Her throat was likely cut, pockets cut open of her coat and the back right of her head showed contusions, possible indicating she could have been hit there. Our suspect is William Cosden Jr. now in DOC for a 74 rape 1st 48 yr sentence. In 75 he hit a woman in the back of the head with a big rubber mallet prior to the rape also in the general area of the murder. We anticipate presenting a case on the murder to the prosecutor in the spring.

Thus, can you give us a listing of similar listed cases of teens and women pre 73 on through the decade, especially the attack on the back of head.

We anticipate being asked of such info. at trial time.

Lastly, please send me the supplemental paperwork to update and clear the case for your files, for when that is timely.

101C

Runaway one block from a much later "Green River" victim disappearance location on Aurora Ave. North in Seattle, Wa.. she was enroute to Rockaway, Ore., west of Portland, but was found deceased in Camp Margaret McKinney State Park near Little Rock, Wa.. She had been bound with $3/8$ " hemp rope, but it was cut off as was her medic alert bracelet. No i.d. was found & her left shoe was missing. The knife used to cut her various pockets was quite sharp as was the cut along the middle of the back of her jeans intended to expose her buttocks. Clothing was pulled up to exposed the breasts, but it is not clear when & where that occurred. She was found face down in this described manner. The pathologist could not give a cause of death. However, investigators argue that a slight trailing edge possible knife cut on the left side of her throat was slightly visible. But, decomposition and animal activity destroyed evidence.

Ted BUNDY denied the crime to Wash. Atty. Gen. Investigator Bob Keppel, but can not be positively excluded as yet. William

CORDEN earlier admitted to being in the area & blood was seen in the back of his P.U. truck that was "stolen & torched" that night. His prior homicide in Florida was not so unlike this crime, & he later committed a rape with serious ramifications. The rape victim was hit with a rubber mallet about the back of the head and base of the neck. The remaining marks were not unlike marks on the Florida victim. Hair evidence was examined much later & is not unlike the hair of CORDEN.

Melvyn FOSTER interjected himself by giving us advice and was seen picking up an unknown young female hitch hiker outside the state capitol, heading south on I-5 in the direction of the crime. And, he was much later found to have been looking for taxi driver work in Seattle on the day **101C** ran away. However, a Wash. State Ident. Section comparison of his known hair, and found it different to what is called evidence at this time.

Dwain LITTLE was believed out of prison in a supervised half-way house. However, prison records were lost and we can not exclude him nor call him suspect. However, his suspected Oregon crimes tend to make him look interesting. He once lived quite nearby at Little Rock, a rural area with a small population.

You hosted a meeting in Portland, Oregon on 11/16/88, which I attended, and pulled together a number of police agencies. In part, we discussed Dwain Lee LITTLE.

To date, we have no blood, saliva, or tissue from this subject and Oregon destroyed all such evidence it had in 1964 and 1980. Please find enclosed the completed VICAP updates on our own campground homicides of 101C and 101A

Under separate mail, I will be requesting that you do DNA Testing on what evidence we have retained in Thurston County, to be compared between homicide evidence and suspects for which evidence exists. Specifically, our request will then be to examine evidence from William E. COSDEN, Jr., 12/19/46 and hopefully you also will compare evidence from Theodore "Ted" BUNDY, 11/24/46, if it is on file with your agency.

We have difficulty in elimination of suspects and have no idea when, if ever, we will be able to obtain blood, saliva, or tissue from Mr. LITTLE. Thus, we very respectfully request your DNA capabilities. At present, the State of Washington is a minimum of one year away from the capability.
