DAWN KRAUT

White Female, 21 years, 5'5"

Light Brown hair, parted in the middle, just past shoulder length

Blue eyes

Wearing light blue jeans and a tan sweater

Very attractive

On 12/5/75, at 0815 hours, I was informed by Detective Al Schrader that a relative of his had engaged Bundy in a conversation at the University of Washington on 12/4/75.

On 12/5/75, 0820 hours, I contacted Dawn Kraut by phone, 743-1219, address: 3217 - 176th S. W., Lynnwood. Dawn is a senior at the University, majoring in psychology, and was in the undergraduate cafeteria on 12/4/75 when she was attracted by the constant glances towards her of the person sitting about two tables away. This person seemed to be staring at her, and after a short period of time she recognized him as being Ted Bundy because of the news photographs.

After exchanging glances for a short period of time, they both got up from their tables and came within a short distance of each other, whereupon Dawn asked him if he was Ted. Bundy responded that he was Ted Bundy and asked Dawn if she knew him from any place, and when she responded that she recognized him from the pictures in the paper, he seemed to be satisfied.

At this point he seemed to be extremely nervous but conversant.

She asked him how the case was going, and he stated that he was in a difficult situation and in fact had been asked to leave the Law School area because of his reputation. He told her that he would get back in law school in Utah when he was acquitted on the current charges.

Bundy commented on Dawn being young and attractive and stated she probably was terrified on seeing him. Dawn stated, "Yes" but that she knew one of the girls who disappeared. Bundy responded that that was a shame and that he really felt sorry for the girls and their families and then added "it must be a terrifying nightmare of an experience".

Dawn states that Bundy had gloves on all the time he was in the lounge. They were brown leather. He was wearing a sweater, long, with a cloth belt and that he was constantly wringing his hands and fiddling with the belt.

She asked him if he felt strange about her approaching him, not really knowing him, and he stated he wished more people would approach him so he could convince everyone that he was not guilty. He also mentioned that he had not pled to the charges in Salt Lake City. He stated he was not bitter; that he had always wanted to be a lawyer, and a prosecutor, and that he now wanted to be a public defender.

SUBJECT: Interview with Theodore (Ted) Bundy

After considerable trouble ^{arranging} ~~arranging~~ an interview, Captain Little and I met with Ted Bundy today. Bundy stated, with regard to his background, that he had actively worked in probably half-a-dozen campaigns. He worked full-time for Art Fletcher and Rockefeller in 1968. He said that he has been personally associated with Evans since 1968. He explained that by that he meant he was identified in party circles as an "Evans" person.

Bundy then described his campaign activities in 1972. He said that the idea to keep track of Rosellini's public statements was his. The first time he went to a Rosellini gathering was at Edmonds Community College. Bundy said that he reported to Mary Ellen McCaffrey (sp?). She was in charge of issues, research and strategy at the headquarters level. (Gordon Frew was in charge of opposition strategy at the full committee level and stated that he did not know of Theodore Bundy or his activities.) Bundy also stated that he used a tape recorder strictly for note taking purposes because he has a bad memory.

Bundy stated there were certain inaccuracies in the news accounts of his activities. He said that he never made any pretense of being a member of Rosellini's campaign. He did not travel with Rosellini's staff or with Rosellini. He never tried to hide the fact that he was an Evans person--he had Evans' stickers on his

car and both the UPI and AP people knew of his Evans connection. He stated that he only kept track of what Rosellini said in public. He never made any effort to speak with Rosellini or Rosellini's staff people privately, and he never misrepresented himself as a student doing a paper, as one news report stated.

Bundy stated that he took about a dozen tapes, although only two are still available. He said he would refrain from destroying these two.

Bundy said he never met with Slade Gorton during the campaign. He did meet with Evans once at the Olympic Hotel preceeding a speech. The purpose of this meeting was to brief Evans on what Rosellini had said at a speech to the same gathering just prior to Evans' speech.

When questioned as to him compensation, Bundy stated that his total compensation was \$400 for expenses, which he received from the Dan Evans' Committee. He said there were no promises about any future jobs or positions, either from Evans or the campaign people. Bundy went on to say that some were suspicious of his obtaining a job with the State Central Committee this past spring, however, Evans does not run the Central Committee, according to Bundy, and he obtained the job from other contacts. He no longer has that job.

Bundy stated that he never met Keith Dysart and was not aware of his activity until after it came out in the paper. He also said that he did not know Gummy Johnson personally until after he went to work for the State Central Committee. Finally, Bundy summarized his personal background. He is 26 years old; he has been a Washingtonian since the age of 4; he went to high school in Tacoma and graduated from the University of Washington; he is now a full-time law student at the University of Puget Sound.

Re: Arrest of Theodore Bundy in Salt Lake City, Utah. + Possible links to numerous homicides in Seattle area and University district.

It came to my attention last night that Bundy had lived across the street from my residence in the University District. Members of my family were acquainted with Bundy on a speaking basis and remembered several things about him. I will attempt to relate the various bits of data that could be gleaned from the memories of these people as well as several other bits of hearsay that might or might not be helpful.

My daughter, Lauren M. Moore, ^{age 21} former member of S. P. D., told me she had had several conversations with him when he stuck up conversations as she or she & her sister were sitting on our front lawn.

Lauren says the man was a very small, talker, and was very easy to converse with, seemed polished and educated. He told her he was attending school here and was from Tacoma, Wn. He mentioned an interest in Tacoma, Skins & Quilts. One time he mentioned that he was going to go to a cabin to get away from it all. She says that she got the impression the cabin was owned by his parents.

Bundy was observed by Lauren on a bike and also getting out of a V.W. driven by a woman.

My son Scott, age 17, recalled that Bundy was a nice guy & that on several occasions he had tossed a football back & forth with him. He could recall nothing except that Bundy owned a Tru. V.W.

My daughter Roseanne, age 18, had nothing significant to contribute at this time although she did remember him as a very nice appearing man.

My wife June, had also noticed Bundy & concurred with my daughters opinions of his good looks and suave manner. June also noticed Bundy and a young woman & child together shopping at Northgate Mall.

Frank Freda Rogers, the former landlady of Bundy while he lived here can supply the young woman's name & address.

Mr. Ernest Rogers, though suffering ill health, can perhaps supply additional information. However, he should be interviewed separately from his wife who is the dominant personality in their family.

At this time he asked if he could meet her after school to talk to her and she agreed. He met her at school that evening and asked if he could take her home and she wouldn't let him and caught a ride with another teacher. While she was talking to him this evening Ted told her that he had to go to Salt Lake City for about three weeks and asked if he could call her when he got back. I don't know her response to that. He apparently went to Salt Lake City and when he returned to Seattle he attempted to call the niece several times but she refused to speak to him so apparently the relationship ended.

Mrs Rice described the man as 25 to 30 years and about 5'8"-very nice looking and especially noticed his hair and how nice and neatly waved it was. (2) Dr. PATRICIA LUNNEBORG, Tel. #543-2698, who knew him through her work at the University of Washington Psychology Department.

(3) Dr. EZRA STOTLAND, Tel. #543-6523, who is the current director of the Society and Justice Program at the University of Washington and who maintains a mammoth file of papers that students have done in all fields relating to criminal justice.

(4) Mr. JERRY FISH, Psychiatry Department, University of Washington, who researched and surveyed all papers and professors that Mr. Bundy might have had.

(5) Ms. SHIRLEY SCHNEIDER, Tel. #322-1191, who formerly worked in the Sexual Assault Center at Harborview Hospital, and who has done considerable research and literature review in the area of sexual assaults.

Subject had to cancel personal interview due to alleged unavoidable new commitments. However had long telephone conversation. Subject related that as far as she knew Bundy is in Salt Lake City. Further that she did not expect him to return to Seattle in the near future as he is low on funds. She promises to contact me as soon as she returns to Seattle after the holidays, indicating that if she has further info regarding Bundy she will relay it to me. At this point she is, if not in agreement with the necessity for surveillance, understands the need for it from our point of view. She will assist us to that end. Further she feels that under the circumstances he will ~~be~~ go along and in general cooperate with our effort.

She does ~~not~~ not seem to be firmly committed to either his guilt or innocence in this investigation but certainly has hopes of his innocence and in any case supports him. She agrees that his actions to this point have not been ~~those~~ those of an innocent man but feels that his emotional condition has been the cause of most of his evasive attitudes and actions.

Hopefully my relationship with subject is good and will continue to improve. She appears to be reasonably open and indicates a desire to trust my motives both toward her and Bundy. I think her unwillingness to meet with me face to face is more a product of her negative attitude toward Police at this time but I feel that after most recent phone conversation this has abated somewhat. I would say that outlook for future contact is reasonably good.

Victim stated that she had been walking down the stairs behind Annie Wright Seminary leading to the Canfield playground. Stated that the suspect was also hanging around the stairway. Stated the suspect said "Hey, got a light?" and when the victim replied in the negative, the suspect ran up from the rear and put his arm around her neck, as in a strangle hold. Susp said, "Got any money?" and when the victim produced only 6 dollars, the susp. said, "That's not what I wanted anyway."

Susp. then placed his knit watch cap over the victim's head and pulled it down over her face, saying something to the effect that he didn't want the victim to see him. Victim was then turned around and forced to her knees and the suspect grabbed her by the head and forced her to perform oral copulation on him. Suspect then brought the victim back to her feet and told her to lean up against a wall, spread eagle type of stance, after pulling down her pants and tossing them aside. Susp. then seemed surprised, and stated, "Hey, you're a girl.", to which the victim replied, "Thanks A lot". The victim then grabbed the suspect about the waist and bent her over, so he could have intercourse with her. Victim stated that the penetration was in the vagina, with full penetration. Victim stated that the suspect tried unsuccessfully to

This morning at approximately 8:30 AM, Gordon Bowker, my boyfriend, and I sat down to breakfast. I started reading the Entertainment section. Gordon was reading the front page and said, "They have a Ted suspect" or something like that. I glanced at the picture, and went back to my breakfast. A few seconds later, I glanced again at the picture. I was struck by the jawline - how it reminded me of the man who raped me the fall of 1973 in Tacoma Wash. I took the paper and looked more closely and felt I recognized him. Said this to Gordon. I looked at the photo for the next 10 minutes or so. While Gordon got ready to go to work we talked about what I should do. I decided to call the police. I told Gordon I probably would, but wasn't positive. He left for work around 9:15 AM. ~~& Around 10 AM I called~~ I searched my letters to see if I had the name of the detective I had talked to at the time of the rape in Tacoma. I didn't.

Around ^{cp.} 10 AM ^{maybe earlier} I ~~called~~ got the Tacoma Police Station ^{cp.} number from information,

and called the police immediately. I was connected to detectives where a woman told me I would be called back since they couldn't find my file.

About an hour later, Detective Hanson called me. I recognized him as the ~~man~~ ^{CP} I had seen 2 years ago. ~~He said he would~~ I told him I was pretty sure the man in the photo on the front page of today's Post Intelligencer was the man who raped me. Hanson said he would "check it out" and call me back later in the day.

He called me back within the hour, asked if I would sign a complain against the man T. Bundy; He said he would call back about 1 pm to see if I would. I agreed.

Then I called my boyfriend at work - told him that I was very positive about the identification of the man from the photo but that I wouldn't want to prosecute without seeing the man in person. Gordon asked if I would like to ask a lawyer what could happen to me if ~~he~~ ^{CP} I ^{CP} went ahead with the complain. I said yes so he said he would have his lawyer, Paul Silver, call me.

Close to noon, Silver called me, said that another member of his law firm who was familiar with criminal proceedings would call me.

Soon after noon Bruce Flynn called to say Fred Meyers was the most experienced in criminal cases, but was on his way ^{up} out of town, his secretary told him then that Meyers was on another phone line, that he would call me back.

Five or ten minutes later, Fred Meyers called me. He said that I could be in an unpleasant situation with both police grilling me and the defense lawyer grilling me, that I might get some publicity, but that if I was quite sure this was the man, that should not stop me from signing the complaint.

I called Gordon to tell him I decided to sign the complaint.

At 1 pm Hanson called me. I said I was pretty sure from the photo, that Bundy is the man. But that I wouldn't ~~was~~^{cp} prosecute without seeing him in person. He said if the case came up for prosecution I would go through a "line-up" ~~cp~~^{cp} situation, so that I would have a chance to identify him in person. So I told Hanson to come and tried to give him directions to my house.

At 1:45 pm I asked Gordon to come home to be with me while I gave the statement.

The torso did not have a head, arms or legs. All had been severed by an unknown instrument. Coroner is still examining the torso. There appears to be a hole the size of a bullet in one of the ribs. Because of the fusion of the spinal column the body is that of a female at least 19 to 20 years and up to 50 years. She was about 5 feet tall. The coroner believes the body is that of an older woman. She was wrapped in a blue jacket or house coat type material. The torso is also enclosed in beige garbage bags. There were no bones found away from the torso. Animals had been gnawing on the torso but had not dragged any bones away.

Due to the location of the torso, they believe the body to be that of a 48 year old female who has been missing since April 15, 1975. The torso find is just below the house where she was missing from. She had told her husband that she was packing up and going to Seattle. She took a .22 pistol with her.

On July 27, 1970 (Monday), at 3:00 p.m., John Winslow filed a missing persons report with J. Visser on his wife Nancy Winslow.

On August 9, 1970 (Sunday), U.S. Ranger Finman called in to the Sheriffs Office a report of a female body found in the Nooksack River above Glacier. Sgt. Crutcher located the body 1/2 mile down stream from the Bridge Campground, on a gravel bar in the middle of the North Fork of the river. The body was badly decomposed and the only clothing was a piece of material around the victims neck.

On August 10, 1970 the victim was identified as Nancy Mae Winslow by her dental records. Autopsy showed the victim was strangled by a nylon stocking which was found around her neck.

On August 11, 1970, Doug Hamilton called Sheriffs Office in regard to a sweater found on Wells Creek Rd. approx. 150' from Mt. Baker Hwy, on the south side of the road, approx 20' down the bank. The sweater was later identified as the one the victim was wearing when last seen.

On August 12, 1970, no new evidence was found that could be substantiated.

On August 14, 1970, another search was instigated in the area where the victim was found, with no positive results.

On July 26, 1970 Nancy Mae Winslow left from work and got into a 1951 gray Plymouth. She was reported missing on July 27, 1970. Her body was found August 9th.

In June 1971 a 1951 2-door gray Plymouth was purchased from a Lynn Edquist by one Edsel Pittman, Lynden. The car was searched by SO and all particles of evidence sent to the FBI Labs. Also a ladies watch was found in the car but was never positively identified as belonging to the victim, although several people interviewed said the watch looked familiar. The FBI reported that hairs found in the car matched those of the victim, but positive identification could not be made by matching hair.

After Lynn Edquist was contacted by SO he soon packed up and moved to California with his family, this occurred in the middle of June. Extensive search for Edquist in California failed to turn up his whereabouts.

Interviews

AARESTAD, Virginia - employed Hilltop Cafe ... Saw victim downtown B'ham. July 27, 1970, identified dress and handbag correctly. Talked with John Winslow August 2, and met with him and Linda Grindle August 3 at the Charbroiler in B'ham concerning victims whereabouts. Also connected Dirk Reed with victim.

WINSLOW, John - husband of victim ... took polygraph test given by officer Kveven test showed he was not involved. John claimed he was out with Linda Grindle on the evening of victims disappearance. Miss Grindle supported his alibi.

WILLIAMS, Anita - sister of John Winslow ... Claims victim was good mother but was having marital problems with husband. As to questions asked of her brother Anita answered negatively.

WILLIAMS, Jo Ellen - Anita Williams daughter ... Described sweater worn by victim. Claimed victim was a heavy beer drinker. Jo said John had called and then came to victims home Monday morning July 27, to see if victim was home, made several calls and then left to look for victim.

WILLIAMS, Kelly - Victim had Kelly babysit July 26 - stayed all night. John came by early afternoon on July 27 became upset when finding out Nancy was not home. Kelly believes John stayed at victims home the night of the 27th.

ENGHOLM, Janette - co-manager Beaver Inn, victims employer ... Claims Jack Silver talked with victim on the 24 & 25 of July. Victim also talked to Janette about her husband and said he was in trouble, kept mentioning Carolina St. On 25 & 26 Janette observed victim talking to David Shane. Victim recieved call from her husband approx. 8 pm, which seemed to upset her. Left from work approx. 10:20 pm.

ENGHOLM, Vic - co-manager Beaver Inn ... Vic saw car that picked up the victim. Said it was a 1952 Plymouth gray or light tan. This was approx 10:30 pm. He said that Nancy knew who was in the car. Also Vic thought the driver to be an older person.

SULLIVAN, Margaret - mother of John Sullivan... John Winslow alledged J. Sullivan was the father of victims baby boy. Margaret called 733-2470 in B'ham in regard to a message from her neighbor. A woman answered and questioned her about her son and Nancy Winslow. John Sullivan was in Alaska working at the time. On Aug 26, 1970 John Winslow spoke to Mrs. Sullivans neighbors about Nancy and John Sullivan. According to her neighbors John Winslow was acting very strange.

WILDERMUTH, Sharon - Worked at Senate Tavern... on July 26th Sharon said John Silver was at the Senate, but didn't recall the times. She left the Senate a little after 10:00 pm and thinks there may have been an older model gray car across the street with two men in it, but she was not sure.

JAMES, Frank - Said he saw the victim at Moose Club on July 25th with Jack Henifin, After the victims body was discovered, James said John Winslow told him that the SO was off his back and that James and Schupp were the suspects. Also said that after John Winslows accident, Winslow was moody and had a worse temper.

SHANE, David - Recalled that the victim acted nervous after phone calls on the 26th during times he was at the Beaver Inn.

SILVER, Jack - Met the victim at the Beaver Inn. Denied trying to make time with her. On the 26th Silver said the victim seemed troubled and talked of getting a divorce. Deined owning 1951 Plymouth, he owened 1969 Ford SW.

SCHUPP, Henry - Said he took Nancy to Moose Club on the 25th. Nancy talked about a Canadian who had inherited a lot of money and wanted her to go back to Canada with him. Approx. 11:30 pm Schupp said he left Moose Club and stated that was the last time he saw the victim.

JACOBSON, Shirely - victims oldest sister ... She stated that she knew the victim was having marital problems, and also she considered her sister a flirt. Also she said that John Winslow was going out on her. She stated that Nancy knew to much about something. Also that the victim had affairs with other men.

CERVINE, Donna Jean - victims sister ... Also said that Nancy was a flirt. Asked if she thought that Nancy would put the squeeze on someone for child support she answered in the affirmative.

HENIFIN, Jack - He said he had asked the victim to go to the Moose picnic with him on the 26th, but the victim did not answer yes or no. On the 26th Henifin played pool at Dicks Tavern with friends. Then went to the Hilltop with Bob Balsley until 12-12:30 pm, then went back to Dicks Tavern talked with Bob until approx. 1:00 am, then went home. He said he had gone to victims home the 27th early evening but victim was not at home. Henifin had not seen nor met the victim prior to July 25, 1970.

FOSTER, Fern - Saw victim at the Moose Club come in around 9:30 - 10:00 pm on the 25th. Saw victim leave 11:00 - 11:30 pm with unidentified male. Was wearing sweater similiar to one victim wore on the night of her disappearance. Fern says she did not see the victim return. Fern left Moose Club approx. 12:30 am.

TEGLAND, Bernice - friend of Winslows... Bernice said she hid John Winslow when he was being sought in connection with a rape case. She said she knew of a illegal tranaction of John Winslows which involved selling unsafe frozen foods to a Seattle concern. She said she was afraid of John because of his violent temper. She also thought that John would kill Nancy if he thought she was going out on him. She stated that Nancy drank a lot of beer. Also that after Nancy was reported missing but before her body was found, Anita Williams, Jack Dixon, John Winslow , and Linda Grindle went dancing and drinking at the Coconut Grove. Bernice said she was very afraid of John Winslow.

RILEY, Carolyn - Said she saw the victim at the Moose Club on July 25th, the victim left at approx. 11:00 pm, but left alone. As Carolyn was leaving the club at approx. 12:30 am, she said she saw Nancy come back into the club, alone.

On October 24, 1975, Detective Robert Keppel called Detective Lou D'Iorio to inform your Department of the presence of homicide suspect, Theodore Robert Bundy attending Temple University, Spring Quarter, 1969.

Investigation to date reveals Bundy as a possible suspect and available at the times of all disappearances of the women. He was also familiar with areas of where the women's bones were found. Similar homicides and disappearance occurred in practically each jurisdiction Bundy has been living during the past 5 years.

Interviews have revealed Bundy's reasons for going back to Pennsylvania were threefold. Initially, Bundy had just broken off a romantic and sexual relationship with a girl friend. He told his cousin this was a reason to get out of Seattle because there were bad remembrances.

Secondly, Bundy's family is from Philadelphia. Bundy was born illegitimately to Eleanor Louise Cowell in Burlington, Vermont. She had left Philadelphia and spent 103 days at the Elizabeth Lund Home for unwed mothers. Bundy's name was changed in Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas to Theodore Robert Nelson on October 6, 1950. In 1951 it was changed to Bundy. His relatives' names are under Cowell. Also a Bruce Taylor called Salt Lake County Sheriff's Office and said he was a relative from Philadelphia and would call back but never did.

Thirdly, Bundy wanted to be an attorney, and he learned that he did not have to possess an undergraduate degree to enter the law program at Temple. His grades at Temple were not poor so he had to have a reason for leaving.

A former address of Bundy in Lafayette Hills, Pennsylvania is 4039 South Warner.

We would appreciate any information on Bundy that you could locate. We are specifically interested in similar disappearances and murders while he was in Pennsylvania, Bundy's school records, homosexual activities, any psychiatric help or counseling, and contacts with police.

Some indicators to be kept in mind when examining homicide cases are damage to skulls, strangulation with girl's own nylon stocking, found completely nude, no jewelry found or very little, bodies dropped 10 - 260 miles from where they were missing, clothing never located, and no evidence homicides occurred where bodies were dropped.

Summaries of missing and murdered women are included for your comparison of similar occurrences in your area. Also enclosed are photographs of Bundy.

Due to pressure from the media in this case we are expressing a "no comment" response to press questions.

I have not had a chance to check with the Forest Service to see if they have any record of BUNDY signing in before doing any climbing, but will do so.



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Nude Bodies Identified As 2 Missing Women

POMONA, N.Y. — (UPI) — Authorities yesterday identified two nude and badly decomposed bodies found near this New York City suburb as two women who were reported missing a week apart earlier this month in northern New Jersey.

The Rockland County Medical Examiner, Dr. Frederick T. Zugibe, identified the victims as Susan Heynes, 28, a housewife from Haworth, who was last seen hanging clothes on a line at her home on Oct. 6; and Susan Reeve, 22, of Demarest, who was

reported missing Oct. 14.

Earlier yesterday, Zugibe said he believed both women "possibly" were strangled by the same person and said the killer might strike again.

He described the killer as "sadistic and psychotic" and said there was "a danger to any young woman alone. I don't like to use scare tactics, but I feel the public in general should be cautioned."

He added that a killer "who is capable of committing such a crime is capable of committing it again."

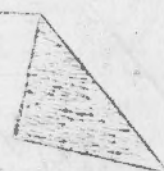
