R/ZT was requested by Lieutenant Joseph Kozenzak, Des Plaines Police Department, to process a pickup truck in reference to a missing Des Plaines youth, Robert J. PIEST. The vehicle was processed in the heated secure garage at the Des Plaines Police Station. The vehicle is a black Chevrolet Scottsdale 20 pickup truck with a red Western brand snowplow attached to the front. It bears Illinois 1979 license plates 1146793, VIN CKL248J182155 and has a mileage of 05642.5 miles. The interior of the truck was vacuumed for trace evidence (items 1 and 2) which will be submitted to the State lab for analysis. A broken hammer handle was recovered from under the passenger seat of the truck (item 3) and a section of rope was removed from the left side of the bed of the truck, (item 4). These items will be inventoried for future comparison. The interior and exterior of the truck were processed for latent prints with negative results. The vehicle was photographed as

(27) Case Summary and Questions to be Received:

A 15 year old M/W disappears after keeping an appointment with a subject who wanted to talk with him about a summer job. A search warrant is issued to search the subject's house for evidence of a homicide. The above items were removed from the house by R/ET. Items 7 and 8 recovered at the Des Plaines Police Department.

Item 1: Are the spots on the carpet blood? Type?

Item 2: Is stain under left arm (or other) blood? Type?

Item 3: Is trace evidence on the parka recoverable?

Item 4: Is stain at front of shorts blood? Type?

Item 5: Can the letter and number impressions on the first card be read?
(They appear to be from a Des Plaines library card. Impressions at lower left will be upside down and will start with letter D. Robert J. Piest had an old library card number DP 35104 and a new card with number DP 94883.)

Item 6: Is any trace evidence present on the rope?

Item 7: This blood was drawn from the finger tip of victim Piest by himself to observe and attempt to type as a self interest project. His brother witnessed him draw it.

R/ET then examined a 1978 black Chevrolet Van 20 with the lettering P.D.M. Construction and the vehicle number 4 written on the side. R/ET photographed the van as listed above and recovered item 2, a blood spotted paper towel, from the drivers door step. Examination of the rest of the van revealed various construction tools and materials consistent with the stated use of the vehicle. No other evidence was found in the truck. No further action taken at this time.

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

R/ET was advised at 1555 hours 13 December 1978 by ET Rossi to respond to 8213 Summerdale, Norwood Park Township and assist Des Plaines Police Department investigators in executing a search warrant at that location. Upon arrival R/ET met Lieutenant Joseph Kozenzak who advised that the search was for evidence concerning a Robert J. Piest, a fifteen year old white male missing from Des Plaines. Interior and exterior color photographs of the residence taken by R/ET are listed as items 9 through 23. Printed material removed from the residence by Des Plaines officers was photographed at the Des Plaines Police station and is listed as item 24. Items 7 and 8 were turned over to R/ET by Lt. Kozenzak, and are to be submitted to the State lab as standards of blood and hair of Robert J Piast.

R/ET was advised at 1555 hours 13 December 1978 by ET Rossi to respond to 8213 Summerdale, Norwood Park Township and assist Des Plaines Police Department investigators in executing a search warrant at that location. A section of rope approximately a yard long was recovered by R/ET from the trash basket and will be submitted for trace examination and future comparison. Printed material removed from the residence by Des Plaines officers was photographed at the Des Plaines Police station and is listed as item 24. Items 7 and 8 were turned over to R/ET by Lt. Kozenzak, and are to be submitted to the State lab as standards of blood and hair of Robert J Piast.

The following is a compilation of the daily activity conducted at 8213 W. Summerdale, Norwood Park, Twsp., Illinois, by the Evidence Technician Unit. Initial contact commenced on 21 Dec 78. It should be noted that before, and after the excavation of the residence Reporting Evidence Technicians recorded the scene with photography and video tape. The photography included color print film and color slide film. After the exhumation of each body a wooden stake with the corresponding body number was placed in the location of the skull. Body numbers were issued upon discovery of the remains and Morgue numbers issued by the Medical Examiners personnel at the scene. Measurements were taken to locate each skull as found, both as to position and depth in the crawl space soil. The interior dimensions of the crawl space were approximately 28' x 38'.

notified that a search warrant would be executed at the home of GACY, John W., located at 8213 W. Summerdale, Norwood Park Twp., by members of the Des Plaines Police Department. The warrant was for the purpose of searching for further evidence in the case of a missing youth, a PIEST, Robert, refer to Job #12510. Reporting Evidence Technicians were requested to meet the Des Plaines Police officers and members of the Cook County Police North Investigations Unit at the residence at approximately 2000 hrs., for the purpose of assisting the processing of the residence.

Evidence Technician GENTY #366 arrived at the scene at approximately 1955 hrs. Evidence Technician HUMBERT #424, ZEKAS #231 and ROMITO #475 arrived at 2005 hrs. Evidence Technicians Humbert and Romito photographed the interior of the residence and garage. Items of evidence recovered from these locations, were also photographed (see Job #12510). Evidence Technician Genty entered the crawl space of the residence along with Investigator BETTIKER #210, of the North Investigations Unit. Genty crawled to the Southeast portion of the crawl space and observed that the entire dirt floor of the crawl space was uneven and covered with a chalk-like substance. In places it appeared to be several inches thick. The entrance to the crawl space was thru a trap door, located in the floor of the frontroom closet, which measured approximately 32 1/2" X 20 1/2". The trap door closet was located in approximately the center of the residence. Just below the opening of the entrance is located the sump hole, for water drainage. The area was flooded with water, as the electrical cord for the pump had been unplugged. Evidence Technician Genty plugged the cord in to the outlet provided, and the pump functioned normally.

The average height of the crawl space ranged from approximately 28" to 30" to the top of the floor joists. While enroute to the Southeast corner of the crawl space Genty observed what appeared to be hair-like fibers in the dirt, just east of the center support pillar. At arrival in the Southeast corner of the crawl space Genty observed two shallow depressions in the soil which appeared to be approximately 18" in width, by approximately 6' in length, running parallel to the south foundation wall. Evidence Technician Genty then crawled back to his starting point and proceeded to the northwest corner of the crawl space. There it was observed that the soil was mounded up into the corner above the level of the surrounding soil. Both, the northwest and the southeast areas appeared not to have been disturbed for some time.

Evidence Technician Genty then proceeded to the southwest corner of the crawl space, where three things were observed; first, that there was a small amount of fresh dirt placed against the base of the south foundation wall. The wall was covered by the white chalky substance, which had been liberally placed around the area. The chalky substance was observed on the foundation walls, ground and the floor rafters above. Secondly, the presence of three small pools of standing water, the two smallest of which, appeared to be clear water. The larger pool of water contained water which appeared to be a dark murky purple. Finally, the two clear pools contained a large

(continued)

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number of thin red worms. These worms, when exposed to the beam of a flash light, retreated into their burrows. Genty then elected to dig in this spot and upon sinking his shovel into the soil, found the dirt to be very loose. With the second shovel thrust, raised wet mud and rotting flesh. The third thrust uncovered what appeared to be a human arm bone and hair like fibers. Evidence Technician Genty was then joined by Investigator Bettiker and Evidence Technician Humbert who witnessed the discovery.

The location of the discovery was approximately 10' east of the west foundation wall and 2' north of the south wall. Evidence Technicians Humbert and Genty then crawled to the northeast corner of the crawl space, while the Medical Examiner's office was contacted by Lieutenant BRAUN of the North Investigations Unit. Humbert and Genty then in a depression along the east wall approximately 18" west of the east wall and 6' south of the north wall. It was in this area that Humbert discovered a cloth covered human leg bone approximately 10" below the surface of the top soil. Genty, then found hairlike fibers at the same depth approximately 4' south in the same depression. Humbert and Genty proceeded to the southeast corner of the crawl space to the depression which had been observed earlier. Humbert dug in this depression approximately 8" down, locating two darkened long, apparent, human bones. The bones were removed and placed next to the hole.

Evidence Technicians then proceeded to photograph the crawl space pending the arrival of the medical examiner. Dr. STEIN, Cook County Medical Examiner, and Chief Investigator FLANIGAN arrived at approximately 2300 hrs. Upon being briefed as to the circumstances, Dr. Stein and Flanigan entered the crawl space with Evidence Technicians Humbert, Genty and Investigator Bettiker. Once in the crawl space Dr. Stein confirmed the bones found in the southeast corner to be human. Dr. Stein then ordered no further digging be done until an orderly exhumation be organized. The house was then secured by placing a uniformed police officer at the residence.

22 Dec 78

At approximately 1200 hrs., Evidence Technicians Genty, Zekas, Cox, Jones, and Lt. Taylor were present at the above listed residence.

The method of excavation was determined to be through the main floor. The decision was made to remove sections of the floor boards to facilitate the excavation process. Sections of the floor and subflooring were removed from the Northeast area of the residence, exposing the crawl space along the east wall. Assisted by members of the North Investigations Unit and Criminal Intelligence Unit, the non-bearing walls in the front section of the residence were also removed.

Evidence Technicians Genty and Humbert began excavation of an area
(continued)

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in the crawl space at the northeast section, east wall. Shallow earth removal in this area yielded the skeletalized remains of a human body. The remains were completely unearthed exposing a skeleton. The skull was to the north, legs and feet extended to the south. The remains were positioned face upward and no evidence of clothing was found. The remains were located some 19" south of the north wall to the skull and approximately 24" west of the east wall. These remains were assigned body identification number 1. Dr. Stein was present at the scene, issued Morgue #1066 Dec 78 and pronounced the remains dead.

While excavation of body #1 was being conducted, members of the North Investigations Unit were searching the attached workshop area of the residence garage. The far east floor of the work shop was believed to contain the remains of another body. The section of flooring in question, was covered with approximately 4" of concrete, necessitating the use of a compressor and air hammer to remove same. The east outer wall of the workshop was removed to facilitate excavation. Investigators LUNDQUIST #243 and SCHWARTZ #130 were able to remove approximately one half of the concrete in an area measuring approximately 4' X 2'. Removal of the concrete revealed the skeletalized remains of a human body. Only the upper torso and skull were removed at this time, as Dr. Stein stopped excavation due to the possibility of noxious gases emitting from the grave. The body remains were issued body identification number 2. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead and issued Morgue #1065 Dec 78 at this time. Some clothing remnants and a shoe were removed from the area where the body was found. The remains of both bodies #1 and #2 were removed from the scene to the Forensic Institute and the entire scene was secured by uniformed officers of the Cook County Police Department.

23 Dec 78

Evidence Technicians Genty, Humbert, Kulovitz, Jones, Zakis, and Lt. Taylor arrived at the scene at approximately 0830 hrs.

The removal of the remainder of body #1 from the grave site was completed. During the exhumation of body #1 another skeleton was unearthed under the foot area of body #1. Also, at this time Investigators LUNDQUIST #243, BETTIKER #210, and RUSSELL #311, resumed removal of the concrete in the workshop, where the remainder of body #2 was recovered. Suspected material from the victim's pants, was also recovered from the grave.

The remains of the third body were located just south of body #1, also with the skull to the north, on its posterior. From the skull to the north wall measured, approximately 5' 6" and like body #1, 24" west of the east wall. Two shoes and some clothing fragments were also recovered from the grave. The remains were assigned body identification number 3. Morgue #1121 Dec 78 was issued by Dr. Stein, who also pronounced the remains dead.

The remains of a fourth body were located under the feet of body #3, at approximately 1300 hrs. The skull was positioned to the south, with the legs and feet extended to the North, face up. A leather wallet was recovered in the area of the torso. Dark cloth pants and socks were in position on the remains. The body was assigned identification number 4 and pronounced dead by Dr. Stein, who also issued Morgue #1122 Dec 78. The location of the skull was approximately 11' South of the North wall and 24" west of the east wall. Evidence Technician Jones collected a section of green carpeting and pad from the southwest bedroom, for analysis. All remains and recovered material were transported to the Forensic Institute.

The scene was secured by uniform personnel of the Cook County Police Department.

Per a directive of Chief of Police Dobbs, work was suspended until after the Christmas holidays, which include the 24th thru the 25th Dec 78.

26 Dec 78

Evidence Technicians Kulovitz, Pearson, Genty, Humbert, Hale, Zekas, and Lt. Taylor arrived at the scene at approximately 0845 hrs.

The days excavation began by probing the area beneath the grave of body #1, again, after shallow digging a fifth body was unearthed, and issued body identification #5, exhumation was begun at approximately 1010 hrs. Body #5 was pronounced by Dr. Stein at approximately 1208 hrs., at his arrival and issued Morgue #1265 Dec 78.

The position of body #5 was located as approximately 19" south of the north wall and 24" west of the east wall. The skull was to the north, with the legs and feet extended to the south. The remains were positioned face up at a depth of approximately 3' below the surface of the top soil and 5'7" to the top of the floor joist. The remains were clothed in a light colored cloth, long sleeve shirt or jacket and dark pants. What appeared to be a cloth material was found in the mouth of the skull. Reporting Evidence Technicians also recovered a folded piece of paper which was collected as physical evidence.

The recovered piece of paper was returned to the Maybrook Police Photo Laboratory where it was later photographed by Evidence Technician HALE #264, with infra-red photography as the paper was coated with mud and debris. Prints were made of the note and forwarded to the North Investigations Unit. The piece of paper was submitted to the Illinois State Crime Laboratory for analysis.

Continued examination of the crawl space revealed the remains of body #6 at approximately 1350 hrs. The remains were found resting parallel to the north foundation wall, on it's posterior. The skull was to the west with the torso and legs extended to the east. The remains were positioned approximately 5' south of the north wall and 16' 2" west of

the east wall. The depth was noted as approximately 5' 4" to the top of the floor joist and 2' 5" below the surface of the top soil. No clothing was found with the remains. Morgue #1274 Dec 78 was assigned by Dr. Stein, who also pronounced the victim.

The remains of body #7 were located adjacent to body #6 at approximately 1415 hrs. The remains were positioned with the head to the east. The torso appeared to have been flexed at the lumbar area, as the forehead was resting on the knees of the remains. The lower appendages were also bent at the hip and the knees, in an easterly direction. The remains appeared to be resting on the body's left side. Cloth material was found in the mouth of the skull. In addition, a plastic bag was removed from beneath the skull. The remains were positioned approximately 15' west of the east wall and 4' 4" south of the north wall. The depth of the remains was recorded as approximately 6' to the top of the floor joist and 2' 9" under the surface of the top soil. Morgue #1277 Dec 78 was assigned and the remains pronounced dead by Dr. Stein.

The unusual positioning of body #7 were misconstrued as an eighth body causing a morgue number and body #8 to be issued prematurely. Body #8 and the morgue number were reassigned the following day.

At 1426 hrs., body #9 was unearthed after removal of a 4" thick, piece of concrete. The concrete measured approximately 7' 6" X 2' 7" and was located at the east side of the east pillar support structure pad. Dr. Stein issued Morgue #1279 Dec 78 and pronounced the remains at 1430 hrs. The remains were observed with the skull to the south on its anterior side. The skull was positioned approximately 7' 2" west of the east wall and 12' 10" south of the north wall. Approximately 4', was noted to the top of the floor joist and approximately 1' under the support pillar pad surface. An elastic band, similar to those found on mens underwear, was observed around the waist area of the remains. A pair of dark colored socks were found in place on the remains.

The remains of body #10 were found at 1505 hrs., and pronounced dead by Dr. Stein, who issued Morgue #1289 Dec 78. Body #10 was positioned on its back with the head to the west, legs and feet extended to the east. The skull was positioned approximately 2' south of the north wall and 19' west of the east wall. Two reddish colored socks were removed from the grave, along with a pair of mens jockey type underwear. The depth below the top soil of the skull was noted as, approximately 7' and approximately 4' to the top of the floor joist.

All recovered remains were removed to the Forensic Institute and the scene was secured for the day by uniformed officers of the Cook County Police Department.

27 Dec 78

Evidence Technicians on the scene at approximately 0915 hrs., were Pearson, Humbert, Jones, Genty, Zekas, Kulovitz, and Lt. Taylor.

Prior to the days excavation Evidence Technician Jones recovered a folding pocket knife and a length of rope from the closed of the southwest bedroom. Both items were returned to the Maybrook Facility, where they were inventoried and submitted to the Illinois State Crime Lab for analysis.

The discovery of the days first remains was at approximately 1002 hrs. and assigned body #8 and given Morgue #1278 Dec 78, both of which were issued the previously day. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains at his arrival, approximately 1215 hrs. The body was positioned face down with the skull to the north and the legs extended to the south. The arms were positioned under the upper torso of the remains. The remains were clothed in dark pants, bright blue jogging type athletic shoes, which had three stripes on the side and white socks with three stripes at the top. A ligature was found wrapped around the neck similar to rope. Over all length of the remains was approximately 5' 2". The remains were resting at the west side of the far east concrete pillar support pad and approximately 7' south of the north wall and 12' west of the east wall. The depth was recorded as approximately 4' 5" to the top of the floor joist and 16" below the top soil to the skull. All items found with the body were left in place for examination at the Forensic Institute.

At approximately 1025 hrs., the remains of body #11 was found, adjacent to body #8, on the west side. The skull being parallel to number eights' mid-torso. Morgue #1322 Dec 78 was issued and the remains pronounced dead by Dr. Stein at approximately 1220 hrs. These remains were further positioned with the head to the north, legs and feet to the south. The remains were face down, with the body curved slightly to the west. The body was clothed in corduroy pants, a gold colored knit type shirt and a western style belt buckle, white metal and multi-colored oval stone. The buckle was found beneath the remains. The buckle was collected by members of the North Investigations Unit as a possible means of identification. A ligature similar to rope was found around the neck. The body was positioned approximately 8' 9" south of the north wall and approximately 13' west of the east wall. The approximate over length of the remains were 5' 4". The depth of the skull was approximately 14" below the surface of the top soil and 4' 2" to the top of the floor joist.

Victim #12 was discovered at approximately 1030 hrs. Morgue #1323 Dec 78, was issued by Dr. Stein, who also pronounced the remains dead at approximately 1225 hrs. The remains were adjacent to victim #11 and #8 on the west side and also, face down, head to the north. The feet and legs were extended to the south. A rope-like ligature was found around the neck. Black cloth material pants were observed in place on the body. The remains measured approximately 6' 7" south of the north wall and 15' 6" west of the east wall. Approximately 12" was measured from the skull to the top of the soil and 4' 3" to the top of the floor joists.

At 1400 hrs., date, the remains of body #13 were unearthed in the south-west corner of the crawl space. Morgue #1325 Dec 78 was issued by Dr. Stein and pronounced dead at 1410 hrs.

The remains were positioned with the head to the west, resting on the right side. The skull was approximately 7" east of the west wall and 1' 6" north of the south wall. The remains were found approximately 13" under the surface of the top soil and 4' 8" from the top of the floor joists. The overall measurement of the remains were approximately 6' 1". The remains were positioned on the south side, parallel to an apparently unused concrete footing. The concrete runs the entire width of the crawl space, (east to west). The concrete footing is approximately 4' 8" north of the south wall and is approximately 10" in width.

Body #14 was discovered at 1455 hrs., issued Morgue #1329 Dec 78 and pronounced dead at 1518 hrs. by Dr. Stein. The remains were positioned with the head to the east, legs extended to the northwest. The body was on an angle approximately 5' south of the north wall to the skull and 19" from the feet to the north wall. The remains were placed face up, with the skull approximately 16' 6" west of the east wall. The upper torso, from approximately the waist upward was covered with an opaque plastic material. Closer inspection, revealed the victim was placed in a plastic bag. A pair of dark corduroy pants, high top athletic shoes and red socks were in place on the remains. The depth of the remains was noted as approximately 9" to the top of the soil and 4' 4" to the top of the floor joist. The plastic bag was left in place, as found, as per the request of Dr. Stein.

While exhuming body #14 Reporting Evidence Technicians, unearthed the remains of body #15 at 1500 hrs. The remains were under and to the north of body #14. These remains were also covered from the waist upward with an opaque plastic bag. With the removal of body #14, body #15 was examined. The remains were also found face up and resting in the same direction as body #14. The remains were clothed in blue jeans, which were unzipped, purple colored socks and high top athletic shoes. Closer examination of the remnants of the shoes revealed they were Converse brand, size eight.

Dr. Stein pronounced the remains of body #15 at 1520 hrs. and issued Morgue #1330 Dec 78. The skull was located approximately 4' 6" south of the north wall, with the feet 19" south of the north wall. The skull was further positioned 16' 1" west of the east wall. Again, the plastic bag was left in place. The depth of the remains was approximately 4' 6" to the top of the floor joist and 11" to the top of the soil.

All recovered remains were removed to the Forensic Institute and the scene was secured by uniformed police officers of the Cook County Police Department, at 1650 hrs.

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At approximately 2200 hrs., date, Evidence Technicians NAGORSKI #430 and ROMITO #475 photographed miscellaneous items of jewelry at the Cook County Sheriff's Police facility in Niles, at the request of Investigator SMITH #203. The items of jewelry were removed by investigators from the Gacy residence, at 8213 W. Summerdale, Norwood Park Twp., Illinois, previously. The photographs were requested in an attempt to identify any of the items as belonging to victims.

28 Dec 78

0900 hrs., Evidence Technicians on the scene were Kulovitz, Ganty, Humbert, Jones, Pearson, Zekas and Lt. Taylor.

The remains of Body #16 was unearthed at approximately 1030 hrs. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1255 hrs., at his arrival. Morgue #1377 Dec 78 was issued to the remains. The body was found with the head to the east, legs and feet to the west. The remains were face up, resting adjacent to and parallel to the unused concrete footing to the north of the body. Examination of the remains revealed cloth material in the mouth. The body was resting on the left side. The remains were positioned approximately 3' north of the south wall and 11' 5" east of the west wall. The depth of the body was noted as approximately 10" below the top of the soil and 4' 4" to the top of the floor joist.

Body #17 was discovered at 1105 hrs., approximately 9' east of the west wall and 9' south of the north wall. The remains were face down with the head to the south. The legs were extended to the north, with a slight easterly angle. The buttox of the remains were slightly elevated. Dark cloth pants and socks were in place.

The remains were resting on the east side of slab of concrete, which measured approximately 3' 3" wide by an undetermined depth. The slab was extending on an angle into the crawl space earth, with the west end jutting out of the soil, obliquely. A depth into the soil could not be made as the remains of body #17 were resting just above it. The body was approximately 4' 5" below the top of the floor joist and 8" below the top of the soil. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1300 hrs. and issued Morgue #1378 Dec 78.

The remains of body #18 were discovered at approximately 1220 hrs., and located approximately 18" east of the west wall and 8' 5" north of the south wall. The remains were positioned with the head toward the east, legs and feet to the west. The body was face down and the skull was turned to the right. It was also observed that the skull was contained in a opaque plastic bag, was secured at the neck by a ligature. Evidence Technicians placed the remains in a plastic bag, over the head to the waist, to facilitate examination at the Forensic Institute. The depth of body #18 was recorded as approximately 8" below the top soil and 5' 8" to the top of the floor joist. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1315 hrs. and issued Morgue #1379 Dec 78.

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Body #19 was unearthed at 1230 hrs., was located approximately 2' 2" east of the west wall and 5' 10" south of the north wall. The remains were face down with the head to the north, legs and feet extended to the south. A cloth material was found in the mouth. The depth of the body was approximately 10" to the top soil and 4' 3" to the top of the floor joist. The remains were pronounced dead by Dr. Stein at 1350 hrs., date, and issued Morgue #1380 Dec 78.

Discovery of the remains of body #20 was made at 1235 hrs. The remains were positioned approximately 16' east of the west wall and 2' south of the north wall, face up with the head toward the west. Several inches of rope-like cord was around the neck. Both arms were under the body. Clothing included dark pants with a leather belt. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1355 hrs., issuing Morgue #1332 Dec 78. Dr. Stein upon examining the remains noted the condition of the abdomen, and observed it was distended. Dr. Stein the proceeded to puncture the abdomen to release the pressure. The depth of the body was approximately 4' to the top of the floor joist and 8" to the top of the soil.

The remains of body #21 was unearthed at 1420 hrs. in the southeast corner of the crawl space. The head was located to the east, face upward, legs and feet extended to the west. The skull measured 1' west of the east wall, and 3' north of the south wall. Depth from the top soil was 12" and 4' 2" to the top of the floor joist from the skull. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1445 hrs., and issued Morgue #1385 Dec 78.

All remains were removed to the Forensic Institute and the scene was secured by uniformed police officers at 1545 hrs.

29 Dec 78

Excavation began at 0945 hrs., by Evidence Technicians Humbert, Kulovitz, Jones, Pearson, Gonty, Zekas and Lt. Taylor.

At the commencement of the days activities, a section of concrete, approximately 7 1/2' x 4', located at the southwest edge of the sump hole was explored with hammer and chisel.

At 1120 hrs., the remains of body #22 was discovered under the remains of #21. The body was positioned face down with the skull toward the west, legs and feet were extended to the east. The position of the remains was approximately 2' 8" north of the south wall and 6' 2" west of the east wall.

Examination of the remains yielded two light blue socks from the pelvic area. A material similar to cloth underwear was found in the mouth. A black rubber shower clog was found under the rib cage area. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1235 hrs., after his arrival and issued Morgue #1439 Dec 78. The depth of the victim was noted as approximately
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2' to the top soil and 5' 7" to the top of the floor joist.

The remains of #23 were discovered at 1400 hrs., and pronounced dead by Dr. Stein at 1405 hrs., who issued Morgue #1452. The remains were located adjacent to and just west of bodies #21 and #22. The head was to the west, legs and feet extended to the east. The body was positioned face down with the head turned to the south. A pair of cloth under shorts were found in place. The skull measured 3' 2" north of the south wall and 13' 6" west of the east wall. The depth of the skull to the top soil was approximately 1' 3" and to the top of the floor joist was 4' 3".

Body #24 was discovered at 1435 hrs., under body #23 and adjacent to the west of #21 and #22. The head was to the west with the legs and feet to the east. The body was positioned with the face down and turned slightly to the south. The position was located as approximately 2' 11" north of the south wall and 14' 3" west of the east wall.

Cloth type material was found in the mouth and two white metal jewelry type chains were found in the neck area. Both were link type chains, measuring approximately 2' in length. One chain was a large link and the second of smaller link. A cloth type shirt was also found in the area of the body. The remains were approximately 1' 9" to the top soil and 4' 9" to the top of the floor joists. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1435 hrs., and issued Morgue #1453 Dec 78.

The remains of body #25 were discovered under the section of concrete that had been explored earlier. Remains were located at approximately 1115 hrs., however, were not unearthed until approximately 1435 hrs. The remains were buried under concrete which varied from 2-8" in thickness. The body was positioned with the head to the south, face down, turned to the west. The position was approximately 6' north of the south wall and 13' 3" east of the west wall. The covering slab of concrete extended over the feet to the upper torso. The legs extended deeper into the ground than the remainder of the body. A cloth sock was found in the mouth. The sock appeared to be a knee length, athletic type, with three red stripes at the top. The remains were pronounced dead by Dr. Stein at 1435 hrs., and issued Morgue #1454 Dec 78. The depth of the skull was recorded as approximately 1' to the top of the soil and 4' to the top of the floor joist.

Body #26 was discovered at 1545 hrs., under bodies #23 and #24, to the west of bodies #21 and #22. The remains were positioned with the head to the west, legs and feet extended to the east, face down. The skull was positioned approximately 11' 5" west of the east wall and 3' 1" north of the south wall. A depth of 2' 7" was recorded to the top soil and 5' 10" to the top of the floor joist. Closer examination of the remains revealed a cloth material in the mouth. Dr. Stein pronounced the remains dead at 1545 hrs., and issued Morgue #1455 Dec 78.

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Body #27 was discovered at approximately 1415 hrs., and pronounced dead at approximately the same time, by Dr. Stein, who also issued Morgue #1456 Dec 79 to the remains. The body was positioned face up, with the head to the east, legs and feet extended to the west. The head was turned slightly to the south. The body was located approximately 3' 4" north of the south wall and adjacent to the unused concrete footing. Cloth material was found around the lower portion of the skull. Dark pants with a leather belt and metal buckle were on the remains. Two dark socks were also found in place. The victim was approximately 10" below the surface of the top soil and 4' 3" below the top of the floor joist.

All recovered remains were transported to the Forensic Institute and the scene was secured by members of the Cook County Police Department at 1700 hrs.

30 Dec 78

Evidence Technicians on the scene at 0915 hrs., were Zekas, Pearson, Genty, Kulovitz, Jones, Hale, Humbert, and Lt. Taylor.

Excavation began in the area of the back yard bar-b-que pit, where a metal tool box was found contained in the fire pit. Further examination was delayed until equipment could be obtained to break the concrete at the bottom of the fire pit.

Members of the North Investigative Unit then proceeded to examine the attic area of the residence. Access to the attic was attained through a pull down ladder in the hallway, at the bathroom. The wooden attic floor was removed and various items of physical evidence were removed, including four books, smoking materials, pipes, bongas, a bag of badges and police type stars. Also recovered was a shoe from the hallway closet, a brown bottle from the attic, a length of rope from the dining room hutch and an envelope containing unknown strips of material. Two samples of the chalky white substance were collected from the south east and northwest corners of the crawl space.

Excavation of the crawl space continued, searching for physical evidence and remains. The days activities were met with negative results.

The scene was secured at approximately 1600 hrs., by uniform members of the Cook County Police Department.

Per the directive of Chief of Police Dobbs, all work at the scene was suspended until after the New Years holiday.

2 Jan 79

Evidence Technicians on the scene at approximately 0830 hrs., were Zekas, Genty, Kulovitz and Sgt. Des Re' Maux.

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Excavation of the crawl space continued, searching for physical evidence and remains. The days activities were met with negative results.

3 Jan 79

Evidence Technicians Zekas, Jones, Sgt. Des Re' Maux, and Lt. Taylor were on the scene at approximately 0830 hrs.

The crawl space was photographed, illustrating the grave markers in place, throughout. Excavation of the crawl space continued, searching for physical evidence and remains. The day's activities were met with negative results.

The scene was secured at approximately 1800 hrs., by members of the Cook County Police Department.

Evidence Technician ROSSI #344 processed a roll of Plus-X photographic film at the request of North Investigations, Sgt. ANDERSON #57. Rossi further made three sets of photographic prints, which, along with the negatives were forwarded to Anderson at North Investigations.

4 Jan 79

Evidence Technicians Jones, Zekas, Sgt. Des Re' Maux and Lt. Taylor were at the scene at approximately 1000 hrs.

Lt. BRAUN of the North Investigations Unit received information that a section of floor in the residence, specifically the utility room, may contain physical evidence. Two boxes of food stuffs were removed from the south wall floor area. A hole in the floor was observed, which measured approximately 2" X 8 1/2", and was further located as approximately 52" east of the west wall and just east of a metal floor cabinet. The opening entered a space between the floor joists.

Closer examination in the area revealed a blue cloth material placed between the floor joists. The material was photographed and removed, revealing that it was a nylon parka type jacket, down filled. The brand name was identified as Pacific Trail. Officer TOVAR #222 of the Des Plaines Police Department collected the coat as physical evidence.

In addition to the jacket, a plastic tooth brush and a cellophane cigar wrapper was found in the crevas. Photographs were taken of all items.

Members of the Cook County Highway Department were placed into service, digging in the crawl space. Heavy machinery was brought to the scene to facilitate the deep excavation of the crawl space. Sgt. MARINELLI #88 of the Investigative Unit recorded the names of the workers involved in the excavation.

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Excavation of the crawl space continued, searching for physical evidence and remains. The days activities were met with negative results.

5 Jan 79

Evidence Technicians at the scene were Jones, Sgt. Des Re' Maux and Lt. Taylor at approximately 0900 hrs.

Search of the crawl space yielded a work type glove from the northeast corner of the soil. Evidence Technician Jones collected same as physical evidence.

Further examination of the crawl space was met with negative results.

The scene was secured at approximately 1700 hrs., by personnel of the Cook County Police Department.

6 Jan 79

Evidence Technicians present at the scene included Jones, Sgt. Des Re' Maux, and Lt. Taylor.

Excavation of the crawl space continued, searching for physical evidence and remains. The days activities were met with negative results.

The scene was secured at approximately 1700 hrs., by personnel of the Cook County Police Department.

All activities at the scene subsequent to 6 Jan 79 will be recorded on a daily basis, by the officer handling the assignment.
