1.1 The above-named defendant was found guilty on July 29, 2002, by jury verdict of the following crime:

MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE, RCW 9.48.030(3). Offense date on or about November 25, 1973.

1.2 A sentencing hearing in this case was held on JULY 30, 2002. Present were the above-named defendant, John Sinclair, Attorney for Defendant, and Philip Harju, Supervising Deputy Prosecuting Attorney for Thurston County.







1. I am a Deputy Sheriff for Thurston County, Washington. I've received my initial training in law enforcement with the Los Angeles City Police Department when hired as a police officer in 1970. I received training in all phases of law enforcement while with that agency, including training in homicide investigation. While with that agency, I assisted and investigated numerous homicides. I have been a detective with the Thurston County Sheriff's Office for six years and have investigated and assisted in the prosecution of several homicides while with that agency. I am familiar with the police reports and investigation conducted in this case. Based upon information provided through that investigation there is probable cause to believe that the defendant committed the crime of Murder 1st Degree as supported by the following facts and circumstances:


On December 6, 1973 a young female body was found in the brush at Margaret McKenny Campground in Capitol Forrest located in Thurston County by park caretakers. The Thurston County Sheriff's Office was notified and conducted an investigation. The deceased female was the apparent victim of homicidal violence and no identification was found near or with her body at the time of investigation. It appeared that her throat had been cut and she was laying face down when discovered. Her pants were cut at the rear waist with the cut running down to her crotch area. The clothing material had been laid back exposing her bare buttocks. The resulting death certificate issued by the Thurston County Coroner found the cause of death due to a knife wound to the neck and or strangulation. It was determined that the body was that of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] date of birth [REDACTED] a [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. She was positively identified by dental records and family. Further investigation revealed that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was last seen alive in Seattle on November 25th, 1973, hitchhiking to Rockaway Oregon after running away from her home in Seattle. She was seen by witnesses getting into a pickup truck driven by a male on Aurora Avenue which left southbound. Investigation determined her time of death between November 25th, 1973 and December 3rd, 1973. Evidence was collected from her body at the time of the autopsy and booked

1 into the evidence section of the Thurston County Sheriff's Office at that time. A person of interest was developed
2 by detectives from information received from citizen tips during the earlier stages of the investigation. That
3 person was William E. Cosden Jr of the Scott Lake Community located in Thurston County. Mr. Cosden was
4 employed by his father who owned and operated the Restover Truck Stop located on 93rd Ave SW and the
5 southbound side of I-5 south of Tumwater. This was a focal point for hitchhikers in the 1970's. It was learned that
6 William Cosden Jr. had raped and murdered a young female in the Maryland area in 1967 and he had been
7 convicted of a first degree rape in 1976 in Thurston County Washington which he is currently serving a sentence
8 in prison. A witness had seen what was reported to be blood stains on a shirt William E. Cosden Jr. was wearing
9 the early morning hours of November 26th, 1973 after he pulled into the Restover Truck Stop and filled his pickup
10 truck fuel tanks with 40 gallons of fuel. Earlier that same night, at approximately 2300 hours, November 25th,
11 1973 another witness had observed what was described as blood stains inside the pickup bed of that same truck
12 which had a canopy on it. At approximately 0220 hrs. right after leaving the Restover Truck Stop William E.
13 Cosden Jr's pickup truck caught on fire and was destroyed in that fire, approximately three miles from the
14 Restover Truck Stop. Detectives from the Sheriff's Office interviewed William E. Cosden Jr. in 1986 where he
15 denied ever seeing, having sex with or killing [REDACTED] 101C Blood samples were taken from William
16 E. Cosden Jr. per court order during those interviews. In 2001 those blood samples along with evidence taken
17 from [REDACTED] 101C body were sent to the State Lab for DNA testing and a match was found showing
18 William E. Cosden Jr's DNA on an evidence sample taken from the victim's vagina during the autopsy.
19 Detectives from the Thurston County Sheriff's Office re-interviewed William E. Cosden Jr. in January of 2002. In
20 the initial interview William E. Cosden Jr. was shown pictures of [REDACTED] 101C and asked if he had
21 ever seen her, been with her, had sex with her or killed her. He denied every seeing her, being with her, having
22 sex with her or killing her. Later in this interview he was advised of the DNA match and still denied any contact
23 with [REDACTED] 101C. A few days later William E. Cosden Jr. was re-contacted and interviewed again.
24 During the second interview he admitted to having contact with [REDACTED] 101C admitted to having
25 vaginal and anal sex with her but denied killing her. Based on this information it is requested the Thurston County
26 Prosecuting Attorney consider charges against William E. Cosden Jr. for Murder 1st Degree.

Dave Perschon (Hazel present)

1. Looked at the case file anonymous note. Believes it the handwriting of either Carl Clark or the "Bill" guy on night shift. Denies it is Dave.
2. Bill Cosden, Sr. had a cheap Saturday Night Special handgun, short barrel. Margaret Cosden later had it, gave it to Tim, who has it now.
3. Bill, Jr. said he barely got out of the truck fire but escaped.
4. Dave only tells the truth.
5. Never saw the news, didn't read the paper then. Learned of the murder from talk at the truck stop. Never saw the truck (after the incident at the truck stop)
6. Used a flashlight, with help from the outside truck stop lights, to see into Bill Jr.'s pickup (bed & dash). Poor lighting.
7. Bill Jr., "used to frequent Deep lake a lot" (Millersylvania State Park). Because of it, Dave assumed we were investigating the death of the girl found there.
8. Attorney Sinclair:
 - A) Showed Dave a Xerox photo of the waffle-stomper
 - B) Tried to make Dave think he saw a different shoe type, i.e. oxford?
 - C) Tried to get Dave to say he didn't like Bill Jr., or Tim (not true). Implied Dave was untruthful.
 - D) Tried to confuse Dave with a photo of a "Littlerock" area.
 - E) Squawked on Dave seeing the knife (hunting type in a sheath) on the driver's side dash. Just noticed it, walking by. Didn't mean anything then.

1. That Bill is right-handed.
2. That Tim helped load the International truck gas tank, with Dave Perschon helping, for Dave out, green and burned. It had been stored upstairs at the 93rd Street truck stop.
3. That he helped Perschon look for his tire rims at the truck stop.
4. That he does not recall looking into Bill's truck, the night before the truck fire, and see blood.
5. That he would run hitchhikers out.
6. That Bill said he lost all his camera gear in the fire and hurt his left arm when he bailed out. Bill described how he noticed the truck on fire. It had a canopy, level with the cab top, had windows and curtains.
7. Never talked to Bill about the '73 murder, nor '74.
8. Really a big bowie knife, didn't carry it around. But Bill did carry a knife.
9. Never hunted with Bill, nor ever showed Tim any deer.
10. It was Tom Wagner that knocked on the door to interrupt Bill trying to rape Margaret Cosden at 818 Olympia Avenue, Olympia.
11. The family business insurance man was Don Newbold, Olympia Insurance Brokers.
12. Wife Margaret did call in one tip on Bill.

Items Examined:

- 5 Three short lengths of natural fiber rope (each 2-2½ inches) contained in packaging marked "...From under body near neck..."
- 31 Short length of rope (6½ inches) contained in packaging marked "Near left hand area..."
- 13 One brown suede leather-type jacket with fur lined cuffs and collar.

Other items submitted were not examined at this time.

Examination Procedures and Results:

Each rope item was swabbed for possible epithelial cells (cells which form the deeper layers of the skin, and line the body cavities). The swabs were tested using phenolphthalin (a chemical used to indicate the possible presence of blood) and no indications of blood were obtained from either rope. The swabs from each rope item were extracted for DNA content.

The jacket (item 13) was examined for possible blood stains. Three small red/brown specks were found on the left pocket. Each of these gave positive indications for blood using phenolphthalin. All three stains were removed and combined in a DNA extraction. An area above the left pocket zipper was swabbed and found to give a positive reaction to phenolphthalin. This swab was also extracted for DNA content. Another swabbing was made on an area below the stains on the left pocket. When tested, this swab gave no indication of blood being present. The swab was extracted for DNA content to be used as a substrate sample.

The DNA extracts from the two rope items and the three jacket pocket samples were quantified for human DNA content. No human DNA was detected for the rope #31 or the jacket pocket samples. The extracts from both rope items and the stains on the jacket pocket were amplified by the PCR (polymerase chain reaction) process using an Applied Biosystems AmpFISTR® Profiler Plus™ amplification kit. The resulting amplified STR (short tandem repeat) DNA products were analyzed using an ABI Prism™ 310 capillary electrophoresis unit.

Conclusions:

No DNA profile was obtained from the extract of rope #31 or the jacket #13.

The extracts from the two jacket pocket swabs were not analyzed further because no profile was obtained from the stains on the jacket pocket.

A low level partial profile was obtained from rope #5 which indicates male DNA is present. There is no information in this profile which would include Cosden or 101C as sources of this DNA.

Remarks:

DNA profiles for Cosden and 101C used for comparison had been established during previous testing under requests 0003 and 0004.

Disposition of Evidence:

The stains on the jacket pocket were consumed during this testing. The DNA extracts from the jacket and both rope items will be stored frozen at the WSP Tacoma Crime Laboratory. The remaining evidence will be returned to the Thurston County Sheriff's Office.


Glossary:

Capillary Electrophoresis: A method of separating DNA fragments by size.

DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid): Genetic material found in every nucleated cell.

PCR (polymerase chain reaction): A process used to make many copies of short target segments of DNA which can subsequently be typed. This process is commonly referred to as "DNA amplification".

STR (short tandem repeat): Short segments of DNA, of a particular sequence, which is repeated a variable number of times. STR's are differentiated and categorized based on size.







NARRATIVE:

Dive team was requested by Captain Curtis and Detective Haller to search two man-made ponds, in the general area of 93rd Avenue SE and I-5. Dive Team was asked to search for a knife, which may have been involved in a 1973 homicide in December.


The first pond was located on the southern most property line of the 93rd Avenue Truck Stop at I-5 and 93rd. Detective Haller obtained permission to be on the property from owner, who was located in Snohomish County. The pond was a man-made sand/gravel pit, which was created in the mid 1950's. The section of the pond which was to be searched was the northern shore area, where located is a trail and a beach area for swimming. The search pattern began on the north shore. The pattern started at a large tree at the west end of the beach area. A PVC pipe grid system was laid down, which allowed divers to search 18 inch squares at a time. The pattern extended out from shore 68 feet from the actual water line. 68 feet was used, due to the fact that the water line in December would have been much higher, giving it an additional 20 feet in length at that time of year. Seven patterns of seven foot wide grid systems were done, which would give a pattern of 49 feet wide.

First divers down were Sgt. Dunn and Detective Carlson. Dive was continued until about noon, when Deputy Elwin and Deputy Claridge continued to finish the pattern. Divers did the pattern in zero visibility and discovered the bottom was basically flat, featureless and with a silty bottom. Only trash was located on the bottom in the area where the pattern was done. No knife was located. Maximum depth at the time would be about 7 to 8 feet.

On 7-24-02, divers were shifted to another pond located north of 93rd Avenue, situated right along I-5, approximately half a mile north of 93rd. Permission was gained to get on the property by Detective Haller. Information from Williams pipeline was gained to cross their property to gain access to the pond area. Divers Derillio and Ziesemer conducted the same type of pattern as done in the previous pond with PVC pipe grid system. The bottom conditions of this pond were somewhat different from the first pond. There was a heavy layer of silt, cat tails, lilly pads and very thick milfoil or seagrass in the area. A pattern of 70 feet out and 28 feet wide was done in that area, without locating a knife.

Location of the search pattern was at the end of a trail on the south side of the pond only. We could find no other area showed to have access to the water line on that pond. It is unknown what those ponds looked like 30 years ago when the homicide occurred. Search patterns were only done where the access to the water is available today. A Small percentage of the pond was actually searched in this pattern and would take an extensive period of time to conduct searches to any larger pattern in these ponds.



#11) On 07/20/02, at 2053 hours I contacted Officer Hovda inside the Thurston county jail, regarding an assault
complaint. Officer Hovda advised me that inmate William Cosden wanted to report that inmate Kelly Newcomb and
Joseph Teal assaulted him, (see officer Hovda's supplement report).

I next spoke with victim Cosden about the incident. Cosden told me that at approximately 1830 hours he was getting
out of the shower and observed suspect Newcomb coming out of his cell. Cosden stated that after he got dressed
told both Newcomb and Teal to come inside his cell. Cosden advised me that he has had problems with both inmates
for several weeks harassing him and making threats do to his current charges. Cosden is currently in custody for
Rape 1st degree. Cosden stated that he armed himself with a sock containing two bars of soap. Cosden told me that
he wanted to work things out between himself and the other inmates. Cosden said that both Newcomb and Teal

started yelling and "rushed" him. Teal then retrieved a chair and used it to force Cosden to the ground. Cosden stated that Both Newcomb and Teal then started punching and kicking him in the face and head. I asked Cosden how long did this go on for? He said approximately forty-five seconds. Both inmates then left but came back several minutes later and took some of his "commissary" items and threatened to continue to beat him up if he didn't pay them daily. I observed abrasions on Cosden's nose and forehead. Cosden also had swelling and bumps along the front and back of his head. Cosden then provided me with a taped statement on what he just told me.

I next spoke with suspect Newcomb. I explained to Newcomb why I was here at which time I read him the Miranda warning from my department issued card. Newcomb acknowledged he understood and was willing to talk to me. I asked Newcomb what happened when inmate Cosden invited him and Teal into his cell? Newcomb told me that Cosden asked him to come inside his cell at which time Cosden started hitting him in the chest with a sock containing bars of soap. Newcomb said he then defended himself by punching Cosden in the face several times. I asked Newcomb if Teal was inside the room and if he forced Cosden down to the ground with a chair? Newcomb stated that Teal never had a chair and believes he was never involved since he was behind him the entire time. I inquired if Teal or himself have been threatening Cosden due to his current charges. Newcomb stated "no". I observed no injuries to Newcomb's person. Newcomb declined to give me a taped statement.

I then spoke with suspect Teal. I explained to Teal why I was here at which time I read him the Miranda warning from my department issued card. Teal acknowledged he understood and was willing to talk to me. I asked Teal what happened in Cosden's cell this evening? Teal stated he observed Cosden call Newcomb into his cell. Teal told me that he was outside playing cards but could plainly see inside Cosden's cell when this incident took place. Teal stated that when Newcomb entered Cosden's cell he observed Cosden start hitting him in the chest area with a sock containing what he thought were bars of soap. Teal said Newcomb then fought back by punching Cosden in the facial area several times. Teal said that Newcomb then left the cell and never returned. I asked Teal if he ever went inside Cosden's cell? He stated "no" that he was playing cards the entire time. I inquired from Teal if he assaulted Cosden inside the cell? Teal denied ever being inside the cell or assaulting Cosden. I observed no injuries on Teal's person.

After talking with both suspects I had pictures taken of Cosden's injuries using the jail's booking photo machine. I explained to Cosden that I would be referring this case to the prosecutor's office for consideration of assault charges on both Teal and Newcomb.

To the P/A's misdemeanor division for consideration of Assault 4th degree charges on both Newcomb and Teal.




