DEFENDANT'S SECOND DAY ON STAND

Cosden Denies Rape Charge

William E. Cosden Jr., in his second day of testimony in his first degree rape trial, today said he didn't have sexual relations with the alleged victim although he had sex in mind when she got into his truck.

He told the Thurston County Superior Court jury he backed off from the woman inside the truck when he couldn't "perform" after they both undressed.

Cosden, 2710 114th Ave. SW, is accused of kidnapping and sexually assaulting Beverly J. Fredericks Nov. 30 near Maytown. His trial began a week ago last Monday.

The 29-year old defendant said the woman almost ran him down in her truck when she pulled into the Lathrop Road Restover Truck Stop, where he was working on the night of the alleged incident. He tes-

tified she waved to him and flirted with him even though he had never seen her before. Her actions attracted her to him, he said.

Later she got into his truck and wanted to go someplace, he said. This idea appealed to him because he "wanted to get to know her better." At the time he admitted he was having problems with his marriage and had sex on his mind.

When she suggested they go to her place, he rejected the proposal because he was married, he said.

When Strophy asked him why he didn't suggest a motel, Cosden hesitated and said, "It sounded lewd."

The trial is expected to continue with defense testimony tomorrow. The jury is expected to begin deliberations tomorrow afternoon.

1ST DEGREE RAPE

Jury Finds Cosden Guilty

A Thurston County Superior Court jury last night convicted William E. Cosden Jr., 29, of raping a 24-year-old county woman last Nov. 30.

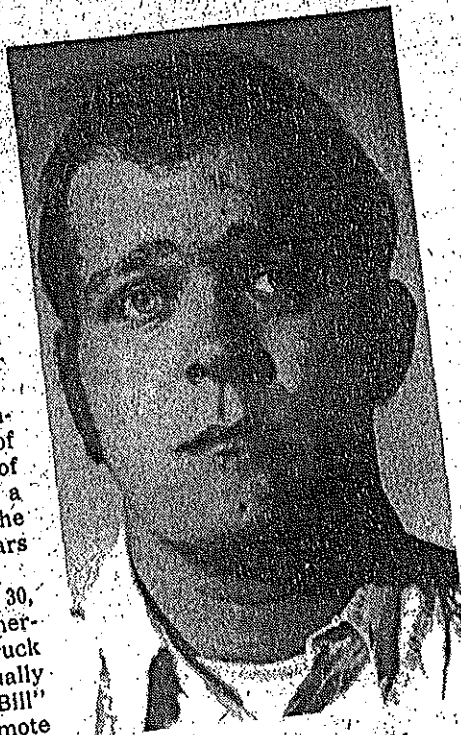
The jury stayed out about 8 1/2 hours before returning the verdict of first degree rape at the end of the six-day trial.

Cosden was in custody in county jail this morning. Judge Frank E. Baker last night ordered him held to await sentencing after pulling his property bond.

The conviction carries a mandatory minimum sentence of three years in prison because of the use or threat of use of a deadly weapon or kidnap. The maximum prison term is 20 years to life.

Cosden was arrested Nov. 30, hours after the woman told sheriff's deputies she had been struck from behind and later sexually assaulted by a man named "Bill" in a pickup truck in a remote clearing near Maytown.

The defendant had testified he was with the woman the night of the incident, but denied that sexual intercourse took place. He said the woman had aroused his sexual interest and asked him to

COSDEN LABELED ONE OF COUNTY'S 'MOST DANGEROUS INDIVIDUALS'

Ten-Year Minimum Term Sought

William E. Cosden Jr., a Vietnam war veteran who killed a Maryland woman last fall, was sentenced to 10 years in prison for the rape of a Thurston County woman last fall.

In a sentence that lasted about two hours, Superior Court Judge Frank E. Baker recommended a minimum term of three years for a crime which carries a mandatory imprisonment of three years.

The judge also said he would "strongly urge" that Cosden undergo "intensive" psychiatric treatment in prison, with reports of his progress to be made to the court every six months. He also recommended the Board of Prison Terms and Parole notify the court and the county prosecutor's office upon Cosden's ultimate release.

It's expected Cosden's attorneys will appeal the case. Cosden, 27, 114th Ave. SW, was convicted Feb. 18 after a week-long jury trial in the first-degree rape of a 24-year-old woman last Nov. 30.

She had testified he struck her from behind twice with a rubber mallet in the early morning hours on Case Road. Out of fear for her life, she agreed to accompany him to his property near Maytown where he raped her twice, she had said.

Yesterday Chief Criminal Deputy Prosecutor Rick Strophy urged a 20-year minimum sentence. The conviction calls for a maximum of 20 years to life.

Strophy introduced St. Mary's County, Md., court records concerning the brutal slaying of a 21-year-old woman there in which Cosden was involved. Police found the woman in a shallow stream, savagely beaten and stabbed several times.

According to his father, Cosden came forward and gave information to Maryland police even though they had another man in jail on a charge involving the death.

A judge there found the defendant innocent of first-degree murder by reason of temporary insanity. The court committed Cosden to a mental institution, where he remained until May 1971 when he was released after he was determined to be mentally competent, Strophy said.

The deputy prosecutor said there was evidence of a "sexual assault" in the Maryland killing, a conclusion disputed by Cosden's father and Taylor.

Strophy said Cosden was "one of the most dangerous individuals the court may have had before it."

At one point during Strophy's presentation to the court, Cosden, gripped with anger, shouted, "You're a liar." Judge Baker rebuked him for the outburst and ordered him to be quiet.

Taylor suggested Cosden's activities resulted from emotional scars suffered during his Marine Corps tour in Vietnam, which included five months in an enemy prison. The attorney stressed the horrors of his client's experiences there where he received three purple hearts and a bronze star for wounds suffered.

Cosden received a medical discharge from the Marines in November 1967, Taylor claimed, the Maryland killing never would have surfaced.

Taylor hadn't been "honest" in admitting to it. He said Cosden maintained his honesty in denying the Thurston County rape. Judge Baker said the Cosden sentencing would serve as a signal to "other rapists in the county" that they can expect the same treatment.

Editor's Corner**Cause Of Justice
Often Confusing**

THE PROTECTION of an individual's right to a fair trial often seems to put a real strain on the cause of justice. Seems to me we just had an example of this in William E. Cosden Jr.'s trial here.

The 29-year-old was found guilty of rape by a jury of his peers which heard all of the good things in his background, but none of the bad.

Then, at the time of Cosden's sentencing, it was revealed his past might have been particularly relevant to his present problems. Rick Strophy, chief criminal deputy prosecutor, produced court records from Maryland concerning the brutal slaying there of a 21-year-old woman. Strophy said there was evidence of sexual assault in that case. Cosden was tried for that murder and found innocent by reason of temporary insanity.

The Maryland murder, the court was told, occurred in 1967. Cosden was held in a mental institution until May of 1971 when he was determined to be mentally competent and released. He moved to this area soon after.

Although this information all was known to Strophy before the trial, none of it could be introduced as evidence under our court rules.

My concern is this: Does such a rule go beyond protecting an individual's right to a fair trial and actually prejudice the consideration in his favor? It is easy to answer that this certainly didn't happen in the Cosden case but such a reply ignores other factors and begs the question.

Of course the Maryland incident is no prima facie evidence that Cosden might have committed rape here, but it certainly is evidence of what he was capable of at one time.

I believe our jurors are intelligent enough to make such a distinction. The lawyers and judges who draft our laws of evidence think otherwise. Is this why Justice always is depicted as being blindfolded when we create our courthouse statuary?

SYNOPSIS

Victim alleges that she was assaulted and raped during the early morning hours of November 30, 1975. After receiving proper medical attention, she provided the Sheriff's Department with a statement. Based upon the description of the suspect provided by the victim and facts he had related to her, a photo lineup was shown. Victim immediately picked the photo of William Earl Cosden, Jr., which was one of five photos shown. Description of the vehicle used during the crime matched the vehicle owned and operated by Cosden. A search warrant was obtained to seize and search Cosden's vehicle. Cosden was taken into custody at his residence at the time of execution of the search warrant and was subsequently booked into the Thurston County Jail on charges of rape and assault.

INVESTIGATION

At approximately 0628 hours, November 30th, 1975, Beverly J. Fredricks, Rt. 4 Box 394, Olympia, phone 352-4634, notified the Thurston County Sheriff's Department that she had been assaulted and raped. Deputy McClanahan was dispatched to investigate the incident. Upon his arrival, he was met by the victim, Beverly J. Fredricks. She related to him the details of the incident. Deputy McClanahan, then summoned a medical aid unit, which responded to the Fredricks residence and gave her limited medical attention. Deputy McClanahan took into evidence clothing worn by Fredricks at the time of the assault and rape. He then transported her to St. Peter's Hospital for further medical attention. See Officer's Report of Deputy McClanahan for details.

At approximately 0945 hours, 30 November 1975, Beverly J. Fredricks gave a statement to Lt. H. V. Baesen of the Thurston County Sheriff's Department. In her statement, she described what had occurred before, during and after the incident. See statement of Beverly J. Fredricks for details.

Based upon the description of the suspect obtained from Fredricks and facts she stated he had related to her of himself and family, a photo lineup was shown to her. The photo lineup included five photos of white males. Fredricks then immediately selected without any hesitation whatsoever, the photo identified as number four. This was a driver license photo of William Earl Cosden, Jr. Cosden was known by investigating officer to drive a vehicle similar to the one described by Fredricks. Deputy McClanahan was requested to drive by the Cosden residence and determine if his vehicle was there and to obtain a general description and license number. Deputy McClanahan checked and advised

that an old white Dodge, flatbed truck with some type of rack or frame behind the cab was there. He advised that he could not see a rear license plate.

Based upon the photo lineup identification, similarity of the suspect's description to that of Cosden, similarity of suspect's vehicle to that of Cosden and facts related by suspect to the victim that were known by this department to be true, a search warrant was requested and obtained to seize and search the Cosden vehicle. A search warrant was also requested to check the time records for Cosden at the Lathrop Road Restover Truck Stop.

During the early afternoon hours of 30 November 1975, Deputy McClanahan was taken by Fredricks to where the incident had occurred. Deputy McClanahan found a soft drink can, which had earlier been described by Fredricks as having been thrown from the suspect vehicle by the suspect. He also found a cigarette butt at the scene, where she stated that she had been raped as she had earlier described the suspect as having thrown from the vehicle.

The search warrant was executed by Deputy Strand at 1745 hours, 30 November 1975 at the Cosden residence. The vehicle described in the warrant was impounded with Howards' Towing. Due to condensation within the vehicle, it has not been searched for fingerprints or other evidence and must dry thoroughly first.

At the time of impounding of the Cosden vehicle, William Earl Cosden, was arrested, transported to the Thurston County Courthouse, where he was advised of his constitutional rights and right to counsel by investigating officer. Mr. Cosden stated that he understood his constitutional

rights and was willing to talk with investigating officer without the presence of an attorney. Deputy Robert West was present during the reading of the rights throughout the interview. Cosden denied being involved in any rape and stated he had not had sexual intercourse with anyone during the preceeding 48 hours. He stated that he had left the Texaco Service Station where he was employed at approximately 0200 hours, 30 November 1975. He advised that he had been working on his own, towing people out of the ditch due to the recent snow and that he had not used a time card. He admitted to having a rubber mallot in his truck. He then refused to answer further questions without the presence of an attorney. He was then booked into the Thurston County Jail and charged with assault and rape.

Mrs. Cosden was also brought to the courthouse and was briefly questioned by investigating officer. Lt. H. V. Baesen was present during the interview. Mrs. Cosden was reluctant to answer any questions for fear of incriminating her husband. She did, however, advise that her husband had returned home at approximately 0400 hours on the morning of November 30th, 1975. Mrs. Cosden advised that she did not wish to answer any further questions and was provided transportation to her home.

Employees of the Restover Truck Stop, who had worked during the period that the assault occurred, were contacted. Stephen R. Striazic, stated that he remembered a pickup truck, a late model with four wheel drive, coming into the station and being driven by a young lady. He states that Cosden was present at the pumps at the time that she came to the station and that his vehicle was also parked at the pumps. He states the lady bought two dollars worth of gas and paid for it in cash.

He states that he was the one that serviced the vehicle and took her money. He further advised that while he was servicing the vehicle, that Cosden was talking to the driver. He states that he overheard part of the conversation and from it, thought them to be strangers. When the lady left the station, Cosden said that he was going to the gambling room and left. He states that he did not see Cosden again during his shift. See statement of Stephen R. Striazic for details.

A Robert Irving, who runs the gambling room, was contacted and he advised that he had closed the gambling room at 0100 hours, at which time, Cosden was present but that he had not seen Cosden after the time of closing.

Another service station attendant, Mr. Felker, advised that he had also been working at the station at the time, but had mostly been in the truck service area. He states that he last saw Cosden at approximately 0030 to 0100 hours.

Medical records obtained from St. Peter's Hospital following Fredricks examination and treatment, confirmed that she had received injuries to the neck and head. Vaginal examination for sperm was positive. See Medical Reports of Beverly J. Fredricks for details.


During period victim was abducted from the Case Road, her vehicle had been left with the motor running. It was still running upon her return. William R. McCarty, Rt. 4 Box 396-A, Olympia, advised that he returned home between 0200 and 0230 hours. He states that he observed a pickup truck with the engine running parked at the intersection of the Case

Road and Nunn Road, now known as 101st Avenue SW. He states that he observed the vehicle for 8-10 minutes as he approached it, passed it and continued on, watching it in his rearview mirror. He states that he had been driving slowly, due to the snow on the roadway. He states that he did not see anyone around the vehicle at the time he passed it. See statement of William R. McCarty for details.

This case is forwarded to the Thurston County Prosecutor for disposition on charges of rape and assault on William Earl Cosden, Jr. Cosden is now incarcerated in the Thurston County Jail.



I do hereby give the following statement to H. V. Baesen, whom I know to be a Deputy Sheriff of Thurston County, Washington, as an aid to investigation and all facts contained herein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Q. Beverly, what is your occupation?
A. Pharmacy Technician at St. Peter's Hospital.

Q. Will you give us a location of your present address?
A. Approximately two miles down the Case Road from the Lathrop Road intersection.

Q. What is your marital status?
A. I am divorced.

Q. Are you quite familiar with the area in which you live?
A. Somewhat. I don't know the names of the road, but I know how to get places.

Q. Have you ever done business at the Texaco Station at the Truck Stop on Lathrop Road?
A. I buy my gas there all the time.

Q. Are you acquainted with some of the personnel that work there?
A. I talk to them, yes. I don't know them by name.

Q. This evening, you stated that en route home from an earlier date, you had occasion to stop for gas at the Texaco Station, also known as the Restover Truck Stop on Lathrop Road. Is that correct?
A. That is correct.

Q. What time did you arrive at the station and what date was it approximately?
A. I think it was about November 30 at about quarter to 1:00 in the morning.

Q. When you drove up to the station, what type of vehicle were you driving?
A. 74 Dodge half ton, 4 wheel drive pickup.

Q. You asked for gas?
A. I asked for \$2.00 of regular.

Q. Who waited on you, do you know?
A. I can't remember the guys name, but he is an attendant who I have seen there before.

Q. You stated that you have made purchases there on several occasions. Have you seen this individual several times there at the station?
A. I think one other time, I had seen him.

Q. You did recognize him then as being an employee there at the service station?
A. Yes.

Q. At the time that you made your purchase at the station, did you have a conversation with this attendant?

I came to the intersection at the Lathrop Road and Case Road intersected and my truck slide sideways, so I got out and turned the hubs in and put the pickup into four wheel drive and he got out of his truck and asked if there was anything he could do to help and I said, "No, I was just turning the hubs in". So I got back in my truck and he got back in his and he followed me down the road. At 101st and Case Road, his truck looked like it had gone into the ditch, so I backed up and backed my truck right into the middle of 101st and left it there running and he asked me if I knew how to drive a straight stick and I said is that on the floor and he said yes and I said I could drive one and he said to put it in gear and he would push it out. So I got in the truck and I put it in gear and he pushed it out into the middle of Case Road and I got out of the truck and started back towards mine and I thought I slipped in the snow and I fell to the ground and then I realized he was hitting me. Then I rolled over and I said, "Please don't hurt me. I will do anything you want me to do" and he said, "Okay, get back in the truck then".

Q. Do you recall how many times he hit you?
A. I can think of two that I know of.

- Q. Do you recall what type of instrument it was that he struck you with?
A. Rubber mallet.
- Q. Do you remember the location in which you were struck?
A. On the shoulder and one on the neck and I don't remember being struck on the head, but I have bruises and things there.
- Q. At the time you were hit with the instrument, were you knocked to the ground?
A. Yes.
- Q. When you were on the ground, were you hit again?
A. Yes, I am sure he hit me one more time when I was on the ground.
- Q. Would you relate the incident that occurred following the attack on you that you got in his car and where did you go from there?
A. He told me to get back into his truck, which I did and he proceeded down the Case Road. I kept trying to get him to go to my place and I told him he would be more comfortable there and he said he had a house of his own. So he drove down the Case Road to the Maytown intersection and we turned left towards Maytown and I think it was the first road to the left right after the grange, we turned onto and he went past some houses and a mobile home and we made a left curve and a right curve and went a mile or a mile and a half up that road onto ten acres he said he owned. Then we were there.
- Q. En route to this spot, did he inflict any other injuries upon you?
A. No.
- Q. En route to this spot, did he threaten your well being in any way by making oral threats to you?
A. No, he took my shoes off and I put them back on and when I went to put my shoes on, he said, "Leave them alone", in a threatening tone.
- Q. Did he inform you that he had any other weapons in which to influence you with?
A. Yes, he said he had a gun under the seat.
- Q. Did he, at any time, show you this gun or threaten you with it so you could see it?
A. No.
- Q. When you arrived at this location, what occurred next?
A. I asked him for a cigarette because I was scared and I asked him his name and he said Bill, so I said I have to call you Mr. Bill and he started unbuttoning my dress. I said, "You don't have to do that. I have panty hose on", so he said, "No, it all has to come off" and I thought I would make a game out of it, so I took my panty hose off and told him it was his turn.
- Q. What was your reason for all of this delay?
A. I didn't want to do it. I was scared and I thought if I could stall him, he would call the whole thing off.

- Q. Were you engaged in any other type of conversation at this time with him?
- A. No, I mentioned it was like playing strip poker, which I didn't know how to play.
- Q. Would you continue to inform us what occurred next?
- A. I took my pants off and he took his pants off and I took my panty hose off and he took his undershirt off and then I took my dress off and he took his pants off and he made me take my bra off.
- Q. Did you both wind up naked?
- A. I was completely naked and he had his socks on. He took his boots off.
- Q. At this particular time, were you raped in this vehicle?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Will you describe this vehicle to me in which you were raped?
- A. It was, I believe, a Chev, older vehicle, four wheel drive, there was a gun rack mounted in it. I believe the seat was black. I don't know if the color of the inside was white or tan. There was also a radio in the car and there was a speaker mounted right behind me. There was a cigarette lighter that didn't work.
- Q. At the time you were raped in this vehicle, what position were you in?
- A. I was on the bottom and he was on the top. I had my head against the passenger's door and my foot was on top of the steering wheel.
- Q. During this rape upon you, was penetration made?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Did this individual have a climax?
- A. Yes, he did.
- Q. Did he force you to commit any other type of sex acts?
- A. No.
- Q. Immediately after this incident, what happened next?
- A. I asked him if he could take me home and he said, "No, we were going to do it again" and I said, "Can I have a cigarette" and he said, "Okay" and I had a cigarette and he lit it for me and then he had a cigarette and then we engaged again. He asked me if I wanted to do it dog style and I said I didn't know how and so we did it the same way and he called the same old way "conventional".
- Q. Was this a complete rape as the previous one where there was penetration and a climax?
- A. Yes.
- Q. During these rapes upon you, did he talk to you or threaten you in any way at this particular time?
- A. No.

Q. He engaged in no conversation at this time?
A. None.

Q. How long do you recall you may have been at this location?
A. A couple of hours, maybe 2½.

Q. Would you give me a complete description of this individual that raped you and what he was wearing at this particular time?

A. Between 30 and 35 years old, 6', about 225 lbs., blue eyes, brown hair, short with a cowlick on the right hand side. He looked like a simpleton. He had maybe a day and a half growth of beard and he said he had been up for 19 hours.

Q. Would you describe the clothing he was wearing?

A. Dark long sleeved shirt, wool jacket, dark pants, leather harness boots, knee high, brown and white socks and a white T-shirt.

Q. After this incident then, you left the area?

A. He turned the truck around and he stopped at the top of the hill and he shut the truck off and said we were going to talk and he proceeded to talk about "Ted" and I said I didn't want to talk. I said I just wanted to go home I was cold. So I went to start the truck, so I turned the key and it jumped forward and he took the key out of the ignition and put them on the dash.

Q. At this area where you were just prior to leaving, did you have anything to eat or drink?

A. He had a stale pepsi sitting in a wire glass holder mounted on the dash and he threw the pepsi out before we got there.

Q. What time do you estimate that this rape incident took place at the location you stated?

A. Maybe about 2:00.

Q. When you left the area, where did you go?

A. He took me back to my pickup truck, which was sitting at 101st still running.

Q. After he dropped you off at your vehicle, did he make any comments to you?

A. He said he would see me again. He grabbed me by the throat and said "You are not going to say anything to anybody are you" and I said "No, you have to believe me. I will go up to the chapel tomorrow to pray for us", because I told him I had to go to work today and be there at 8:00 and I told him I wasn't going to say anything because I wouldn't want to hurt his little girl because that would just tear her up.

Q. What all did you find out about this man during this evening as far as his background?

A. He was born in Baltimore, he know Karate, he was in the marines. He has been married four years in October and he has a little girl.

A. who is two and her name is 101B and he didn't say what his wife's name was, but she has blue eyes and the little girl has blue eyes.

Q. What else did he tell you about himself?

A. He doesn't drink coffee. He drinks Orange Peko Tea. I asked him if he liked horses and he said no, not really. He said I was the first he had ever raped. He said his wife was from Littlerock and they now live in Maytown and he took a course in psychology and he said he had an I.Q. of 132. He was going to build a house on his ten acres the way he wanted it.

Q. Is there anything else you can recall that you would like to add?

A. No.

Q. When you left his vehicle, and after you reached yours after these incidents, explain what you did after that?

A. I got out of his and into my vehicle and I went home and I took a bath and I had a terrific headache, so I took 401/401A and I wound my alarm clock and it was three minutes after four. I laid down on my bed and held my cat and I dozed off for an hour and I woke up crying and I just couldn't take it and I called the Sheriff's Department.

Q. Were there any witnesses at the service station at the time that he left with you or did you see anybody during any of this?

A. There were a bunch of colored people there, but nobody I knew.

Q. Is there anything else you wish to add to this statement that you think would be necessary?

A. He kept saying he was going to shoot himself.

Q. In the event of prosecution in this matter, will you assist in testifying?

A. Yes.

Q. When this statement is transcribed into typing, will you sign it?

A. Yes.

Q. Will you cooperate in attempting to make identification of this individual from photographs?

A. Yes.

Q. Beverly, you have been shown five mugshots in a lineup consisting of white males of approximately the same age, numbered 1-5, can you identify any of these as being the man who assaulted you?

A. Yes, #4 (victim selected #4 without any hesitation).

Q. Did you identify that photograph as the subject who identified himself as Bill?

A. Yes and he had a service station hat on.

NOTE: On the night of assault and rape, victim had "Style" type hair spray on head. She was not wearing hair spray when samples were obtained.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

Victim alleges that she was assaulted and raped during the early morning hours of November 30, 1975. The rape occurred within the cab of a 1961 Dodge truck.

The victim states she was first assaulted by being struck on and about the head with a rubber mallet, then later by being choked about the neck by suspect's hands. Following her release, she returned home where she bathed, prior to reporting the incident to the police.

Her clothing were taken into evidence and she received subsequent medical attention. Vaginal smears were found to be positive for sperm.

A search warrant was obtained for the suspect vehicle. During the search, a rubber mallet was seized, numerous hairs were picked from the cab interior, a pair of coveralls (Victim believes suspect used the coveralls to wipe himself following the rape) were seized. On the front of the seat, a small quantity of an unknown substance was located. The substance was collected on the tip of a cotton swab. This substance is believed to be seminal fluid from its color, density and texture.

Shortly after 0800 hours, on 30 November 1975, the undersigned received a phone call from the Thurston County Dispatcher informing me that a rape had occurred and the victim was with Deputy Neil McClanahan. The undersigned requested Dispatcher to make available the Deputy and victim at the Thurston County Sheriff's Department as soon as the doctor at St. Peter Hospital had completed his examination. A request was also made that a stenographer be made available to assist with statements.

The undersigned arrived at the Courthouse shortly after 0900 hours and contacted Neil McClanahan regarding this incident. In the interim, the undersigned had contacted Sgt. Paul Barclift and made arrangements for him to be present for photographs and assistance in this case. Prior to this, the undersigned had notified Chief Criminal Deputy Dwight Caron of the incident. Following a briefing by Deputy McClanahan on the rape, the undersigned took a statement from Beverly Fredricks. The statement has been typed and signed by the victim.


Shortly after statements were taken from the victim, Sgt. Paul Barclift and the undersigned assembled pictures including the suspect for possible identification by the victim. Five pictures were assembled and numbered one through five. The victim studied the pictures upon view of them and immediately picked picture number four. Picture number four was

suspect William Cosden, Jr. The victim stated that this was definitely subject that raped her.

Because of the presence of evidence in the truck used by the suspect, it deemed necessary to obtain a search warrant. Arrangements were made and a telephonic search warrant was obtained for the truck belonging to William Cosden. After the search warrant was obtained, arrangements were made to have a wrecker standby for transportation of the truck for storage and later processing.

The undersigned accompanied other deputies to the Cosden residence at Scott Lake and arrived there approximately 1630 hours. No one was home at this time. At approximately ~~1650~~ ¹⁷¹⁵ hours, Mr. Cosden and his wife and child arrived at the residence and at that time, he was placed under arrest and the vehicle was impounded. The vehicle was towed to Howard's Storage. The undersigned brought Mrs. Cosden and her child, **101B** to the Sheriff's Office to speak with her regarding this matter. At approximately ~~1750~~ ¹⁷⁵⁰ hours, the undersigned and Mrs. Cosden talked about this matter, but she did not wish to make any comments or a statement relevant to this incident. Sometime thereafter, at approximately 1830 hours, Det. Paul Barclift and the undersigned again talked to Mrs. Cosden about her husband's activities during the time in question. The only comment made by her relevant to this matter was that he arrived home at 4 a.m. Following this, Mrs. Cosden did not wish to stay any longer. She was transported home by Deputy Neil McClanahan. This concluded the investigation of this matter at this particular time. Note is made that the truck in question is impounded at Howard's towing and is being dried out and will be ready for processing in the near

future. The elements it is being processed for, according to the search warrant will be fingerprints, hair, evidence of sperm on clothing, a weapon, rubber mallot, and possibly a gun.

This officer was contacted at the Sheriff's Department and advised that a subject was to be arrested at Scott Lake. The subject was identified as William Cosden, Jr. and that I would be arresting him for suspicion of rape, and that I was to serve him with a copy of the search warrant for his white Dodge, flatbed truck, which was to be seized as evidence in the alleged assault and rape.

At approximately 1715 hours, this officer made contact with the suspect in front of his residence. This officer had earlier gone to the door and knocked and found that no one was home. I parked in the driveway in front of the residence. The suspect arrived home at approximately 1715 hours, at which time, he approached my vehicle. I dismounted and the suspect then asked if he could help me and I stated yes, that I was Deputy Strand from the Thurston County Sheriff's Department and showed the suspect my identification, at which time, I advised him that he was under arrest for suspicion of rape and assault. Suspect was handcuffed.

At this time, the suspect's wife, who had been in the car when the suspect arrived home, came up to this officer and asked what was going on. I again identified myself and advised that her husband was under arrest for suspicion of rape and assault. The suspect's wife was greatly upset by the situation. I advised that her husband would be taken to the Thurston County Jail and that if she cared to, she could accompany him to the jail. The suspect was advised of his rights and then placed in a patrol car for transportation to the Thurston County Jail.

Lt. Baesen transported the suspect's wife to the Thurston County Courthouse

On 2 December 1975, the undersigned drove to Howard's Towing covered impound building at 5th and Cherry and there, met Det. Sgt. Paul Barclift. The purpose of this was to process a white flatbed truck, registered to Mr. Cosden, that had earlier been towed to this area by Howard's Towing. Processing of this vehicle was authorized by a search warrant, which had been obtained on an earlier date. More specifically we were authorized to search for hair, fingerprints, a mallot, sweepings and a pair of coveralls. All items that were retained as evidence in this truck were itemized on the search warrant return and thereafter, filed with the proper authorities.

The processing of this vehicle began at approximately 1025 hours on 20 December 1975. At this time, Sgt. Paul Barclift photographed the vehicle and the evidence. The evidence obtained within the cab of the truck is all itemized on property slips and retained in evidence in folder and copies are being retained by Det. Sgt. Paul Barclift.

Because of the damp condition of the interior of the truck, the best interests to obtain fingerprints, it was decided that final processing would take place the following day.


On 3 December 1975, Det. Paul Barclift and the undersigned again went to Howard's Storage on 5th and Cherry and began processing the mentioned truck. I do hereby give the following statement to Janice Marks, whom I know to be a Deputy Sheriff of Thurston County, Washington, as an aid to investigation and all facts contained herein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Q. Beverly, at this time, we would like to have some additional information regarding the sexual assault upon you on the 30th of November 1975. Can you describe the truck driven by the suspect in this matter?

A. It was a big flatbed, maybe a 1 ton, white, 4-wheel drive, black interior, it was an older model truck. It had stacks on the outside, like exhaust pipes is what they are. A gun rack attached to the window and on the passenger side was a speaker for the radio. The seats were black. I couldn't tell if the insides were white or tan, the glove compartment was broken and there was a thing to hold bottles or cans, it was metal. The cigarette lighter he said didn't work, it was a stick on the floor. The driver's side door didn't close properly. I don't remember any mirrors. On the ceiling there wasn't a normal roof, it had been ripped out, it was all metal. It was a messy truck.

Q. I understand that you have identified the person through photographs?

A. Yes.

Q. Were pictures taken of the injuries sustained as a result of the assault?

A. Yes, except for the one of my elbow.

Q. Do you still have bruises?

A. Yes.

Q. Are they still visible enough to take pictures of?

A. Yes.

Q. During the sexual assault, did you notice anything abnormal or different about the body or sexual organs of the man?

A. No, it was dark and I couldn't see anything.

Q. Was he rough during the sexual assault?

A. No, he was very gentle.

Q. Did he talk to you at all during the actual act of intercourse?

- Q. Beverly, when was the last time other than the sexual intercourse on the 30th, did you have sexual intercourse with anyone?
- A. Wednesday.
- Q. That would be November 26th, 1975?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Do you remember about what time of the day?
- A. About one in the morning.
- Q. Was the act completed?
- A. Yes.

- Q. Have you ever seen this other service station attendant before?
A. Yes.
- Q. Do you know his name?
A. No.
- Q. Can you describe him?
A. He had a mustache and dark hair, about 25.
- Q. Is there anything else you'd like to add?
A. I helped him get dressed, I helped him put his shirt on. He rolled down his sleeves and I remember he had on long sleeves. I said I bet your wife doesn't do this.
- Q. Why did you help him get dressed?
A. I figured if I was as nice as I could he wouldn't hurt me and would let me go. I was petrified.
- Q. After the assault, you mentioned that he put his hands on your neck and threatened you, did he hurt you at this time?

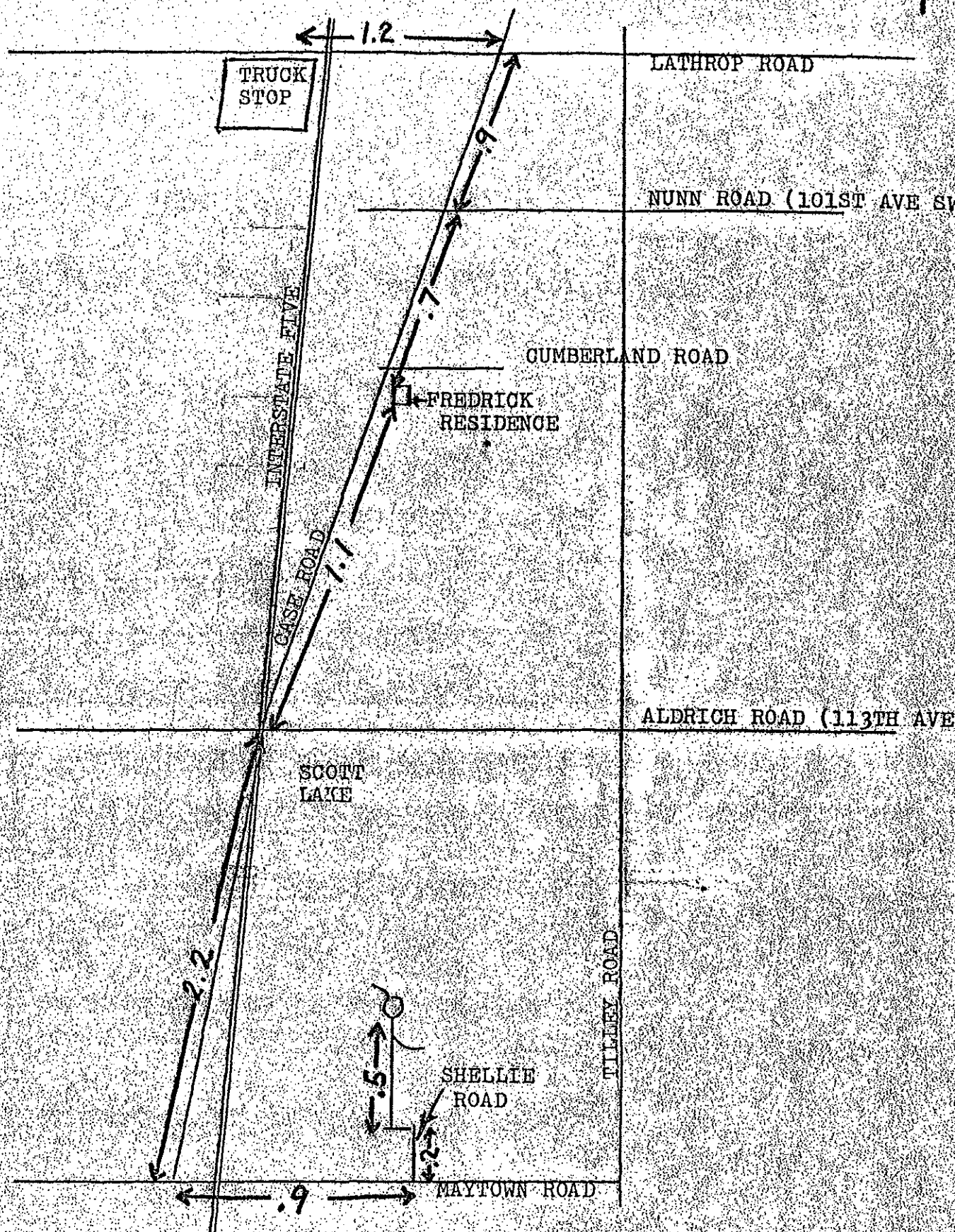

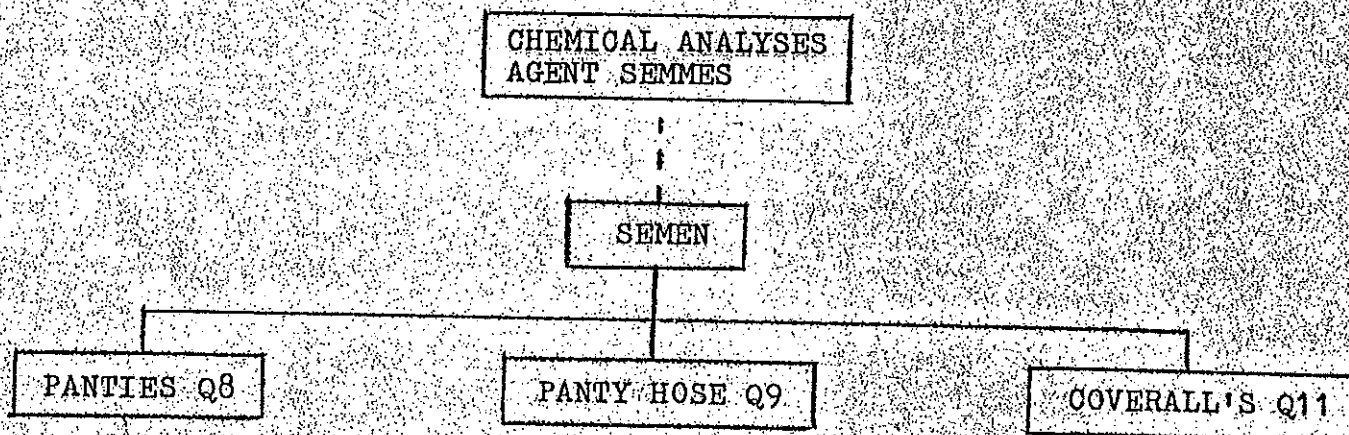
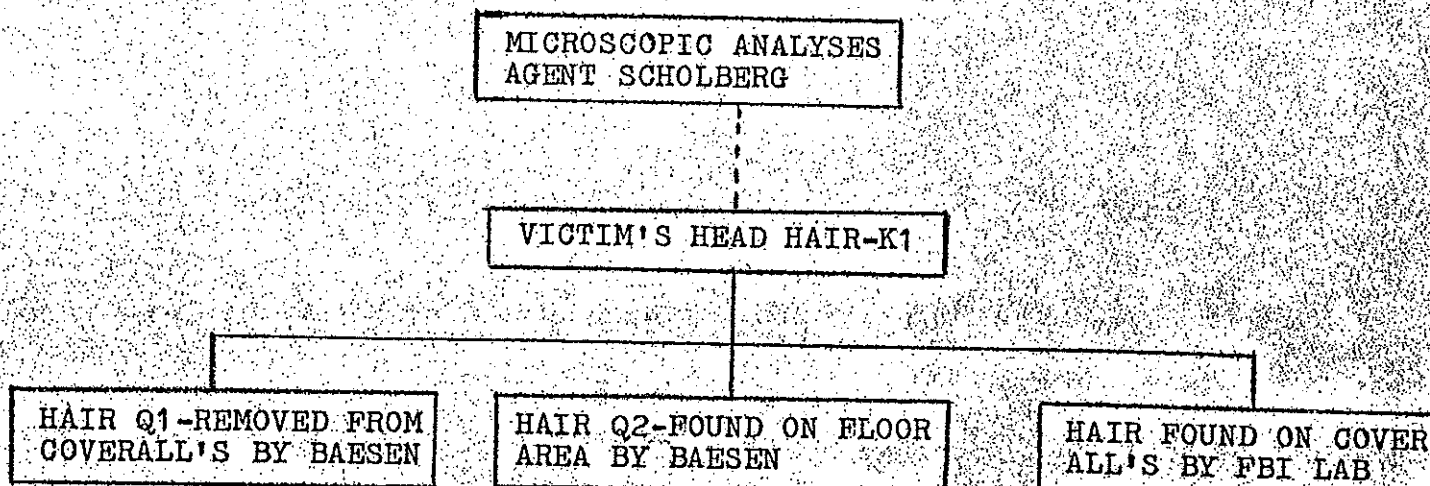

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

Victim alleges that she was assaulted and raped during the early morning hours of November 30, 1975. The rape occurred within the cab of a 1961 Dodge truck.

The victim states she was first assaulted by being struck on and about the head with a rubber mallet, then later by being choked about the neck by suspect's hands. Following her release, she returned home where she bathed, prior to reporting the incident to the police.

Her clothing were taken into evidence and she received subsequent medical attention. Vaginal smears were found to be positive for sperm.

A search warrant was obtained for the suspect vehicle. During the search a rubber mallet was seized, numerous hairs were picked from the cab interior, a pair of coveralls (Victim believes suspect used the coveralls to wipe himself following the rape) were seized. On the front of the seat, a small quantity of an unknown substance was located. The substance was collected on the tip of a cotton swab. This substance is believed to be seminal fluid from its color, density and texture.

This report supplements the FBI Laboratory report in this case dated January 13, 1976, and completes the requested examinations. For a detailed listing of the evidence, please refer to that report.

Semen which could not be conclusively grouped was identified on specimens Q8 and Q9. Chemical tests indicated the possible presence of semen on the Q11 coveralls. However, the presence of semen on the coveralls could not be conclusively established by the microscopic identification of spermatozoa. The examination of specimens Q6, Q7 and Q10 disclosed no indication of the presence of semen.

The submitted items are being returned to your office under separate cover by registered mail.

This examination has been made with the understanding that the evidence is connected with an official investigation of a criminal matter and that the Laboratory report will be used for official purposes only, related to the investigation or a subsequent criminal prosecution. Authorization cannot be granted for the use of the Laboratory report in connection with a civil proceeding.
