Kohberger Paypal OneDrive

In an attempt to locate further online accounts or online service providers utilized by Bryan Kohberger, I began previewing the data forensically acquired from the desktop computer seized from the residence of Bryan Kohberger, located at [REDACTED], Pullman, Washington.

On this device I located references to both Paypal and OneDrive.

Paypal is a commonly used financial service and Paypal reports its services as a "financial technology company operating an online payments system in the majority of countries that support online money transfers, and serves as an electronic alternative to traditional paper methods such as checks and money orders." This service could be linked to additional accounts or show potential transactions important to the case.

Internet artifacts were located on the computer with the following URLs referring to Paypal:

OneDrive is owned by Microsoft and is reported by Microsoft to be "a file hosting service operated by Microsoft. First launched in August 2007, it enables registered users to share and synchronize their files. OneDrive also works as the storage backend of the web version of Microsoft Office." This service could be linked to additional accounts or show potential transactions important to the case.

The OneDrive app appeared to be installed and set to autorun on the computer. The program appeared to be installed at the following location on the computer:  
C:\Program Files\Microsoft OneDrive\ [REDACTED]  
And appeared to be listed in the Startup Items folder:  
C:\Program Files\Microsoft OneDrive\OneDrive.exe

The artifacts located showed OneDrive software was set to run after a reboot/start of the computer. And the program appeared to be last run on November 28, 2022.

The URLs located seem to refer to a specific "resid":

I sent an email to Microsoft in an attempt to clarify if the "resid" was a unique identifier to the user's OneDrive account, but have not received a response at the time of this report.

The OneDrive artifacts also included SharePoint links to URLs, which included references to Washington State University:

Microsoft states Sharepoint "empowers teamwork with dynamic and productive team sites for every project team, department, and division. Share files, data, news, and resources. Customize your site to streamline your team's work. Collaborate effortlessly and securely with team members inside and outside your organization, across PCs, Macs, and mobile devices."

From my training and experience I know cloud-based storage, like OneDrive, can contain files not located on local computers, hard drives, or other storage media. These files could be created entirely online or moved to the cloud storage and then deleted from the local device. Because of this, I am requesting a warrant to Microsoft OneDrive to identify any accounts used by Kohberger and request the located data within the account be provided to assist in the investigation. This is to include all accounts linked by recovery email, cookie, Microsoft IDs, creation IPs or phone numbers associated with these known identifiers associated with Kohberger:

I also know the online payment service Paypal was referenced and appears to have been utilized on the computer, I am requesting a warrant for Paypal for data related to the following account identifiers, which have been previously known to be used by Kohberger, between June 23, 2022 and December 31, 2022:
