Vehicle Test Runs and Glove Collection-157

3. Narrative

At approximately 1700 hours on 11/24/22, I took the MPD school car, a silver Ford Fusion, and drove the route of the suspect vehicle. I drove two separate routes in front of the camera located at [REDACTED] Ridge Road, once westbound on Lauder Avenue and then twice on Ridge Road, southbound and northbound. I advised the command post of the times of these runs and requested the video from the point of contact at [REDACTED] Ridge Road in order to compare the color of the test vehicle to that of the suspect vehicle.

Once I completed these runs, I drove to 1122 King Road and walked the route M [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] stated she took while on foot near the house on 11/13/22. I also parked the MPD school car on Queen Road immediately to the east of 1122 King Road in order to observe the effects of the orange-tinted street lights located in the area. The lights appeared to make the silver vehicle look tanner in color than it would under white street lights.

I also walked down and spoke to OFC Tesdahl who was providing scene security at this time. I spoke to OFC Tesdahl for a moment and then began to walk back to my patrol vehicle. As I did so, I noticed a black glove laying in the parking lot approximately 25 feet from the front door. The glove was laying palm-up and appeared to have been laying in that spot for a couple of days as it did not have any snow on it. I nudged the glove with the toe of my boot and found it was frozen to the ground. I asked OFC Tesdahl for rubber gloves and his flashlight. Upon further examination, there appeared to be a dark, fluid like substance on the glove. This substance's color and consistency was consistent with dried blood. OFC Tesdahl provided me with an evidence bag and I collected the glove as

evidence. The glove is a "Polar Penguin" brand glove with a rubberized palm and fingers. This type of glove is often used for concrete work. I brought the glove back to MPD and booked it into MPD evidence for submission to the state lab.

The videos of the vehicle test runs were later collected and added to the FBI video files for this case.
