On 11/27/74 in the morning hours, I took VONNIE to Highline College and then at approximately 12:40 P.M., we went to Pacific Car & Foundry to pick up my truck which had broken down. It was an electrical problem. I drove the truck back and VONNIE followed in the car, and went home and parked the truck, then we went to the bank to cash my check and then returned home, which was about 2:30 P.M. She fixed dinner of pancakes and bacon, and after dinner we just sat in the living room and talked about what she was going to do the rest of the day, mostly house work. We also talked about Thanksgiving. As I was leaving for work at 4:00 P.M., VONNIE was in good spirits and happy. She walked me to the edge of the house. I kissed her and hugged her a couple of times. She said have a good day. I then got in my car and drove to work. I worked until lunch time which was between 8:30 and 9:00 P.M. I ate lunch in my car in the parking lot at Pacific Car & Foundry and returned to work at 9:00 P.M.

I left work at 1:00 A.M. on 11/28/74 and arrived home at 1:15 A.M. When I got home, I found the door unlocked, TV on and VONNIE gone. There was evidence that VONNIE was making a salad. After looking through the

When I got to TODD's house, I parked my car and walked to the garage, opened the small door there, went in and got the fan. On my way out I thought I had better see VONNIE and let her know that it was me in the back yard so she would not be scared. I walked to her door and looked in and saw VONNIE on the phone so rather than bother her I just left and went back to my car and then drove to West Seattle to my friend's.

On 11/25/74, a Monday, I came over to TODD's house to work on my car. This was about 5:00 P.M.; while I was there, VONNIE told me that she had received a phone call from a man who asked her if her husband was home. Without thinking, she told the man that he wasn't. She said that he wasked questions like when did her husband work and that he wanted to talk to her husband. She stated that when asked, the man would not say who he was, or what he wanted. VONNIE said that she then hung the phone up. TODD left for work approximately 3:45 P.M., and I came to TODD's between 5:30 and 6:00 P.M. then this man must have called sometime between. On 11/29/74, during the evening and after learning that VONNIE was missing, I talked to my girlfriend, CAROL BRITTENHAM. CAROL told me that she had talked to

I told her no, and then she said I will give you the number and you can make the call. At this time I opened the door and asked her where her car was. She stated, White Center, so I asked her what she was doing here. She said that she had been with a party who told me to put up or get out and I chose to get out. On 11/15/74, MR. TAYLOR asked me to come to the house as he wanted to talk to me. When I arrived MR. TAYLOR stated that he was going to break the lease as he stated he was moving to Everett for a better job and that he would rent a duplex for \$90.00. He felt bad about breaking the lease and he offered to buy some of my furniture. He purchased two beds, a brown refrigerator, Philco B/W TV, and a bookcase and chest of drawers, and daveno for \$215.00, but later put a stop payment on the check. 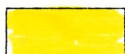

Court blocks extradition of murder suspect



Gary Addison Taylor

The Texas Court of Appeals yesterday temporarily blocked the extradition to Washington State of Gary Addison Taylor, 39, charged with first-degree murder here in the death of Vonnie Stuth, 19.

The court held that Taylor's lawyers were not given sufficient time to prepare their challenge of the legality of Taylor's arrest, the Associated Press reported.

King County Prosecutor Christopher T. Bayley said:

"We regard the decision as a temporary setback and will continue to press vigorously for extradition of Taylor as soon as possible.

"The Texas court has the final say, and

must be satisfied that all legal requirements are met before releasing him."

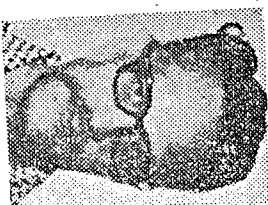
Taylor, an escapee from a Michigan mental institution, has been confined in the Harris County, Texas, jail since May 20 on \$340,000 bail. He is charged in Texas with multiple counts of sexual abuse and rape.

Mrs. Stuth vanished from her Burien home Thanksgiving Eve, 1974. Her body later was unearthed behind an Enumclaw home formerly occupied by Taylor. She had been shot in the head.

Taylor also is being investigated in other murders, including that of a Houston waitress and two women in Toledo, Ohio.

TEXAS COURT blocks Taylor extradition.

The Texas Court of Appeals yesterday blocked, for the time being, extradition to Washington State of Gary A. Taylor, charged with first-degree murder in the November, 1974, slaying of a South Seattle woman, Mrs. Todd



TAYLOR

(Vonnie) Stuth. Taylor, held since May by Houston police on charges stemming from sexual assaults on four women and a 16-year-old girl, appealed a June extradition order on grounds that his lawyers were not given sufficient time to prepare a challenge to the extradition request.

The court agreed, noting that a copy of the extradition warrant Taylor and his lawyer until minutes before the June 30 hearing. The warrant had been received by the Harris County sheriff on June 26. Deputy King County Prosecuting Atty. Phillip Killien, after contacting the district attorney's office in Houston, said a new extradition hearing will be held within a few weeks, hopefully in January. Court blocks extradition of murder suspect

The Texas Court of Appeals yesterday temporarily blocked the extradition to Washington State of Gary Addison Taylor, 39, charged with first-degree murder here in the death of Vonnie Stuth, 19.

The court held that Taylor's lawyers were not given sufficient time to prepare their challenge of the legality of Taylor's arrest, the Associated Press reported. King County Prosecutor Christopher T. Bayley said:

"We regard the decision as a temporary setback and will continue to press vigorously for extradition of Taylor as soon as possible."

The Texas court has the final say, and

must be satisfied that all legal requirements are met before releasing him."

Taylor, an escapee from a Michigan mental institution, has been confined in the Harris County, Texas, jail since May 20 on \$340,000 bail. He is charged in Texas with multiple counts of sexual abuse and rape.

Mrs. Stuth vanished from her Burien home Thanksgiving Eve, 1974. Her body later was unearthed behind an Enumclaw home formerly occupied by Taylor. She had been shot in the head.

Taylor also is being investigated in other murders, including that of a Houston waitress and two women in Toledo, Ohio.

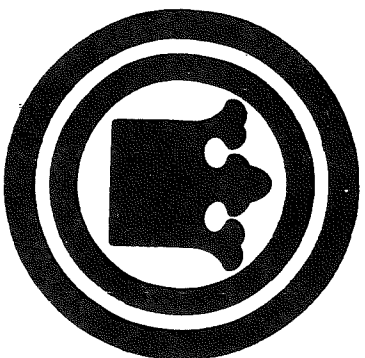

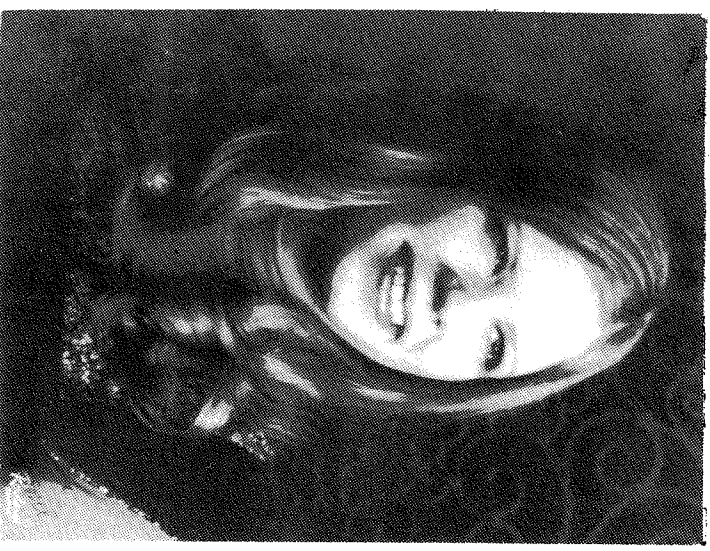

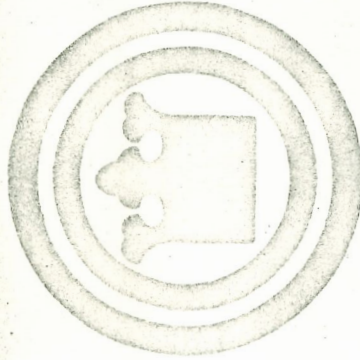

Attached is the information that we have regarding Gary A. Taylor's arrest record and criminal record, plus his medical reports while being detained in various Michigan State hospitals. Included also is a report compiled for us by the Royal Oak Police Department, Royal Oak, Michigan, on Taylor's background the last four or five years. 
A young woman named Vonnie Stuth has been missing from her Seattle area home since November 1974, and the circumstances warrant criminal investigation.

This letter is in regard to your telephone conversation with Sgt. Randall on December 27, 1974, when you discussed your son, Gary A. Taylor. At that time you were made aware of our investigation regarding the disappearance of a 19 year old woman, Vonnie Stuth. We have good reason to believe that Gary was one of the last people known to contact her before she disappeared. When we talked to Gary, he declined to discuss any aspects of the case. We were not accusing him of any foul play, as we had reliable information that he could assist us with our investigation.

During our last contact with Gary, he promised to appear within 24 hours to take a polygraph, which he never did. That was the last time we had contact with Gary or his wife.

Since that time, community interest has been generated by the media as it does in all cases of missing young women in Washington State. Enclosed are clippings from two Seattle papers explaining what I mean. Their information was obtained from sources independent of our department.

For these reasons, we are asking for your cooperation in reconsidering discussing your visit with Gary in Enumclaw over the Thanksgiving Holiday. Regarding our phone conversation on 12/11/74 reference our missing girl, Vonnie Stuth, and a possible suspect in her disappearance, Gary A. Taylor, our investigation is continuing although no new information has come to light since we last talked, linking Taylor to her disappearance. We have contacted Dr. Robey, the doctor, who treated Taylor from 1967 till 1973, and who is now in residency at Ann Arbor Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan - 313-429-2531. During our conversation with Dr. Robey, he was able to give us some insight into Taylor's background, but could not go into detail because of the doctor-patient relationship. Because of this, we have tried to get a court order for these medical records while he was confined in Michigan State, but our prosecutor states that under Washington State law, this is privileged information and cannot be obtained in this state. The prosecutor did state that there is a possibility that this report might be obtained in the State of Michigan. We are hoping that this report of some 800 pages might provide some clues in our case.

On 12/27/74, Det. Sgt. Randall made a phone call to Mr. Milo Taylor, Gary Taylor's father, who is now residing in Tucson, Arizona. Sgt. Randall explained our investigation to him and our suspicions about his son's involvement. Mr. Taylor at that time did not feel that he could be of any help to us, but it is our hope that he will contact his son and question him about this case, and in that way assist us now that he is aware of the seriousness of this case.

After Gary Taylor's release by us on December 6, 1974 because of lack of evidence in our case, he left immediately for Portland, Oregon. I contacted Det. John Wesson of Portland Police Department, and advised of our investigation and asked his assistance in locating Taylor, who we believed was in the Portland area. He called me later and advised that Mrs. Taylor was living in the Portland area in a rented home and that both of their vehicles were at this house. At this time, there was no sign of Gary Taylor. Since then we have discovered that Taylor has talked to the Department of Motor Vehicles in Salem, Oregon, possibly for new identification or a change of vehicle registration.

We have been in contact with Houston, Texas, who currently has in custody a Gary Addison Taylor regarding some homicides and sexual assaults in that city. We have obtained information from them that Gary Addison Taylor is also possibly involved in a homicide in your area in which he was apparently driving an orange colored Pinto vehicle. We have a homicide in our city which occurred in April of 1974, which we feel could be similar and would like more information from you regarding Gary Addison Taylor.

The homicide in our city occurred on the night of Wednesday, April 17, 1974 or the early morning hours of Thursday, April 18, 1974. The victim, Patricia Webb, white female, age 25, was working as a clerk in an Adult Book Store here in Lincoln, Nebraska. She was working alone and due to close the store at 0100 hours the morning of April 18, 1974. However, the manager found the store unlocked the following morning with approximately \$30 cash missing from the cash register and about 50 hard core pornographic magazines of the bondage type missing from the store. He could not find the victim, Patty Webb. Her body was found on April 20, 1974 on a farm approximately 15 miles south of Lincoln. Her body was completely nude except for a blue waist length jacket which was on her torso. Her mouth had been gagged with two inch adhesive tape wrapped around her mouth and neck. She had been shot seven times in the body with a .22 caliber long rifle weapon and four times in the head with a .25 caliber automatic weapon. The body was placed at the foot of a haystack and hay pulled down over her in an effort to hide the body.

An autopsy failed to show any supporting evidence of sexual assault. We have very good specimens of both the .25 caliber slugs and the .22 caliber slugs that were removed from the body. For comparison, we also have tire tracks which we feel were left by the perpetrator of the homicide. The tire tracks would be from a medium to small size vehicle. They have a 59 inch wide wheel track, which would fit with numerous small vehicles such as a 1965 Mustang.

We would appreciate any information you can give us regarding Gary Addison Taylor, the vehicle he was driving, what time period he was in your area, any weapons that may have been used and if the .25 or .22 caliber would fit in with your homicide.

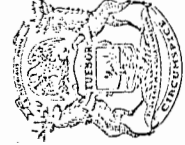

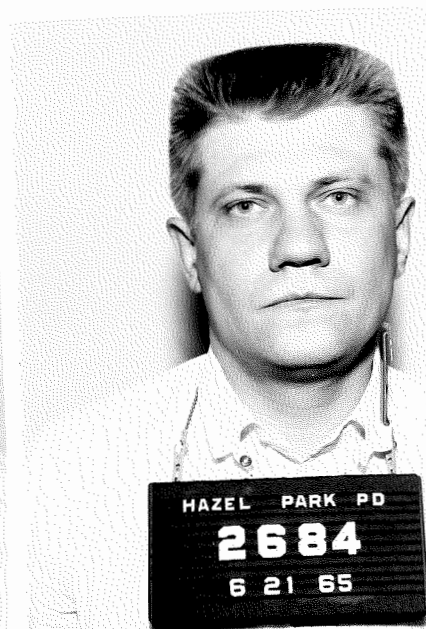

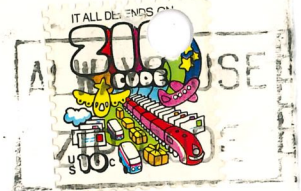

Gentlemen:

I would like to pass on to you an experience my 17 year old daughter had on about Monday, May 5th that may be of some use to you.

My daughter, Barbara, is a senior at Sealth High School. It was about 5:30 or 6:00 pm that she decided to walk down to school to get her tennis racket out of her school locker. As she walked through the parking lot of the West Seattle General Hospital, the lot west of the hospital on Holden street, she became aware of a man in a parked car staring at her. She described him as having dark colored, short hair, dark glasses; somewhere in the middle-age range. The car was a rather late model Olds or Pontiac, green in color. His manner made her uneasy so she kept watch on his activity out of the corner of her eye as she crossed Holden and started walking east towards 26th Ave. She thought she saw his car beginning to move so before she turned to go down 26th she looked again and saw he had left the parking lot and was on Holden Street coming in her direction. She quickly recrossed Holden, entered the hospital grounds by way of the entrance to the east side of the building and hid behind some shrubs. He followed her into the entrance of the driveway where he parked for a time. Apparently, unable to see any sign of her he left the grounds. She remained hidden for a time after his car left but saw no more of him when she left the grounds the second time.

Thursday, when the picture of Gary Taylor appeared in the Times, she came to me and said, "Mother, this looks just like the man I saw in the parking lot of the hospital." A case of mistaken

INVESTIGATION:

On this date at approximately 3:30 P.M., MR. WILLIAMS was contacted by phone to see if his records showed whether the TAYLOR'S had been off work in late January, 1974.

INFORMATION:

At this time, it was learned that GARY TAYLOR worked at one of the model homes by himself. He was not a licensed real estate salesman so the final sales were made by one of the licensed salesmen, but TAYLOR would do the preliminary selling at the model and was paid a salary by the company. A book was kept at all the models, and when a customer came in, they would sign their name. In checking the register book of the model that Taylor worked at for 1974, it was found that from January 27, 1974 until February 2, 1974, no one had registered at the home.

MR. WILLIAMS recalled that sometime during the latter part of January 1974, the Taylors had taken a few days off work. This was probably the reason for no customers at the model. He also remembers that the reason HELEN had given for being off work was that GARY had bursitis in his right arm and he had to go to the hospital every day for cortisone shots. He was unable to drive and Helen took off work to drive him there. Helen worked at the main office and not at the model with Gary. Both people were excellent employees and for this reason, MR. WILLIAMS paid them for the days they were off. During the period the Taylors were off work, they were not seen by Williams. Also, it is believed that the hospital he went to was in Adrian or Tecumseh. When TAYLOR returned to work, he had his right arm in a sling.

During the course of the conversation with Mr. Williams, I asked him if Taylor had ever talked about any type of cult or organizations. At this time he stated that TAYLOR was very well versed on Nazism and had a large collection of albums of Nazi marching music, and that he had mentioned many times about witchcraft and premonitions.

One of the things that stuck in Williams' mind about Taylor was the fact that during one of their conversations, Williams had mentioned that when he had been in Vietnam, the people over there had a type of ritual where if a person over there had murdered someone, they would bury the head in one place and the rest of the body in another. The reason for this was that if the head found the body, the dead person would come back and haunt the killer. TAYLOR was very interested in this and asked Williams about it several times afterwards.

NOTE: At the start of the interview, Mr. Williams was not informed of any of the information received from the Detroit News.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM MR. WILLIAMS:

The company was closed down from December 23, 1973 to January 10, 1974.

HELEN had left for Texas approximately 3 weeks before the incident with the prostitutes from Toledo occurred.

On November 14, 1972, HELEN got her builders license. On the application, she stated she had lived at 3739 Grass Lake Road, West Branch, Michigan for two years. She also stated on the application that prior to working at Royal Arbor Homes, she had worked for 5 years at Continental Motors, Detroit.

GARY applied for a real estate license and was turned down by the state on 2-26-74 because he withheld information on the application.

In October 1973, the woman from Ann Arbor, SANDY HORVATH, turned up missing after she had dated TAYLOR several times just prior to her disappearance. Also, in the same month TAYLOR told WILLIAMS that he had gotten stuck on one of the back roads out near his home in Onstead and had ruined the transmission in his truck.

In the latter part of 1973, the TAYLORS had a house warming party at their home in Onstead. GARY and HELEN got drunk and approached WILLIAMS with the idea of possible wife swapping, which WILLIAMS turned down. HELEN was asked about this later, and she stated it was GARY that liked this type of thing and she just went along with it because she wanted him to be happy.

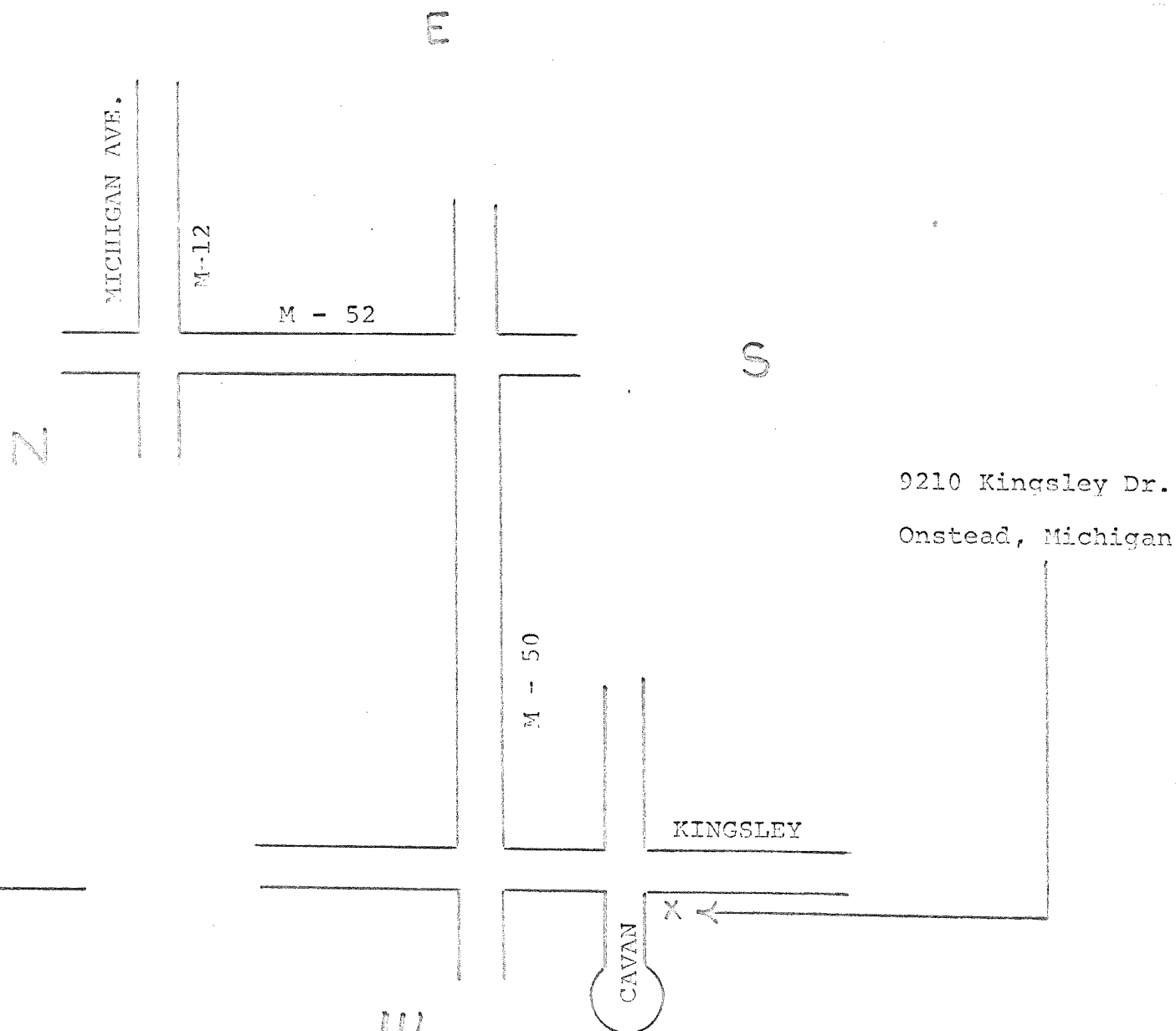

At this time he was questioned by Det. Stephenson in regard to Harris County Sheriff's Office Murder case on Susanne Jackson. Taylor was asked to make a statement in regard to the case and he made an oral confession to Det. Stephenson which he was asked to reduce to writing and he stated that he would. A written confession was taken by Det. Stephenson in the Jackson case. The confession was taken from 3:00AM to 4:20AM. At 4:20AM the confession was completed and signed by Taylor in front of witnesses. During the time the written confession was being taken the actor asked for and was given one package of cigarettes and three cups of coffee.

PROGRESS REPORT:

We, detectives Trimble and Baker, were assigned by Lt. Kersten to follow up on the below information.

I, Det. Trimble, received a phone call from Sgt. Schuelle of the Austin, Texas police dept. who stated that an informant had called him this date and stated that a Gary Taylor was supposed to be enroute from a machine shop somewhere in Houston to his place of residence at 1120 Robbie. Sgt. Schuelle further stated that Taylor was suppose to be driving a four door bronze Chrysler, Michigan license NMC 563. At the time Schuelle called he did not know whether or not Taylor was actually wanted by this dept.

The H.W.A.T. team was notified for their assistance in making a run on the above address.

Taylor stopped at the intersection of Studewood and Calvalcade and as he came to a complete stop unit 801 with officers R.S. Lobue, badge #2191, and W.E. Carmical, badge #124, stopped their patrol car in front of the actor. With the patrol unit in front of the actor and the det. unit in the rear I, det. 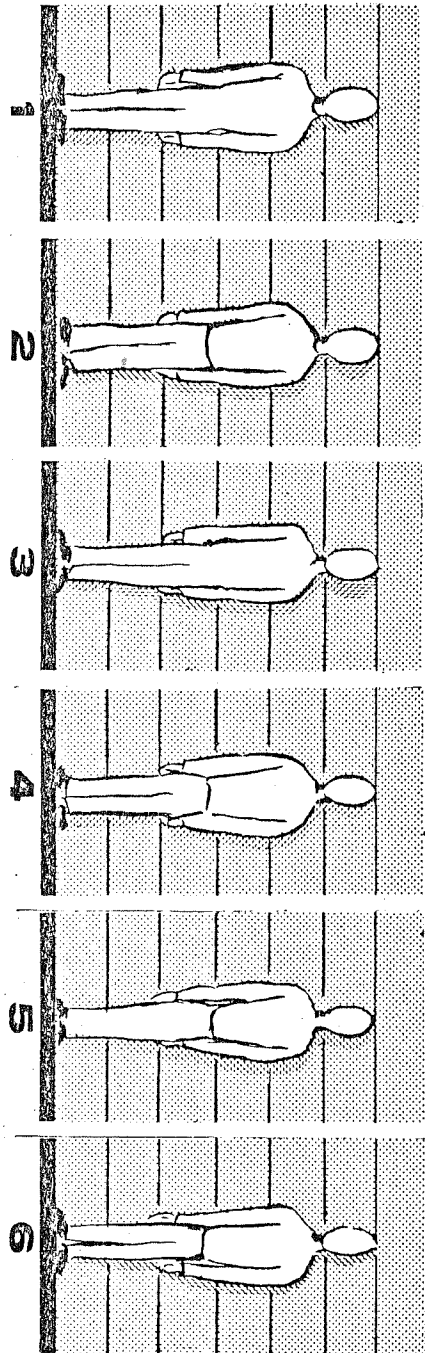

Statement of Garry Addison Taylor

I, Garry Addison Taylor,

have been warned by Carolyn Stephenson, the person to whom this statement is made that: (1) I have the right to have a lawyer present to advise me both prior to and during any questioning, (2) if unable to employ a lawyer, I have the right to have a lawyer appointed to counsel with me both prior to and during any questioning, (3) I have the right to remain silent and not make any statement at all and any statement I make may and probably will be used in evidence against me at my trial and (4) I have the right to terminate the interview at any time I so desire.

I fully understand all of these rights, and, desiring to waive all of them, I hereby make the following voluntary statement



AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

I, CAROLYN STEPHENSON, a Houston Police Officer, assigned to the Homicide Division, do solemnly swear that I have reason to believe and do believe that GARY ADDISON TAYLOR is presently secreting a criminal instruments, to-wit: a chrome revolver, small calibre with a "pearl-like" handle, and a large calibre blue steel revolver, at a location in Harris County, Texas, described as follows: 1120 Robbie, Houston, Harris County, Texas, the same being one unit of a single story duplex residential rental unit.

My reason for said belief is based upon the following facts and information which is known to me:

On March 11, 1975, Patricia Templeton was assaulted and made to perform oral sodomy on a White Male who she did not know. The said complainant told me that he threatened to beat her with two pistols which she described as a .22 or .25 calibre chrome revolver with "pearl-like" handles. She said that he also had a blue steel large calibre pistol which he threatened her with. All of this was told to your affiant by the said complainant, Patricia Templeton, on May 1, 1975. The same information was also told to J. Johansen a patrol officer making the scene of the assault on March 11, 1975, and as evidenced by his report #G-00790 which I have read.

Prior to May 1, 1975, your affiant had been investigating numerous assaults wherein the description and the motive of operation of the actor involved matched the facts in Patricia Templeton's case. In one of those cases, the complainant had obtained a license number from a motor vehicle. Your affiant upon checking registration of said vehicle determined that it was registered to GARY ADDISON TAYLOR and gave a Michigan address. A check with NCIC showed the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR to be wanted as an escapee from a mental institution in Michigan. Your affiant contacted the Police Department in Royal Oak, Michigan. Royal Oak, Michigan was the address which the plates came back to on the said vehicle obtained aforesaid. The Identification Bureau of the Royal Oak Police Department forwarded to your affiant a photograph of the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR, which was received in the Homicide Division of the Houston Police Department on May 1, 1975.

On May 1, 1975, Detective Terry Stark, with the Houston Police Department Homicide Division, displayed the said photograph, along with other photographs, to the complainants in numerous assault cases wherein the motive of operation was like the facts in the Templeton case. There were three (3) positive identifications of the photograph of the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR, which had been obtained aforesaid, and among those positively identifying the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR as the assailant was Ms. Templeton. This information was told to me that same date by the said Terry Stark, who is known to me.

Based upon the identification aforesaid, charges of sexual abuse were filed on the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR on said date.

At approximately 2:30 A.M. on May 20, 1975, Detective Trimble received a call from Austin, Texas Police Department who stated they had received information from an informant that GARY ADDISON TAYLOR was in Houston and was working at Best Industries and at this time should be leaving Best Industries enroute to his apartment located at 1120 Robbie Street in Houston, Harris County, Texas.

After receiving the telephone call from the Austin, Texas Police Department, Detective Trimble and other officers of the Houston Police Department began surveillance of the location of 1120 Robbie. At approximately 3:00 A.M., a White Male left the house and drove away in a 1973 Chrysler, White/Bronze bearing 1975 Texas License LPK-508. Detective Trimble later told me these facts and that he personally recognized the said TAYLOR from the photograph that had been sent from the Royal Oak, Michigan Police Department aforesaid. In the 2000 block of Studewood, the said vehicle and said occupant were stopped and arrested and the vehicle was taken to 61 Reinsner Street, where it is presently located.

The activities as described above by Detective Trimble were told to your affiant in the Homicide Division of the Houston Police Department on this date. I know Detective Trimble and know him to be a credible person.

WHEREFORE, I have reason to believe and do believe that the criminal instruments as alleged, i.e. the two pistols as described by Ms. Templeton and that were used in the sexual assault upon her person may be found in the said residence of the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR or in the vehicle he was arrested in as described above, and would ask that a warrant issue to search the said location and the said vehicle and to seize the said criminal instruments.



As noted in the report, Helen was reluctant to answer many questions already covered by Sergeant Demsky prior to my arrival. Not having known what he specifically queried her about, I found myself at a disadvantage in many areas as to what to pursue.


As previously advised, she was cooperative to a point, but defensive, and it was felt that it would not have taken much pressure on my part to have agitated her into terminating the interview. At this point in time, she was weary from the almost two hours of questioning by Sergeant Demsky.

Enclosed also are missing portions of Sergeant Demsky's transcription which were obtained from Attorney Meiser's tapes.

Page 16A occurs where it is noted as a change of tape on Page 16. Page 18A occurs where an interruption is noted on Page 18. Page 31A occurs at another tape change on Page 31. Page 33A occurs in the last paragraph on Page 33 after Mr. Reynolds says, "I want to apologize for being late."

Mrs. TAYLOR, the estranged wife of GARY TAYLOR, was interviewed in the law offices of Attorney FREDERICK A. MEISER, Jr., 1144 State Street, San Diego, California, telephone 239-8125. Present at the interview, besides Mrs. TAYLOR and R/O, was Detective Sergeant VINCENT J. DEMSKY of the Michigan State Police, and Mrs. TAYLOR'S attorney, FREDERICK MEISER. R/O arrived at the law offices of Attorney MEISER at approximately 7:00 p.m. on the noted date. Prior to the Investigator's arrival, Sergeant DEMSKY had been interviewing Mrs. TAYLOR in connection with various unsolved homicide cases in the Michigan area for approximately an hour and ten minutes before the arrival of this Investigator.

R/O, upon the conclusion of Sergeant DEMSKY'S questions, interviewed HELEN TAYLOR, with the interview beginning at approximately 8:00 p.m. on the noted date. The interview was terminated at approximately 8:45 p.m. Prior to the arrival of this Investigator, Sergeant DEMSKY had been conducting the interview with Mrs. TAYLOR reference her knowledge of the activities and travels of her and her husband, GARY TAYLOR, for the past 4 or 5 years. Mrs. TAYLOR was advised that this Investigator wished to speak with her concerning questions which had been requested by the authorities in Seattle, Washington, concerning her knowledge of the murder of VONNIE STUTH.

Mrs. TAYLOR advised this Investigator that much of the area and questions probably to be asked as to her knowledge while in the Seattle area, as well as her and GARY'S travels elsewhere, had already been covered by Sergeant DEMSKY prior to this Investigator's arrival. However, she would cooperate in listening to the questions, those of which had already been answered for Sergeant DEMSKY she would not repeat, but would respond in areas which may not have been covered during Sergeant DEMSKY'S interview. Mrs. TAYLOR felt that many of the questions might be redundant, and that she was extremely tired after having talked to Sergeant DEMSKY for several hours previous to the arrival of the Investigator.

The following answers provided by Mrs. TAYLOR will numerically correspond to the questions requested by the authorities in Seattle, Washington. The question will again be given here, followed by the answer given by Mrs. TAYLOR. In some instances the question may have already been covered, and it will be noted as previously answered with no further explanation as to that particular subject.

1. WHEN DID HELEN AND GARY COME TO SEATTLE? Previously answered. WHO CAME FIRST? Previously answered. WHY SEATTLE? Previously answered. In reference to this question, however, Mrs. TAYLOR advises that it was probably her fault. She had never been up in the Washington area and had always heard how beautiful it was, and if they had to go somewhere, why not there. WHY THE BURIEN AREA? Mrs. TAYLOR advises that not wanting to live in downtown Seattle, they looked for a house that they liked and it just happened to be in the Burien area. She states there was no other reason than that. WHAT CITY OR AREA DID THEY COME FROM? Previously answered. WHY DID THEY LEAVE? She advises because of different little things that happened with the bill collectors and the danger of losing their cars..
2. WHEN DID GARY GO TO WORK IN THE SEATTLE AREA? Mrs. TAYLOR advises that GARY only worked at a machine shop in the Seattle area while they lived there. She can't remember the name of the shop, but knows that the King County Police know about it, as when she stopped to pick up GARY'S check, the people at the machine shop told her that the detectives had been there inquiring about GARY. She advises that the Seattle authorities can check GARY'S employment dates at the shop for further information. She is almost positive that GARY never worked anywhere else but at this particular machine shop. WHERE DID GARY AND/OR HELEN SPEND THEIR LEISURE TIME (TAVERNS, ETC.)? Mrs. TAYLOR advises that she and GARY never went to bars, that they just stayed home and played with their dog. DID GARY HAVE GUNS WHILE LIVING IN THE SEATTLE AREA? Mrs. TAYLOR advises that GARY had some, but that she did not see them because she didn't want to see them. He kept them away from her, but she knows he had some guns, but exactly how many and what kind she doesn't know other than the ones that she has already told Sergeant DEMSKY about.
3. WHEN WAS THEIR FIRST CONTACT WITH VONNIE STUTH? Mrs. TAYLOR advises that she, herself, had never met VONNIE STUTH. She states that she was told that Mrs. STUTH lived across the street from them, but advises she never even saw Mrs. STUTH. GARY never mentioned Mrs. STUTH to her by name, but now looking back, she knows who she was because of her dog. She recalls GARY coming home from work one time and telling her that someone had hit this dog out in front.

She advises that GARY had her get a box and then GARY went out, picked up the dog in the box, and told HELEN the dog belonged to the people right across the street from them. At the time,

HELEN didn't know who the people were. But now realizes it was the STUTHS. HELEN says GARY came back from giving Mrs. STUTH the dead dog, and was really upset, like he had lost his best friend, because this woman was so careless that she didn't fence up her dog.

GARY told HELEN the woman was upset and GARY asked the woman why she was so upset, that if you had cared for your dog, you would have given it a nice fenced yard and not let him get killed. HELEN says at that time GARY didn't like the woman, but HELEN says as noted, she didn't even know who the woman was.

All that HELEN knows is that GARY went across the street, then came back and told her about it. HELEN was asked when her first recollection was of VONNIE STUTH. She relates her first knowledge was when the Seattle police stopped them and took GARY to the jail. She was shown a picture of Mrs. STUTH and was told that Mrs. STUTH lived across the street from HELEN, and she was asked if she knew her. HELEN told them she didn't know Mrs. STUTH. GARY did not indicate to HELEN any prior contact with Mrs. STUTH at the time of the dog incident, and only referred to her as "that girl across the street".

4. WAS HELEN AWARE OF THE MURDERS IN MICHIGAN AND ELSEWHERE? Previously answered. WAS HELEN AFRAID AND SUSPICIOUS OF GARY WHILE LIVING AT THE HOUSE ON 24th S? HELEN advises that she does not think this has anything to do with the matter. She advises that these things make her so mad that she doesn't even want to be asked about them, and that it's bad enough as it is.
5. WHY DID THEY LEAVE THE BURIEN RESIDENCE? HELEN advises that the reason that they left the Burien residence was because GARY had applied for credit and was turned down because all the credit references were picked up on. At this time, right after this, GARY was chaining the cars to the trees. HELEN told GARY this was crazy and that the bill collectors were going to find them. So, GARY said, let's move and HELEN started looking for another house. WHY DID THEY MOVE TO ENUMCLAW? HELEN advises that it just happened to be the house she found. HOW LONG DID THEY LIVE IN ENUMCLAW? HELEN advises that this was answered in previous questions posed by Sergeant DEMSKY, but notes that she believes it to have been about three weeks. WHY AND WHERE DID THEY MOVE? Previously answered. WHY DID THEY MOVE TO THAT CITY? HELEN advises that that is where she happened to find a house. They found the house through a rental agency, possibly RENTEX.
6. WHAT ARE THE DETAILS OF THE DAYS BEFORE THANKSGIVING? Previously answered. WHAT WAS HELEN DOING THANKSGIVING EVE? Previously answered. WHAT WAS GARY DOING THANKSGIVING EVE? Previously answered. WHAT ARE THE DETAILS OF THANKSGIVING? Some of these

and the following questions are unknown by HELEN. She advises that she arrived back in town Friday night, or Saturday, having been gone since the previous Wednesday before Thanksgiving. She imagines that GARY'S parents were right there at the house, or at least this is what GARY'S parents told her. Apparently, GARY'S parents were right there at the house with him Thanksgiving morning, and were still there when GARY brought her to the house. She notes they had just bought the Pinto for her and GARY, and that GARY'S parents left the following Sunday after Thanksgiving.

7. DID GARY HAVE GUNS AT THE ENUMCLAW RESIDENCE? HELEN advises that he had whatever he had, she's sure. She advises that GARY had them in a case or something, but she never saw them. She states that GARY knew that she didn't want to see them. She does not know how many or what kind. DID GARY TARGET PRACTICE? HELEN believes that he did, but that GARY wouldn't do it when she was home, because he knew she didn't like it. She believes that at the Burien residence, he may have practiced out back behind the house, and that even in ENUMCLAW, it was possibly close by because GARY wouldn't drive anywhere to target practice, and that it would be somewhere right around the immediate area of their residence.
8. WHAT ARE THE DETAILS OF THEIR TRAVELS AFTER THEY LEFT ENUMCLAW, WASHINGTON IN DECEMBER OF 1974, UP UNTIL GARY WAS APPREHENDED IN TEXAS? Previously answered.
9. WHAT ARE THE DETAILS OF GARY'S ADMISSIONS TO HELEN? HOW, WHEN, WHERE, ETC.? HELEN advises that she does not believe that this question has anything to do with it. This Investigator advised HELEN that he had originally learned from Attorney MEISER that admissions were made by GARY to HELEN while in a desert area. HELEN advised that the Investigator must be confused, as the only time they were in the desert was in Las Vegas when GARY first came out and told her that there was trouble in Michigan.

GARY told HELEN he had a big party at the house in Onsted, and that they were shooting all the guns. Apparently, the neighbors called the police, and GARY had to leave because he said that he wasn't supposed to have guns because of his hospital problems and couldn't get involved. He told HELEN that he would get a realtor to sell the house, and that now that he was out here, he wanted HELEN to go with him to Portland.

HELEN states that originally GARY stayed behind in Onsted to sell the house, while she, HELEN, went ahead. HELEN advises that originally, before GARY met her in Las Vegas, she had talked to him on the phone from Michigan, and that he had told her to quit her job in Los Angeles as there had been trouble, and that he wanted her to meet him in Las Vegas. HELEN advises that this is the only desert that she can recall. HELEN stated that GARY couldn't afford to get involved because of the hospital and all that.

10. WHERE ARE THE GUNS OWNED BY GARY? HELEN advises that she has no idea, and all that she can relate as to the guns has already been answered. As to a machete-like instrument, HELEN advises that all she can recall was that GARY had a long knife or something like that, and that it was an Army thing. She advises that the 9MM weapon was already covered by Sergeant DEMSKY, and that it was unknown by HELEN as to whether GARY had that weapon in Washington or not. As noted, she didn't even want to see GARY'S weapons.
11. WHERE IS THE FORD PINTO PURCHASED BY GARY'S PARENTS FOR THEM WHILE HIS PARENTS WERE UP HERE FOR THANKSGIVING? The Ford Pinto is presently being driven by HELEN in San Diego. The Pinto is carrying Michigan license plates, TSW-763.
12. DID GARY THREATEN HELEN? WHY? WHAT DID HE THREATEN TO DO TO HER? WHEN DID SHE SUSPECT HIS ACTIVITIES? HELEN advises that she does not see what these questions have to do with it.
13. DID HELEN HAVE ANY KNOWLEDGE THAT GARY MIGHT BE INVOLVED IN ANY CULTS, OR DEVEL WORSHIP, BLOOD SACRIFICES, ETC.? HELEN states that as far as she knows, GARY never belonged to any group in his life. GARY was not a joiner, but was a loner. He never talked about things like this, and would think that they were a big joke.
14. WHEN GARY WAS ARRESTED, MANY KEYS WERE FOUND IN THE CHRYSLER. WHAT ARE THESE KEYS FOR? HELEN thinks GARY kept every key he ever had, but doesn't know why. He kept keys to every tool box that he ever owned, and that every key that they ever had, GARY would want 4 or 5 duplicate keys. She notes that GARY always had a lot of keys and that this does not seem unnatural for him.
15. WHEN AND WHERE DID HELEN TRADE VEHICLES WITH GARY? Previously answered.
16. HAVE HELEN GIVE A COMPLETE RUN-DOWN ON HER'S AND GARY'S PATH OF TRAVEL AFTER LEAVING MICHIGAN UP UNTIL THE PRESENT? Previously answered.
17. ASK HELEN ABOUT THEIR BANK ACCOUNTS, PARTICULARLY THE ACCOUNT AT THE CONTINENTAL BANK IN BURIEN. WAS GARY RECEIVING CHECKS FROM MICHIGAN STATE HOSPITAL AT THAT BANK? HELEN advises that the account at the Continental Bank in Burien was hers. The company that she worked for opened accounts for their employees, and deposited their payroll checks right to that bank. She states that GARY did not have an account that she knew of, and that her bank account was the only one that they had up North.

She advises that GARY was not receiving any checks from Michigan State Hospital, nor was he receiving checks of any kind from anywhere that she was aware of.

The following answers given by HELEN TAYLOR are in response to questions requested by the Seattle authorities verbally during a telephone conversation. They will be numerically listed in sequence with the preceding questions and answers.

18. DID BOTH HELEN AND GARY SMOKE? HELEN advises that she has smoked menthol Doral cigarettes for the last four years. She notes that GARY would smoke various brands of cigarettes, but not menthol. He would smoke Winstons, Pall Malls, any type of filter cigarettes. She advises that it didn't make much difference to GARY what brand he smoked.
19. WAS GARY LEFT, OR RIGHT-HANDED? WAS HE AMBIDEXTROUS? HELEN advises that GARY was right-handed. He couldn't write with his left hand. As to his equal ability with either hand in other areas, she does not know.
20. TRASH IN PLASTIC BAGS WAS FOUND IN A SHED BEHIND THE HOUSE IN ENUMCLAW. HELEN advises that there was no trash pickup at either the house in Burien on 24th S, or at the residence in ENUMCLAW because of the remote locations, and that trash is disposed of by either the occupant or the landlord.
21. CIGARETTE BUTTS WERE FOUND OF THE BENSON & HEDGES VARIETY. HELEN, in recalling, advises that GARY also smoked this brand.
22. DRINKING HABITS OF BOTH GARY AND HELEN, AND TYPES AND/OR BRANDS USED. HELEN wanted to know what this question had to do with the matter at hand. She advises that she and GARY just drank at home and never went to bars, or drank in bars. She states they used no particular brands, that GARY drank beer and wine, but that she did not care for either. Also, GARY would drink anything, vodka, gin, probably mostly whiskey, but no particular brands, as it didn't much matter to him.
23. QUESTIONS WERE POSED TO HELEN CONCERNING DATES SHE AND GARY, OR GARY ALONE, MAY HAVE BEEN IN THE NORTHWEST AREA. THE DATES CORRESPOND WITH THE DISAPPEARANCE OF FEMALES FROM THAT AREA, BEGINNING WITH 1-31-74 AND COVERING THROUGH 6-11-74.

HELEN advises that in January of 1974, both she and GARY were still in the Michigan area. That around March 12, 1974, GARY was in Michigan, and that she was in San Diego. April 17, 1974, at this time it was possible, as reflected on Sergeant DEMSKY'S tape, that this may have been when HELEN was working in Portland, and that GARY went to Seattle for a week or so to find work and then return to Portland. May 6, 1974, in the Oregon-Washington area. HELEN notes that there were times when she and GARY were apart as stated on Sergeant DEMSKY'S report. June 1, 1974, she believes that this can be figured out from the previous interview of questions posed by Sergeant DEMSKY.

HELEN was asked if she had heard, or knew of, THE FLAME TAVERN in Burien. She advises she has no knowledge of such a place.


She advises that at one time, GARY was in Seattle before she went up there, and that after she arrived, GARY told her of a hillbilly bar down the street that was such a great place that he used to go to.

She states that it was close to the first apartment/motel residence that GARY rented before they got their house on 24th S. She doesn't know the name of the place and has never been there, but that GARY pointed it out to her on one occasion when they passed by.

HELEN feels that the Seattle authorities know of this place. She advises that this place was apparently in North Seattle, and not close to where she worked, and not in the Burien area.

HELEN was asked if GARY ever mentioned a place called Taylor Mountain to her. HELEN advises that she has never heard of this location, nor does she recall GARY ever having mentioned the name to her. June 11, 1974, HELEN advises that this period of time was already covered in the interview conducted by Sergeant DEMSKY.

24. THE SEATTLE AUTHORITIES WISHED INFORMATION THAT HELEN MIGHT HAVE REGARDING A WALTER R. PECA. HELEN advises that she had no idea that PECA was up in the Washington area, and that she hasn't heard or seen him in probably 10 or 15 years. She thought that possibly he might be in Alaska. Her last recollection of seeing PECA would be approximately 1963. She advises that GARY does not know PECA and has never met him. (This area was apparently covered by Sergeant DEMSKY during his interview.)
25. HELEN AGAIN WAS ASKED CONCERNING ADMISSIONS MADE TO HER BY GARY CONCERNING VARIOUS HOMICIDES. HELEN advises that she did not want to go into all that, and as noted in Sergeant DEMSKY'S interview, thinks that there are no more bodies than what were found at this point in time, and thinks that GARY may have made some of it up.

Mrs. Taylor: You can check that out. I know where we stayed. At the Teagarden Motel.

D/Sgt. Demsky: Teagarden.

Mrs. Taylor: Teagarden Motel in San Diego.

D/Sgt. Demsky: How long?

Mrs. Taylor: I don't remember. But the whole time we were here we were at that motel.

D/Sgt. Demsky: Weeks or months?

Mrs. Taylor: Weeks, weeks.

D/Sgt. Demsky: And the both of you were there?

Mrs. Taylor: Yeah.

D/Sgt. Demsky: We're speaking of April of '74?

Mrs. Taylor: We must be into May or June by now.

D/Sgt. Demsky: Okay, of '74.

Mrs. Taylor: Yes. We looked for a house for at least a week and couldn't find one.

D/Sgt. Demsky: Okay, go on.

Mrs. Taylor: So we went to Los Angeles. And then we got another motel there. I don't remember the name of that.

D/Sgt. Demsky: That's from a lot of dogs though.

Mrs. Taylor: I can't think of the name of it.

D/Sgt. Demsky: L. A.'s a big place. Okay, how long were you there?

D/Sgt. Demsky: Now is there some possibility you may be off in your dates though? Because to my knowledge, the Seattle police talked to him in January of '74.

Mrs. Taylor: Well, they are wrong.

D/Sgt. Demsky: Well, the newspaper had it.

Mrs. Taylor: The newspapers are nuts.

Mrs. Taylor: Like the middle of April. I'm not really sure. He came by and he said he'd been laid off from his job, but that he was thinking of changing jobs anyhow. And that he was going to go up to Los Angeles and look for a job. I don't believe this whole thing when I'm saying it all in one. I don't believe it.

D/Sgt. Demsky: That guy's got a lot of energy.

Mrs. Taylor: It sounds to, I'm getting tired just talking about it, let alone doing it.

Mrs. Taylor: Now he was alone in Portland for awhile because I went back to Michigan to pick up the rest of our things. He came out in the van. Remember when I told you I met him in Las Vegas. He came out with the van and the dog and he went up to Portland. He must of had a motel and he got the house. So before I went to work, he couldn't bring everything, so I went back, I stopped and saw Ted, and Ted would know when it was, and I saw some other friends, I don't want to mention their names, but anyhow, so he was alone for however long it took me to drive to Michigan and come back to Portland. But I know he was there because I called him there.

D/Sgt. Demsky: I can get going on this list here, because it's strictly Michigan. I have fourteen items.

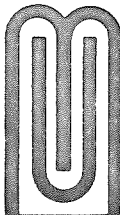

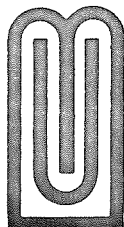
