "Inferior" to Denise. Denise also interested in sports and they may have had a slight acquaintanship by this.

Friend believes that more than one person abducted missing persons. Auto was involved. My friend is working on color description of auto plus better pin-pointing of area where missing persons are located, but you will find some info on this within this analysis. Appears abductees left initially of their own accord, however brief, but after this, force was used on them. There was no apparent immediate fear of abductor(s). People who abducted persons live in or west of Grand Junction. One man (abductor) considered a very good family friend of Patricia and/or Ken. All indications point to violence for Patricia. Friend of mine says if pressed for an answer to the question of whether missing persons are alive or dead, friend would have to say they are dead. "Where they are, they will stay a long time. Their deaths are no accident, other people deliberately did this. All victims are together in a grave...buried, not drowned or in water, but in the earth. This does not eliminate a cave, but they would be covered with earth...covered up." A nicked - 1960 or as a nick name or alias.

One assailant described as a nervous-type person, thin lips. Another person described as "brainy", always thinking, fighter instinct, pioneer instinct, trail-breaker. There is some kind of eye trouble, possibly color blind, in regard to one of the suspects....has malady in regard to face, possibly pock-marks, acne, etc.) One suspect would have combination of letters "ar" in full name, on birth certificate, or as a nick name or alias.

Patricia appears to have brought on her own death by her own actions. Linda was apparently pulled into this situation through some type of relationship with Patricia. Long distance travel where missing persons are located, believed to be east of Durango in area of Bayfield, Valencia Dam, Chimney Rock, Indian Reservation....pin-pointing still being worked on. This location shows barren, thorny, fallow ground, possibly where cattle are kept...cellars, deep pits, old churches, caves, vaults, tombs, cemeteries, etc. Case is not one which will remain unsolved. It will come to light but not before Dec. 11, at approx. time, something definite will be solved. Was Patricia plump? Abduction...what was shiny red glow look. What color hair?

Mr. ROMERO was examined at the Mesa County Sheriff's Department.

PROCEDURE: Standard polygraph technique was exercised throughout this examination.

ADVISEMENT AND RELEASE: Mr. ROMERO voluntarily signed both forms reference his rights and polygraph waiver.

HEALTH OF TESTEE: He stated he was in good health.

PRE-TEST INTERVIEW: Mr. ROMERO stated that on Sunday, 4-6-75, himself and DENISE went and purchase her some shampoo from a drug store on North Avenue. He stated they then went to the park and saw several friends. He stated that DENISE and himself just messed around town. He stated they then went home, when she advised him she was going to go for a bike ride. She got her bike out from the front room and left approximately 3:30 p.m. She advised him (Steve) she was going to go by her parents home before coming back. He stated that is the last time he saw her. He stated that he doesn't know where she is. He didn't harm her. He feels that something bad has happened to her.

RESULTS: Romero was given two tests containing the following questions:

Test #1

1. Your true first name Raymundo? Yes.
2. Did you eat today? Yes.
