Gentlemen:

This is regarding the evaluation and consultation that we had on April 19, 1974. Our meeting was an attempt to develop a profile of the assailant of seven female homicide victims. The victims are listed as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], Kamahale, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

After reviewing the taped portion of our consultation on the above named victims and the review of the possible suspects in your files, I felt that it would be important to put down my thoughts and summarize the six hours of concentrated discussion between Captain Hess, Sergeant Carlstedt and myself.

We reviewed in great detail the scenes and circumstances of each victim. All victims were apparently picked up by the assailant on Highway 101, probably at Steel Lane off ramp. The victims were found rolled down the side of the highway near a creek. Three of them were found in one spot. Two victims were found within a triangle distance of less than two miles. The third victim was found in a different area. All victims were within the boundaries of easy driving distance to the Santa Rosa area and all were east of Highway 101. The bodies that were found in a relatively good state were nude. The only exceptions were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. There was no evidence of clothing in or around the scene of the crime. There was one characteristic finding. One piece of jewelry was left with the victim and the other piece was taken. I will not mention what type of jewelry it was, in order to maintain the secrecy of this one point. The clothing and personal belongings of all the victims were never found. It is assumed that both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were also nude when their bodies were deposited in the area.

The backgrounds of all the victims, with the exception of one,

showed home situations that were bad - either split or otherwise. They were all identified with "the drug or hippie element" and sexually promiscuous, with the exception of one individual. This individual was dressed in a hippie costume and could not be distinguished by her appearance as not being a part of this particular "scene". At least two of the victims were known to have had sexual intercourse within a reasonable period of time prior to their death. It has been assumed by your staff, I think correctly so, that this all appears like a single assailant who possesses a certain psychological profile that I will attempt to define at this time.

In looking over the total picture, several things strike me. The assailant would have to be somebody who has at least a high school education, not necessarily graduating, but at least have reached that level of education. Because of his ability to talk and approach these girls, whose educational backgrounds ranged through junior high school to college, he would have a relatively straight appearance and be of a peer age range with them. This would make it easier for him to approach them and be accepted on an equal basis. It would seem to me that he spent some time in and around the skating rink near the Santa Rosa Steel Lane off ramp and Highway 101 as part of his own basic needs to observe and possibly spot his victims. He also, by virtue of the nudity of the victims, seems to have a need for some type of fetish in relationship to their clothing and jewelry. The symbolic signs that were left behind would make one feel that he is challenging you to capture him and would know him by the one identifying piece of jewelry.

It would seem that the suspect would also know the east side of the Santa Rosa countryside extremely well because, in going over the area, and visiting the scenes with Sergeant Carlstedt, it became apparent to me that these were areas that would not be easily known unless the individual had travelled there before. He was probably clever enough to approach the area first by driving past it and then turning around. He most likely had his victims in the driver's seat or on the trunk side so that they could be easily rolled over the side of the road. I don't think he intended his victims to roll into the creek but somewhere near it. They would eventually be found in order for the game of "cat and mouse" to continue. Therefore, I think he would have to be intellectually quite cunning and have to plot his actions in order to carry out the intended results. I also feel that he probably selects his victims by picking up girls and questioning them and talking to them before he decides to act. The girls would all have to have the same kind of background attitudes that these girls had. I feel that his general attitude towards women is one of hatred,

hostility and contempt. Therefore, he acts in a manner which causes their deaths. He tends to do this by very subtle methods, or with the use of strychnine as in one case, by which he could observe the slow death of his victim for the necessary gratification.

The suspect would have to fall into the rapist category. I have divided the rapists into five classifications: the show-off; the verbal abuser; the physical verbal abuser; and the last group, the necrophiliacs, who commit murder as part of their sexual gratification. They either have sexual intercourse just prior to the murder or possibly a single ejaculation, or else they have an ejaculation after the murder either by penetration or otherwise. I also feel that this person has had a rather long-standing problem in the areas mentioned above. I would think in terms of someone who has been admitted to state hospitals or local mental facilities. One who has had a history of animal torture or animal killings by strangulation or poisoning would also be suspected. As time has gone on, he has transferred this hostility towards humans.

The suspect probably comes from a background in which there has been family dissension with a dominant mother and a passive father with feelings of hatred and total revenge towards the mother. This gets displaced upon his victims in terms of degradation. The manner in which he "has dumped these girls" would tend to confirm his marked low opinion of women, regarding them as "garbage" to be dumped along the side of the road and not even receive a "decent burial". Because of his adulation of other areas I feel that he is also involved with fetishes. This would involve women's clothing and jewelry. He would tend to bury the clothing in mounds for purposes of worship or he would keep one piece of jewelry as a means of displaying "the notches on his gun" as an accomplishment in getting rid of these bad women.

This person would look upon himself as a savior of mankind and therefore fall into the paranoid classification with a tremendous need for paranoid delusions. He would probably live with a family in which he would "idolize" the man and look up to him. Yet he would not be a part of the family or live with them. He probably lives within a building outside of the house. He would probably be good at the usual mechanical things of a handy man in and around large ranches or vineyards.

Based upon previous statistics, I think his age would be between 17 and 25. He is probably Caucasian and has some kind of religion similar to that of the Manson type in which he would regard himself as some kind of messiah or person who can resolve and cleanse the world of these fallen women.

The suspects who were reviewed were boiled down to three. I felt that one of these would particularly fit the classification. He had a long and strong history of being institutionalized since the age of ten. He was known to be an animal strangler and extremely abusive to his mother and other women. He made several attempts at rape while hospitalized. He would be far enough advanced and cunning enough to handle the present involvement. There was another suspect who had the appearance of being a person who could easily seduce women and has had one minor history. This person should be investigated. The third person was only a minor suspect.

By investigating the mental health records of the community as well as the local mental hospital if you can, I feel that you might be able to turn up more suspects that would fit into the background outlined above.


In summary, the individual would have to be between the ages of 17 and 25 or possibly a little older. He would fit into the necrophiliac rapist category who has an extreme dislike of women, and is paranoid in nature. He selects his victims quite carefully after first "interviewing them" when he picks them up. He apparently has sufficient sophistication to approach these women without harming them in a physical or abusive manner. He probably is of sufficient height and weight to be able to lift these bodies and dump them, as he has done. I also feel that he is either a native or long-term resident of the Santa Rosa area, particularly of the northeast area of Santa Rosa and probably works on one of the ranches or vineyards nearby. I also feel that he frequents the ice rink two or three times a week or possibly a minimum of twice a month.

This type of individual is well known to the medical literature and has been constantly reappearing from time immemorial.

Again I want to thank you for the long day I spent with you. I learned a great deal and hope I contributed in some way to your knowledge and hopefully lead to the apprehension of this assailant.

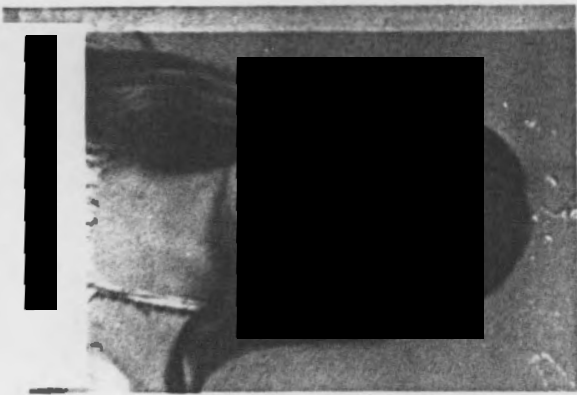
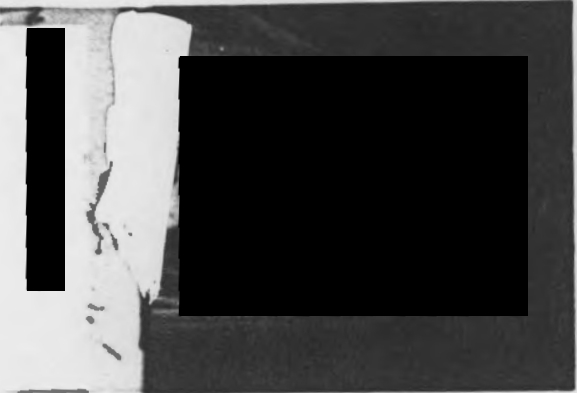
