Since I had already been notified that [REDACTED] would be having a hearing at 10am Friday, May 2nd, I felt the [REDACTED] case had to be expedited for presentation to the prosecutor first thing in the morning. This was accomplished by competing all reports at 01:30am, 5-2-75.

ENTRY: 5-2-75 09:35am arrived at our office found out [REDACTED]'s appearance had been moved up to 9:30, he had been taken upstairs to Superior Court but brought back down pending a conference by the Prosecuting Atty, the defense atty, and the Judge. I took the [REDACTED] case to the Prosecutor, calling him out of the conference to remitt the file to him. At this time it was confirmed that a plea of guilty was being considered. I again stressed that we should settle for no less then a Guilty Plea to at least one count of Rape in light of all findings made in the investigation.

It was still felt that a guilty plea would hasten our ability to begin sharing information with the "TED" Task Force. It is still considered crucial that the case here is settled to some extent because of anticipated News Interest which may come about thru contacting the Task Force.

After the conference between the lawyers and the Judge, I was informed that [REDACTED] would be entering a plea either Monday, May 5, 1975 or Tuesday, May 6th. At that time there may be a Court Order submitted to have him sent to Western State for a 90 day observation period as, or under, the Sexual Psychopath provisions of the Law.

POST ENTRY: On April 29, 1975, Tuesday, an All Points Bulletin was sent out via Teletype to Washington, Oregon, Idaho and California. It had been determined that [REDACTED] had travelled these states. A copy of that teletype is included in this file. The following requests were received. Some by teletype, others by phone.

ENTRY: 5-1-75 I was assigned the following task by Undersheriff Benavides. The task was to take a total of 12 photographs, which had been put together from our files by Chief Jailer Cooper. Among the photographs was one of [REDACTED]. The photographs were to be shown by me to two specific individuals, [REDACTED] in reference to our case number 75-000363 and [REDACTED] in reference to a complaint made by her to the Ellensburg Police Department. The object was to determine if either one of these subjects could identify, among the photos compiled, the person involved in the incidents involving them.

5-1-75 10:00AM. I contacted [REDACTED] at [REDACTED], N. Ruby, her place of employment. I advised her I had some photographs for her to view, there were other employees present so I requested to use a separate room if available for privacy. This was done.

All data identifying the subject, such as arrest number, date of arrest, were blocked from view on the face of the photos. Each photo had then been numbered on the back. A control list had been prepared showing exactly who was in the photo. Photo #8 was that of [REDACTED].

Each photo was shown to [REDACTED] one at a time. She responded as follows; The first one shown was #9, she indicated it was a possible, 17- negative, 5- negative, 4- negative, 10- negative, 2- negative, 8- possible, 1- negative, 7- negative, 6- negative, 12- negative. I then had her view the two she had indicated could possibly of been the subject, photos number 8 and 9 again. She viewed both photos together. She then stated she was positive it was number 8. Number 8 is [REDACTED] I then concluded the contact.

5-1-75 1107AM. I contacted [REDACTED] at her residence located at [REDACTED] N. Ruby. I advised her that I would like to have her view some photographs to determine if she might be able to identify the person who assaulted her on December 22, 1974. She agreed to view the photographs. The photos were shown in the following sequence, the response is indicated, 9- negative, 11- negative, 1- negative, 6- negative, 5- negative, 10- negative, 12- negative, 8- positive, She stated, "Thats him, I am positive". The rest of the photo were shown to her and she still maintained number 8 had been her assailant. Number 8 was that of [REDACTED] It was arranged for Ms [REDACTED] to come to our office so a statement could be taken with regards to the incident involving the suspect.

At approximately 4:35 this officer was dispatched to Crossroad Cafe to make contact with an alleged rape victim. Arrived at Crossroads location at 0445 hours where contact was made with above victim.

After a brief interview as to determine what took place I had the victim follow me to the Sheriff's Office where I interviewed her and obtained her statement of the alleged crime.

At approximately 1:30 a.m. subject victim had gone to Sambos Restaurant to meet two other girl friends, a Kim Lindstrom and a Deanne Edson. Victim left at approximately 0230 hrs. to go home but was unable to start her car. While attempting to start her car a young male subject approximately 24 years old, long light blond hair, offered to get her car started. This he did, then asked the victim for a ride home. Victim answered to the affirmative being that he was so nice to fix her car she felt that was the least she could do to give him a ride home. Suspect directed victim to Wilson Creek Rd. area where he stated he lived. On arrival at end of pavement at north end of Wilson Creek Rd. suspect told

victim he lived a little further up on the unimproved portion. Victim drove on this road until stopped by heavy snow drifts on the roadway.

At this point suspect allegedly made physical advances toward victim stating he wanted to make love to her. After a short time victim attempted to escape, was caught, acceded to suspect's demands under threat of bodily harm. After act was completed, suspect drove victim's car and victim back to Ellensburg by way of Nanum Rd. to Game Farm Rd. to Brick Rd. onto Sanders to Airport/Walnut Rd. Suspect drove into the southern most portion of the [redacted] Apartments where he alighted from the vehicle and disappeared into the apartment complex. I asked victim if she observed into which if any apartment the subject entered. The victim's answer was no, that she was so frightened that she just left. I asked victim why she came to the Crossroads and she stated that she works there part time and was looking for a girlfriend to seek help in what to do. She was unable to locate friend whom she was seeking but the waitress on duty advised her to call police and report the incident which she did.

After interviewing victim and obtaining a statement she was taken by this officer to Kittitas Valley Community Hospital for physical examination and lab analysis for semen. On arrival at the hospital I contacted victim's parents to have them present and for their consent for treatment that may be needed. Was advised by Dr. Aaker, attending physician, that semen specimens did show positive in the test analysis. Was advised by Dr. Aaker his written report of the analysis would be available with written release by the victim and parents. Victim was released by Dr. Aaker with some medication to prevent pregnancy and recommended possible further treatment if any venereal disease should show up on analysis.

Description of suspect as follows: Age approximately 24 yrs.; 5'10" or 5'11"; collar length straight very light blond hair; weight approximately 145 lbs., slim build; wearing green ski type jacket, blue jeans, heavy boots or shoes. I asked victim if there was any unusual speech mannerisms or accent or other distinguishable features, she answered no except that his voice on normal conversation was somewhat highpitched but in his moments of anger, voice lowered to very deep tone. Suspect smoked Kools and at one point told victim his name was [redacted]

At 1200 noon, I drove out to the end of the Wilson Creek Rd. At the location described by the victim, was able to determine that a small compact type vehicle had been stuck in snow over the roadway approximately one mile North of the end of the pavement. Footprints around the area where the vehicle was stuck indicated someone wearing about a size 12 boot had made them. These showed lug soles, possibly made by a hiking boot. A set of smaller prints were also evident. It appeared at one point the smaller size was taking long strides, as if running or moving rapidly, away from the car, the larger ones either followed or were going with the smaller ones. Two areas appeared to have indications of a struggle of some sort. There did not appear to be any indication of anyone falling. A cigarette stub, "KOOL" brand, was found near the tracks.

ENTRY: **4-1-75** During the course of investigation being conducted on our case number **75-001165**, which was a reported Rape made by [REDACTED] the defendant in that case, [REDACTED] became suspected of having been the assailant of Miss [REDACTED]. A profile of complaints had been outlined, among them the [REDACTED] complaint, making a total of four complaints which had been received by local law enforcement agencies. One complaint was received by the Ellensburg Police Department and three by ours. Upon receiving the profile, it was noted that there was some similarity on the [REDACTED] complaint with the suspects descriptions in the other complaints.

It was decided that the [REDACTED] family would be contacted and arrangements made for their daughter, [REDACTED] age 17, to view an assortment of photographs put together on the [REDACTED] complaint.

On May 1st, 1975, Mr. [REDACTED] called our office twice in view of the news article he had read in the Daily Record, our local newspaper. The second time he called it was requested he come to the office in order to be filled in on the case, and what we wanted to do about this incident involving his daughter. He arrived at approximately 11:15am.

At this time it was arranged for me to come to his residence at 5:30pm and he would have his daughter present to view the photos. NO photographs were shown to Mr. [REDACTED].

5-1-75 5:32pm, arrived at the [REDACTED] residence located at [REDACTED] S. Pine. I was met by Mr. [REDACTED] and shown into their living room. In the living room I was introduced to a young lady sitting on a couch whom was [REDACTED]. At about this time Mrs. [REDACTED] came into the room from the rear of the house and Mr. [REDACTED] introduced me to her. We all sat down. Mrs. [REDACTED] to my right at one end of the couch, [REDACTED] between us and I at the other end. Mr. [REDACTED] sat across from us in a chair.

At this time I explained to the family the purpose of my visit as I had explained it to Mr. [REDACTED]. That we had a subject in custody on 2 counts of Rape and that we had reason to believe he was the same subject that had assaulted Miss [REDACTED]. At this point it was agreed by them, especially [REDACTED], that she would view the photographs.

I took 12 photographs out of a plain manila envelope, each photograph had been carefully selected for the purpose of these investigations, each was prepared so that the information pertaining to arrest number, date of photograph, was not visible. I then began showing them to Miss [REDACTED].

They were shown in the following sequence; her response is indicated after each photograph, 12- no, 4- no, 11- no, 10- no, 9- no, 8- "THATS HIM, THATS THE ONE", I asked her if she was positive, she stated, "Yes", I then continued showing her the other photographs, 7- no, 6- no, 5- no, 2- no, 1- no, 3- no. I again asked her if she was positive on number 8, she stated, "Yes, he is the one". She picked [REDACTED] as the person that had Raped her in the early morning hours of Feb. 22nd.

The following information was obtained from Miss [REDACTED] about her activities on the 21st of February which led to her being out that night into the early morning hours of the 22nd of February when she was accosted and subsequently assaulted and raped.

Miss [REDACTED] is 17 years old, she is a student at Ellensburg High School and is a Senior this year. The 21st of February was a Friday. That day she went to school and was in class beginning at 08:25am. She got out of school at 1200 Noon.

She came home, studied awhile and got ready to go to work. She works at the Crossroads Cafe as a waitress. She went to work and began her shift at 3:00pm.

She got off work at 11:00pm and went to visit a friend for a short visit. She arrived at the residence of her friend, a former classmate that has quit school, Deanne Edison. At that time Edison was living at an apartment located at 2nd and Walnut. She went home from there arriving at around 11:30pm. Her mother confirms this because she was waiting up for her to arrive home. She changed out of her working uniform and asked her mother permission to meet Deanne and another girl, KIM LINDSTROM, for coffee. This had been tentatively arranged when she visited Deanne at her apartment. Mrs [REDACTED] recalls her asking permission to go out and being granted because the girl had done nothing for two weeks but go to school and then to work and her mother felt she was entitled to a short break in her routine.

Her mother also recalls telling the girl to take her own car to assure she could get home early and not have to depend on anyone for a ride. The girl left the house and went to Sambos, where she had agreed to meet her friends. She indicates that she arrived at Sambos between 12:30am and 1:00am, the girl friends were waiting there for her.

When she left Sambos to go home her car would not start. That is when the suspect, whom she now positively identifies as [REDACTED] approached her and asked if she needed help in starting her car, she accepted his offer. She got out of the car, a Volkswagen 2dr, and stood at the rear of the car while he opened the engine compartment. At this point she states that the subject REPLACED a loose wire, she got back in the car and it started. The young man then asked for a ride home and she felt obligated to give him a ride and agreed to do so.

The girl, in her initial statement, and even now, maintains he REPLACED a loose wire which allowed the car to be started.

Mr. [REDACTED] now states that after the incident he noticed that the locking mechanism, which was located on the lid to the engine compartment, is missing off the car. It had been in place prior to the incident. In fact, it was soon after the incident that he noted it missing and he went to the Sambos parking lot looking for it. He feels it was taken off on purpose and thought it might be found in that area. It was never found.

I was at Sambos at about 0130 hrs. with Kim and Deanne Edison or Edson when at about 2:30 I left to go home when this guy followed me out of the cafe. I got into my car but it wouldn't start. This guy asked if he could help get the car started, I said yes he could. He open the engine compartment and replaced a wire and the car started then.

He then asked me if I could take him home and as he fixed my car I said yes. He said he lived on Wilson Creek Rd. I asked where on Wilson Creek he lived and he said about 5 miles up. When we got to the end of Wilson Creek Rd. he said he lived a little further on a dirt road. We drove about a mile then stopped because of the snow. He then grabbed the keys out of the ignition. I attempted to get the keys back but he would not let me have them. I got out and started running back down the road towards the houses. He chased me and caught me. He said "Settle down." He said he wanted to make love to me. I said I would if he let me go but then he let me go and I took off running again, but he caught me. He said if I didn't stop fighting him he would have to get tough. He had me on the ground at this time. I told him to let go and he said he would if he could make love to me. At this I said "O.K. let me go."

We walked back to the car and got in and after talking him into pushing my car out of the snow he got back in and tried to kiss me and said for me to stop fighting. He pulled my hair and said he was going to make love to me. I told him he probably would not stop there but would hurt me and leave me out there without my car. He then took down his pants and I then took down my pants off one leg and my panties the same. He told me to get on top, which I did when he pulled me over to him. He made full penetration inside me. I don't know if he had orgasim or not.

I was born at Auburn, Washington, when I was 9 years old my family moved to a farm just South East of George, WA. My family now lives South of George a short ways on Q SW.

I moved to Ellensburg with my sister when I was 17. I finished high school here at Ellensburg high school. I graduated last year and started attending Central Washington State College Summer of 1974 and I am presently enrolled.

On the evening of December 21st, at around 10pm, Cheryl Flagget and I went downtown in separate cars, leaving from my home at [REDACTED] N. Ruby. We went to Jack's Tavern, I was not asked for Identification. There were some other people that we knew at the Tavern and we started playing pool. This man, who's photograph I have identified, was in there all this time, in fact he mingled with out group during the evening, playing foosball with some of the group. I was sitting at a booth near one of the pool tables and he came up and asked me if I wanted to play pool. I said, "Sure", I like to play pool. I got up and played one game with him. He was polite, not abusive at all. he asked me if he could buy me a beer, I declined the first two times he asked, but agreed to a beer after he asked me the third time. grabbed me by the hand, sort of jokingly and began pulling me along with him. He didn't let go of my hand and I still just thought it was a joke. He kept walking and eventually we arrived at a car parked in the alley behind Jacks Tavern, it was the first car just inside the alley. He had let go of my hand at about this time and he got to looking for his car keys. At about this time I indicated to him it had been nice meeting him and so forth and that I be seeing him. I intended going back to my car.

There was a couple coming into the alley from the direction of the Moose Lodge at about this time. over my head as I was lying on the ground looking for my glasses, I remember he ~~said~~ said don't try to reach for anything, in between screams I recall saying "my glasses", he had my mouth covered most of the time and I seem to recall he had one hand near my throat. But I not recall him choking me at all. He did say that if I did not stop screaming he was going to kill me, I stopped screaming. I think that when I had been trying to get up as he sat on top of me, when he would push me down my head would hit the pavement. I had welts later. I was really shaken, he picked me up, unlocked his car and sort of shoved me in. I recall sitting on the drivers seat. I was crying now and really shaken, he ordered me to move over to the passenger side. I got over, all I could think was that I did not want him to get me off by myself where I could not get any help. As he was starting the car I reached over my right shoulder with my left hand and unlocked the car door. I opened the door with my right hand but before I could get my feet out of the car he grabbed me from behind by my coat. 



THE FACE OF THE PHOTOGRAPHS WERE SUBSEQUENTLY ALTERED BY PAPER-CLIPPING STRIPS OF THIN CARDBOARD TO THEM IN SUCH A WAY THAT ALL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION WAS OBLITERATED FROM VIEW. THAT INFORMATION INDICATES ARREST NUMBER, DATE OF BIRTH, DESCRIPTION, PICTURE NUMBER AND NEGATIVE NUMBER. THIS INFORMATION IS LOCATED ON THE MASTER LIST. THE INFORMATION THAT WAS OBLITERATED FROM VIEW WAS THE ARREST NUMBER DATE OF PHOTOGRAPH AND THE NUMBER OF THE ROLL OF FILM THE PHOTOGRAPH WAS TAKEN ON ALONG WITH OUR DEPARTMENTS NAME.





ENTRY: On the evening of Sunday, April 27th, 1975. Officer Dave Mack arrived at our office. He is with the Central Washington State College Police Department. He told our duty jailer, Deputy Don Holke, that his chief, AL PICKLES, had received information that we had a subject in jail on a charge of RAPE that resembled "TED". He had been ordered to pickup the case file and come interrogate the subject on the "TED" angle. Deputy Holke thought it better that I be contacted and the matter be cleared first. I spoke to Officer Mack, found out his purpose and informed him we were aware of the "TED" case, that some observations had been made by members of our department that our suspect matched the description of "TED" in some respects, but; We had not filed formal charges yet, the man had agreed to a polygraph exam, and I was not about ready to allow anyone to interrogate him at this stage about any other involvement. That once formal charges were filed they would be notified and if the Chief had any questions he could contact me personally. Officer Mack abided by our wishes. It was also explained that we are looking at the suspect as being involved in at least four cases in our jurisdiction which are now under close investigation. It was at this time that Deputy Holke came back on the phone and advised me that John Jenks, the polygraph operator, would be in our office at 07:30am the next day.

ENTRY: At approximately 11:30am, 4-28-75, I discussed the case with Deputy Prosecutor David Gorrie, I specifically stated we were looking at the man as a good suspect in three other incidents, one of them the Rape of a 17 year old. I went on to indicate we would be working as hard and as fast as possible in cinching these cases because the possibility of other agencies becoming acutely interested is very good.

At 3:00pm Dep. Pros. Gorrie had me bring [REDACTED] to Lower County District Court on Bail hearing. Upon my recommendations he asked for and got bail at \$10,000 and bound the subject over to Superior Court, assuring the District Court Judge Pro-Tem, Brian Fredrickson that the formal charges would be filed and arraignment would be set for 9:30am the following day in Superior Court.

Shortly before taking [REDACTED] to the Bail hearing, he was visited by Atty Brian Dano, of the Dano-Cone-Fraser & Gilreath Law Firm. Mr. Brian Dano indicated that his associate, Mr. Cleary Cone had been retained as Mr. [REDACTED]'s attorney.

ENTRY: 4-29-75 09:30am, approximately, [REDACTED] was arraigned and formal charges filed and served against him charging him with 2 Counts of Rape, based on the [REDACTED] case only.
On this day I began typing a Case Profile which consisted of the 17 year old Rape this case, another one of our cases and a City case. Only two of the four involved actual Rape. There was a very striking potential that [REDACTED] was the same man involved in all four cases.

Chief Pickles indicated he would notify Officer Cheryl Martin of his department to come in on 4-29-75, she was off on Monday's.

ENTRY: 4-29-75 approximately 10:00am, Officer Cheryl Martin arrived and I discussed this case, previous cases on file and the suspect, whom had now been charged. It was pointed out that with the exception of the case he is under arrest for, [REDACTED] had used some ploy which appealed to the victims sympathy. The 1st case, which was reported to the city, he told victim he had lost his keys, 2nd case, [REDACTED] he needed jumper cables, 3rd case, [REDACTED] he helped victim start her car then asked for a ride home, victim felt obligated to give him a ride. It was pointed out to Officer Martin that we still did not have him positively identified on the other cases on file, and we wanted to proceed cautiously so as not to jeopardize this case by inducing public prejudice prior to settling it. It was agreed we would work together, sharing information, to see if there could be any connection between [REDACTED] and an individual they were seeking that had approached two girls at Central prior to the Susan Rancourt case coming up. It had already been the intention of this department to contact other agencies as soon as practical to determine if there could be any connection to "TED".

Officer Martin indicated she would begin checking records at CWSC to determine if [REDACTED] had any close connection to Rancourt, such as taking classes together etc., I indicated to her at this time that I would be interested in seeing statements from witnesses in their investigation.

After she left I recalled [REDACTED] telling me on the day of his arrest, Sunday, that he at one time had lived with 4 other subjects on a rent sharing bases, the other subjects were students at Central. The information was needed in order to make recommendations to the Prosecutor with regards to PR.

I recontacted [REDACTED] in his cell and again enumerated his places of residence from the time he arrived in Ellensburg to present. He indicated he arrived in Ellensburg in around February or March of 1973, having been discharged from the Marines in January 1973.

MAY 1973 until July 1974 he resided at [REDACTED] E. 4th, Ellensburg, WA. With 4 Room-mates.

July 1974 until Xmas 1974 he moved in with Patty Mueller at [REDACTED] Apartments, [REDACTED] at CWSC.

Xmas 1974 until Present He and Patty moved into [REDACTED] E. Manitoba, Ellensburg, WA.

The period of May 1973 to July 1974, he shared [REDACTED] E. 4th with the following persons; 1. [REDACTED] 2. [REDACTED] 3. [REDACTED] 4. [REDACTED] ?spellin
