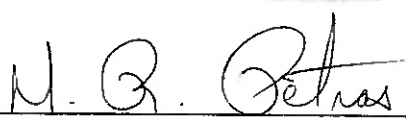

On 2/2/74 at 0028 hrs. I responded to 5517 12th NE to take additional information on a missing person (Lynda Ann Healy). A friend of the missing person, Joanne C. Testa, told me that officer Marshall #3131 had taken a missing person report earlier but that she is sure something is really wrong. I went down to the victims room and asked if anything was out of place or if anything looked different. The roommates stated that the missing girl (Healy) usually does not make up her bed. The bed had the blanket spread neatly around it and I pulled back the top part over the pillow and found the top sheet with a bloody area on it. I picked up the pillow (it did not have a pillow case over it) and I found smears of blood on both sides of it. I lifted up the pillow and found blood smears on the mattress. The victim's night gown was laying in her closet with blood on the back upper part of the neck. All these items that had blood on them, the blood was dry. All of the above items except the mattress were taken to the property room and put in under evidence #85516. The roommates were concerned about the clerk who works at the Stop & Go market at Ravenna Blvd. & Brooklyn because they showed him a picture of Lynda Healy and the girls stated that the clerk acted very suspicious when he saw the picture. I went to the store and talked to the clerk (Bob Wilcox) who was very busy with customers. He stated to me that he was busy when the girls came into the store and showed him the picture and he couldn't really talk to them. The only thing about him that I observed is that he seemed to act nervous.

I contacted Sgt. Burke and he responded to the scene.

PAM KAYE AND SALLY FEATHERKILE, BOTH ABOUT 20 YEARS OLD, LIVE AT 5026 9TH N.E., PHONE: 632-5133. ON 2/6/74, I TALKED WITH SALLY — PAM WAS NOT THERE AND COULD NOT BE REACHED. SALLY SAID THAT ABOUT TWO WEEKS AGO, PAM WAS OUTSIDE IN FRONT OF THE HOUSE. PHIL, THE NEGRO MALE ~~RE~~ REFERRED TO BY OFFICER RASMUSSEN, APPROACHED PAM AND OFFERED TO HELP HER CARRY HER BICYCLE INSIDE THE HOUSE. HE WAS VERY FORWARD AND MANAGED TO TALK HIS WAY INTO THE HOUSE ALTHOUGH PAM HAD NEVER SEEN HIM BEFORE. HE LEFT HIS GLOVES IN THE HOUSE AND RETURNED AT A LATER TIME TO PICK THEM UP, BUT PAM HAD TAKEN THE GLOVES TO 5022 9TH N.E. 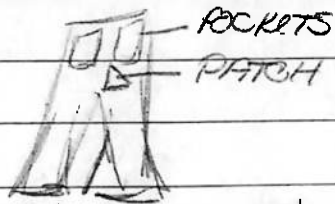

As for her top-blouse - I do not remember that she had something white on sticks in my mind, but I can not recall.

After watching TV, I went to my room. Lynda came in to talk with me - She was in a good mood - we talked about our upcoming party, about Dave, about Dante's and about a letter I had received from my Boyfriend in Phoenix. It was again, light conversation - She said goodnight. She gave no indication of stress, physical or mental and no indication of leaving. I do not know what she was wearing. My first suspicions concerning her absence came the next day about 4:00. Karen was worried that she hadn't come home. I called Dick Shearer's house & Rich's dorm - but with no success. Neither Dave nor Rich were home & I had talked to other people. Mrs. Healy called - I told her Lynda was not home yet. Her father & brother arrived at our house about 5:30-6:00. We all were home by this time and somewhat worried. She ~~was~~ ^{had} planned to have her parents come to our house for dinner. She had been looking forward to it - it was most unlikely for her not to show. The fact that she had not shown up for work added to our concern. Shortly after, the police were called.

Police Dogs Used In Hunt for Coed

Dogs of the Seattle Police Department K-9 division combed a large area in the University District yesterday in search of evidence that might lead to the finding of U. of W. coed Lynda Ann Healy, 21, missing since Thursday.

Ban (Puff) Vote Is (Hack!) No

SACRAMENTO — (UPI) — The California Assembly yesterday killed a measure to ban smoking in assembly committee rooms amid warnings it would "wreck the committee process."

With a dozen lawmakers puffing on cigars, pipes and cigarettes, the measure by Assemblyman John V. Briggs, R-Fullerton, was rejected on a 30-32 vote.

A police spokesman said yesterday the case is now being investigated by the Homicide Division. But the spokesman hastened to add that "we have nothing to show a crime has been committed. But we are assuming something could have happened."

Police found very small amounts of blood on sheets and pillow cases of Miss Healy's bed at her 5517-12th Ave. NE home. It has not yet been determined if the blood is that of Miss Healy.

The missing girl, who worked as an announcer of ski conditions for several Seattle-area radio stations, is described as being 5 feet 7 inches tall, 115 pounds, with long hair, blue eyes and a small scar on her nose.

Police say a red pack sack, owned by Miss Healy, is also missing from her home.

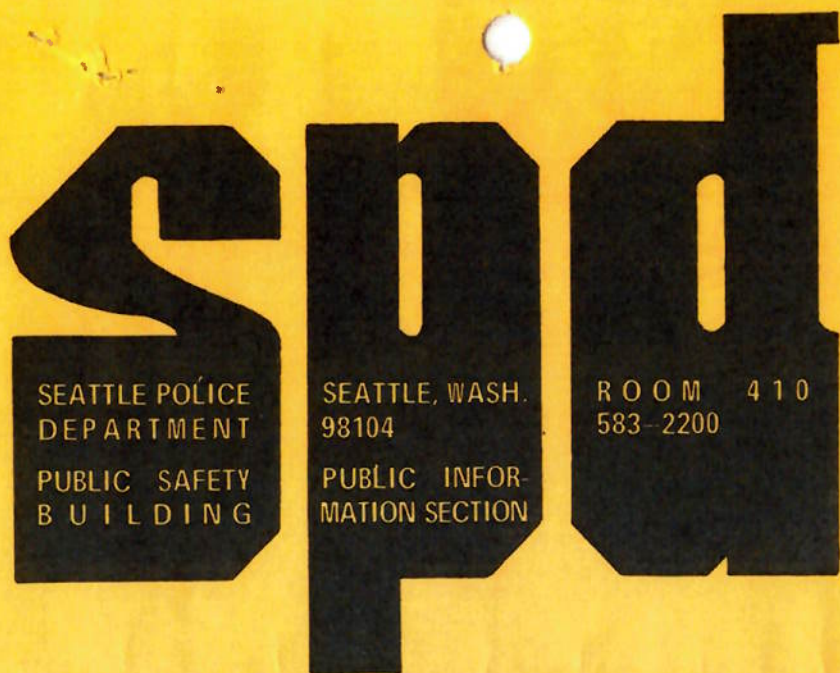

Received a call from Mrs. Healy who stated that she was very happy with the manner in which you two have been conducting the investigation thus far and who wanted to give you the following information: the man who rented the house to the girls was a Mr. Taylor who lives up the street from the house. Prior to the girls being in the house, it was rented to five boys. Mrs. Healy feels that this might be something to look into as one or more of the boys might have had keys to the house. Ginger will be available in the morning and knows where Mr. Taylor lives. Received call on 02-05-74 at 1945 Hours.

Received a call from a Duane Bennett, 8032 28th Ave. N.E., 522-5448, who is self-employed as a hair-dresser at the House of Edward, 808 E. Roy St., EA-4-3151. Mr. Bennett excitedly advised this detective that he and his wife went out to dinner this evening and during the meal he, being a psychic clairvoyant (a condition brought on by a hole in the head-in Mr. Bennett's own words) experienced a psychic experience. He has not read the papers in several days and claims to have no knowledge of this case but during this experience he was told the name Linda Jean Neely or Healy, the address of 5517 12th Ave. N.E., parents live in Bellevue while the girl lives in a basement apartment in the U-district, blood is involved and, get this, a feeling of sexuality. 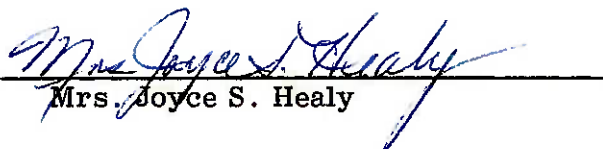

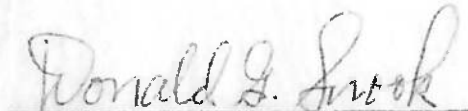
