When she left the bus station and individual had honked and waved at her to come over to his car. He then demanded that she get into the car which she refused to do.</p> <p>I contacted Mrs. NAEGLE by telephone. She stated that the vehicle involved was a Sting Ray. The individual was in his mid-30's or early 40's. He had dark brown hair, conservative style, approximtely medium length, a round face and was very attractive.</p> <p>Mrs. NAEGLE stated that she reported this to the Salt Lake City Police at that time however she could not remember the exact date.</p> <p>I then contacted a Mrs. Kathy TATTON at [REDACTED] who is a daughter of Mrs. GIBSON. This is where Mrs. NAEGLE stayed while she was in town. Mrs. TATTON stated that Mrs. NAEGLE was at her residence on August 13, 1974 and that this incident occurred sometime between 8 and 9:30 P.M.</p> <p>I contacted the Salt Lake Police Department in an attempt to locate the report on this incident and obtain the license plate number and the individual involved however at the writing of this report, I have been unable to locate the information through the Salt Lake Police Department.</p>

Ballantyne received a phone call from Chief Anderson indicating that a body had just been found in American Fork Canyon and he requested that we meet him at the State Medical Examiners Office.</p> <p>We arrived at 1125 hours on 11-27-74. At 12:05 P.M., the ambulance arrived from American Fork, being driven by Mr. Earl LOWE, from the Pleasant Grove ambulance and Fire Departments and also John FRAMPTON of the Pleasant Grove Police Department.</p> <p>The body was immediately taken to the coroner's office on the 5th floor of the University of Utah hospital where the body was photographed by the state medical examiner's office. Contact was made with Mr. Ted PREECE, the family dentist of the KENT family. Mr. PREECE brought the records accompanied by Detective Garner and Deputy HUNT, to the state medical examiner's office, where he examined the teeth of the victim and determined that this was not Debra KENT.</p> <p>Reporting officer then left.</p>

Reporting officer contacted a Mr. Darrell HESELTON at [REDACTED]. I inquired of him if he had purchased a Volkswagen from Eileen BLACK. Mr. HESELTON stated that he had in fact purchased the Volkswagen, pointing to a Volkswagen which was parked in the driveway of his residence.

Reporting officer observed this Volkswagen which had a light blue right front fender, a white right door and was rust colored on the rest of the vehicle.

In observing the front and rear seats of this vehicle, they were observed to be red plastic covers. The back seat was not torn.

Reporting officer inquired of Mr. HESELTON as to when he purchased this vehicle and he stated that he purchased it during the summer of this year. I inquired as to whether Miss BLACK or any of her friends had had any access to this car or had any occasion to use it since the time he purchased it and he stated that they have not, that it has been in his possession since that time.

Reporting officer inquired as to whether Mr. HESELTON knew anyone by the name of Ron AUTH. He stated that he did not know him nor had any idea who he was.

Mr. HESELTON'S description is as follows; 5'10", 165 pounds. Approximately 25 years of age, brown straight collar length hair. Wearing a mustache and has heavy bushy dark eyebrows. He also has acne on the face.

I then went to [REDACTED] attempting to locate anyone who might be acquainted with Eileen BLACK at this residence, which was at one time where she lived. I was unable to find anyone home in a four-plex apartment building at this address. I attempted to learn from the neighbors who the landlord was but the neighbors did not know him.

I located a name of LeRoy B. SCHARRGARRD who is presently living at the address of [REDACTED]. I then went to [REDACTED] and attempted to contact a Don J. BLACK however no one was home at that address. Reporting officer also returned to this address approximately 2 or 3 hours later and again found no one home. I observed a 1928 Model A Ford two door sedan, two tone light tan with dark tan fenders parked in the garage. Also observed was a red Volkswagen, license JJS 714 parked in front of the BLACK house. In observing this Volkswagen the seats were plastic. The rear seat was torn however there was no stuffing coming out of it.

It was also learned from the Provo City Police Department that Mr. BLACK is a Seminary teacher at the Orem High School.

Reporting officer then went to [REDACTED] and attempted to contact a

I returned to this address about two or three hours later and still found no one at home. I observed on the mail box that Timothy and Susan TAYLOR were listed [REDACTED] this being [REDACTED]

While there I did observe a red Volkswagen, JHC 446 parked in the parking lot east of the 5-A building. The front seats of this vehicle had terry cloth seats on. The rear seat had leather upholstery, however it was not torn on the top.

Reporting Officer, Sgt. Ballantyne went to the Rupp Jeep Sales, 4800 South Redwood Road and contacted Mr. Willy RUPP. We inquired of him as to whether he had sold a Jeep Wagoneer to a Mr. Ronald AUTH. Mr. RUPP stated that he had not however in checking his records he did state that he had sold it to a Jeffrey B. WELLS of [REDACTED] His vehicle is insured with Farmers Insurance Company, [REDACTED]

He stated that nothing was traded in on the wagoneer. He had purchased the vehicle on 11-15-74 putting a deposit of \$200.00 in cash and then taking possession of the vehicle on 11-16-74, paying the balance in cash for a total of \$2409.77.

Mr. RUPP stated that at the time that the individuals paid for this vehicle, they had a large roll of money in their pocket, both individuals having what seemed to be a large roll of money.

The vehicle in question is a 1970 Jeep Station Wagon four wheel drive, red tucked leather interior, serial 1414C19307246.

Mr. RUPP remembered both parties very well. In describing both individuals the dark headed one that he described, fits the description of Ronald AUTH, the second one, his roommate Jeffery WELLS.

Reporting officer received a phone call approximately 1930 hours on 11-30-74 from the Park City Police Department stating that Ronald AUTH and Eileen BLACK had just left Park City in the wagoner headed for Salt Lake City.

Reporting officer contacted Officer Stones and we immediately went to Salt Lake, going directly to Aggies Lounge where Eileen works. At the time that we arrived at this lounge, it was observed that the wagoner was parked at the front door.

We parked across the street at approximately 2000 hours. Mr. AUTH came out of the parking lot at Aggies, going west towards State Street. Reporting officer got hung up in a traffic light at 1st East. Mr. AUTH making a left turn south on State Street and by the time we got to State Street and turned south Mr. AUTH had approximately a block to a block and a half lead.

We got behind several vehicles and was unable to get around them. Mr. AUTH turning off at approximately 500 South westbound. By the time we got to 500 South we were unable to observe the vehicle any longer and was unable to locate it anywhere in the area.

Reporting officer and Officer Stones proceeded to Fashion Place Mall and remained there for approximately one hour however the vehicle in question did not show up at that location.

We then returned to Bountiful. Contact was made with Park City Police Department. They were advised that the individual had been lost in traffic. We requested that they watch and see if he did return to the area of Park City prior to returning with Miss BLACK.

At the writing of this report there is no further information.
