CASE SUMMARY

1. This investigation was initiated following Mark Curtis, Thurston County (WA) Sheriff's Office (TCSO) request for assistance in obtaining S/COSDEN's DD-214. CURTIS alleges that S/COSDEN was in the USMC between 1966 and 1967 and was discharged with mental problems. Curtis advised that S/COSDEN is currently in prison for rape and is a possible suspect in an old homicide in Thurston county. Curtis is interested in what type training and discharge S/COSDEN received while in the USMC. A records check with DCII disclosed that NCIS in 28APR71 had an investigation concerning S/COSDEN. Exhibit (1) pertains. Files of the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC), ST Louis, MO were queried regarding S/COSDEN which reflected he received a General Discharge, under Honorable Conditions, 18NOV66, by reason of unsuitability (emotionally unstable personality/passive-aggressive type. S/COSDEN's DD-214 was not available, however a certification of military service as well as copies of other pertinent extracts are included as exhibit (2).

SYNOPSIS							
1. Judge Advocate General (JAG), U. S. Navy requested investigative assistance in locating Subj's original clinical records to be used by the U. S. Government in a pending suit. All logical inquiries were made and were negative in locating the original documents. (References (a) through (h) refer). These inquiries disclosed that the original documents were last seen in 1967 at the time of Subj's trial in Maryland courts for murder.							
PREDICATION							
2. This investigation was predicated upon a letter of request dated 26 April 1971 from the Office of the Judge Advocate General, U. S. Navy, Washington, D.C.							
BACKGROUND							
3. On 26 April 1971, CAPT R. C. SMITH, JAGC, USN, requested investigative assistance to recover the original clinical records relative to Subj's treatment at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital in 1966. CAPT SMITH stated that the originals were needed for the Government's defense in a pending suit brought by the family of a female person whose death was allegedly caused by Subj.							
ADMINISTRATIVE NOTE							
4. On 30 April 1971, various Naval Investigative Service components were requested to contact persons with knowledge of the possible whereabouts of the original documents comprising Subj's clinical records at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital. References (a) through (h) are the replies received, all of which reported that the attempts to locate the original were negative.

LIAISON WITH THE VETERANS ADMINISTRATION

5. Liaison with the Veterans Administration (VA) Central Office, Washington, D. C. was established upon the receipt of reference (A) to review Subj's VA folder. Mrs. Margaret E. ROGERS, Records Consultant, VA Central Office, Washington, D. C. disclosed that she had requested Subj's VA file from the Baltimore Regional Office at the request of the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED), Washington, D. C. ROGERS stated that she had reviewed Subj's VA Claims Folder #C-23371501 and that the originals in question were not contained in the file. ROGERS further stated that she had returned Subj's folder to the Baltimore VA Office and that Mr. URBATIUS of that office was holding Subj's VA folder for subsequent review.

REVIEW OF SUBJECT'S VA FILE

6. On 06-21-71, Subj's VA File #C-23-371-501 was reviewed by Vincent C. URBATIUS, Assistant Contact Officer, VA Regional Office, Baltimore, Md. in the presence of S/A STARK. The file review produced no record of the originals of Subj's Philadelphia Naval Hospital Clinical Record. (S/A W. L. STARK/06-21-71)

INTERVIEW OF CAPT DUDLEY E. BROWN, MC, USN

6. On 06-22-71, as per reference (E), CAPT Dudley E. BROWN, MC, USN, Head, Neuro-psychiatry Branch, Professional Division, BUMED, Washington, D. C. was interviewed at his office. CAPT BROWN stated that he had served on the Medical Board concerning Subj on 2 Nov 1966 at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital and that he, as the Chief of Psychiatry, had been the Senior Member at Subj's Board. CAPT BROWN disclosed that he had seen the originals of Subj's Clinical Record at that time.

7. CAPT BROWN revealed that in early 1967 there was an inquiry from the Legal Office of the Fourth Naval District concerning Subj and that a Command Investigation was conducted by the Hospital Legal Officer, LT William J. CURREN, USN. CAPT BROWN states that he had again seen the original of Subj's Clinical Record at this time. CAPT BROWN disclosed that after the Medical Board and the Command Investigation, Subj's records were placed in the Office of Patient Affairs, at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital.

8. CAPT BROWN related that he recalled an inquiry from a Maryland Court requesting the originals of Subj's clinical records to be used in Subj's trial for murder. CAPT BROWN stated that he was not involved in this action as the Patient Affairs Office at the Hospital handled this matter. CAPT BROWN stated that LCDR H. A. GOBBEL was the Patient Affairs Officer at the time. CAPT BROWN stated that he has had no further occasion to see Subj's file and that he has no knowledge of the present whereabouts of the originals of Subj's clinical records.

INTERVIEW OF H.W. BECKER MD

1. DR. H. W. BECKER, FORMERLY LCDR. (MC) USNR, STAFF PSYCHIATRIST AT USNH, PHILADELPHIA, FEB 1966 TO FEB 1968, WAS INTERVIEWED UNDER FAVORABLE CONDITIONS AT HIS RESIDENCE, 8 WILLOWHURST DR., PENFIELD, N.Y., ON 21 JUN 1971. BECKER ADVISED THAT HE WAS UNABLE TO RECOLLECT CONSIDERATION OF SUBJ'S CASE AS MEMBER OF A MEDICAL BOARD CONVENED 2 NOV 1966. BECKER CONTINUED THAT THE NAME "COSDEN" DID SOUND VAGUELY FAMILIAR, BECAUSE APPROXIMATELY ONE YEAR AGO HE RECEIVED A LETTER, TOGETHER WITH A COPY OF MEDICAL BOARD FINDINGS FROM A LEGAL OFFICER, NAME UNKNOWN AND ORIGINATION OF THE CORRESPONDENCE UNKNOWN. HE RECALLED THAT THE LETTER STATED THE SUBJ THEREOF HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN A MURDER, WAS ACQUITTED OF THE CHARGES AND THAT PRESENTLY THE DECEASED PERSON'S PARENTS WERE SUING THE U.S. GOVERNMENT FOR APPROXIMATELY \$400,000. BECKER RELATED THAT IT WAS REQUESTED HE PERUSE THE MEDICAL BOARD FINDINGS AND ADVISE THE LEGAL OFFICER OF ANYTHING HE COULD POSSIBLY REMEMBER CONCERNING THE CASE. INTERVIEWEE STATED THAT HE RETURNED THE COPY OF THE BOARD FINDINGS WITH A NEGATIVE RESPONSE. BECKER ADVISED THAT HE HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF WHERE CLINICAL RECORDS RELATIVE TO SUBJ MAY BE. WHEN QUESTIONED CONCERNING DISPOSITION OF CLINICAL RECORDS AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF MEDICAL BOARD FINDINGS, BECKER ADVISED THAT THEY WOULD NORMALLY BE SENT TO THE COMMANDING OFFICER OF THE FACILITY (USNH PHILADELPHIA), WHOM HE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN ONE CLYDE STROUD, RANK UNKNOWN, FOR HIS SIGNATURE, THEN TO BUMED, AND FINALLY TO THE COMMANDANT, USMC. BECKER CONCLUDED BY ADVISING THAT HE WOULD BE RELOCATING WITHIN THE WEEK TO ENTER PRIVATE PRACTICE, AND IF THERE SHOULD BE NEED TO CONTACT HIM FURTHER HE MAY BE REACHED AT 243 N. DUKE ST., P.O. BOX 1781, LANCASTER, PA. 17602, TELEPHONE: 717-392-0781.

 1. MISS JANE M. MALLEY, SECRETARY, AND MRS. JAMES F. (VIANNA E.) HILTON, SUPERVISOR-CLERK, PATIENT AFFAIRS, BASE HOSPITAL, NAVTRACEN, BAINBRIDGE, MD., WERE INTERVIEWED AT WORK. SOURCES, BOTH OF WHOM HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED AT THEIR PRESENT JOBS FOR MORE THAN FIVE YEARS, ADVISED THAT THEY DID NOT RECALL EVER HEARING SUBJ'S NAME MENTIONED IN CONNECTION WITH CLINICAL RECORDS SENT FROM USNH PHILADELPHIA. 2. MRS. MARGARET M. FINGER, SECRETARY, JUDGE ADVOCATE GENERAL'S OFFICE, NAVTRACEN, BAINBRIDGE, WAS INTERVIEWED AT WORK. SOURCE, WHO HAS BEEN AT HER CURRENT JOB SINCE 1966 ALSO ADVISED THAT HER FILES ARE NEGATIVE CONCERNING SUBJ AND THAT SHE DOES NOT RECALL HER OFFICE HANDLING ANY RECORDS CONCERNING SUBJ. (06-22-71)

3. NELSON D. STUBBS, DEPUTY-CLERK, CIRCUIT COURT OF CECIL COUNTY, ELKTON, MD., AND DONALDSON C. COVE, JR., STATE'S ATTORNEY, CECIL COUNTY, WERE INTERVIEWED AT THEIR RESPECTIVE OFFICES IN THE COUNTY COURT HOUSE, ELKTON, MD. BOTH INDIVIDUALS SEARCHED THEIR FILES AFTER WHICH THEY INDICATED THAT THEIR RECORDS WERE NEGATIVE REGARDING SUBJ AND THAT THEY DID NOT RECALL SUBJ'S NAME OR ANY NAVY MEDICAL RECORDS BEING RECEIVED BY THEIR OFFICE REGARDING HIM.

INTERVIEW OF LCDR S. J. KREIDER

1. LCDR Staaley J. KREIDER, USN, Naval Psychiatrist, Medical Dept., U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Md. was interviewed on 10 Jun 6971 concerning the location of the original medical records pertaining to Subj's treatment at U. S. Naval Hospital (USNH), Philadelphia, Pa. He said he is aware of the legal ramifications involved in Subj's case and that he was questioned by a U. S. Justice Dept. Lawyer, Jerry KLINGER, about two months ago in preparing the U. S. Government defense. LCDR KREIDER said that KLINGER had already informed him that the original clinical records concerning Subj's treatment could not be located. According to LCDR KREIDER, he last saw the original clinical records (or official copies) in Aug 1968 while at USNH Philadelphia, Pa. He said that inasmuch as he was a member of the three man Medical Board that recommended Subj's separation from the USMC on grounds of unsuitability in 1966, he was asked by the USNH Legal Officer, LT William CURRAN to prepare a summary of Subj's hospitalization when JAG, Washington, D. C. requested details of Subj's treatment for legal purposes. LCDR KREIDER said he reviewed the clinical records, took personal notes and prepared a summary of the Boards recommendation, however, he is not certain whether the records he reviewed were originals or copies. He explained that the USNH Patient Affairs Officer, LCDR H. A. GOBBEL, was the intermediary providing material in Subj's case and he recalls receiving a packet containing (1) Complete transcript (Court Records) of the Sanitary Hearings at Leonardtown, Md., and (2) Inpatient Hospital Records regarding Subj's treatment at USNH Philadelphia. He said it is possible that he reviewed copies which were prepared and that the originals were subpoenaed and provided to the State of Maryland to be used in the court trial of Subj.

2. LCDR KREIDER stated that after preparing the summary, he returned the complete packet of material back to LCDR GOBBEL, Patient Affairs Officer, USNH, Philadelphia. He said he is surprised the original records are not in file at USNH Philadelphia because the hospital was very careful about handling patient records. He stated he doubts that either of the other officers on Subj's Medical Board would have the originals and he believes it most likely the originals were

provided to the court or lawyers involved. LCDR KREIDER produced a folder containing personal notes and the rough draft summary of the Medical Board Report in Subj's case. He provided a copy of the Summary of the Medical Board Report which is Atch (1), advising the U. S. Justice Dept. defense lawyer and JAG, Washington, D. C. should already have copies of this report.

3. Concerning the legal ramifications concerning the suit against the U. S. Navy for negligence in releasing Subj while he was dangerously insane, LCDR KREIDER stated that it was the Medical Boards opinion in Nov 1966 that Subj was not suitable for continued military service due to pre-existing personality disorder. The Medical Board's opinion was that Subj did not have an emotional illness, such as psychosis, a disabling neurosis, or organic brain disease, at that time. Source could provide no additional pertinent information.

This nineteen year-old, single, Caucasian FVT USMC with approximately one year and one month continuous active duty prior to the present admission was admitted to the Third Medical Battalion Field Hospital 1 in Vietnam on 25 August 1966 with the diagnosis Anxiety Reaction, #3100 because of insomnia and "uncontrollable urges to kill other marines." He was transferred on August 1966 and arrived at the Naval Hospital Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on 6 September 1966, with the above diagnosis retained.

The patient reported that he had adjusted well to the Marine Corps after enlisting in July 1965. He arrived in Vietnam on or about 20 May 1966 and was sent on his first patrol in less than a week. After a few days in the field he was admitted to the Third Medical Battalion (A Co.) Field Hospital with symptoms of fatigue, diarrhea, and nausea. The patient reported that he felt he was suffering from "heat stroke." He remained in the hospital for five days and was discharged to full duty with the diagnosis of "combat fatigue." In the narrative summary from that hospitalization the Medical Officer noted that the patient was "intermittently crying, incoherent, and understood but did not reply to questions." The patient reported that one month later, on 24 June 1966, he was wounded in both legs by grenade fragments during a night ambush. There is no note in the health record of an examination by a medical officer at that time, but a replacement Form Standard Form 88 dated 9 July 1966 noted "Shrapnel wound Rt. calf". On 18 August 1966, according to the patient, his sea bag containing clothes, pictures, and \$150.00 in cash was stolen. He was very upset about this but did not report it because according to the patient, "All Marines are animals and no one would care." At about 0100 on 19 August 1966 the patient went to the chaplain and told him what had happened. The chaplain referred him to the medical officer who reported that the patient told him of an "almost uncontrollable urge to shoot some of his fellow marines." The Medical Officer reported that the patient's platoon Sergeant told him that the patient was "unable to get along with any of the men and on four occasions had drawn his weapon on another person and once threatened to kill someone with his knife." The patient was referred to the division psychiatrist who noted that the patient was under considerable emotional tension and was considered a poor candidate for rehabilitation to combat status at that time. He was then evacuated from Vietnam to this hospital.

On admission to this hospital the physical, neurological and indicated laboratory examinations were within normal limits. About four small well-healed wounds were present on the lower extremities. The mental status

examination revealed a tall, muscular Caucasian male of about nineteen years who appeared tired, depressed, and maintained a consistently "sorrowful" facial expression. He was well-groomed with a small moustache. Motor activity was retarded, posture was relaxed, and speech was slow and guarded. Often the patient seemed to be near tears and frequently sighed deeply. Affect was appropriate to thought content. Progression of thought was normal and logical. There were no delusions or hallucinations. The patient was well-oriented; memory, judgment, calculations, and abstractions were within normal limits. He appeared to be of below average intelligence with very little insight. There was no sign of psychosis.

The past history as elicited from the patient and his health Record and considered to be reliable revealed that the patient was the oldest of four children. He was reportedly jealous of his siblings, feeling that they were receiving privileges denied to him at their age. His father, described as a good, ~~honest~~ honest, strict man was respected but often feared by the patient. The father reportedly lost the sight of one eye during WWII and had been an all-Navy boxing champion with hopes of a professional career. The patient's mother was described as a good cook and housekeeper. Because of difficulties with studies and with teachers, the patient was required to repeat the eighth grade. The patient reportedly followed a characteristic pattern of passive obstructionism in dealing with authority. He was afraid openly to defy his teachers or to act out aggressively, but responded to rules, orders and regulations by compliance when directly confronted by authority figures, and by stubbornness, procrastination, and inefficiency when not immediately threatened. In high school football the patient was reportedly a valuable defensive guard on the first team. He felt that he had more respect for the coach, a former Marine Officer, than for anyone else. Yet he was inefficient and unreliable in games because he could not control his behavior. On one occasion the patient reportedly had to be removed from an important game by his coach when he refused to follow the plays and tried to "get" the referee by covertly blocking others players into him. The patient left high school after the eleventh grade when his former classmates graduated, and enlisted in the Marine Corps.

In the hospital the patient was treatment with individual and milieu therapy. At no time did he show any significant anxiety. He was consistently contemptuous of authority but was at first hesitant to act out his hostile feelings. He was placed on a liberty status and given duty as a gate guard. On 21 September 1966 the patient reported a superficial blister on his toe and was allowed to remain on the ward. The next morning he used this as an excuse to remain in bed and ignored the ward corpsmen's order to stand

In the interest of justice, we feel compelled to ask you to consider the opening of an alleged old death investigation. The case involves an alleged murder of an officer or military man in and during the Vietnam war.

The time frame in question is between 20 May and 6 September, 1966, likely at Hue Phu Bai, Quang Tri Province or Vinh Loo. Our hope is that you may agree to at least attempting to locate and interview Mr. Cosden's Marine Corps company level and lower level officers and sergeants. At issue is Cosden's long-time bragging of killing an officer in a shower in Vietnam and other unauthorized killings.

To our knowledge, no one has ever inquired as to attempting to prove or disprove these claims. As our duty is that we are all sworn to uphold the law, we feel honor-bound to at least attempt to cause justice to occur. Tracing down possible witnesses to last known homes of record will be burdensome. The logistics tend to intimidate an effort to investigate. However, it really should be done and closure achieved, one way or another.

Mr. Cosden went to jail in Washington State concerning a 1975 rape case. Although his sentence was 48 years, we are informed that he is now making efforts at release. He may achieve that release.

Over the years, Cosden has consistently claimed he killed an officer by throwing a grenade into the latrine or shower. What has varied is that the victim was a Vietnamese Lt., and another time, a Marine Lt. He did not really specify a United States Marine Lt. He has allegedly told people of also doing some unauthorized killings in Vietnam. These claims occurred before and during his

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state incarceration.

It would be convenient to dismiss Cosden as a person of false bravado, but the math adds up to a nagging concern that maybe he did get away with murder in Vietnam. Consider the following:

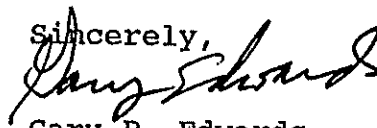
- A. He claimed a shrapnel wound on 9 July 1966, in combat (which could have come from an assault on the unknown lt.)
- B. He claimed a grenade wound on 24 July 1966, in combat, also a concern to us.
- C. He was quite upset over a theft on 18 August 1966, and considered all Marines to be animals.
- D. He was said on 19 August 1966 to have an uncontrollable urge to shoot some of his fellow Marines, and had four times pointed his weapon at Marines prior to that date and once threatened to kill a Marine with his knife, prior to this.
- E. He choked a Navy person on 1 November 1966, and threatened another.
- F. He did kill a woman in Maryland, following Marine Corps release from service. Cosden went to a mental hospital and later came to Olympia, WA.
- G. We have long suspected him of a 1973 murder of a young woman hitchhiker near Olympia, but have not charged him.
- H. His 11/2/66 military record referred to Cosden as having character problems such as "pathological resentment towards authority figures", etc....

His anger for a "Lt." does not seem known, but rather at Marines in general and some specifically, and his capability to kill seems quite possible.

Attached are some notes of our understanding of dates, concerns and military notations of officer names that you might consider interviewing. Any closure outcome would be important, that being confirmation of murder in Vietnam, or that being all a lie.

Background:

COSDEN has long claimed, while in Washington prisons, that he killed a marine officer (Lieutenant) while in Vietnam by throwing a grenade into the latrine where the Lieutenant was at. We have sought to verify or explain the claim.

The same claim occurred 10/25/74, but then Cosden was quoted as claiming he killed a "South Vietnamese Officer". We wrote then to the USMC, but learned nothing to corroborate any crime in Vietnam.

Pre-USMC Background:

- A. "Feared his father. Mom was a good cook and cleaned house."
- B. Repeated the 8th grade, and became passive-obstructive to authority.
- C. Jealous of siblings, believing they got privileges earlier than he did.
- D. Played high school football as a guard, offensive. Liked his ex-Marine Officer coach. Pulled out of a game due to anger control. Tried to block into a referee to "get" the ref. in an important game.
- E. Quit high school early.
- F. Had been working as a farm hand. Milked cows.

- 05/18/65 - Enlisted in the Marine Reserves. #2155777.
- 07/26/65 - Discharged from the USMCR.
- 07/27/65 - Enlisted in the regular USMC. Finished boot camp March 18, 1966. Likely went home for liberty afterward.
- 05/20/66 - Arrived in Vietnam.
- 05/21/66 - Assigned to Co. L, 3rd Bn., 4th marine, 3 Marine Div. (Rein.) FMF, as Lt. Sec. Ammo Carrier.
- 05/25/66 - Served in the defense of Hue Phu Bai. Did his first combat patrol in the first week in Vietnam.

- 05/27/66 - Re-assigned to Co. A Med. Bn. Was there for five days for "heat stroke", he claimed. Diagnosed as combat fatigue. Intermittently crying, incoherent, and understood but did not reply to questions.
- 06/01/66 - Returned to active duty.
- 06/28/66 - Participated in Operation Athens Phu Bai.
- 07/03/66 - Participated in Operations Jay.
- 07/07/66 - Participated in Operation Holt.
- 07/09/66 - He claimed shrapnel wound. A medical form does indicate a wound to the right calf.
- 07/24/66 - Claimed he was wounded by grenade in a night ambush. (No physician note was found re: exam).
- 07/31/66 - Returned to active duty.
- 08/02/66 - Participated in Operation Hastings, vicinity of Quang Tri Province. Awarded the RVN Cross of Gallantry, 08/15/66.
- 08/18/66 - Cosden claimed his sea bag was stolen with clothes, pictures and \$150.00. He was very upset, but hadn't reported it. Called "all Marines animals", and said that no one would care.
- 08/19/66 - Went to a Chaplain about the theft and was referred to a medical officer. Cosden had an "uncontrollable urge to shoot some of his fellow Marines". His platoon Sergeant said Bill couldn't get along with fellow Marines and four times pointed his weapon at Marines. Bill once threatened to kill a Marine with his knife.
- 08/24/66 - Patient in Co. C, 3rd Med. Batt., during Operation Ottawa, Vinh Loo, admitted to 3rd Batt. Med. Field hospital for an anxiety reaction #3100, for insomnia and "uncontrollable urges to kill other Marines".
- 09/06/66 - Transferred to the Naval Hospital ship, Philadelphia. Had a "sorrowful facial expression, near tears, sighed deeply. Below average intelligence with very little insight".

- 10/13/66 - Cosden began to get in trouble with discipline.
to
- 11/01/66 - Two Capt. Masts were conducted and he was reduced in rank from PFC to PVT. He failed to obey lawful orders to go to bed and to get out of bed. He replied to a person, "Fuck you, I'll tear your ass up." He unlawfully choked SN A.B Church, with his hands. He also threatened to break the neck of Petty Officer R. L. Quincey for bothering Bill.
- 11/02/66 - Did hospital guard duty, but used the excuse of blistered foot to avoid duty. Recommended separation from the Marines on grounds of unsuitability. His father had insisted on rule bending to get Bill out of the hospital for an unusual weekend liberty. Bill had refused to return to active duty, and had abused another patient. He was considered:
- Thoughtless of others
 - Selfish, resentful, manipulative.
 - Occasionally tearful when frustrated.
 - Resisted acting out as passive-obstructive.
 - Stubborn, inefficient, with deep dependency needs.
 - Had a pathological resentment towards authority figures.
 - Had undependable judgment.
 - Impulsive behavior, under minor stress.

BOARD DECISION:

This was a Deferred Decision. The decision of the full Board is to find Mr. Cosden not parolable and to add 90 months to his minimum term.

NEXT ACTION:

Schedule a May 2001 Administrative Progress Review.

HISTORY/COMMENTS:

Mr. Cosden is under the Board's jurisdiction for Rape in the First Degree. The time start was March 15, 1976, with a maximum expiration date of February 10, 2024. The Judge recommended 120 months and the prosecutor recommended 240 months. The SRA (Sentencing Reform Act) range is 51 to 68 months, with an adjusted range of 49 to 66 months. Mr. Cosden's current PERD (Parole Eligibility Review Date) is September 26, 1999, and as of today's date he has served approximately 278 months.

File materials describe the underlying conviction as Mr. Cosden following a young woman home from a gas station where he had been working in a snowstorm, and Mr. Cosden faked car trouble to encourage the woman to assist him. She did assist him and he overpowered

her, hit her in the head with a rubber mallet, and raped her. Mr. Cosden also has a history which involves a finding of not guilty by reason of insanity for a 1967 murder of a young woman. There are some file materials that suggest that the woman was raped prior to her death, although Mr. Cosden maintains it was consensual sex and he beat her to death during a blackout afterwards.

REASONS:

The Board last saw Mr. Cosden in April of 1996. At that time he had completed the Sexual Offender Treatment Program (SOTP) at Twin Rivers. The Board at that time was concerned with information presented that involved Mr. Cosden writing a "novel" which contained graphic sadistic and violent sexual behavior. The SOTP Treatment Summary Addendum was quite negative with respect to this novel and stated that the novel fed his deviant fantasies of torture, murder, and multiple rapes, and consisted of child pornography at it's very worst. The staff at Twin Rivers at that time period rated him a high risk to reoffend. Subsequent to the .100 hearing in 1996 he received an infraction in November of 1996 for possession of pornographic material. Mr. Cosden explains that it was one of the scripts which was the subject of the last .100 hearing. The Board questioned him as to why he had the script in his possession since it had been quite clearly discouraged by staff and the Board, and Mr. Cosden stated that he had sent some of the books out to publishers and that it may have been a manuscript that was sent back.

There is a current psychological from Betty Richardson dated April of 1999, which is more positive than past psychologicals, but still has some areas of concern. On the risk assessment ratings from the PCL-R, Mr. Cosden was rated a moderate risk for committing another

violent offense within four years of release. On the LSI-R he scored in the medium to high risk needs category. On the Multiphasic Sex Inventory Profile he was unable to follow directions and answered in a manner that resulted in an invalid test.

Mr. Cosden has clearly been incarcerated for a lengthy period of time. After evaluating the available information, the Board still believes that he is too high a risk to release into the community.

FACTS RELIED UPON:

The panel relied upon previous Board dictations, a review of the entire ISRB and DOC files, as well as the face-to-face interview with Mr. Cosden.

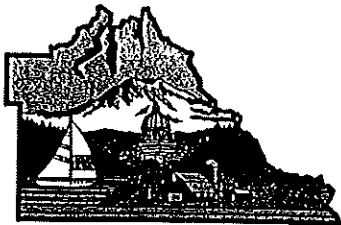

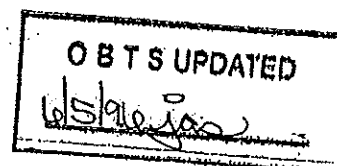

HISTORY/COMMENTS:

Mr. Cosden was convicted of Rape First Degree in Thurston County in February of 1976. He has been incarcerated since that time. The Judge recommended ten years and the prosecutor recommended 20 years. As of April 1996, Mr. Cosden has served 234 months. His current maximum expiration date is February 10, 2024. The instant offense involved Mr. Cosden raping a young woman in Thurston County. He struck her in the head two times with a rubber mallet, took the victim away in his truck, and subsequently raped her twice. After the rape he threatened her by grabbing her throat and demanding that she not say anything. Records also indicate that Mr. Cosden used the threat of a gun underneath the seat of the vehicle, although the victim never saw the gun. He was convicted of Rape First Degree. Previously, in Maryland (1967) Mr. Cosden was found not

guilty of Murder by reason of insanity. He was confined to a State Hospital from 1967 until the fall of 1971. It should be noted that the instant offense was similar to the one that he had been involved with in Maryland, which resulted in the Rape and Murder of a female companion who also had multiple bruises and contusions around the back and top of the head and body.

Mr. Cosden has a file history which is characterized with many inconsistencies regarding his life prior to his incarceration. It is clear that he was in the military and he did serve time in Vietnam. However, it is unclear as to what happened to him while he was there. There is one version of his story that claims he was wounded several times in Vietnam and that he killed U. S. servicemen and Vietnamese women and children.

REASONS:

The ISRB met with Mr. Cosden in October of 1995. This meeting came as a result of Mr. Cosden receiving Maximum Benefits from the Sexual Offender Treatment Program (SOTP) at Twin Rivers in May of 1995. The Board elected to not take any action at that hearing in view of some recent developments which raised serious concerns regarding Mr. Cosden's behavior and treatment benefits.

The Board asked for an updated report from the SOTP, as well as additional information from the Department of Corrections (DOC) in order to reach a decision. As a result of this additional information, a .100 hearing was held on April 2, 1996.

The Board discussed with Mr. Cosden his writing of a "novel", which contained graphic, sadistic, and violent sexual behavior. It contained scenes where there were child victims and other victims who enjoyed being raped and brutalized. The novel had come to light when it was discovered by

correctional staff after Mr. Cosden had completed the in-patient portion of the program.

Mr. Cosden was asked to comment. He stated that he was writing the novel after being granted permission by SOTP staff and getting approval from his therapy group, with which he had shared some of the input. He went on to indicate that he was encouraged to continue writing this novel so that he could purge himself from the bad feelings that he did not want to duplicate.

His counselor, Pat Glebe, as well as SOTP counselor, Shirley Gray, and other SOTP staff to include Mike Morris and former therapist John Rockwell, all testified that this novel was not an approved document. In addition, it had not been encouraged or known of prior to the discovery by the correctional staff. They also indicated that it was not a part of the program's treatment modality. Part of the Sexual Offender Treatment Program does require participants to complete "covert scripts". These scripts were to be written and shared with the therapy group and therapist, and would deal with the offender writing a deviant arousal situation complete with an intervention scene. The arousal scene was to stop short of the participant touching the victim. Each script was to be about two pages in length. Mr. Cosden completed 15 written scripts and they were referred back to his SOTP therapist at that time, Mr. Henry Schmidt. The covert sensitization process was intended to assist offenders in managing a deviant sexual arousal and was read in group three to five times daily for practice in reducing sexual arousal. It was also stated that the potential victim was not to be engaged in any kind of conversation or physical interaction of any kind. Lastly, the potential victim was not to be displayed as enjoying or liking the situation, or having any fault for the situation. This novel clearly violated those mandates.

Mr. Cosden had completed the in-patient phase of the Sexual Offender Treatment Program and was participating in the Maximum Benefits Group, which is a group meeting for individuals who have

completed the in-patient part of the program. He has continued to be employed by the Ex-Mark Corporation, where he has received satisfactory reports. He stated that if he were allowed to parole, he would continue to participate in Phase Three of the SOTP, where he would work on relapse prevention. He also indicated that he had VA benefits as a result of Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome. He, along with his attorney, pointed out that he had served in excess of the recommended time by the Judge and the prosecutor and had responded to the Board's request that he complete the Sexual Offender Treatment Program and is willing to continue treatment in Phase Three of the out-patient part of the program.

The Board finds enough evidence both in Mr. Cosden's "novel" as well as his denial and contradictions of program purposes and practices to conclude that Mr. Cosden has not internalized the treatment principles and continues to demonstrate that he is not safe to be at large.

FACTS RELIED UPON:

This panel relied upon the testimony by Mr. Cosden, his counselor, Mr. Pat Glebe, Mike Morris and Shirley Gray of the SOTP, the addendum to the SOTP Maximum Benefit Summary dated October 25, 1995, the Sex Offender Treatment Summary dated May 17, 1995, a letter dated April 3, 1996, from Mr. Cosden, input from Mr. Cosden's attorney, Rich Linn, the ISRB file, previous Board dictations, the DOC file, and the ISRB report.

We received a call from Dennis Marsh, Exec. Secy. for the Doc Indeterminate Sentencing Review Board. His info is:

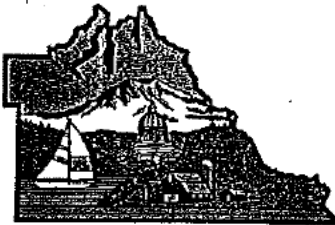
Cosden is under their jurisdiction until he max's out at 2024, unless he is found to be parolable, which is possible but unlikely. He will be age 77 in 2024, Too old to be a danger.

The Doc would likely be willing to parole him, if, our prosecutor was wanting to go through the expensive Civil Commitment Trial. Cosden can also be paroled at the maximum date.

The earlier predicted "hearing" date of May '95 will not occur. Cosden is said to have lost a little of his good time. At this time, Cosden is not scheduled for any hearing at all until Jan. 1997. This is partly because he waived his earlier date until his sex offender Treatment Program maximum benefits expire.

Cosden could get a hearing date set if he passes this Program. That decision is in the near future and does not seem probable (from my perspective.)

Dear Mr. Marsh:

Mr. Cosden is in sexual-psychopathic treatment at Twin Rivers, at this time. He agreed to my interview on 25 April 1995, in the presence of counselor Shirley GRAY, and waived his right to silence. He did not permit tape recording. Enclosed is a copy of my report and related letters generated due to this interview.

Cosden seems as dangerous as he ever was and maybe more so, now, with planned sophistication. His possible re-entry into society flat gives me chills. He now claims he killed two U.S. servicemen while in Viet Nam. One killing was accidental and the other intentional. He admitted to his sister Susan, telephonically, about 1-1/2 years ago, that he recalls having sex in the woods in Maryland, 1967, with the Pilkerton girl who he also murdered in those woods. He had previously and since claimed that he blacked out and cannot recall the act of murder. Yet, on 25 April 1995, he displayed to us how he thrust the weapon. Shortly later, he claims how it was only "possibly" how he did it. Further, prior to incarceration for Rape, he freely would display photos of living, young Vietnamese children who he and other Marines "had to kill", later.

Cosden denies he murdered the young 101C [REDACTED] at/near Capitol Forest in Thurston County, in 1973. He still refuses to be polygraphed on that one, single case. He denies ever setting any fires, as long suspected. He also does not wish to fully admit to long-time sex abuse of siblings, nor other young girls, as suspected.

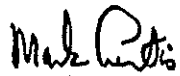

Surely, his Twin Rivers treatment is not yet successful or he should by now be more honest. I am particularly worried about his opinion expressed that he may do anything he wants to drunken women. I have no confidence whatsoever that this attitude is solely in the past. Bill Cosden's behavior towards women is dangerous and predatory. He speaks very macho towards men, but it is girls and women who seem in danger.

Considering his past proven violence, and claimed unpunished violence, suspected arsons, other murders and sexual abuses, it seems reasonable to again ask the Board to consider a Civil Commitment. he is now quite knowledgeable about what to say to impress or attempt to manipulate, relating to sexual psychopath treatment. But, the reality appears that only a good smoke screen is there. Cosden should be denied release and permanently retained in custody.

HISTORY AND COMMENTS:

Mr. Cosden is incarcerated as the result of a 1976 conviction for Rape. He has been continuously confined since that time. The Judge recommended ten years and the prosecutor recommended 20 years. He has now served 228 months, which correlates to an aggravated sentence. His criminal history includes being found not guilty in 1967 in the state of Maryland of Homicide by reason of insanity. He was released from the state hospital in Maryland as competent in May of 1971 and then traveled to the state of Washington. The Murder in which Mr. Cosden was found not guilty by

reason of insanity was of a young woman who was stabbed several times, and there was possibly some evidence that he had sexual intercourse with her. The current Rape that he is serving time on involved him coercing a woman at a truck stop and raping her.

Mr. Cosden has a file history which is laced with many inconsistencies regarding his life prior to his being incarcerated. It is clear that he was in the military and served some time in Vietnam. However, depending on which version of his story you believe, he has been wounded several times while in Vietnam and killed U.S. servicemen and Vietnamese women and children.

REASONS:

As recent as April 1995 Mr. Cosden was interviewed by Captain Mark Curtis of the Thurston County Sheriff's Office. This interview was apparently a collaboration effort with the Bangor Naval Base and the St. Mary's County Sheriff Department in Maryland regarding a couple of unsolved Murders, which took place back in the 1960's. Mr. Cosden had allegedly told his sister that he had been involved in these Murders and subsequently an interview was set up to investigate these crimes, which have remained unsolved. A review of the reports concluded after these interviews appear to be filled with inconsistencies, recantations, and distortions of realities. Mr. Cosden has had a history of story telling and this appears to be along the same lines. It certainly is filled with a great deal of grandiosity and distorted memories, which may be laced with some truths.

Since Mr. Cosden's last appearance before the Board, he has been convicted for fighting in May of 1993, for possession of an unauthorized tool in October 1993, and a last major infraction in September of 1994 resulting from four general infractions.

Cosden has completed the Twin Rivers Corrections Center Sexual Offender Treatment Program, receiving Maximum Benefits labeled on May 17, 1995. He indicated that he was participating in the Maximum Benefits follow-up program. However, further review indicates that he attended only one of ten possible sessions. He continues to work for the Ex-Mark Corporation, where he has continued to receive adequate performance evaluations.

According to the SOTP Treatment Summary, Mr. Cosden is rated as a medium risk. It also gave a list of items that would increase the level of risk, including use of drugs, secrecy, and judgmental statements.

Prior to our meeting with Mr. Cosden, it had been revealed that Mr. Cosden had been found in possession of an uncompleted novel, which was very graphic in terms of his violence and sexual abuse. He indicated that he had permission to write this novel while he was a participant in the SOTP. A partial review of some of the written manuscript was very disturbing, and it would raise questions as to why a man would be allowed to do this. It should be noted that Mr. Cosden does have a history of bizarre story telling and has had many difficulties differentiating truth from fantasy. He indicates that he was encouraged to continue this novel because it apparently was assisting him in dealing with some of the trauma of his past.

A psychological evaluation was completed in June 1994 by Dr. Gerald Hover. This was completed prior to his completion of the SOTP. In view of the confusing information regarding this progress review it is requested, as previously indicated, that an updated psychological report be completed and a review of the evaluation submitted by the SOTP and a follow-up assessment of his progress since completion of that Program be made available to the Board for another review.

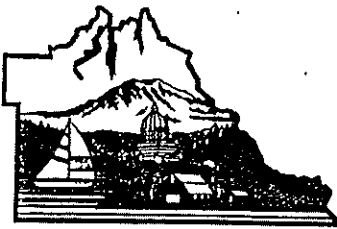

Dear Board Members:

We last communicated with Dennis Marsh, Secretary of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board, on August 31, 1989, concerning our worry that Bill Cosden, Jr. might be released back to Thurston County. We believe Cosden fits into a Level III sexual predator status and would be a danger to our community as well as his family. Our request is that you consider:

- A. Keeping him the full term of his 48 year sentence and at a minimum file a sexual commitment as a sexual predator. It is my feeling that this individual would be a serious threat to the citizens of Thurston County and to his original victim and family if he was ever returned to this jurisdiction.
- B. At the minimum bar his return to Thurston County or any county in the nation that his sister, Karen Cosden-Harris, or his 1975 rape victim may live.

In general, we cite information that Cosden is incarcerated for rape now; committed a 1963 murder in Maryland; is suspected here of a minimum of one unsolved murder; committed a minimum of one arson vehicle fire here, and is suspected of others; intentionally injured animals; sexually abused his brother; and allegedly had predatory contacts with other juvenile girls and women prior to his incarceration.

Cosden's ex-wife and two sisters fear his return. His rape trial prosecutor told the court that a life commitment would be proper as Bill is very dangerous to innocent people.

We previously sent for your consideration the August 4, 1986 statement of Cosden's youngest sister. She is [REDACTED] of Olympia. [REDACTED] has suffered long-term child molestation by Cosden. He once told her he needed sex six times per day.

We now send to you statements recently given by [REDACTED] and his ex-wife, Rita Luce. [REDACTED] was his victim of sexual abuse and rape between the ages of about 4 and 15, including the day he returned from Vietnam up to the day he went for sentencing and incarceration for his rape conviction. Luce's statement covers Bill's alleged admission of an arson fire, corroboration of [REDACTED] molestation, observations of hallucinations when drunk, inappropriate contacts with 12 and 13 year old girls (one of which was found naked in his car), cruelty to a family dog, and his claims of enjoying killing people while in Vietnam in about 1963 and 1964. Fits of rage were a common occurrence by Bill. His anger was often directed towards women in general, and he was described as unsafe to walk the streets. A very disturbing situation was related by Rita Luce on how Bill once brought home a lady whose phone and power was cut late at night and Bill just happened to stop by at that time.

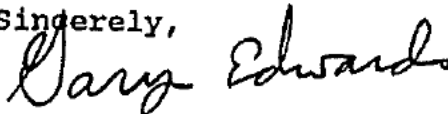
Collectively, [REDACTED] and ex-wife have given us additional bits of information that tend to further point to Bill regarding a 1973 murder investigation at Capitol Peak in Thurston County.

[REDACTED] is said to be willing to testify in a court as to the abuse allegations, but only if under subpoena.

We are aware that Bill had control of a .357 Magnum S&W, and a 30.06 rifle during the time frame of 1973, when he allegedly shot a neighbor's dogs at Scott Lake.

After consideration of the information previously submitted, together with the additional statements provided herein, we hope the Board will rule in favor of the protection of society and continue the incarceration of Mr. Bill Cosden.

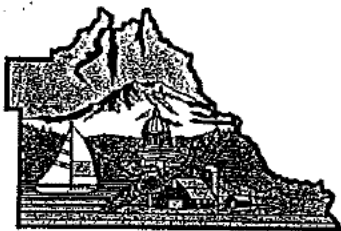

Mr. Cosden is in sexual-psychopathic treatment at Twin Rivers, at this time. He agreed to my interview on 25 April 1995, in the presence of counselor Shirley GRAY, and waived his right to silence. He did not permit tape recording. Enclosed is a copy of my report and related letters generated due to this interview.

Cosden seems as dangerous as he ever was and maybe more so, now, with planned sophistication. His possible re-entry into society flat gives me chills. He now claims he killed two U.S. servicemen while in Viet Nam. One killing was accidental and the other intentional. He admitted to his sister Susan, telephonically, about 1-1/2 years ago, that he recalls having sex in the woods in Maryland, 1967, with the Pilkerton girl who he also murdered in those woods. He had previously and since claimed that he blacked out and cannot recall the act of murder. Yet, on 25 April 1995, he displayed to us how he thrust the weapon. Shortly later, he claims how it was only "possibly" how he did it. Further, prior to incarceration for Rape, he freely would display photos of living, young Vietnamese children who he and other Marines "had to kill", later.

Cosden denies he murdered the young 101C [REDACTED] at/near Capitol Forest in Thurston County, in 1973. He still refuses to be polygraphed on that one, single case. He denies ever setting any fires, as long suspected. He also does not wish to fully admit to long-time sex abuse of siblings, nor other young girls, as suspected.

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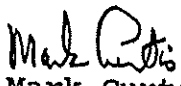

Surely, his Twin Rivers treatment is not yet successful or he should by now be more honest. I am particularly worried about his opinion expressed that he may do anything he wants to drunken women. I have no confidence whatsoever that this attitude is solely in the past. Bill Cosden's behavior towards women is dangerous and predatory. He speaks very macho towards men, but it is girls and women who seem in danger.

Considering his past proven violence, and claimed unpunished violence, suspected arsons, other murders and sexual abuses, it seems reasonable to again ask the Board to consider a Civil Commitment. He is now quite knowledgeable about what to say to impress or attempt to manipulate, relating to sexual psychopath treatment. But, the reality appears that only a good smoke screen is there. Cosden should be denied release and permanently retained in custody.

Geiger Pre-Release last week received a McNeil Island Inmate you need to know about and we hope to hear from you if he re-offends.

He committed an assault-rape in 1975 in Thurston County that still has our attention.

Cosden worked for a family-owned, large truck stop and followed an attractive young woman to a point where she was forced over to the side. He hit her about the head with a rubber mallet and made some comment similar to his surprise that here he, "was doing the same thing as Ted". At that time frame, the "Ted" (Ted Bundy murders) were quite well known. His victim survived to testify and his sentence was a maximum of 48 years.

But, there is more. Earlier in Maryland, he stabbed a young woman (possibly a girlfriend) to death with a broken pool cue and was sent quite briefly to a mental institution. His father, now deceased, was successful in gaining the man's release to Olympia. A chain of fires were set/or/involved with Cosden, Jr. that seemed to coincide with some tension involving him. They were;

- 1) a "stolen" and torched truck of his on 8/10/73,
- 2) another truck of his on 11/26/73, following a witness seeing blood in his truck bed and was inconsistent in story,
- 3) a house fire at his home on 4/15/74,
- 4) a truck-wash fire at his work 7/15/75,
- 5) and a pole shed-dwelling fire of his neighbor he didn't care for on 10/26/75.

We have two (2) unsolved runaway hitchhiker girl murders,
i.e.,

- 1) a likely Memorial Day 1974 case of Brenda Joy Baker, found a few miles east of Cosden's work at Millersylvania State Park, likely stabbed in the upper body area, and
- 2) a likely 11/25-26/73 case of **101C** who was found west of Cosden's work at Capitol Forest, likely attacked with a knife to the neck area. Her jeans were cut on the back and peeled over the buttocks and she had previously been tied with rope.

Mr. Cosden remains a very possible suspect in the 1973 homicide and we are anxiously awaiting the soon-to-be-possible state testing of DNA for hair. At this juncture, we do not know the comparability of hair evidence. We do know the evidence is not unlike that of Cosden. While in prison, he worked with weights and is unusually strong.

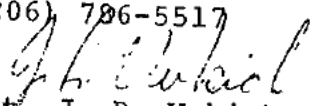
It might be fair to say we are aware of several different subjects of interest reference the 1974 homicide.

As Bill Cosden seems to be in your area, the greater risk seems to be to your community. However, his mother, brother and ex-wife still reside near Olympia, as is the family business. Thus, we are concerned he will return to work or visit when full DOC release occurs.

Please keep him in mind and us as well, should we be of any assistance or if we need to know any facts.

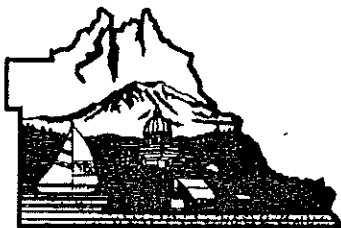
