NARRATIVE:

On the above time and date Robert L. Zimmerman, DOB: [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] was interviewed by Detective Tovar and Adams. Zimmerman indicated that he works at the Shell Station which is owned by John Lucas, located at 300 Higgins in Park Ridge, approximately 20 to 23 hours per week. He stated that he was familiar with John Gacy, as Gacy uses his credit card to obtain gas for his black vehicles. Zimmerman stated that he first became acquainted with John Gacy during the summer months of 1977, at which time he met Gacy at a party; in which case he felt the party consisted of approximately 10 per cent young people. Bob recalls that he remained at the party from approximately 2:00 until 0000 hours, was not familiar with any other individuals that attended the party and sat at the far end of the table. Once before Zimmerman had visited the Gacy residence, in which case a youth was already present at the Gacy home and he recalls that that youth was Rich Henley. Upon arriving at the Gacy residence for the second time, Zimmerman learned that Gacy and Henley had already been engaged in a pool game and allegedly Henley had been waiting for the Zimmerman youth and subsequently the three individuals became engaged in a game of pool. Zimmerman advised us that at approximately the same time they became engaged in a pool game, Gacy wanted to make a bet that if the individual won the pool game, he would give him a blow job or any unspecified amount of money. Gacy then asked Zimmerman and Henley if they wanted to bet; at which time Zimmerman advised Gacy "I don't get turned on by that." Zimmerman indicated that he then left the party, although Henley remained at the Gacy residence. The following day Zimmerman engaged Henley in a conversation and asked if he had stayed to play pool, at which time Henley advised Zimmerman that he had left shortly after Zimmerman. Zimmerman stated that the last time he was at the Gacy residence was approximately two months ago, at which time he played bumper pool. When asked about personal opinions of Gacy, Zimmerman replied that Gacy does construction work and sells dope and on one occasion had mentioned something about pharmaceutical drugs. Zimmerman advised us that he had observed some black pills on one occasion, although he did not pay too much attention, as he is not involved in drugs. Prior to the termination of the interview, Zimmerman advised us that a female from the Edison Home in Park Ridge had purchased drugs from Gacy on two occasions, although he had no additional information regarding that incident.

NARRATIVE

At about 0010 hours R/O and Officer Albrecht started our surveillance of John Gacy. We relieved the other units and began to follow Gacy westbound on the Kennedy Expressway at Lawrence. At 0030 hours Gacy drove to the Moose Lodge in Des Plaines. While in the Moose Lodge, Gacy spent most of the time speaking with Ed Hefner. At 0130 hours Gacy left the Moose Lodge and went to the Pot & Pan Restaurant in Des Plaines and stayed at that location until 0200 hours. Gacy then drove south on River Road to Algonquin, east on Algonquin to Talcott, Talcott to Cumberland and he entered the Kennedy Expressway towards Chicago. At approximately 0215 hours Gacy arrived at the Good Luck Bar in Chicago located on Elston and Pulaski. Parked right by the door was a brown van, license number [REDACTED]. Gacy got in the van, spoke with the occupants for a few minutes and then entered the Good Luck Bar by himself. He left the bar at approximately 0315 hours and went to another bar located at 3535 West Irving Park in Chicago. The name of that bar was PJ's. He stayed at that location from approximately 0315 hours to about 0430 hours and most of that time sat and spoke with a female by the name of Pam [REDACTED] ki. At 0430 hours he went to a bar called the Unforgettable at 4200 West Irving Park Road in Chicago. He left that location at 0500 hours. The subject then drove to Franklin Park looking for an open bar with negative results. The subject then proceeded to Cumberland Avenue where he went in the Golden Bear Restaurant in Norridge. After eating breakfast, he drove back to his home and arrived there at 0615 hours. At 0910 hours a black Lincoln Continental with license plate number [REDACTED] driven by a Ed Frey stopped by the house and he entered the house. A short time later both subjects left the house in their own vehicles. They were en route to Pulaski and North at their construction site. On the way to that location, Gacy stopped on Tripp Avenue in Chicago, where Ed Hefner lives. He stayed there for a few minutes and then went on to the construction site by himself to Pulaski and North. At about 1230 hours Ed Hefner then showed up at the construction site at Pulaski and North and went inside. We were then relieved by the on-coming shift.

On December 16, 1978 at approximately 1027 hours Detectives Pickell and Adams interviewed Richard Raphael, DOB: [REDACTED] in The Friendly Restaurant at the Fox Valley Shopping Center in Aurora, Illinois. Richard Raphael, a general contractor, entered the contracting business approximately 10 years ago and, as indicated by Mr. Raphael, he is responsible for building stores. Raphco Incorporated is only a few months old and was started by Mr. Raphael in August of 1978. Prior to being involved with Raphco, Mr. Raphael was involved in with a company known as Herber. Mr. Raphael said he is presently associated with Mr. Gacy, as Gacy is considered a superintendent in the Raphco Company, although he emphasized that Mr. Gacy is not considered a partner. The P.D.M. Company is solely owned by Mr. Gacy. Mr. Raphael met John Gacy approximately 3 years ago, in which case John and Richard started on a subcontractor basis. While affiliated, John Gacy provided general building services such as painting and carpentry. Mr. Raphael indicated that he has never had any problems with Mr. Gacy. Approximately 2 1/2 years ago Richard Raphael entered into a new partnership, at which time John Gacy did not get along with Mr. Raphael's partner; therefore Richard Raphael sold his interest in the company. At approximately the same time John Gacy quit a company which was referred to as P.E. Systems and Gacy came to work for Richard Raphael. As a superintendent, John Gacy is paid \$675 weekly, plus labor and material, in which case Gacy receives his money from Richard Raphael and in turn John Gacy pays his employees from the money he receives from Mr. Raphael. Mr. Raphael indicated that his association with Gacy began in September of 1978 and had not seen Gacy in 1977 or 1978 prior to September of 1978. Mr. Raphael indicated that John Gacy did have access to the Raphael residence. Mr. Raphael was then questioned regarding the personal relationship between him and John Gacy, at which time Mr. Raphael replied that he did not consider himself to be on the same social level as John Gacy. When asked to elaborate on that statement, Mr. Raphael said "Most of my associates are more professional, such as doctors or lawyers," and that he never socialized with Gacy. Mr. Raphael went on to say that he has only been married two years and that his relationship with John Gacy is 100 per cent business. Mr. Raphael indicated that he had never observed any odd behavior on John Gacy's part and a couple of weeks ago Gacy had mentioned to his wife that he was married or had been married. Gacy had further stated that approximately 2 1/2 years ago a female with a couple of kids had been living with him, although it is unknown if the female he was referring to was, in fact, Gacy's wife.

Upon being questioned about Mr. Gacy's employees, Mr. Raphael replied that John used to pick up guys to work for him, although he does not recall the names of the employees, because there were too many names to remember. Mr. Raphael used Mr. Gacy and Mr. Gacy's employees whenever necessary and was certain that the following individuals are presently employed by John Gacy. #1: Michael Rossi, #2: Ed Heftner and #3: David Cram. Mr. Raphael was then asked if he had any information regarding Ed Heftner, at which time he replied he believes Heftner is 23 or 24 years old, is married, has 2 children and appears to be a nice guy. We then asked Mr. Raphael if he was familiar with an individual named Gordon, at which time he replied that he believes Gordon is a relative of John Gacy's and that Gordon does the book work for John Gacy and works about a half a day.

We then questioned Mr. Raphael regarding Max Gussis, the plumber, at which time he replied Max is very strange, not worth talking to, a nut, unreliable, can't be

trusted, must be watched very closely and in addition not a very good plumber. When asked if Mr. Raphael had any additional information regarding John, he stated that John is not known to take vacations and would be considered a workaholic, that he talks a big tune and is the commissioner of streets in Norwood Park. He then requested any information regarding any telephone conversations between Richard Raphael and the Nisson Pharmacy on Tuesday, December 12, 1978.

As best as Mr. Raphael can recall, he stated that he had called the drug store and spoken with the pharmacist and believed that call was placed sometime during the day. When asked about the business relationship, Mr. Raphael indicated that John Gacy is responsible for making estimates and if it involved something worthwhile, he would become involved. Mr. Raphael feels that John Gacy is not up on complex matters, although he could be trained. Mr. Raphael said on Monday, December 11, 1978, he had a phone conversation with John Gacy, in which case he believed that John Gacy was to spend a portion of his day on a job site on North Avenue and had a subsequent appointment at 1700 hours at Nisson Pharmacy. Mr. Raphael stated that the last time he spoke with John Gacy on Monday, December 11, 1978, was sometime between 1730 and 1830 hours, although he does not recall if he called John Gacy or John Gacy called him. Although he does remember that he was at his residence, although he does not know the whereabouts of John Gacy. On Monday, December 11, 1978, at approximately 2230 hours Richard Raphael attempted to contact John Gacy to inquire why John did not attend an important meeting which had been scheduled for 1900 hours that date. Mr. Raphael stated that when he attempted to contact Gacy at 2230 hours, he found that Gacy's phone was busy. Richard Raphael advised these Officers that at approximately 2235 hours he received a call from John Gacy, at which time Gacy advised him that, although he was home, he did not answer his phone. Mr. Gacy further advised Mr. Raphael that he had a flat tire and was concerned because his uncle was sick or had died and that he did not want to talk and did not want to do business. Mr. Raphael then informed Mr. Gacy that he would speak with him at 0700 hours on Tuesday, December 12th. On December 12, 1978 Mr. Raphael met with Mr. Gacy, at which time Mr. Gacy stated to Mr. Raphael that he did not want to talk on the phone and he did not have a flat tire. During the conversation between Mr. Gacy and Mr. Raphael, both individuals were at their respective homes. The 0700 hours conversation involved the fact that John Gacy missed the important meeting which had been scheduled for 1900 hours on 11 December 1978. Mr. Raphael stated that he went to John Gacy's home on Tuesday, December 12, 1978, at approximately 0745 hours, as the two had planned to have breakfast and while at the Gacy residence, Mr. Gacy was on the phone with someone from the police department, at which time he was advised by Gacy that the police department wished to speak with him, as he had been a character witness. Mr. Raphael indicated on Tuesday morning John Gacy and Richard Raphael met for breakfast and, after breakfast, went to give an estimate and ultimately went to the Gacy residence. While at the Gacy residence, Mr. Raphael observed that Gordon was in the office. Mr. Raphael advised us that Mr. Gacy had placed a few calls and subsequently went to the police station. John Gacy had indicated to Mr. Raphael that he had an appointment at Nisson Pharmacy for 1700 hours and is certain of that time because he had scheduled an appointment for 1730 hours that date. Mr. Raphael advised us that John Gacy had stated that while at Nisson Pharmacy, he had forgotten his book. Richard Raphael stated that he did not notice anything odd about Gacy's behavior on Tuesday morning, December 12th.

When questioned regarding the activities of Mr. Gacy on Wednesday, December 13, 1978, Mr. Raphael was unable to provide us with any information regarding that date.

Mr. Raphael stated that he went to the Gacy residence at approximately 2330 hours the night John Gacy was released from the police station. Mr. Gacy then advised Mr. Raphael that the police had taken some dry cleaning, some speed, some marijuana and a few small tools and went into a story about a boy that

had stayed there who had plasma attacks. Mr. Raphael has never known John Gacy to smoke grass and did make reference to some stag film. Mr. Gacy further advised Mr. Raphael that the police had taken a portion of his carpeting, which contained blood stains and that the blood on the carpet was from a cut when the carpet had been installed when someone cut himself. Mr. Raphael was asked if he was aware of any employees presently living with John Gacy, in which case he replied negatively. Mr. Raphael was familiar with the fact that at one time Michael Rossi and David Cram did stay at the Gacy residence and that other young kids had also been staying there. Mr. Raphael was then questioned regarding the important meeting which had been scheduled for Monday, December 11, 1978.

Mr. Raphael advised us that sometime between 1700 and 1800 hours on December 11, 1978 he had received a phone call from John Gacy, although John did not give his location, at which time John advised him that he would attend that meeting which had been scheduled for sometime between 1900 and 1930 hours. Mr. Raphael further indicated that he was under the distinct impression that John and another individual would attend that meeting and he had further stated to John that he had ordered a pizza for him. Mr. Raphael stated that the four individuals that were to attend the meeting to discuss some fixtures were the superintendent of the Bruce/Ken Pharmacy, himself, Richard Raphael, a Les-On representative and John Gacy. Mr. Raphael stated that when he determined that John Gacy did not attend the meeting, which had been scheduled for 1900 hours, he attempted to reach Gacy and ultimately Gacy contacted him at 2235 hours. Mr. Raphael was then questioned regarding the Tuesday meeting he had with John Gacy, which was held at the Bruce and Ken Pharmacy at which time we were advised that the Tuesday meeting was not scheduled until after John Gacy had missed the important meeting on Monday evening.

Richard Raphael said that on Wednesday John Gacy was to be running the North Avenue job and a few other errands, although when he spoke with him, Gacy appeared to be somewhat incoherent. In Mr. Raphael's opinion, John Gacy did not know he was going into the police station. Mr. Raphael stated that he first knew John Gacy was at the police station at approximately 1430 hours when he received a call from Gacy, at which time Gacy requested that Mr. Raphael get him an attorney, as he was aware of the fact that Mr. Raphael's father is an attorney. Prior to concluding our interview, Mr. Raphael was asked how well he knew John Gacy, to which he replied "I never took the time to know him that well." John has been acting irrational or scared since Wednesday. We then asked Mr. Raphael if John Gacy was aware of the fact that we were going to interview him today, to which he replied yes, John is aware of our meeting and that he made no request regarding any coaching. John advised Mr. Raphael to tell the police everything they know. We then requested any pertinent information Mr. Raphael might have regarding the youths employed by Mr. Gacy, at which time we were advised that he has only known the kids for a couple of months, therefore did not have to much information. Prior to terminating the interview, Mr. Raphael was advised that it may be necessary to speak with him again, at which time he advised us that he would cooperate in any way possible. The interview was terminated at 1140 hours on 16 December 1978.

NARRATIVE:

CONFIDENTIAL

The following report reflects my activities in a continuing investigation of a missing person (murder) of Robert Piest, which was originally filed by his mother on December 11, 1978.

On today's date at approximately 0945 hours I was advised by Lt. Frank Braun, of the Cook County Sheriff's Police, that after having interviewed John Wayne Gacy at the Cook County Jail Complex, Cermak Hospital, in the presence of his attorney, he had advised them where the jacket of Robert Piest could be located within the house. Lt. Braun pointed out the location to me, which is in the area which was commonly known as the pantry area, and after having removed two boxes of food stuffs; one of Pine-Sol Cleaner and one of Stewed Tomatoes, a small hole at the base of the south wall was observed. This hole is approximately 12 inches west of the joist directly underneath the west side of the door jamb that leads to the dining area. The hole is 2"x4" and from there once a light was shone into the area, you could observe the blue material of the jacket within. At this time I went into the area below the level of the crawl space of the addition and from the crawl space under the pantry I could observe a paper bag covering up the hole. This paper bag turned out to be a large grocery type bag from Dominicks Finer Foods and, once it was moved over to the side, the blue ski jacket could be observed more clearly. Photographs were then taken by Lt. Al Taylor, of the Cook County Sheriff's Police, Evidence Technician Department, and at this time I went upstairs again to remove said item. The item is a light blue ski jacket with a hood of the brand name of Pacific Trail. The jacket was removed from the hole and in the immediate locale of it was also recovered an Oral-B-20 yellow toothbrush in a small piece of foil that appears to be packaging for a cigar. All items were recovered, initialed by the recovering officer, Detective Rafael Tovar/Star #222, and witnessed by Evidence Technician Tom Richard/Star #240. Items were initialed by both officers and recovered at 1000 hours on January 4, 1979. Items were further photographed by Lt. Taylor and then were transported to the Des Plaines Police Department, where they were held in evidence at this time. They were inventoried under the file number of 78-35203. The exact area where the jacket was found is between the second and third joists in quadrant 4-S of the coordinates drawn by the Cook County Sheriff's Police Evidence Technicians. This would have been directly underneath the entrance of the dining area, which is the new addition to the house. Further reports to follow.

NARRATIVE

The following report reflects my activities in a follow up investigation of a missing person's report which was originally filed on December 10, 1978 by the victim's mother.

On December 14, 1978 I had an occasion to go to the residence of Michael A. Rossi on [REDACTED] to transport him to the station for questioning in regards to the missing person's case we were working on at the time. It was at this time that I observed Michael Rossi arrive at his home in a white '71 Plymouth Satellite bearing Illinois for '78 plates [REDACTED]. Michael Rossi was then transported to the station for questioning and subsequently released.

On December 16, 1978 I had an occasion to speak to Detective Bell'anni, of Area 6/General Assignment, Chicago Police Department, reference to the John A. Szyk case and obtained a copy of the missing person's report. While at the station reviewing the report, I noticed that the vehicle in question that was listed for John Szyk was a '71 white Plymouth Satellite bearing license plate number [REDACTED]. It was at this time that it occurred to me that this was the same type of vehicle which was being driven by Michael Rossi. I attempted to get a 10-28 on the '76 plate [REDACTED] but due to the age I was unable to do so. I was advised that Officer Adams had obtained a amount of paperwork from Szyk's mother and among them was the registration for 1977 for Szyk's car. The license plate issued to him was [REDACTED] Illinois for 1977. I was able to obtain a 10-28 on this, which registered to John A. Szyk at [REDACTED]. This vehicle showed that it had a serial number of RH23616239297 on a 1971 Plymouth Satellite 2 door. I then went to the Soundex System and looked up Michael A. Rossi Jr. and found that he had a 1971 white Plymouth Satellite bearing Illinois '78 plates [REDACTED]. This plate, when run through the computer, indicated that it had a registration of RH23616739297. It was here that it was determined that this was very probably the same car. The only number difference would have been the number following the second G. On Szyk's registration it shows as a 2 and on Rossi's it shows as a 7. A registration check was immediately sent and it was later determined that this was one in the same vehicle after one of the officers went down to the house of Rossi and also viewed the vehicle and saw the serial number to be, in fact, a 2 and not a 7 as indicated on his registration and title form. It was now positively determined that this was the vehicle that belonged to John A. Szyk at one time. Further action to follow.
