On January 31, 1978 contact was made with [REDACTED]

Reporting officer received a call from [REDACTED] earlier this date stating that herself and [REDACTED] would like to visit him and discuss the period in which they were a ward of the court living at the Skyway for Youth School in the Capital Forest.


An appointment was made for 1530 hours. Present at the meeting was Corinne Newman of Juvenile Court, Reporting Officer, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that for approximately a six week period during the summer of 1975 that a Bill Cosden taught self defense and visited at the school. It was explained to them that Mr. Christensen had met Bill at Bill's place of employment, the Texaco Truck Stop. Bill had told Mr. Christensen that girls should learn self defense and that he would volunteer his time and expertise by coming to the school and training the girls. She stated that Bill Cosden had complained to Mr. and Mrs. Christensen of the girls wearing bras under T-shirts and emphasized that it was better for them not to wear bras. She stated she was often matched against Cosden during the training exercises. She recalled one occasion he asked her to flip him over her shoulder which she did and it then made him mad and he picked her up and threw her against the wall. She stated that quite often during the exercises he would seem to accidentally brush against the girls' breasts, however never made any real overt actions.

102A stated on one occasion herself, [REDACTED], Jerry Lee Christensen, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went down to a creek located behind the barn on Christensen property within a wooded area where they went swimming nude. [REDACTED] stated while they were swimming she looked up in the woods and seen Cosden approaching them. She alerted the other girls; some scampered for their clothing and others hid under the water. She stated Cosden approached one girl and held a towel up in front of him so she could dress behind it, however the towel was only up to his chin and he could see over the top of it.

She recalls one night waking up and hearing a girl screaming from the direction out behind the barn at Christensens and later heard what sounded like two men laughing.

[REDACTED] does not recall Cosden talking much of his past other than stating that he was from Maryland.

On 1/26/78, contact was made with a **102A** [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] /60 who resides at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] came to this office at the request of Detective Barclift to discuss her acquaintance with William Cosden.

[REDACTED] stated she met Cosden as a result of her being in the Skyway School for Girls in the Capitol Forest in Thurston County. Mr. Cosden taught self-defense and Karate to the girls and sometimes remained as a senior or "sitter," as it was called. She stated on one occasion she went on a camping trip with Cosden. The plan was to include Cosden's wife and daughter, however, when he picked up [REDACTED] he drove by a store where he purchased film, then went home where his wife helped him pack for the outing, but only [REDACTED] and Cosden went. She said while at the store he inquired if she needed any Kotex or Tampons and she related no she didn't. She stated she figured that he only wanted to find out if she was on her period or not. She stated that during the trip they never had sex, but he did try several times. He gave her rum and even attempted to get her drunk but did not succeed. I inquired if during this time she knew Cosden, if he had ever been rough or threatening to her or any of the girls in order to have sexual relations with them and she answered not to her knowledge. She stated that on one occasion when she and the other girls were swimming nude, she saw

him peeking at them through the brush, but other than this, their association was normal. She stated most of the girls made up to him but more to gain favors, cigarettes, etc.

That he goes out at nite along his wife sated that he gets nervous and they had a fight about this but he goes anyway.

Bill has a dog he loves but he beats it when he gets mad.

Bill loves fires of all kinds, when at a bon fire he keeps ~~put~~ putting wood on it until it is big then sits and looks at it as if in a trance

He told his wife that he had picked up the girl he is charged with but did not do anything only thought about it and that she was a good girl not a tramp

That Bill hangs around with Mr Christenson and that he baby sits the girls at Skyways from time to time.

That he does not want anyone around his property at Maytown, wants it for his hideaway

INVESTIGATION:

Interviews and follow-up investigation with William E. COSDEN in reference to his involvement in the homicide of Brenda BAKER.

On 27 June 1986, Det. SCHOENING and Writer went to McNeil Island. There, we spoke with William E. Cosden in reference to the homicide of Brenda BAKER and **101C**. The interview took place in a very large conference room. Det. SCHOENING and Writer sat on one side of the table while Mr. COSDEN sat at the other. No one else was present. Prior to any questioning, we advised Mr. COSDEN of his constitutional rights and obtained a signed rights and waiver of rights form. We made it very clear to him before the questioning who we were, where we were from and what the topic would be.

Mr. COSDEN had little to say about either homicide. In relation to the homicide of Mr. COSDEN admitted some familiarity with the Capital Peak area. He claimed to be more familiar with the Hollywood campground than the Margaret McKinney campground. He admitted that on the night his pickup burned, he had been poaching; however, contrary to a statement he had given at the time of the investigation, he maintained that he was in the Yelm area. He denied getting deer and denied remembering having any blood on his clothing. However, he did remember the flat tire.

In relation to the homicide of Brenda BAKER, he insisted that he could prove that he was hunting in Canada at the time of the murder.

It should be noted that we did not provide him with the date of that crime. He claimed that he had a license and a tag to substantiate this hunting trip. It should also be noted that he brought this topic up after the mere mention of two homicides in Thurston County.

As our conversation continued, it progressed to the crime that led to his conviction - the rape of a girl named Beverly. He told us that if he had wanted to kill her, she would have been dead and, that if he had raped her, why would he leave her around for a witness. In response to questions about the rape itself, he insisted that he never hit her but maintained that she fell on the ice and thus struck her head on the roadway. He stressed his expertise in karate and indicated that if he had hit her, he would not have had to use a mallet.

Eventually, our conversation progressed to the topic of the polygraph. At first, Mr. COSDEN consented to taking one. However, it would have to be after he was out of prison. He then asked if he could talk to his mother and brother. A phone call to his mother was allowed. When that phone call was concluded, a special visit for him with his mother was arranged by Sgt. KENNEDY. Mr. COSDEN indicated that he would make his decision about the polygraph after that visit.

Later that night, Det. SCHOENING received word from Sgt. KENNEDY at his residence that Mr. COSDEN would not be taking the polygraph. In fact, Mr. COSDEN was extremely upset over our visit.

On 1 July 1986, Det. SCHOENING and Writer went again to McNeil Island to interview Mr. COSDEN. On this occasion, he was visibly upset. Having obtained a search warrant, we were there to collect hair, blood and saliva samples from him. He was extremely agitated and wanted

to know or at least wanted us to show him what it was we had reference his involvement to these homicides. Det. SCHOENING outlined for him the following: the fire of his truck, the blood on his clothes, the body being found at the Margaret-McKinney Campground and his denial of any knowledge of that campground. To this, he stated that he did go to a girls group home several times during the week to instruct them in self-defense. He indicated that he would go through Littleerock. He named the group home as Skyway. In order to get there, he would have to have passed the Margaret-McKinney campground. We took this opportunity to ask him why he had changed his mind about the polygraph. He would only tell us it was a joint decision between himself, his mother and his brother.

At this point, we advised him of his rights. Telling us that he had been advised by his attorney to not say or do anything, he declined to sign the form. We next informed him of the court order allowing us to take hair, blood and saliva samples. He immediately refused and became very emotional and very irritated. He stood silent with both fists clenched and his hands at his side. His face became very red. It appeared to me that he was on the verge of physically losing control. In fact, I anticipated some sort of physical reaction by him towards us; however, this did not happen, and we were finally able to calm him down.

Accompanied by Sgt. KENNEDY, we moved to the medical wing of the prison where samples were taken.

Following that visit, those samples were sent to the lab for comparison with the trace evidence already on file. The end result was that

William E. COSDEN Jr. could not be excluded as a perpetrator of the **101C** homicide.

Attempts to schedule a third visit with Mr. COSDEN bore negative results. At our request, Sgt. KENNEDY spoke with Mr. COSDEN on or about 2 December 1986. The purpose of that conversation was to inquire of Mr. COSDEN as to whether or no he would talk with us. The results were negative. Mr. COSDEN became extremely upset and indicated that he did not wish to talk to us under any circumstances.

The search warrant (see attached copy) was prepared by Det. SCHOENING and Writer. It was reviewed by Chief Deputy Pros. TABOR. It was presented to Superior Court Judge Carol Fuller. After some discussion and the addition of more information, the search warrant was authorized. Writer filed the Return of Service. For details, refer to the attached documents.

It should be noted that during our first interview with Mr. COSDEN, I approached the subject of several arson fires with him. This was outside the presence of Det. SCHOENING. He would say little about any of them; however, he did indicate that the vehicle fire occurring on 10 August 1975, was questionable.

During the course of the investigation, Writer had an opportunity to speak with **101C** In a

lengthy statement, she detailed, amongst other things, incidents of sexual abuse done to her by [REDACTED] These things occurred at

the [REDACTED] residences on Wesley Drive and Armstrong Road. [REDACTED] being twice her size, would wrestle with her and pin her to the floor. He would then try to kiss her and fondle her breasts. He would touch

her both inside of and outside of her clothing. She remembered other occasions when she would be sleeping when he would come up and rub his penis against her. He would lay on top of her. He rubbed so hard that it hurt. There were many occasions when he would kiss her on the lips, neck and other places. He would French-kiss her even though she would try to resist. The touching even occurred at **101C** ██████████ Scott Lake residence. She could not recall ever having intercourse with ██████████ or recall him putting anything inside her vagina. The incidents of touching and kissing continued until he went to prison. While he was in prison and she a freshman in high school, she told her parents about what had happened to her.

She recalled that ██████████ had a violent temper. It would take little if anything to send him into a rage. She recalled one incident in which he got mad at her and ripped up one of her stuffed animals.

As he was considerably larger than her, there was little she could do to ward off his advances.

Given ██████████ age, prosecution for these crimes is not possible due to the expiration of the statute of limitations. For additional details, refer to her attached statement.

At the writing of this report, Mr. COSDEN remains incarcerated at McNeil Island Penitentiary. He has declined any further interviews with investigators. No new witnesses or physical evidence has come to light, and all investigative leads have been exhausted.

Upon the sworn affidavit of J. R. Vukich made before me, it appears that there is probable cause to believe that;

We think that Bundy is the number one suspect but Cosden is also a suspect. In order to clear Cosden, we would like to see if he will take the polygraph test to eliminate him or Bundy.

Tentative plans have been made for detectives Joe Vukich and Brian Schoening to go to McNeil Island on Friday, 27 June, and talk to Cosden about taking the polygraph test. A court order has been requested to bring Cosden here if he consents.

18. Her clothing was cut and there were laceration(s) resembling knife wound(s) on her breast(s).
19. William Earl Cosden, Jr. was arrested ^{file} and convicted for rape and murder in Maryland. The victim was a 21-year-old female. She was beaten and stabbed. It occurred at 2:30 a.m. on 4-16-67. He was institutionalized as criminally insane for 4½ years for this murder.
