NARRATIVE:

At approximately 1915 hours, 4 Jan, 1979, Det Pickell went to the Piest home and spoke with Mr & Mrs Piest and their son, Ken, and their daughter, Kerry. In summary, R/O advised the Piest family that a jacket similar to that which Rob had been wearing on the night of his disappearance had been recovered.

Prior to showing the family the jacket, R/O asked the family where the jacket had been purchased. Mrs Piest advised that the jacket had been purchased about two years ago at Spiegler's department store in Des Plaines. The jacket was a down filled jacket, light blue in color, with an attached hood. The family was asked if they recalled any rips or tears in the jacket and they replied negatively. They were asked if they recalled any mending or sewing that had been done on the jacket and they replied negatively. They were asked if they knew of any stains, marks, or other distinguishable marks on the jacket and they again replied negatively.

Upon viewing the jacket, Ken and Kerry Piest said that without a doubt, the jacket was their brother's. They both said that they had worn this jacket several times themselves. They also specifically remember the brand name, "Pacific Trail".

Mr & Mrs Piest examined the jacket and they said that they were positive that this jacket was their son's.

The Piest family examined three other items recovered, a yellow toothbrush, a small piece of cellophane, and a brown grocery-type bag. They said that these items were not familiar to them and they meant nothing to them.

Mr & Mrs Piest advised R/O that their son, Rob, had been wearing "Young Jockey" undershorts. The undershorts were colored, not white. They said the color was most probably blue in color, but they couldn't be 100% certain. The size was 18-20 waist.

Mr & Mrs Piest also said that their son may have been wearing white tube socks or colored terry-cloth socks, both of mid-calf length.

The Piest family was advised that they would be kept informed of the progress of our investigation.

It should be noted that yellow soiled undershorts were recovered from the Gacy residence on 12/13/78.

NARRATIVE

The following report reflects my activities in a follow up investigation of a missing person (murder) case originally filed on December 10, 1978.

On Saturday, 6 January 1979, at approximately 1000 hours while working at the murder scene, 8213 West Summerdale Avenue in Norwood Park Township, Illinois, I found three pieces of paper with various notes on them behind a washing machine in the pantry area of the house. These three pieces of paper had been either pushed or hidden behind the washing machine and are attached to the property inventory sheet which is dated 01-06-79 by the undersigned Officer. The one slip shows the name of Jim and Rex at 3168 Hudson, Belmont and Hudson area. It also shows a number of drinking establishments, including Alfies, Broadway Limited, Crystal Blinks, The Gold Coast, and Bistrs. The other pieces of paper, the second one, shows the name of Luis A. Gonzalez, shows an age of 21, court date apparently of 29 April at 9:30 in the morning, assault and battery charge, attempted theft at Western and Belmont. The other one shows some directions, which appear to be to a Rose Lodge at 2500 Fullerton Avenue. These notes were recovered, as there is the possibility of a connection between the bar Blinks and the disappearance of one of the bodies that has been identified, that one being the subject from Minnesota.

# NARRATIVE

The following report reflects my activities in a follow up investigation of a homicide reported on 11 December 1978.

On today's date, February 7, 1979, I had a conversation with Detective Irv Kraut and Investigator Jerry Lawrence, of the Cook County Sheriff's Police and Chicago Police Department/Homicide Divisions, and it was at this time that for the purpose of taking a handwriting comparison of a note which was recovered by this Officer on January 6, 1979 at the home of John Gacy that the note in question, which was inventoried under our P.D. Number, was signed over to Investigator Jerry Lawrence of the Chicago Police Department/Area 6 Homicide. He signed for it on our evidence recovery sheet and it was turned over to him. An attached copy of it is attached to this report. Also the two other notes with the name of Luis A. Gonzalez and some directions were also turned over to them. The change of custody of evidence has been maintained, being turned over from one to the other and being held in property inventory. More reports to follow.

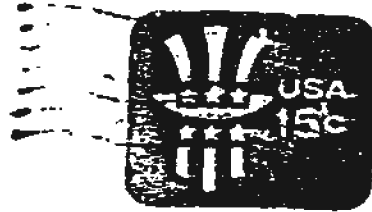

NARRATIVE

On the above time and date a conference was held with William Cygan, DOB: [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Previously we had received information from John Lucas, the owner of the Shell Station at 300 Higgins, Park Ridge, in which case Mr. Lucas had advised us that Mr. Cygan might be able to provide us with information regarding this case. During my interview with Mr. Cygan, Mr. Cygan indicated that he presently works at both the Shell Station and at the Flying Tigers Airlines, O'Hare Field, and his supervisors are Frank Cich and Julian Bellin, and he can be contacted at the Flying Tigers Airlines at 686-7105. Upon speaking with Mr. Cygan, it was determined that he has known John Gacy for approximately four years, in which case Mr. Cygan has been an employee of the Shell Station at 300 Higgins Road in Park Ridge. Mr. Cygan was then questioned if he had any personal knowledge of Mr. Gacy, to which he replied that he felt Mr. Gacy tried to be a high roller, a big shot in front of a crowd, had two daughters and was divorced for approximately two years. Mr. Cygan further described Mr. Gacy as being high strung. I then advised Mr. Cygan that we had received information regarding a specific incident which may have involved Mr. Gacy and he was aware of the incident to which I made reference. Mr. Cygan indicated that the incident would involve a David Edgecombe of [REDACTED] and he believes the incident occurred approximately two years ago. Mr. Cygan advised this Officer that to the best of his knowledge he had informed Mr. Edgecombe that Mr. Gacy was seeking employees for construction work and the incident may have been precipitated when, as indicated by Mr. Cygan, John Gacy became pissed off when David terminated his employment with Mr. Gacy. Mr. Cygan advised this Officer that as best as he can recollect the incident occurred around Halloween about two years ago after he had driven David Edgecombe home to his residence. The following morning Cygan questioned Edgecombe, as he had observed that David Edgecombe had been beaten up, at which time Edgecombe indicated to him that after he had arrived home; he heard someone knocking on his window. When Edgecombe looked out the window, he encountered Gacy, at which time Gacy asked him to go out drinking. Mr. Cygan advised this Officer that David Edgecombe allegedly consumed an entire bottle of alcohol and during the time they were drinking, he had his pet Husky named Ivan with him and apparently the alcohol was consumed at the residence of John Gacy. Mr. Cygan stated that he had been advised by Mr. Edgecombe that the beating had taken place in the garage of John Gacy while David Edgecombe was handcuffed and Ivan was allegedly locked outside the garage. Mr. Cygan advised this Officer that in the event it should be necessary to speak with him again, he can be contacted either at home or at his place of employment through Mr. Cich or Mr. Bellin.

## Missing Person Investigation

1. ADDRESS

NARRATIVE On the 26 Dec. 78, reporting officers went to the Goodwill Rehabilitation Center 150 S. Ashland Blvd., Chicago, Illinois, TX738-3860. This was after Det. Adams had found out from John Gacy that he had apparently thrown Robert Piest's clothes into a goodwill box either at Cumberland and Lawrence or at Harlem and Irving. Det. Adams had first called the Goodwill and spoke to a female subject by the name of Bernice, TX738-3860 Ext. 259 and also the Transportation Manager Manuel DeGuzman Ext. 326 4331. He was informed that they have eight stores to which they send out items to sell and that their trucks are out every day but donot always pick up from their different pickup locations due to the fact that there may not be enough clothes to pick up. There are about 20-40 people on the production end of the company. Apparently, the clothes are sent on a conveyor to the fifth floor where they are priced and gotten ready for shipment. The shoes also go to the fifth floor and are boxed. The pants are put into boxes of fifty.

Reporting officers upon arrival were taken to the fifth floor and allowed to look through the jackets and coats that were hanging and already being gotten ready to ship out with positive results.

Reporting officers then spoke to Mr. DeGuzman who related that they donot have a box at Harlem and Irving but that there is a box located at 1900 N. Cumberland next to a Kinney Shoe store in Norridge. He checked his records and found that the driver for that route is a Derrick Washington, truck #11. Pickups were made at that location supposedly on the 18th Dec., Monday and on the 21 Dec., Thursday. He further related that once items come into the center, it takes about four to five days not counting Sunday, which no one works, for the items to be sent out to the various stores. There is no set pattern in which the items are sent out to the stores and it would be impossible to trace any item down.

Reporting officers next checked the store they have in the building and could come up with only a pair of pants which looked something like the ones Robert Piest was wearing. These were recovered and an attempt will be made to see if they can be identified. No other items could be located and reporting officers showed the sales clerks the picture of Piest with the clothes he was wearing when he was reported missing and they related that they couldnot remember seeing any of the items.

On the above time and date Robert L. Steinberg, of [REDACTED] was interviewed in reference to the above captioned incident. Mr. Steinberg indicated that he may have information pertinent to the investigation regarding John Gacy and that although he was not a victim in this particular incident, his friend or associate Loren Itkin, of [REDACTED] had been chased by John Gacy and, although he was uncertain of the exact date the incident occurred, he does recall that approximately three days after that particular incident his friend, Loren Itkin, had been involved in a traffic accident and Mr. Itkin was going to request that the Cook County Sheriff's Police check the registration on the vehicle which had been driven by Mr. Gacy and as best Robert can recall the plate was [REDACTED] Illinois '77 registration. Upon further speaking with Mr. Steinberg, Mr. Steinberg described the vehicle driven by Mr. Gacy as perhaps a '73 or '74 dark colored Oldsmobile and although the vehicle did not have any spotlights, it did have a red light behind the grill on the right hand side of the grill work. Mr. Steinberg informed this Officer the incident began in a gas station located at 2351 West Howard in Chicago, which is the corner of Howard and Western, when Itkin was to go to [REDACTED] to pick up an item for Robert Steinberg. After leaving the Mobil Station, Itkin proceeded and was followed to the Steinberg residence by the vehicle, which was later identified as having been driven by John Gacy. According to Mr. Steinberg, Itkin made several maneuvers in an attempt to elude Gacy's vehicle and subsequently returned to the Mobil Station, at which time Gacy pulled his automobile in close proximity to the vehicle being driven by Loren Itkin. Itkin then exited his vehicle at approximately the same time Gacy exited his vehicle and at that point Gacy removed what is described as a revolver from his belt or waistband and pointed the weapon in the direction of Loren Itkin. Gacy then asked Itkin why he came to that gas station and if, in fact, if he had robbed the gas station. Itkin then made some type of reply to Mr. Gacy, at which time Gacy mumbled something and then left the area of Howard and Western. Robert Steinberg stated that was the first and the last time that he had ever seen John Gacy, and to the best of his knowledge Loren Itkin had never seen Gacy before nor has he seen him since.

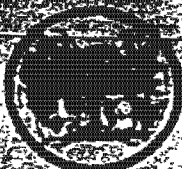

Reporting Officer was directed by Assistant State's Attorney Terry Sullivan to appear in front of Judge Fitzgerald, the Chief Judge of the Cook County Circuit Court, for the purpose of returning warrants on the John Wayne Gacy case. Also at this time a preliminary hearing was held, at which Mr. Gacy was denied bail, and there were 7 indictments for murder that were read against him at which time he responded with a not guilty plea. The original and Plaintiff Complaint for Murder against John Wayne Gacy will be superseded by a Grand Jury indictment 79-089. At this time numerous motions were presented by Mr. Amiraux, the Attorney for John Wayne Gacy, and the motions were held in abeyance pending the assignment of an actual trial judge. At this time Judge Fitzgerald assigned Judge Garriga as the trial judge for this case and the various motions made by Mr. Amiraux will be taken up by Judge Garriga. One of the primary motions that was, in fact, heard at this time was that of a psychiatric evaluation, which was requested by defense counsel for John Gacy, and the psychiatric evaluation should be returned to Judge Garriga by January 24, 1979. Present at this hearing were Mr. & Mrs. Plea and their two children, along with Reporting Officer and various other state's attorneys and investigators from the Cook County Sheriff's Police. A new date for the next hearing will be February 28, 1979 at 11 a.m. This was by agreement between defense counsel and the State's Attorney's Office. The hearing again will be held at 26th and California, the Criminal Courts Building.

The following report reflects summary of court appearances that pertain to this case, the case of John Wayne Gacy.

December 22, 1978, Des Plaines Court, Judge Marvin J. Peters, charged with Murder, No Bond.  
December 29, 1978, Des Plaines Court, Judge John L. White, John Wayne Gacy did not appear.  
on orders of Judge Richard J. Fitzgerald, who transferred it to his court at 26th & California for the prisoner's protection. The defense at this time asked that John Gacy be allowed to make bond and that the charges be dropped, due to the fact that the body of the victim had not yet been located. As far as the bond was concerned, Judge White tabled this motion to be decided on by the Judge who gets the case assigned.

On January 6, 1979, Grand Jury met and a True Bill was returned on 7 counts of Murder.

On January 10, 1979, John Gacy was brought to court before Judge Richard J. Fitzgerald for arraignment at 26th & California, where the defense brought up motions to quash the indictments; this was denied. They also asked that the search be stopped at the residence; this also was denied. The case was then assigned to Judge Louis B. Garippo, who ordered that a psychiatric work up be done, he denied bond, and when the State asked for writing exemplars as well as blood and hair samples from John Gacy, he ordered that this was to be taken under advisement and be ruled on at a later date.

On February 16, 1979 court was held again in front of Judge Louis Garippo, 26th & California. The defense brought up motions to quash the arrest, which was denied, and also a ruling was made that John Wayne Gacy was fit to stand trial and to assist in his defense.

On February 21, 1979 Gacy was again before Judge Louis Garippo at 26th & California, where the motions were heard in the case of the search warrants. The defense asked and made motions that the search warrants numbers 1 through 5 be quashed, which was denied by Judge Garippo, however he did not rule on the evidence that was seized. The State asked that the Judge order that the digging be continued, which was approved by the Judge, and he held over the request of the State to draw blood and hair samples.

On February 28, 1979 Judge Louis Garippo at 26th & California again held court for John Wayne Gacy, where other motions were heard. Among the motions were a request by the defense that the Grand Jury that was impaneled at the time of the indictments be brought back to check to see how much, if at all, they were tainted by the adverse publicity. The Judge ruled there was no way this could be done and thus denied the motion. Again, the defense brought up the item of news leaks and asked that the Judge also find Chief Lee Alfano in contempt for having made a statement to the secret service reference the security check on John Wayne Gacy. Also, it was asked that Doctor Stein also be included in this contempt citation for his remarks. Judge Louis Garippo at this time ruled on the State's request for handwriting exemplars and blood and hair samples, which are to be drawn and completed on March 16, 1979. The case was continued to April 25, 1979.

NARRATIVE:

The following is a brief synopsis of the culmination on the criminal trial of John Wayne Gacy in regards to the Piest homicide. The jury selection in regards to this case took place in Rockford, Illinois during the month of January 1980. The jury involved in this trial consisted of seven men and five women. The actual trial in this matter started on February 6, 1980 and was held in the criminal courts building at 26th & California, Chicago, Illinois.

There were a total of 79 prosecution witnesses, along with 22 defense witnesses called in this matter.

The trial terminated on March 12, 1980 after a two hour deliberation by the jury. JOHN WAYNE GACY was found guilty of 22 murders, one of which included the murder of ROBERT J. PIEST and he was also found guilty of Deviate Sexual Assault and Taking Indecent Liberties with a Child, these charges stemming from ROBERT PIEST'S murder.

After deliberation of the same jury the recommendation was made by them that JOHN WAYNE GACY be sentenced to die in the electric chair. On March 18, 1980 Judge LOUIS GARIPPO, presiding judge of the trial, sentenced JOHN WAYNE GACY to die in the electric chair on June 2, 1980. JOHN WAYNE GACY was remanded to the custody of the Illinois Department of Corrections and transported to the Menard State Penitentiary, to be held on Death Row, until his Appeal process is exhausted.

NARRATIVE:

At approximately 0845 hours this call Mrs. Piest came to the police station with her son, Kenneth, and daughter to discuss the above captioned incident. In essence Mrs. Piest indicated that at approximately 2100 hours on December 11, 1978 she went to Nisson Pharmacy, 1920 Touhy Avenue, to pick up her son, at which time she spoke briefly with the missing youth and, because of the fact that he did not re-enter the store by 2120 hours, she left the area of the pharmacy and returned home. At approximately 2140 hours Mrs. Piest again contacted Nisson Pharmacy, at which time she was advised that as of that time the youth had not returned to the store. Mrs. Piest contacted the store on a second occasion at approximately 2155 hours, at which time Robert had not yet returned to work. At 2329 hours Mrs. Piest filed the missing person's report with this department.

At 0907 hours I contacted Larry Torf, at Nisson Pharmacy, tx 827-4700, and was advised that Phillip Torf might be able to provide this Officer with additional information regarding the missing youth.

I then contacted Phillip Torf at home, tx [REDACTED] and received the following information. Phillip Torf stated that a contractor named John Gacy had entered the pharmacy on two occasions, the first being at 1800 hours and the second being at approximately 2000 hours. During the time Mr. Gacy was in the pharmacy, apparently a conversation between John Gacy and Phillip Torf took place, in which case Gacy had mentioned that he hires high school [REDACTED] for his business which is referred to as P D M. The P D M stands for Painting, Decorating & Maintenance. Phillip Torf was unable to state for certain that John Gacy had any specific conversation with the missing youth, although it is possible that Robert Piest may have overheard the conversation regarding the hiring of youths between Gacy and Phillip Torf. Mr. Torf stated that the reason Mr. Gacy was in their establishment, as he had done some remodeling approximately two years ago and at the present time Gacy works at two pharmacies. Phillip Torf stated that on December 11, 1978 after the store had received the calls from Mrs. Piest, he contacted the message service for John Gacy, tx 457-1614, although Gacy never recontacted him. During my conversation with Larry Torf, Larry indicated that Phillip Torf made a statement to Kim Byers to the effect that Rob was talking to the guy about a job.

At approximately 0915 hours I contacted P.D.M. Contractors and spoke with John Gacy. Mr. Gacy indicated that he had been in the pharmacy and had questioned Mr. Torf about some fixtures in the backyard. When asked if he had spoken with the missing youth, Mr. Gacy replied no and, when again asked if he had any personal contact with the youth, he stated no.

At 0932 hours I again contacted Larry Torf and determined that Kim Byers lives on Gregory Lane and that Kim may have additional information regarding the incident. I then determined that Kim Byers resides at 8704 D Gregory Lane, tx 824-1612.

At approximately 0942 hours I contacted Kim Byers and I was advised that Rob Piest had left the store at approximately 2100 hours and prior to leaving he made a statement to the effect "That contractor guy wants to talk to me." Upon questioning the Byer

youth further, she stated that he had left some of his personal belongings in the store and she had described the youth as kind of spacedy at times and indicated that on occasion he has a tendency to forget things. Kim Byers indicated that she did not observe the missing youth talking to John Gacy and did not observe the two together in the pharmacy.

At 1035 hours I went to Maine West and, in the presence of Assistant Principal Eldon Burke and Boys Dean Jurinek, I interviewed Ken Collier, tx [REDACTED]. The Collier youth stated that he had last spoken with the missing youth at approximately 1800 hours on 12-11-78 and at that time had no indication that the missing youth had any problems at home, in school or at the pharmacy. The Collier youth did indicate that at about the time of the homecoming Rob broke up with his girlfriend, Cary Gibbons, tx [REDACTED] although he does not feel that would be sufficient reason for the youth to leave home. Upon terminating the interview with the Collier youth, I then went to Nisson Pharmacy and spoke with Todd Schludt, tx [REDACTED] to determine if he could provide this Officer with any information.

Todd stated that he had contacted Cary Gibbons between 1000 and 1030 hours this date, although she had no information that would indicate the whereabouts of the youth.

I then went to Wall's Liquors and spoke with Stanley Wall, as it is common knowledge that the youths employed at the pharmacy purchase soda from the liquor store. Kenneth Piest advised this Officer that his brother usually purchased A & W Root Beer in bottles from Wall's, and that perhaps an employee of the liquor store might have observed Rob in the store. Upon speaking with Mr. Wall, it was determined that Timmy Kehl, tx [REDACTED] worked until 2200 hours on December 11, 1978 and that Steve Mortowski, tx [REDACTED] started at 2000 hours and that, although neither of the employees were present at that time, Timmy Kehl will begin work at approximately 1600 hours this date. Mr. Wall was advised to have Timmy Kehl contact this Officer as soon as he reports to the liquor store.

At approximately 1334 hours I contacted Kim Byers, at which time he advised this Officer that his daughter, Kim, was presently attending school at Maine North. He had no objection if we interviewed her at school.

At approximately 1357 hours I went to Maine North High School and, in the presence of Gloria Mazone, Kim Byers, DOB: 08-22-61, was interviewed from 1357 until approximately 1425 hours. Miss Byers stated that she did not remember John Gacy leaving the store, although he had been in making some measurements and was rearranging items. She further advised this Officer that in her opinion Rob has no reason to leave home. Upon questioning the Byers youth further, she indicated that Rob had left the store between 2100 and 2102 hours and she is relatively certain of the time, as he had called her to the front of the store stating "Come watch the register," at which time she asked where are you going and he stated "The contractor guy wants to talk to me. I'll be right back." Kim Byers stated that during the time Rob made that statement, Mrs. Piest was in the store. Kim further advised this Officer that Rob had been in and out of the store a few times to take out the garbage and at least on one occasion he had entered the store through the back door. She believes that he took the garbage out at approximately 2000 hours, as during that time he was struck by snowballs which were allegedly thrown by little kids. Upon further questioning her about other statements which she allegedly made, specifically the statement regarding a big boy, she advised this Officer that she had made a statement to the effect that Rob is a big boy he can take care of himself and, although she is not certain that statement may have been directed to Phil Torf. Ms. Byers stated that she doubts that the individuals at the liquor store could be of any assistance, because Rob did not enter that establishment to purchase any soda on 12-11-78. Ms. Byers was advised to contact this Officer in the event she should develop any information that would

At approximately 1330 hours this date Reporting Officer Pickell arrived at the Des Plaines Station and was briefed by Detective Adams in reference to the above incident. Reporting Officer was advised that a person who may have last had conversation with the above missing youth was Mr. John W. Gacy, tx 457-1614. Lt. Kozenczak traced this telephone number through the telephone company and learned that the number was registered to John W. Gacy, 8213 West Summerdale, Norridge, Illinois. Information was also received from Robert Piest's employer, Mr. Phillip Torf, of Misson Pharmacy, 1920 Touhy, that Mr. John Gacy has a Christmas Tree lot on Cumberland Avenue between Foster and Lawrence. The Christmas Tree lot was reportedly on the west side of Cumberland next to a church with five staples.

Reporting Officer Pickell proceeded to that location and located a Christmas Tree lot just north of St. Joseph's Ukrainian Church, 5000 North Cumberland. Reporting Officer proceeded to the Christmas Tree Lot Office and spoke with the gentleman inside, asking for Mr. John Gacy. The gentleman indicated that no John Gacy was involved with that particular Christmas Tree Lot. He indicated, however, that there was a lot further north on Cumberland and he might be associated with that Christmas Tree Lot. Two vehicles were parked in the Christmas Tree Lot. The first vehicle was a brown over tan '73 Plymouth 4 door with Illinois '78 license 566-101, which registers to Richard Fugiel, 6634 North Quallah, Chicago. The second vehicle was a '76 red Dodge Van with Illinois '78 license [REDACTED], which registers to Louis Pietlos, of [REDACTED].

Reporting Officer next proceeded to a Christmas Tree Lot which was located on the east side of Cumberland just south of Bryn Mawr. Reporting Officer spoke with a middle aged couple in the trailer located at that lot and neither party admitted knowing or hearing of Mr. John Gacy. They referred Reporting Officer to the Christmas Tree Lot next to the Ukrainian Church which had just been checked.

Reporting Officer Pickell next proceeded to the home of Mr. Gacy, 8213 West Summerdale in Norridge. Reporting Officer knocked at both the front and back doors, but there was no one apparently home.

Reporting Officer next went to the next door neighbor west of the Gacy residence and inquired of the neighbor if she knew where Mr. Gacy's Christmas Tree Lot was located. She stated that she did not. She further advised that since Mr. Gacy's 1979 Oldsmobile 4 door sedan license [REDACTED] was in his driveway, he was probably out in his truck. She advised that the truck would be easy to spot, since it had P.D. Maintenance painted on the side. A 10-28 for [REDACTED] is attached to this report.

Reporting Officer Pickell next returned to the station and attempted to collect some information on Mr. Gacy which might be useful in this investigation. Reporting Officer ran a same check through the Chicago Police Department and it was learned that he was arrested in Chicago reference I.R. 273632. Mr. Gacy's Date of Birth is 17 March 1942.

## NARRATIVE

At 1730 hours on December 12, 1978 R/O was contacted at his residence regarding an update on the Piest investigation. Det. Adams advised R/O that at this time there were no further paths of investigation left and Det. Adams requested direction regarding what further steps should be taken regarding the missing boy.

R/O advised Det. Adams to stand-by at the Youth Bureau, while R/O contacted Cook County States Attorney/Felony Review at 26th & California, Chicago, IL. At this time R/O contacted the Night Duty States Attorney and advised him of the facts surrounding this case. R/O told the on-duty S/A that Mr. Gacy was in the drug store on the night that the boy disappeared and that Mr. Gacy also had a long rap sheet that contained a conviction for Sodomy in the state of Iowa.

The S/A was advised by Lt. Kozenczak that R/O wanted to go to Mr. Gacy's residence and question him in regard to the boy disappearing on the same night that Mr. Gacy was in the drug store. The on-duty S/A told this R/O that I should be very careful regarding the questioning of this subject as the subject could refuse to admit R/O into his residence and it would be to R/O's advantage to possibly discuss this case with States Attorneys in Dist. 3. R/O explained that he had tried to reach the 3rd District S/A but none were available for a conference.

At this time R/O decided to go to the Gacy house and advised Det. Pickell to stand-by at HQ and to have Det. Olsen and Det. Sommerschild prepare to accompany R/O to Mr. Gacy's residence.

At 2100 hours on 12 December 1978 R/O returned to the Des Plaines Police HQ and held a briefing with Det. Pickell, Det. Olsen and Det. Sommerschild. R/O advised that a decision was made that we would all proceed to the residence of John W. Gacy and would utilize two squads. All officers concerned were told that this would be a informal type interview and we would be asking Mr. Gacy for his cooperation in this matter and R/O would then ask Mr. Gacy to accompany us back to the Des Plaines Police HQ. for further questioning.

At 2130 hours all of the aforementioned officers and R/O proceeded to the home of John W. Gacy, 8213 W. Summerdale, Morridge, IL. Upon arrival R/O directed Det. Gisen and Det. Sommerschild to go to the rear of the residence and R/O and Det. Pickell went to the front door. At this time R/O knocked on the front door and after several minutes it was noted by R/O that the shadow of a subject could be seen staring out of a small window in the front door, but whoever this subject was he would not respond to R/O's knocking. At this time a van type vehicle pulled into the driveway of the Gacy residence and the driver identified himself as Michael Rossi, an employee of PCM Contractors. Mr. Rossi advised R/O that Mr. Gacy would not answer the front door and that R/O should go to the East side of the residence and knock on the side door.

Upon proceeding to the East side of the residence R/O stopped in front of a large picture window and upon looking into the window R/O observed a subject who was identified by Mr. Rossi, as John W. Gacy. Mr. Gacy was sitting in a recliner chair watching television.

R/O knocked on the back door and Mr. Gacy responded by opening the door and prior to R/O identifying himself as a Police Officer Mr. Gacy stated "I heard you knocking at the front door, but I was in the bathroom". R/O identified himself as a police officer and told him that we were at his home to ask him some questions regarding a missing boy from the City of Des Plaines. R/O advised Mr. Gacy that we had information that he was in the drug store on the same night that R. Piest was in there.

At this time Mr. Gacy stated that he had been in the drug store (Nisson Pharmacy) on the night in question and that he came to the drug store after being called by one of the owners (Mr. Phil Torf) to do an estimate for work inside of the drug store. Mr. Gacy denied that he even saw anyone in the drug store who would match the missing boys description, however he vaguely recalled two younger people who were employees of the drug store. He denied having any conversation with these youths, but may have asked one of them if there were any old shelving at the outside rear of the drug store.

Mr. Gacy told R/O that he left the drug store around 2045 hours and went directly home. Mr. Gacy advised R/O that upon his arrival at home he had received information that his uncle had died, at which time he had gone to Northwest Hospital which is located at Central & Addison, Chicago, IL. for the purpose of talking with his Aunt, who was the wife of the deceased uncle.

R/O advised Mr. Gacy that R/O would like Mr. Gacy to accompany him to the Des Plaines Police Headquarters for the purpose of him writing a witness statement out regarding what he remembered about the night at the Nisson Drug Store when the boy disappeared. Mr. Gacy stated that he would not be able to go right at this time as he was expecting a long distance call from his mother in Arkansas, regarding the death of his uncle. At the prompting of R/O, Mr. Gacy called his mother and conversed with her for about 10 minutes. At the end of the conversation on the phone, Mr. Gacy was about to get his coat when the side door opened and Michael Rossi entered the residence. (Mr. Rossi had been detained outside of the house by Det. Olsen & Det. Sommerschield) Once Mr. Rossi entered, Mr. Gacy appeared to gain some confidence and told R/O that he would not go with him as he had more important things to do. R/O advised Mr. Gacy that the missing boy was also an important issue and that the boys parents were very concerned about his disappearance.

Mr. Gacy told R/O that he had some other things to do and he would try to come into the station later this evening. R/O gave his business card to Mr. Gacy and told him that he would stay at the station waiting for his arrival.

Upon leaving the residence R/O assigned Det. Sommerschield & Det. Olsen to stake out the Gacy residence and to keep R/O advised of any activity that might take place once R/O and Det. Pickell left the area. Det. S & Det. O. set up an observation point about a 1/4 block east of the residence on Summerdale St.

Upon leaving the area of Mr. Gacy's residence R/O and Det. Pickell were proceeding North on Cumberland Ave at the Kennedy Expressway when radio traffic was received from Det. Sommerschield that they had lost Mr. Gacy who was driving his private vehicle, in the area of Summerdale & Cumberland Ave. The R/O then advised the stake-out team to proceed to the Des Plaines Police HQ. for further instructions.

While at the CID HQ, R/O received a call from Mr. Gacy around 2300 Hrs. at which time Mr. Gacy asked this R/O if Lt. Kozenczak still wanted to talk with him. R/O advised Mr. Gacy that I did want to talk with him and that I would wait for him at the Des Plaines Police HQ. R/O waited for Mr. Gacy until around 0100 Hrs. and at this time R/O left word with the 11/7 Desk Officer that if Mr. Gacy shows up tell him that he is to report to the DPPD. in the morning of 13 December 1978.

AT 0050 HOURS, LT. J. KOZENCZAK ADVISED THE R/O THAT HE HAD BEEN EXPECTING A MR. JOHN GACEY TO COME INTO THE STATION AND TALK WITH HIM, BUT MR. GACEY WAS LATE. LT. <p>Upon R/O arriving at work at 0800 Hrs. 13 December 1978 it was observed that a note had been left for R/O by the 11/7 Desk officer, which stated that Mr. Gacy had shown up at the DPPD asking for R/O at about 0330 Hrs. The D/O stated that Mr. Gacy's clothes were disarranged and that he had a glassy look in his eyes. Upon the completion of typing the Request for and the Warrant (Search) itself R/O in the company of S/A Sullivan went in front of Judge Marvin Peters and presented these documents for Judge Peters approval. At 1540 hours the Search Warrant was approved and R/O called next door to the DPPD to advise Det. Pickell not to release Mr. Gacy.

R/O called a meeting of all available investigative staff and advised them that we would be proceeding to 8213 W. Summerdale to search the residence of Mr. Gacy. The officers who participated in this search process were: Lt. Kozenczak (R/O), Det. Pickell, Det. Kautz, Det. Tovar, Det. Adams, Det. Olsen and assisting with evidence processing would be Off. Karl Humbert of the C.C.S.P., as Mr. Gacy's house is located within the jurisdiction of the Cook County Sheriff. The search warrant that was authorized is S.A. 78-1-003792.

Initial entry was made into the residence by R/O and it was noted that the residence was in complete darkness. Upon completion of the search Mr. Gacy's residence was secured and all items of evidence secured were returned to the DPPD for processing and inventory. The search was culminated at around 1900 Hrs. 12/13/78.

At 2200 Hours 12/13/78, Mr. Gacy was interviewed briefly by Lt. Kozenczak & Inv. Bedoe. Prior to this interview and in the presence of his attorney Mr. Stevens, Mr. Gacy was given his Miranda warnings and was asked to sign the Miranda sheet. All youths questioned, with the exception of Yolanda Quille, who stated she did not know Robert Piest, had the highest opinion of the boy. All stated that he was definitely not the type of boy who would run away or do things on impulse. They stated that to their knowledge the boy was not involved with drugs. None of them had any idea where he might be at this time. The last youth to have seen the victim was Michael Miller. He saw the boy at Misson Pharmacy at approximately 1930 hours on 11 December 78. He had no conversation with Robert, outside of saying hello. He seemed to be in good spirits at that time.

Reporting Officer was not able to contact two of the names Detective Adams assigned him. James Rosner and Kenneth Quinn, were both out of town in college and, according to their parents, probably would have not been in contact with the victim. Reporting Officer also interviewed a Pat Horndasch, Steven P. Bahr, and Venessa Berry. Pat Horndasch related that he last saw the victim at gymnastics practice at Maine West High School. This was on 11 December 78 at approximately 1730 hours. He had had conversations with the victim during practice, but noticed nothing unusual. Steven Bahr states he is no longer a close friend of the victim. He has no ideas as to the youth's whereabouts. Venessa Berry related that she hasn't seen the victim since last summer. Reporting Officer also attempted to contact Randy J. Uidl, He wasn't at home, but a message was left for him to contact this Officer. As of this time he has not done so.

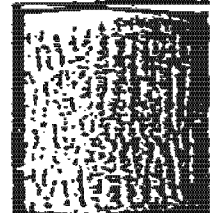

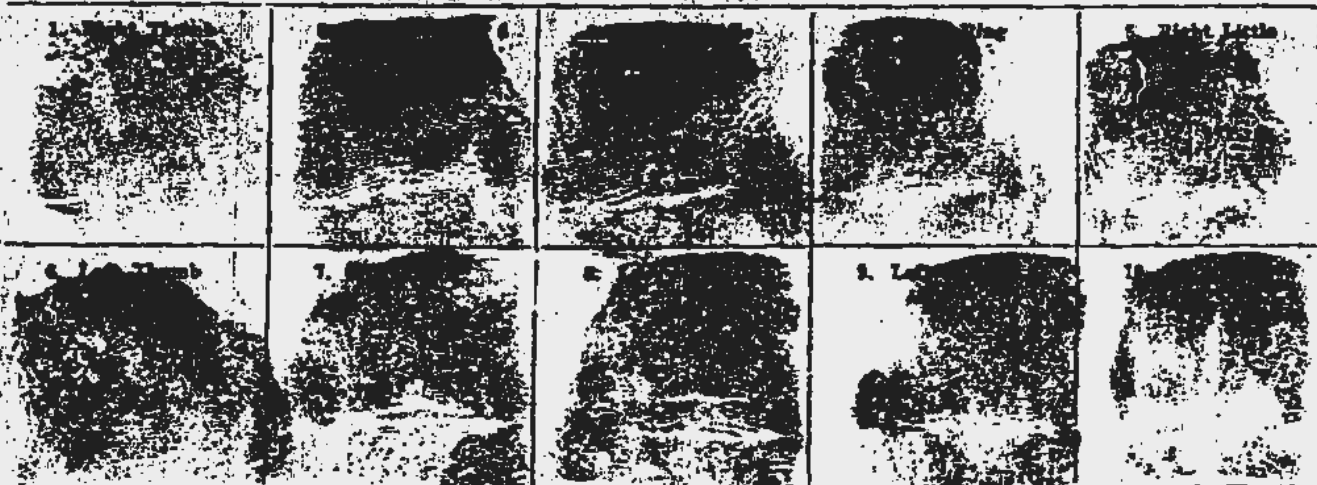
