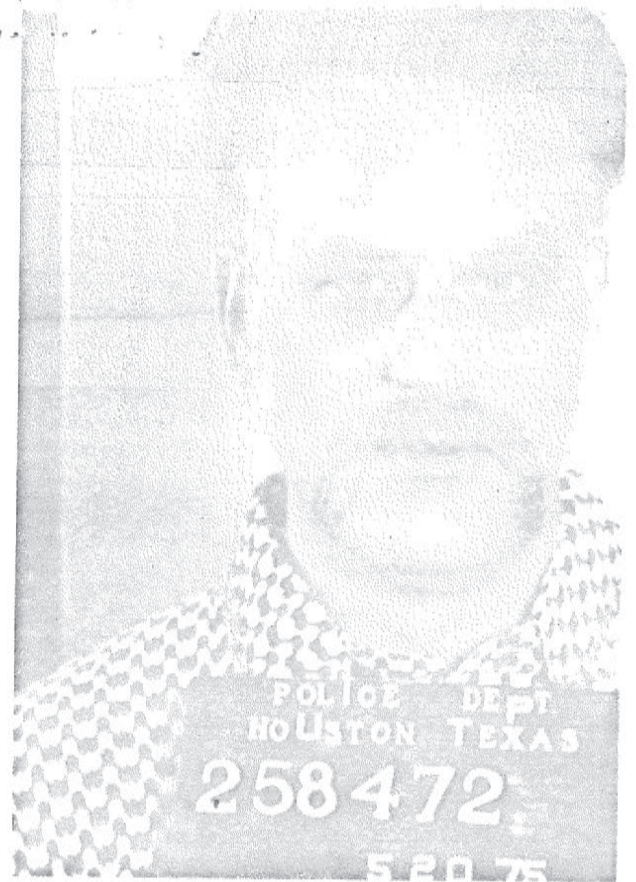
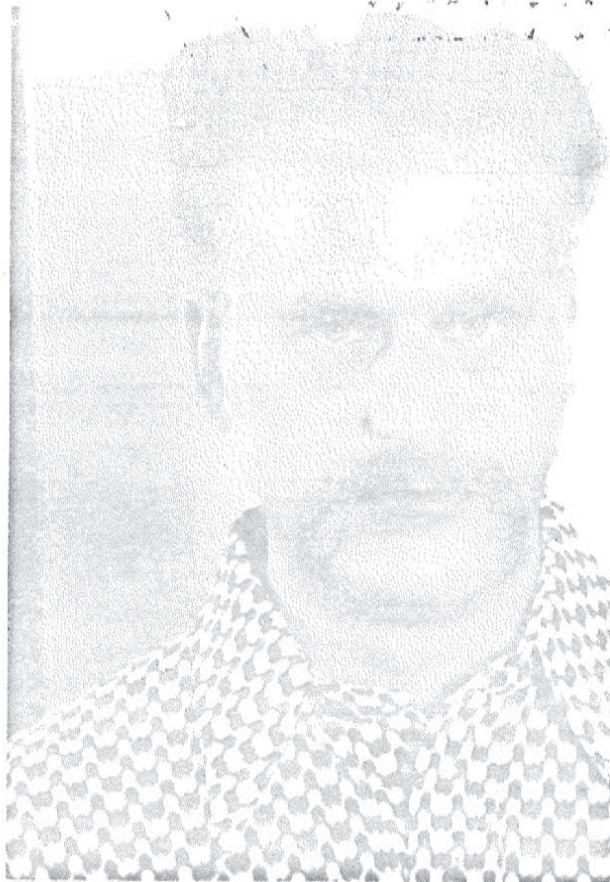

PROGRESS REPORT - MAGISTRATE'S WARNING 5-20-75

On Tuesday, May 20, 1975, Detectives J.L. BONDS D-595 and T.M. PIERCE D-620 went to the City Jail and checked out GARY ADDISON TAYLOR at 8:40am and Taylor was taken directly to Municipal Court #2. At 9:00am Taylor was given a Statutory Warning by Judge Michael Breen in accordance with Article 15.17 of Texas Code of Criminal Procedures. After receiving the warning from Judge Breen, Taylor was asked by Judge Breen if he understood the warning and Taylor stated that he did understand and then requested the Public Defender be notified for him. Judge Breen explained to him there was no Public Defender as such in Texas but there was a Lawyer Referral Service that he could contact and would be allowed by officers to contact them. Judge Breen then restated that Taylor would not have to give any statement without advice of counsel. Judge Breen advised Taylor that if he (Breen) had an attorney come into his court that would be interested in defending Taylor that he would send him up to the City Jail to talk with Taylor.

Detectives Bonds and Pierce then took Taylor to the Homicide Office where detectives advised Taylor that he did not have to make any statement and that if he wanted to contact an attorney he would be allowed to use the phone. He was further advised that detectives could not recommend any attorney but he was given the yellow pages where all the attorneys are listed and Taylor made some calls including Lawyer Referral Service and Houston Legal Foundation. He told whoever answered the phone that he was in jail on some rape charges and that he needed a lawyer so he could have a writ hearing to get out of jail. He also told them he was broke. Taylor had been advised prior to the calls that he would be in some showups after 2pm on May 20, 1975 and he also mentioned on the phone that he would have to be in some showups after 2pm and would like to have an attorney present during those showups.

After Taylor indicated that he was finished using the phone, he asked for and got a cigarette. Taylor was advised he had been filed on in three cases and he asked to see the warrants and the warrants were given to him to read. After reading the warrants, Taylor was returned to the City Jail, at 9:27am.

It should be noted that Taylor did not leave the building on this date as the jail is located on the 5th floor, the Homicide office on the 3rd floor and the Court being located on the 1st floor of 61 Riesner Street, Houston, Harris County, Texas. Detectives did not attempt to question Gary Addison Taylor after he requested an attorney about any offense under investigation.

DETAILS OF OFFENSE PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT:

For the exact details of arrest and following investigations, we are attaching hereto supplements in Houston case G 00790, Criminal Attempt Rape and Aggravated Sexual Abuse, the compl. being Patricia Templeton.

At the time of his arrest, Gary Taylor, was brought to the Homicide Office. He was asked for his current address, place of employment and any previous addresses. He was not questioned in regards to any offenses, at this time.

On 5/22/75, at the request of Det. Stephenson, Dets. M. Lankford and L. Earls, went to the City Jail and checked Gary Addison Taylor out of Jail, at 8:08 PM. He was then brought to the Homicide Office, to Det. Stephenson. Det. Stephenson advised Taylor, at this time, of the charges which had been filed in regards to the cases being handled by the Houston Police Dept. All of these cases are sex offenses. Taylor asked what the bond was on these cases and was advised that at this time he was being held with no bond. Taylor also wanted to know an approximate time when he might be tried on these offenses. He was advised that the very earliest date would probably be around 6 or 7 months and could be possibly as long as a year, depending on the number of cases pending in the criminal district courts. Det. Stephenson asked Taylor at this time, if he had an attorney and he stated that he did not. He stated that he had called several but at this time, did not wish to spend his money, on an attorney, and further that if he had not hired an attorney for himself by the time the cases went to trial that he would request a public defender. Det. Stephenson advised him that we did not have the public defender system but as he had been advised by the Judge, he could be given a court appointed attorney upon request. Det. Stephenson asked Gary Taylor if he wished to make a statement in regards to the sex offenses that he was charged with and he replied "No, not right now." The interview was terminated at this time and Taylor was returned to the City Jail by Det. Lankford and Earls at 10:15 PM.

At 2:15 AM Det. Stephenson checked the actor, Gary Taylor out of the City Jail and brought him to the Homicide Office. When Taylor Arrived in the Homicide Office he was again given his legal warning by Det. Stephenson, from the blue card issued by the M.A.s office and he stated that he understood his rights. At this time he was questioned by Det. Stephenson in regards to Harris County Sheriff's Office Murder case on Eusanne Jackson. Taylor was asked to make a statement in regards to the case and he made an oral confession to Det. Stephenson which he was asked to reduce to writing, and he stated that he would. A written confession was taken from 3:00 AM to 4:20 AM. At 4:20 AM the confession was completed and signed by Taylor in front of witnesses. During the time the written confession was being taken the actor asked for and was given one package of cigarettes and three cups of coffee.

PROGRESS REPORT: CONTINUED....

The actor was then questioned in regards to the missing person, Vonnie Joyce Stuth and Taylor stated to Det. Stephenson that Vonnie Stuth was dead and he had killed her. Taylor was asked to make a written statement in regards to this case and he stated that he would. A written statement confession was taken by Det. Stephenson from 4:40 AM until 5:40 AM at which time the confession was completed and signed by Gary Taylor and witnesses, Det. H. R. Trimble and Det. D. R. Spurlock. During the time of this confession the actor, Taylor, asked for a drink of water and to use the restroom.

At approximately 6:00 AM Taylor stated that he was hungry. His food order was placed in the police cafeteria and at 6:40 AM his order was brought to Homicide Office by Det. Trimble. The actor, Taylor ate a hamburger, order of french fries and three cups of coffee. During the time Taylor was eating he told Det. Stephenson and Trimble about killing 2 women, which he had picked up in Toledo ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~. He gave the following account of this offense. He stated that as near as he could recall, he picked the girls up near the end of March 1974, but he could not be certain of the date. He stated that he was in Toledo at a hotel, which he could not recall the name of, but stated that it was the largest hotel in Toledo. He stated that he had left the hotel and had gone to several bars drinking. And he then called for a cab and he asked the cab driver where he could find some girls. Taylor stated that he believed the cab driver thought he was a cop and told him that he didn't know where he could find any girls. Taylor states that he told the cab driver to take him to the hotel, and when they arrived at the hotel there was a NM standing in the front of the hotel. Taylor said the cab driver told him then "That man may be able to help you." Taylor states that he got out of the cab and asked the NM if he knew ~~if he~~ where he could get any girls. The NM told him yes he did, and took him to a small house (location unkn, near downtown). Taylor states that when he arrived at this house, there was a WM and 2 WFs in the house and that the NM left. Taylor states that he does not know the name of any of these people. He stated that he didn't remember anything in particular about the girls except that one of them was taller than the other. Taylor stated that he tricked the tallest girl there in the house, and that he paid her for the date but said that he could not remember how much money was involved. Taylor states that after this girl filled the date that the WM left the house. Taylor then started talking to both girls and asked them if they would be willing to go home with him for a day or two, and they stated that they would. Taylor said that he then left the house with the girls and drove to his home with them in Onsted, Michigan. Taylor stated that he had sex relations with both of the girls at the time he arrived in Onsted with them. And he stated that he did not kill them until the next day when they "started bitching about him taking them back home and that they were going to have their old man take care of him."

PROGRESS REPORT: CONTINUED:

Taylor said after the whores threatened to have their pimp get him, he took them to the basement of his house where he shot both of them. He said he thinks that he shot them both more than once and thinks that he remembers shooting them in the chest area and the head. He said after he shot them he buried them in the back yard near his bedroom. Taylor was asked again at this time if he knew the names of either of these women, and he stated that he remembered looking through their purses and seeing their names but that he just couldn't remember and said that he had buried their purses in the back yard also.

Taylor was then asked what he used to shoot these women and he stated that he used a .30 caliber carbine Universal brand, which he had bought at Montgomery Ward's in (not sure of spelling) Livonia, Michigan. He said that he didn't remember exactly when he had bought the carbine. Dets asked Taylor where the carbine was at this time and Taylor stated that the carbine and the 9 millimeter pistol, which he had used to kill Vonnie Stuth, were ripped off here in Houston while he was living on Alabama and that the weapons were taken by two men by the name of Maddison Monroe Crumley WM 30/35, who was an ex-con from Rayford Pen in Florida and a Robert C. Evans WM 45/55. Taylor stated that these two men also lived at the address on Alabama but he did not know what name they rented the apt under but thought the name they rented under started with an S. Taylor stated that he did not know the serial number of the carbine or the 9 millimeter. He stated that the 9 millimeter was a Browning and that he had bought it from an individual in Michigan by the name of Bob Carroll. He states that Bob Carroll was an architect that drew the plans for the homes which he was selling in Michigan. Any information learned on follow-up in regards to the weapons used in these cases will be forwarded to the proper authorities when it is received. After eating the prisoner was returned to the City Jail by Det. Trimble at 8:18 AM.

On 5-25-75 at the request of Det ~~XXXXXXXX~~ Stephenson Det H.R. Trimble went to the city jail and checked Gary Taylor out at 10:40 A.M. and brought him to the Homicide office. Det Stephenson advised Taylor at this time that the investigation by the Houston Police Dept had been concluded and that we would at this time transfer him to the Harris County Jail. Taylor asked if he was going to be sent back to Michigan and was advised that it was unknown at this time. He was told by Det. Trimble that the district attorney in the different states where he had committed offenses would have to get together and decide where he would be tried. He was advised that he would be given this information as soon as it was known. Taylor stated that he understood this and at 12001 AM 5/26/75, Taylor was returned to the City Jail by Det. Trimble. At this time Det. Stephenson took the paper work for the release of Taylor

DETAILS OF OFFENSE PROGRESS OF INVESTIGATION, ETC.

PROGRESS REPORT:

We, detectives Trimble and Baker, were assigned by Lt. Kersten to follow up on the below information.

I, Det. Trimble, received a phone call from Sgt. Schuelle of the Austin, Texas police dept. who stated that an informant had called him this date and stated that a Gary Taylor was supposed to be enroute from a machine shop somewhere in Houston to his place of residence at 1120 Robbie. Sgt. Schuelle further stated that Taylor was suppose to be driving a four door bronze Chrysler, Michigan license NMC 563. At the time Schuelle called he did not know whether or not Taylor was actually wanted by this dept.

The s.w.a.t. team was notified for their assistance in making a run on the above address.

With four units from the s.w.a.t. team and two Det. units from homicide, surveillance was set up at various intersections around 1120 Robbie. At approximately 2:55 A.M. we, Trimble and Baker, observed a Chrysler turn north on Studewood st. from Robbie. We got behind the Chrysler as it was turning west on Louise st. The Chrysler then turned south on north main st. and as it passed in the light of a service station on the corner of north main and Louise, Taylor was recognized from wanted pictures as being the wanted actor in a number of Rape cases. Taylor stopped at the intersection of Studewood and Calvalcade and as he came to a complete stop unit 801 with officers R.S. Lobue, badge #2191, and W.E. Carmical, badge #124, stopped their patrol car in front of the actor. With the patrol unit in front of the actor and the det. unit in the rear I, det. Trimble, opened the drivers door of the actors vehicle and ordered him to step out. Det. Baker handcuffed the actor and placed him in the det. unit. The actor and his vehicle was then brought to the central police station. The vehicle was tagged at 1202 Washington and the actor was taken to the homicide division and placed on hold and was then placed in city jail. While at the scene of arrest officer Lobue read the actor his legal warning from the blue card furnished by the district attorney's office. The actor was sitting in the back seat of the Det. unit when his statutory warning was read to him.

PROGRESS REPORT: 5/20/75

At 3:30 AM Det. Stephenson was notified by Officer Lobue that the wanted actor, Gary Addison Taylor, was in custody. Det. Stephenson also spoke with Lt. Kersten in the Homicide Office and reported to Homicide at 4:15 AM 5/20/75.

The actor was booked in the city jail by Det. Trimble & Det. Baker. Det. Stephenson went to the car compound and found the actor's vehicle to be bearing 75 Texas LPK 508. Checked these plates on MVD Reg.--not reported by county. Det. Stephenson will secure search warrant this AM to search actor's vehicle, 1973 Chrysler white over bronze, 4 door--Vin:CL43M3C234377, bearing 75 Texas LPK 508. A search warrant will also be secured to search the actor's residence, 1120 Robbie St. in Houston, Harris County, Texas.

Det. T. Pierce, on follow-up investigation, found LPK 508 to be registered to Shirley A. McHugh, 5919 Jim--to a Buick Vin#452695X126188. Det. located Mr. L. L. Robie--5919 Jim ph 681 5562, who stated Shirley was their daughter and she sold her buick to Glenda Gail Hodge who works at Coffee Cup Restaurant Hempstead 462 0915. Mrs. Hodge was contacted & her father advised that the plates were missing from the car at this time, but Glenda did not know they were missing until asked about them, she states they were on her car when she drove it 5/19/75. She will make a report.

At 7:30 AM, Det. Stephenson contacted Asst. D.A. John Holmes and met with him at his office--301 San Jacinto. At this time affidavits for a search warrants were drawn on the actor's vehicle & residence. Search warrants were issued and executed by Judge Lawrence Wayne in his court at 10:30 AM--5/20/75. Copies of both search warrants are attached hereto, please refer to them for complete details.

Det. Stephenson & B. E. Frank proceeded to the actor's residence, 1120 Robbie, after securing house keys from key ring in actor's vehicle. Det. Arrived at 1120 Robbie at 10:50 AM. At this location, Robbie St. runs East & west. This residence is located on the north side of the street and faces to the south. This is a one story frame duplex residence with 1120 Robbie being located on the east side of the residence. Dets. entered through the back door which was secured with a dead bolt lock. The front door was secured with the same type lock and also a chain lock from the inside. The search started from the front door. See Diagram, not to scale, attached, for floor plan.

The following described items were recovered by Det. Stephenson from the presence of Det. Frank, from the residence of 1120 Robbie:

PROPERTY RECOVERED

LIVING ROOM: Numerous maps and magazines recovered from the drawers in the table that was used ~~xxx~~ as a stand for the television set. This table was located in the northwest corner of the living room.

BEDROOM: 55 keys were recovered from the top of and from the left top drawer of a dresser, which was located in the southwest corner of the bedroom. There were 16 loose keys, one motel ring from Las Vegas, 1 key ring containing 18 keys and one key ring containing 20 keys. These keys were marked by Det. Stephenson with the initials C.S. There were 2 white ~~XXXX~~ sheets recovered from the double bed which was located along the east wall of this bedroom, with the head to the north wall.

CLOSET: One 22 ~~xxxx~~ caliber Remington rifle fully loaded, serial #2448733. This rifle was marked by Det. Stephenson with the initials CLS, the date 5/20/75 and the location recovered 1120 Robbie. This closet is located near the southwest corner of the bedroom and is between the living room and the bedroom.

KITCHEN: Numerous discarded scraps of papers and notes were recovered from two white plastic sacks containing garbage. Which were located in the northwest corner of the kitchen. Some of these scraps of paper were marked with the initials C.S.

BATHROOM: One pair of men's light brown western cut (PANHANDLE) slacks, stained and one pair of men's size medium (EVD BRIEFS COLOR BROWN) stained and torn. Both items were marked by Det. Stephenson with the initials CLS and the date 5/20/75. The slacks were on a hanger, hanging on the wall of the bathroom. The briefs were on the edge of the sink. The bathroom is located on the north east corner of the house.

ALL OF THE ABOVE PROPERTY WAS TAGGED IN THE POLICE PROPERTY ROOM UNDER TAG # 89760 WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE SHEETS, THE SLACKS AND THE MEN'S BRIEFS. WHICH WERE PLACED IN THE HOMICIDE OFFICE PROPERTY ROOM TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE CRIME LAB UNDER HARRIS COUNTY'S SHERIFF OFFICE CASE # B 28396, SUSAN KAY JACKSON, DEAD WOMAN.

TUESDAY, MAY 20, 1975. I WAS ARRESTED BY POLICE ABOUT 3:00 AM. I HANDCUFFED BY DET. TRIMBLE, WHO TOLD ME TO RUN SO HE COULD SHOOT ME, AND AS HE RAN CAR TO THE MIDDLE OF THE STREET. POLICE SEARCHED MY CAR, AND DET. TRIMBLE THREATENED TO SMASH MY FACE IN. I WAS RETURNED TO MY PENITENTIARY HOUSE IN POLICE CAR, WHERE POLICE QUESTIONED NEIGHBORS, FORCED-ENTRY IN THE HOUSE, CONFISCATED MY PROPERTY + CLOTHING, AND AGAIN SEARCHED MY CLOSET. TRIMBLE WRENCHED MY HAIR WHILE HANDCUFFED + THREATENED TO SQUEAK MY FACE UP. AT POLICE HEADQUARTERS ONE HOUR LATER, I WAS INTERROGATED BY DET. STEVENSON, WHO BECAME FURIOUS AND VERBALLY ABUSIVE, THREATENING ME WITH HURDER IN JAIL, THE ELECTRIC CHAIR, AND PHYSICAL VIOLENCE. I STATED THAT I WOULD NOT ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS UNTIL I WANTED MY ATTORNEY. DET. STEVENSON AGAIN BECAME ANGRY AND CASTIGATED DET. TRIMBLE FOR "FUCKING-UP" AND BRINGING ME IN ALIVE. AT NO TIME DID POLICE READ ME MY RIGHTS, AS STATED IN THEIR REPORT. AT 7:00 PM TUESDAY I WAS TAKEN BY DET. FIERCE + BONDS BEFORE JUDGE BREEN. DET. B. TOLD ME HE WOULD NOT HANDCUFF ME, AND ADVISED ME TO SIGN THAT HE WOULD GIVE ME A \$500 CHANCE BEFORE SHOOTING AT ME. I ASKED JUDGE BREEN TO APPOINT ME AN ATTORNEY, AND ADVISED THE JUDGE THAT I DID NOT WISH TO BE QUESTIONED BY POLICE WITHOUT AN ATTORNEY PRESENT. THE JUDGE SAID I DID NOT HAVE TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS, AND THAT I WOULD NOT BE QUESTIONED BY POLICE AGAINST MY WILL. THE JUDGE SAID THAT THEY HAD NO PUBLIC DEFENDER, BUT STATED "THERE WILL BE ATTORNEYS IN A COURT TODAY, AND I WILL SEND AN ATTORNEY TO SEE YOU, THIS AFTERNOON. I TOOK THIS STATEMENT TO MEAN THAT JUDGE BREEN WOULD SEND ME AN ATTORNEY, ALTHOUGH IT WAS NOT CLEAR TO ME IF THE ATTORNEY WOULD BE CO-APPOINTED OR PAID FOR BY MYSELF. AFTER RETURNING FROM COURT, I WAS IMMEDIATELY INTERROGATED BY SEVERAL OF DETECTIVES FOR THE REMINDER OF DAY. DURING EACH INTERROGATION, I TOLD POLICE I DID NOT WISH TO ANSWER QUESTIONS, AND THAT I WANTED TO TALK TO MY LAWYER. TUESDAY AFTERNOON I WAS TOLD BY POLICE THAT I "MUST" STAND IN LINE-UPS, THAT I HAD NO CHOICE. I SAID I WANTED AN ATTORNEY PRESENT DURING LINE-UPS. THE POLICE SAID THEY WOULD WAIT UNTIL THURSDAY. ~~THEY WOULD WAIT UNTIL THURSDAY. THE POLICE SAID THEY WOULD WAIT UNTIL THURSDAY.~~

MY ATTORNEY DID NOT SHOW-UP, I HAD TO SIGN A "WHIVER OF LIME AND WHIVER OF ATTORNEY FORMS. I REFUSED TO SIGN. THE POLICE CONTINUED TO PRESSURE ME TO SIGN THE FORM, SAYING IT WAS "TEXAS STATE LAW THAT I SIGN THE FORMS" AND THAT THEY "HAD THE LEGAL RIGHT TO HANDCUFF ME AND THROW ME OUT ON THE LIME-UP STAGE. I WAS CONTINUED THREATENED WITH PHYSICAL VIOLENCE IF I DID NOT "VOLUNTARILY" GET IN THE LIME-UPS, AND SIGN THE WHIVERS. I WAS PRESSURED BY POLICE FOR HOURS. AFTER THEY MADE ^{ME} STAND IN LIME-UPS, TO SIGN WHIVERS - THEY SAID "SINCE YOU MR. LAWREN DID NOT SHOW-UP, THE LIME-UPS ARE STILL LEGAL, AND YOU MUST SIGN THE WHIVERS." I DID NOT SIGN THE WHIVERS.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 21. I SPENT MOST OF THE DAY BEING QUESTIONED BY TERMS OF DETECTIVES, AND I WAS RESENTLESSLY PRESSURED TO SIGN WHIVERS TO COUNSEL AND LIME-UPS. I REFUSED TO SIGN WHIVERS OF DISCUSS THE CHARGES, AND ASKED REPEATEDLY TO CALL AN ATTORNEY. I WAS CONTINUALLY THREATENED WITH DEATH AND VIOLENCE IF I DID NOT CONFESS TO THE RAPE CHARGES, WHICH POLICE SAID I HAD BEEN IDENTIFIED ON. DETECTIVE STEVENSON TOLD ME "I WOULD GET A BULLET BEFORE I GOT A LAWYER, SHE ALSO SAID WOULD PUT ME IN THE SAME TRUCK WITH A MURDER VICTIM'S BOYFRIEND THEN SUPPOSEDLY IN THE COUNTY JAIL SO I AND OTHER INMATES COULD KILL ME. ON TUESDAY OR WEDNESDAY MORNING CI (I AM NOT POSITIVE OF THE DAY) I WAS ALLOWED TWO PHONE CALLS IN A 10 MINUTE PERIOD. I CALLED HOUSTON LEGAL FOUNDATION, WHO REFERRED ME TO THE MR. LAWYENS REFERRAL SERVICE - THE LATTER STATED THAT THEY WOULD SEND AN ATTORNEY IMMEDIATELY. I ALSO WROTE A LETTER TO JUDGE BREEN REGARDING THE WHEREABOUTS OF MY ATTORNEY, AND I REQUESTED THE DETECTIVES TO CALL THE D.A.'S OFFICE AND ASK THE D.A. TO SEE ME. I WAS ALSO QUESTIONED BY SHERIFF'S DETECTIVES AND I REFUSED TO DISCUSS ANY CASES OR TO SIGN A WHIVER TO SEARCH MY CAR DURING BOTH WED. + THURSDAY NIGHTS, I WAS AWOKEN SEVERAL TIMES BY JAIL GUARDS, VIOLENTLY ABUSED + THREATENED WITH PHYSICAL VIOLENCE, AND DEATH.

THURSDAY, MAY 22. THIS WAS A REPETITION OF WEDNESDAY'S EVENTS. I WAS CONTINUOUSLY AND RESENTLESSLY QUESTIONED BY TERMS OF DETECTIVES

MY WIFE. DURING EACH OF THESE MANY INTERROGATIONS I REFUSED
 ANSWER QUESTIONS, AND ASKED TO USE THE PHONE TO CONTACT A LAWYER. MY
 MANY REQUEST WERE IGNORED OR REFUSED BY POLICE. THURSDAY MORNING
 THREE UNIFORMED POLICE ENTERED MY CELL. A BIG BLACK POLICEMAN DREW A
 CHANGE CLASP KNIFE AND SAID "I'M GOING TO CUT YOUR EYES-OUT". HE WAS
 PHYSICALLY RESTRAINED BY THE TWO OTHER COPS AS FROM 50 FEET. DURING

FRIDAY, MAY 23. I WAS AGAIN QUESTIONED ALL DAY ABOUT THE CHANGE
 MENTIONED PREVIOUSLY, AND WAS CONTINUALLY THREATENED WITH BRUTALITY FROM
 NO DEATH. I WAS CONTINUALLY DENIED USE OF THE TELEPHONE WHEN I REQUESTED
 TO CALL AN ATTORNEY, JUDGE BRENN, AND THE D.A. I WAS TOLD BY DETECTIVE
 STEVENSON THAT I WOULD NOT BE APPOINTED A LAWYER UNTIL I WENT TO TRIM
 7-7 MONTHS AWAY. STEVENSON ALSO STATED THAT THERE WAS NO SENSE IN MY
 TRYING TO CONTACT A LAWYER, BECAUSE SHE HAD "IMPOUNDED" MY MONEY AS

STURDAY MORNING, APPROXIMATELY 12:30 A.M. I WAS TAKEN FROM THE CITY JAIL
 BY DETS. TRIMBLE, STEVENSON + JOE KITTLE. TRIMBLE STATED "WE ARE THROUGH
 TALKING WITH YOU. I COULD SMELL ALCOHOL ON HIS BREATH. I WAS TAKEN ON
 THE ELEVATOR TO AN UNMARKED POLICE CAR AND TOLD BY DETECTIVE KITTLE
 TO RUN, YOU S.O.B. I WAS PUT INTO THE BACK SEAT OF THE CAR WITH KITTLE.
 STEVENSON PRODUCED 2-SIX PAKS OF BEER AND THEY CONTINUED DRINKING -
 KITTLE WAS DRINKING FROM A PT. OF WHISKEY. WHILE ON THE FREEWAY, AT
 NEEDS AN EXCESS OF 100 M.P.H., DET. TRIMBLE LOST CONTROL OF THE CAR AND

TRIMBLE TOLD ME THAT LITTLE WAS A RELATIVE OF MURDER VICTIM ASAN JACKSON, AND I HAD BETTER CONFESS TO THE RAPS + MURDERS AND PRODUCE THE BODIES, OR HE WOULD "GIVE ME TO LITTLE" AND LITTLE WOULD BEAT ME TO DEATH AND BURY ME IN THE PARK. I DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF MY MURDERS. TRIMBLE YELLED AT LITTLE, WHO CAME RUNNING AT ME + HIT ME IN THE THW - A BLOW THAT BROKE TWO TEETH. THEN I WAS KICKED IN THE STOMACH AND WAS UNCONSCIOUS MOMENTARILY - THEN I WAS STOMPED AND KICKED IN THE STOMACH, BACK + ELBOW. I WAS HANDICAPPED DURING THIS BEATING + FOR 5 H. OR MORE AFTERWARD. AFTER THIS, I AGREED TO CONFESS, BECAUSE ASSAULTED AGAIN BY LITTLE (3 TIMES) IN THE CAR. I WAS TOLD THAT ONCE BACK IN THE INTERROGATION ROOM, IF I BACKED OFF FROM SIGNING THE CONFESSIONS, I WOULD BE SHOT TO DEATH IN THE POLICE STATION, FOR "TRYING TO ESCAPE." WHILE MAKING + SIGNING CONFESSIONS IN THE INTERROGATION ROOM, TRIMBLE POINTED A 9. MM. BROWNING AUTOMATIC PISTOL AT ME AND THREATENED TO SHOOT ME FOR LYING. PRIOR TO SIGNING THE CONFESSIONS I PASSED OUT + WAS REVIVED BY DET. TRIMBLE.

AT APPROXIMATELY NOON, SATURDAY, MAY 24, I WAS AGAIN TAKEN FROM MY CELL TO THE INTERROGATION ROOM BY TRIMBLE. DET. STEVENSON SAID THAT IF I DID NOT TELL SET RANDALL, ON THE TELEPHONE, THE EXACT LOCATION OF STEVIE'S BODY, I WOULD BE SHOT RIGHT THEN, AND THEY WOULD SAY I "WENT CRAZY" AND TRIED TO ATTACK STEVENSON AND WAS KILLED BY TRIMBLE IN THE PROCESS. WHILE I TOLD RANDALL THE LOCATION OF THE BODY, TRIMBLE WAS COUGHED DOWN BEHIND THE DESK POINTING THE GUN AT MY FACE. AFTER THE CALL, I WAS TOLD THAT IF I HAD LIED AGAIN ABOUT THE LOCATION OF THE BODY, AND IF THE WASHINGTON DID NOT HAVE THE BODY "IN TWO HOURS", I WOULD BE KILLED IN THE MANNER PREVIOUSLY DESCRIBED.

AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

I, CAROLYN STEPHENSON, a Houston Police Officer, assigned to the Homicide Division, do solemnly swear that I have reason to believe and do believe that GARY ADDISON TAYLOR is presently secreting a criminal instruments, to-wit: a chrome revolver, small calibre with a "pearl-like" handle, and a large calibre blue steel revolver, at a location in Harris County, Texas, described as follows: 1120 Robbie, Houston, Harris County, Texas, the same being one unit of a single story duplex residential rental unit.

My reason for said belief is based upon the following facts and information which is known to me:

On March 11, 1975, Patricia Templeton was assaulted and made to perform oral sodomy on a White Male who she did not know. The said complainant told me that he threatened to beat her with two pistols which she described as a .22 or .25 calibre chrome revolver with "pearl-like" handles. She said that he also had a blue steel large calibre pistol which he threatened her with. All of this was told to your affiant by the said complainant, Patricia Templeton, on May 1, 1975. The same information was also told to J. Johnsonsen a patrol officer making the scene of the assault on March 11, 1975, and as evidenced by his report #G-00790 which I have read.

Prior to May 1, 1975, your affiant had been investigating numerous assaults wherein the description and the motive of operation of the actor involved matched the facts in Patricia Templeton's case. In one of those cases, the complainant had obtained a license number from a motor vehicle. Your affiant upon checking registration of said vehicle determined that it was registered to GARY ADDISON TAYLOR and gave a Michigan address. A check with NCIC showed the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR to be wanted as an escapee from a mental institution in Michigan. Your affiant contacted the Police Department in Royal Oak, Michigan. Royal Oak, Michigan was the address which the plates came back to on the said vehicle obtained aforesaid. The Identification Bureau of the Royal Oak Police Department forwarded to your affiant a photograph of the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR, which was received in the Homicide Division of the Houston Police Department on May 1, 1975.

On May 1, 1975, Detective Terry Stark, with the Houston Police Department Homicide Division, displayed the said photograph, along with other photographs, to the complainants in numerous assault cases wherein the motive of operation was like the facts in the Templeton case. There were three (3) positive identifications of the photograph of the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR, which had been obtained aforesaid, and among those positively identifying the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR as the assailant was Ms. Templeton. This information was told to me that same date by the said Terry Stark, who is known to me.

Based upon the identification aforesaid, charges of sexual abuse were filed on the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR on said date.

At approximately 2:30 A.M. on May 20, 1975, Detective Trimble received a call from Austin, Texas Police Department who stated they had received information from an informant that GARY ADDISON TAYLOR was in Houston and was working at Best Industries and at this time should be leaving Best Industries enroute to his apartment located at 1120 Robbie Street in Houston, Harris County, Texas.

After receiving the telephone call from the Austin, Texas Police Department, Detective Trimble and other officers of the Houston Police Department began surveillance of the location of 1120 Robbie. At approximately 3:00 A.M., a White Male left the house and drove away in a 1973 Chrysler, White/Bronze bearing 1975 Texas License LPK-508. Detective Trimble later told me these facts and that he personally recognized the said TAYLOR from the photograph that had been sent from the Royal Oak, Michigan Police Department aforesaid. In the 2000 block of Studewood, the said vehicle and said occupant were stopped and arrested and the vehicle was taken to 61 Reischer Street, where it is presently located.

The activities as described above by Detective Trimble were told to your affiant in the Homicide Division of the Houston Police Department on this date. I know Detective Trimble and know him to be a credible person.

WHEREFORE, I have reason to believe and do believe that the criminal instruments as alleged, i.e. the two pistols as described by Ms. Templeton and that were used in the sexual assault upon her person may be found in the said residence of the said GARY ADDISON TAYLOR or in the vehicle he was arrested in as described above, and would ask that a warrant issue to search the said location and the said vehicle and to seize the said criminal instruments.

At 2:15AM Det. Stephenson checked the actor, Gary Taylor out of the City Jail and brought him to the Homicide Office. When Taylor arrived in the Homicide Office he was again given his legal warning by Det. Stephenson from the blue card issued by the D.A.'s Office and he stated that he understood his rights. At this time he was questioned by Det. Stephenson in regard to Harris County Sheriff's Office murder case on Susanne Jackson. Taylor was asked to make a statement in regard to the case and he made an oral confession to Det. Stephenson which he was asked to reduce to writing and he stated that he would. A written confession was taken by Det. Stephenson in the Jackson case. The confession was taken from 3:00AM to 4:20AM. At 4:20AM the confession was completed and signed by Taylor in front of witnesses. During the time the written confession was being taken the actor asked for and was given one package of cigarettes and three cups of coffee.

The actor was then questioned in regards to the missing person, Vonnice Joyce Stuth and Taylor stated to Detective Stephenson that Vonnice Stuth was dead and he had killed her. Taylor was asked to make a written statement in regards to this case and he stated that he would. A written statement confession was taken by Det. Stephenson from 4:40AM until 5:40AM at which time the confession was completed and signed by Gary Taylor and witnesses, Det. H. R. Trimble and Det. D. R. Spurlock. During the time of this confession the actor, Taylor, asked for a drink of water and to use the restroom.

At approximately 6:00AM Taylor stated that he was hungry. His food order was placed in the police cafeteria and at 6:40AM his order was brought to Homicide Office by Det. Trimble. The actor, Taylor ate a hamburger, order of french fries and three cups of coffee. After eating the prisoner was returned to the City Jail by Det. Trimble at 8:18AM.

At approximately 7:00AM Det. Stephenson notified Sgt. Bussa, King County Police Seattle, Washington 206 344-3883 of the confession in this case and he advised a search party would be organized and our department would be kept advised of the developments.

At 12:50PM 5-24-75 Det. Stephenson was contacted by phone by Sgt. Randall, of the King County Police, who was at the time in Duwamish Washington PD to conduct a search for Vonnice Stuth. Sgt. At 4:00PM this date Det. Stephenson was advised by phone call from Sgt. Randall that the compls body (Vonnie Stuth) had been recovered from Taylors directions at 11:50PM Washington time. Sgt. Randall was advised that this report would be mailed to him by air mail later this date.

I, Gary Addison Taylor

have been warned by Carolyn Stephenson, the person
to whom this statement is made that: (1) I have the right to have a lawyer present

lawyer, I have the right to have a lawyer appointed to counsel with me both prior to
and during any questioning, (3) I have the right to remain silent and not make any
statement at all and any statement I make may and probably will be used in evidence
against me at my trial and (4) I have the right to terminate the interview at any
time I so desire.

I fully understand all of these rights, and, desiring to waive all of them, I
hereby make the following voluntary statement

It was Wednesday, May 14th I went to the Three Thieves Club on Shepherd
and something I don't know the street. It was around noon or after lunch.
I went in and had a couple of beers. This girl I had propositioned before
named Sue, she was high, came over to my table. Sue's tall and blond.
She asked if I wanted to turn a trick. I had asked her once before and
she didn't because she couldn't get off work, she worked in the club, she's
a Go Go Girl. At the time I asked her about the whole weekend and she
said no she needed money now for her car. I kept drinking. She wanted
to turn the date right then because she could get off work. So I kept
drinking a while and she kept coming back and messing around and I said
yes. So we left about 2:00 o'clock or so. She wanted \$200.00 and all I
had was \$300.00. She said something about a motel and I was thinking about
saving money and I thought it would be cheaper to go to my place so I
book her to my place on Robble Street. We had sex relations and drank a
bottle of wine and she took some black pills she had and she went to sleep.
I did too for a short time. I woke up and got dressed. Then I got my
money out of a pair of shorts she had been wearing. A little later she
woke up and got dressed in her Levi shorts and then she missed the money.
She really made a fuss, started really hollaring. I was afraid of the
neighbors hearing something so I grabbed her and told her to shut up that
I would give her half of it. She really got wild yelling about the money,
she really got loud. I threw her on the bed and she started screaming.
I thought someone might hear. I started choking her and telling her not
to scream that I'd give her the money and I would have. She wouldn't quit
and I kept choking her and then she was dead. I couldn't believe she was
dead that quick. I left her there on my bed. I took her shorts off and
put her in some plastic bags and an old blanket and tied it with a chain
had in my car. I kept drinking. When it got dark I put her in the
trunk of my car. I went back inside and drank till I passed out.
The next morning all I could think of was I had to get rid of her. I drove
my car out north on 45 highway and I turned off, I don't know the area.
I had been near there just once before looking for a job at A & W Valve
company. The place I drove is somewhere off 1960 road. I noticed my tail
light and break light on my car went out. When I noticed this I still had
not found a good place but I got scared about the tail light, I didn't want
to get stopped. So I took the first sport where no one was around it was
a paved road with hardly any houses anywhere. I stopped my car and
at her out on the side of the road and went back home. I threw most her
things out while I was drinking. I threw her slippers and purse and perfume
it along the road as I drove out there and I put the shorts she had on
in my neighbors garbage. When I got home I cleaned up the car. I went
to work that night.

I then got my kit that had all my work clothes in it and left again and drove down Shepherd St. and turned on Colquitt St. and I saw SUSAN JACKSON and R.G. standing there talking. It was just down from the intersection of Shepherd and Colquitt. I know this guy R.G. because he comes in Diablos occasionally. As I passed, R.G. waved at me and motioned for me to stop so I pulled up in a driveway and R.G. came over to the window and asked me where ROY RIVERS was because he wanted a job with him. I asked SUSAN if she still worked at the Three Thieves and she said yes that she was on her way to work. I told her to get in that I would give her a ride to work. She got in my car and I started off and I noticed that she was wearing a black shirt, it was a cut out type with embroidered flowers on the front, a pair of jeans that had a brown tiger sewn on the back of the pocket. They were low cut type jeans and they were hemmed and they were real faded. She was wearing thong type shoes with straw inset soles and they had velvet straps that were either black or navy blue. I went to work at the Three Thieves at 2301 San Felipe on the 25th of January 1975. I was tending bar and Susan Jackson was one of the dancers. She lived about 4 blocks from the club, she didn't have a car and I would either go and get her in the mornings or she would hitchhike to work. Upon until around the middle of April she had a room mate her name was Anita Graves. They got into a hassle and Anita moved back in with her mother. Dancers are suppose to be at the club at 11:00 AM and Susan would usually get there around 11:45 AM or 12:00 noon. She always came to work, she was late, but she always came to work. This was up until around the 1st of May when she started coming in and then leaving and she got to where she would work two or three days a week. The week that she disappeared, she came to work Monday, then she took off Tuesday, said she had a doctor's appointment. She came in Wednesday about 12:30 PM -14-75. Business had been slow for two or three weeks. The man who I identified in the line up at the City Police Department, who I have learned is M. Mr. TAYLOR came into the club on Wednesday around 1:00 PM shortly after Susan had come in. There were three other girls working besides Susan and myself. There were three or four customers in the back playing pool. I don't know who they were, they were just there. Mr. TAYLOR was sitting in the first booth on the left hand side, booths curve around, and he was sitting in the booth against the wall, and Susan went over and sat right beside him. I walked from behind the bar to get a package of cigarettes that's when I got a good look at Mr. TAYLOR. Susan had already come in and changed clothes, she had on a low cut pair of brush denim's which she had cut off and hemmed herself and there was a little tiger on the right side rear of the denim's., she had taken them off and threw them in the dressing room. She also had on a white or light top, long sleeve, which had some type of design on the front of it, which she put on. To the best of my recollection, she had on a red pair of bikini underwear. She went and said down with Mr. Taylor, I didn't pay too much attention to how Mr. Taylor was dressed, except for the fact that he was wearing dark glasses. They sat there for awhile and had a couple of drinks and then at 2:30 PM, Susan came up and said she had a doctor's appointment and that she had to leave, I remember it is 2:30 PM because she had not been there very long and I looked at the clock. She is going toward the dressing room. When she had come in, she hadn't mentioned anything about having a doctor's appointment. She got her purse and then walked out of the club with MR. TAYLOR. I ask Susan if she was going to be back before 7:00 PM, and she said she was coming back because she was going to work the night shift. That's the last I heard anything of her until 10:30 AM the next morning, 5-15-75, and I had just gotten to the club and it was about 10:30 AM or 11:45 AM and the nursery called that keeps Susan's little boy, and said that she had not picked up Jason. I didn't hear anything else until the Detectives came in and told me they had found Susan's body the day before. I told the Detectives the above information, that I have given in this statement.

In July or August of 1974, I met a girl by the name of SUSAN JACKSON. She was a topless dancer at the three thieves club on San Felipe St. One time when I was working as a carpenter on some townhouses on the corner of Colquitt and McDuffey, SUSAN'S son, JASON, came by there and picked up a bunch of tools and I had to ask SUSAN for the tools back. I wasn't mad at the boy or anything, I just wanted my tools back. I saw SUSAN occasionally, when she would be working at the club, or walking down the street. I never dated her or anything.

I knew that susan was a prostitute, because I knew alot of the guys that she was tricking. A guy by the name of ROY RIVERS dated her alot. I also knew that SUSAN was dealing in drugs. Her son even came down to the job site where I was working and he would have joints (marijuana) with him.

On the morning of 5-14-75, at about 11:00AM, I was walking to the Duncan Do Nut Shop on the corner of Shepherd and Colquitt to get some donuts and some milk. While I was walking, I saw a man that I didn't know driving up and down the street. I saw him pull into a stall in front of an attorney's office. It was a 72-73 model El Dorado with bullet holes in it and I remarked about the bullet holes and the man said that vandals had done it. The Man was about 40-5 years old, he was a white man, had gray hair, about 5'8" tall, 140-50 pounds, dressed in a sport suit with a tie. He was wearing a large ring on his right hand, I think. I'm not sure if it was a masonic ring, or what, but it was noticeable. I talked with him for a few minutes and he spoke well, and he didn't have a Southern drawl. I noticed that when DIANE and SUSAN drove off, that man in the black El Dorado Cadillac started up his car and drove off in a different direction from SUSAN and DIANE.

That was the last time that I saw SUSAN.

My full name is RONALD JERRY FLORES and I am a Mexican Male twenty-four years of age. My date of birth is: 8-8-50. I am married and live with my wife, Ernestina R. Flores, at 1122 Robbie Street, Houston, Texas. I do not have a phone. I am presently employed at the North Side Industries as a Welder Trainee.

I first met GARY TAYLOR when he moved in next door to me about five or six weeks ago. We just met outside the house when I was feeding the cat. He came out and told me that he was feeding the cat too and that he didn't know whose it was. It was nobody's cat so we both agreed to feed him. As I recall it, Gary didn't have too much property when he moved into the house, just some suits, suitcases. As the days passed along, we would strike up conversations whenever we'd meet outside. . . I usually got home about 4:00 p.m. and he'd usually be sitting in his house watching television, in some shorts, and I'd always say, Hi Neighbor. Sometimes he'd open the door and ask if I wanted a drink (he always had a bottle - Thunderbird wine or whiskey) - We'd mostly talk about his job back in Michigan - he used to work for General Motors. I'd go in there just about every day - and we'd just talk about his working for General Motors and the economic problems. One afternoon when I was talking with him, he told me that he had been married, but him and his wife weren't together any more - I don't know if they were divorced or what - he just said they weren't together any more - I said he was going to go back to Michigan after he took care of his business here. He didn't say what the business was - said he had a lot of bills to pay - for his wife, his car, his house - but he said he wouldn't borrow any - that he had it under control. Another afternoon when I came home, he was outside waxing his car - a brown Chrysler - seemed to be painted an off color - he said he had a wreck one time and the color painted came out that way - he was going to leave it like that. I think it was about a '73 or '74 model. I remember when he was polishing it, it still had the Michigan license plates on it. The first I remember is that he worked at night - he would never be at home at night. I asked him when he ever slept because he was always awake when I came home from work. Sometimes he'd make a lot of noise banging things around - it could have been those weights he used to lift, but he made a lot of noise. Then sometimes, it would be very quiet in there. One afternoon when I came home and went into the back yard I seen some blankets hanging on the clothes line. I asked my wife if they were ours and she said no - there was about two or three of them. I asked Gary if they were his and he said that they were - There was a green one, and a pink one and a sort of like a beige looking one - Sometimes they'd stay out there for three or four days - He said he left them outside to get good and aired - they were dusty. I remember seeing the green one on the bed on several occasions. Usually the bed wasn't fixed at all and I recall seeing them all on the bed - just piled on there. I saw Gary the Monday before they arrested him Tuesday and I was in his house and his bed was still all messed up and the pink blanket was on the bed, but I didn't notice the green one, or the beige one. He had on a striped shirt (a pullover) bantam-like, and we were just talking about things. He said he could get me a job where he was working - he knew the foreman. I went on back next door to my house and I didn't see him any more until I saw his picture in the paper a couple of days later. Then, I didn't know what to do or what to think and on Thursday Detective Evans came out from the Sheriff's Office and asked me what kind of neighbor I had. I told him he was a pretty regular dude as far as I knew and Mr. Evans asked me if I would take a look at a blanket. Mr. Evans got the blanket and brought it up on the porch and took it out of a plastic bag and asked me if I had ever seen one like in in Mr. Taylor's house and I told him I sure had - that he used to hang one out on the clothes line, exactly like it and that there was a pink one also and a beige one. Detective Evans asked me if I could be sure that that was the blanket that belonged to Gary and I said yes, that I used to see it about every day - if it wasn't on his bed, it was on the clothes line.

Detective Evans asked me if Gary ever talked about his job, women or guns and I told him, all the time... Well, he told me he had a few girl friends, but I never did see them. He brought one of them over one time - I didn't see her, he just told me he did - Most of the time he said he went to the Holiday Inn or some motel around there. One time he said he met this girl at some club and took her to the Holiday Inn. He told me about having a gun - a .357 Magnum and showed it to me - I even held it in my hand. He said he bought it for about \$149.00 here. He said he used to rob banks, or people a long time ago, but I thought he was just coming - He said he had been to the joint and I told him I had too. He would hardly talk about it - he just said he was in a place with a lot of bad people in there. He told me one time the name but I can't remember it - it was in Michigan. He

asked me if I could find him a .9mm pistol - just like a Luger - that he didn't care how much it cost, he would pay me for it. He had mentioned about his being in the Service and talked about the pistols and guns he had used and said he was real good with one (guns). I forgot to tell you one thing - he was always asking me if I could get him some uppers - anything that would keep him awake. . . Like Mollies (he calls them Dexies). I told him that must be Dexadrene or Methadrene. I told him about Black Mollies - he said he didn't care that he bought them by the hundreds. I told him I didn't know where to get them. If I heard, I would let him know. He would always dress up about two or three times a week - especially on Saturday and Sunday. He said he'd go downtown or the other side of town to eat.

That's about all I know - we usually talked, like neighbors.

INTRODUCTION:

On 5-19-75, Detective L. P. Garner assisted Detective D. R. Maddox with reference to the above offense. I accompanied Detective Maddox to 1805 Colquit St., apartment #2, same being the residence of the complainant, for the purpose of making a search in an effort to obtain any evidence relevant to the above offense. We made contact with the apartment manager, Mrs. Peggy OWENS, who admitted us to the apartment through the use of a pass key, after which a search was initiated.

While still at the location, Detective L. P. Garner conducted the following interview with Mrs. OWENS.

INTERVIEW WITH PEGGY OWENS (NE) 1805 Colquit St., apartment #4, 524 9770:

Interview was conducted at approximately 8:30AM 5-19-75. Mrs. OWENS who resides next door to the deceased, advised that approximately two months prior, that the complainant had advised her that she had been having trouble with her boyfriend, ROY RIVER, and had asked Mrs. OWENS not to allow him admittance to the apartment. She further advised that ROY was getting possessive and jealous of other guys and had slapped her around a couple of times. The complainant then asked Mrs. OWENS to come to her aid if she knocked on the wall separating their apartments. MRS. OWENS stated that she thought that ROY had been paying the complainant's rent for a period of several months. Mrs. OWENS described subject ROY RIVERS AS follows:

LAM, 23-30, approx. 5'8" tall, 195 lbs, well built, shoulder length dark hair, occasionally worn in a pony tail, generally dressed in blue jeans and t-shirt (work clothes). For evening, RIVERS generally dressed in expensive, wild type clothing.

Mrs. OWENS described the deceased as being quiet, polite, and high most of the time. She stated that many men were observed coming in and out of the apartment all hours of the day and night, with one man generally remaining throughout the night. She stated that the men were generally long-haired hippy types, generally in their middle 20's and were generally high on drugs. Information that the complainant advised Mrs. OWENS that she had been raped by three LAM's approx. two weeks ago while hitchhiking.

NOTE: photographs of the subject ROY RIVERS and his vehicle were found in the complainant's apartment and are included in Pkg. #3 (tag #2913).

At 2:30PM 5-20-75, this Detective L. P. Garner was at the Three Thieves Lounge on San Felipe St. on a follow up investigation, when I overheard a patron of the Lounge remark about SUSAN JACKSON being on the drug scene and that he was not surprised that something happened to her due to the associates she had. I approached the subject and identified myself and asked him to step into the manager's office. The subject was found to be ROBERT GENE WHITE and he agreed to talk with me, however seemed extremely nervous and appeared to be frightened of me.

In talking with ROBERT GENE WHITE, he advised that he knew quite a bit about SUSAN'S life and stated that he wanted to tell me about it. I advised ROBERT that I had another appointment and would not be able to talk with him at length at that time and requested that he come to Headquarters in the AM of (5-21-75) and he agreed. On 5-21-75 at approx. 5:00PM, Mr. WHITE contacted me and requested that I come to his residence in the AM to pick him up.

On 5-22-75, at 9:00AM, I went to the residence of ROBERT GENE WHITE and brought him to Headquarters for the purpose of an interview.

INTERVIEW WITH ROBERT GENE WHITE:

ROBERT stated that Susan was going the whole route on drugs, was turning tricks and advised that he had seen her around 11:00AM on the street near her apartment and had stopped and talked to her. He stated that she was badly sunburned and was swollen as if she may have been hit in the face. Mr. WHITE then agreed to having his statements reduced to writing after which he affixed his signature to the bottom of the statement. Statement will be attached to and made a part of this case report.

Prior to talking with GENE WHITE I learned that the Cadillac with the bullet holes in it which he referred to in his statement, was similar to a Cadillac with bullet holes in it driven by HAROLD BERT KEEL, "DADDY BERT". While WHITE was sitting at the desk talking with WHITE this Detective, subject leaned over the desk and pointed at BERT KEEL'S photograph which was laying on the desk and said "that looks like the man in the Cadillac" and then picked up the photograph for closer inspection and said "yes, I'm sure that's him". He gave a physical description of subject KEEL which closely matched the description listed on KEEL on his rap sheet from City

These Detectives did not find any additional information at 1120 Robbie St. and left there and proceeded to 1717 Roy - Best Industries - phone #861 4232 where we were introduced to Charles W. Le Master, Secretary-Treasurer of the company. Detective Pierce explained to Mr. Le Master that we needed a copy of Defendant Taylor's employment application and any additional information that the company could give us. In this interview with Mr. Le Master, we learned that an employee by the name of Robert Nelson had been pretty close to Taylor. He asked that Mr. Nelson be called in Mr. Le Master's office for an interview.

INTERVIEW WITH ROBERT NELSON: (8574 Rason St.) (phone #462 4377) (WM)(35)

Mr. Nelson stated that he used to work with Taylor, off and on, and that he had been to a machine show recently with Mr. Taylor and that all that they ever talked about was machinery, and Mr. Taylor's job prior to going to work for Best Industries at the General Motors Plant in Michigan. In fact, they had nicknamed him "Detroit" there in the shop. Mr. Nelson said that they had a breaking in of one of the employee's car recently and that they had all went outside to see what was going on. Taylor had carried him over to his car (a white, over brown, Chrysler) and opened the trunk and pulled out a .357 magnum - which he (Nelson) handled while Taylor told him that if he

ever caught anyone breaking into his car, they'd get a "piece of the action." Mr. Nelson went on to tell these detectives (Pierce, White and Evans) that they had a young lady working the second shift there by the name of Terry who had had some words with Taylor, that she was quite a girl and didn't take any talk off of anybody and that she had majored in Psychology. Mr. Nelson said that the night that Taylor and Terry had words, Terry told him later that she had become very scared of Taylor because he had stared at her and the stare made her feel very creepy. Then that same night, but later on, Taylor had come back around and asked her to go to breakfast with him and Taylor had said that Nelson could go along too. Mr. Nelson stated that Terry told Taylor where he could go - and she punched out and went on home. Mr. Nelson said that was about all he knew because he didn't work a steady shift with Taylor, but that he was a pretty good machinist.

End of Interview.

Mr. Lelaster stated that if we would come back later, about 5:00 P.M., he would have Terry Gibson come back to his office for an interview with us. Mr. Lelaster said if we could give him a day that he would have some copies of Taylor's employment application and time-cards made up for us. We advised Mr. Lelaster that we would return around 5:00 P.M.

These detectives then went to the Houston Police Department Car Compound where we (Pierce, White and Evans) met the DPS Laboratory man and Detective Maddox. (See Page 20)

This detective (Evans) and Detective White from City Homicide, went to the Harris County Morgue and received from Dr. Green - to this Detective Evans - a plastic container that contained one black piece of plastic material with some hair attached to it, that had been placed in this container 5/18/75 by Dr. Green during the autopsy and had been left at the Morgue. This detective (Evans) and Detective White of City Homicide, while Detective Maddox and Sgt. O'Shaughnessy went by 1250 Colquitt, Apt. #2 and gathered evidence listed on Page 20, returned to City Homicide. Detective White picked up a copy of their juvenile case and we went to their property room and got some keys listed in this case and then proceeded to 1120 Robbie St. whereupon we inserted the keys into the door and found that they did fit. Then we left 1120 Robbie St. and went back to 1717 Roy St. to the Best Industries for our interview with Terry Gibson. He arrived back at Best Industries at 5:00 P.M. and met with Mr. Lelaster who called Terry Gibson into his office and we began an interview at 5:15 p.m.

Miss Gibson stated that when Mr. Taylor first came to work there, she didn't have any reason to be associated with him too much but he changed shifts and was working the shift after hers and that he had made several remarks about women's lib, politics and about he was a better machinist than she. Mr. Taylor was running a tape machine which is a machine programmed to cut certain pieces of metal to certain thicknesses. On this one particular day, a couple-three weeks ago, she had an occasion, she said, to work a double shift. It was on a Tuesday, the best she could recall. And during the second shift, she was running the #2 Tape machine next to his and the project called for Taylor to finish one portion of the pipe and hand her the pipe so she could finish the second portion. As she began the second shift, he "lit into her" about how much more work he could produce and that women were made for two things: for making babies for the army and be a depositor for male semen. She told him why didn't he keep his mouth shut and do his work. He advised her that he would like to roommate with her and that once she went with him, she would never want to go with anyone else again. She said he just kept this harrassment up for the next couple of hours and several times during this period, she got ahead of him and would look over and ask him why he was dragging behind. She said this did make him very angry and he looked at her with a real "weird" look and just kept staring at her - then he started in on her about her body. She said that she finally took a coffee break and one of the other guys came by and mentioned how Taylor was staring at her. She said that when she resumed work, Taylor started down-grading her again - and that's when she told him that if he didn't get off her back and quit being obnoxious she was going to hit him and one of the guys yelled out: I'll pay to see you hit him - and she said that Taylor sniled back at her and said "you hit me and I'm one of the type of guys that will sure hit you back." She went on to say that along towards the last of the shift, Taylor came around to her side of the machine and said "let's bury the hatchet and make up - come on over to my place for breakfast." She said that she responded, no thank you and he asked her what's the matter - "are you afraid I am going to rape you." She said no and Taylor said "we'll even let Yankee (nickname for Robert Nelson) come along." Miss Gibson said she did recall some of the things he said at other times like "I am a card-carrying Nazi" "I've had to get FBI clearance" and that sometimes he whistled, with no tune - just an eerie sound. Miss Gibson said that if she could think of anything else, she would get in touch with this Detective.

The interview was ended at 6:00 P.M., and Miss Gibson returned to the Shop. She came right back to tell us that one afternoon when she came in to work, while Taylor was working days, she found all of his tools in her tool box and she said she really got onto him about that and she told him she would sell him the damn tool box if he wanted it so bad for \$5.00 - lock and all. She said he pulled out \$5.00 and she gave him the box, lock and one key and he asked her "where in the hell is the other key" "What are you doing, holding out on me so you can get back in my tool box." She told him all she had was one key, and that she didn't need a damned thing out of his box. Detective White

then asked her if the tool box was still out there in the shop and she said that it was. He also asked her about the lock and she said we'd have to find the lock, she thought it was out there too. Miss Gibson went and looked and returned with the tool box which was released to Detective White and Miss Gibson said that they would find the lock and we could pick it up 5/23/75. These detectives thanked Miss Gibson for her cooperation and advised Mr. LeMaster that we would return 5/23/75 and get the lock, the time-cards and the application.

This Detective (Evans) returned Detective White to City Homicide and then began looking for the neighbor of Mr. Taylor's who lives on the West side of the duplex #1122 Robble St. This detective went to 1122 Robble St. and found no-one at home. INTERVIEW WITH RONALD JERRY FLORES:

Mr. Flores stated that he had first met Gary Taylor some five or six weeks ago when he (Taylor) first moved in and that he was a pretty good neighbor - that he spoke to him every day when he came home from work and about all they talked about was Mr. Taylor's job, machines, guns and Mr. Taylor had mentioned about having several different women. He said that Mr. Taylor had also mentioned about being in the joint and that his wife and him were not getting along. This detective then asked Mr. Flores if he had been in Taylor's house and he said, yes, on numerous occasions. This detective then asked Mr. Flores if he would mind taking a look at something for me. Mr. Flores went on to say that he was sure surprised to see Mr. Taylor's picture in the paper and learn of the trouble that he was involved in. This detective then asked Mr. Flores if he would mind coming down to the Sheriff's office and give us a statement concerning having known Mr. Taylor. Mr. Flores stated that he would not mind at all, and this detective advised Mr. Flores that he would get back with him in a couple of days.

Reports of the investigation conducted by the Michigan State Police in the basement of the TAYLOR home indicates there is a small room located in the southwest corner of the basement which has been so designed and boxed in to indicate to the members of the Michigan State Police Crime Laboratory, Plymouth, Michigan, Investigative Team, that this was designed to be a sound proof room, a torture chamber.

Members of the Investigative team from the crime lab now feel the room located in the basement is in fact the scene of the homicides, inasmuch as blood and flesh was found on the floor, walls, ceiling and pipes located herein. At this time she stated if the four bodies were not all found in the sand underneath the bedroom, there were two other possibilities where they could be found, indicating one of the possibilities was the woods directly to the rear of the TAYLOR home at 9210 Kingsley Dr., Onsted, Michigan, and the other a large sandy lot on the other side of the subdivision near a creek, an area which was scheduled not to be developed because of the soil potential.

DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR INVESTIGATION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW, GARY A. TAYLOR, Defendant in the above-captioned causes, and pursuant to Article 26.05, V. A. C.C.P, the Fifth and Sixth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States, and the due process and equal protection clauses of the Constitution of the United States, and Texas, and the doctrine expressed in Brady v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83, files his motion for investigation, in support of which he would show:

I.

Subsequent to his arrest for the instant offenses the Defendant was incarcerated and held incommunicado for several days. During this time the Defendant's repeated requests for appointed counsel and his assertion of his right to remain silent were ignored while "Peace Officers" subjected the Defendant to third degree interrogation.

II.

Some seventy-two (72) hours after his arrest, three (3) members of the Houston Police Department removed the Defendant from the confines of the Houston City Jail and drove him in an unmarked police car to "Memorial Park", an area located within the boundaries of Harris County, Texas.

III.

In a deserted section of the woods at "Memorial Park", the "Peace Officers" proceeded to physically abuse the Defendant and threaten him at gun point. After said beatings the Defendant signed certain instruments entitled "Confessions with Officer's warning".

These instruments purport to implicate the Defendant in certain murders in the States of Washington and Michigan and in the instant offenses.

IV.

Presently the State of Washington is attempting to extradite the Defendant to stand trial there for the offense of murder. This Court has set an extradition hearing in said matter for hearing on June 30, 1975.

V.

Defendant's attorneys, to prove the above, must be able to document and prove the existence of certain evidence at the scene of the aforementioned beating which will corroborate Defendant's recounting of the circumstances surrounding the taking of the "Confessions".

VI.

Although the Defendant has described the general location of the scene of the incidents of physical coercion, it is not possible to determine the exact location without the Defendant's presence at the scene.

VII.

If the Defendant is extradited to Washington without a thorough and complete investigation into the totality of the circumstances surrounding the taking of said "Confessions" at this time and in this location he will be irreparable harmed and denied his rights to confrontation, compulsory process, the effective assistance of counsel, due process, and equal protection of the laws.

VIII.

Due to the nature and circumstances of the instant offenses, and an investigation into the Defendant's background the State's Assistant District Attorney, Mr. Don Lambright, has made known to defense counsel that he will do whatever necessary, within his lawful powers, to insure that the Defendant be incarcerated for the remainder of his natural life. Thus, should the Defendant prevail in the trial of the murder charges in the State of Washington, the Defendant, in all probability will be tried here at some future date for the instant offenses. Therefore, the Defendant must be granted an opportunity to gather the extant exculpatory evidence prior to its permanent loss.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, the Defendant prays that the Court enter each of the following orders:

- (1) That the Defendant be taken with his attorneys to the scene of the beatings to ascertain its exact location with appropriate orders to protect the attorney-client privilege.
- (2) That funds be provided, pursuant to Article 26.05, V.A.C.C.P., to hire individuals to "comb" the general area of the beatings for evidence, and to hire experts to examine into the physical and chemical properties of said evidence.
- (3) That the above-mentioned three (3) officers of the Houston Police Department be subjected to polygraph examinations and interrogation to determine the exact location of the beatings, and the totality of the circumstances surrounding the taking of the confessions.
- (4) That the Defendant be allowed to take the depositions of the three (3) officers of the Houston Police Department prior to the Defendant's extradition, if any.

STATE'S AMENDED MOTION FOR PSYCHIATRIC
EXAMINATION AND MEMORANDUM OF LAW FOR
THE COURT ON THE ISSUE OF AUTHORITY OF
THE COURT TO ORDER INQUIRY INTO MENTAL
COMPETENCY AND SANITY

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

NOW COMES CAROL S. VANCE, District Attorney of Harris County, Texas, and in behalf of the State files this its Amended Motion for Psychiatric Examination and Memorandum of Law in support thereof.

The nature of the offense for which the Defendant, ELMER WAYNE HENLEY, JR., in this case has been indicted is such that the question of his legal sanity at the time of the offense may well be raised at the trial on the merits. Defense Counsel has stated publicly that the defense would be raised, and, in fact, indicated to the Honorable George Walker, Judge, 185th District Court, Harris County, Texas, during a hearing on a Writ of Habeas Corpus filed in said Honorable Court on the 13th day of August, A.D. 1973, that, as counsel for Defendant, a psychiatric examination and evaluation conducted by doctors of the Defendants own choice would be requested.

Pursuant to the Motion filed by the State on the 15th day of August, A.D. 1973, and the hearing thereon on the 16th day of August, A.D. 1973, defense counsel, Charles Owen McInder, filed Defendant's Motion to Dismiss State's Motion for Psychiatric Examination". In relation to the Motion of defendant, counsel stated in open court before this Honorable Court that an examination of the Defendant, FLEMMER WAYNE HENLEY, JR., pursuant to the Motion of the

State for said examination would be in violation of the Defendant's 5th Amendment Right to remain silent and privilege against self incrimination.

The State takes issue with this position, and at the outset would respectfully cite to the Court Section 46.02, Subsection 2(F)(4), which reads as follows:

"No statement made by the Defendant during examination into his competency shall be admitted in evidence against the accused on the issue of guilt in any criminal proceeding no matter under what circumstances such examination takes place."

Because of this protective provision, the 5th Amendment does not apply. In connection therewith it would likewise be improper for counsel to insist that he be present during any examination of the defendant by psychiatrists and psychologists. In Blankenship v. State, 432 SW2d 945, objection was made that examinations of the appellant occurred after appointment of trial counsel, at which time trial counsel was not present. The Court said:

"No authority is cited by appellant in support of his contention. We know of none. Certainly a mental examination is not a confession, and therefore would not be subject to the requirements and rules laid down by the Supreme Court of the United States in Escobedo v. State of Illinois, 378 U.S. 478, 84 S.Ct. 1758, 12 L.Ed.2d 977, and Miranda v. Arizona, 384 U.S. 436, 86 S.Ct. 1602, 16 L.Ed.2d 694. The grounds of error are overruled".

In Early v. Tinsley, 286 F2d 1, 3. (10th Cir., 1960), cert. denied 365 U.S. 830, 81 S.Ct. 717, 5 L.Ed.2d 708, the Court held that a pre-arraignment psychiatric examination by the State does "not work a denial of due process or amount to self-incrimination."

As to the applicability of the Sixth Amendment and the holding in Gideon v. Wainwright, 372 U.S. 335 that a defendant has the right to counsel during a "critical stage" of the proceedings, there is no case found where this criteria has been applied to mental examinations. Such is the statement in Steele, Criminal Law and

Procedure, 24 S.W.L.J. 229,236 (March, 1970). In fact, ruling case law is exactly to the contrary. Blankenship v. State, 432 SW2d 945 (1968), Earl v. Tinsley, supra, Caster v. United States, 319 F2d 850 (5th Cir., 1963).

In Caster, supra, appellant claimed his rights were adversely affected when the Court required a psychiatric examination, without a hearing and without counsel being provided. The Court said:

"...the most that can be said for such contention is that it is new and novel; and, that there seems to be no authority holding directly to the contrary... where the motion is made in good faith and there is a logical basis upon which to question the appellant's sanity, the trial court must order the examination as a matter of course. We will add only that the statute (18 U.S.C.A. Sec. 4244) is benevolent in concept, and the proceeding non-adversary in character, unless and until the psychiatric report reflects a mental condition which calls for a hearing and examination by the Court of the appellant's competence. Under the circumstances shown here the appellant's rights were not infringed in any manner." 319 F2d 850 at 852.

The issue of the defendant's sanity in the case at bar has been raised by defense counsel himself. Mr. Melder has stated on several occasions within the past week to the news media and in other public statements that sanity would be an issue in the case. Likewise, in open court on Monday, August 13, 1973, before the Honorable George Walker, 185th District Court for Harris County, Texas, Mr. Melder, having applied for Writ of Habeas Corpus, asked the Court for a mental examination by doctor's of either his or his client's own choice.

It is also the extreme atrocity and depravity with which the alleged homicidal acts have occurred that causes the State to request this examination.

What defense counsel apparently seeks is to keep the issue of insanity out of the case before this Court - at least at

this stage of the proceedings - while publicly stating that such will be an issue at the trial on the merits. This counsel may not do. He may, if he wishes, refuse to raise the issue of insanity, but he may not, in a proper case, prevent the Court from injecting it. Whalem v. United States, 346 F2d 812 at 818 (D.C. Cir. 1965), cert. denied 86 S.Ct. 124 (1969).

When the prosecution knows or can reasonably anticipate that the accused's mental state at the time of the crime will be a critical issue at the trial, there is an obligation to see to it that there is a pre-trial mental examination of the accused. Such an examination must be broad enough to cast light upon the issue. Blunt v. United States, 244 F2d 355 at 364, note 23 (D.C. Cir. 1957). Failure of the trial court to order a total and complete examination has been held to be reversible error. Winn v. United States, 270 F2d 326 (D.C. Cir. 1959).

Such an examination is required not only to protect the right's of the accused and to enable the prosecution to meet such a defense, it is also to protect society's great interest in hospitalizing the accused, if his violent act sprang from mental disorder, so that he would not be released - as he would after completion of a prison sentence - without medical assurance that he is not likely to be dangerous to himself or others. Williams v. United States, 250 F2d 19 at 26 (D.C. Cir. 1957).

The authority to permit the accused to be examined at the request of the State when he has or will raise the insanity defense, stems from the inherent power of the courts. United States v. Albright, 388 F2d 719 (4th Cir. 1968); Alexander v. United States, 380 F2d 33 (8th Cir. 1967); Pope v. United States, 372 F2d 710 at 719 (8th Cir. 1967). It also stems directly from the statutory language of Art. 46.02, Tex. Code of Criminal Procedure as amended 61st Legist., 1969. Article 46.02, Sec. 2(f)(1) provides as

"The Court may, at its discretion appoint disinterested qualified experts to examine the defendant with regard to his present competency to stand trial and as to his sanity, and to testify thereto at any trial or hearing in connection to the accusation against the accused; provided that the Court may not order the defendant to a State mental hospital for such examination without the consent of the head of that State mental hospital."

This statute is patterned after 18 U.S.C.A. 4244 and the federal cases cited as authority herein deal with the application of that statute.

In a criminal trial the issue of mental incompetency is presented in an adversary context. The adversary system cannot work successfully unless each party may fairly utilize the tool of expert knowledge to assist in the presentation of this issue to the jury. United States v. Schultz, 431 F2d 907 (1970).

In Alexander v. United States, supra, the Court said: "It would violate judicial common sense to permit a defendant to invoke the defense of insanity and foreclose the Government from the benefit of a mental examination to meet this issue." 380 F2d 33 at 39.

And in Pope v. United States, supra, Judge Blackman, writing for an en banc court, stated:

"It would be a strange situation, indeed, if, first, the government is to be compelled to afford the defense ample psychiatric service and evidence at government expense and, second, if the government is to have the burden of proof, as it does with the competency issue... and yet it is to be denied the opportunity to have its own corresponding and verifying examination, a step which perhaps is the most trustworthy means of attempting to meet that burden." 372 F2d 710 at 720.

In Pope the court held the issue of sanity had been raised and the prosecution was entitled to have the defendant examined by experts of its own choice.

Finally, we quote from the oft-cited case of State v.

Whitlow, 46 N.J. 3, 210 A2d 763, 775-776 (1965):

"An accused who asserts lack of criminal guilt because of insanity and who fully cooperates with psychiatrists engaged by him for examination purposes, answering all questions put to him including those relating to the crime itself, ought not to be allowed to frustrate a similar comprehensive examination by the State by asserting the bar against self-incrimination. He ought not to be able to advance the claim and then make the rules for determination of the claim."

Again, it is the State's position that counsel has raised this issue by his public statements, his numerous statements to the news media, and his statement in Court before the Honorable George Walker, in requesting appointment of physicians of the defendant's own choice for such an examination that have raised this issue. According to the authorities above cited and discussed, it cannot be the law that the defendant may prevent the Court, pursuant to its authority under Article 46.02, Section 2(f), from ordering an examination of the defendant under the circumstances in the case at bar by invoking the Fifth Amendment. We reiterate that it is not just the statements of opposing counsel that insanity would be an issue at the trial on the merits, it is also the magnitude, the complexity and the atrocity and depravity of the crimes with which this defendant is charged by indictment that, in the interest of the State, the defendant, and society a complete and total examination of the defendant's mental competency should be had. Certainly this is no admission by the State that the accused is insane under the law. While we have absolutely no reason to believe that such is the case, it is for the reasons and authorities discussed above that such examination is proper and well within the authority of our Code of Criminal Procedure. Article 46.02(2)(f).


WHEREFORE, THE STATE PRAYS that this Honorable Court Order the defendant, ELMER WAYNE HENLEY, JR., be made available to disinterested qualified experts to be selected by the Court, to examine the defendant as to his present competency to stand trial and to his sanity now and at the time of the offenses for which he is charged, that is July 10th and July 27th, and that this evidence be made available at the trial on the merits to both parties. It is respectfully requested that the Court consider for examination and evaluation the following qualified experts: (1). Benjamin Sher, M.D., Psychiatrist; (2). Dr. John D. Knotttingham, Jr., M.D., Psychiatrist; (3). Dr. Jerome B. Brown, Psychologist; (4). Dr. Alfred Vogt, M.D., Psychiatrist; and (5). The necessary personnel and technicians required to perform an electroencephalogram, and a taking of a complete social history. It is further requested that as to Dr. Vogt, that said doctor be permitted by the Court to choose an additional psychologist and social worker who are competent and qualified in their fields.

In the event this case should come to a trial on the merits after the passage and effective date of the new Penal Code, January 1, 1974, it is requested that the Court order the inquiry into the mental competency of the defendant to likewise be determined under the new criteria of the code, that is, whether, due to some mental defect or deficiency, the accused either did not know his conduct was wrong, or was unable to conform his conduct to the requirements of the law he allegedly violated. 1973 Penal Code, Section 8.01. Finally, it is requested that the Sheriff make the said ELMER WAYNE HENLEY, JR., available to said physicians, psychologists, and supporting medical personnel and technicians, and any other qualified and competent experts as the Court may

appoint, at a time convenient to said examining physicians and personnel, for the conduct of said examination.

RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO DISMISS APPEAL

COMES NOW, The Sheriff of Harris County, Texas, Respondent in the above styled and numbered cause in the Court of Criminal Appeals, and moves that the appeal in the above styled and numbered cause be dismissed. In support thereof, the Respondent would submit the following:

I.

This is an appeal from a hearing on a Writ of Habeas Corpus, cause number 230,080, in the 176th District Court of Harris County, Texas.

II.

Appellant was ordered remanded to the Sheriff of Harris County to be delivered to the demanding state of Washington (R. 36). Notice of appeal was given.

III.

Subsequently, the same judge heard another Writ of Habeas Corpus, cause number 228, 495, in the 176th District Court of Harris County, Texas. The relief was denied in that case and it is now pending as cause number 51,128 in the Court of Criminal Appeals of Texas.

IV.

In the record of the second case (S.F. 5-6), it is shown that the relator in the first case is also the relator in the second case.

V.

The papers in the latter cause, showing why Appellant was being held, included the same Executive Warrant which was introduced in the hearing on the first Writ of Habeas Corpus.

VI.

The Writ of Habeas Corpus, prior to conviction, is a unique remedy in Texas. See article 11.23, TEX. C. CRIM. P. ANN. (1966). There is no distinction between a Writ of Habeas Corpus used as a vehicle to contest the validity of an Executive Warrant and one at which the issue

of bail is considered. See Ex Parte Trelolar, No. 50,350 (Tex. Crim. App., September 17, 1975).


VII.

Therefore, the second hearing afforded Appellant a second opportunity to contest the identity of Appellant as the fugitive, the presence of Appellant in the demanding state on the date of the allegations in the papers supporting the Executive Warrant, and any other issues relevant to extradition which can be raised upon Writ of Habeas Corpus. That is the remedy Appellant seeks on appeal from the adverse judgment in the first case. Since Appellant has had a second hearing upon a Writ of Habeas Corpus, the appeal from the first is now moot.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, it is respectfully submitted that the appeal in cause number 50,650 should be dismissed because it is moot. In the alternative, that cause should be joined with cause number 51,128.



walked up to her from her left side and placed both of his hands around her neck and began to choke her. The actor said "Scream and I'll kill you. You'll not going to scream, are you?" The compl could not speak so she nodded her head indicating that she would not scream. At that time the actor released the compl and said "If you scream, I'll kill you." The actor then began unbuttoning the compl's blouse. The actor then pushed the compl to the floor and told her to take her clothes off. While the compl undressed the actor began to mumble, calling the compl a bitch. The actor told the compl to take her clothes off faster and while the compl was on the floor he fumbled with the compl's clothes trying to get the compl undressed.

The actor then asked the compl "Am I'm going to have to tie you up or Are you going to do what I say?" The compl nodded No. The compl was laying on her back on the floor and the actor straddled the compl sitting on the compl's stomach as if he was going to tie her hands (but did not tie her hands). While sitting on the compl's stomach the actor removed his coat and took a chrome revolver from the belt line. The actor then blindfolded and gagged the compl to what appeared to be a white handkerchief.

the apt closing the front door behind him.

The compl then got dressed and ran outside where she found Tommy B. Thomas, WM, 31, washing his car. Mr. Thomas is a county deputy and he lives in apt #2801. Mr. Thomas took the compl to his apt and called police. The compl told Mr. Thomas that the actor had been gone for about 10 minutes prior to her leaving her apt.

Miss Roberts then showed the actor how to get there by giving him directions, and he stated that he would go try to find it. A few minutes later the actor returned and stated he couldn't find it. So Miss Roberts drew him a map, and he stated, "Well, I'll come back later, cause I can't find it." She asked him where his car was parked, and at this point the actor became upset and said, "Why do you ask, I parked my car on the other side of the project and walked up here." The actor then started talking about that he worked for a tool company, and that he had just been relocated down here from Toledo, Ohio and that he was looking for a place to live down here. Miss Roberts told him that she could not leave at this time, but if he would return later, someone else might be able to show him the apt. and the actor said, "Well, I'll be back at 3:00 tomorrow". Miss Roberts noticed that the man appeared to be of a business ~~type~~ office type individual, and that he had short hair, as if it was a long crew cut combed back. She stated that she did not notice any accent, but that he did appear to have been drinking somewhat heavily.

Officer then went into the office, and talked to the compl. The compl.'s

condition was highly distraught and she was very emotional. It took officer several minutes to get her calmed down enough to get a description of the actor and put out on the air. After the compl. gave officer the description she told officer that approx. 5:40pm the actor came in and told her that he had been in earlier, and that he decided to lease the apt. and surprise his wife, but that he wanted to see it one more time. Miss Roberts came into the office about that time and gave the actor the key to the apt. and said, "Why don't you go see the apt., you know how to get there by now." The actor said, "no, I want one of you to show me the apt." The compl. left and walked with the actor to the apt. and while in route to the apt. the compl. recalled the actor saying that he was down here from Ohio working 12 hours a day, and that his wife called every night and bitches and ~~xxxx~~ raises hell. She also recalled that he mentioned that his wife and children were coming into town tomorrow, so she asked what the ages of his children were, because they have a 2 child maximum setup in the apts. The actor stated that I have a boy 19, "I guess you think I'm rather old." The compl. then stated that he mumbled something else and she just thought he was kind of funny and kept quiet.

When they entered the apt. which is listed as 3808 Lake, it is a townhouse apt., 2 story, and as they entered she left the door open, and the actor began looking around the apt. He then walked upstairs and began looking at the bedroom. The actor then asked compl. which one was the master bedroom, and she stated the large room is always the master bedroom. The actor then said, "Come up here and show me which one it is, they're both about the same size." The compl. did so, and after showing him the master bedroom, she turned, walked past the actor, heading for the stairway, when the actor grabbed her, turned her around, put his hands at her throat and started choking her. She stated that he started yelling, "I'm going to kill you, you bitch, but before I kill you, you know what I'm going to do to you." The compl. stated then that she became faint and that she started begging and pleading with him not to hurt her and he just kept saying, "I'm going to fuck you, you bitch" over and over. He then started yelling at her, "Don't you scream or make a sound, or I'll kill you." The compl. then stated her legs became limp and she started sinking towards the floor, and at this point, he dropped his right hand and produced a chrome pistol, and at first held it up under her chin, and then at the side of her head telling her that he was going to kill her if she screamed or said a word, but that he was going to fuck her first. Then the compl. stated that she started begging him to wait and talk this thing over, and he said, "Talk, what ~~you~~ do you mean talk? The others never wanted to talk!" At this point the compl. told him that there would be no need in killing her as she was dying anyway. She told him she had M.S. and just had a short time to live. The actor said to this remark, "So I'm about to fuck a sick girl? I'm actually about to fuck a dying girl." At this point the actor backed away from her a little bit and took his gun away from her head, and started calling her assorted names of four letter characteristics. same time she started falling down the stairway. The compl. fell down the stairway, got up and ran for the door. The actor grabbed her, jerking her back into the apt. and the whole time the actor was yelling, "Don't you scream, I'll kill you." She relaxed a little bit, let him pull her in and then jerked away again and ran outside the door and started screaming as loud as she could possibly scream. The compl. stated that a woman in an upstairs bedroom across from the apt. started looking out the window, and the actor then stayed inside the apt. for a second or two, and then started running out of the apt., dropping the chrome plated revolver in the apt. He then ran east through the fence and the gate to the second fence where the compl. observed him climbing over it. The compl. had one of the employees of the apt. stand by the open apt. until the police arrived and recovered the pistol, then she went back to the apt. office and called the police.

The compl. had several abrasions on her knuckles of her left hand and could barely walk from the injuries that she sustained from falling down the stairs. The compl. stated that she could definitely identify this man, and that she was going to go see her doctor to be checked for injuries and to get something to calm her down.

Miss Roberts of 9545 Elda Lee Lane also stated that she could identify this man again, and she is a permanent employee in the office of the management.

Officer W. J. Wissel #2408, received a call to 3808 Lake in regard to a man running from a door and leaving a pistol behind. Upon arrival officer was met by Roosevelt Royal who is a permanent employee at 3616 Lake. Mr. Royal took officer in the apt. and pointed out of him the above tagged pistol which was laying on the 2 floor just inside the door at the foot of the stairs. This pistol was taken by Officer Wissel to the I.D. Division where it was tagged to have the latent prints lifted from it. R. M. Jordan was left with R.M. Jordan who works in I.D.

Officer spoke with Rena Jackson who lives at 3778 Lake, and she stated that she observed the below described actor walking very quickly from 3808 Lake and going through a gate in the fence on the east end of the building. She stated that she could not see the actor's face, but noted that he was well dressed and very large. Jackson's phone # is 526-0486.

Officer Wissel went on the other side of the fence and questioned several people in the area to determine if anyone saw this man jump the fence and leave in a vehicle, but was unable to find anyone who had been a witness to the man leaving the scene.



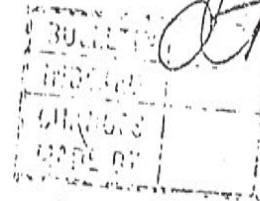

I, Det. Trimble, received a phone call from Sgt. Schuelle of the Austin, Texas police dept. who stated that an informant had called him this date and stated that a Gary Taylor was supposed to be enroute from a machine shop somewhere in Houston to his place of residence at 1120 Robbie. Sgt. Schuelle further stated that Taylor was suppose to be driving a four door bronze Chrysler, Michigan license #13 563. At the time Schuelle called he did not know whether or not Taylor was actually wanted by this dept.

The S.W.A.T. team was notified for their assistance in making a run on the above address.

Taylor Not Mentally Ill, Says Robey, Only Dangerous When He Drinks

The man who released the so-called "phantom sniper of Royal Oak" from a mental institution said Thursday Gary Addison Taylor is not mentally ill but is considered potentially dangerous only when he drinks.

Dr. Ames Robey, M.D., director of the forensic center in Ypsilanti, said:

"The root of his problem has always been drinking, not mental illness. Every single event had always been allegedly committed when he was intoxicated."

Court Ruling—

Robey said the State Supreme Court last September, ruled "dangerousness is not enough for patients found not guilty for reason of insanity, the person has to be dangerous by reason of mental illness."

Taylor was classified as having an antisocial personality disorder, Robey said.

Taylor is sought by the King County Police in Seattle, Wash., for questioning in connection with the disappearance of a 12-year-old

South Seattle housewife the day before Thanksgiving.

Taylor had been confined to various mental institutions since 1937 when he was committed to Ionia State Hospital by then Circuit Court Judge Frank L. Doty. The order came after he was specifically charged with the shooting of a 19-year-old Bloomfield Hills Woman.

Loophole Could Free Man Who Killed Three

DETROIT (AP) — James Johnson Jr., an auto worker found innocent by reason of insanity after being tried for killing three co-workers, could be released from a state hospital soon.

Johnson was sent to a state facility after his acquittal, and his release will come, according to a Wayne County official, because he cannot be legally defined as mentally ill.

Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Terrance Boyle said two psychiatrists have determined Johnson does not meet state guidelines defining the mentally ill.

"They are not saying he

Taylor was the primary suspect in the sniper shootings during the winter of 1936-37 when nine women and girls were fired on.

Acquitted—

In February 1966, Taylor was certified sane to stand trial, but was acquitted by Circuit Court Judge Arthur E. Moore of Oakland County who

isn't dangerous. The two certificates say he is dangerous. He may be likely to murder someone else. But he isn't mentally ill within the definitions," Boyle said.

Testimony at Johnson's 1970 trial claimed he was driven to commit the murders because of working conditions at the Chrysler Corp. plant.

Judge Robert J. Colombo, who presided at Johnson's trial, recommended that Johnson never be allowed to re-enter society.

Johnson has been allowed to visit his family for brief periods since being hospitalized by the state.

ruled he was insane when he committed the snipings.

He was returned to Ionia State Hospital and later transferred to the forensic center in Ypsilanti.

In July 1972, he was released from the forensic center by Dr. Robey on "convalescent leave status," which meant he was allowed to leave the facility if he checked in periodically with doctors.

Taylor had twice petitioned for his release, but both times his motion had been denied by different circuit judges following lengthy hearings.

"We had no objection to his appeals," Robey said, "and on his writs of habeas corpus we testified that he is not mentally ill, but that he is potentially dangerous."

Medication—

Of Taylor's second appeal in 1971 before Circuit Court Judge Ross Campbell of Washtenaw County, Robey said, "The staff down here feel he was dangerous if, and only if, he went off medication."

"The testimony at the hearing was that he was not mentally ill. The question was raised, was he potentially dangerous and the answer to this was 'No.' He is not potentially dangerous unless he drinks."

Robey said Taylor was returned to the institution despite his testimony, and that of other doctors, because:

"Basically in 1972, the court was saying they didn't want to handle it. The law did not say, at least in not guilty by reason of insanity cases, that he could not be committed."

Can't Hold Him—

"Now the law says a man can be dangerous, but if he is not mentally ill, we cannot hold him."

Robey explained why Taylor was placed on "leave" status despite the court's denial.

"It was our feeling, and he was reviewed by several clinicians, that we had no basis for continuing to hold him."

"With controls and the use of antabuse, we felt there was no reason that he could or would drink and, of course, not being mentally ill, we felt we had to release him."

Robey said he also foresaw the outcome of a Detroit Federal District Court decision in June 1973 which invalidated Michigan's commitment laws.

Aware of Decision—

"We were aware a year before about the decision — which way it was going. It was my clinical judgment that I was in a much better position to return Mr. Taylor to the community, carefully, slowly, with controls and treatment,

rather than to wait for that ruling and discharge him suddenly without treatment or follow-up."

Robey last saw Taylor during a scheduled appointment in September 1973.

"Our visits had tapered off to about once every two months," Robey said. "The last time I saw him he was on antabuse, working hard and had a good income. I had heard he was planning to buy a house and move to Onaway."

Because of scheduling conflicts Taylor was not due to visit doctors until March 1974. He failed to appear. Robey said:

"I wrote him a letter, but it was returned for having the wrong address."

Lost in Shuffle—

"Without any particular concern, I tried to find the right address. But, quite frankly, he got lost in the shuffle of an ever-increasing workload."

Taylor was not listed as being on an "unauthorized leave of absence" with the State Health Department until Nov. 6, 1974.

Robey blamed the delay on the Supreme Court decision which meant 105 patients being treated at the Forensic Center should be examined within 60 days. All except five were found and examined.

Those the center was unable to locate, Taylor among them, were listed with the department "because if we didn't notify the department of them at least being unofficially gone, we would be forced to discharge them."

Questions Legality—

Monday, Taylor was placed on the police Law En-

forcement Information Network (LIEN) as an escapee from a mental institution.

While his office filed the papers with the state police which listed Taylor as escaped, Robey said he questions the legality of it because he is not charged with a crime, nor is he, in any way, considered a criminal.

"If he had escaped from the hospital, we would have notified the police immediately," he said. "But ordinarily we don't notify them if a man is on convalescent leave and fails to appear for appointments."

Robey said Taylor was listed pending an opinion from the state attorney general's office on whether persons such as Taylor may be legally placed on the list.

Exercise in Futility—

According to the new mental health law, Robey said, the only way a person may legally be returned if he leaves the state is if he is mentally ill and dangerous or potentially dangerous.

"I suspect to a degree this is an exercise in futility because if he were to be returned to our custody, if he were to be extradited to this state, and we examined him and tried to go to court, the court would have to discharge him."

Psychiatrist Calls New Mental

A prominent Detroit psychiatrist who has testified on behalf of many persons accused of being mentally ill Thursday blasted the state's controversial mental health code, calling it "ridiculous" and "totally unrelated to practical realities."

Dr. Emanuel Tanay M.D., considered a leading authority on criminal insanity, said, "dangerous people are being

released on technicalities."

Tenay, who has appeared as an expert witness in many criminal cases involving insanity defense, made his remarks during testimony on whether a 19-year-old former Farmington Hills man should remain hospitalized.

The case involves Charles Frederick Portus, who was acquitted of murder charges because of insanity in the strangulation death of a

seven-year-old neighbor who also was sexually molested.

The commitment hearing was delayed by Probate Court Judge Donald E. Adams of Oakland County pending resolution of a legal question challenging the prosecuting attorney's jurisdiction in mental health cases.

The mental health code, which partially went into effect last Nov. 6, gives every Michigan mental patient the

right to a court-appointed attorney, and a trial by jury on whether the patient should remain committed. The patient has the right to demand such a hearing every six months.

In Portus' case, Tanay was the psychiatrist who convinced Circuit Court Judge Farrell E. Roberts of Oakland County that Portus was legally insane at the time of the alleged murder. Judge

Robey Says 18 of 20 Released, Shouldn't

LANSING (AP) — Twenty patients, nine of whom were tried for murder, have been released from the state Forensic Center at Ypsilanti under provisions of a controversial new state law.

The nine were found innocent by reason of insanity. The rest were tried for lesser crimes, mainly theft.

Two Would—

"Two of the 20 probably would have been released under the old code, but not the others," said Dr. Ames Robey, director of the Forensic Center where the criminally insane are diagnosed and treated.

The new law, aimed at protecting civil rights, has been in effect since November. A portion of it won't go into effect until next August, but state Mental Health Department officials already are considering changes.

Unlike the old code, the new one requires that to be committed, a mentally ill person

needs such as food, clothing or shelter."

Some Will Fall—

Of the 20 who were released, Robey said, "Some were mentally ill but not dangerous. Some were dangerous but not mentally ill. A few were not mentally ill or dangerous to others, but it's likely that a few of them will commit a crime again."

Of about 130 persons released from the Forensic Center over the past seven years, only three were caught committing other crimes. Of the 20 released between Oct. 30 and Jan. 30, one is already accused in the stabbing deaths of an elderly couple in another state. The man, George E. Lee, is awaiting extradition from Santa Barbara, Calif.

Prior to a state Supreme Court decision in September, a person was automatically committed to a mental institution if found innocent by reason of insanity. The 20 were committed prior to that ruling.

undergo hearings to determine if they are mentally ill and meet the new code's requirements.

Court hearings are to be held for those committed before the decision if there is a chance they will be affected by the new code.

Robey and other mental health specialists say a new category should be added to the code which would allow a mentally ill individual to be found guilty. The person could then be treated and when he recovered could apply for parole or serve the rest of his sentence.

Hope Wrong—

"I hope our predictions are wrong, but I think we are going to see a lot of these people again committing other crimes," said Robey.

"I feel we have a responsibility to protect society. At the same time, if a person is dangerous but not due to mental illness, then there is no alternative but to release him."

"The court has no choice. The prosecutor has no choice."

and prosecutors say the new law also makes authorities powerless to provide treatment for many persons who have committed no crime but who need psychiatric care and have refused it.

"Many people need treatment who are not getting it," said Dr. Richard Budd, superintendent of Northville State Hospital. "I get two or three calls a week from people who are wondering how to get treatment for somebody."

Can Do Little—

"If he refuses treatment and doesn't meet the new requirements, there isn't much we can do."

Ingham County Assistant Prosecutor John Boyd said the person who stands on a street corner and exposes himself may be mentally ill, but is not dangerous by court standards. Boyd said a young man who slept with a loaded gun next to his bed and exhibited other strange behavior was committed only after he beat up a

Mental Health Code 'Ridiculous'

Robert Adams acquitted Portus after Tanay played a tape of a conversation with Portus, in which the defendant told Tanay the circumstances of the killing.

Thursday, Tanay testified that Portus' condition hadn't changed, and that he should be hospitalized for an indefinite period. He said Portus suffered from a disease that couldn't be cured with today's technology.

Shouldn't Be

relative. His family, however, previously had attempted to have him committed.

Need Treatment—

Probate judges such as Robert Drake of Ingham County say the new standards "exclude a lot of people. They don't meet these requirements, but they need treatment."

"The problems are people who have a cyclic type of illness. They can devastate their families, but don't meet the new definition," said Dr. Philip Smith, superintendent of Traverse City State Hospital.

"We will have a clear idea of what the problems are in another month or two," said Dr. Donald C. Smith, acting director of the state Mental Health Department. "We don't have enough data yet to evaluate the new code. Our purpose is to monitor it."

He said it would be "surprising" if the code did not need modification.

When Judge Adams asked him to re-examine Portus and testify at another hearing in six months, Tanay called the state code "ridiculous."

Adams replied, "I'm inclined to agree. I'm trying to live within the statute, too."

Tanay said, "Mr. Portus requires continued care in a hospital for his own benefit. I don't think he should have to kill someone else for the right to hospital care. He shouldn't be placed in a situation where he can't cope."

Outside the courtroom, Tanay told reporters, "this statute is the creation of scholastic thinking. It is totally unrelated to practical realities."

"It was concocted by lawyers for lawyers — not for the benefit of the patient. In short, mental illness has been criminalized."

"Instead of committing someone because he is mentally ill, now the patient

must have committed an act. It's a Catch-22 situation."

"In order to be declared mentally ill, you must commit an injurious act. Doing that usually sends you to jail."

"I know of a case where a man spent 105 days in jail, then the Probate Judge refused to commit him because the statute required 'a recent act.'"

"I don't see why the old statute had to be changed."

Stephen R. Bernstein, Portus' attorney, claimed that the petition for commitment was defective because the prosecutor had no standing in the case.

Although the new code calls for the prosecutor to handle all mental health cases, a 1941 law says that the prosecutor can't handle county civil cases if the county hires a civil counsel — which Oakland does — unless the county Board of Commissioners tells the prosecutor to.


Assistant Prosecutor Ronald Covault, in an effort to avoid that issue, declared that he was filing his petition as a private citizen.

But Bernstein now says Covault's action is improper because he's using prosecutor's files, and conducting the hearings on county time. Judge Adams will rule on that issue next Tuesday.

Meanwhile, the prosecutor's office has asked the Board of Commissioners to designate the prosecutor to handle mental health cases involving the criminally insane (those found innocent because of insanity).

Richard Thompson, chief assistant prosecutor, said the Board's Public Services Committee last Monday approved such a resolution. It will be considered by the full Board next Thursday.

Portus remains hospitalized pending final disposition of the case.
