Since I had already been notified that would be having a hearing at 10am Friday, May 2nd, I felt the case had to be expedited for presentation to the prosecutor first thing in the moring. This was accomplished by competing all reports at 01:30am, 5-2-75.

5-2-75 09:35am arrived at our office found out superior court but brought back down pending a conference by the Prosecuting Atty, the defense atty, and the Judge. I took the case to the Prosecutor, calling him out of the conference to remitt the file to him. At this time it was confirmed that a plea of guilty was being considered. I again stressed that we should settle for no less then a Guilty Plea to at least one count of Rape in light of all findings made in the investigation.

At that time there may be a Court Order submitted to have him sent to Western State for a 90 day observation period as, or under, the Sexual Psychopath provisions of the Law.

She came home, studied awhile and got ready to go to work. She works at the Crossroads Cafe as a waitress. She went to work and began her shift at 3:00pm.

She got off work at 11:00pm and went to visit a friend for a short visit. She arrived at the residence of her friend, a former classmate that has quit school. Deanne Edison. At that time Edison was living at an apartment located at 2nd and Walnut. She went home from there arriving at around 11:30om. Her mother confirms this because she was waiting up for her to arrive home. She changed out of her working uniform and asked her mother permission to meet Deanne and another girl, KIM LINDSTROM, for coffee. This had been tenatively arranged when she visited Dearme at her apartment. Mrs recalls her asking permission to go out and being granted because the girl had done nothing for two weeks but go to school and then to work and her mother felt she was entitled to a short break in her routine.

Her mother also recalls telling the girl to take her own car to assure she could get home early and not have to depend on anyone for a ride. The girl left the house and went to Sambos, where she had agreed to meet her friends. She indicates that she arrived at Sambos between 12:30am and 1:00am, the girl friends were waiting there for her.

When she left Bembos to go home her car would not start. That is when the suspect, whom she now positively identifies as her and asked if she needed help in starting her car, she accepted his offer She got out of the car, a Volkswagen 2dr, and stood at the rear of the car while he openned the engine compartment. At this point she states that the subject REPLACED a loose wire, she got back in the car and it started. The young men then asked for a ride home and she felt obligated to give him a ride and agreed to do so.

The girl, in her initial statement, and even now, maintains he KEPLACED a loose wire which allowed the car to be started.

now states that after the incident he noticed that the locking mechanism, which was located on the lid to the engine compartment, is missing off the car. It had been in place prior to the incident. In fact, it was soon after the incident that he noted it missing and he went to the Sambos parking lot looking for it. He feels it was taken off on purpose and thought it might be found in that area. It was never found.

This man, who's phtograph I have identified, was in there all this time, in fact he mingled with out group during the evening, playing foosball with some of the group. I was sitting at a booth near one of the pool tables and he came up and asked me if I wanted to play pool. I said, "Sure", I like to play pool . I got up and played one game with him. On the evening of Sunday, April 27th, 1975. Officer Dave Mack arrived at our ENTRY: office. He is with the Central Washington State College Police Department. He told our duty jailer, Deputy Don Holke, that his chief, AL PICKLES, had received information that we had a subject in jail on a charge of RAPE that resembled "TED". He had been ordered to pickup the case file and come interrogate the subject on the "TED" angle. Deputy Holke thought it better that I be contacted and the matter be cleared first. I spoke to Officer Mack, found out his purpose and informed him we were aware of the "TED" case, that some observations had been made by members of our department that our suspect matched the description of "TED" in some respects, but; We had not filed formal charges yet, the man had agreed to a polygraph exam, and I was not about ready to allow anyone to interrogate him at this stage about any other involvement. That once formal charges were filed they would be notified and if the Chief had any questions he could contact me personally. Officer Mack abided by our wishes. It was also explained that we are looking at the suspect as being involved in at least four cases in our jurisdiction which are now under close investigation. It was at this time that Deputy Holke came back on the phone and advised me that John Jenks, the polygraph operator, would be in our office at 07:30am the next day.

EMTRY: At approximately 11:30am, 4-28-75, I discussed the case with Deputy Prosecutor David Gorrie, I specifically stated we were looking at the man as a good suspect in three other incidents, one of them the Rape of a 17 year old. I went on to indicate we would be working as hard and as fast as possible in cinching these cased because the possibility of other agencies becoming acutely interested is very good.

At 3:00pm Dep. Pros. Gorrie had me bring to Lower County District Court on Bail hearing. Upon my recommendations he asked for and got bail at \$10,000 and bound the subject over to Superior Court, assuring the District Court Judge Pro-Tem, Brian Fredrickson that the formal charges would be filed and arraignment would be set for 9:30am the following day in Superior Court.

Shortly before taking to the Bail hearing, he was visited by Atty Brian Dano, of the Dano-Cone-Fraser & Gilreath Law Firm. Mr. Brian Dano indicated that his associate, Mr. Gleary Cone had been retained as Mr.

FNTRY: 4-29-75 09:30am, approximately, was arraigned and formal charges filed and served against him charging him with 2 Countrys of Rape, based on the case only.

On this day I began typing a Case Profile which consisted of the 17 year old Rape this case, another one of our cases and a City case. Only two of the four involved actual Rape. There was a very striking potential that was the same man involved in all four cases.

On the afternoon of the 28th I had contacted Chief Al Pickles of CWSC Police Dept. I told him we would have formal charges and I would be willing to begin sharing information.

Chief Pickles indicated he would notify Officer Cheryl Martin of his department to come in on 4-29-75, she was off on Monday's.

4-29-75 approximately 10:00am, Officer Cherly Martin arrived and I discussed this ENTRY: case, previous cases on file and the suspect, whom had now been charged. It was pointed out that with the exception of the case he is under arrest for, used some play which appealed to the victims sympathy. The 1st case, which was reported to the city, he told victim he had lost his keys, 2nd case, , he helped victim start her car he needed jumper cables, 3rd case, then asked for a ride home, victim felt obligated to give him a ride. It was pointed out to Officer Mattin that we still did not have him positively identified on the other cases one file, and we wanted to proceed cautiously so as not to jeopardize this case by inducing public prejudice prior to settling it. It was agreed we would work together, sharing information, to see if there could be any connection between and an individual they were seeking that had approached two girls at Central prior to the Susan Rancourt case coming up. It had already been the intention of this department to contact other agencies as soon as practical to determine if there could be any connection to "TED".

Officer Martin indicated she would begin checking records at CWSC to determine if had any close connection to Rancourt, such as taking classes together etc,. I indicated to her at this time that I would be interested in seeing statements from witnesses in their investigation.

After she left I recalled telling me on the day of his arrest, Sunday, that he at one time had lived with 4 other subjects on a rent sharing bases, the other subjects were students at Central. The information was needed in order to make recommendations to the Prosecutor with regards to PR.

I recontacted in his cell and again enumerated his places of residence from the time he arrived in Ellensburg to present. He indicated he arrived in Ellensburg in around February or March of 1973, having been discharged from the Marines in January 1973.
